

Descendants of Henry TRUE "of Salem"

Generation No. 1

1. **Henry TRUE "of Salem"** died 1659. He married **Israel PIKE** 1644 in Salem, MA, daughter of John PIKE and Sarah Saunders. She died March 12, 1699/00.

Notes for Henry TRUE "of Salem":

Henry TREW (as it was spelled then) is said to have emigrated from the neighborhood of Huddersfield, Yorkshire, England. He settled at Salem, MA, in 1644, but one record has him coming to this country as early as 1630. A large chart bearing the title "Genealogy of the Family of True, in America", has the notation: "Deed or Bill of Sale. I, Edward gibens doe acknowleg to have Received of henry True of Salem four pound for the House in Salem, which was Mr. Strattens; and by this payment doe give him fulle perseson of the said house; to him and his forever. the 16 day of August 1644 by me Edward gibens," and in another place, "'Henry Trew g.l. (Granted Land) 1649.' Felt's Annals of Salem." Shortly after his arrival he married Israel Pike, whose brother was Major Robert Pike. One source indicates the year of Henry's death as 1660.

Note on the name: The name appears to have a Gaelic origin. The Irish Gaelic "trius" and the Scots Gaelic "triubhas" were singular nouns used to denote "close fitting shorts". In Scotland, while male inhabitants of the Highlands traditionally wore the kilt, Lowlanders generally wore what we now call "pants", a garment with legs that was drawn on over the feet (hence also the term "drawers"). In Gaelic these were referred to as "trews" or "trouse", the term being borrowed into English in the 16th Century as "trewsers" or "trousers".

After the 1745 uprising by the Highland Clans in support of Charles Edward Stewart ("Bonnie Prince Charlie") was put down by the English forces of King George II, the wearing of their traditional dress by the Highlanders was proscribed. Many Highlanders had their kilts sewn into trews and "tartan trews" became a common form of apparel throughout the country.

In the south of Scotland and the bordering English county of Yorkshire, the family name Trews or Trew, was not uncommon. After Henry Trew of Salem emigrated to this country, he apparently changed the spelling to True. I have not found any records that indicate a reason or reasons for this change, but the spelling of True has been used by this branch of the family at least, ever since.

2. Henry TRUE "of² Salisbury" (Henry TRUE "of¹ Salem") was born March 08, 1644/45, and died September 08, 1735. He married **Jane BRADBURY** March 15, 1667/68, daughter of Thomas BRADBURY and Mary PERKINS. She was born May 11, 1645, and died January 24, 1728/29.

Notes for Henry TRUE "of Salisbury":

Referred to as "Henry True of Salisbury" (resided in Salisbury, MA). Also listed as "Captain Henry True." "Henry True was captain in the Militia from 1696 to 1722. Records of Salisbury (?) note, "May 13, 1695, Henry True was chosen Representative to serve at 1st session of ye grate and general Cort to be holden at Boston in town house May 27, 1695."

Birthdate is apparently listed as Jan. 18, 1644 in "Founders of Massachusetts Bay Colony", by Sarah Saunders Smith, Pittsfield, Mass., Press of the Sun Printing Co., 1897. Something doesn't add up, however. If Henry True of Salem arrived in this country in 1644 and didn't meet Israel Pike until then (she is said to have immigrated with her family in 1635), it would seem that a birthdate of 1645 is more likely. However, if the immigrant Henry arrived in this country in 1630, then there is no real problem with the 1644 date.

Notes for Jane BRADBURY:

NOTES for her mother, Mary Perkins Bradbury:

Amongst the records of my father, Oscar True Babcock, is the following handwritten note, with a heading of "Interesting things", then the words "Wills - lists", the meaning of which is unclear. My father's note provides a tantalizing bit of evidence connecting the family -- in a way -- with the infamous Salem Witch Trials! His note reads:

"1680 - John Carr in love with Jemima True -- Broken off by his father on account of his youth -- He became melancholy and insane and died." (This must have been Henry of Salisbury's younger sister Jemima, who had married Capt. John March in 1679, and not Henry's daughter Jemima, as 1680 is the year of her birth and such a passionate infatuation as this is not usually directed at a new-born babe. -- B.B.) The handwritten note continues:

"1692 (12 years later) Mary Perkins Bradbury, age 70, arrested, charged with bewitching John Carr so that he became insane and prematurely died. "The deposition of William Carr who testifieth and saith that about 13 years ago, presently after some differences that happened to be between my honored father, Mr. George Carr and Mrs. Bradbury, the prisoner at the bar, upon a Sabbath at noon, as we were riding home by the house of Capt. Thomas Bradbury, I saw Mrs. Bradbury go into her gate, turn the corner and immediately there darted out of her gate a blue boar, and darted at my father's horses legs which made him stumble, but I saw it no more. And my father said, "Boys, What did you see?, and we both said, "A Blue Boar." ' ' End of quote from the deposition, but my father adds a postscript, "She was convicted (as a witch - B. B.) with 4 others who were executed Sept. 1692. She escaped hanging."

Imagine convicting someone of a hanging offense on the basis of evidence like this! Someone from a family with whom you've had a history of "some differences", accuses you of being a witch since he says he thinks you changed yourself into a "Blue Boar" and frightened his father's horse. And on the basis of this testimony, you're convicted and condemned to hang! Of course we don't know if William Carr's testimony was the only evidence presented. Did others also think they witnessed Mary

Bradbury in an act of changing herself into a dangerous beast, perhaps a purple chipmunk, or a pink elephant? And, how did she escape hanging in the face of such overwhelming evidence, when the 4 others condemned with her were hanged? And what happened to her? Did she serve a prison term, or just have her head shaved and her ears notched? Was the motivation a 12 year old belief that she had bewitched the unhappy John Carr, even though it was the aggrieved father who opposed the relationship?

(It boggles the mind. And some politicians urge us to return to the "good old days." Perhaps the days of Sen. Joe McCarthy in the 1950's when scores of academics, writers and the like were black-listed and had careers ruined on the basis of similar evidence? Not quite the same as hanging, but the same idea.)

Fortunately, the answers to most of those questions can be found in Marion L. Starkey's book, "The Devil in Massachusetts," 1949, an inquiry into that sordid and disturbing piece of American history. In Chapter XVII, "Eight Firebrands of Hell," Starkey writes:

"The wheels of justice (sic) now turned at full speed. On September 9 the judges tried and condemned six witches (sic), and on September 17 nine more. Of the total of 15, eight were hanged on September 22. All but one of the seven who escaped hanging could be judicially accounted for. Five were... condemned but reprieved. The sixth... got a stay of execution by pleading pregnancy. Only with the seventh was there any irregularity. Mary Bradbury of Salisbury 'escaped' or if escaped is too strong a word, she being too feeble to do anything for herself, at least her friends had in some obscure way managed to hide her from authority...."

Starkey's account goes on to describe Mary Bradbury as "one of the best loved members of her community" and that ninety-three neighbors presented the court with a statement that "in half a century they had never known her to make any trouble." Others, including Reverend James Allen (Allin), testified to her "charity and piety." The book continues: "Her husband, Thomas, to whom she had been married fifty years and borne eleven children, said that she was 'of a cheerful spirit, liberal and charitable,' but now that she was old, 'weak and grieved under her affliction, may not be able to speak for herself, not being so free of speech as others may be.'"

