1. MICHAEL<sup>1</sup> LYNCH<sup>1</sup> was born Abt 1790 in Kilrush, Co Clare, IRE<sup>2</sup>, and died in Carrowfree, Kilrush Parish, Co Clare, IRE. He married MATILDA "MAGGIE" PURTILL<sup>3</sup>. She was born Abt 1795 in Kilrush, Co Clare, IRE, and died in Carrowfree, Kilrush Parish, Co Clare, IRE.

Notes for MICHAEL LYNCH:

\*Clare Heritage Center Records, County Clare, IRELAND: Records did not start until 1827, in Kilrush. The Michael LYNCH family was not found in the civil registration records, which did not start until 1864. It is believed that most of them had immigrated by then. County Clare was hit very hard by The Great Famine. Whole families disappeared at this time, either immigration to the US, Australia, Canada, or died.

Also, there was a huge outbreak of Cholera epidemic there in 1832, which might be why some records are not there for some. Per Sally LYNCH/O'Meara.

\*Sally O'Meara-knew her mother spoke of two LYNCH cousins in Minneapolis, MN. They were Mariah and Ellen. She said they never married. Mariah was principal of the Willard School in Minneapolis, MN. She found them, learned their father was Patrick LYNCH, son of Michael.

Notes for PATRICK LYNCH:

\*Per Sally (LYNCH) O'Meara-Patrick left IRELAND abt 1850 during the famine. He went to Canada, when his prents and family went to the US. He married Ellen,(last name unknown-parents born in Ireland) in Quebec, Canada. They had nine children (four born in Canada). They lived in Vermont, NH, Main, MASS, before settling in Minnesota, where he worked as a stonemason in St. Peter, Nicollet Co., MN in 1880 Census. Ellen was a dressmaker.

MARY<sup>2</sup> LYNCH (MICHAEL<sup>1</sup>)<sup>5,6,7,8</sup>** was born Abt 1825 in POSS-Carrowfree, Kilrush, Co Clare, IRE<sup>9</sup>, and died 21 Mar 1899 in Winona, Winona County, Minnesota<sup>10</sup>. She married WILLIAM HENRY (NEILAN) NEALON<sup>11,12,13,14,15,16</sup> 14 Feb 1844 in Carrowfree, Kilrush parish, Co Clare, IRE<sup>17,18,19</sup>, son of JOHN (NEILAN) NEALON. He was born 25 May 1802 in POSS-Derrynalecka, Kilmurry-McMahon, Co Clare, IRE<sup>20</sup>, and died 14 Jun 1902 in Winona, Winona County, Minnesota<sup>21,22</sup>.

Notes for MARY LYNCH:

\*Wm's OBIT notes Mary died 3 years before him (1899).....he died in 1902, per Winona HERALD, MINNESOTA

\*Notation in book "Silver Rifts" states "ma died March 21, 1899" ...Book was written by their son, Wm. Henry NEALON.

\*Research collected by Sally O'Meara: GGgrand-daughter of Anna Lynch, Mary's sister along with an article about Mary's sister Catherine states that Kilrush, County Clare, IRELAND was on the bank of the Shannon River. Sally's daughter lives in IRELAND and works in research, got her master's in medieval Irish history at Trinity College in 1997, and has been very helpful in researching the LYNCH/NEALON families.

Per research by Sally-The LYNCH-NEALON-McGUANES families were Irish Catholic Famine immigrants from County Clare, Ireland. The LYNCHES were from the small idustrial town of Kilrush in County Clare. This area was

very hard hit in the Great Famine and a great many of them left and went to the US and Australia. Unfortunately, there aren't many Irish CENSUS records for that area still in existence (many records lost in a great fire in Dublin in the 1920's when Ireland was fighting for independence from England.) Also, the Catholic parish records don't go back very far (they start about 1828 for County Clare) because it was a persecuted religion. "

\*The OBIT for Wm. in the book "Silver Rifts", the notation of him being 100 yrs and fourteen days was written over. It indicated that he was (107 yrs and fourteen days) and that he had celebrated his 107th birthday. I don't know who had corrected/changed this by hand. The obituary in the Winona Herald was in 1902, and states he was born in Ireland May 20, 1802.

