In the winter of 1889, Martin Van Buren Carden (December 25, 1867), and his wife, Mary Frances (April 12, 1862) made the decision to move to Cordele. It was through a friend, Sanford Roberts, who had already moved here that encouraged them to come to this new booming town. So, in November, the Carden family set out from Fayette County in north Georgia for Cordele with all their family possessions. They came with two covered wagons, driven by hired drivers, Sims and Shivers, a buggy driven by Mary Frances, a surrey driven by the thirteen year old son, James Martin. Martin Van Buren rode his horse and led the way. The five young children: Jessie Jackson, Elna Jane, Carmen Ercelle, Samantha Florence, Curtis Robert, rode on the wagon, in the buggy, on the horse then Surry. It was on this trip that Samantha Florence was nicknamed "Little Gypsy" by one of the drivers. The family was accompanied by a dozen hunting dogs that belonged to Mr. Carden and Mr. Sanford Roberts.

The family camped out and cooked over open campfires. Sometimes, they were able to camp in vacant houses along the way. the last camping spot was made in Henderson. they arrived in Cordele in December 1899.

The Carden family settled on what is now known as the Greer Place just north of the present Cordele State Patrol Office. A new was ready for them to move into. (This house burned ago when Anthony and Martha Jane Laporte resided there). The land was bought for one dollar an acre. It was cleared, and that spring, a small crop was harvested, they were offered three dollars an acre for the land. The farm was sold at an enormous profit, and the Carden family bought a farm in the Tremont Community for one dollar an acre and moved there.

In 1903, Sanford Roberts and Dr. H. B. Roberts, brothers, moved from Cordele to Hatley where the Roberts families had built a turpentine still and a mercantile business. Dr. Roberts practiced medicine. Again, Mr. Roberts encouraged Martin Van Buren to move with his family to Hatley to help the Roberts family in their business adventures in this new railroad town. Thus, the Carden family moved in a new house that Dr. Roberts

had built. (This house is known as the North House and is still in good condition in Hatley)

Hatley became a thriving little town on the railroad. Newcomers included: the Tom North family, the Prikles, Tom Waldrip, Zollie Gregory, Rossers, Gordons, Tom Oglesby, L. E. Arnold, and the J. D. Welchels.

Martin Van Buren bought farm land in Hatley, and in 1907, built a home where he resided at his death on October 08, 1960, at the age of 93. He was Postmaster of the U. S. Post Office in Hatley, and retired in the 1940's. Mary Frances departed from this life on March 16, 1950. Samantha Florence, a daughter, continues to live in this home at the time of this writing at the young age of 82 years. The farm is now owned by his grandsons, Tom and Max Carden.

Hatley Baptist Church

Hatley Baptist Church was organized on the third Sunday in May of 1904. Churches assisting in its beginning were Rock Springs, Seville, and Union in Wilcox County, Cordele First Baptist in Crisp County.

On September 08, 1904 a petitionary letter was presented to the Little River Association Meeting at Seville, Georgia. The messengers bearing this letter Mr. M.V. Carden and Mr. C. L. H. Warren. It was accepted as a member of the Little River Association until 1923.

On September 10, 1906, the church was given a deed to one acre of land on which to build a church. The land was given by Mr. L. E. Arnold and Mr. T. S. Roberts. Receiving the deed for the amount of five dollars were Mr. M. V. Carden and Mr. B. T. Mansfield. An incomplete list of the charter members follows: Mr. and Mrs. Sanford Roberts, Mr. M. V. Carden, Miss Eleanor Carden, Miss Carmen Carden, Miss Ada Roberts, Mr and Mrs. C. L. Hiram Warren and Mr. L. E. Arnold.

The church has had it's ups and downs through its seventy-four years. In 1917 in the summer revival, around twenty-five people accepted Christ and were baptized in River Lake. Among these were Mrs. Mattie W. Carden, still an active member, and Mrs. Florence C. Davis, our oldest member.