"Such testimony came from the circle of Mrs. Bradbury's affectionate acquaintance. Not everyone in Salisbury belonged to it; at its outer edges were people who took the view that her seeming goodness was a false front behind which she concealed abominations. The elder Ann Putnam... not having moved in Mrs. Bradbury's social set, knew all about the abominations. Her kinsman, Richard Carr, had as good as seen the woman turn herself into a 'blue boar;' anyway he saw the boar rush out of a gate which Mrs. Bradbury had just entered and dash at the feet of his father's horse. Neither he nor another witness doubted that the boar was Mrs. Bradbury, and apparently neither did judges or jury when the story was duly relayed to them." (The "elder Ann Putnam" was the mother of a 12 year old daughter - also named Ann - who was one of the group of teen and pre-teenage girls who had, with their wild accusations, triggered the hysteria about witches that swept through Salem and the surrounding communities.)

There was also testimony that she had even "haunted" ships at sea. A man named Samuel Endicott told the court that his captain had bought "two firkins of butter" from Mary Bradbury prior to a sea voyage and that these had spoiled. (Not too surprising, Starkey notes, since the ship was bound for the Barbados and was not equipped with any refrigeration!) Starkey continues, "The spoiling of the butter was, however, only the beginning of Mrs. Bradbury's display of malefic powers. Soon after the Barbados the ship ran into a storm, lost a mainmast and sprang a leak which ruined several tons of salt. At this point, Mrs. Bradbury gloating over her accomplishment, could not resist the temptation to show off. On a bright moonlit night, Endicott looked up and there she sat on the windlass, neat and composed in her white cap and neckcloth as she had ever been at Meeting at Salisbury. There could be no plainer evidence than that. Mrs. Bradbury was sentenced to hang -- yet did not. Her friends found means of spiriting her away and concealing her...."

In the notes at the end of the book is the following: "Though extensive testimony both for and against

Mary Bradbury remains in the records (see Woodward, W. Elliot, Vol. II, "Records of the Salem Witchcraft," printed in Roxbury, 1864, two volumes), the circumstances of her trial are mysterious. First complained on May 26, she was indicted July 26. Her survivors claimed in 1710 that she had been imprisoned six months, but since notation in the court records (Essex County Archives, "Salem Witchcraft," Vol. II, pp 34-40) explicitly says that she escaped, their statement is obviously erroneous; maybe they meant six weeks."

(The whole story of this sordid chapter in our history is fascinating and well worth looking into. I recommend not only the book quoted here, but if you have a chance to read or, better yet, see the stage play, "The Crucible" by Arthur Miller, don't miss it! It's one of the most powerful stage plays ever written. -- Bryce Babcock)

My son, Taavi Kirk Babcock, found this account of Mary Perkins Bradbury and the full depositions of her husband and others on a Family Tree Maker site, the Bradbury-Perkins Homepage. It is pretty much in agreement with the information in the book quoted above, "The Devil In Massachusetts" although there are some minor differences (the statement signed by 117 Salisbury men and women who knew her, as opposed to 93, for example). Excerpts from The Perkins Family In America (pp. 15 -16) concerning the trial of Mary Perkins Bradbury.

Mary (Perkins) Bradbury was one of those unfortunate people who, in the dark days of witchcraft delusion, was among the accused. She was also convicted, but by the efforts of her friends her execution was delayed, the horrid delusion passed away, and she was discharged. The papers connected with her trial, as well as those of the others, who were, some of them, more unfortunate, have been preserved, and are to be seen on the files in the Clerk of Courts Office in Salem, Mass.

Her defence in answer to the accusations of her persecutors, the testimony of her husband with that of Rev. James Allin and John Pike, her ministers, and the united testimonial of over one hundred of her neighbors and towns-people were all of no avail. These papers show her to have been a most estimable, pious and good woman, and should be recorded in her praise. We copy them from the original:

"The answer of Mary Bradbury to the charge of witchcraft or familiarity with the Devil.--I do plead not guilty. --I am wholly innocent of such wickedness through the goodness of God that hath kept me hitherto. I am the servant of Jesus Christ and have given myself up to him as my only Lord and Saviour, and to the diligent attendance upon him in all holy ordinances, in utter contempt and defiance of the Devil & all his works as horrid and detestable; and have endeavored accordingly to frame my life & conversation according to the rules of his holy word, and in that faith and practice resolve, by the help and assistance of God, to continue to my life's end. For the truth of what I say as to matter of practice, I humbly refer myself to my brethren and neighbors that know me, and to the searcher of all hearts for the truth & uprightness of my heart therein, human frailties & unavoidable infirmities excepted, of which I bitterly complain every day. -- Mary Bradbury. "

"July 28: 1692.--Concerning my beloved wife, Mary Bradbury, this is what I have to say: We have been named fifty-five years, and she hath been a loving and faithful wife to me. Unto this day she hath been wonderfully laborious, diligent and industrious, in her place and employment about the bringing up of our family (which hath been eleven children of our own and four grandchildren) she was both prudent and provident, of a cheerful spirit, liberal and charitable. She being now very aged and grieved under her affliction, may not be able to speak much for herself, not being so free of speech as some others may be. I hope her life and conversation have been such

among her neighbours as gives a better and more real testimony of her than can be expressed by words. -- Tho. Bradbury."

"Being desired to give my testimony concerning the life and conversation of Mrs. Bradbury of Salisbury among us which is as followeth, viz: I have lived nine years at Salisbury in the work of the ministry and now four years in the office of a pastour; to my best notice and observation of Mrs. Bradbury she hath lived according to the gospel among us, was a constant attender upon the ministry of ye word; and all the ordinances of the gospel, full of works of charity and mercy to the sick and poor, neither have I seen or heard anything of her unbecoming the profession of the gospel. -- James Allin. "

"Having lived many years in Salisbury and been much conversant there, according to my best observation and notice of Mrs. Bradbury must needs affirm to what is above written, and give my oath to it if called thereto. -- John Pike."

July 22: 1692. "Concerning Mrs. Bradbury's life and conversation, We the subscribers do testifie that it was such as becometh ye gospel, she was a lover of ye ministry in all appearance and a diligent attender upon Gods holy ordinances being of a curteous and peaceable disposition and carriage, neither did any of us (some of whom have lived in ye towne with her fifty yeare) ever heare or know that she ever had any difference or falling oute with any of her neighbors, man, woman, or child --but was alwayes readie and willing to doe for them what lay in her power night and day, though with hazard to her health or other danger. -- more might be spoken in her comendation but this for the present. "

-- The above was signed by 117 men and women of Salisbury.

Mary (Perkins) Bradbury died in Amesbury in 1700, at the age of eighty years.

It is uncertain whether Martha Kennedy was of Irish or Scottish ancestry (or both). There is a family tradition that indicates that the family was Scots in origin but had spent a period of time in Northern Ireland before coming to the US. Some records indicate Martha's birthplace was Ireland and others that she was born in Scotland. I think Ireland is more likely, as Kennedy is an Irish, not a Scottish, name. There is family tradition indicating that some Scots ancestors lived in Northern Ireland for a number of years, perhaps as much as several generations, before coming to the US. My guess is that the family was Scottish, but that Martha's mother had married an Irishman (Kennedy).

