Notes for JOHANNES PHILIP BOSSERT:

The reason or reasons why Philip Johannes immigrated to America is unknown, though some speculate it was because of religious persecution. Looking at the history of France preceding the birth of Philip Johannes and during the time he lived in France, the deciding factor may have been , religious persecution, massive taxation, civil unrest, any one or a combination on of factors.

Whatever the reason or reasons, Philip Johannes Bossert's name is found on the Passengers list of the Ship Samuel and Elizabeth:

PHILIP BOSSARD and family in Pennsylvania

..... It is probable that in 1749 John George Hartlieb, his second wife, t he widow of Christopher Keller (No. 1) and the two step children, Christop her Keller (No.2) and Margaretha Catharine arrived from Philadelphia, thro ugh the Wind Gap, probably stopping at Delabole to visit the family of Jos eph Keller, and then up through Cherry Valley to the Bossard plantation. D oubtless Philip Bossard, George McDowell, Conrad Bittenbinder and Peter So an assisted in the building of the first log hut for the Hartlieb famil y. Some measure of prosperity shone on the entire community and everythi ng was peaceful till the 11th of December, 1755, when a war party of ov er 200 Indians simultaneously attacked settlements in what is now Lehig h, Northampton and Monroe Counties in a determined effort to drive the whi te settlers south of the Blue Mountains and keep them there. The Minisi nk was harassed down to Shawnee, and all buildings north of Brodhead's pla ntation in East Stroudsburg, then known as Dansville, were burned and t he people killed, taken prisoners or made fugitives.

A few weeks later, about January 15th, 1756, the first attack was ma de on the Cherry Valley settlers. Philip Bossard had a Palatine named Mulh ausen working for him. While Mulhausen was breaking flax one day he was at tacked by a party of five Indians and shot through the body. One of Philip 's sons came to his rescue but was at once shot and killed. Philip now app eared and seriously wounded one of the foe but would have probably been ki lled himself had not his neighbors come to his assistance. Following th is the settlements on both sides of the Blue Mountains were kept in a cons tant state of anxiety. To protect the settlers and help them remain on the ir farms a

chain of forts was built along the Blue Ridge from the Susquehanna to the Delaware - of these forts only four were in the region we are especially interested in. These were Fort Norris near Kresgeville, Fort Hamilton at Stroubsburg, Fort Dupuy at Shawnee and Fort Hyndshaw at Bushkill. Bossard's plantation was nearly half-way between Fort Norris and Fort Hamilton and when General James Young made an inspection of the Provincial forts in 1756 he spent the night of June 23rd at Bossard's, leaving there at 4 A. M. so he could get to Fort Hamilton early in the day. This example was frequently followed by the officers and troops during the French and Indian War, as we find frequent mention of persons stopping to feed their horses or stay all night at the Bossard plantation. On or about the 20th of April, 1757, a second attack was made on Cherry Valley and the surrounding territory which was considered grave enough to warrant the sending of Michael Roup to Easton to make a deposition or affidavit. This is of such interest to us that it is worthy of repetition. (See notes for Philip Johannes Bossert, Jr. for Michael Roup's deposition)

... In September, 1762, a petition was presented to the court at Easton for a road from Shoemaker's hills to Dansbury (now East Stroubsburg) and from there to Mount Sul and the Wind Gap. This petition was signed by John McDowell, Philip Bossard, Lawrence Romig, John Hillman, Abram Miller and William Smith, and these petitioners were appointed as viewers. On September 1st, 1761, a tax of 3 pence per pound was levied to pay the expenses of Representatives, to erect public buildings and to destroy wolves, foxes and crows. Among those in Lower Smithfield whose names we are interested in, the following appear on this list: Philip Bossard, 8 pounds; George Hartlieb, 6 pounds, and Michael Roup, 5 pounds. They were living in Lower Smithfield at that time as the township of Hamilton was not organized till a year later in 1762. While Philip donated the land that the Hamilton Square church was built on in 1775 it was not till some years later that this was deeded to the church trustees by his son Melchior. This gift from the Bossard family to the community has been fully discussed in a previous chapter and need not be repeated at this time. The tax list of 1785 does not show Philip's name. It appears that his son Melchior was the virtual owner of the lands of his father as in that year Melchior paid 1 pound, 8 shillings, 3 pence on 300 acres of land, 3 horses and 5 cows. It was not, however, till July 27th, 1790, that Philip deeded to his son, Melchior Bossard, this land; the deed being recorded in Deed Book B2, page 102, at Easton, reading in part as follows: Deed: Philip Bossert To Melchior Bossert. July 27, 1790. Consideration the natural love and affection which he hath and doth.

It has been established through many sources that Philip Johannes Bossert founded Bossersville, Pennsylvania.

....everything was peaceful till the 11th of December, 1755, when a war party of over 200 Indians simultaneously attacked settlements in what is now Lehigh, Northampton and Monroe Counties in a determined effort to drive the white settlers south of the Blue Mountains and keep them there. The Minisink was harassed down to Shawnee, and all buildings north of Brodhead's plantation in East Stroudsburg, then known as Dansville, were burned and the people killed, taken prisoners or made fugitives.

A few weeks later, about January 15th, 1756, the first attack was made on the Cherry Valley settlers. Philip Bossard had a Palatine named Mulhausen working for him. While Mulhausen was breaking flax one day he was attacked by a party of five Indians and shot through the body. One of Philip's sons came to his rescue but was at once shot and killed. Philip now appeared and seriously wounded one of the foe but would have probably been killed himself had not his neighbors come to his assistance. The 24th day of April, one thousand, seven Hundred and Fifty seven, appeared before me, William Parsons, esquire, one of His Majesty's Justices of the Peace for the County of Northampton, Michael Roup, of Lower Smithfield, in the said County, aged 52 years, a person to me well known and worthy of credit, and being duly sworn on the Holy Evangelists of Almighty God, did depose and declare, that his neighbor, Philip Bozart, being at Fort Norris last Saturday week, heard a letter read there, which was dispatched by Major Parsons to acquaint the Garrison that he had received information that some Enemy Indians intended shortly to come and attack the inhabitants at and about Minisink and to desire them to be upon their Guard; which was soon made known to all the Neighboring Inhabitants. And this Deponent further saith, That on Friday Morning last John Lefever passing by the house of Philip Bozart and this Deponent, informed them that the Indians had murdered Casper Gundryman last Wednesday Evening; whereupon this deponent went immediately to the House of Philip Bozart to consult which was best to be done. Their House being about half a mile apart that they concluded it best for the Neighbors to collect themselves together, as many as they could in some one House. And this Deponent further saith, that he immediately returned home and loaded his Wagon as fast as he could with his most valuable Effects which he carried to Bozart's House. That as soon as he had unloaded his Wagon he drove to his Son-in-law Peter Soan's House about two miles, and loaded as much of his Effects as the Time and hurry would admit, and took them also to Bozart's where 9 families were retired; That a great number of the inhabitants were also retired to the Houses of Conrad Bittenbender and John McDowel; That Bozart's House is 7 miles from Fort Hamilton and 12 from Fort Norris. And this Deponent further saith, that yesterday Morning about 9 o'clock the said Peter Soan and Christian Klein with his daughter about 13 years of age went from Bozart's House to the house of the said Klein and thence to Soan's House to look after their cattle and to bring off more effects. And this Deponent further saith, that about a half an hour after the above 3 persons were gone from Bozart's House, a certain George Hartlieb, who also fled with his family to Bozart's and who had been at his own house about a mile from Soan's to look after his Creatures and to bring away what he could, returned to Bozart's and reported that he had heard 3 guns fired very quick one after the other and towards Soan's Place which made them all conclude the above 3 persons were killed by the Indians. And this Deponent further saith, that their little Company were afraid to venture to go and see what had happened that day, as they had many Women and Children to take Care of, who if they had left might have fallen an easy Prey to the Enemy. And this Deponent further saith, That this Morning 9 men of the Neighbor-hood armed themselves, as well as they could, and went towards Peter Soan's place, in order to discover what was become of the above three person

s. That when they came within about 300 yards of the House, they found the bodies of the said Soan and Klein lying about 20 feet from each other, killed and scalped, but did not find Klein's daughter. Soan was killed by a bullet which entered the upper part of his back and came out at his breast. Klein was killed with their tomahawks. The 9 men immediately returned to Bozart's and reported as above. That this Deponent was not one of the 9, but that he remained at Bozart's with the women and Children. That the rest of the people desired this Deponent to come to Easton and acquaint the Justice with what had happened. That the 9 men did not think it safe to stay to bury the Dead. And further this Deponent saith no

Following close after this came an ambuscade in which Conrad Bitten-bender, John Nolf, Peter Roth, and two sons of Philip Bossard were killed. It was after this that many families fled to Easton and from there on July 25th, 1757, a petition was sent to Governor Denny which is of especial interest because it is signed by two of the members of our family. The Petition of sundry Persons, formerly inhabitants beyond the Mountains, humbly Sheweth: That we, your Petitioners, having made Settlements beyond the Mountains, have been obliged to leave them; that we last fall sowed some grain which is now fully ripe and should be cut down, but for fear of being way laid and murdered by our enemies we dare not go to reap it, and without it we and our families must be exposed to want and become a burden to our Country. We therefore humbly pray that the Governor will be pleased to order us a guard of Soldiers to protect us, till we can reap and remove our grain to this Side the Mountain, and your Petitioners as in duty bound shall ever pray.

Notes for JOHANN HEINRICH BOSSERT:
There has been no definitive proof that Heinrich Bossert is the child of Phillip Johannes Bossert and Eva Cathrina or where he was born, but many researchers believe that Heinrich was born en route to America on the Ship Samuel and Elizabeth.

The following information was supplied by Norman Miller letter dated June 17, 1993. "When Henry moved to Westmoreland his married son, Jacob also settled there. Based on 1790 census and later information the following children were with Henry - George, Melcher, Henry, Frederick, Christina, & Sarah in move to Westmoreland. The others might of died young (no doubt, Catharine) or remained in Northampton. there is no record of Valentin there after the church record of birth- nor any death records appears in early Hamilton Union records."

Heinrich Bossert (Busert) m Anna Catharina ? (mother possibly Susanna). At some point, the spelling changed from Bossert to Buzard to Buzzard. By the time George W. Buzzard's will was written, it was recorded as "Buzard."

Henry Bossert was shown as living in Hamilton Twp during the Rev War and changed his spelling to Henry Buzard with one "Z" in 1788. In 1790 his deed of 5,568 acres in Westmoreland County had him listed as Henry Buzard. There were no other Buzzards, Bozard, Bossert, Busert, or Bossert in southern Clarion County for several years to come. He died at the age of 51, most likely the Buzard that was killed by a falling tree, while clearing the land of 5,568 acres. (This was in Mt Pleasant Twp, not the town of Mt. Pleasant. In 1789, Mt Pleasant Twp became Unity Twp, located in Westmoreland County, PA

At one time he served under his brother-in-law, Captain Christopher Keller. In these records his name is spelled as Buzard, Busard, Basard, Buzzard, Bossart. He and his brother-in-law were very close friends and each married the sister of the other. From Keith, a Buzzard researcher: "a while back, I found militia rolls from Aug. 1784 listing Melchior born 1745 and Henry born 1740 on assignment to the Wyoming Valley. There is no definite record of any combat service performed by Melchior Bossard in the Revolution. However, as his name appears in five muster rolls, there is no doubt that he was called out at various times to serve as a 30, 60 or 90 day man. The record is interesting, not only as a proof of service but also as showing the many ways the name was spelled by illiterate clerks.

The record is as follows: 1778- May 14~6th Bn.-8th Co.-7th Class-Melchior Buzard. 1780- 5th Bn.-8th Co.-7th Class-Melcher Busard. 1781- 5th Bn.-8th Co.-7th Class-Walker Basard. 1782- 5th Bn.-8th Co.-7th Class-Melker Buzard. 1784- Captain Keller's Co.-Col. Kerns' Battalion-Melchior Bossart.

