Was a travelling engineer in the Civil War and in 1862 on the Orange and Alexander RailRoad. When the war ended he went to Omaha, Nebraska in 1866. Then to North Platte, Nebraska.

He used to tell stories how the indians would shoot at the engine they called the iron horse. The indians were very numerous and the government had soldiers to protect the town, soldiers camp was close to the rail road somewhere near the depot, the rail road shops and the round house were across the tracks. He also ran a paper and magazine booth of all kinds near the post office on Front street across from the depot in 1870. Lola E. Wyman (1937)

In remembering family history, I recall the story of my Great-Grandfather 'Buttermilk Wyman' and quote from a local history book 'North Platte and Its Associations:

'When R. J. Wyman took his seat as mayor, April 5, 1879, he

announced in his inaugural address that ~~Bianco~~ he was opposed to all forms of vice in the city, and as liquor was at the root of most evils, its sale within the city limits ought to be suppressed. The majority of the councilmen agreed with him, and despite reasons given by the minority that a crusade of the kind would be ineffectual, applications for renewals of saloon licenses lay on the table disregarded, and it was 'Resolved, that his honor the mayor notify, through the city marshal, all persons engaged in selling intoxicating liquors, that no licenses to sell liquor in North Platte will be granted by the council.'

'The foregoing, resolution became law May 6, 1879, and the town was declared 'dry' and it may be remarked that North Platte was the, first 'dry' town in the state of Nebraska.

'Law in those days was loosely administered and western life too free and easy for saloon keepers to be deterred from selling liquor by any such measure, and they went right along doing business, with the slight difference that beer was called 'Buttermilk' and sold under that name.' (Charles Howard Wyman 10/24/1992 )

A Centennial year series about the early residents of North Platte

Even though his ancestors travelled to the New World on the Mayflower, Russell James Wyman was a railroad man. Born Oct. 25, 1828 in Vermont, Wyman got his first experience on the rails during the Civil War. He served as a general master mechanic of the Orange and Alexandria Railroad at Alexandria, Va. On Aug. 31, 1866, Wyman came to Omaha and had the distinction of running the second locomotive out of Omaha to North Platte. In June, 1867, he moved west as the railroad moved west - First to Julesburg and then to Laramie, Wyo. When he returned to North Platte from Laramie he was the engineer on the regular run from North Platte to Grand Island. In 1869 Wyman had a book store called the 'News Depot' located on Front Street.

The first library in town was Wyman's circulating library, which he ran from 1870 to 1880. From 1869 until June, 1871 he was Postmaster with a salary of \$36.00 per year. In the spring of 1879 Wyman began his campaign for mayor of North Platte and was elected in April with a majority of 253 votes. He announced in his inaugural address that he was opposed to all forms of vice in the town, and since liquor was the root of most evil, its sale within the city should be suppressed. The majority of the council agreed with him and on May 6, 1879, North Platte became the first 'dry' town in the state. But the law in those days was loosely administered and the saloon-keepers weren't even slowed down. They went right on doing business by re-naming their liquor 'buttermilk' and selling it under that name. Wyman and his council did not stop with liquor. They passed ordinances to prohibit carrying a deadly weapon and shooting a gun within the city limits, outlawed houses of prostitution and made construction and maintenance of sidewalks compulsory. North Platte soon had fine sidewalks. In 1887 Wyman bought a ranch two miles west of the city limits on what was then Elm Street. Here he and his son started the first dairy in North Platte and sold milk at a nickel a quart. He retired from the railroad in 1891 to devote his time to the dairy. R.J.

Wyman's grandson, L.A.

Wyman, retired from his Union Pacific Railroad bringing to an end 100 years of Wyman family service to the company.

North Platte Neb Dec 15 1873

Dear Sister Mary My darling wife My loving Susan died yesterday

and I dont know I cannot write half of what's gone my  
heart aches the mind is in the brain she went from my heart I  
can fell it She said she would take care of our 2 little girls  
and God would help her till I could come Charles & Arthur are  
with me and little Susy & little Louisa are with their mother  
Oh she sung so good when she was dying and when she could not  
speak she pointed upwards as an expression that there we would  
meet Heaven is the place to go for happiness My friends are  
there and more are going and death is the way or the gateway  
RJ Wyman

Recollections of An Old Railroader

R.J. Wyman of the Union Pacific Railway shops at an early day,  
had him the subjoined article written of him in the Omaha Railway  
News:

'R.J. Wyman of the Union Pacific shops is an old engineer and  
has had many thrilling experiences. He has been traveling  
engineer of the United States Military road during the war and  
came to the Union Pacific at its close. The Indians were bad  
through the Platte Valley in those days and did not look on the  
building of a railroad through their best hunting ground with  
as much favor as might be imagined and improved every occasion  
to annoy those engaged in its construction.'