If there is basis to that tradition, it's possible that Martha's family was descended from those Scots Lowlanders who were encouraged by the English King, James I, to move to Ulster and were given land there. The intent was to set up a protestant "plantation" in Northern Ireland and, of course, it was this that led to the ongoing "troubles" between catholics and protestants in this province that have plagued Ulster up to the present time. The main period of this emigration from Scotland to Northern Ireland was between 1606 and the ending of the Stuart dynasty with the ascent to the British throne of William of Orange in 1689. Many of these Scots immigrants intermarried with the native Irish and came to think of themselves as Irish. It's possible that the (Irish) Kennedy name was aquired through intermarriage, and that Martha Kennedy's family had both Irish and Scottish ancestors. Wouldn't that be great!

Although the Scots emigrants prospered for a time, by the early 1700s conditions in Ulster were becoming very difficult. Four years of drought led in 1717 to another migration of these Ulster Scots, this time to the United States. Five great waves of migration to the US took place between 1717 and 1775. In this country, history has come to speak of these immigrants of Scottish decent from Ireland, as the "Scotch-Irish".

The records compiled by my father, Oscar True Babcock, refer to Martha Kennedy as having been born in Ireland. If this is true, the date of her birth in 1770, would place her family as coming to this country probably as part of the last wave of immigrants from Ulster in the period 1771-1775. The family name was apparently sometimes spelled "Kannady."

The year of Martha Kennedy's death is shown in an old handwritten record of the family as 1858, rather than 1838. These crumbling sheets of family records were given to me by Patricia Babcock Wharton, and appear to be in the handwriting of our grandmother, Jessie True Babcock, grand-daughter-in-law of Martha Kennedy, although I may be in error about this.

He married **Mary Catharine McFarland** May 31, 1864 in Olin, Jones, Iowa, daughter of William McFarland and Rosanna McLaughlin. She was born January 07, 1845 in Jones County, Iowa, and died July 11, 1918 in North Loup, Valley, NE.

Notes for Melville Beveridge Cox TRUE:

Melville Beveridge Cox True was born at Temple, Franklin County, ME. His mother was born in nearby Wilton, ME and his parents were married in Temple. Two sisters were born in nearby Farmington, the County Seat, and the largest community in the area. He had two brothers and seven sisters in all. His birth date was January 22, 1838. He has described himself in a "Pictorial Family Register" (which unfortunately has no photos or pictures!) as 5' 8" in height, 135 lbs, with dark brown hair and grey eyes. He describes his complexion as "florid," and his health as "good". He lists his politics as Republican and his religion as Unitarian.

I've been unable to discover anything about his schooling, though he lists (in the "Family Register") his education as "academic". He was well educated for the time as he later was a high school principal and author of several textbooks. In the "Register" he lists his occupation as "Editor and Publisher" and at some later date his daughter, Jessie, added "Lawyer and Supt. of Schools." His family moved to Solon, IA, at some time prior to 1858, (probably some years prior to that date, as his sister Sarah's marriage took place there in that year.) When he enlisted in the army in 1861, M. B. C. True listed his occupation as "student."

The Civil War is considered to have begun with the bombardment of Fort Sumter on April 12, 1861. M. B. C. True enlisted in the Union army on August 14 of that year. In the "Pictorial Family Register", M. B. C. True lists the following on a page dealing with his military record: He enlisted at Iowa City, IA

on August 14, 1861, as a private in Company H of the 2nd Iowa Cavalry. He lists a promotion to "Battalion Quarter Master Sergeant", but gives no date for this. He lists under "Memoranda of Engagements" the following: New Madrid, MO (March-April, 1862.); Farmington, TN (May 1862); luka, MS (Sept. 1862); Corinth, MS (Oct. 1862); Watervalley, MS; and Coffeeyville, MS (Dec. 1862). (The dates of these engagements are my own notations - Bryce Babcock.) M.B.C. True was discharged on Oct. 3, 1864.

In my father's (Oscar T. Babcock, grandson of M.B.C. True) geneological papers is the following note beside the entry for his grandfather: "In the battle of Corinth in Miss. Quartermaster Sargent. Brevet Lieut. and acting captain of a colored regiment." I've been unable to verify that information, and do not know the source(s). M.B.C. True says nothing in the above mentioned document about a brevet promotion or of service with any unit of the army other than the 2nd Iowa Cavalry. The rank of Sergeant was his permanent rank. A brevet commission was a temporary advancement in rank, but usually without a corresponding advancement in pay. Such commissions were normally given in recognition of gallant actions on the battlefield or meritorious service in combat.

On May 31, 1864 M. B. C. True married Mary Catherine McFarland at Olin, Jones County, IA, while home from the army on furlough. His home at that time was Solon, IA. His official discharge certificate shows that he was discharged from the army as a "Commissary Serg't., of Captain George B. Harrington's Company (H), Second Regiment, Iowa Cavalry, Volunteers." His discharge took place at Davenport, IA, and is dated Oct. 3, 1864. It gives his date of enlistment as Aug. 14, 1861 "to serve three years, and the discharge was "by reason of expiration of term of service. (No objection to his being re-enlisted is known to exist.)" (In other words, an "Honorable Discharge".) The document also states, "Said Melville B. C. True was born in Franklin Co. in the State of Maine, is 23 years of age, five feet eight inches high, Fair complexion, Hazel eyes, dark brown hair, and by occupation when enrolled, a student." (The notation of his age is confusing, as he would have been 26 at the time of discharge. Perhaps it was an error, or was intended to refer to his age at the time of enlistment, not discharge.)

After his discharge, he and his new bride "lived at different places in Iowa, and in 1872, they moved to Nebraska." For some fourteen years they lived at Crete, NE, moving to North Loup, NE in 1887. M. B. C. True became the first principal of the North Loup High School. Later, they lived for a time in Edgar, and then in Tecumseh, but " in 1903, Mr. True being broken in health, they came back to North Loup." He died Feb. 6, 1909 at North Loup and is buried in the North Loup cemetery.

M. B. C. and Mary Catherine were the parents of 5 children: Jessie Fremont True, Archibald (Archie) True, Sidney Merlin True, Abigail Kennedy (Gail) True and Alaric Roy (Larry) True. M. B. C. True was the author of at least two textbooks designed for high school courses in Civics, History and Government: "Our Republic" (with J. W. Dickinson) (1882) and "History and Civics of Nebraska" (1892).

Notes for Mary Catharine McFarland:

The following is the obituary of "Kate M. True", printed in the North Loup Loyalist (July 19, 1918) and written by her daughter, Jessie True Babcock.

"Mary Katherine McFarland was born near Rome, Iowa, in pioneer days, the only child of James and Rosanna McLaughlin McFarland. Her early education was received from her mother. Later she attended the Methodist college at Mt. Vernon, Iowa. At the age of 16, she left school lacking but a few months of graduating and was later made an honorary alumnus of that institution.

May 31, 1864, she was married to M. B. C. True of Solon, Iowa, who was home from the army on furlough. After the war they lived at different places in Iowa, and in 1872, they moved to Nebraska, and for fourteen years made their home at Crete. In 1887 they came to North Loup where Mr. True

was the first principal of the high school. Later they went to Edgar and Tecumseh but in 1903, Mr. True being broken in health, they came back to North Loup. Here Mr. True died in 1909 and Mrs. True continued to reside alone in apparent good health till three weeks ago, she was taken sick and died at the home of her son-in-law, E. J. Babcock, July 11, 1918.

