Notes for JOHN [SR.] ROGERS:

Public information in encyclopedia as well as on the 'net:

Captain John Rogers was a Tory soldier during the American Revolution. He eventually became an Indian Trader and land owner. He married 3 times, all of the Cherokee nation. John James Rogers `Hell-Fire Jack` was a very prominent figure among the Cherokee. He gave them much help and advice. You will find many letters, written by him to the government. He once paid the ransom, demanded for a young boy named Jennings and returned him to his family. John Rogers was often a delegate to Washington, D.C., a Councilman of outstanding ability; and his influence was manifested then and yet today. He was Scottish (English). We know very little about the life of this man before he came among the Cherokee during the Revolution. In an early history of America, it gives that there were two Rogers brothers who came to this country. They first came into Wythe County, Virginia. William went to Pennsylvania, and Ben came to Tennessee. He was also a Captain during the War of 1812, presumably with the Americans.

Notes for SAM HOUSTON:

 She was a tall and beautiful woman, the daughter of Captain John Rogers, one the most prominent white men in the Cherokee Nation. She appeared to be more of a `white woman` because she was less, a quarter Cherokee. Her mother was the part Cherokee sister of two prominent Cherokee Chiefs. She was, according to those who knew her `a half breed.` She has been called by many names, Talhina, Titania, Tyania, Tenia, and many other similar names. Her name was actually Dianna Rogers, but she was known among the Cherokee as Tiana Rogers. The name as it appears in the official documents found in the War Department and Bureau of Indian Affairs is spelled both `Diana` and `Dianna` Rogers. Tradition has it that the name Diana was selected because as a baby Diana was as beautiful as the Greek goddess of the moon and the hunt. Sam Houston was said to have known her by `Hina.` The Cherokees had difficulty in pronouncing the d in Diana, so the name became Tiana.

[1]. Chas Rogers-a Cherokee-lived in the Salina-Spavinw area in the 1830's after moving from Ark. Before that, he & his family lived in Cherokee territory in Tenn. I am searching for the location of his home and where he was

buried. I do not know if he died in what is now Mayes Co.

[2]. Charles Rogers lived at Spavinaw and built the old water mill there on Spavinaw Creek.

Charles supplied quite a lot of timber logs to Fort Gibson area, which were floated down the Grand River.

The art of making good whisky descended from father to son and so it came about that Charles Rogers a son of John decided to engage in the business soon after the removal of the Cherokee Indians in 1829 from Arkansas to their present home. He planned to operate a distillery and grist mill at the same time and set about to secure a location on a stream that would furnish sufficient power for his business; so he found on Spavinaw Creek not only the water power and a good location to build his mill and dam but also a beautiful site for his home which he erected near by, which became the old settlement called Spavinaw.

Before he had completed his establishment, there occurred in June, 1833, what was probably the greatest flood known to Oklahoma history, and Rogers' dam and mill were badly damaged. But his greatest loss occurred the next year when he was notified that in compliance with a law recently enacted by Congress, he would not be permitted to operate his distillery and would be obliged to destroy his equipment which he thereafter did. He later filed a claim with the Government for the loss of his property. Governor Montford Stokes, Cherokee agent located near Fort Gibson, then appointed Samuel Mackey and Wm. A. Keys to describe and appraise Rogers' establishment.

The appraisal made by these men and afterward filed with the War Department at Washington has preserved a picture of this enterprising establishment, located on the bottom of what is now the lake that furnishes water to the city of Tulsa: "Appraisal of Mr. Charles Rogers' Distillery establishment with all the appurtenances thereto attached, Gristmill, dam, etc. as made by Saml. Mackey and Wm. A. Keys viz: "The still house is a frame building 30x24 feet 10 feet high, with mulberry pickets set all around. Raftered, gable ends weatherboarded; the roof is of clapboards nailed on; two puncheon floors and one door; the whole estimated at two hundred and fifty Dollars \$250

"This building contains one large Still holding one hundred & Seventy Gallons with a boiler & Stiver, one doubling Still holding ninety three gallons, one frame box for the boiler to Stand in, two flake stands, three pumps, six lead troughs, two troughs 24 feet long to contain water to Support the Still when in operation; the whole appraised at Six hundred and ten Dollars \$610

"An additional building Attached to the Still house; the lower Story framed, set round with Mulberry pickets 30 by 25 ft., 9 ft. high; half Story above of hewed logs raftered & board roof nailed on; Gable ends weatherboarded; two puncheon floors and two doors, one double the other Single; this whole estimated to be worth three Hundred Dollars \$300

"This building contains Sixty-six Still-tubs at two dollars per tub \$132

"Both of the buildings above described Stand in a pit sunk in the ground 49 feet in length 30 ft. wide and 10 ft. in depth; at four hundred dollars \$400.

