Paul and Lucille met in Hannibal Mo. Both had come to live with thier sisters, these sisters were neighbors. Paul was going to electrical school, not sure which sister he was living with, Winnifred I suppose.

Grandpa built a little trailer for Mom's dog, Rex, a German Shepherd, when they moved from Hannibal to Colorado Springs that was pulled behind thier 1930 Chevrolet. At intervals Grandpa would let the dog out and it would come back with a Jack Rabbit, Mom worried about how to feed the dog on the trip and that was a relief to her. They got to Colorado but wages wer not good so moved to Las Vegas(3 yrs) where Grandpa was a Steamfitter. A trip to Mexico and a "La Fiesta" hooked mom on Caballeros and Mexican food. Back to Colorado Springs on East Kiowa/across the creek from St. Francis hospital where Uncle Sonny was born in 1938 and then to 1029 N. Chestnut. Gpa worked for Glen Miller Plumbing and Heating in Colo Spgs.

Grandpa Edwards must have learned from his father Milby how to be a fun Grandpa. He allways played with us and seemed so serene and it just made me feel the same. Comfortable and homey. Bon and I visited them, got to go on planes to Page and Phoenix Az. Grandpa worked on Glen Canyon Dam. We got to see the different stages of it being built and played in the playground that was built for all the Trailers of people working on the dam. Lots of Red Sand!!!! Grandpa broke his arm when young bucked off a horse so could not move it straight but it was the perfect curve to hold granddaughters in his lap!!

The night before Daddy died, after weeks of pain from the cancer eating away, he brought Mom, Bonnie and Donna together. He asked if he could stand, with a little help he did. He stood himself as erect, tall and proud as ever. Daddy then told us easily as though he were not in pain and with his beautiful eyes as bright as before he was ill, with that glint of such warmth in them, "Thank you for caring for me here, you all did so much for good care, now I am free to fly like a bird". He stood through all our hugs though it must have pained him so, through our tears, we had, thanks to God and that Fry tenacity such a last beautiful moment together. He told Mom he wanted to be home when he passed on and she graciously upheld his wishes.

This a quote from Jeromy, "He was the finest man I ever knew." He always played with his grand kids and had special projects lined up for our visits to them. Science stuff and building things. Once they settled down in Phoenix after all their travels he set up croquet for each visit also. I finally learned the dead mans float from Dad, swim a lot in Phoenix.
