transportation and maintenance. The term was from four to five years in Virginia. The indentured servant was in England with the representative of the colony, the shipmaster, who transferred his agreement to the colony. Apprentices may also properly be called indentured servants. Many apprentices were bound for a term of years in order to learn a trade.