\* 2003-Sally O'Meara (LYNCH) states that she believes Wm H NEALON & Mary LYNCH were married (14 February 1844) in St. Senan's Church, which is/was the Catholic Church in Kilrush. (Source: Marriage Record for Mary LYNCH & Willlliam NEILAN per RC Parish records for Kilrush, Diocese of Killaloe, IRE. Witnesses-John NEILAN & Matilda PURTILL) "Good chance John NEILAN is William's brother, Matilda might be a relative of Mary's."Marraige date would fit with the birth ages given in 1870 Census, Winona, Minn. for Bridget (age 24-1846) and the date of his immigration given by William NEALON in the 1900 Census (1849)

\*2004-Sally e-mailed NEW DISCOVERY!- She had research done by the Clare Heritage Center, Corofin, IRELAND, on the NEALON-LYNCH family of County Clare. "They confirmed that Mary LYNCH and William NEALON-NEILAN were married 14 Feb 1844, at the home of Mary's parents in the townland of Carrowfree, Kilrush parish, County Clare. they said it was customary at that time to be married in the brides home. Mary's parents were Michael LYNCH and Matilda (Maggie) PURTILL (variant of Purcell). William NEALON's father was listed as John NEALON-NEILAN. (We had info that his father was PATRICK, per Obituary in 1902, Winona, MN) but the CLare Heritage Center indicated that was wrong) John NEALON and Mary's mother, Matilda LYNCH, witnessed the marriage (William's mother wasn't mentined, so she was probably deceased). John NEILAN farmed in the townland of Derrynalecka, parish of Kilmurry-McMahon, County Clare, neighboring parish to Kilrush, County Clare."

OTHER NOTES from Clare Heritage Center. The parish records didn't start until the mid 1840's.Their first child, Bridget, does not show up in the records as her birth would have been before the records started in that parish. Their second child, Susan, is in the parish records, baptised on 17 Sept 1846, in Darrynalecka, Kilmurry-McMahon, Co Clare, IRE. so her birth would probably been within days or weeks of her christening." (See LYNCH, MICHAEL for more County Clare parish records)

ALSO, The Clare Heritage Center couldn't find these families in the civil registration records (which didn't start in Ireland until 1864) and we believe that all of them either emigrated, or died before that. We already know that County Clare was especially hard hit in the Great Famine, abt 1845, and also a huge Cholera epidemic abt 1830's. We do know that Wm. Henry NEALON arrived in BOSTON abt 1864. (WHO is the Patrick that we thought was father to Wm. Henry NEALON)??? POSSIBLY a BROTHER??

!Family Register-(Family Bible Records) of ( Diana L. ELLIS) states that Wm. H. Nealon Died at Tacoma, another entry states that Wm. H. Nealon Died at Winona. Have newspaper clips of Obits for both of them. They are father & son.

!May 21, 1885 CENSUS shows a boy, Williiam age 10(?) living with William & Sarah Ellis. I believe this to be Wiliam NEALON-Sarah's brother, even though the age & birth year do not match for him (he would have been abt 15yrs).

Winona City Directory 1881-81: Nealon, William-laborer, res W. 2d, 1 w round house. This would be Wm., Sr.

\*Catherine Lynch McGuane- part of an article printed in the newspaper in Minneapolis, MN, 1920, aged 94. She recalled some of her youth in Ireland. "The little town of Kilrush, in County Clare, where she was born, It was right on the bank of the Shannon River. Many's the day I've gone wading and started to walk right out to the ships that sailed past to the ocean. But it was always too deep and besides we had to watch the tide. When it started to go out it would sweep you right along with it if you didn't run for it."

Mr. Timothy Burns married Anna LYNCH in IRELAND, then Timothy came to America about 1853 (poss 1847) first to "make his way" and sent for Anna a few yrs later. According to family tradition, "her parents did not want her to go and Timothy had to write to the Parish priest, who talked them into it." He lived in Elmira, NY for five years, then (?) for six, then removed to Winona, Minn about 1858. He was then employed by the Laird-Norton Co., as an engineer, first in the sawmill and then in the planing mill.

\*Bridget was born in IRELAND, abt 1844-45, probably in Derrynalecka, parish of Kilmurry-McMahon, County Clare. The Clare Heritage Center does not have a record of her birth, since the parish records did not start until the mid 1840's and her birth was apparently before the records started.

Her sister, Sally's birth was recorded.