"The millhouse is a two story building; the lower is a frame 21 by 18 ½ and 13 feet high; the upper story is of hewed logs 18 ft. square, Raftered board roof nailed on; Gable ends weatherboarded; one puncheon floor & one door; the building is sit one half of its size in the bank excavated; the mill is what is termed an over-shot with a wheel sixteen feet in diameter; other works in proportion, Irons included; the mill is Single-gearred all new and in good order. The whole of above described is appraised at Eight hundred Dollars \$800.00

"The water is conducted to the wheel through a race 128 ft. in length 5 ft. in width & 3 ft. depth, with a frame let down the full size and whole length, with a plank bottom & sides Sheeted, all of oak plank 1 ¼ Inches in thickness; estimated at three hundred and one Dollars.

"Another race running round the other side of the establishment called the waste way is 230 ft. in length 5 ft. wide and 4 ft. deep, planked only a part of the way; is estimated at one hundred dollars \$100.00

"The Mill dam is 115 feet in length, 13 feet high; in the center across the top of the dam is 20 feet, which is a level the whole length, and a slope of 10 feet extending down into the water; the dam is made entirely of clay and is perfectly water tight without any leek; valued at Five hundred dollars \$500.00

"Damages done the aforesaid distillery establishment by the June fresh of 1833, Five hundred and fifty Dollars \$550.00.

"Capt. Geo. Vashon Sir The above is a Joint valuation made by us of Mr. Charles Rogers distillery establishment with all the appertunances & fixtures attached and Gristmill inclusive of stones, dam, races, & C, affixing to each particular what we fairly believe a correct & just valuation in witness whereof we hereunto Subscribe our names Cherokee nation west 26 Sepr. 1835 Saml. Mackey William A. Keys.

Mackey before me an acting Justice of the Peace for said County and made oath that the within is a true valuation of the mill and distillery establishment within described, Sworn and Subscribed to this 29th day of September A D 1835—before me Jacob Chandler, J. Keys before me an acting Justice of the peace within and for said County and made oath that the foregoing valuation was made by myself and Samuel McKey. and to the best of our judgment William A. His birth record appears to change as one peruses different research tools...from 1792 to 1810, in Indian Territory Georgia.

PUBLISHED RECORDS: Emmet Starr's "History of the Cherokee Indians" is considered to be an accurate accounting of the genealogy of the Cherokee. Pleasant Rogers is recorded on page 307 as being the son of CHARLES ROGERS and NANNIE DOWNING. This same Pleasant Rogers is recorded on page 647 as being the father of EDITH [EDY] CAROLINE ROGERS who married ROBERT ALLEN PRATHER. This accounting does not include wives' names for Pleasant but does include some of his children.

PUBLISHED RECORDS: typed here word for word with no added commentary:

pg. 261-262 of "Full Blood Cherokee", listing applications to the Indiana rolls. 28817 Howard L. Prather: 'My name is Howard L. Prather. I live at Grove, Okla. I was born in Texas in 1862. I claim my Cherokee blood through my mother, who name was Caroline C. Rogers. That was her maiden name. My father and mother were married in Tenn. but I don't know where my mother was born. I don't know when they were married. My oldest sisters was born in 1847 and she was the first child. I don't know where she was born. My mother has been dead over 2 years and she was 76 years old when she died. She got her Indian blood from her father, my grandfather, whose name was PLEASANT ROGERS. I don't know where my mother was living in 1851. We moved from Texas to Okla. Prior to that we had moved from MO. in Jasper co., Mo. They came from Tenn., to Mo. but I don't know what year. I don't know where my oldest sister was born. My mother had a brother, GEORGE ROGERS. I knew him. They came to this country from Mo. I was enrolled with the Dawes Commission in 1838. My uncle George had 2 children, but I don't know there names. I think my mother was living in Tenn. in [word smudged]. My mother was third cousin to William Boudinot wife of Tahlequah, Okla. My mohter had one sister, she was younger than my mother and her name was JANE and she married a man name of PECK. I don't know when she married. She lived in Mo. just prior to her death. My mother had a half brother by the name of William Rogers. I was first enrolled by the Dawes Commission about ten years ago, I think. I was enrolled by the Dawes Commission when it first came here. I have been living here on the Cherokee land since 1867. My grandfather, Pleasant Rogers died before we came here. My wife is an Indian also. She is a Cherokee. My mother drew money here, but I never heard anything about her drawing any money before she came here. I do not know any one now living who knew about my mother's moving from Tenn. I don't know what County my mother lived in Tenn. There was no contest over my being enrolled. We came here in 1867 and proved our rights before Robertr Daniels' Court at Tahlequah and were allowed to settle on the land and make improvements. They were then remarried by Indian law. We did not have any contest over the later enrollments at all." signed: Howard L. Prather, Grove, Okla, Sept. 8, 1908

page 262 - - application #16758=6042: - Margaret J. Parks:

"I am 53 years of age. I claim my Indian blood through my mother. She never got any Indian money from the government. I am an allottee and got my percapita payment in the Cherokee Nation. She was about 76 when she died. I never heard her say if she got money in 1852 when the Immigrants were paid. My grandfather, PLEASANT ROGERS, was the Indian. I had one sister and one brother older than I. My mother was born in Tennessee. My mother came to this country about 1866. My mother was an allottee. My allotment number is 9704. My father was a white man. My mother's mother was a white woman. I never saw my grandfather, PLEASANT ROGERS. He died in Tennessee." Signed: Margaret J. Parks, Vinita, Okla, Oct. 14, 1908

page 9, next vol. - - 16758. MARGARET J. PARKS and 1 child, Vinita, Okla. Rejected. Ancestors were not parties to treaties of 1835-6 or 1846, names of ancestors can not be found on any Cherokee rolls. The only proof of Indian blood is that of O.S. The sister of Pleasant Rogers [through whom applicant claims Cherokee blood] made affidavit that Pleasant was her brother. Lucien B. Bell testifies that his sister who made that affidavit was an Old Settler.