Somewhere between 1923 and 1930 the church ceased to have services, the number of years is not known.

About the year 1923 or 1930, Rev. R. H. Kelly moved into the community and became interested in reviving the church, along with several members still living in the community. The old building was repaired, Rev. Kelley was called as Pastor, and the church began having services and has continued to this present time.

A new building, concrete block, was dedicated in December of 1957. in 1976 and 1977 we built our fellowship hall, and we are indeed thankful for all the physical and spiritual blessings.

As a teenager, he helped his family move to south Georgia. He drove a surrey, his mother drove the buggy, and his father drove a loaded wagon with the animals tied behind it. Two friends drove wagons. They moved into Crisp County in 1899 and made two moves before they settled in Hatley community. It was in Hatley, Georgia, where "Jim" met Miss Lula Musselwhite who was later to become his wife. She was the daughter of Redmond Roland Musselwhite and Texiann Graham Musselwhite. Her father's people had come to this area from North Carolina in the 1800's, so they were pioneers in this section of Georgia. Her mother's people the Grahams and Browns, were old established families also living in this area in the time of the Indians. Her grandfather was "Indian Jim" Brown.

Lula was the eldest of ten children in the Musselwhite household, two of whom died as infants and one as a teenager (Zuma). Her brothers and sisters were Redmond, Eppie, Tom, George, John Gordon, and Elna.

As a bookkeeper and clerk, Lula was employed by the Hawkins Mercantile when she married James M. (Jim) Carden on September 18, 1919. Nine healthy children were born to this union in a span of thirteen years.

Van Roland was the oldest and perhaps the most responsible, because he assumed much responsibility in taking care of the eight. He was musically inclined and played in the band at the University of Georgia while he attended college there. After serving time in the Army during World War II, he became associated with General Motors Corporation. He worked as a representative for the company for many years. Shortly before his death in 1969, he had established an auto parts business for himself. He was living in Bogalusa, Louisiana, and had married Ella Rose Salmon Lewis of the same city.

Sam Terry was second in line. He served in the U. S. Coast Guard during the war. He had previously studied at Franklin Institute of Technology in Boston, Massachusetts. He has worked as an electrical engineer for many years. Sam married Louise Gloss, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Hardy Gloss of Cordele. They have two sons, Terry and Sammy. Terry married Sharon West of Clayton, Alabama, and Sammy married Veronica Wright of Gainesville, Georgia, and they have a little daughter, Bentley Lane. Terry is a school teacher in Clayton County and Sammy is a dentist in Rome, Georgia.

Violet Janann is number three, and being the oldest daughter, she, too, was a "little mother" for the rest of the brood. She took a secretarial course in Atlanta after graduating from high school. She is Vice-President of the Electronic Tabulating Service in Atlanta. She is married to William P. (Bill) Owen they have no children.

Next comes Mary Alice who has had an interesting and rewarding life. She was the peacemaker of the family. Mary has worked for the United States Government for many years. Though most of her work has been in Atlanta, she has been sent to Okinawa, Hawaii, Vietnam, and Panama on government assignments as well as assignments within the states. She has traveled extensively in foreign countries. Mary was free with her money and time in helping the rest of the family. She lives in Atlanta, Georgia.

Sarah Lee is the fifth child, and she was born into this world weighing fifteen pounds. What a baby! Even Dr. Dorsey was amazed and rode all the way back to Pitts to get his scales to see how much that baby actually weighed. She married Oscar H. Summers Jr., son of Mr and Mrs. Oscar H Summers Sr. and they have one son, Carden.

Next in line is Pansy Claire, an athlete in her high school and college days. She also attended Andrew College and returned there to teach physical education. She also taught in Sycamore, Vidalia, and Warner Robins. She married James E. (Jack) Briggs and they have two sons, Robert and Richard, who are in the seventh and ninth grades respectively. They live in Warner Robins, Georgia

Jimmie Ruth is the "baby girl" and seventh in the family line up. She married W. H. Williams, son of Mr. and Mrs. Willie Hiram Williams, and they have two children, a daughter, Vanessa, and a son, Colon.