In the Heads of Families, Census 1790, the name of Melchior Buzart appears with twelve persons in the household, four males over 16, four males under 16, and four females. In 1795 Christopher Keller (No.2) decided to make his will. Wishing to select a proper guardian for his minor children he could think of no one more suitable than his brother-in-law. As young boys they had faced the Indian peril of 1756-57. They had frequently been fellow communicants; each had married the sister of the other. During the Revolution they had served in the same company. The years of association had deepened the affection they held for each other. It was with these thoughts in mind that Christopher wrote at the end of his will: "And I do hereby nominate, ordain and appoint Melchior Bossert, guardian of my minor children." There is no doubt but that as guardian Melchior did

his best to look after the financial interests of these children. Further data concerning the family has not properly a place in this history and no effort has been made to trace the succeeding generations. Many of Melchior's children moved to New York State but the family still remains in Monroe County. Although the name is spelled in different ways at present there seems to be no doubt that all are descended from Philip Bossard. As we have stated his daughter, Christina, married Christopher Keller (No.2) and thus some Alsatian blood came into the Keller family. The son Melchior is buried in the Hamilton Church graveyard, his stone stating that he died on the 9th of February, 1830, at the age of 85. While we know but relatively little concerning Philip we have enough to know that he was an energetic, fearless, religious pioneer and as such no doubt left a definite heritage not only to his descendants in the Bossard but also in the Keller family. Philip Jacob Buzzard, as was a frequent German custom, he was known by his second name, Jacob. Sometime before 1788 Jacob married Margaret (surname unknown). They lived in Northampton County in 1788 but were in Unity Township, Westmoreland County, Pennsylvania by 1790, likely moving west at the same time as his parents.

By 1800 Jacob and Margaret had continued their movement west, going to Crawford County, Pennsylvania. In 1809 he bought land with a Philip Strow (Straw) on French Creek in Crawford County. Jacob bought the land in Crawford County from William Griffith and John B. Wallace. The land had been purchased by Griffith and Wallace from the Holland Land Company.

NOTE:

The Holland Land Company in 1792 was a group of Dutch bankers who joined in the rush for lands in the western part of the U. S. They paid cash for the 5 million acres or more they purchased in central and western New York and northern Pennsylvania. Their main office was in Philadelphia.

In 1813 Jacob again moved west, this time to Wayne County, Ohio.

On 8 September 1824 he purchased 80 acres from the U. S. government at the Wooster land office.

Census records indicate that Jacob and Margaret had at least two daughters, as well as seven sons. The birth dates of the daughters are not known. One daughter must have been Mary, wife of Henry Borts as this couple signed a deed in 1826 as heirs of Jacob Buzzard.

Mary may have been born about 1804 and another daughter, Margaret, was born ca. 1810.

A county history biography of one of Jacob's grandson, Bigelow (son of Daniel) said that Daniel could speak little English until after he was 12 years old about the time the family moved to western Pennsylvania. Perhaps as the family moved west, they were less influenced by the German settlements of eastern Pennsylvania and more Americanized. Jacob's estate sale was held on 2 July 1823. On 23 March 1826 three of Jacob's children along with his widow signed a deed selling their interest in a piece of property. For some unknown reason the deed was not recorded with the county until 1891. The three children who signed the deed were: Jonathan and his wife Sarah; George and his wife Eleanor; and Henry Borts and his wife Mary, along with the widow Margaret. Margaret's death date is not known though she was still alive in 1827.

Jonathan B. Buzzard was born on July 31, 1788 in Hamilton Township, Northampton County, Pennsylvania. He was the first of eight children born to Philip Jacob and Margaretha Catherina Bossert. As of this writing, I have not been able to determine the maiden name of Philip Jacob's wife.

According to church records and other family researchers, Jonathan's siblings were Daniel, born in 1790, in Hamilton Twp, Northampton County, Pennsylvania, Johann Philip, born 23 Aug 1792, in Unity Twp, Westmoreland County, Pennsylvania, Heinrich or Henry, born 12 Jan 1795, at Mt. Pleasant, Unity Twp, Westmoreland County, Pennsylvania, Johannes or John, born 7 Apr 1797, at Mt. Pleasant, Unity Twp, Westmoreland County, Pennsylvania, George, born 24 Apr 1799, in Washington Twp, previously known as Germantown, Westmoreland County, Pennsylvania. According to US census reports, sometime after 1800 but before 1810, Jacob and his family migrated to Crawford County, Pennsylvania. Two girls were born following

this migration, first Mary in 1804, followed in 1809 by the birth of Margaret. Around 1813, it is believed the family migrated to what was then known as Wayne County, Ohio, now this part of Wayne County is Holmes County. US census reports confirm this family resided in these locations during these periods of time.

Elizabeth is in Edward Sherer's household, along with their children, John is found in Lost Creek Twp census in his own household with Jane and their children and Margaret is in McDonald County census in Abram Testerman's household, with their own children. I have not located George in the 1840 census.

Assuming that all of these census reports are accurate, Capt Jonathan was married to someone unknown, probably married sometime in 1808, the year before Elizabeth was born and therefore was the mother of Elizabeth, George, John, Margaret, and Peter. Very shortly after the birth of Peter and before the 1820 census was enumerated, the mother/wife died and Capt Jonathan married Sarah (sometime between when the 1820 census was enumerated and 1824) the year before Simon was born. Sarah died sometime after the 1840 census was enumerated, and Capt Jonathan married Nancy Adams sometime between the death of Henry Adams (her husband prior to Capt Jonathan) in 1848 and before the 1850 census was enumerated.

From the 1850 Lost Creek Twp, Newton County, Missouri Census, some information about Nancy can be mined. Jonathan was married to Nancy prior to the enumeration of the 1850 census, she was 58 years old at that time, she

was born in Virginia, and the 3 children living in the home had the last name Adams. Judy Barr then located the will of Henry Adams, from that we learned that Henry died in 1848, that Nancy was his wife, and the three Adams children living in the Jonathan Buzzard home in 1850 were listed as heirs in Henry Adams' will. Taking all of this information into account, I can say with certainty that Nancy and Jonathan were married no earlier than 1848 and no later than 1850 and therefore, she was not the mother to any of Jonathan Buzzard's children.

According to the Ohio state records, signatures on the quit claim deed for Philip Jacob's property after it had been sold following his death, Capt. Jonathan's wife in 1826 was Sarah, maiden name unknown.

It has been speculated that Jonathan Buzzard, at some point in his life, married a Margaret or Margery Spurgeon. Since I have not found any actual proof of this marriage, I can only speculate that if this is true, this marriage occurred first, most likely in Crawford County, Pennsylvania, and before 1808. Since the 1810 Crawford County, Pennsylvania census lists a female the same age range as Jonathan and the 1820 Wayne County, Ohio census lacks a female within the same age range as Jonathan, my best guess would be that she could have died when Peter was born or shortly after, possibly due to complications or an infection and before the 1820 census was enumerated.

Naomi Sparlin Poor always believed that Margery Spurgeon (that she believed married Jonathan Buzzard) was a sister to Elizabeth Spurgeon Sparlin, but I find that unlikely since Capt Jonathan's son, John B. Buzzard married Jane Spurgeon in 1838. If Naomi Sparlin Poor was correct, then John B. Buzzard married his maternal aunt because Jane Spurgeon and Elizabeth Spurgeon Sparlin are believed by many Spurgeon and Sparlin researchers to be sisters, while still others believe Elizabeth was Jane's aunt, which would have made John and Jane first cousins. Regardless, I have never found a Margery or Margaret Spurgeon born in the right area and the right year that could have been married to Capt Jonathan because they were married to other men and the researchers had documentation of those marriages. Naomi Sparlin Poor has since passed away so I can not ask her on what she based this theory.

Another theory concerning the wives of Capt Jonathan is that he married the sister of Falling Buzzard's wife. I have started researching this and did find a few family trees that contained Falling Buzzard and the name of his wife, Nate-Se. I didn't find the name of a possible sister and unless Capt Jonathan married a woman young enough to be his daughter, I find this unlikely since census reports list the age range of all the people in the household and this theory does not follow the information found in any of the census reports containing Capt Jonathan and his household. A sister to Falling Buzzard's mother would be about the right age. The Falling Buzzard I found in family trees online was of actual Indian descent and his Father's name was Little Buzzard. This family did live in Jay, Oklahoma, but I can not be certain if this is the same Falling Buzzard that Buel talked about on his tapes, On the Buzzard Trail. One question did cross my mind about the name of the Falling Buzzard chronicled in Buel's tapes; since he was originally from Scotland, could his birth name have been Fallon Buzzard and altered once here?

The first actual documentation that I have found of Jonathan being married to anyone doesn't present itself until 23 Mar 1826, when Sarah, along with Jonathan, George and Eleanor, Mary and Henry Borts, and Jacob's widow, Margaret, signed the deed to the land sold from Jacob's estate. Because of this date, I am fairly confident that Sarah was the mother of Simon and definitely the mother of Jonathan Junior. As far as the older children are concerned, I can't yet prove who their mother was and according to the 1820 census, the lack of a female in the same age range as Capt Jonathan appears to eliminate Sarah as their Mother, though this could have just been an error made by the census taker, caused either from someone other than a family member answering the questions or the mark representing the oldest female in the household placed in the wrong column.

Tidbits

In 1971, Wilford Fowler completed his Buzzard Family genealogy which included bits and pieces he was able to find and contributions made by other family researchers of this line of Buzzards. In his work he noted that Mrs. F.A. Teague of Berryville, Arkansas had in her possession a photostatic copy of a pay record from Washington, D.C. A Private Jonathan Buzzard was attached to the 137 th Regt. (Terrils) of the Pennsylvania Militia during the War of 1812. This fact has also been well documented by other family researchers, so I feel confident that this is a true fact and should be included in my own body of work.

Though I have not found proof, it is widely believed by family and others that Jonathan Buzzard served during the Black Hawk War for some period of time during 1832 and it was during this conflict that he was promoted to

the rank of Captain. From recorded history of this conflict, I learned that the way a man was promoted to Captain was by a vote by the men in his outfit. In fact, Abraham Lincoln was promoted to Captain of his outfit during the Black Hawk War in just this manner.

The Journey

We don't know for sure just how many people made this journey, but we can make a guess if we look through census data and family history files to determine who was alive and what their approximate ages were in 1833

Family 1. Capt. Jonathan Buzzard, 45; Sarah, 45; George, 22; John, 18; Margaret, 15; Peter, 13; Simon, 8; Jonathan Junior, 5.

Family 2. Edward Sherer, 22; Elizabeth, 22; Ariel, 2; William (Edward's brother) 18;

Family 3. John Spurgeon, 59; Rebecca, 59; John D, 28; John's first wife, name unknown, 20; Mary, about a year old; Jarvis, between 23 and 26; Amos, 21; Rebecca, 16; Jane, 13;

Family 4. Andrew Sparlin, 28; Elizabeth, 27; Curtis, 7; Jackson, 5; Delilah, 3; Hiram, a few months old; The Sparlin's male slave, about 14 years old.

John Spurgeon and Captain Jonathan and their families were close friends, they were neighbors through many years while these families lived in Ohio. We know that Edward and William's father, John Sherer and Captain Jonathan were very close. It was a friendship that went all the way back to the period of time when both the Sherer and the Buzzard families lived in Pennsylvania and migrated to Holmes County, Ohio together.

In the winter of 1833, this group, likely headed by Captain Jonathan Buzzard, began building flatboats near their farms in Washington and Knox Townships. It is believed that Capt. Jonathan, the oldest son of Jacob and Margaret Buzzard who had migrated to Washington Township from Mercer County, Pennsylvania about 1814, had just returned from serving in the Black Hawk War of 1832 in Illinois.

Elizabeth Buzzard, oldest daughter of Capt. Buzzard had married Edward Sherer, son of John Sherer, March 28, 1830. By 1833, Edward and Elizabeth had one daughter, Ariel, born in 1831 and if not already, would soon be expecting another child.

Andrew Sparlin of Knox Township was the son of John and Nancy Parsons Sparlin. He was married to Elizabeth Spurgeon, the daughter of John and Rebecca Spurgeon. John Spurgeon and family, along with his son in law, Andrew Sparlin and his family linked up with Capt. Buzzard and his son-in-law, Edward Sherer, and their families, thus began a wondrous journey.

These families weren't just close friends, their ties were much closer than that. As already stated, Edward Sherer had married Capt Jonathan's oldest daughter, Elizabeth, and Andrew Sparlin had married John Spurgeon's daughter, also named Elizabeth. Edward's brother, William, would marry John Spurgeon's daughter Rebecca on March 26, 1836 in Barry County, Missouri, and Captain Jonathan's son, John, would marry Jane Spurgeon, believed to be another daughter of John Spurgeon, on July 19, 1838, also in Barry County, Missouri.