In her early life she joined a Unitarian church but there being no church of that faith where she has lived, she always allied herself and worked with other denominations, and was especially interested in patriotic and educational organizations.

She was the mother of six children: Mrs. Jessie Babcock of North Loup; Charles S. who died in infancy; Larry R., who died in young manhood (This was Alaric "Larry" Roy True, who was murdered at the age of 30 in 1898, near Cincinnati, Ohio -- Bryce Babcock.); Archie M. , of Manila, P. I.; Sidney M., of Saguache, Colorado; and Mrs. Gail Doan of Kennewick, Washington. She is also survived by thirteen grandchildren. Funeral services conducted by pastor Davis were held at the Seventh Day Baptist church Saturday afternoon and the body was laid to rest by the side of her husband (in the North Loup cemetery -- B. B.)."

The "Family Register" begun by M. B. C. True contains this entry regarding their marriage: "We hereby certify that we were legally married by Rev. A. Brosson (sp. ?) in the town of Madison, Jones Co. and State of Iowa on the 31st day of May, 1864." It is signed, "Melville B. C. True" and "Mary C. McFarland".

The Register contains the following data: Name: Mary Catherine McFarland; Birthplace: Rome, Jones County, Iowa; Date of Birth: January 7th 1845; Descent: Scotch (sic); Father's Name: William Matthews McFarland; Mother's Name: Rosanna Virginia McLaughlin; Brothers and Sisters: None; Education: Collegiate; Occupation: Housewife; Politics: Republican & Womans Suffrage; Religion: Unitarian; Date of Marriage, May 31, 1864. Her "autograph" is written as "Kate True" and she describes herself as 4' 11" tall and weighing 110 lbs. She gives her complexion as "dark" with dark brown hair and dark grey eyes, and lists her health as "Good".

The discrepancies in the spelling of her name is explained by her daughter, Jessie True Babcock, in a letter to my father, O. T. Babcock, dated May 12, 1941: "Grandmother True (yours) used to spell her name Mary Catherine. My father always insisted that in business and legal matters a woman should use her own name. But she insisted she would not 'part her name in the middle' and write it M. Catherine True, so in all public matters she wrote it Mary C. When Kate (Jessie True's daughter Katharine -- B. B.) was born, I liked it better spelled with a K, and Grandmother said she remembered her father's mother spelled it with a K. She did not know why her mother used a C. From then on she wrote her name Kate (or Katharine) M. True, the M being for McFarland and dropped the Mary."

Notes for John (?) McLaughlin:

On the back of one of my father's genealogical charts is this note, very faintly written in pencil:

"John McLaughlin worked for Robert Morris a wealthy liquor merchant. He never drank. Later he went into business for himself. Then after not working with liquor he began to drink -- quit, went to farming. His son John ran the farm and hated liquor so he formed a society of people who wouldn't touch liquor. They couldn't get farm help because they wouldn't furnish liquor. Was it the first temperance society in America?"

When ill with typhoid fever he drank a whole pan of milk -- couldn't have water -- and died."

I have no idea where my father (O. T. Babcock) obtained this little piece of information. It's not totally clear whether the note is in reference to this John, or his son of the same name. -- Bryce Babcock

Notes for William McFarland:

A faint note on the back of one of my father's (Oscar True Babcock) genealogical charts is this note:

"William McFarland --fording river full of ice, wagon upset, worked in icy water, died of pneumonia."

I had heard this story told by my grandmother when I was a young boy. My memory was that the family was moving by wagon from Iowa to Nebraska when this incident took place. Kate (Mary Catherine), my great-grandmother, would have been just two years old at the time, and must have been traveling in the wagon. I don't recall ever asking why they were making this move in the middle of the winter. I wish I knew more details of this incident.

It's very possible that my memory is incorrect regarding the incident occurring during a move from Iowa to Nebraska. It may have occurred during a routine trip to or from town with supplies and that no other person was in the wagon at the time. I think I remember my grandmother identifying the river being forded as the Maquoketa River which flows through Jones Co. in eastern Iowa where Kate (Mary Catharine) was born. If that is correct, the latter scenario of the upset wagon is more likely, as the location is in the opposite direction from Nebraska, nor would they be likely to be moving in the winter. -- Bryce Babcock

Notes for Alaric Roy (Larry) True:

Alaric Roy (Larry) True was probably born at the family home in Jones County, IA. He was the eldest son and second child of Melville Beveridge Cox True and Mary Catharine McFarland True. The date of birth was April 12, 1870. I have not found a birthplace indicated, but the family "moved from Iowa to Crete, Nebr." in 1874 according to his sister, Jessie. She was born in 1865 in Rome, now Olin, Jones Co., IA. As to his given name, Jessie wrote the following, "If you were up on ancient history you would know Larry's name was Alaric, tho why Papa chose such a name I can't see. Larry repudiated it after he was grown... was simply 'Larry'." (see further note at end.)

His father had purchased an interest in the Globe newspaper in Crete, NE, in November, 1882, and Larry went to work for the newspaper at that time. He left the Globe (and Crete) in the summer of 1886 "to try his fortune alone." He became an accomplished and respected printer and proofreader and followed this career for the rest of his life, although his employment was interrupted from time to time by frequent travels.

Larry was described in contemporary accounts as "a typical 'soldier of fortune' ", as having a "roving disposition", and as leading a somewhat "nomadic life." One of his obituaries states, "Like most printers, he remained in one place but a short time. He traversed the United States, east of the Rocky Mountains, from Texas to Boston and north to Quebec. He made two trips to Europe, working his passage both times." He apparently had only sporadic contact with his family, and he never married.

In the summer of 1893 he returned to his parents' home in Tecumseh, NE. It was his first visit home since leaving in 1886, and he was employed "for a few months" by the Tecumseh Chieftan newspaper. In that paper's obituary Larry was described as "...a great traveller. In his journeys he had visited nearly every city in the United States and had made two trips to Europe. He was an excellent workman and skilled proofreader."

After a few months there, Larry went to Cincinnati, OH, and took employment as a proofreader with the Daily Tribune newspaper. He continued his work there after the Tribune consolidated with another paper and became the Commercial - Tribune. He had earlier worked on other papers in Cincinnati and in Toledo, OH.

On Wednesday, October 20 Larry resigned his position and drew his wages. He told several of his co-workers that he was going to Texas to join his brother, Archie, "on a ranch". One report said that his brother was serving in a cavalry regiment stationed in Texas and had sent him \$60 so that Larry could join him there. Larry had lived with the family of J. B. Randal, the paper's composing room foreman, and the next morning as he left the house he also told the Randals that he was going to Texas.

The following morning his body was found floating in the Ohio River, several miles downstream from Cincinnati, near Lawrenceburg, IN. His throat had been cut, and the \$100 dollars or so he had taken with him was missing. The police and coroner concluded that he had been murdered, but the perpetrator was apparently never identified or found. It was thought that he had started down river on board a freight boat, or "shanty" boat, and had been murdered and then robbed.

