

Descendants of John Boye

Generation No. 1

1. John¹ Boye was born in Stirlingshire, Scotland, and died in Durham Parish, Charles, Maryland, Usa. He married **Jane Taylor**. She died 14 Sep 1719 in Durham Parish, Charles, Maryland, Usa.

Notes for John Boye:

This is the father of Abraham Bowie. He was probably born in Stirlingshire, Scotland. Migrating to Maryland USA he settled on a farm called Seneh's Delight, later to be owned by his fifth son, Abraham. It is not clear who gave the farm its name, but more than likely it was Abraham's father. G. Henry Bowie in "Where The Brambles Bloom" indicates it was named by Abraham. However he ignores data that Abraham had ancestors in the same community. The late Howard Coulby, Jr. did a lot of research in parish and public records of Charles County, Maryland and Durham Parish and quotes many details which lead to the inescapable conclusion that W. W. Bowie in "Bowie's And Their Kindred", and Henry Bowie in "Brambles" have either ignored these data or chose not to use them. It must be stated here these data may be in error, and caution should be used until documented 100%. But because so much material has been quoted by Howard Coulby, Jr. directly from records, it can be assumed these data to virtually documented as fact. His first name was not known, but was believed to be John, hence the use of "John" here. The name was spelled "Boye" till about the third generation, although some records show Abraham spelling it "Boey."

Addendum: (July 4, 1997) Researcher Everette Bowie, of Olive Branch, MS has uncovered data in the Memphis Public Library listing a John Boye as a passenger on the ship the John and Sarah which sailed from London on 13 November, 1651 carrying a "cargo" of prisoners who had participated in a rebellion against the crown. They were taken prisoner in the Battle of Dunbar (Dumbarton) 3 September, 1650. These data are referred to in an affidavit a Mr. Tho. Kemble to the captain of the John and Sarah, Capt. Jno. Greene. The document was notarized by Jo. Nottock 13 May 1652, apparently the date the ship landed in BOSTON. All the prisoners were being deported to New England for their rebellion. Quote: An exact of a letter written by Rev. John Cotton to the Lord General Cromwell, dated at "Boston in N. E. 28 of 5th 1651" respecting some prisoners of the same class of persons included in the above list sent over before the se arrived. They all were taken prisoner in the Battle of Dunbar, 3 Sept, 1650 when Cromwell was victorious, and four thousand were slain, and ten thousand made prisoner." end quote. Also in the same letter, this quote copied in the spelling and grammar actually used: "The Scots, whom God delivered into your hands at Dunbarre, and whereof sundry were send hither, we have been desirous (as we could) to make their yoke easy. Such as were sick of the scurvy or other diseases have not wanted physicks and Chyrurgery. They have not been sold for slaves to perpetual servitude, but for 6 or 7 or 8 yeares, as we do our owne; and he that bought the most of them (I heare) buildeth houses for them, for every four an house, layeth some acres of ground thereto, which he giveth them as their owne, requiring 3 dayes in the week to work for him (by turnes) and 4 dayes for themselves, and promiseth, as soone as they can repay him the money he layed out for them, he will set them at liberty." It is interesting to note the passenger list shows two names that are identical: John Boye! No data can be located to date to explain this. Could there be two John Boye's, or was one John Boye listed twice, in error? Also how and when did he move to Maryland, and when and where did he marry Jane. Since no women were on the John & Sarah, it is logical to assume he married her in the colonies. This data can be located in a book, Passengers To America in a section called Scotch Prisoners to Massachusetts, 1652, pages 147-149.

Addendum 4 December 1997: Researcher Everette Bowie of Olive Branch, MS has found documentation of John Boye coming to America. It can be found in the Maryland Genealogical Society Quarterly Bulletin in a section called Passengers to America, subtitle, Scotch Prisoners to Massachusetts, 1652. He was captured in the Battle of Worcester, in Scotland 3 Sept 1651. (The Battle of Dunbar was 3 September 1650, and these data remark that the Battle of Worcester was one year to the day following Dunbar, hence the date of Worcester as 3 September 1651 must be assumed, though not specified in the records.) Lord General Oliver Cromwell was sent to quell a rebellion and 4000 were slain, and 6000 made prisoner. Affidavits consigning the prisoners to Mr. Thomas Kemble, a businessman of Charles Towne, MA shows he accepted the entire manifest of the John & Sarah, all prisoners of the same battle, all deported by order of the English Government, on 13 May 1652. It is believed the John & Sarah was owned by a Charles Towne resident, but it is not certain. What is known is that it