After selling their land and livestock these four families bought dry provisions and loaded their tools and small household goods into the flatboats, they started their trek in the Mohegan River below Loudinville.

They had chosen the spring season because the current would be faster and the likelihood of being grounded was far less. It should be remembered that all of the waterways were kept free of fallen trees and brush at that time because they were the "Expressways of the frontier." Capt. Buzzard led his crew down the Mohegan into the Walhonding and then the Muskingum Rivers. They stopped only occasionally to buy new provisions. Fortunately, no large rainstorms brought the rivers over thie banks and the trip went quite well.

Upon reaching Marietta, they entered the Ohio River and journeyed southward until they reached the Mississippi. Down the Mississippi they ventured until they reached the Arkansas River. A small steamer towed them up the Arkansas River until they reached Van Buren County. Then they disembarked. The Sherers remained in Van Buren for a year or so, but the rest of the company pushed into Missouri. Edward and Elizabeth had lost a child during their journey and Elizabeth was expecting another child which they named William, most likely a

namesake of Edward's brother.

It is unknown whether John Spurgeon died in route to Missouri or shortly after his arrival, all that is known is that Rebecca Spurgeon was listed as the head of the household in the 1840 Shoal Creek Twp, Newton County, Missouri census. Some believe that it was Captain Jonathan's wife that had died either shortly before the journey or shortly after their arrival, but she is found still living in Captain Jonathan's household in the 1840 census.

After John's death, their son Jarvis stayed with his mother, working the farm. Jarvis cared for Rebecca until he himself died in 1846. After his death and according to the provisions of Jarvis Spurgeon's will, Amos inherited all of his land and took over the care of his mother until her death.

Evidence that William Sherer came with his brother to Missouri has not been established or explicitly disputed in any of the accounts written of this group's journey from Ohio to Missouri, but I believe that this was probable. Another possibility is that he met the group in Van Buren County, Arkansas before the rest of the group migrated to Southwest Missouri. Either scenario would fit with what is known and help explain so many of the actions of this group. If William accompanied or joined the group and stayed behind in Van Buren County with Edward and Elizabeth, it would explain the reason the rest of the group felt they could continue on to Missouri while Edward and a very pregnant Elizabeth stayed behind in Van Buren County, Arkansas while they were awaiting the birth of their son, William. Van Buren County, while it showed signs of civilization, was still an all but lawless territory. I can't imagine this group of friends and relatives leaving Elizabeth with only Edward in such a vulnerable position. William would have been the logical choice for such a task since he had no obligations to anyone else in the group at that time and held the deep felt bonds as a sibling to Edward.

Edward and William must have been close, he is the only sibling of Edward Sherer's that I have been able to identify that migrated to Newton County, Missouri and he resided very close to where Edward and Elizabeth lived. I believe that Edward named his first born son William, after his brother. William wasn't a name found with any frequency in the Buzzard lines until this point in time, but now it is used quite a bit. Edward's father was named John, so by naming this son William, it lends credence to the theory that little William was the namesake of his uncle.

A year later, after the birth of little William, Edward, his brother William, and his wife, Elizabeth Sherer moved to Newton County. Edward and Elizabeth reared 11 children, four of which died in childhood. Edward was a farmer and later his land was to become the site of Seneca. Edward died in December 1854. He had gone into town and his horse returned him to his home, dead, apparently a victim of a robbery. Captain Jonathan buried his son in law in the Gallemore Cemetery located on the Fred Gallemore farm. His wife, Elizabeth outlived him by about 40 years- dying in 1898. She was buried in the Seneca Cemetery.

As stated before, William Sherer would marry Rebecca Spurgeon and they would have five children; Telithia, born in 1841, William, born in 1843, John, born in 1845, Mary, born in 1848, and Sarah, born in 1850.

Andrew Sparlin set up a trading post in Wela Park and also operated a tannery. When Elizabeth died, he remarried. Andrew and Elizabeth had nine children then he married Mary Myers who bore him eleven children, so that he was the father of twenty.

He and Elizabeth were buried in the Sparlin Cemetery, which was set aside as a cemetery by Andrew Sparlin before he died.

Captain Buzzard was a respected and honorable citizen of Newton County, Mo. He was appointed as an election judge along with Hiram Estes and both men served with pride and dignity from May, 1839 to February, 1843. As might be expected of a man of such lineage. He was a powerful man of great proportion. He loved the sport of boxing and took on all comers, some traveling several hundred miles to face him. Jonathan whipped them all and might have been a world champion had he lived in today's world. He settled with his family to the east of Wela Park.

It is said that Capt Jonathan was a very strong and tall man with large hands. He was a pugilist who would take on all challengers. One story of this was told by Buel Buzzard. A man came from somewhere around Springfield, Missouri to challenge Capt Jonathan to a fight, declaring that his goal was to die the pugilist champion. Capt Jonathan agreed to the fight and offered him a meal. His sons went around to neighbors to tell of the upcoming fight. As time for the fight grew near, neighbors from all around the area came to watch, some spectators most

likely placing wagers on the outcome. When the time came to start the fight, excitement grew. The fight consisted of only a couple of blows, Captain Jonathan hit the man, knocking him to the ground, picked him up, and hit him again. The man giving up, got on his horse, went home, and died. It is said he died from internal injuries sustained from the fight.

His life in Missouri

Capt Jonathan and family arrived in the Wela Park area around 1833 or 1834 where they made their camp. It is said that this family of Buzzards remained at this campsite until Capt Jonathan decided on the 40 acres he purchased. To date I have not located the deed to land purchased in Jonathan Buzzard's name.

It is said that the original cabin that Capt Jonathan built had two rooms with a breezeway between and was the first plastered cabin in this part of the country. It was burnt to the ground during the Civil War and a new cabin was built to replace it after the war had ended. In later years this cabin was moved upon the hill east of the present house and remained there for over a hundred years. There is a family story that was told by Buel Buzzard that mirrors this except it was George's home that was burnt to the ground by Bushwhackers in the first of two attacks. The first time they burnt the house to the ground and the second attack they burnt the smoke house to the ground, leaving the women and children with no alternative but to go to Neosho, leaving the property until it was safe to return after the Civil War had ended.

His Death

The exact date that Capt Jonathan died is not known. Many have speculated he died before the Civil War, I have found nothing to date that proves or disproves this and no one has been able to provide any actual details concerning Capt Jonathan's death. We do know that when Edward Sherer was killed, Capt Jonathan buried him, so he was still alive in 1854. Capt Jonathan was not found listed in the 1860 Lost Creek Twp Census, but Nancy is found in the 1860 census living in the household of Elizabeth Huffman, the daughter of Henry Adams. From the index of the 1860 census found at Rootsweb.com, Nancy's last name is spelled Bazzano, from the rest of the information concerning Nancy, this was a misspelling of the name. The will of Nancy Buzzard was probated the end of February, 1867, Henry Adams' son, possibly her son as well, James Adams was the executor. It is believed that her death followed that of Jonathan Buzzard.

There are several accounts detailing the burial and location of Capt Jonathan's grave, though none have been verified and no actual documentation has been found. According to Wiford Fowler's family history, Capt. Jonathan Buzzard was buried along old U.S. 60 highway between Neosho and Seneca. Others believe this location to be part of what was once a farm owned by Fred Gallemore, now owned by the Grandson of Dean Cox, the man that bought the Gallemore farm from Fred Gallemore when he became ill and had to sell the farm, after which Mr. Gallemore and his wife moved to California.

Suzanne Kelly went to the genealogy room at the Newton County Library in 2001 and made copies of the 1882 and 1902 Newton Co Plat Maps showing Dayton, Seneca and Buffalo Townships and said the 1882 map shows the Fred Gallemore farm. She made copies of other pages in the 1882 book about Capt Jonathan, that he was a Farmer, Stock Raiser and Dealer, that he came from Ohio in 1833, that he came here with several children. She also spoke with the man who built the home in 1963 or 1964 and was responsible for digging up the "pointed stone" grave marker because he kept hitting it with the mower. He said the stone was limestone, she then went looking for the picture he claimed that he took of the stone, but to date it has not been found. He said that he had attached it to the abstract. He told her that he believed that the stone was actually the corner marker of the lot, that he had it surveyed and found this to be the reason the stone was there. He also said that there were people with metal detectors and shovels digging in the yard. When the road was fixed in front of his house, the road grader uncovered latches and handles and work was stopped for several days. The county then took all that they had dug up and buried it across the road from where they discovered the original grave and repaired the road. No marker for the new grave site was placed and it's exact location is forever lost.

The Gallemore Cemetery

It is a shame that this cemetery was never preserved, I have discovered that it predates every cemetery platted in Newton County. Most likely, this was the cemetery used by every family in this area until other cemeteries were available. I believe William Sherer, the eldest son of Edward and Elizabeth Sherer that died in 1840; Sarah Buzzard, wife of Capt Jonathan, that died between 1840 and 1848; Jane Spurgeon Buzzard, first wife of John B.

Buzzard and died between 1845 and 1846; Joseph Roberts, first husband to Susannah Davis Roberts Buzzard, and died before 1846; Henry Adams, first husband to Nancy Adams Buzzard, Capt Jonathan's last known wife, and died in 1848; Nancy Adams Buzzard, who died some time after 1850; Margaret Sherer, daughter of Edward and Elizabeth, and died in 1853; Edward Sherer, husband of Elizabeth Buzzard Sherer, buried by Capt Jonathan, and died in 1854; Elizabeth Sherer, daughter of Edward and Elizabeth, and died in 1859; Susannah Davis Roberts Buzzard, second wife of John B. Buzzard, and died either in 1854 or 1859, and Capt Jonathan Buzzard, who died after 1854, along with many unknown others, were buried in the Gallemore Cemetery. I just can't prove it. All that can be proven is that none of these graves can be found in other area cemeteries. If my speculations concerning this are correct, these and other graves lie under Highway 60 and this happened when the highway was "fixed" in the 1960s.

Records contributed by Clyde "Tommy" - His comments:

It appears that you were right about Abner marrying Nancy Fountain and Db 12, page 58 indicates she was the daughter of John Fountain. We already knew that Nancy married Henry Adams. Apparently Abner and Nancy were the parents of Zilpha or at least she was a minor when Henry Adams sold to her for a nominal price, just enough to make the sale legal, her own portion of Abner's real estate. Actually, all he was doing was signing a quit claim deed since the land was already hers. Note that she was called "orphan of Abner Bracewell" indicating that she was probably a minor when the deed was made on 25 Feb 1813. She was almost certainly the Zilpha who married James Ellinor, Jr. about 18 Dec 1823. Note that Jo Bell was the bondsman for the marriage and also a witness when Henry conveyed title to her land to her. Note also that Henry and Nancy sold her dower in Abner's land to James Ellinor.

After Abner Bracewell died, Nancy then married Henry Adams, and possibly followed by Jonathan Buzzard.

In 1853 he went to Richland County, where he purchased one

hundred and thirty-five acres, and thereon spent the remainder of his life. He never received a pension nor land-warrant, because there had not been proper records of his army service kept, but he bought a couple of land-warrants of a nephew, and located three hundred and twenty acres in Linn County, Iowa. He was twice married, his first wife being a Miss Nancy Drake, by whom he had fifteen children, all but five of whom lived to manhood and womanhood. A strong anti-slavery man, he rejoiced at the downfall of the system, and after the organization of the Republican party became one of its supporters. His death occurred August 16, 1865.

Searching for information on Nancy drakes parents, parents...also any and all information on "[Daniel Buzzard] was twice married, his first wife being a Miss Nancy Drake, by whom he had fifteen children, all but five of whom lived to manhood and womanhood." P. 266, Portrait and Biographical Record of Johnson and Pettis Counties, Missouri (Containing Portraits and Biographical Sketches of Prominent and Representative Citizens of the Counties Together with Biographies and Portraits of all the Presidents of the United States) Chicago: Chapman Publishing Co. 1895.

The marriage of Daniel Buzzard and Nancy Drake is easily documented. Nancy Drake and Daniel Buzzard were married in Wayne County, Ohio, on February 23, 1815, by J. Cord, Deacon, M.E. Church (Volume 1, Page 7, Wayne County, Ohio Marriages). (On the same index page, the marriage of David Drake (brother of our Nancy) to Rachel Sill, on June 13, 1815 by Jesse Morgan, J. P. is noted.)

