"Forget all those references about William's father - as far as I know they are all just idle speculation. "

Andrew was a resident of Ipswich MA 1639, proprietor 1635, etc. [See reference "Genealogical Encyclopedia of First Settlers to New England" which says he may be the youth sentenced to be whipped Sept Court 1635 for running from his master, and after had served in the expedition against the Pequots two years later.] I can find no further reference regarding this man.

Augustine was a resident of Exeter NH 1639, had the year before been of Boston MA, etc. [See reference cited above, which says his surname was variously recorded as Star, Storr, Storre & Story.] Nothing further known.

Regarding when William came to the colonies...

8 Aug 1637: Examination of Samuel Dix, of Norwich (etc - this is in England) and two servants, William Storey age 23 & Daniel Linsey age 18 all desirous

to pass to Boston in New England, there to inhabit."

Some half a dozen items of circumstantial evidence, including the names of the children of Sarah Story and an association of Elisha's son, William Story, with "Samuel Story of Norridge (Norwich, Connecticut)" suggest strongly that he was a son of William Story, Jr. and his wife, Susannah Fuller, of Ipswich, Massachusetts, who moved to Concord, then to Charlestown, Roxbury, and Brookline, Massachusetts, putting them in the right place to have had a son named Elisha. William Story, Jr. was one of three sons of William Story and Sarah Foster, both of whom immigrated from England to Ipswich."

"In early life, Zachariah Story was a mariner and master of the sloop "Charlotte", engaged for several years in profitable trade with the West Indies. Tiring of the sea he abandoned this occupation and removed to Hopkinton, N.H. where several of his brothers had preceded him and where his father, Jeremiah, spent his declining years. In that picturesque village of the Granite State, Captain Story and his wife, Susannah Low, made their home until 1890 when he became one of the earlier settlers of this town (Windsor, VT). Here in West Windsor he purchased a farm of 200 acres upon which there was a cabin, and brought his family to the pioneer home, his wife and ten children having buried four prior to his removal to West Windsor. He cleared his original purchase and developed it into a fertile and productive farm and later built a substantial brick dwelling which is still standing...Captain Story died in West Windsor, May 12, 1831, in his 90th year and he and his wife are buried in the Hill burying ground on the road to Sheddsville..."

"Mr. Nehemiah Story was a man of more than average mind, unusually well versed in mathematics. He removed from Oxford, Me., where 6 of his 12 children were born, to Ohio in 1816. But he spent a considerable time in Pa. before going on to Ohio and was engaged in surveying lands in the "Holland Purchase". The compass, tripod, chain and tally pins used by him are now in possession of his grandson, Mr Amos Hardy of Chicago, also a pen and ink map of the "Holland Purchase" made by him. After (arriving) in Ohio he was engaged much of the time in surveying and for a time on government surveys under what was then the "New Rectangular System".

"He was also a carpenter, millwright and cabinet maker, and there are several dwellings built by him (at) an early day still standing in a habitable condition.

"He was also a Baptist preacher and for many years preached regularly. He also, to very limited extent, practiced medicine in the early settlement - times when regular physicians were few and far apart.

"He was stricken with paralysis in May, 1868, and died August 3, 1868 at his home in Galion, Ohio."

3. Note: In the book, "HISTORY OF MORROW COUNTY, OHIO", O.L Baskin, and Co., 1880, p. 400:

"In the spring of 1823, Nehemiah Story settled on some land he had entered where Mr. Abner Sharrock now resides. He was a preacher of the Baptist denomination, and not infrequently did his fellow pioneers gather at his house to listen to his plain-spoken Gospel truth. Though no organization of that faith was formed, yet he was the means of great good to his fellows in making it possible for them to hear the Truth even in the interim between the visits of evangelists, which that early day were much like angels' 'few and far between Mr. Story was also a practical surveyor, and we find his name appended to the record of land plats in the township and village of Iberia."

"Francis Marion Story was born May 16, 1833, in Gallion, Crawford County, Ohio and departed this  
life after ten days of intense suffering September 28, 1905, age 72 year, 4 months and 12 days. (He was  
the oldest of a family of six children... four girls and two boys, and the first of the children to depart this  
life... this phrase did not appear in referenced obituary, but was in copy of an obituary sent Helen  
Heuston Hubbell by 'Beth' Story Moore of Pensacola, FL.)

" He was married to Margaret Nestlerode August 20, 1854. There were 8 children of this union: Clara  
Jane, Samuel Curtis, Lafayette, Harvey W., Arthur E., Bebee Orissa, Anna Martha and Mary D. Of  
these, Mrs. Clara Harding of Everett, Wash.; Curtis of Ripley, OK; Mrs. S. C. Pool (Bebee) of  
Sigourney, IA; Mrs. Frank Churchill (Mattie) of Keswick, IA; and Miss Mary D. Story of Omaha, NE  
survive him. He was married the second time to Hannah E. Reeder February 13, 1876, in Keokuk  
County, IA. To this union were born two children, Alva F. who died in infancy and Mrs. Ira Ames  
(Josie) of Kirkman.