was Captained by Capt. John Greene. The likely departure date from London was 11 November 1651. All prisoners were indentured servants. An extract from a letter written by Rev. John Cotton to Lord General Cromwell dated at Boston in N. E. 28 of the Fifth 1651 reads as follows: "The Scots, whom God delivered into your hands at Dunbarre, and whereof sundry were sent hither, we have been desirous (as we could) to make their yoke easy. Such as were sick of scurvy or other diseases have not wanted physick and chyrurgery. They have not been sold for slaves to perpetual servitude, but for 6 or 7 or 8 yeares, as we do our owne; and he that bought the most of them (I heare) buildeth houses for them, for every four an house, layeth some acres of ground thereto, which he giveth them as their owne, requiring 3 days in the week to worke for him (by turnes) and 4 days for themselves, and promiseth, as soone as they can repay him the money he layed out for them, he will set them at liberty." (Note spelling). The reference to 'Dunbarre' is puzzling since the records of this occurrence refers only to the Battle of Worcester.

Addendum 6-25-00: Bowie Family Researcher, Everette Bowie of Olive Branch, MS., now believes that John Boye nor his fifth son Abraham ever owned Seneh's Delight. Abraham Bowie II, son of Oswell was the more likely owner. Records in Charles County, Maryland show at least two purchases of land known as Seneh's Delight from the Poston family.

In the name of God, Amen. I, Jane Boye, of Charles County in the province of Maryland, widow, being very sick and weak in body but of perfect mind and memory praises be to Almighty God for the same--first and principally, I commit my soul unto Almighty God who gave its hoping at the general resurrection through the merits of my Saviour Jesus Christ to have free pardon and forgiveness of all my sins and my body to be decently buried at the discretion of my executor hereafter named and for what estate it pleased Almighty God to bestow upon me. I give and bequeath the followeth: Item 1: I give and bequeath unto my daughter Elizabeth Boye one bed and bedstead with good blankets and silk, rug, and other furniture and -----(unreadable) and one table and three small chairs and one great chair and three dishes and one-half dozen plates and one tankard and one iron pott and one Bellmettle skillet and one pair of curtains and one pail and piggins and two cow calves and three sows and piggs and two banou (researcher note: probably barrow) hoggs, all the said mentioned goods and chattle to be delivered to my daughter Elizabeth Boye when she shall arrive at the age of eighteen years or the day of marriage. Item: my will and pleasure is that all the rest of my personale estate be equally divided among my five sons, Pigeon, John, Thomas, Abraham, and Bowman Boye, and if any of my said sons live to arrive to the age of eighteen at which years my will and pleasure is they shall be at age give for them. If any of them die before the age of eighteen years then their part to be equally divided among the survivors. And if any of my said sons die after the death of my daughter Elizabeth Boye then their parts or portions to be equally divided among the rest of my sons that are still alive. Item: I give and bequeath unto my daughter Elizabeth Boye all my wearing cloaths both linnens and wollin gs. Lastly I do nominate and appoint my well beloved son Pigeon Boye full whole and sole executor of all Revoking and Disannulling all former wills by me Jane Boye made and this to be my last will and testament. As witness my hand and seal the 28 day of July 1719.

Test: Thos. Evans---Ann Evans Signed Jane Boye

Amendment to the foregoing will was the following probate, towit, September 21st, 1719. Thomas Evans Subscribing witness to the within will before on the Holy Evangelists that he saw Jane Bowie sign and seal the written instrument as her Last Will and Testament and that he published and declared the Jane Boye is to be and at the time of her so doing s he was of sound and perfect mind and memory to the best of his knowledge before us this day and year above said.

It is not known what happened to John, Bowman, Pigeon, and Thomas. It appears that only brother Abraham remained in Maryland. It is thought that they may have moved south to Virginia, North Carolina, South Carolina, or Georgia. The ancestor of Col. Jim Bowie was a John Bowie who married a Mary Mulligan (Mulliken) and was born in 1688. There is no evidence to indicate any relationship between our John Boye and the husband of Mary Mulligan (Mullican, Milliken?)

The will of Jane Boye copied above is entered here exactly as written, complete with grammar and spelling unchanged from the original.

Addendum 4 December 1997: Researcher Everette Bowie, Olive Branch, MS has uncovered a document that may give a clue to the maiden name of Jane Boye - Taylor. Consider this from "Early Charles County Maryland Settlers 1658 - 1745: Boye (Boy), Jane (widow). Mentions dau. Elizabeth; five sons, Pigeon, John, Thomas, Abraham and Bowman. (Will: 15.200; 28 July 1719, 21 September 1719)" Next of kin: John Taylor. (Inv.:3.254; 3 Nov. 1719---).