As will be seen in the ensuing discussion, Daniel Buzzard lived for some time in the Washington Township of Wayne, then Holmes, County, Ohio. This was an area inhabited by a host of the Drake family, including the Revolutionary veteran brothers, Thomas and David, their sister-wives, Sarah and Margaret Hinkle, and their descendants.

Several questions arise about our Nancy Drake, which we attempt to answer here.

1. Who were the parents of our Nancy Drake?
2. What do we know of the siblings and parents of Nancy Drake?
3. What was her life like before she married Daniel Buzzard?
4. What do we know of her life after she married Daniel Buzzard?
5. What do we know of her death and burial?

1. Who were the parents of our Nancy Drake?

When we study the Drake family, we learn that the brothers Thomas and David both had several children, and each of them had a daughter named Nancy. So, in our area we find two ladies named Nancy Drake: one of them married Daniel Buzzard and was the mother of Daniel Buzzard's children; the other married a Thomas O'Dell and also lived for a long time in the general area. Both of their births can be documented. To complicate things further, they were double first cousins, with their fathers being brothers and their mothers being sisters.

We believe that we know the answer to the parentage of our Nancy Drake, but we cannot point to definitive proof, only circumstantial evidence. Perhaps, on a more thorough examination of the deed records and estate and guardian records of Holmes Count, we can find a conclusive document.

Our Nancy Drake, we have concluded with some considerable degree of confidence, was born about 1794 in Baltimore, Maryland (LDS Film No. 442775, Page 0094, Ref# 06147; also LDS Film No. 458460). Her parents, Thomas Drake and Sarah Hinkle Drake were married in about 1785 in Frederick County, Maryland. (LDS 180114-052899105234) or perhaps in Allegany County, Maryland (LDS Film #458460). Our Nancy and the Nancy Drake who married Thomas Odell apparently migrated with their respective parents from Allegany County, Maryland to Wayne/Holmes County, Ohio, and took their respective spouses at about the same time.

The other Nancy Drake, Nancy Drake Odell, was born, we have concluded, on 15 July 1795 in Allegany County, Maryland. (LDS Film No. 442775, Page 12, Ref#06074). Her parents were David Drake and Margaret Hinkle Drake, who had been married in Allegany County, Maryland around 1792. (Note: Allegany County, Maryland is often misspelled as Allegheny.) (LDS Film # 458460). This Nancy married Thomas Odell on December 24, 1815 in Holmes County, Ohio. (Wayne County Marriage Records).

The migration from Maryland to Ohio was apparently done en mass and included additional families besides the Drake family, including, at least, the Hendrickson family, the Chapman family, the Risor family, the Sigafos family, the Scholes family, the Buzzard family, the Parsons family, . Many members of the Drake family and other related families are buried in Drake's Cemetery, Holmes County, Ohio. Some members of and the Hendrickson family and the Odell family later migrated on to Iowa. A relationship between the Hendrickson family and the Drake family is reported by virtue of Charlotte Hinkle and William Hendrickson having a son, William Hendrickson, who married a Mary Ann Drake (b. 1782 in Maryland), daughter of a David Drake. Both William Hendrickson and Mary Ann Drake are buried in Holmes County, Ohio, presumably in Drake's Cemetery. In fact, the 1940 readings of Drake's Valley Cemetery, show a William Hendrickson, Died August 31, 1854, Aged 70y ? 19d; and a Mary Ann, wife of William Hendrickson, Died Jan 8, 1863, Aged (obliterated). (To complete the whole intermingling thing, a third Drake brother, William Drake, is reported to have married a third Hinkle, perhaps a third Hinkle sister, Elizabeth Hinkle. This William Drake apparently died in Maryland and was not a part of the migration to Ohio.

As a further note to guide future investigation, the above suggests that David Drake had a daughter named Mary Ann Drake who was born in 1782 in Maryland. This report fits well with the brothers David and Thomas being revolutionary war veterans, and begins to fill what is largely a ten year gap between the end of the revolutionary war, and the beginning of child bearing by the brothers. It implies strongly that the listing below of the siblings of the two Nancy Drakes may be incomplete.

So, how were we able to pin down which of the Nancy Drakes was married to Daniel Buzzard? We do this by circumstantial evidence of living patterns, and then we close the case by process of elimination whereby Nancy Drake Odell is shown to have been the daughter of David and Margaret Drake, leaving our Nancy as the daughter of Thomas and Sarah Drake.

First the living patterns. The original Washington Township Land Entries reveal much about the family patterns. Early Land Records of Wayne County, Ohio, Compiled and Arranged by Richard G. Smith 1988, Published by The Wayne County Genealogical Society.

Section 4 of the Washington Township was entered as follows:

Nw160: Dan Buzzard 1817 May 3

Sw160 Thos Drake 1812 Feb 27

Section 9 of the Washington Township was entered as follows:

Sw160 Thos Odell 1817 Sep 27

Se160 David Drake Jr 1814 Mar 11

Ne160 Griffith Johnston 1817 Sep

Section 8 of the Washington Township was entered as follows:

N80Se David Drake 1833/1835

Ne160 David Drake 1812 Feb 27

When this picture is pieced together visually on a map you can easily see that Dan Buzzard and Thomas Drake entered adjoining properties; and Thomas O'Dell, David Drake, Jr. and David Drake entered adjoining properties. Thus, by proximity of Daniel and his wife Nancy to Thomas Drake, one can guess that Thomas and Sarah were our Nancy's parents. And this is bolstered by the proximity of Thos. Odell and his Nancy to David Drake and

David Drake, Jr., further suggesting that Nancy Drake Odell was the daughter of David and Margaret Drake.

An examination of certain deed records, however, strongly supports this view of the parentage of Nancy Drake Odell. The deeds in question are recorded in Deed Book 2, page 47 of the Holmes County records. We have not completed a thorough review of the Holmes County deed records and what we have are poor copies of microfilms of some deeds. We hope to review these in more detail on our next excursion to Holmes County.

The first of the deeds is a quitclaim deed dated March 25th, 1826, and it recites, in part that the deed is from

"Griffith Johnston and Harriet his wife, Thomas Odell and Nancy wife, Nathan Drake and Miranda his wife, and George Drake and Rachel his wife, of the county of Holmes and State of Ohio, of the first part, and David Drake, Thomas Drake and Sarah Drake, children of David Drake, deceased, of the county aforesaid, of the second part..."

A related quitclaim deed of unknown date is recorded at the same time. Its heading says that it is a deed from "Sarah Drake to David Drake, Jr. and Thomas Drake" and part of the recitation of this deed states:

"Sarah Drake, child of David Drake,...[in consideration of monies paid to] Griffith Johnston, guardian of ? Drake and Sarah Drake, children of the said David Drake... and David Drake, Jr. and Thomas Drake, children of the said David Drake..."

While the poor copies of these deeds in our possession make a complete reading impossible, it seems clear that these deeds were a part of settling out the estate of David Drake (a son of the original settler David Drake). The first deed then between the siblings of the deceased younger David and the three children of the deceased David, and the second deed was among the three children of the deceased David. An examination of the hard copies of these deeds and the records of the probate court of Holmes County should fix these relationships beyond doubt. Below, we refer to these two deeds as the "David Drake Children Deeds."

A somewhat consistent report by Phyllis Boyd Gauss, 7114 Romford Ct., San Diego, CA 92120 reports that the children of Thomas Drake and Sarah Hinkle were: "David m. Rachel Sills; Eliphalet m. Mary Dodds; Catherine m. Daniel Buzzard; Eleanor m. Thomas Shearer; Margaret m. Mr. Bryan; Jesse m. Rachel Critchfield; Levi m. Catherine Henry." We will address this report in the following section.

2. What do we know of the siblings and parents of Nancy Drake?

So, although the evidence is circumstantial, and at times not completely consistent, we can say with considerable confidence, that Nancy Drake Buzzard, the wife of Daniel Buzzard and the mother of his children, was the daughter of Thomas Drake and Sarah Hinkle Drake, and was born in 1794 Baltimore, Maryland.

More is written elsewhere about the parents and their lineage.

We believe that the children of Thomas Drake and Sarah Hinkle were as shown below, combining our LDS research and the above report of Phyllis Gauss. Thomas Drake and Sarah Hinkle Drake are both buried in Drake's Valley Cemetery, according to the 1940 readings: "Thomas Drake, died Jan 19, 1844 Aged 83y 2m & 3d; Sarah, wife of Thomas Drake, died April 13, 1848, Aged 85 yrs 2m 3d." Thomas Drake had Land Entries in Washington Township on 27 February 1812 and 16 September 1815.

1. David Drake, b. 28 Oct 1790 (LDS Film#442774, p. 0092, ref#06441; film#458460). David married Rachel Sills on 18 June 1815 (Wayne County records). This interest excerpt from History of the Methodist Churches of Nashville and Western Holmes County, Rev. Joshua Crawford, from issues of the Nashville Journal, April 7, 1904 and following, shed additional light on David: "I am quite sure there was another class perhaps older than [Nathan Drake's which dates back before 1822] of which David Drake, son of Thomas, sr., was the leader. From this time on to 1832 this was a strong society, and during this time and for years later held a great Camp Meeting every year. To these gatherings people came from every direction for thirty miles or more in big lumber wagons bringing provisions with them to last ten days. Log tents were built and also a few canvas Some of the most famous preachers of the West delivered their stirring sermons on this camp ground." In addition to its obvious importance, this passage also establishes this David's life well past the earlier deeds that referenced David, son of David and Margaret Hinkle. David Drake died on September 15, 1846, aged 55y 10m & 17d, according to the 1940 reading of Drake's Valley Cemetery; and from the same record, Rachel, wife of David Drake, was born

March 27, 1799 and died Oct. 23, 1877, aged 78 y 7m 26d. On our next trip to Holmes County, we should review the Nashville Journal, which was a weekly paper published in 1904-05 by Thomas Johnson.

The following is written about one of David's sons:

MAJ. J.L. Drake was born in Holmes County, Ohio, November 1, 1817; the son of David and Rachel (Sills) Drake, who were natives respectively of Maryland and Virginia, and the parents of eight children. David Drake was twice married, by his first wife having two children. He came from Maryland to Holmes County, Ohio, in 1814, and died there in 1846. His wife died in the fall of 1878. James L. Drake, when seventeen years of age learned the tailor's trade. This he discontinued at the end of three years, on account of ill-health, and, engaged in farming; also clerked for a time. In 1849, he and twelve other, including three brothers, went to California overland, being one hundred and five days on the trip. They remained fourteen months. For the first two months our subject mined with the rest, but soon established a trading business, and in three months cleared \$8,000. Among other things he clerked in a wholesale store in Sacramento, receiving \$500 and board per month. The winter of 1850 he started home via Panama, and on his arrival in New Orleans was taken down with the small-pox. After his recovery, he returned to his family, and purchased the old homestead in Holmes County, Ohio. Mr. Drake has been a Democrat, but after the repeal of the Missouri Compromise became a Republican. For this his neighbors made threats to lynch him. He assisted in raising the first three years' company in Ohio, Company H Twenty-third Regiment, of which he was elected Captain. He also had two brothers and two sons in the war. One brother, Levi, Lieutenant Colonel of the Forty-ninth Ohio Infantry, was killed at Stone River. [my note: he is buried in Drake's Valley Cemetery.] The other, Commodore, was a Captain in the One Hundred and Ninety-second Regiment. One son, Levi N., was taken prisoner and starved to death in Andersonville. The other, Francis, was a non-commissioned officer in the Twenty-third Regiment, and is at present a hardware merchant of Rome City. Capt. J.L. Drake participated in all the engagements of his regiment until the battle of Antietam. Three of his regimental officers became distinguished in the history of the United States, viz.: Ex-President Hayes, Major; Stanley Mathews, Lieutenant Colonel; and William Rosecrans, Colonel. Capt. Drake was severely wounded by shell in the left arm and side, from the effects of which he was mustered out in October, 1862, and brevetted Major. He was elected Colonel of a Home Guards regiment, and was appointed Provost Marshal of the Fourteenth Congressional District, in which capacity he served until the close of the war. He was married, August 7, 1839, to Susan Hayward, of Cattraugus County, N.Y. They have had twelve children - Francis M., David, Sarah, Ellen, Emily, Mary, Cora, James S., Newton, Fremont, Sherman and Jack. Four are dead, viz.: David, Sarah, Newton and Sherman. The mother died April 23, 1877. Mr. Drake, in October, 1879, married Mrs. Harriet A. (Triplet) Filson. He came to La Grange in September, 1866, where he has since been living retired. Source: "1882 History LaGrange County, Indiana" by F.A.Battey & Co., - Town of La Grange

2. Eliphalet Drake, b. April 5, 1791 (LDS Film#442774, p. 0093, ref#06442; film#458460; Nashville cemetery records), who married Mary Dodds. From a typed "History of Nashville" located in the Holmes County Library: "In 1823 Thomas Drake purchased from the government two 80 acre lots for two dollars an acre. In 1827 he deeded on to Eliphalet Drake, his son. In 1828 the state road was run from Millersburg to Mansfield, and at the suggestion of his neighbors, Eliphalet drake laid out a village and called it Nashville. The reason for the name was that his father was a great admirer of Gen. Frances Nash who fell in the battle of Brandywine. The town was plotted into 31 lots on June 30, 1828. Eliphalet Drake donated land for a Methodist Church and cemetery at the west end of the village." Eliphalet is buried in this cemetery, along with his wife Mary who died in 1863 at the age of 67.