'Engineer Wyman was at Ogalalla with the piledriver one day,  
trying to get orders to proceed west when the operator at Big  
Springs broke in with 'My God, there are 10,000 Indians around  
the station ... I am afraid ... there is one coming in the door  
... tell my mo...'. Here the messenger was suddenly interrupted  
and the key left open. After vain effort to raise him, Wyman  
sallied out and went over to Big Springs. The Indians had gone  
and there in the station with one hand grasping the key was the  
lifeless body of the brave operator.'

'The red devils seemed to catch onto the telegraph business  
somehow, probably through bad white men who were with them.  
They wold cut the wire and then tie it with a buckskin string,  
maing it almost impossible for the linemen to find the break.  
The greatest fun they ever had was at Plum Creek one dark  
night. They pulled the spikes from the end of the rails, lifted  
them up, so they ran into the cylinder of an engine attached to  
a freight train, making a very complete wreck.'

'After killing all the crew but the conductor, who escaped  
scalped, they broke open the cars and took out what they wanted  
and then set fire to the wreck. During the pyrotechnic display,  
squaws, bucks and papposes would grasp the end of a bolt of  
silk or calico and ride around the bonfire with it trailing  
behind or floating flaglike in the breeze.'

Also from the same book pg. 73:

... R.J. Wyman served all through the Civil war as general  
master mechanic of the Orange and Alexandria Railroad, a  
Government railroad, at Alexandria, Virginia. He remained on  
the road until the engines and supplies were disposed of, and  
then he returned to Massachusetts. He had been a local engineer  
and was promoted to traveling engineer, and August 31, 1866, he  
started for Omaha. Mr. Wyman had the distinction of running the  
second engine out of Omaha on the Union Pacific. The road was  
being graded at the time. He was on the pile driver engine and  
drove all the piles between Omaha and laramie, Wyoming. In 1867  
he located in North Platte, and his regular run was to Grand  
Island. He afterward spent four years in the Union Pacific  
machine shops in North Platte.

R.J. Wyman was well educated and well read, being versed on all  
of the topics of the day. He not only read the news of the day,

but he read the scientific magazines and ~~Bible~~ periodicals. He had a remarkable memory and could spell all of the words in use at the time. There were two daughters, who died in infancy, and the sons are: Charles A. Wyman, and Arthur B. Wyman, who is a passenger conductor between North Platte and Denver. The father later married a Mrs. Cal Park.

R.J. Wyman was a member of the Unitarian Church, and he was a great Bible student. He was a whig, and from its birth he voted with the republican party. He was one time mayor of North Platte and had much to do with making it a dry community in its early history. He was postmaster when the office only paid a salary of \$36 a year. He was a Mason in the early history of the order in North Platte. He was a son of Anson Wyman, of Vermont, and there is a direct line of descent from the Pilgrims. It is now 300 years since they came to the 'stern and rock bound coast' of Massachusetts.

Smith, all of my real estate being the ~~East~~ <sup>West</sup> half (1/2) of the northwest quarter (1/4) of section twenty-five (25) in township eleven (11), north of Range 2 (2) East, of the 6th P.M., in Seward County, Nebraska, to have absolutely share and share alike as tenants in common. In case any of my said children, Electa K. Newton, Edward N. Smith, Orvis W. Smith, and Abel D. Smith, Jr., shall die before my death leaving issue and descendant, I direct that his share shall not lapse but shall descend to his or her children in equal proportions. His education was obtained in the district schools of Stockbridge and in the public and evening schools of Boston, Mass. At the age of fourteen he commenced to learn the trade of a machinist at Boston, and was for a time in the employment of the Vermont and Massachusetts R. R. He spent five years at Fitchburg working at his trade, and afterward returned to Boston, where he continued till 1861, when, with Charles E. Moore, he formed a copartnership to engage in the manufacture of all kinds of experimental machinery. He was one of the first to engage in the construction of passenger elevators for hotels and office buildings, under the patent of the late Otis Tufts. The name of Mr. Wyman often appears as the patentee of many useful inventions, more especially those appertaining to elevators. He retired from active participation in business recently, leaving his son, Charles E., to occupy his place as treasurer and manager of the Moore & Wyman Elevator and Machine Works.

