Notes for ANDREW JACKSON SHILL:

Andrew Jackson Shill was born in Sidney, Shelby County, Ohio. He lived there until around the mid 1860's when the family moved to Lafayette, Indiana. He worked as a mail carrier in Indiana carrying mail between Lafayette and various parts of Indiana.

On the 1st of April, 1862, along with his brothers John and Thomas, enlisted in the Union Army. They all were in the 26th Indiana Infantry, G Co. Their residence was listed as Concord, Indiana. During a battle at Sterling Plantation in Louisiana, Andrew and his brother Thomas were captured by the confederates. Below is a brief summary of the battle. They walked to Tyler Texas along with many more prisoners. Some only in shorts with no shirts or shoes. He was fed only a tablespoon of corn and sometimes a piece of dried beef. Andrew and Thomas remained prisoners for 10 months. They were part of a prison exchange. They all mustered out, April 4, 1865.

After the war, he moved to Iowa along with his brothers John and General. General Shill served in the Union Army but enlisted in Ohio. Thomas moved back to Shelby County, Ohio. He lived with General and his wife Margaret, until he married Elnora in 1873. He worked as a Harness maker. Harley was born 1874 in Lucas County. Arthur was born 5 years later in 1879.

Andrew spent the the next 15 years in Council Bluffs, Iowa. When Elnora died in 1908, he moved in with his son Harley and family. In August he married Georgia Kramer. She gave birth to a boy named George and then died in 1910. It is unknown what became of George. He married a third time in 1913 to Edna Pace. Had one more son named Lee in October of 1914. Andrew died the following year.

Stirling's Plantation

Other Names: Fordoche Bridge

Location: Pointe Coupee Parish

Campaign: Taylor's Operations in West Louisiana (1863)

Date(s): September 29, 1863

Description: Following the Union defeat at Sabine Pass earlier in the month, Maj. Gen. Nathaniel P. Banks intended to occupy important locations in Texas. He decided to send troops up the Bayou Teche, disembark them on the plains and march overland to Texas. Maj. Gen. Ulysses S. Grant sent him a division, commanded by Maj. Gen. Napoleon J.T. Dana to garrison Morganza and prevent Rebel troops from operating on the Atchafalaya River. A 1,000-man detachment, under the command of Lt. Col. J.B. Leake, was at Stirling's Plantation to guard the road to the Atchafalaya River and deter any enemy troops from passing by. Brig. Gen. Alfred Mouton, commander of the Sub-District of Southwestern Louisiana, decided that he had a favorable opportunity to defeat the Union forces around Fordoche Bridge. On September 19, he instructed Brig. Gen. Tom Green to prepare for such an attack. Mouton provided Green with reinforcements and gave the order to attack on the 25th. Green's force began crossing the Atchafalaya River on the 28th, and all were over after midnight of the 29th. At dawn on the 29th, Green's men marched out. Confederate cavalry began skirmishing with Union pickets at Fordoche Bridge before noon and continued for about a half hour. Green's other troops then hit the Union force, drove them and captured many, although most of the Federal cavalry found an escape route. Although Dana sent reinforcements, mud and rain slowed their progress and allowed Green to get away. Green had defeated this Union force handily, but it did not deter Banks from his intended movement.

Result(s): Confederate victory

Camp Ford

On this site during the Civil War was located Camp Ford, the largest prisoner of war compound for Union troops west of the Mississippi River, named in honor of Col. John S. 'Rip' Ford who originally established a training camp here in 1862. It was converted in the summer of 1863 to a prison camp.

It first consisted of four to five acres enclosed by a stockade sixteen feet high. In the spring of 1864 following the Confederate victories at Mansfield, Louisiana and Mark's Mills, Arkansas the enclosure was doubled to accommodate the large influx of prisoners. Approximately 4700 Federals were confined here during this period. This overcrowded condition was somewhat relieved through a series of prisoner of war exchanges between the North and the South.

Union soldiers representing nearly one hundred different regiments plus sailors from gunboats and transports were confined here. In addition there were imprisoned Union sympathizers, spies, and even Confederate deserters.

The prisoners constructed their own shelters ranging from log huts and burrows called "shebangs" to brush arbors and tents made of blankets.

A spring located about 100 yards southwest of this marker furnished an ample supply of good water. Their meager rations, essentially the same as that of their guards, usually consisted of beef and corn meal and were sometimes supplemented by vegetables purchased from nearby farms.

Although escape attempts were frequent, very few were successful due to the long distance to Union lines and the difficulty in eluding the tracking hounds used by the Confederate guards. Even though conditions were primitive it compared favorably with the other Civil War prison camps. Camp Ford continued to serve as a prison until the surrender of the Trans-Mississippi Department in May, 1865. It was later destroyed by Federal occupation troops.

Retired after 40 years there. Helped install the first telephone lines between Chicago, IL and St. Louis, MO. It was during this time that he met Shirley Vreeland in Morris, IL. She was working as a waitress when they met.

Spent most of his life in Chicago although they did move alot. Grandma like to buy and sell houses in Chicago.

After retiring he spent his summers at Bass Lake/Knox Indiana and the winters in St. Petersburg, Florida. They sold the cottage and lived in a mobile home outside of Knox for a short time. They then moved to a two bedroom home in Rolling Meadows, Illinois but still went south for the winter.