3. Nancy Drake Buzzard, b. 1794 (LDS Film#442775, p. 0094, ref#06147; film#458460), married, as we concluded above, Daniel Buzzard. Phyllis Gauss' list of this family lists a "Catherine Drake, who married Daniel Buzzard" in this slot. As will be seen elsewhere, Daniel Buzzard's second wife was named Catharine or Mary Catharine, but this second wife does not appear to be the mother of his children. While the LDS films referenced apparently enumerate the children of Thomas and Sarah including our Nancy. As discussed below, the burial place of Nancy Drake is unknown for certain. Daniel Buzzard's brother, George Buzzard, is buried in Drake's Valley Cemetery.

4. Eleanor Drake Shearer, b. 17 April 1796 (LDS Film#442775, p. 0095, ref#06144; film#458460) who married Thomas Shearer according to Ms. Gauss' list. Several Shearers are known to be buried in Drake's Valley Cemetery including two children, Thomas D. and David Q., whose tombstones announce that they are sons of Thomas and Eleanor Shearer. Also, there is a monument to John Shearer who was born June 15, 1755 and died April 3, 1832; presumably this is the father of Thomas Shearer. John Shearer had a Land Entry in the

Washington Township in 1825. Also, there is a monument to "Sarah Shearer, Died November 20, 1851, Aged 81 yrs," presumably the wife of Thomas and mother of Thomas.

5. Margaret Drake Bryan, b. about 1798 (LDS Film#442775, p. 0096, ref#06144; film#458460) who married Mr. Bryan according to Ms. Gauss' list.

6. Jesse Drake, b. about 1800 (LDS Film#442775, p. 0097, ref#06442; film#458460) who married Rachel Critchfield according to Ms. Gauss' list. In the 1940 reading of Drake's Cemetery there is a stone that reads: "In memory of Rachel, daughter of Jesse and Rachel Drake who died January 13 A D 1842 Aged 7 years 8 months 7 days."

7. Levi Drake, b. about 1804 (LDS Film#442774, p. 0098, ref#06476; film#458460) who married Catherine Henry. according to Ms. Gauss' list. A Cathirinah Henry is shown on the 1940 reading of Drake's Cemetery as 1829 A 66.

We believe that the children of David Drake and Margaret Hinkle were as shown below: David Drake had Land Entries in Washington Township on 27 February 1812 and 16 September 1816, on the same dates as his brother Thomas. Another Land Entry is recorded for David Drake on 11 March 1814, on the same date as an Entry of David Drake, Jr. Also, two additional Land Entries are shown for David Drake in 1833 and 1835, but these could be Entries of Thomas's son David, or even David's son David's son David.

1. David Drake, b. before 1793. Some records indicate a much later birth of 1805 (LDS Film#442774, Page#0015,Ref#06436; Film#458460), but these records must refer to some other David Drake. This David Drake, Jr. entered land in the Washington Township on 11 March 1814, with Griffith Johnson later bordering on the North and Thomas O'Dell bordering on the east. Clearly, this David Drake, Jr. was born before 1805! The above described David Drake Children Deeds of 1826 vintage are between all the other children of Thomas and Sarah Drake and the children of David Drake, deceased, presumably this David Drake, Jr.. If so, this David Drake, Jr. had three children named David Drake, Jr., Thomas and Sarah. However, those deeds are dated 1826. Perhaps the fact that in these series of deeds the Junior has been dropped from the name of this David Drake and applied to his son, suggests that the elder David Drake (brother of Thomas and husband of Sarah) had predeceased this David Drake, Jr. We have been unable to locate a death record of the elder David Drake (broth of Thomas and husband of Sarah) or his wife, Sarah.

2. Harriet Jerusha Drake Johnston, b. 25 December 1793, Allegany County, Maryland (LDS Film# 452863, Reference # 22320; film#458460) who married Griffith Johnston (as shown in the above reference deed) Moreover, it is reported that this marriage took place in 1813 and that the couple had 7 children and that Harried died on January 8, 1859, in Lowden, Cedar County, Iowa. According to a typewritten History of Nashville in the Holmes County Library, "the Drakes built the first Nashville community school west of Nashville with Griffith Johnson as the first teacher." Griffith Johnston had Land Entries in the Washington Township in 1817 and 1818.

3. Nancy Drake Odell, b. 15 July 1795, Allegany County, Maryland (LDS Batch #8483402, Source Call No. 1395859, Sheet 22; LDS Film# 442775, Page No. 0012; Ref#06074; Film# 458460) who married Thomas O'Dell (as shown in the above referenced deed and in Wayne County Marriage Records.) Moreover, Thomas Odell and Nancy Odell appear in the listing of Nathan Drake's 1821 Class Book, from the Drake's Valley Methodist Church. In the northeastern corner of the Washington Township is a famous lake called O'Dells Lake. According to an article in the Holmes County Traveler, Sept Oct 1990, p. 20, "[A]s Holmes County was settled, the lake was renamed O'Dells Lake, after Rev. Thomas Odell." It is unknown whether Nancy's husband was the Rev. Thomas Odell, or her son, or some other relative. But, according to the article cited just above, Odells Lake became one of the premier tourist attractions in Ohio so long as the railroads were king. It was reported in the article that among the many large groups that would meet there were General Sherman's unit which held eight reunions there, often having drill exercises and mock battles! Thomas O'Dell had Land Entries in Washington Township in 1817 and 1819.

4. Nathan Drake, b. 26 May 1797 in Allegany County, Maryland, (LDS Film# 452774, Page # 0013, Reference # 06437; film#458460)who married Miranda (according to the above-referenced deed). Nathan Drake is buried in the Nashville Cemetery (Methodist): d. July 18, 1882 85 yr 7-4. Miranda Drake is also buried there: d. Jan 22, 1871 71 yr 9 mo. Nathan Drake was a Sunday School Class Leader as early as 1816 and held this position for over 50 years. Members of his early class include Nathan and Maranda, Nancy and Thomas O'Dell, Eliphalet Drake, Sarah Buzzard (widow of George?), and a Mary Drake (could this be Mary Catherine, the second wife of

Daniel Buzzard?) According to a typewritten Nashville History found in the Holmes County Library: "Mr. Nathan Drake, to whom we are indebted for many of the facts here noted, bought his land from the government at two dollars per acre. He was born in Maryland in December 1796-consequently he will be eight years old should he live till next December. His appearance indicated that he will reach more than four-score. He came to Ohio when quite young, has lived here on this farm for forty-nine years; for the last ten he has lived here in town. He married Miranda Weatherbee when about twenty-one and raised a strong hearty family of girls and boys. . . . He distinctly remembers the place where [Nashville] stands when it was covered with trees and underbrush, and says he has chased many a deer from this spot. He has seen and been with the Indians in their camp when they would rest on a journey to Green Township and Jeromesville. Before Cornelius Quick built the grist mill at Lakeville, Mr. Drake and his neighbors had to go to mill on Owl Creek in Knox County on horse back, though they sometimes went down the Mohican in canoes and would paddle upstream with their cargo and to sell their grain they had the 'delightful' task of hauling it to Massillon." Nathan Drake had a Land Entry in Washington Township in 1815, after he turned 18 years old.

5. George Drake, b. about 1799, (LDS Film#442774, Page# 0014, Ref# 06437) who married Rachel (according to the above-referenced Deed). There is a 1940 reading of the tombstone of George's wife in Drake's Valley Cemetery: "In Memory of Rachel Drake wife of George Drake who was born August 30, 1801 and died January 23, 1829. Beloved in life Lamented in death In eternity doubtless blest"

3. What was her life like before she married Daniel Buzzard?

A step back into history may be helpful. Ohio became a state in 1803. Wayne County, Ohio was finally established in 1812 (prior to that it had been a part of Columbiana County and known as Killbuck Township). Wooster, the county seat of Wayne County, was established as a Post Office in December 1812. In the 1810 census of Killbuck Township, there were only 46 heads of families and a total of 332 people in the county. By 1820 there were 1941 heads of families and 11,935 persons, thus evidencing the rapid influx of pioneers.

The southeastern corner of Wayne County was referred to as the Washington Township. In 1824 the southern part of Wayne County was joined with other lands to form a new county, Holmes County. Thus the northwestern portion of Holmes County, known as the Washington Township, is the almost the same as the original southwestern corner of Wayne County. Our geography is more complicated by having a slender plug of Ashland County just to the west of this township, and, not too many miles across Ashland County, one comes to Richland County. The researcher of this area would do well to become familiar with the geography of the area. See generally, Wayne County Ohio Early Censuses and Tax Lists, Compiled by C. Arthur Phillips, Homes County Library, Millersburg, Ohio, reprinted 1980 and 1998.

There were several waves of immigration to flow through Holmes County, Ohio. Of course, the Indians were first, and not far away, in Richland County one can find the final resting place of The Last Mohican. German settlers were an early wave, settling in the northern townships, including the Washington Township. A wave of Frenchmen later settled in the northern part of the Salt Creek Township. And then the Amish, Swiss and Dutch waves came. Holmes County is now predominantly Amish with only the far western sections showing as outside the concentration of Amish on a 2000 tourist map of Holmes County. At some point, in the middle of all these migrations, the man known as Johnny Appleaseed also came through Holmes County doing his thing.

This is an excerpt from "A Brief History of the Methodist Churches in Western Holmes Count, Expecially Those Included in the Nashville Circuit:"

One of the oldest Methodist organizations was the one in Drake's Valley where a log church building was erected by the Drake families and other Methodist families some time during the 1820's....

It is stated on good authority that the Drake Brothers, Thomas and David, built cabins in the valley as early as 1810 and brought their families soon after, possibly before the beginning of the War of 1812. Apparently the Drake families must have owned a large tract of land on the eastern slope of the valley including the land on which the Village of Nashville now stands, for records show that one of Thomas's sons, Eliphalet by name, employed Samuel Robinson in the summer of 1828 to survey 31 lots in the village of what is now Nashville, the cemetery being one of them. Apparently, however, no Methodist church was built until about 1839 or about the time the Great Revival of 1840 swept over Holmes County. At about that time the log church in the valley was abandoned and a new organization was formed by the members in the valley and the new Methodist immigrants living in and around Nashville.

Incidentally, the village of Nashville was named in honor of Gen. Nash, a close friend of the Drake Bros., who

was killed in the Battle of Brandywine during the Revolutionary War. Some members of this church were of the Drake families, the Henry Campbell family, Frank Hughes, Henry Oberholtzer, Delmar Willard, Joshua Crawford. This church later became one of the churches on the Nashville Circuit, Bigelow and Lakeville being the other two.

More about the brothers Thomas and David Drake can be found as notes under their names.