By the establishment of the line he was transferred from Massachusetts into New Hampshire. His house was located in that part of the southwest part of old Dunstable which is now a part of Brookline; its site being near that now occupied by the dwelling house of Deacon Perley L. Pierce in South Brookline. He owned and operated a sawmill which was located on Stickney brook. and of which it is claimed that it was the first sawmill to be erected within the limits of Brookline. Mr. Wyman continued to reside in West Dunstable for several years after his involuntary introduction into its territory. He certainly was a resident as late as 1746, as in the latter year his name appears on the West Dunstable records as one of the signers to a remonstrance against the proposed location of the second meeting house of that town.

The first sawmill to be erected within the present limits of the town was built prior to 1741 by Jasher Wyman. It was located on the stream then known as Wolf brook, but at the present time known as Stickney brook, in the southwest part of the town; its site being on or near that of the present sawmill of Deacon Perley L. Pierce, in South Brookline. At the date of its erection the mill was located in Townsend, Mass., from whence it was transferred into Brookline by the running of the Province line in 1741.

As appears by the Hollis records, Wyman continued to own and to operate the mill until, at least, as late as 1746; after which date we have no further definite information concerning him, although there is a tradition to the effect that he removed from Raby to Townsend Harbor, and that he died there. Another tradition says that he died in Woburn, Mass.

He received £30 for property he sold in Westmill in 1678 and perhaps some for property in Braughing and then disappears from the English scene. 'Sergeant' John Wyman appears in Woburn, MA. in 1679 where he was granted land and is identified as a relative of Francis and John Wyman. It appears beyond doubt that we are dealing with the same person. John was on Phipps 1690 expedition to Quebec: a Sergeant in the Woburn militia and a wheelwright.

Another possibility This was copied by Russell James Wyman in 1848 from a letter his grandfather had, and he copied it from another letter so right or wrong it is recopied in 1937 by my ancestors.

I have been informed that when Boston Mass. was begun to be settled by Europeans in 1630, and about the years 1625 Jonathan and Timothy Wyman came from the city Herford by the river Nye in Wales to Wobern Mass. and settled in that town in 1629. There was a younger brother named John Wyman age 17 that took leave of his parents to come over the ocean to see his brothers in Wobern. He liked the town so well that. he wrote his parents to give him leave to serve the other 4 years of his minority with his brothers. They did so but before the 4 years passed both parents died and he never returned to his native land.

When John was 21 years old he took land in Wobern and began gardening and orcharding of which he was very fond. The seeds were brought from England, such as apples, peaches, pears, plums, and all kinds of bushes, they grew well in a short time. He was nick named Cider John, the few inhabitants knew no error of him for he was constant and lawabiding and kept his mind from evil. He lived to a good old age and a father of many children.

One of his sons named Jasher saying its my wish to live and die righteous a man of good learning for those days. He moved to the town of Townson Mass. and married Miss Mary Carter of Southbury. He was the first surveyor of the out lines in small lots being guarded by solders to keep off the savages. Another brother Uzzia in a battle against the Indians was captured by Indians and supposed to be killed as nothing was heard from him, in 18 years he came home alive being scared all over with hot irons done by the Indians and they almost beat him to death. This first Jasher had a sister named Anna. Samuel Birthright married her only daughter that lived long and Timothy who was killed at 11 years of age being jolted out of a cart loaded with brick his head was crushed under the wheels. The children of Jasher the son of John the first were Jasher, Hannah, Sarah, Joanna, and Thomas.