Larry was an avid reader and was considered to be "something of a bibliophile" and collected old books. That he was held in high esteem by his friends and co-workers is evident from this statement in one of the obituaries: "Those of his friends who had known him most intimately and longest say that he had no enemies; that his vices were so few, if he had any, as to be hardly known; that he was studious, a great reader and serious thinker; that on some topics as the navy and naval affairs, he was an authority among newspapermen, even. He was always cheerful, a real optimist; generous to a fault; somewhat taciturn, but never offensively so; that everyone who knew him as 'Larry' True, and so called him, is more proof of the friendly interest they felt in him."

Larry was a highly regarded member of the local Typographical Union and, in accordance with instructions received from his family after his death, the remains were given over to the charge of the Union. The president of the Union local conducted the burial ceremony, and most of the mourners were Union "brothers". He was buried on a lot owned by the Typographical Union in the Spring Grove Cemetery.

(Note on name: Alaric I was a leader of the Visigoth tribe of "barbarian" invaders of the Roman Empire. As early as 401-403 AD, Alaric had led invasions into Italy. In three consecutive years Alaric led his Visigoth warriors to the very gates of Rome itself, and in 410 entered and sacked the city -- the first time that the city of Rome had been occupied by a foreign foe in nearly 800 years. This marked the beginning of the end of the Western Roman Empire. The date usually given for the fall of the Western Empire being 476 AD.

Even though being "up on ancient history" to the extent of knowing the origin of the name, like my grandmother, I have no idea why M.B.C. True passed the name on to his son. Obviously "Larry" did not appreciate it, which is, to me, a pity. I rather like the name.

After her marriage, she joined the North Loup Seventh Day Baptist Church (Sept. 16, 1893), where her husband was a member, and for many years taught in the Sabbath School. She helped organize the No Lo Club, and was a member of the local American Legion Auxilliary. Active in the organization of the Library Board, Jessie served as Librarian, and as Children's Story Teller for many years. She worked for the Savings and Loan for about 25 years, and frequently wrote news and human interest

articles for the North Loup Loyalist and Ord Quiz newspapers.

From the time of their marriage until her husbands' death, the Babcocks lived in a large square two-story house in North Loup, built by the groom as a wedding gift for his bride. The home was "custom built" for Jessie, who stood only about 4' 11" tall, with all counters, cupboards and even the stairs built lower than normal so as to be more convenient for her. After E. J.'s death, Jessie lived alone on the second (upper) floor of the house, while renting out the downstairs as an apartment.

The day before her 89th birthday, in 1954, Jessie was taken ill from the excessive heat and her children persuaded her to allow them to move her to Omaha, where she made her home with her daughter, Katharine, and where she could also be closer to her sons, Edwin of Lincoln and Arthur of Omaha. She lived there, with Katharine, until her death on May 30, 1966, at the age of 100 years and 10 months. Katharine died less than 4 months after her mother.

By the early 1940's, my father, O. T. Babcock, was urging his mother to provide him with information about herself. It was a fact, noticed in later years by many of us that Grandmother (Jessie) would speak and write at great length about the Babcock side of the family, but would seldom talk about herself or her side of the family. I have several letters she wrote in 1940 and 1941 in reply to my father's urging. Commenting that, "You seem to be going into the geneology of the families heels over head, " she did provide some information about the True family, while noting difficulties since, "Grandmother True was not bitten by the geneological bee".

It was typical that, when asked specifically to talk about her own life, she responded simply: "There were three important facts in my life. I became the daughter (oldest child) of M. B. C. & Kate True, the wife of E. J. Babcock, and the mother of five fine children." Finally she did add a bit more, writing, "I lived as a child at Anamosa and Toledo, Iowa, and Lincoln and Crete, Nebr., reaching the last place one jump ahead of the grasshoppers in 1874. I helped your father (E.J.) as food administrator and had charge of knitting for Red Cross. Wrote two pageants for P(op) C(orn) Days, served on some committee or had charge of Woman's Exhibets almost every year. Taught a S(abbath) S(chool) class almost continuously from 1903 except about 12 years as Supt. of Graded Dept. (&) Church Clerk for 8 years. Founded Pub. Library. Wrote historical articles for Loyalist and Quiz. Was Sec. Treas. of Building and Loan from your father's death till -- I've forgotten when, six or seven years ago. I came to N(orth) L(oup) in 1887, married in 1889 and lived continuously in the home your father built for us. Schooling at Doan; only a little more than H(igh) S(chool)."

Notes for Edwin Jeffrey BABCOCK:

Edwin Jeffrey Babcock was born May 14, 1860, at Dakota, WI, the eldest son of Oscar and Marietta (Metta) Bristol Babcock. At the age of 12, in November of 1872, he moved with his father and younger siblings to what is now North Loup, NE. His mother had died and was buried at Dakota just before the move to Nebraska. Except for these early years and a few years away at school, "E. J.", as he was generally known, resided his entire life on his father's original homestead in North Loup. He had joined the Seventh Day Baptist church just before leaving Dakota and became the youngest member of the new SDB congregation at North Loup. He attended the first school at North Loup, held in his father's dugout.

Early on, E. J. assumed heavy responsibilities in caring for the motherless family which included his brothers Arthur and George and his sister Myra. (Myra was 3 years of age, and George only a few months old at the time of the move to NE.) The early years of the North Loup settlement were exciting and difficult times. The spring of 1873, with the family still living in the dugout, the new colony was struck by a ferocious 3 day blizzard, one of the worst on record, and later by a raging flood that nearly destroyed the dugout home and the family with it. The disastrous "grasshopper plagues" were to follow and it's remarkable that the pioneer community survived at all. On Oct. 12, 1878, a terrible

prairie fire swept the area killing one man while several others were badly burned and many homes and much property destroyed. The fire nearly cost 18 year old E. J. his life as he fought successfully to save the family log cabin (his father was away at the time). Caught by a sudden shift in the wind, E. J. jumped into Mira Creek flowing only a few inches deep near the cabin. Rolling over and over in the shallow water, he survived although he suffered severe burns on his back. Later, E. J. wrote vivid accounts of all of these experiences (and others) and these manuscripts, along with a section of cedar log from the family log cabin, are now in the possession of his grandson, Bryce Babcock.

That fall (1878) E. J. attended Hastings (NE) high school. He later attended Doan College in Crete, NE, and Alfred University, Alfred, NY. He graduated with honors from Alfred Univ. in 1884 and did graduate level work there the following year, qualifying to practice law. Knowing that opportunities for establishing a law practice in a small town were limited, he planned to set up a practice in Omaha, but because of his father's health problems and the dependence placed on him as the eldest son, E. J. gave up his larger ambitions and returned to North Loup. His obituary states, "Although he had many of the qualities of a successful lawyer, this restricted field made it necessary to take up side lines to eke out his profession. This characteristic of always putting others ahead (of himself) was the leading one of his life.

...he was the head and front of everything that tended toward bettering conditions in this valley he loved so well. He organized the irrigation company and was it's manager for 3 years; he organized and was the secretary of the Building and Loan Association; he helped organize the telephone company and it was largely through his efforts as secretary of the school board that the 12th grade, the manual training, Domestic Science and Normal (teacher) Training departments were all added to the high school; he was one of the organizers of (North Loup's annual) Pop Corn Days (fair).... was one of the leaders of the Good Roads Movement, and in 1918 (during the U.S involvement in World War I) served as the Food Administrator for Valley County."