4. What do we know of Nancy's life after she married Daniel Buzzard?

Daniel Buzzard, and presumably Nancy, appear in the 1820 census of Washington Township, Wayne County. Wayne County Ohio Early Censuses and Tax Lists, *ibid.*, p. 32. (George, Jacob and Jonathan Buzzard also appear; as do, David, David (2), Eliphalet, Nathan and Thomas Drake.) A separate summary of the 1820 census, which is available in the raw on microfilm at the Wayne County library, shows that the Daniel Buzzard family had males aged 25+ and 5; females aged 20 and 5; but age categories were loosely grouped in this census.) In terms of family order, the families enumerated in the 1820 census of Washington Township came in this order: 41:David Drake,m25+; 42:Griffith Johnston,m25+; 43:Eli Booth, m25+; 44:Thomas Drake,m45+; 45:David Drake,m45+; 46:Daniel Buzzard, m25+; 47:George Buzzard, m45+. Elipalet Drake,m25+, Nathaniel Drake, m25+, and Jacob Buzzard, m45+ appear elsewhere in the township. Thomas Drake is located on a map alongside the eastern edge of the river in Section 4, and the elder David Drake is located in the southeastern corner of Section 9 on the north side of the road from Nashville to Loudonville. From pages 62 and 63 of a small typewritten booklet about the 1820 Census of Wayne County, from either the Wayne County or the Holmes County library.

The effect of the above is that we can see that in 1820, Nancy and Daniel are living in the neighborhood with assorted Drake and Buzzard relatives. At this time she appears in the census to have only three children. The actually microfilm of the 1820 census, as copied from the film in the Holmes County library, reveals that perhaps there were 5 people in the household in 1820. (Page 138)

Their first child, a daughter named Ariel, was born in Holmes County, Ohio in 1831 and died in 1833, in route to Missouri. The location of her death has been said to be in Van Burren, Arkansas, when the group had completed the waterway portion of their trip. This is where the rest of the group bought wagons, horses and provisions in preparation for the trek across land to their destination, Southwest Missouri. Elizabeth and Edward stayed in Van Burren for about a year before rejoining the rest of their party in Wela Park. William, their next son, was born in 1833, while the couple remained in Arkansas. William's birth coupled with the death of Ariel was probably the reason for their decision to remain while the rest of their party traveled on to Missouri. The next child born was a son, John Pickney on July 11, 1835, then another son, Daniel on May 29, 1838, both of these sons were born while the family was still living at the campsite in Wela Park, Missouri. Martin Van Burren was born on November 7, 1840, Emaline was born February 7, 1843, Sarah was born in 1845, Margaret was born in 1846, Mary was born February 9, 1847, Elizabeth was born in 1850, and James Edward was born February 20, 1852 in what was considered Lost Creek Township for census purposes and known as the Lost Creek Valley.

According to some of the historical accounts written of this incident, on January 9, 1854 Edward Sherer was ambushed by roadside bandits on his way home from town. He reportedly was knocked off his horse, hit in the head with a rock, and left along the roadside to die, which he did. Jonathan Buzzard buried his son in law in the small cemetery located on the Fred Gallemore farm. In addition to Ariel, who died at the age of 2, Edward and Elizabeth's daughter Elizabeth died in 1857, at the age of 7, Margaret died in 1853, at the age of 9, and their son William was killed when he was struck by lightning in 1840, at the age of 7. An historical account stated that five children died, but I have not identified the name of that child. It is possible that a story about one of Edward and Elizabeth's daughters being taken by Indians, raped, and later dying could be this fifth and unknown child. The rest of the children survived until adulthood, marrying and having families of their own. Elizabeth finished raising their children alone after Edward died in what is now Seneca, Missouri. She outlived Edward by about 44 years, dying on March 9, 1898 and was buried in The Seneca Cemetery.

18. JOHN B.⁵ BUZZARD (*JONATHAN B.*⁴, *PHILIP JACOB*³ *BOSSERT*, *JOHANN HEINRICH*², *JOHANNES PHILIP*¹) was born 1815 in Holmes Co, Ohio, and died 12 May 1867 in Newton Co, Missouri. He married (1) ELIZABETH PATTON Bet. 1859 - 1860 in Newton Co, MO. She was born 02 May 1826 in Virginia, and died 29 Apr 1901 in Newton County, Missouri. He married (2) JANE SPURGEON 19 Jul 1838 in Barry County, Mo, daughter of JOHN SPURGEON and REBECCA UNKNOWN. She was born Abt. 1820 in Ohio, and died 1846 in Newton County, Missouri. He married (3) SUSANNAH DAVIS ROBERTS 1846 in Newton Co, MO. She was born 08 Oct 1818 in Tennessee, and died Jul 1859 in Newton Co, MO.

Notes for JOHN B. BUZZARD:

John B. Buzzard was born in 1815 in Holmes County, Ohio. His first marriage was to Jane Spurgeon in 1838.

John and Jane had three children, Ariel, born in 1840, Francis Marion, a son, born in 1843, and Elizabeth, born in 1845. Jane died shortly after the birth of Elizabeth, but the exact date is unknown.

In 1846, John married the widow of Joseph Roberts, Susannah Davis Roberts. She was born on October 8, 1818 and her older brother, Reason, born in 1816, were raised by Bennett Roberts after their mother's death. Bennett provided for her and her brother in his will. In a book containing wills in Clay County Missouri there was a will dated 5 Dec 1831 for Bennett Roberts. It said that Reason Davis and Susanna Davis were to share equally, and brother Aaron Roberts was to attend to taking care of the above mentioned children. Stephen Roberts and Anthony C. Clemons were witnesses. Aaron Roberts was the administrator of this estate.

Reason married Sarah Jane Belieu and Susannah married Joseph Roberts, then both couples moved from Clay County, MO to Newton County. Susannah and Joseph had three sons, Reason McDonald, born August 14, 1838, George Washington, born February 22, 1840, and Joseph Franklin, born November 30, 1842. An interesting note about George, he married Cynthia Ann Testerman and with their daughter, Margaret and her husband, Ira Foster Hetherington, participated in the land rush in Oklahoma.

John and Susannah had three children, James Polk, born on August 29, 1847, Sarah Jane, born in 1849, and Susan, born in March of 1854. According to the 1860 Mortality Schedule, Susannah died at the age of 35. If the age on the mortality schedule and the birth year I have is correct, she died in 1854, if the year she was born is

wrong then she died in July of 1859. Since her headstone can not be found, I have nothing to verify or dispute this date other than the genealogy of other researchers, so this is the date that I will use for her death.

Between July of 1859 and the birth of Francis in 1861, John Buzzard's next known child, John married Elizabeth Patton Albert, born on May 2, 1826. Her first husband was Fredrick Albert. The children known to be John and Elizabeth's are Francis Lemuel or possibly named Lafayette, born in 1861, George, born in 1862, and Dallas Kelso, born in 1864. The 1860 Lost Creek Census, in error, lists Elizabeth's children from her previous marriage, Tennessee, born in 1850 and Laura, born in 1851, as Buzzards, later census reports list them both correctly as being Alberts. John and Elizabeth are buried in the Buzzard Cemetery and according to their headstones, John B. Buzzard died May 12, 1867 and Elizabeth Patton Albert Buzzard died April 29, 1901.

What I know of Elizabeth and Fredrick Albert's children is that Laura Albert married John Gilmore, they had 3 sons, George, born in 1869, William E., born in 1871, and Elmer, born in 1876, and one daughter, Francis, born in 1870. Laura died in route to Idaho in 1877, by one account, she died in Oregon. John T. was born in 1844, was a merchant in Seneca, Missouri, he married a woman born in Austria named Frederika and they had at least 3 daughters, Allie, Katie, and Blanche. William Penn Albert was born in 1857 and married

Prior to February 1, 1914, Dallas Kelso Buzzard, the youngest son of John and Elizabeth, owned and operated a grist mill and a farm located in Racine, Missouri. On February 1, 1914 he entered into an agreement with Nelson Campbell Gallemore, founder and President of the First National Bank of Fairland, in order to relocate his grist mill to Fairland, OK. Things went sour, the mill went bankrupt, D.K. had to sell the mill at a loss and he ended up filing suit on June 20, 1917 against N.C. Gallemore and the First National Bank of Fairland for breach of contract and damages for his losses.

The terms of the agreement, according to court documents, was that N.C. Gallemore and his bank were to furnish D.K. Buzzard a mill site at Fairland free; the bank would pay off and discharge the incumbrances on the mill and farm, and pay the expense of moving the mill to Fairland and would pay for the mill to be rebuild on the donated mill site; the bank would furnish money to keep D.K. Buzzard and the mill supplied with grain sufficient to operate, and the money would be advanced as a loan. The bank, through N.C. Gallemore, would keep and account for the operation of the mill and was to have the custody of all funds of D.K. Buzzard to guarantee that they were used in carrying out the terms of the contract.

Court records show that D.K. Buzzard performed all his part of the agreement; moved his mill to Fairland, sold his farm, and turned the proceeds over to the bank; the bank furnished the mill as agreed, paid the indebtedness, and rebuilt the mill on the new site, but failed and refused to furnish sufficient grain, or money to buy grain, to operate the mill. D.K., having mortgaged all of his property to the bank as security for the money expended in moving the business, and having turned over the proceeds of the farm to the bank, was without funds and unable to obtain funds from any other source to buy grain to operate the mill full time. This resulted in the failure of the mill because D.K. could only operate the mill one-fourth of the time, so he sued Nelson C. Gallemore and the bank for breach of contract, and for damages in the sum of \$ 12,700, and costs. The case was tried and judgment rendered in favor of D.K. Buzzard for \$ 261.89 on account, and for damages in the sum of \$ 4,000. Upon appeal the judgment on the accounting was affirmed, and the judgment for damages was reversed, being cause No. 12851 in the Supreme Court and decided on February 12, 1924.

Nelson Campbell Gallemore died and was replaced by a Mr. Melbourne, who filed an appeal and the case went back to the Oklahoma Supreme Court, which in turned returned the case back to the lower court for redress. The case's final decision was made 11/16/1926, it was reversed in part and reaffirmed in part, resulting in D.K. Buzzard's total award being \$12,700.00. In today's dollars that award would be worth, \$232,901.07 using the Consumer Price Index, \$193,597.11 using the GDP deflator, \$1,061,328.13 using the unskilled wage, \$1,387,110.03 using the GDP per capita, and \$4,065,739.73 using the relative share of GDP.

I found more information about Nelson Campbell Gallemore, he was called Nells and he was born in Seneca, Missouri. He died in Fairland, Ottawa County, OK. and is buried at the Fairland Cemetery, Fairland, OK. He was a banker by profession and and hewas also a Newton County representative in 1889-90 Legislature, and served as mayor of Fairland. He never married and died intestate. His probate was finally settled in 1943, 18 years after his death. I think it is rather ironic that an attorney, of all people, would die without a will.

Syllabus

¶0 1. Pleading--Petition--Failure to Separately State and Number Causes of Action--Waiver of Objection. Section 267, Comp. Stat. 1921, which provides: "Where the petition contains more than one cause of action, each shall be separately stated and numbered," is a statutory right in favor of the defendant, and where the petition fails to comply with the statute and the defendant fails to move for a amendment to comply with the same, the right is waived.

2. Appeal and Error--Discretion of Court--Rulings on Pleadings.

Where the petition states two causes of action, one for an accounting and the other for breach of contract and damages, and the defendant files motion to make more definite and certain and the court overrules the motion, held, the action of the court in passing on the motion, a matter of judicial discretion, and will not be disturbed by this court without it is made to appear the court abused its discretion to the prejudice of the defendant.

3. Appeal and Error--Review--Conclusiveness of Verdict.

In an action for an accounting and breach of contract and damages, where the issues are tried to a jury, and the jury return a verdict for two items, one for the accounting and one for damages, and the court renders judgment accordingly, and there is evidence supporting the judgment for the item on accounting, this court, on appeal, will not disturb the judgment for the accounting.

4. Damages--Measure--Prospective Profits--Breach of Contract to Furnish Money.

Where B., a miller, enters into a contract with G., a banker and money lender, for the purpose of moving his flour mill from Racine, Mo., to Fairland, Okla., and G. agrees to furnish the money to pay off the incumbrances against the mill and pay for removing the mill and rebuilding it on the new site and to furnish the money to supply the mill with necessary grain to keep it in operation, and G. fulfills the agreement in all respects except to furnish money to supply the grain, and B. brings suit for breach and damages, the measure of damages is the profit B. would have made from the products of the mill as contemplated by the contract.

5. Sufficiency of Evidence.

The record examined, and held sufficient to sustain the judgment on accounting, but not sufficient to sustain

the judgment for damages.