Notes for EDWARD P O'CONNOR:

\*1900 CENSUS-West Omaha, Douglas Cty., NEB-states the same year of birth for both Edward & Bridget, but then state 10 yrs difference in ages??? I have other CENSUS for Bridget showing her @abt 3yrs old when her parents arrived in US from Ireland in 1849. Also stated facts, she said she was in the US 42 yrs, parents from Ireland. They were married 21 years with 4 children, with a farm, and mortgage.

John R. NEALON, Rail Veteran, Dies suddenly

One of the Best-Known Engineers on Divison, 57 years with North-Western-Road, succombs when complications follow operation.

The sudden death of John R. NEALON, agen 60, Winona pioneer and veteran railroad man, came as a great shock to his family and host of friends here and all along this division of the Chicage & North Western railway. His death occurred at 8:30pm Saturday from unexpected complications after he had undergone a slight operation at a Rochester hospital.

Mr. Nealon has spent his entire life in Winona. He was born here November 1, 1858, and has the unusual record of 57 years of service on the railroad.

When not yet 11 years old, in June 1869, he began working as a wiper and call boy at the local shops and continued working up until he became an engineer. His first trip in that capacity was made March 17, 1882. Since that time he has worked steadily with an enviable safety record, and has seen his division grow until it has more than seven times as many locomotives as when he began. Two years ago, Mr. Nealon was honorably retired with a pension by the company and has since lived with his family at 477 Harriet Street.

Surviving Mr. Nealon are his wife, formerly Elizabeth Donahue of Winona; two sons, John of Winona, and William of Minneapolis; one aughter, Mrs J. Harvey Thompson of Winona; one brother, Michael of San Antonio, Tex; two sister's, Mrs. Martha Barrett, of Minneapolis, and Mrs. Sadie Ellis, of Eugene, Ore.

Funeral services will be held at 9 am tuesday at St. Thomas cathedral. The Rev. Father Donald Cunningham will read the ceremony, and burial will be in St. Mary's cemetery. The pall bearers will be John Sherman, Philip Riley, Michael Murphy, Ralph Burdoin, Michael Ryan and James Hockenull.

Mike & Julia moved to Chadron, Neb in 1877, then to Fremont, Neb abt 1891. In 1894 he was involved in a wreck in Blair, Neb. In Nov, 1895 he moved to Smithville Tx., where Mike was a conductor with the Missouri-Kansas-Texas Railroad. When Julia died in San Antonio in 1904, Mike and daughter Julia moved ther in 1905. He remarried in 1906. He retired from the Railroad in 1939.

Mike's second marraige, was to Sue (Larremore) Wiggins, b-29 April, 1871, Lockhart, TX. Sue had two children from her marraige to Wiggins. With Mike they had a son, Clark. L. NEALON, b-abt 1910. He was sports editor of the Houston Post for many years. Mike died March 21, 1954, and Sue died Nov. 18, 1954 . This info was given by Alan Gilbertson, who said he got it from the Railroad Retirement Board. They keep excellent records and they are open to the public. (This is a VERY good source to remmember).

In the old photo album that Aunt Francis gave me (was our Ggrandmother's Sarah (NEALON) ELLIS's) there was a news clipping of a little girl, Julia Marie NEALON. She was three years old and had won a Baby Contest in Texas. This is what the new article printed:

I am baby Jewel, Papa's little pet;  
Won prime honors lately and would  
Now be gazed at in the Gazette.  
I'll be a real good baby,  
Des as good as I tan be;  
Will all who thinks I'm pretty,  
Please cast a vote for me?

Article: Julia M. NEALON won first prize in the recent spring carnival baby show. She is an orphan, her (FOSTER PARENT) being M.D. NEALON of 410 Avenue C. Julia is 3 years and 4 months old. In the picture she is seated in a baby car, rings decorated with lilies and with an emense butterfly over her head in place of the customary hanging parasol. The detail made a most beautiful effect, but is sacrificed t enable the presentation of an enlarged view of the sweet baby face. Sedate, with features angelic whin in repose and breaking into the most bewitching dimples when a ripple of infectious laughter rolls over the cherry lips and the merriment is reflected in the dancing eyes. Julia is truly a little princess whs exacts willing and loving tribute from all.

(In fact, according to research that Allen and I have done, Julia was not an orphan, but her mother Julia Marie had recently died, and she and her father Michael D. had just moved to San Antonio, TX., from Smithville, TX.) I will follow up on this with her family.
