2. John² Agnew (William¹) was born Abt. March 29, 1789 in Portaferry, Downe County, Ireland, and died 1850 in Carlisle, Pennsylvania. He married **Margaret Brown** November 29, 1821 in 1st Presbyterian Church, Carlisle, Pennsylvania. She was born Abt. 1789, and died April 14, 1852 in Carlisle, Pennsylvania.

Notes for John Agnew:

It was during the religious wars in the land of the Celts when John Agnew, heir to a large estate, planned to run away from his home, because his brother, a land owner, was murdered on the Shannon bridge in Down County by the Irish Catholics and John feared of inheriting the estates and being killed as was his brother, so he left Ireland as a very young man and sailed for America.

John landed in Philadelphia in February of 1809 with ten cents in his pocket and emigrated to Carlyle, Pennsylvania where he soon began working in a mill of which he eventually become owner.

He married, then raised two families as was the custom of some wealthy men of that time. He educated all of the children.

John speculated in real eastate and when he died in 1850 he left Henry his entire fortune.

from the "American Volunteer" newspaper, October 10, 1850:

The deceased was one of the oldest citizens of our borough, having been a resident of Carlisle for more than forty years. He was kind, Charitable and humane. The poor never sought his aid in vain and the wants of the destitute always found him a benefactor. Ardent and sincere in his friendship, those who have experienced his liberality and enjoyed his warm and abiding friendship and esteem will long remember the unostentatious charity and personal kindness of their deceased friend.

John died of paralysis at his home at the age of 71 years.

? Agnew was a son by a second wife and was educated as a lawyer and became the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of Pennsylvania.[boucher.FTW]

Notes for William D. Agnew:

from the "American Volunteer" newspaper in Carlisle Pennsylvania:

William was the eldest son of John and Margaret Agnew and was educated as a Presbyterian minister at the theological seminary in Princeton, then graduated from Dickson College in Carlisle. He died at Oakland College, Mississippi of yellow fever.

from the "American Volunteer" Newspaper, February 26, 1852:

In this borough, on Tuesday morning last, after a very short but severe illness, James Agnew, esq. aged 24 years. "Truly, in the midst of life we are in death". Our valued young freind was in our office on Wednesday evening last about 7 o'clock, apparently in good health and in fine spirits. Some week or two previously he had a severe cold, for which he had taken medicine and when he was in our office he had boasted of having got rid of his cold so soon. We remonstrated with him however, and remarked that it was very imprudent of him to be out after night. We advised him to go to hi room and to be more careful of himself in future. His reply to us was, "well, freind, if it should happen that I die before you, you are the very man I desire should write an obituary notice of me". He said this in a careless, light manner, little thinking that before our paper was again put to press that he would be cold in death and that we would be forced so soon to comply with his careless remark. Oh, how little did he think of such a thing!

Mr Agnew had studied law in the office Judge Graham and was admitted to the bar at the last January court. He was a young man of more than ordinary ability and bid fair to be a star in his profession. As a public speaker he was bold, enthusiastic and convincing and at the last court he conducted a case with marked ability. He was a warm and sincere freind, full of life and hilarity and when he expressed his freindship it was from the impulse of his heart. He was much beloved by a large circle of acquaintances and his untimely death is universally deplored. But, he is gone! peace, peace to his ashes! We trust he is now with his God where sickness and sorrow can never come.

We sincerely sympathize with the bereaved and careworn mother of the deceased. To her of all others, his loss is irreparable.

from the "Meeting of the Bar":

At a meeting of the members of the Carlisle Bar held at the office of J.S. Colwell, Esq. on the 24th insatant upon the occasion of the death of their late fellow member, James Agnew, Esq. on motion. Honorable Frederick Watts was called to the chair and W.M. Penrose, Esq. appointed secretary. James S. Colwell, Esq. in a few appropriate remarks announced the death of Mr. Agnew.

On motion of Mr Miller a committee of three was appointed to draft resolutions expressive of the feelings of the Bar upon this sad event. The chair appointed W.H. Miller, L. Todd and A.B. Sharp, Esqs., said committee who reported the following which were adopted unanimously.