" Mr. Story came to Cedar County, IA with his parents in 1844 and with the exception of short  
intervals of time in Illinois, Kansas and Nebraska, has lived in this State since then. He was converted  
and joined the Baptist Church when 19 years old, and lived a faithful Christian life until called home.  
(Mr. Story has been failing in health the past four years, and has been very frail the past year, but able to  
be around the most of the time, and was confined to bed nine days.) He expressed his perfect willingness  
to go. The last evening while in great pain, he sang in a clear, sweet tone, 'Rock of Ages, cleft for me, Let  
me hide myself in Thee.' Singing this three times, he fell asleep, never to awaken until the Resurrection.  
(He died at 3:30 the next morning.)

" Funeral services were held Friday at 2:30 PM in the Kirkman Baptist Church , (check with Shelby Co. CC showed NO Baptist church now in Kirkman, dgb 8/95) services being conducted by Rev. Tucker, reading Psalm 19, taking for his subject the 7th verse, "The law of the Lord is perfect, converting the soul." Four hymns were sung, "Jesus, Lover of my Soul". "Rock of Ages", "I Shall Know Him" and "In the Christians's Home of Glory". After the service, the body was lovingly laid to rest in Rose Hill Cemetery west of Kirkman, there to await that glorious awakening when we hope to meet again."

7. In researching Francis M. Story, I found several individuals with the given name..."Francis Marion". I learned (re. Prodigy note from Cecilie Gaziano) that there was a well-known patriot during the Revolutionary War named Francis Marion (1732 - 1795). He was a farmer and soldier in the Carolina's and was called "the Swamp Fox" by the British forces because of his elusive tactics. He is credited with being one of the first to use guerrilla warfare. Marion was recognized by Congress for his efforts in rescuing American forces surrounded by the British at Parker's ferry. After the war, he served in the South Carolina legislature.

As with many other famous personalities, Francis Marion became the name-sake of many sons born in the early 1800's. Also, there are 18 states with "Marion" counties, but it is not known how many of these were named in honor of Francis Marion. (dgb)

Francis Marion moved his family from Iowa to Kansas for a short time in 1874 (see obituary of daughter, Clara Jane ). His wife, Margaret, had family in Johnson Co., KS. Obituary of his daughter, Martha, indicates that his wife, Margaret died while in Kansas. She was united to Mr. Francis Story, February 13, 1876. Two children came to make their home happy, one a boy who died at the age of 14 months, and the other Mrs. Ira Ames of Kirkman.

"Mrs. Story was baptized into the Prairie View Baptist church of Keokuk county, Iowa, January 30, 1876, by Elder S. E. Nelson, and united with the Kirkman Baptist Church eight years ago. Her Christian experience was bright and clear, for she was willing to do all she could for her Master, and she faithfully performed her part. She suffered a great deal during her seven weeks of sickness, though unconscious most of the time. To all appearances she bore it patiently and if she could have spoken, would have said, 'The Lord's Will be done, not mine.' Her husband preceded her to the better land seven months and sixteen days almost to the hour.

"She leaves one daughter, Mrs. Ira Ames of Kirkman, one step-daughter, Miss Mary Story of St. Louis, one brother and two sisters who reside in Colorado and a large circle of friends and neighbors to mourn her departure. The funeral services were held in the Kirkman Baptist Church, and were conducted by Rev. C.V. Bentley. He was assisted by Rev. E. B. Tucker who preached her husband's funeral sermon."

(It is interesting to note that the obit acknowledges only step-daughter, Mary, but there were 4 other children of Francis still living...dgb.)

"Chauncey C. Harding was born at Clifford, Pa., January 14, 1790; (son of Amos and Phoebe Tripp Harding); died Huron county, OH, December 8, 1880. Married Feb. 22, 1830, Rachel Story (born in Oxford County, Maine, Jan. 22, 1809; died at Iberia, OH, March 10, 1869).

Chauncey Harding came to Ohio with his parents in 1820; soon after his marriage he settled in Marion County, OH, where he had the respect and confidence of a large circle of acquaintances. He was a farmer, a Free-will Baptist, and was noted for his liberality in religious matters, being at home in almost any sect of worshippers. Politically, he was a Whig (casting his first presidential vote for Henry Clay in 1832), until 1856, when he became a republican, and his last vote was for Garfield in 1880. His wife was a daughter of Nathaniel Nehemiaah Story, a granddaughter of Joseph Story and Nathaniel Kittredge, and a great granddaughter of Benjamin Dows and William Low, all soldiers in the war of the Revolution."