Max Lindburgh is the eighth child, and he was very studios. After high school, he went to ABAC and onto the University of Georgia where he received his BSA degree in Agriculture. Max served two years in the Army. He carried on extensive farming operations in Crisp County before accepting a job with the Georgia Farm Bureau in Macon.

Tom Kimmie, baby of the nine, is a farmer and also a teacher in the Crisp County School System. He teaches agriculture at Crisp County High School. Tom received his BSA degree in Agriculture from the University of Georgia, and immediately afterward served two years in the Army. The most of the time was spent in Germany where he was a medic in the Veterinary Division. He married Annelle Israel, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Jesse Israel of Dawson, Georgia, who also taught school at Crisp County High School. They have three children: Mark a fifth grader, Kimmie a second grader and Janann who will be in kindergarten this fall.

Times were rather hard around the Jim Carden home trying to feed, clothe and keep nine children in school. The year that the oldest one entered college, the youngest one entered first grade at five years old. It was one big happy family with a devoted mama and daddy who tried to teach their children the guiding principles of right.

There was plenty of food and "Miss Lula" was the best of cooks. There was meat hanging in the smoke house all year long and that ham made the best red-eye gravy. Hog killing time was a big event at the Carden house making that sausage, liver pudding, souse meat, and drying up (?) something to be remembered. There was a pasture full of cattle though they were not worth much then. There was plenty of milk and butter and even the hogs were fed buttermilk and clabber. the yard was usually full of chickens, turkeys and guineas. Why, Miss Lula could grab a fryer off the yard at any time, dress it and have it on the table for dinner. Mr. Jim always planted a big garden and many jars of fruit and vegetables were canned for use in the winter time. Not too much of the food had to be bought. A 48 pound sack of flour would last about a week.

Everybody had to rise and shine by daylight and everybody had a job to do. The boys always tended to the animals, while the girls helped with the household chores. Miss Lula was a good seamstress and sewed for the entire family.

There was certain jobs that had to be done around the house. Wash day was any day. The real dirty clothes were soaked and beaten on the old bat'lin block with the bat'lin stick and then boiled with homemade soap in the wash pot. The rub board was used, too. It took "tons" of water drawn from the surface well to do that awful job. The floors had to be scrubbed every Saturday, rain or shine. A shuck was used. The yard had to be swept on Saturday, too. A brush broom made of gall berry bushes was used to sweep them. Never a sprig of grass was allowed to grow in the yard.

Mr. Jim had a two-horse crop and worked at the cotton gin also. The entire family worked in the fields. They chopped, hoed and picked cotton, shook and stacked peanuts, pulled corn, stripped cane, picked up sweet potatoes and even picked velvet beans, usually during the Thanksgiving holidays. The velvet beans were boiled in the wash pot to make them soft enough for the cows in the real cold weather.

The older children walked to Hatley School where nine grades were taught by four teachers. Later, they rode the bus to Pitts where eight of the nine went through the eleventh grade. Pansy graduated from East Crisp where she delighted in playing basketball.

Each year several of the children would have perfect attendance records. It was the policy if one was sick enough to miss school, he was sick enough for castor oil and such. Few days were missed. Tom never missed a day in his eleven years in public school. Both parents were determined that their children would get an education, and they did all they could to help.

The children studied by kerosene lamp, because electric lines were not run across the county lines until the late 30's. They lived just across the line in Wilcox County, so their Crisp County neighbors, a few yards away were using their sophisticated electric irons while the Cardens were still using the old "smoothing irons."

The first vehicle the family owned was a little red Willis pick-up truck, and it was second-handed. That thing was nothing but trouble. It got good gas mileage, because they pushed it about as much as it ran on its own power. Even that was better than the mules and wagon.