Resolved, That we deeply lament the death of our fellow member of the Bar, James Agnew, Esquire. With a warm and kind heart social in his feelings and animated in his discourse, he had those qualities which render the ties of freindship and fellowship strong and enduring.

Resolved, That as individuals and as a Bar we entertained high respect for our deceased freind and that we deeply regret the talent which promised success in this profession on which he had just entered with bright prospects for the future, should so soon be silenced in death.

Resolved, That we deeply sympathize with the Mother of the deceased, left desolate by many bereavements and that we offer her our sincere condolence.

Resolved, That the members of the Bar attend the services in a body and wear the usual badge of mourning for thirty days.

Resolved, That a copy of these resolutions be sent to the Mother of the deceased, signed by the officers of the meeting and published in the papers of Carlisle.

Notes for Henry Agnew:

Henry was apprenticed to a painter to learn the trade. He made his home in Greencastle, Pennsylvania and was appointed colonel of the militia by War Governor Curtin of Pennsylvania.

Henry owned a team of blackhorses and Osceola, the indian leader of Florida, who was in Pennsylvania with his two sons, hired Henry to take them back to Florida for fifteen dollars a day. He made the trip in thirty days facing many storms in the mountains.

In 1861 he and his family moved to Franklin Grove, Illinois.

NOTE: the above information is doubtful. There is no record that we have found to substantiate the appointment of Henry Agnew as a Colonel in the army. Also, it is unlikely that the indian leader, Osceola ever went as far as Pennsylvania. When he did travel North it was under a flag of truce issued by General Thomas Jessup in 1837. Jessup thus tricked Osceola into leaving Florida and was promptly captured and imprisoned in Charleston, SC. He was assassinated in prison and his body (minus a head) was returned to Florida for burial. [Lee Agnew, March 8, 1999]

OBITUARY from the Fulton Gazette June 3, 1926 (approx).

William C. Agnew, son of Mr. and Mrs. Henry Agnew was born May 20, 1851, in Greencastle, PA., and passed away in Fulton, IL. at 7 p.m. on June 5, 1926. He had been failing health for the past few months, but was critically ill only for the past two weeks and his sufferings were intense.

In 1861, he moved to Franklin Grove and on July 20, 1872, he was united in marriage to Miss Carrie Ross at Rochelle. Five children were born to this union, but two passed away when very young during the black diphtheria epidemic. In 1921 Mr. and Mrs. Agnew moved to Fulton to make their home and during their short residence there, they made many friends. The surviving family are his wife, three sons, John E. of Galt, James B. of Fulton, Lord D. of Agnew, one brother, John of Haines City, FL., two nephews, Edward Agnew of Waterman, IL and William of Elgin, nine grandchildren and one great granddaughter. Private funeral services were held Tuesday afternoon at 1:30 o'clock at the home with Rev. Sheerer of McCausland, Iowa officiating. Miss Harriet C. Bell sang two selections, "Let Not Your Heart Be Troubled" and "Abide With Me". The funeral cortege then went to Rochelle on the 2:40 o'clock train where burial was made.

John E. Agnew of Galt, retired station agent and postmaster at Galt, passed away at 9:05 p.m. on Tuesday, May 13, 1953 in Community General Hospital where he had been admitted at 6:50 p.m. He had been ill with a heart ailment for some time.

Funeral services will be held at the Melvin Funeral Home Friday at 2:00 p.m. The service will be conducted

by Reverend James D. McKelvey of the First Methodist Church. The burial will take place in Riverside Cemetery.

John Agnew was born September 25, 1877 at Creston, Illinois, the son of William and Carrie Ross Agnew. At the time of his death he was school treasurer in Hopkins Township an office he had held for 40 years. Mr. Agnew retired from the Chicago & North Western Railway after serving 54 years as station agent in Galt. He was postmaster in Galt for 50 years.