E.J. began and carried through 3 sessions of the state legislature a successful effort that changed the method of teaching at the State School for the Deaf from the manual (sign language) method only, to emphasis on the oral (lip reading) method. This effort was inspired by that fact that two of his children, Katharine and Archie, had become deaf in childhood. Katharine had benefited greatly from this method of instruction, but had to travel out of state to receive it. Both were too old to benefit directly from the changes at the Nebraska school, but their parents were impressed by the training Katharine had received back east, and wanted other Nebraska children to have the same opportunity.

The obituary states, "... if he had a hobby it was the love and care of trees which has changed the bare valley to a veritable garden.... he seldom aspired to or held public office. He preferred to be one of the rank and file, yet few men had a greater influence for good. More people came to him for advice, sympathy and help than to almost any one man. While his business as a lawyer was supposed to be a fight, yet he never took a case into court without trying to settle it amicably especially if it was a domestic difficulty. He lost many a case because he insisted on this delay and he never took a case that did not seem to have an element of truth in it that was worth fighting for.... for what he felt was right, no man could fight harder."

E. J. was regarded as intensely loyal to his family, his friends, his community and his church, though his religious beliefs "might have been considered somewhat unorthodox." He was said to have a great love for children, trees and dogs! He was also said "to never hold a grudge against anyone", and that "he loved harmony in all things".

E. J. Babcock married Jessie Fremont True, daughter of Melville Beveridge Cox True and Mary Catharine McFarland True, on June 1, 1889. They had five children; Katharine (Kate), Oscar (O.T.), Edwin (Deke), Archie and Arthur. E. J. died early in the morning of December 28, 1925, at his home in North Loup. In writing his obituary for the local paper, his wife, Jessie, referred to his death as resulting from "a heart block." She noted that he "had not complained in any way, with the exception of feeling very uncomfortable (the previous) afternoon and later in the night. It is of interest to note that in all his life Mr. Babcock had never employed a doctor until after his death, and then it was too late." E. J. Babcock is buried in the North Loup cemetery.

Notes for Katharine Myra Babcock:

Katharine Myra Babcock contracted smallpox when she was about two years old and lost her hearing. She was profoundly deaf but led a full and productive life. She never married and bore no children. She attended Clark School for the Deaf in Northampton, MA, travelling alone on the train from North Loup, NE to Northampton. The Clark School was apparently somewhat unique at that time as, in addition to sign language, they taught students to lip read ("the oral method") as well. Katharine became proficient in both methods of communication. Katharine related that her parents encouraged her to associate with "hearing people" more than with the deaf. She did this throughout her life, though for many years she and another deaf lady shared an apartment in Omaha. If one spoke slowly and enunciated clearly, Katharine had no trouble understanding, as long as she could see the person's lips. Since she could not hear her own speech, her pronunciation was difficult for a stranger to understand, but those who got to know her well learned to understand her speech with little difficulty.

Katharine lived with her brother Edwin's family in Lincoln, NE for several years, working as a retoucher for a photographic studio. She then moved to Omaha, NE, where she continued her work as a retoucher, and also color tinted photos and portraits, in the period before the advent of color film.

Notes for Archie Bristol Babcock:

"Archie Bristol Babcock lost his hearing in infancy. (The cause is not known to me. - B.B.) He attended the School for the Deaf in Omaha, NE, graduating in 1922. (Several examples of his woodworking are still in our family, including a hat/coat rack, table lamp stand, and a turned wooden bowl or dish with fitted lid. - B.B.) Archie was very athletic and was a star football player despite his handicap. He also attended the Univ. of Nebraska for a short time. In 1926 he became a draftsman in the State Engineer's office in Lincoln, NE, working there until his death. He died of meningitis at Lincoln Memorial Hospital, Sept. 19, 1928."

Notes for Arthur Sidney Babcock:

Arthur Sidney Babcock suffered from epilepsy throughout his adult life. His mother thought that the epilepsy resulted from a head injury suffered while playing football for North Loup (NE) High School. He took medication, saw a doctor regularly and the epilepsy was kept pretty much under control at all

times. Art was not positive that his condition was not hereditary (though I'm aware of no other instances in the family), and for this reason he never married. He thought it irresponsible to risk passing on the disease to another generation. He lived with his brother Edwin's family for a time in Lincoln, NE, and later kept an apartment in Omaha, NE. He worked for the Nebraska State Highway Department for many years, and was often "on the road" on job assignments for days and weeks at a time.

In his later years, Art suffered from advanced pulmonary emphysema. In August 1971 he had undergone treatment for this condition at Immanuel Medical Center in Omaha. On release, he was transferred to Columbus Manor, a nursing facility in Omaha, and lived there the final months of his life. The Administrator at the Manor had this to say about Art: "Art was doing quite well here... and was a very cooperative and likeable person.... (he) was not really incapacitated.... but was restricted to minimum activities.... (We) had many conversations together, as he enjoyed visiting and I enjoyed visiting with him."

On Jan. 11, 1972 he suffered a severe attack of emphysema and was sent to the hospital where he expired the next day. He had celebrated his 68th birthday a month earlier. The doctors reported the death as being due to "advanced pulmonary emphysema in conjunction with pneumonia." Art had arranged for his body to be donated to the Creighton University Medical School, an act which the Administrator termed "quite noble", adding, "I, too, admire him for it."

Notes for Oscar True Babcock:

Oscar True Babcock was born Feb. 2, 1895, in North Loup, NE, the son of Edwin Jeffrey Babcock and Jessie Fremont True. He attended North Loup schools and the University of Nebraska where he received a certificate to practice law. He practiced law in his father's law office in North Loup from 1921 to 1923. In that year he entered Milton College, Milton, WI, and graduated from that institution in 1925. He was made Registrar of Milton College right after his graduation and remained in that position until his death in 1952. He also taught courses in Political Science and Business Law for a number of years.

O.T., as he was known to everyone but his mother (he was always "Oscar" to her) married Beulah Vernetta Vincent on Sept. 5, 1927. Beulah was the daughter of Floyd Christopher Vincent and Mignon Whitford. O.T. and Beulah had one son, Bryce Vincent Babcock, born April 6, 1930 at Mercy Hospital in Janesville, WI.

O.T. served for a number of years as Clerk of the Milton Union High School board, and later served on the Milton Village Board. He was a member of that board at the time of his death. He also served several terms as Justice of the Peace for the village of Milton.

O.T. suffered severely for many years from asthma and, later, emphysema. In the winter of 1951-52 his health worsened and he was advised to try a dryer climate to see if that would help. He was driven to Tucson, AZ by his son, Bryce, right after Christmas and remained there until May, 1952. Bryce stayed with him for several weeks and then returned to Milton in order to complete his senior year at Milton College and graduate with his class. O.T.'s health improved a bit, but he was very homesick, and his wife Beulah went to Tucson in May to bring him home. En route, they stopped in Lincoln, NE and had an informal family reunion with O.T.'s mother, sister Katharine and brothers Edwin and Arthur. Beulah and O.T. left Lincoln on May 12 and while Beulah was driving through Omaha, NE, O.T. was stricken with a cerebral hemorrhage. He was rushed to the hospital in Omaha where he died the next day, May 13, 1952. An autopsy showed an aneurysm deep inside the brain. O.T. was buried in the Milton, WI, cemetery on May 17, 1952.