I do give and bequeath unto Jane my wife the full sum of ten shillings of lawful English money to be paid unto her by mine executor presently after my burial. Item I do give and bequeath unto my two sons Francis Wyman and John Wyman which are beyond sea ten punds apiece of lawful English money to be paid unto them by mine executor if they be in want and come over to demand the same. I do give and bequeath unto my sister Susan Huitt widow the full sum of forty shillings of lawful English money to be likewise paid to her by mine executor within one whole year next coming after my decease. I do give and bequeath unto Thomas Wyman my son all that my messuage of tenement wherein I now dwell with all my other buildings and outhousing thereunto belonging, and all my lands, orchard, garden and yards, with all and singular their appurtenances whatsoever, to him and his heirs forever. All the rest of my goods &c. to my said son Thomas, whom I appoint executor. Pell, 116.'

Francis failed to pay his tithes for a number of years and so irritated the vicar that he lost patience with Francis and took him to court. The record appears in the tithe book: '1640 Francis Wyman payed 15 April 1640 17/5d at the Court at Hitchin for ye Calves valued at 8s ye Calfe, for eleven years last past viz for ye years 1623, 1624, 1625, 1626, 1627, 1628, 1629, 1630, 1631, 1632, 1633, the sum of 17s5d by the hand of Mr. Dawson Curate to Dr. Ward of Much Munden for which there is an Act in Court unto me Richard Taylor parson of Westmill which Calves were fallen in St. Croft.

The Wymans built on what became Wyman St. in Woburn, and by 1666 they had also built country farms in what is now Burlington, a few miles north, on what became the Billerica boundary.

Overlooked by many is the fact that a grant of land was made in Woburn on 25 Feb 1679 to a John Wyman, a wheelwright. This was not Lt. John Wyman the brother of Francis, but rather the son of Thomas and Ann (Godfrey) Wyman and hence the nephew of the Wyman brothers. This John was know and Sergant John Wyman. There is also found in Boston a tailor named Thomas Wyman or Wayman who was in the 1675 war against the Narragansett Indians. He is believed by some to be the son of the brother Richard Wyman, hence another nephew of Francis and John Wyman. He was the second officer in the only cavalry troops the English had at the Narraganset Fort fight, Dec 19, 1675. In this fight his son John was killed, but he escaped with a wound in his cheek from an Indian arrow. He was a tanner He 'brought' a servant Robert Simpson to manage his tan yard. With his brother Francis, the largest tanderium in Woburn. These two brothers had brought the Cottemore grant of 500 acres for 50 pounds.

They opposed the rite of infant baptism and were sent to the ecclesiastical court in Cambridge on charges of staying away from church and turning their backs on the rite of infant baptism. However several other prominent citizens of Woburn were with them and nothing happened.' .

The English Wymans are well covered in 'The Wymans/Whymans of Hertfordshire' by Christine E. Jackson of Amberly, Herts, England.

To take possession of this extensive territory a party of fifty or sixty persons, under John Endicott, was sent out to Salem the following June, and another party of two hundred, under Francis Higginson, the year after. In the year 1630, seventeen ships in all, but not all together, brought at least one thousand passengers from England, as estimated by Palfrey in his History of New England, though commonly reckoned at fifteen hundred. Of these ships the Lion left Bristol in February, bringing people from the west of England; the Mary and John sailed from Plymouth March 20th, and arrived May 30th, bringing passengers from Devonshire, Dorsetshire, and Somersetshire. Four ships, the Arbella, Jewel, Ambrose, and Talbot, left the Isle of Wight together, on the 8th of April, having on board Winthrop, Dudley, Isaac Johnson, his wife the lady Arbella, Increase Nowell, William Pynchon, and other principal persons; seven ships, the Mayflower, Flower, Whale, Hopewell, and others, sailed from Southampton in May, and four others followed not long after.

Francis and John Wyman became tanners in Woburn, perhaps having learned the craft in England (Buntingford, two miles north of Westmill, was a tanning center in Hertfordshire) By 1641 they were granted lots for 6d per acre near the center of Woburn at the present Main and Wyman Streets near Central Square. Francis' house has not been recorded, but John's house was a two story frame house 34 by 26 feet with 13 windows having 40 rods of land adjoining. Nearby on Wymans' Lane were the tanning vats, a barn, tan house, currying shop and sheds. Their tanning business carried on until 1768 when it was sold to David Cummings. The water needed for tanning was diverted from a brook which was done away with when the nearby Middlesex Canal was built about 1800. Woburn became the tanning center of the country.