After an illness of nearly a year's duration, James B. Agnew former mayor died at 3:15 monday afternoon in his home in Ninth avenue. He underwent two major operations last spring and was a patient in Jane Lamb hospital, Clinton, Iowa for many weeks.

Funeral services will be held at 2:30 wednesday afternoon in the Presbyterian church with the Rev. Jones Earl Corwin in charge.

The Clinton consistory will conduct the Rose Croix service. Burial will be in Oakland cemetery, Clinton, Iowa.

James B. Agnew was born Aug. 10,1879 in Creston, the son of William Clark and Carrie Ross Agnew. He received his education in the schools at Creston and Rochelle.

He was married to Marie Fanger of Clinton and to this union three daughters were born, who survive with his

widow. They are Mrs Alex Frazier of Phoenix, Ariz., Mrs. Walter Sikkema of Fulton and Donna at home.

She was born May 13, 1886 in South Dixon, Illinois, and died October 11, 1976 in Sterling, Illinois.

Notes for Lord Doland Agnew:

Lord Agnew, after finishing high school in Creston, Illinois learned telegraphy for the Chicago and Northwestern Railroad at age seventeen. He worked his way from Chicago, Illinois to Portland, Oregon to San Francisco (He was there during the earthquake that devastated the city) to Omaha, Nebraska all on the railroads connecting lines, then came back to Illinois.

It was while working as a telegrapher in Nelson, Illinois that he met Margaret Ortgiesen who became his wife. He was transferred to Morrison, Illinois in 1906. In March of 1909 they moved to Rock Island Junction where he was assigned agent and operator of the station. Eventually the station was officially renamed Agnew Station and Rock Island Junction became Agnew, Illinois.

Lord opened a general store in Agnew that sold everything from clothing and groceries to harnesses and gasoline. In the late 1930s Lord was reassigned to Morrison, Illinois as both passenger and freight Agent. The depots were on opposite sides of the track and had matching telegraphs in both of them so the operators would always be able to hear them. Lord could tell by the sound of the "fist" who was sending a message.

It was said that Lord received sugar shipments for the gangster, Al Capone, during prohibition at the Agnew depot and delivered them in the Chicago and Northwestern truck to northern Wisconsin. The driver of the truck, Russ, told many stories that will probably never be proven. During the early 1930s Lord and his son London operated a dance hall out of what had been the grocery store and its attached warehouse. Many "name" bands played there such as Eddie Duchin and Henry Busse. Russ would drive the Chicago & Northwestern truck up into Northern Wisconsin and obtain bottled beer from one of Mr Capone's breweries. The beer would be sold from the truck during the dances while a "lookout" watched for "revenue agents". London's children, Lee and Judy, would arise early the next morning to pick up all the empty bottles so Russ could drive them back to Wisconsin before they were discovered. Their Grandfather, Lord, advised them that if they smelled bad they were beer bottles. Otherwise they would only be soda bottles.

"A small area was platted which was called Deets' Sub-division or Rock Island Junction. It included two blocks of ten lots each. In March, 1882, a post office was established there. B. F. Tumbleson was the first postmaster. In later years the name was changed to Agnew after a long-time resident of that name. Like other settlements in Hopkins township, it has dwindled greatly in its commercial enterprises. Taken from History of Whiteside County by Wayne Bastain, pg. 279, paragraph 3.

Lord Agnew was the man Agnew was named after. It is on Rte 30 between Sterling and Morrison. Vice-president candidate Spiro Agnew made a campaign stop there during his campaign, more of a photo op than anything, because it is the only place named Agnew anywhere."

Lord D. Agnew was born June 17, 1882 in Creston, Illinois, the son of William and Carrie Agnew. He was a retired employee of the Chicago & Northwestern Railway after 50 years of service and operated a grocery store in Agnew for many years. In 1907 he was united in marriage to Margaret Ortgiesen and they resided in Agnew for 60 years.

Pallbearers were Lloyd and Walter Bley (neighbors), Mervyn Reed, Frank Larson, John Bauer and Joe Gorzney.