John N. Daland, Dean of Milton College, a longtime colleague, friend and neighbor, wrote the following "In Memoriam" tribute for "Fides" the Milton College Yearbook:

"Oscar T. Babcock was a friend to everybody, and was universally and affectionately known as 'O.T.'"

His legal training and close association with his father, a thinker and broad-minded lawyer, brought out his natural talent for logic. O.T. was preeminently a clear thinker and correct reasoner.

Each man has his own attitude towards life, and O.T. inclined in politics and religion to the liberal point of view. He was one of the most fair and open-minded men I ever knew, always reading and considering both sides of every public question. I never discussed these matters with him without benefit to my own thinking.

O.T.'s interest in national and local affairs is well known. In his own community he was an ideal citizen, serving faithfully and intelligently in school and local offices. He met the ultimate test of good citizenship: he believed in paying taxes and never complained of the taxes he was called upon to pay.

'Homo Sum'

In his educational and administrative work at the college for the last twenty-seven years O.T. displayed not only intellectual attainments, but qualities of a fine human texture. As registrar he came in contact with more students than any other teacher, and he was courteous and agreeable to every one. He understood the student point of view and listened with patience to all complaints. Yet he was firm in giving good counsel and in explaining the necessity for upholding the rules of the curriculum.

All that he accomplished, and it was a considerable contribution, was done against the background of ill health and inadequate physical strength. Herein lies one of his great qualities. It took courage to come back after each attack and plunge again into his work with never a complaint.

Strict himself in the path of rectitude and honor, he was tolerant of the weakness of human nature, and was constantly seeking excuses for his fellowmen.

In his frail body dwelt a high and noble spirit: intelligent, independent, liberal. He exemplified in his

life the celebrated words of Terence: 'I am a man, and whatever concerns my fellow man is my concern.' "

O.T was posthumously honored in June, 1952, with the "Pillar of Milton" award by the Alumni Association of the college he served so long, honorably and faithfully. The award reads as follows:

"The Alumni Association of Milton College wishes to honor posthumously with this citation, Oscar True Babcock, on this the 27th anniversary of his graduation and a month after his untimely death, as one who made an outstanding contribution to his Alma Mater; whose untiring efforts translated Milton's slogan "large enough to serve you, small enough to know you" into reality for thousands of Milton students who have been guided by his wise counsel; whose fairness, patience and kindness were unmatched on the Milton campus; whose industry and devotion to Milton demanded most of his vacation period these later years; whose interest in alumni affairs is evidenced by his many years as editor of the Alumni Bulletin and as secretary of the Milton College Glee Club and Quartet Association; whose passing is mourned by the entire Milton College family. In token of our regard, we hereby declare Oscar True Babcock to be A PILLAR OF MILTON."

The Alumni Bulletin carried this statement:

IN MEMORIAM: O.T. Babcock '25

"The college family was shocked to learn of the death of 'O.T.' enroute home with his wife Beulah, from Tucson, Ariz. where he had gone in January because of ill health. 'O.T.' became suddenly ill as they entered the city of Omaha, Nebraska. Since his departure for Arizona, we in the College offices have learned how important his activity was to the function of the whole of Milton College. The last of April, Beulah left for Tucson to bring him back to Wisconsin where the high humidity of the winter seemed to be coming to an end. While both the Babcocks were away the faculty took turns answering the phone and attempting to take care of the many details which come to the office of the Registrar.

'O.T.' was fifty-seven years old and had been registrar at Milton College since his graduation in 1925. Mr. Babcock was prominent in civic activities in Milton. He served as Justice of the Peace and as Clerk of the Milton Union High School board. He was a member of the village board at the time of his death. In 1948 he was elected president of the Wisconsin Collegiate Registrar's Association. He was a charter member of the association. Mr. Babcock was a past president of the Civic Club here, and on the campus he was an advisor to the Chi Delta Rho fraternity.

He was born February 7, 1895, in North Loup, Neb. He attended the University of Nebraska and, after being admitted to the bar, practiced law in Nebraska from 1921-1923. 'O.T.' came to Milton as a student in 1923 and following his graduation in 1925 he taught political science and business law in addition to his work as registrar.

Survivors include his wife, the former Beulah Vincent '41 of Milton Junction; a son, Bryce, member of the class of 1952 of Milton College; his mother, Mrs. Jessie True Babcock; two brothers, Edward (sic -- should be Edwin) of Lincoln, Neb., and Arthur, in Nebraska, and a sister, Kathryn (sic -- Katharine), also of Nebraska.

The funeral was held Friday, May 16, 1952, at the Seventh Day Baptist church in Milton, of which he was a member. The Reverend Elmo F. Randolph, pastor of the church, conducted the memorial service; the Milton College Choir, directed by Prof. Bernhardt H. Westlund '41, sang two choral compositions; and Miss Elizabeth Daland '41, church organist, played the processional and recessional. Burial was in the Milton cemetery.

'O.T.', as we all knew him, was a vital force on the faculty of Milton College and in the community as well. We mourn his passing."

Notes for Beulah Vernetta Vincent:

Beulah Vernetta Vincent was born June 23, 1906, on a farm a few miles north of Milton, WI. Her parents were Floyd and Mignon (Whitford) Vincent. Beulah had one younger sister Doris (Vincent) Baker. There was also a brother who died in infancy.

Beulah was baptised at Clear Lake into the Milton Junction Seventh Day Baptist Church in 1919. In 1920 she became a member of the first class of the newly organized Milton Union High School and graduated from that school with the first graduating class in 1924. (Milton Union HS served the adjoining communities of Milton and Milton Junction. In later years the two communities merged and now exist as Milton, WI, and the High School is known as Milton H.S.)

In the fall of 1924, Beulah enrolled as a student at Milton College which she attended for 2 years. When registering for her first year classes she met Oscar True "O.T." Babcock who was also a student there. Upon his graduation in 1925, O.T. was made Registrar of the small college serving in that position for 27 years until his untimely death on May 13, 1952. He also taught classes in Political Science and Business Law on various occasions. Beulah and O.T. were married on September 5, 1927. They had one son, Bryce Vincent Babcock, born on April 6, 1930 at Mercy Hospital in nearby Janesville, WI.

Beulah returned to Milton College as a student in 1940 and graduated in 1942. A standing joke of hers was to tell people that she entered Milton College in 1924 and graduated in 1942, adding the comment, "I was a slow learner." Before graduation she began working in the Registrar's Office with her husband. Some years later she was officially designated as Assistant Registrar, a position she held until her retirement in September 1971 after a 30 year career. Following this she continued to work for the College on a half-time basis in the College's Development Office from January 5, 1972 until August 5, 1975

In July, 1957, while on a conducted tour to the Pacific Northwest -- taken mainly to visit her son, Bryce, and his wife and baby son -- she met Paul Kaase of Chicago, IL. They were married in Milton on Dec. 27, 1957, after a 6 month courtship, and made their home in Milton. Paul, a retired employee of the Bell and Howell company, died suddenly on February 20, 1968.