A grant of 500 acres in what became the town of Billerica was made in 1648 to the Rev. Henry Dunster the first president of Harvard College. This he sold in 1655 to Francis and John Wyman for £100 sterling. Because of Dunster's Baptist leanings, he was removed as the president of Harvard College and apparently needed some cash. After some political maneuvering the pending town of Billerica was persuaded to lay out the grant which was entirely within the new town. The grant was on the border of Woburn, adjacent to where the Wymans already had land. In 1657 The Woburn selectmen agreed to exchange 94 acres of land the Wymans already possessed in the town for an equal amount 'adjoining to their land at Billerica.' Again, in 1661 Francis exchanged with the town of Woburn 'a parcel of land lying in the treasury (for land at) his farm next Billerica.' The same year Billerica granted 70 acres in the same general area to the Wyman brothers which was laid out and the return made in 1663.

In 1665 the Wymans purchased for the sum of £50 the Coytmore grant of 500 acres which was to be laid out in Woburn. The Woburn selectmen attempted to have the grant laid out elsewhere, but the General Court in 1666 had it laid out at this time when the Woburn-Billerica boundary was being settled. It was stated that the grant was to be laid out 'in Woobourne bounds, next adjoining to the land and houses of the said Waymens, apprehending it to be most convenient and profitable for them so to lye.' Interestingly, the deed of sale is witnessed by Caleb Cheeshahteumuck, a Martha's Vineyard Indian who was the solitary Indian to have graduated from Harvard College at this time.

In 1667 Francis, John and eleven other citizens of Woburn were hauled before the County Court for publicly manifesting contempt for the ordinance of baptism and for attending illegal assemblies of the Anabaptists. Nothing much happened and both were later active in the local church, although Francis in his will left small bequests to two elders of the Baptist Church in Boston.

The country house of Francis built sometime before 1666 still stands in Burlington and is now owned by the Francis Wyman Association. It is an eight room, two story, center chimney

house with attic and half-cellar. Bianco

Nearby in Billerica is the Amos Wyman cellar hole, the site of John Wyman's original farm house, a house to which Samuel Adams and John Hancock retreated on 17 April 1775 when they fled Lexington. Elizabeth (Pierce) Wyman, the wife of Amos is said to have fed her visitors boiled potatoes, pork and bread instead of the salmon which her guests had planned to eat at the Lexington parsonage. Hancock is reported to have sent a cow to his hostess at a later date in appreciation of her hospitality.

In 1640 500 acres of land in Woburn (now Burlington) was granted to Mr. Thomas Coytmore and was subsequently sold by Joseph Rock to Francis and John for £50 in Oct. 1667. They also owned a large farm in West Woburn extending into Billerica adjoining the Coytmore grant.(2)

'Billerica, 19.9m.1661. At a Towne Meeting, The towne do grant to ffrances Wyman & John Wyman that parcell of land that lyeth betweene Woburne line & the former that they purchased of Mr. Dunster, which is by estimation four score acres, more or less and is bounded on the South or South East with Captaine Gookins farme line.'

'Whereas John Wright, Isaac Cole, ffrancis Wiman, John Wiman, ffrancis Kendall, Robert Peirce, Matthew Smith & Joseph Wright, members in full communion with the Church of Christ at Woburne, were presented by the Grand Jury of the County of Middlesex in New England at the Court in October last (1671) for refusing communion with the Church of Woburne in the Lord's Supper, and rejecting the counsell of neighboring churches, and all other measures for healing the disorder and scandall thereby occasioned: This Court having heard their severall answers, wherein they pretend and alledge that the grounds of their withdrawing are sundry scruples in poynt of conscience, not daring to partake with the church for fear of defilement by sin, giving some reasons of their dissatisfaction, which not being satisfactory to the Court, who are sensible of the scandall thereby redounding to our profession, and considering the directions given by the word of God and laws of this Colony, requiring the attendance of all due meanes for preserving the peace and order of the churches in the wayes of godliness and honesty, that so all God's ordinances may have passage unto edification, according to the rules of Christ. This Court do therefore, upon serious consideration of the whole case, order that the respective churches of Charlestown, Cambridge, Watertown, Redding & Billerica be moved and requested from the Court, according to God's ordinance of communion of churches, to send their elders and messengers unto the church of Woburn the ( ) day of March next, where the brethren that were presented as above said are ordered and required to give a meeting together with the church there, and shall have liberty humbly and inoffensively to declare their grievances, and the church also to declare the whole case for the hearing of their proceedings: And after the case is fully heard by the said councill, they are to endeavor the healing of their spirits, and making of peace among them, for the issuing of matters according to the word of God, and to make returne of what they shall do herein to the next county Court to be held at Cambridge: And the Recorder of this Court is ordered seasonably to signify the Court's mind herein to the several churches above named. It is ordered that the Court's final determination in the above named case be respited, untill they receive the councill's return, and the above named persons that were presented by the Grand Jury are ordered to attend at the next court at Cambridge.'(3)