Action by D. K. Buzzard against N. C. Gallemore for an accounting and damages. Judgment for plaintiff, and defendant brings error. Affirmed in part and reversed in part.

THREADGILL, C.

¶1 The defendant in error, as plaintiff, filed suit against the plaintiff in error, as defendant, on June 20, 1917, in the district court of Ottawa county for an accounting and breach of contract and damages in the sum of \$ 10,000. For convenience the parties will be referred to as they appeared in the trial court. Plaintiff's petition consists of five paragraphs. In the first, it states that he is a miller and the defendant is a banker and a money lender at Fairland, Okla., that about February 1, 1914, and prior thereto, the plaintiff owned a grist mill near the town of Racine, Newton county, Mo., and a farm incumbered with mortgages; that about February 1, 1914, he and defendant entered into a contract for the purpose of moving the mill to Fairland, in which it was agreed that the defendant would get the people of Fairland to donate enough money to buy a mill site at that place for the plaintiff, the same to be free as an inducement for him to move his mill to Fairland, and that the defendant agreed to pay off and discharge the incumbrances on the mill, and pay the expense of moving the same to Fairland and rebuilding it on the donated mill site, and furnish money with which to keep plaintiff supplied with grain sufficient to operate. The money advanced was to be in the nature of a loan to plaintiff. Plaintiff was to sell the farm and turn the money over to the defendant for him to keep and account for in the operation of the mill and for the purchase of grain for that purpose. The defendant in person and through the bank he controlled should have the custody of all funds of the plaintiff to see that they were used in carrying out the terms of the contract.

¶2 In the second paragraph plaintiff states that the mill site was purchased as agreed; that the defendant advanced him \$ 3,500 for a year at ten per cent. interest, evidenced by note for \$ 3,850 secured by mortgage on the mill and new site; that defendant loaned plaintiff other sums of money, but not enough to keep the mill supplied with grain for grinding purposes; that plaintiff sold the farm and turned the money into the custody of defendant and the defendant and bank had the control of all his funds.

¶3 In the third paragraph plaintiff complains that defendant is charging him for the mill site in the sum of \$ 300. The defendant is indebted to him for funds placed in his hands in the sum of \$ 448.67, as shown by an itemized statement attached.

In the fourth paragraph plaintiff states that he sold the farm and placed the proceeds in the hands of the defendant that he might see that the money was used in operating the mill and payment of plaintiff's indebtedness to the defendant and bank, and the defendant applied all the proceeds of the farm in paying the notes not yet due, and failed and refused to furnish him money to buy grain in the operation of the mill and plaintiff could not operate the mill successfully, and even had to sell it at a sacrifice for lack of funds for this purpose.

¶4 In the 5th paragraph plaintiff states as follows:

"Wherefore plaintiff says that by reason of the defendant's aforesaid failure to honestly account to the plaintiff and pay over to him the funds belonging to the plaintiff and in the custody and under the control of the defendant, as aforesaid, and by reason of the failure of the defendant to keep the plaintiff supplied with sufficient funds with which to buy sufficient grain to keep said mill in operation and by reason of defendant's unlawful appropriation of funds in his hands belonging to the plaintiff to the payment of notes which were not due, plaintiff has sustained a great loss on account of not being able to operate said mill continuously and a great loss in the sale of said mill at a sacrifice price and has sustained the loss of the aforesaid sum of \$ 448.67 all to his damage in the sum of \$ 10 000, for which amount, and the costs of this action, the plaintiff asks judgment."

¶5 The defendant filed a motion to make the petition more definite and certain which was as follows:

"1. That he be required to set out the date or dates of the items of accounting listed in his Exhibit A. 2. To state whether or not the alleged contract to have been entered into on or about the first of February, 1914, was in writing and set out a copy thereof or allege a reason whereby same is not done or if same be a verbal contract to so state and to state also the length of time the said contract was to continue. 3. To set out par

ticularly the source and origin of the alleged damages and each item thereof for the alleged breach in such manner that the defendant may know for what specific item and things he is being called upon to respond in damages and if the same be for prospective profits, for what length of time and during what period and from what source the same are alleged by plaintiff to have arisen and the reason for the liability of the defendant to respond thereto."

¶6 This motion was overruled and the defendant excepted. Defendant offered a general demurrer, which being overruled, he filed his answer, in which he admits that he loaned the plaintiff money to pay off certain indebtedness against the mill at Racine, Mo., and assisted him in getting a mill site at Fairland, Okla., but denies generally the contract claimed by the plaintiff. He admits the correctness of the account set out in plaintiff's Exhibit A. except rebate on insurance policy and items of interest on two notes, but states that the exhibit is incomplete and there is no thing due on items stated according to their settlement January 21, 1915.

¶7 The defendant pleads other items against the plaintiff for services, commissions, and interests and attorney's fees, and asks for costs and by way of counterclaim asks for \$ 225.43. Plaintiff filed a reply of general denial. The cause was tried to a jury October 2, 1919, and resulted in a verdict and judgment in favor of the plaintiff in the sum of \$ 261.89, on the accounting, and \$ 4,000 damages, and the defendant has appealed by petition in error and case-made.

¶8 In the trial, when all the testimony was in, the plaintiff was permitted by the court to file an amended petition, which does not materially change the original petition except that the defendant was to keep the plaintiff supplied with sufficient grain to operate the mill continuously if it was moved to Fairland.

¶9 The defendant filed motion to require plaintiff to separately state and number his cause of action and state damages claimed on account of failure to lend the money claimed. The record does not show any action on this motion.

1. The first complaint on the part of defendant is that the court erred in overruling his motion to require the plaintiff to separately state and number the causes of action and to make definite and certain. It seems that the defendant in this complaint gets the two motions mixed in his mind. It will be observed that the motion to the original petition did not ask that the petition state and number the causes of action but to make more definite and certain. It is plain that the petition consists of two causes of action, one for an accounting of monies placed in custody of defendant and the other for damages for breach of contract that should have been set out and stated separately as provided by section 267, Comp. Stat. 1921, which reads as follows:

"Where the petition contains more than one cause of action each shall be separately stated and numbered."

¶10 The defendant did file a motion to the amended petition asking for separate counts but it does not appear that any action was taken on this motion. We think this was a statutory right in favor of the defendant and would be error for the court to overrule said motion in a proper case. *Pierce v. Bicknell*, 11 Kan. 262; *Stewart et al. v. Balderston et al.*, 10 Kan. 131.

¶11 But, inasmuch as defendant in this case did not make proper application at first to have the causes of action separately stated and numbered, and obtained no action of the court when his motion was filed to the amended petition, he has waived the statutory right to complain.

¶12 While the action of the court in passing on motion and objection to pleadings is largely a matter of judicial discretion, yet we think in this case it would have been better for all concerned if the court had sustained the motion to make more definite and certain and especially since its indefiniteness was not entirely cured by the amended petition, filed after all the evidence was in. From an examination of the record, it appears that the plaintiff had two causes of action against the defendant, but the cause for damages is very indefinitely stated and the court and jury and parties litigant were all at a disadvantage in understanding clearly the points at issue.

¶13 The defendant states 15 assignments of error, but does not discuss them except in a general way. The matter of the accounting needs but little consideration in this appeal. The items of the account were brought out in the evidence on both sides and the jury found that the plaintiff should recover on the accounting \$ 261.89, and the court approved and rendered judgment for same, and we think the evidence is amply sufficient to support this part of the judgment, and under the well established rule of this court, this part of the judgment will not be disturbed on appeal.

¶14 The defendant contends that the contract claimed by the plaintiff was a contract only for the loan of money and the damages claimed and awarded in the trial were erroneous not being based upon the proper measure of damages, discussing the subject under two heads:

"(1) As to what may be a valid contract to loan money; and (2) damages recoverable for breach of contract to

loan money" --and citing many authorities in support of his contention.

¶15 We cannot agree with defendant's application of the argument he makes and the authorities he cites to the facts in this case. The petition alleged that the defendant was to furnish money in paying off the incumbrances against the mill and for moving it from Racine to Fairland, and for supplying the grain to operate the mill, and the money was furnished for everything according to the agreement except for the necessary wheat for operating the mill. This point was the point of the plaintiff's advantage and gain in the whole transaction, and these profits were in contemplation of the contract, and whatever damages resulted in a failure of the contract in this respect would be recoverable. In 17 C. J. 865, the rule is stated as follows:

"Ordinarily the breach of a contract to loan money will not impose a liability in damages particularly where the loan is to be repaid on demand, in the absence of particular circumstances, since no injury will result if the same amount may be borrowed from another on the same terms. However, the presence of special circumstances which are in the contemplation of the parties may impose a liability, in which case, the damages will be measured by the actual loss sustained."

¶16 In *Michael Murphy, Receiver, v. L. B. Hanna et al.* 37 N.D. 156, 164 N. W. 32 the same rule is stated as follows:

"The measure of damages for the breach of a contract obligation to loan money is not necessarily restricted to nominal damages; and where it appears that special circumstances were known to both parties, from which it must have been apparent that special damages would be suffered in case of failure to fulfill the obligation, such special damages as may appear to have been reasonably contemplated by the parties are recoverable."

¶17 There are many cases supporting the rule that profits are recoverable as damages in a proper case: *Ft. Smith, etc., Ry. Co. v. Williams*, 30 Okla. 726, 121 P. 275; *Cloe v. Rogers*, 31 Okla. 255, 121 P. 201; *Mackey v. Boswell et al.*, 63 Okla. 20, 162 P. 193; *Bishop-Babcock-Becker Co. v. Estes Drug Co.*, 63 Okla. 117, 163 P. 276; *Cushman Motor Works Co. v. Kelley*, 70 Okla. 173 P. 1042.

¶18 We think that the items of damages should have been set out more clearly in the petition and the proof confined to the items stated. We have examined the record to determine just what the evidence was as to loss of the plaintiff in the matter of profits in not having wheat to keep the mill running, and we do not think the evidence sufficient to sustain the judgment for damages. The plaintiff did operate the mill a part of the time and according to his statement was building up a good trade. There is nothing definite as to the number of days he ran the mill, as to what amount of wheat he ground and barrels of flour turned out. The capacity of the mill is given and the profit on the flour, shorts, and bran, but the failure is in not showing with reasonable certainty the approximate number of days to reach the capacity of the mill and the necessary amount of wheat to meet the demand. The testimony disclosed by the record is too indefinite on this point to sustain the judgment. We, therefore think the judgment for the accounting should be affirmed, and the cause should be reversed with direction to the trial court to set aside the judgment for damages and grant the defendant a new trial on these issues.

WILLIAMS, C.

¶1 This action was first begun by D. K. Buzzard, as plaintiff, against N. C. Gallemore, defendant, for damages alleged to be owing for breach of contract, and for an accounting. The case was tried and judgment rendered in favor of plaintiff for \$ 261.89 on account, and for damages in the sum of \$ 4,000. Upon appeal the judgment on the accounting was affirmed, and the judgment for damages was reversed, being cause No. 12851 in the Supreme Court, the decision being reported in 98 Okla. 104, 224 P. 293. On the return of this cause to the district court, the cause of action on accounting being eliminated, the plaintiff filed his third amended petition, alleging, in substance, the following state of facts:

¶2 That he (plaintiff) is a miller and defendant is a banker and a money lender at Fairland, Okla.; that about February 1, 1914, and prior thereto, the plaintiff owned a grist mill near Racine, Mo., and a farm incumbered with mortgages; that about February 1, 1914, he and defendant entered into a contract for the purpose of moving the mill to Fairland; that by the terms of this agreement defendant was to furnish plaintiff a mill site at Fairland free; that defendant agreed to pay off and discharge the incumbrances on the mill and farm, and pay the expense of moving the same to Fairland and rebuilding it on the donated mill site; that defendant agreed to furnish money with which to keep plaintiff supplied with grain sufficient to operate, the money so advanced to be in the nature of a loan. Plaintiff was to sell the farm and turn the money over to the defendant for him to keep and account for in the operation of the mill, and for the purchase of grain for that purpose. The defendant in person and through the bank he controlled was to have the custody of all funds of the plaintiff to see that they were used in carrying out the terms of the contract.