The family belonged to the Hatley Methodist Church, but attended the Baptist Church, also. The two churches were about the only social gatherings back then.

Miss Lula was a firm disciplinarian. She did not believe in "sparing the rod and spoiling the child." They could get around Mr. Jim sometimes, but not her. She was the best psychologist, nurse, doctor, teacher, "preacher," and everything else rolled up in one. She was never idle. By the time one job was completed she had another one started, usually involving the whole family.

Mr. Jim bought his first radio in the Hatley Community. Neighbors came on Saturday night to listen to it (usually the Grand Ole Opera). It was one of those battery contraptions and a fine thing it was!

Before the radio, the family would sit on the front porch at night and listen to Miss Lula tell stories about her ancestors and their many brave and daring experiences. Oh, how they loved those mysterious ghost stories, too!

The family was well blessed. The only real sickness they had was when Van and Tom had pneumonia and

another time when Mr. Jim, Jimmie Ruth, and Max were very ill with some kind of fever.

In 1945, Van had a new house built for his mother and father. It was built just across the line in Crisp County.

This story would not be complete without telling about Miss Lula's beautiful flower gardens. She could cut a bouquet almost any time of the year. She enjoyed sharing her flowers with friends and neighbors.

Words to describe Mr. Jim would be peace and contentment. He lived and let live. Words to describe Miss Lula would be determination and progressiveness as she was always pushing forward. Both enjoyed fishing and spent many hours doing just that after the children were grown. Working as always, Miss Lula died suddenly while shelling butter beans on July 28, 1960 and Mr. Jim died suddenly on September 13, 1971.

Notes for IVA ADELIN CARDEN:

Peddling Knowledge; by Iva Carden Blissitt 3/31/2001

To this day I recall that I wanted to be a teacher - a School teacher. Faint hope for people as poor as the Cardens in Hatley. Hatley is in Crisp Co., Georgia.

As I grew up there was a nine-grade school at every cross road in Crisp county, but no full fledged high school. One School in the county added a tenth grade every year and to get to Cordele High was a virtual impossibility for country students.

We Cardens lived on the Wilcox-Crisp county lines. Crisp county students could go to Wilcox county schools for a fee of six dollars per month. But who had six dollars during the horrible depression years? I started to Pitts High School after finishing the ninth grade. I had to drop out in March because we did not have tuition money and it was time to buy guano and seeds for the next crop.

I started again in the fall, but again in the '30's when time came to buy guano and seeds I had to drop out.

Well, in 1936 I started the tenth grade for the third time. My wonderful principal, J. R. Burgess Jr., called me to his office and said, "Don't quit this time before talking to me. I'll try to see you through and since you've gone so far twice before, I'm going to give you some credit. I am going to give you test over three subjects and if you pass them, I am going to give you the units for them."

I passed the subjects with good grades - got the credit and units and graduated with 19 units rather than the sixteen required then.

A cousin let my father borrow \$8.00 to pay for my class ring. My class of 31 graduated in May of 1937 (in cap and gown).

I went from Cordele to Cedartown after graduation to visit cousins, Lucy, David and S. M. Carden. While on the trip I took a job as an in-training nurse in a private hospital in Cedartown.

I met and married my husband in September of 1937. My, what a year 1937 was!

We lived with my husband's childless Aunt and Uncle - Lillian Blissitt Thacker and Earl L. Thacker. Neither of us had a job for six months. The pickings were mighty lean.

My husband worked on FDR's (Franklin D. Roosevelt) WPA program for about six months. Then he got a job with the county. His job was to guard convicts at work. My, how good a check seemed!

Then he went to work at the Goodyear Mill in Cedartown.

On February 26, 1939, we had our daughter, Nancy Jane Blissitt. She was named for her Blissitt great-grandmother, Nancy Jane Blissitt.