Beulah was active in the community as a member of both the Rock County and Milton Historical Societies. She served on the board of directors of the former organization for 6 years and as president of the Milton group for 2 years. That organization operated the historic Milton House, a former hotel, stage stop and stopover point on the "underground railway" as a museum and historical point of significance. As part of the operation the Historical Society also set up and operated a "Country Store" as an adjunct of the museum. Beulah went to work as an assistant to the storekeeper from 1973 to 1977 and then took over the position of Country Storekeeper from 1977 until 1984.

Having transferred her church membership to the Milton Seventh Day Baptist Church in 1935, Beulah remained active in church affairs, especially in the years between about 1970 until her death in 1998. She served as Financial Secretary of the church from 1981 through 1986 when, as she liked to say, she declined to continue and was "replaced by a man and a computer." She was elected Treasurer of a women's group at the church, the Women's Circle, in 1973 and was reelected annually through 1993. A highlight of her church experience was a two week trip, led by the church pastor, to Egypt, Greece and Israel in June of 1984.

Beulah was also active as a member of the Milton College Alumni Association for many years. She was honored by that organization on June 7, 1986, by being awarded the Pillar of Milton Citation for her distinguished and loyal service to the College. The award read:

PILLAR OF MILTON CITATION

"The New Alumni Association of Milton College takes great pride in recognizing BEULAH V. B. KAASE '42, as a dedicated member of the Milton College administration who has given many years of service to her Alma Mater. As Assistant Registrar she provided valuable guidance to countless numbers of Milton College students regarding their course selections. We hereby declare her to be A PILLAR OF MILTON. June 7, 1986."

Beulah suffered a stroke on December 11 (if my memory is correct) and was moved from her apartment where she lived alone to Mercy Manor, an Assisted Living Nursing Home in nearby Janesville. Her condition worsened rapidly after a week or so and she died peacefully The evening of Dec. 22, 1998. Funeral services were held December 29, 1998 at the Milton Seventh Day Baptist Church and burial was in the Milton Cemetery.

Notes for Edwin Jesse Babcock:

"Edwin Jesse Babcock... was a civil engineer all of his career. He served as a Lt. in the army in World War I. He attended the Univ. of Nebraska for about three years, and began his engineering career in June, 1920, with the Nebraska Roads Department. From 1923 to 1925 he did consulting work for a private firm in Crete and Omaha, NE. He later returned to the State Highway Department. In March, 1936, he went with the U.S. Bureau of Public Roads as a planning engineer. He was an engineer on the (construction of the) Alaskan Highway (Alcan Highway) in 1942-43, stationed in Edmonton, Alberta, Canada. The family joined him in 1943. He was sent to the PRA office in Kansas City, then back to Lincoln, NE. He was a Certified Professional Engineer, State of Nebraska, a member of the National Society of Professional Engineers, and the American Society of Civil Engineers. He lived in Lincoln, NE from 1925 or 1926, and died in Rockledge, FL, while visiting his daughter Patricia and her family. "He was known as 'Deke' to everyone -- except his mother!"

"Deke" had devoted over 50 years of his career to public service, including 30 with the Bureau of Public Roads. About 41 years of his highway engineering experience had been in NE. He was one of the pioneers in the establishment of highway planning in Nebraska and in the Nebraska District Office.

He was awarded a Certificate of Merit by the Public Roads Administration for service during the construction of the Alcan Highway during World War II. In 1948 he received the American Association of State Highway Officials certificate for 25 years of public service. In 1963 he received an award from the Special Acts or Services (Bureau of Public Roads) for engineering assistance provided in evaluating flood damage to roads and streets earlier that year.

Notes for Gertrudis (Tulita) True:

Gertrudis (Tulita) True, was born November 27, 1905, to Archibald McFarland True and Gertrudis (Tula) Gachelien, probably in Manila, Philippines. As a young girl she moved with her family to Shanghai, China, where she was educated in the local English speaking schools. In a letter addressed to "My Dear Mamma" an obviously proud Archie True wrote on July 9, 1912, from Olongapo, P.I., "I enclose you term reports of Tulita and Archie. You may notice a slight difference in their standing. Tulita has done extraordinarily well, considering that she did not know a word of English a year ago. I am very well satisfied with Archie's French and Tulita received one prize and two honor cards. Archie also got a prize, but don't know what it was for unless for athletics." (At this time Tulita, her mother and the other children were in Shanghai, while her father was in the Philippines.) The newspaper clipping quoted below notes that Tulita, "for a number of years had been prominent in athletics at the foreign "Y", excelling in basketball, swimming and tennis," so her brother was not the only family member who excelled in that area.

By the early 1930's Tulita was secretary to Dr. George Sellet, the US District Attorney at Shanghai. In November, 1931, she received an appointment as a US deputy marshal. As a deputy marshal she was placed in custody of an American woman who was being returned to authorities in California after being declared "mentally unbalanced." This occasion marked "the first time in the history of the US Court in China, that a woman had filled such a position."

An account of the event, published in the North Loup paper, contains the following: "The arrival of the pretty, trim woman marshal received much comment in the daily papers on the Pacific coast and her picture appeared many times.... Miss True's visit attracted attention for another reason, that being that, although an American, this was her first visit to the United States." Upon her return to Shanghai, a newspaper there announced in big headlines: "China's First American Woman Deputy Marshal Returns Here."

In December, 1937, Tulita married Mark King in Shanghai. Mark was a member of the Shanghai police force.

At some point after the outbreak of hostilities between Japan and the U.S./Great Britain, both Tulita and her husband were interned in separate prison camps by the Japanese. They were allowed one visit per year, lasting about 10 minutes, during the war years. Following the war, they were both released and were finally reunited in Shanghai on October 11, 1945. They remained in Shanghai, working at different jobs and recovering their health until about January, 1947, when they moved to Victoria, B.C., Canada. Their son, Robert, was born in Victoria on February 14, 1947.

In the early 1960's Tulita was living at 2970 Mt. Stephen Ave., Victoria, British Columbia, Canada. She and her son Robert were still living in Victoria when my mother and I visited there about 1969 or 1970.

Notes for Mark King:

Born in Scotland about 1905. I know nothing about his early life. He was in Shanghai, China as early as 1937 as a member of the Shanghai police force. He married Gertrudis (Tulita) True in December of that year, in Shanghai. At the outbreak of hostilities between Japan and the British Empire, he and Tulita were both interned by the Japanese and spent the rest of World War II in Japanese prison camps in China. In January, 1945, Mark suffered a "heart stroke" and was sent to the prison hospital at the Haiphong Road Camp, then was transferred to another prison hospital in July of that year. After the conclusion of hostilities he was released from Fengtai prison camp hospital in north China on August 17, 1945, and from there was taken to a hospital in Peking (Beijing). His wife, Tulita, was also interned by the Japanese, but in a different prison camp, apparently somewhere near Shanghai. In October, 1945, Mark was allowed to join his wife in Shanghai. The couple remained in Shanghai working at various jobs until probably January of 1947 when they moved to Victoria, B.C., Canada. Their son, Robert, was born in February of that year in Victoria. According to the obituary, Mark resided in Victoria from 1947 until his death in 1961, at the age of 56. He is buried in Royal Oak Burial Park in Victoria.