The name Taylor will be used until data to the contrary can be found.

Addendum February 26, 1998: More evidence of the maiden name Taylor has been located by Diane Atkinson of St. Louis, Missouri in a book titled "Charles County Maryland Probate Records and Inventories 1673-1753, compiled by Ruth King and Carol Mitchell: Page 10: Jane Boye 3 November 1719 - John Taylor the only relation of the deceased. On page 17, same book: John Taylor 15 July 1734 "Jno. Pigeon Boy Jno Boy near kin Eliz(a)Taylor Exec. These data can be regarded as further confirmation that the wife of John Boye was Jane Taylor.

Elizabeth Boye was the only daughter of Jane Boye. See notes on RIN 1594 for more information (Jane Boye). It is not known in which order she was born, or any other information that identifies her positively. However, records have been found by Howard Coulby, Jr. in Georgia and Virginia listing the spelling "Boye". In 1874 Elizabeth Boye is listed in Georgia Land requests for Burke County. This is where Rezin Bowie and Elve Ap-Catesby Jones met and married and gave birth to Colonel James Jim Rezin Bowie! We can consider this more evidence of the Jim Bowie lineage.

2. Abraham² Bowie (John¹ Boye) died 1752 in , Charles, Maryland, New England.

Notes for Abraham Bowie:

Abraham Boye, later spelled Bowie, was the son of John and Jane Boye. It had long been thought that Abraham was born in Scotland, but later data uncovered by the late Howard Coulby, Jr. indicates beyond doubt that John Boye and perhaps wife Jane were the immigrants from Stirlingshire, Scotland, not Abraham. John and Jane Boye had several children, all listed in Jane's will. Abraham was not the oldest. Pigeon, John, Bowman, and Thomas were his elder siblings. Abraham was the next born, and the last son. One daughter, Elizabeth, was the youngest child. All the brothers except Abraham, and Elizabeth left Charles County never to return. It is thought that John married a Catholic lass, probably in Charleston, SC. and fearing she would not be accepted by a staunchly Presbyterian family, decided to stay away. This left Abraham the only child still at home and he naturally inherited Seneh's Delight from his parents, probably at his father's death since no mention of the farm is included in Jane's will. The name Seneh's Delight apparently comes from 1st Samuel 14:1-13. During the war between Israel and the Philistine nation, King Saul's son Jonathan with armour bearers made an unauthorized attempt to infiltrate the Philistine garrison, which with the Lord's help was successful. While Jonathan and his companions made their way through a mountain pass near Michmash they went between two large rocks. One was called Bozez and the other Seneh. A dictionary of Biblical terms indicates Seneh means brambles. It must have been that brambles bloomed in such profusion they seemed to find great delight in that environment. Other researchers have found data (Mark Davis & Pete McLallen) indicating another scenario: That Seneh is Gaelic for Jane. G. Henry Bowie mentions in his book "Where The Brambles Bloom" that Abraham died in 1752 and letters testamentary were issued to John Bowie, his son, who administered his estate, closing it in 1753. The settlement showed disbursements for Abraham and his wife, who was not named, including funeral expenses. She apparently died a short time after her husband. A search for Abraham's wife has been futile to date since the courthouse in Nanjemoy, Charles County, Maryland was burned by the British in the War of 1812.

Addendum January 9, 1997: In a letter to Glenn Bowie in Abbeville, SC the late Howard Coulby, Jr. had information he uncovered in or before 1990 that "Seneh" may have been spelled "Senia" and pronounced phonetically as "Seneh." If this datum is correct it could be an old Gaelic pronunciation of the name "Buihe." It is also believed that Seneh is Gaelic for Jane. So, we can take our pick. There is no corroborating evidence of either story. Speculation can be fun, but does not provide proof of the data. Of particular importance, is that the Charles County, Maryland Courthouse burned, and along with it all supporting records of the Durham Parish, Charles County ancestors.

Addendum February 26, 1998: Diane Atkinson of St. Louis, Missouri has confirmed a date of 15 September 1752 for the date Abraham Bowie's will was proved. This data is in a book titled: Charles County Maryland Probate Records & Inventories 1673-1753, Page 30.

According to data provided by Dr. Robert Bowie of Brewer, Maine, Abraham is buried on his estate, Seneh's Delight. He also has a notation in his book, "Bowie's and Their Kindred of Scotland and The Colonies," that indicates Seneh is Gaelic for Jane!