Four years later and several courses later, I had my wonderful son. His name : William Phillips Blissitt Jr., DOB 1/28/1943. We called him "Billy". When Billy was a year old my husband went to the U.S. Army to fight during WWII.

My dream of teaching was still burning! How? I heard that the extension service of the University of Georgia was conducting a class in Cedartown and it would cost \$16.00.

Where was I going to get \$16.00? I asked my aunt to keep my baby so I could go to some fields and pick cotton to get \$16.00. She agreed and I picked cotton. I was paid \$.50 for every one hundred pounds I picked. I usually got 250 pound in a day and one day i got three hundred pounds, but I managed to get my \$16.00 plus \$2.00 to pay on my books.

The course was History of the South. The book was \$4.00. Believe me, divine guidance intervened. A teacher asked me if I wanted to share a book. For \$2.00 each, we bought the book and shared it. I made 84 on the course! My first college course!

In 1940 I heard that tests were being given in Rome, Georgia for people who were interested in enumerating the Federal Government Census. I went to Rome, took the test, and got an appointment to do the census in the Cedartown district.

This job was an education in itself. When the check came I was so delighted! Frankly, I didn't know there was that much money at the mint!

My mother agreed to keep my daughter in the summer of 1940 so I could go to summer school at Georgia Evening College (forerunner to Georgia State). I loaded up with four courses and since classes at Georgia Evening College could not begin until 4:00 P.M., I went to Emory University and enrolled in the Demonstration School which gave two credits (or 10 quarter hours). I managed to pass all 6 courses. When I went to get my 2-year Teacher's Certificate, the lady in charge (Janie Hearn) looked at my record and said, "My God, you can't do 6 courses in ten weeks - "Well", I said, "I just did."

And the War of Wars (WWII) came along. Help was needed everywhere so I left school for a whole quarter met with the second shift crew to work in the mill. The mill was making linings for tires for military equipment. Two jobs!

I went on Saturdays to Jacksonville Alabama State College. I did three courses in one year - they all were accepted in Georgia toward my A. B. degree. I did a few night classes in Marietta, Georgia through the AAETES program. AAETES was Atlanta Area Teachers Educational Studies. It was sponsored by the University of Georgia.

When my husband had to go to war, I quit the mill. However, I did what I could to help the war efforts as roll bandages for the wounded, go to pray for our men and women in uniform.

Food was scarce and I worked several summers in connection with Extension Service. I operated the local

Cannery. This was so interesting and satisfying.

One time while I was at Georgia Evening College, my husband lost a job. I was in the middle of a semester - no job- no money - board due. Well, I went to the State Employment Office and got in line with lots of men and a few women looking for work. When I reached the clerk he said, "I can't give you any encouragement." I replied "I'm looking not looking for encouragement. I'm looking for a job."

As he filled out the application he asked if I knew the Carden man who bought and sold chicken and eggs in Crisp County. I said "he is my grandfather."

The clerk said my grandfather took him into an organization (secret). He found me a job. He said I would not like it, but it would pay me \$15.00 a week. It was sorting dirty clothes at the Briarcliff Laundry. Well, I guaranteed him I could sort dirty clothes. This facility was owned by Mr. S. Candler. He raised my pay to \$20.00 per week in a short while.

I also wrote papers and did research for other students to get college money.

I went to work as a teacher in 1940. I was given an 8th grade with 25 students. It was a self-contained class. Some of the boys were well passed the age for the grade. There were nine grades at Fish Creek School, Polk Co., Georgia at the time. This was the last year the 8th and 9th grades were taught at Fish Creek.

During my first year at Fish Creek, my principal was fired for drinking on the job. I was a told I had to be in charge of the basketball team and take them to the county tournament. I did. We won!

I worked lots of Saturdays in a 5 and 10 cents store. I used the \$2.00 I earned on Saturday to pay for my daughter's and my school lunches the next week.