"My name is MARGARET J. PARKS. I am 54 years old. I claim my Indian blood thru my mother. My father was a white man and my husband was a white man. My mother was born about the year 1830 to 1835. She was born in Tenn. I don't know the County. I have often hear her talk about Obion Co. I don't know whether she was born there or not. My mother's parents were PLEASANT ROGERS and PHOEBE ROGERS. My mother was married in Tenn. We left Tenn. just before the war and went to Texas. We came to the Indian Territory just after the war. We first went to Mo. and staid there one year - then we moved to near Maysville, Ark. in the Ind. Ter. In 1851 my mother was married. I have some older brothers and sisters older than me who are dead. There were three children older than I. My mother gets her Indian blood thru her father. Her mother was a white woman. PLEASANT ROGERS came to the west. I do not know when he came to the west. I do not know whether he came before 1851 or not. I do not know whether he came before 1835 or not. PLEASANT ROGERS died before I was born. I do not know whether he was living in 1851 or 1835. I do not know why my mother was never enrolled on the roll of 1851 or the roll of 1835. I never shared in the Old Settler payment of 1896. The brothers and sisters of my mother were GEORGE, JANE PECK, nee ROGERS, JASPER. These were the full brothers and sisters of my mother. My grandfather PLEASANT ROGERS married twice. The above named children were the children by the second wife. My grandmother, PHOEBE ROGERS, died in Mo. The half brothers of my mother were MATILDA, WILLIAM - FERRIL [WILLIAM FERRILL] and FED or FRED. I do not know whether any of the half brothers of my mother were on the roll of 1851 or not. I do not know the name of the mother of these children. The father of PLEASANT ROGERS was CHARLES ROGERS. I do not know whether he came west or not. I do not know where my mother was living in 1835. I do not know whether PLEASANT ROGERS was living in 1835 or not. All my brothers and sisters except HOWARD and RICHARD married white women. My brother RICHARD was married four times. His first wife was GEORGIA ANN ROGERS, was a Cherokee, and by that marriage he had one child MINNIE E. ROGERS TURNER. The father of GEORGIA ANN ROGERS was GEORGE ROGERS, a Cherokee. GEORGE ROGERS was an Old Settler. GEORGE ROGERS was some relation to PLEASANT ROGERS but I do not know what it was. The wife of GEORGE ROGERS was a white woman. The second wife of my brother RICHARD was a white woman. The third wife of my brother RICHARD was a Cherokee. There were two children by the marriage, CALLIE PRATHER CUNNINHAM and DICK PRATHER, who are both living. The mother of these children was HATTIE CARR, before she was married and HATTIE CARR'S parents were EDWARD CARR and SUSAN CARR, nee PARKS. EDWARD CARR was not a Cherokee. Lucien B. Bell wrote: "I am 70 years old. I first became acquainted with this family about the year 1868. I never knew PLEASANT ROGERS. I knew the mother of MARGARET J. PARKS. When I first became acquainted with them they were not members of the Cherokee Nation. They made application to be admitted to the Cherokee Nation about 1880. They were admitted and then their case was reopened subsequently on the ground that fraud had been committed in securing admission to the Nation. The former action was ratified and they were thereafter recognized as citizens of the Cherokee Nation. No fraud was found to have been committed. The question at issue was whether the mother of Mrs. Parks was a matter of fact the child of PLEASANT ROGERS. Mrs. Cynthia Crump, who is now dead then testified that PLEASANT ROGERS was her brother. I never knew PHOEBE ROGERS, the wife of PLEASANT ROGERS. Mrs. Cynthia Crump was an Old Settler. I never heard of PLEASANT ROGERS until this admission case came up and the fact that he was not on the roll of 1835 led me to believe that he died before that time. I was not in the case and had nothing to do with it. I do not know a great deal about it." signed: LUCIEN B. BELL, Vinita, Okla., Mar. 11, 1909

There are factions who believe that this is all lies [or, excuse me, all lies but the portions that they want to believe]. They want to believe that Charles Rogers and Nannie Downing are not this man's parents but so far all they have offered in evidence are land and court records that do substantiate that persons by those names lived near each other and were PROBABLY members of a family but not exact relationships as do these records. Believe what you will but allow those of us who have records stating EXACT relationships to remain unmolested.

Obion County, in the NW corner of Tennessee in the western grand division of the state, was created in 1823 from Indian lands and is named for the Obion River, chief watercourse of the area. In 1812, this area was still Indian territory, so its entirely possible that Phoebe as well as Pleasant were Cherokee.

As per John Thomas, although from this point backwards, we are not in agreement, from this point forward we do agree. He uses land records, etc., which do NOT state relationships and at this point assumes relationships to be there which may or may not be true. There were approx. 4,000 'rogers/rodgers' in the united states during the questionable time period and 'williams, samuels, charles and even pleasants' abounded. He assumes that as Pleasant, is listed on a census near to William, his case is made as there is no Charles in that county...[there is one 2 counties over] and living next door to daddy is not now, nor was it then, the norm. He assumes that Chasy Rogers was William's widow when there is no such evidence and she could have been his sister and Pleasant's sister as my portion of the family believes. I took my info from sources which stated relationships quite plainly...signed Joyce Atchley.

They were admitted and then their case was reopened subsequently on the ground that fraud had been committed in securing admission to the Nation. The former action was ratified and they were thereafter recognized as citizens of the Cherokee Nation. No fraud was found to have been committed. The question at issue was whether the mother of Mrs. Parks was a matter of fact the child of PLEASANT ROGERS. Mrs. Cynthia Crump, who is now dead then testified that PLEASANT ROGERS was her brother. I never knew PHOEBE ROGERS, the wife of PLEASANT ROGERS. Mrs. Cynthia Crum was an Old Settler. I never heard of PLEASANT ROGERS until this admission case came up and the fact that he was not on the roll of 1835 led me

Sometime after this incident, Samuel P. left the territory and wen to Stoddard Co., MO where he lived with his great aunt Chacy Jane Rogers Peck and his great uncle George William Rogers for a time.