Addendum February 7, 2000: Researcher Everette Bowie of Olive Branch, Mississippi has come to the conclusion that Abraham Boye, son of John and Jane Boye never owned Seneh's Delight. This could account for no mention of the farm in the will of Jane Boye. Since Abraham was the only issue to remain in Maryland, it would seem that if the land was still in the family it would have been left to Abraham. Rather, he believes, the farm belonged to another of the same name that is often referred to as Abraham Bowie II. This Abraham was the son of Oswald Bowie and the great grandson of Abraham I. This can be documented in Charles County, Maryland Land Records, 1790 to 1796 (Library ID: 929.3525, Volume 5) Page 230: March 8 1794 from William Poston and Sarah, his wife, of CC, to Abraham Bowie of CC, a tract of land called Seneh's Delight, bounded by the spring valley, a dividing boundary between Abraham Bowie and Isaac Bowie, the dividing line between William Poston & Thomas Bulman, the second line of Danby, the last line of Danby's Addition, Randalls

Addition, Bastable Enlarged, Hamills Mistake, Mr. Barnes' land, containing 82 1/2 acres. Signed: William Poston, Sarah Poston. Witness, Richard Barnes, Henry H. Chapman. Said Sarah Poston relinquished her right of dower. Recorded March 12, 1794.

Another transaction occurred on the same date as follows: Page 233, March 8, 1794 from William Poston and Sarah, his wife, of CC, to Abraham Bowie of CC, for 125 pounds, 12 shillings, 6 pence, part of a tract of land called Seneh's Delight bounded by Ashbrooks Rest, a stone formerly fixed by William Poston and Thomas Bullman as a dividing line between them, and the dividing line as run by David L. Ward, the Spring Valley, Mr. Barnes' land, containing and now surveyed for 83 acres, 3 rods. Signed: William Poston, Sarah Poston. Witness Richard Barnes, Henry H. Chapman. Said Sarah Poston relinquished her right of dower. Recorded March 12 1794.

Since Abraham I died in 1752, this could not be his property. There can be little doubt that our thinking on this subject has been in error for more than two hundred years!

April Court 1787

Isabel Bowie - Will

In the name of God, Amen. I, Isabel Bowye of Charles County in the Province of Maryland being sick and weak but of sound mind and memory thanks be to God therefore calling to mind the uncertainty of this life and that it is appointed for all woman (sic) to die do make this to be my last will and testament in the following manner making null and void all other wills by me made hertofore.

First and principally I commend my soul unto the hands of Almighty God that gave it to me and my body to the earth to be buried in a descent Christian manner at the discretion of my executor hereafter named.

Such as to what worldly estate it hath pleased God to bless me with I dispose of in the following manner:

(Word unreadable) I will that all my just debts and funeral charges be first paid.

Item- I give to my son James Peel Bowye sixty acres of land a part of Manisclare Chase to be paid off from the first sale of (unreadable) tract of land in a four square.

Item- I give to my son Benjamin Bowye the remaining part of my land where I now dwell. If my son William Bowye is a mind to come back upon the land to live again; to live his lifetime upon it where hee (sic) lived before and after my two sons death, Benjamin Bowye and William Bowye his heirs lawfully begotten forever, in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal the 9th day of February 1783.

Signed sealed and delivered in the presence of John Smith, Rhody Adams, and Josias Adams.

At the foot of which will is thus written Charles "County 12 March 1787 then came James P. Bowye heir at law to Isabel (sic) Bowye late of Charles County deceased and made oath on the Holy Evangel of Almighty God that the forgoing instrument of writing is true (unreadable) Last Will and Testament of the said deceased that hath come to his hand and possession and that he doth not know of any other.

signed: John Muschett Register of Wills

Then came John Smith, Rhody Adams, and Josias Adams the three subscribing witnesses to the forgoing Last Will and Testament of Isabel Bowye of Charles County deceased and (unreadable) made an oath on the Holy Evangel of Almighty God that they did see the testator therein named, sign and seal this will, that they heard her publish, pronounce and declare the same to be her last will and testament. That at the time of her so doing she was to the best of their apprehension of sound and disposing mind, memory and understanding and that they respectively subscribed their names as witnesses to this will in the presence and at the request of the Testator and in the presence of each other.

On the 12th day of March 1787 Letter of Administration with will (unreadable) on the estate of Isabel Bowie to James Peel Bowie and his bond with Thomas Posey and Josias Adams his securities was taken in the form of Two Hundred Pounds current money for due Administration.

Oswell Bowie's wife was apparently named Mary Ann, maiden name unknown. She is listed in the Charles County Register of Wills (Administrative Accounts 1791-1798). It lists the account of Mary Ann Bowie, the administrator of Oswell Bowie, late of Charles County. Oswell's sons Abraham and Isaac were mentioned in the first account dated February 1791.