These people of Woburn were prosecuted before the Middlesex

County Court Dec. 1671 for contempt for ~~his~~ nonconformance of Infant Baptism as administered in the church of Woburn and for withdrawing from that church and attending the assemblies of the Anabaptists which was not allowed by law. John Wyman seemed to have been convinced of the 'error' of his ways and was admitted back to the church in Woburn and took an active part in the settlement of Rev. Jabez Fox as a colleague of Rev. Thomas Carter in 1697. In his will 10 March 1683/4 he gave them 40/ each calling them his 'Reverend Pastors'. Francis however always retained his partiality for the Baptists for in his will 5 Sept. 1698 he gave to two elders of the Baptist Church in Boston, Mr. Isaac Hull and Mr. John Emblen 20/ each. Francis did however remain in communion with the church in Woburn.

The Wymans of Hertfordshire first appear in the Seventeenth

Century records and form two distinct families living in the eastern part of the county. There were the Westmill Wymans and the Barkway Whymans in the early years. By following the fortunes of the two families you can draw the conclusion that they were separated not only by geography, but also developed and spread their interests independently of one another. The Barkway Wymans by the mid-Eighteenth Century were consistently spelling their name with the "h," while those of Braughing and the Hormeads spelled their name without it. This difference holds today. Another variant is that the Barkway Whymans to the north were traders and labourers, while the Wymans in the south were yeoman farmers.

The Westmill Wymans moved first to Braughing, where Thomas (the elder brother of John and Francis who emigrated to America) founded the Wyman dynasty which subsequently migrated to the north, south and east. From Braughing, Thomas' sons and grandsons moved to Standon, Aspeden, Great Munden, Little Hadham, Bishop's Stortford, the Hormeads, Albury, Throcking and Little Munden. This enterprising family were mostly farmers who leased large farms usually 100 acres and more and trained their own sons. When the sons reached the age of twenty-one, they in turn took leases on neighboring large estates. Time and again this pattern is repeated until in the first half of the nineteenth Century, Wyman farmers held most of the Hormead farms, a Dassells' farm, an Albury and a Throcking farm. These were the Wymans who spread out from Braughing. The Wymans left in Braughing, though numerous in the Nineteenth Century, were reduced gradually to earning their livings as carpenters, butchers and farm labourers.

There were a number of reasons for the decline in the Braughing Wymans' fortunes. In the second half of the Eighteenth Century the eldest sons had been placed on farms outside Braughing parish. In the early Nineteenth Century Wymans who had bought houses, small holdings, and parcels of land in the village, stipulated in their Wills that these were to be sold and the proceeds divided equally among all their children. This democratic procedure meant tiny shares for all that were of use to none. At the end of the Nineteenth Century, despite the increasing number of children to survive infancy, there were fewer Wyman boys than girls, and the males who survived seem to have lost the ability and vigour of their forefathers. One very good reason for lack of Wyman sons to carry on the tradition of the old yeoman farmers in the Hormeads was emigration of two brothers to New Zealand from Little Hormead in 1878. They were the last of the enterprising yeoman stock. In the 1890's agriculture declined due to a disastrous series of wet summers and lost crops. By 1900 hardly any Wymans were occupying the large farms in the northeast part of Hertfordshire where once they had been such good and successful farmers.

Early in the Twentieth Century families became scattered. A lot of the local labor force went to help build the northern suburbs of London, and to work on the railways driving steam engines. World War I took a terrible toll on the small villages where the Wymans lived and of those fortunate to return to

England, many took jobs outside the county for the denuded  
farm labourers in the area had shrunk. A second World War  
nearly intensified this situation, until there is now no Wyman  
left in the Hormeads or Braughing and only one in Barkway.