¶3 Plaintiff alleges that he fully performed all his part of the agreement; moved his mill to Fairland, sold his farm, and turned the proceeds over to defendant; that defendant furnished the mill as agreed, paid the indebtedness, and rebuilt the mill on the new site, but failed and refused to furnish plaintiff with sufficient grain, or money to buy grain, with which to operate the mill. The plaintiff, having mortgaged all of his property to defendant as security for the money expended by defendant in moving the business, and having turned over to defendant the proceeds of the farm, was without funds and unable to obtain funds from any other source with which to buy grain to operate the mill, and that by reason of defendant's failure to carry out his agreement to furnish plaintiff money to buy grain, the plaintiff could not operate the mill successfully and was only able to operate the mill one-fourth of the time, all to his damage in the sum of \$ 12,700, and prayed judgment for that amount and costs.

¶4 Before the trial of this cause the defendant died, and the case revived in the name of the administrator, who having filed a general denial to the petition, the cause was tried to the court and jury, and judgment had in favor of plaintiff in the sum of \$ 5,000 and costs. From this judgment the defendant has appealed to this court, arguing his numerous assignments of error under the following two general heads: First, the sufficiency of the pleadings to justify the action of the court thereunder; and second the sufficiency of the evidence to justify the instructions and rulings of the court and the verdict and judgment rendered.

¶5 We have carefully examined the pleadings in this case, and are of the opinion that they were sufficient to join the issues, and that the court did not commit error in overruling the several motions and demurrers leveled at the pleadings by the defendant. The defects in the pleadings in the former trial of this cause were pointed out by this court in the former appeal and complied with in the second trial of this cause.

¶6 A large portion of defendant's brief and argument goes to matters properly eliminated from the present case, those questions having been adjudicated by the former decision. Every question of law involved in this case was settled by the former decision. This court sustained the position of the plaintiff as to the validity of the contract and as to the liability of the defendant for a breach, and fixed the measure of damages for a breach of this particular contract, syllabus paragraph 4 of the decision being as follows:

"Where B., a miller, enters into a contract with G., a banker and money lender, for the purpose of moving his flour mill from Racine, Mo., to Fairland, Okla., and G. agrees to furnish the money to pay off the incumbrances against the mill and pay for removing the mill and rebuilding it on the new site, and to furnish the money to supply the mill with necessary grain to keep it in operation and G. fulfills the agreement in all respects except to furnish the money to supply the grain, and B. brings suit for breach and damages, the measure of damages is the profit B. would have made from the products of the mill as contemplated by the contract."

And in the body of the opinion, this court said:

"We cannot agree with defendant's application of the argument he makes and the authorities he cites to the facts in this case. The petition alleged that the defendant was to furnish money in paying off the incumbrances against the mill and for moving it from Racine to Fairland, and for supplying the grain to operate the mill, and the money was furnished for everything, according to the agreement, except for the necessary wheat for operating the mill. This point was the point of the plaintiff's advantage and gain in the whole transaction, and these profits were in contemplation of the contract, and whatever damages resulted in a failure of the contract in this respect would be recoverable."

¶7 This brings us to a consideration of the only remaining question in the instant case, i. e., defendant's second proposition: "The sufficiency of the evidence to support the verdict." Plaintiff testified that the capacity of the mill could reasonably be placed at 35 barrels per day; that each barrel of flour represents five bushels of wheat. With wheat selling on an average of \$ 1 per bushel, as it did, flour would sell for \$ 6 per barrel--a profit of \$ 1 per barrel. At capacity the mill would grind 1 75 bushels per day; that to each bushel of wheat there is about 20 pounds of offal, worth on the average \$ 1 per 100 lbs.; on a day's run the value of the offal is \$ 35, which, added to the profit on the flour, makes the sum of \$ 70 per day gross for the mill at capacity. Plaintiff in praying judgment only estimated his loss at \$ 30 per day. Taking into consideration the amount he estimated it took to operate the mill, we believe he was duly conservative.

¶8 In passing on this proposition, we quote from that part of the opinion of this court in the former case by Threadgill, C., reversing and remanding the case, as follows:

"We think that the items of damages should have been set out more clearly in the petition and the proof confined to the items stated. We have examined the record to determine just what the evidence was as to the loss of the plaintiff in the matter of profits in not having wheat to keep the mill running, and we do not think the evidence sufficient to sustain the judgment for damages. The plaintiff did operate the mill a part of the time and according to his statement was building up a good trade. There is nothing definite as to the number of days he ran the mill, as to what amount of wheat he ground, and barrels of flour turned out. The capacity of the mill is given and the profit on the flour, shorts, and bran but the failure is in not showing with reasonable certainty the approximate number of days to reach the capacity of the mill and the necessary amount of wheat to meet the demand. The testimony disclosed by the record is too indefinite on this point to sustain the judgment."

¶9 After a careful examination and review of the entire record, we find that the items of damages are clearly set out in the petition and the proof confined thereto; that the pleadings were regular and sufficient; that the instructions of the court embodied the law applicable to the facts. We believe the instant case was fairly tried in all respects and in compliance with the orders contained in the former decision of this case, and there being sufficient competent evidence tending to support the judgment under the well-established rule of this court, the same is affirmed.

¶10 By the Court: It is so ordered.

BIGELOW D. BUZZARD has been engaged in agricultural pursuits on section 24, township 45, range 29, Johnson County, for the past quarter of a century. He is a patriotic citizen, and one greatly interested in the prosperity of the country for which he fought during the War of the Rebellion. He was born in Holmes County, Ohio, September 29, 1830, and was reared to maturity on his father's farm. After receiving ordinary educational privileges, and when twenty-two years of age, he went to a boarding school for a few months, paying for his tuition with money he had earned himself.

The father of our subject, Daniel Buzzard, was born in Westmoreland County, Pa., July 19, 1790, and served in the War Of 1812, on the lake. Afterward he settled in Holmes County, Ohio, entering land from the Government, and resided there until 1850, when he sold out, locating near Odella Lake. In 1853 he went to Richland County, where he purchased one hundred and thirty-five acres, and thereon spent the remainder of his life. He never received a pension nor land-warrant, because there had not been proper records of his army service kept, but he bought a couple of land-warrants of a nephew, and located three hundred and twenty acres in Linn County, Iowa. He was twice married, his first wife being a Miss Nancy Drake, by whom he had fifteen children, all but five of whom lived to manhood and womanhood. A strong anti-slavery man, he rejoiced at the downfall of the system, and after the organization of the Republican party became one of its supporters. His death occurred August 16, 1865.

B. D. Buzzard was reared on his father's farm, and continued to work on the place until 1860, with the exception of a few short intervals. November 15, 1860, he wedded Arminda Brown, who was born in Richland County, Ohio, September 16, 1841, being a daughter of Caleb and Elizabeth (Johnston) Brown, natives of Butler County, Pa., and Greene County, Ohio, respectively. The mother's parents, however, were also from the Keystone State. The Browns and Johnstons were of Scotch and Irish descent, but for many generations had lived in America. The Buzzard family is of German origin, and our subject's father could speak little English until after he was twelve years of age.

Before his marriage Bigelow Buzzard erected a large house on his father's farm, and both families lived together after that event. In September, 1862, he enlisted in Company H, One Hundred and Twentieth Ohio Infantry, and took part in the battles of Arkansas Post, Milliken's Bend and the siege of Vicksburg. May 1, 1863, he was wounded in the right lung and fell prostrate, but as soon as he was able to stand, he was led to the rear, where his wounds were dressed, and for about two months he was in the field hospital. He came very near death's door, and attributes his recovery partly to the fact that he was kept on a diet of boiled milk, which is nourishing and easily digested. June 29, 1863, he was taken to Bent on Barracks, near St. Louis, and was there honorably discharged on the 17th of the following month. He went to the front under Captain Phelan, later served under Captain Taylor, and had as his Colonel a Mr. French, from his native county.

Returning home, Mr. Buzzard lived in Richland County, Ohio, until March, 1866, and there four of his children were born. Moving to Cooper County, Mo., he purchased one hundred and twenty acres, paying the amount required on the spot, and cultivated the farm for two years. In 1868, selling out, he moved to Johnson County and invested in a tract of one hundred and thirty-five acres. In 1870 he also sold this tract, buying instead his present home of a quarter-section. Since then he has added another eighty acres, and thus has a valuable farm, comprising two hundred and forty acres within its boundaries.

The eldest child of Mr. and Mrs. Buzzard, Annie Violet, born July 14, 1861, married George Frary, and died January 7, 1895, leaving four children, one having previously died in infancy. Ulysses Grant, born June 19, 1864, and a resident of Kingsville Township, is married and has one child. Jeanette F., born January 7, 1866, is clerking in Salida, Colo. Martha E., born in Cooper County, Mo., November 29, 1867, died December 18, 1871. Alice E.,

a native of this county, born June 16, 1869, married Albert Frary, by whom she has one child, and is a resident of Linn County, Iowa. The younger children are Gilbert N., born January 31, 1870; Lizzie Pauline, February 11, 1873; Ethel Blanche, September 27, 1874; Minnie L., January 9, 1878; Maude E., March 25, 1880; Guy Ashton, December 5, 1881; Josie Olive, May 22, 1883; and Cora Augusta, August 30, 1886.

Politically Mr. Buzzard is a Republican, with strong prohibition proclivities. Both he and his wife have been members of the Methodist Episcopal Church for many years, the former having become identified with the same in his early manhood, and the latter having been a member since 1862. They are worthy people and well entitled to a place among the honored old residents of Johnson County.

I know he is not buried with the rest of this family in the Hornet Cemetery

Sarah was born in 1851, in a covered wagon somewhere between Ft. Scott, Kansas and Nevada, Missouri, she herself did not know which state she was born in, but census reports lists her state of birth as Missouri, exactly where, I don't know.

There has been a lot of confusion as to the names of Sarah's parents. The notes in Wilford Fowler's genealogy made mention of the family bible that Laura Mullins Everett had in her possession, listing Arthur Mullins as Sarah's father and Carolyn Staton Mullins as her mother. He mentioned that a land patent issued for a 40 acre section of land located near Hornet, Missouri was issued to William Mullins. The legal description of that acreage matches that later known as "Uncle Horace's Forty". Wilford Fowler questioned the name and had guessed correctly that her father's name, based on a land patent, was actually William, and had been mixed up with Arthur Staton, Sarah's

maternal grandfather. According to the 1860 Shoal Creek Twp, Newton Co, Missouri Census, William Mullins was listed as Sarah's father. The household information was as follows:

Mullins, William farmer, 40 years old, his real value was set at 1500, personal, at 968, and he was born in North Carolina.

Mullins, Elizabeth, no occupation, 36 years old, no values set, and she was born in Tennessee.

Mullins, Sarah, 8 years old, and born in Missouri.

Mullins, Julia, 5 years old, and born in Missouri.

Mullins, Laura, 2 years old, and born in Missouri.

Staton, Nancy, 67 years old, she had a real value of 1500 and a personal value set at 500, and born in Virginia.

Mullins, Marcus, 71 years old, no values set, and born in North Carolina.

Sarah's parents died in Ft. Scott, Kansas when Sarah and her siblings, Julia, Laura Jane, and William Henry were all still minors. It is unclear exactly when or how the parents died, but it is generally believed that her parents, William Mullins and Rebecca Staton Mullins, are buried somewhere near Ft. Scott, Kansas. The story goes that her uncle, John Gaines, came to Ft. Scott to retrieve the four children sometime and bring them to Southwest City, Missouri after the Civil War had ended and their parents had died. On the trip from Ft. Scott to Southwest City, the weather was bitter cold. It is said that John Gaines stood guard over the children at night by peeking out the flap of the covered wagon. On one particular night, the temperature was bitter cold, and he lost sight in that eye due to frost bite.

Killed In A Mine

Five Miners Loss Their Lives and Two Are Injured

Five men were killed and two were seriously injured in a mine accident at Engleside zinc mine, eight miles east of Joplin, on Monday last. The dead are: Hale Fover, George Wilson, Wm Buzzard, Fritz Morris, and Ed Stothard, and those injured were Wm. Daniels and John Burton.

The seven men were cutting a drift from the main shaft. Early Monday morning two shots had been fired but the whole charge failed to explode. In the afternoon a box of powder was sent into the mine. One of the men accidentally discharged an unexploded charge and the box of powder was set off, resulting in the terrible destruction. A man at the surface of the entrance of the mine was thrown thirty feet into the air.