I tutored some children for pay and lots of them for free.

When I did all the college work I could count toward a degree by extension and correspondence, I began pulling it all together. Georgia Evening College gave degrees only in Business Administration, so I transferred to Oglethorpe University.

When my work was transferred to Oglethorpe University everything I had done was accepted. So, I did my senior year at Oglethorpe and graduated in 1946 with an A.B. degree. I majored in education.

When I was 26 years old, I was sent to Antioch School as its principal. I was daring enough to try anything I thought would work. It's a shame we must become afraid of some of the nonsense consequences.

When I went out to Antioch to look around - as I was going to be its principal, a man in the community came to me and said, "Are you what Buck Anderson sent here for our principal?"

I said, "Yes sir, I am that very thing." He retorted by saying, "We'll have a man here before opening date." "That's all right," I said. "I'll be here on these steps and get nine checks." Incidentally, this man became one of my strongest helpers in our community activities.

It was at Antioch that I learned a new term for cursing. The child came in and said, "That boy cussed me!" I asked, "What did he say?" He replied, "He called ma a fat-so."

We lost a lovely, wonderful little student in the 5th grade. He died from a ruptured intestine he received at home one weekend while playing football. It was a sad occasion.

After three years at Antioch, I was transferred back to Fish Creek as principal where I remained for the next 19 years.

I continued the education process. I enrolled at the University of Georgia in Athens to work on a Master's degree. Here we go again - night classes, Saturday classes, and a Master's in Education in 1953. (And not too many thoughts since.)

In 1966, we moved from Polk Co., Georgia to Decatur, Georgia. Once in the Atlanta area, I was given the job as head (principal) of the school at the Fulton County Juvenile Court. We dealt with children from Atlanta and Fulton County.

When asked if we ever "followed up" on our children, I replied, "Oh Gee! We don't ever catch up!" This was a great experience. Sad, indeed! But, eye opening.

One case that was so amusing to me was the case of the young (13 years old) girl who was brought with her baby girl into court. I attended the hearing with the girl. The father, an 18 year old, was brought over from county jail to stand trial. The young girl was very unlearned and ignorant and could not give a good testimony. The mother of the 18 year old father laughed and made as much fun of the girl as the court would allow. Judge Elmo Holt told the male's mother many times to sit down and stop the laughing. He finally said, "I'm charging your son with statutory rape. Now laugh that one, off."

The young girl cried very hard. She and I walked together back to the school area. I asked, "Why are you crying?" She said, "The judge sent him back to county jail and he didn't rape me." I asked if she knew the meaning of statutory rape. Well, she didn't, and I explained that he had said over and over he didn't love her.

She asked, "Mrs. Blissitt, what would you do?" I replied, "In your case, I'd ask the judge to put him in the electric chair." She said, "Mrs. Blissitt, I know what's wrong with you." "What," I asked. "You just don't know what true love is!" I said, "If what you've got is true love, I don't want to know."

Later when I told this story to Judge Holt we had a good laugh. And Judge Holt often asked me, "Blissitt, have you found out about true love yet?"

Once I had a young man in the school office for fighting. The fight took place on the campus at recess. I asked "Freddie Joe, what have I told you about fighting?" "Well, Miss Blissitt, you just don't understand." "what is it I don't understand?" I asked. He said when I'm mad, I'm mad all over."

While serving as principal of a school in Polk County, I had two little girls have a fight at recess on Friday afternoon. I had them come in the office and listen to my sermon on "No fighting - Be a lady."

On Monday morning, the father of one of the girls who was fighting came into the school office and demanded to see the little girl who had fought his daughter. "Say what?" I asked. He replied, "You didn't Whup her Friday." "No," I said, "and I didn't whip yours either." He continued his threats and quarrelsome remarks until I said, "You get out of here before I have to call Lester Litesey or John Redding to take you out." (Lester was a funeral director and John was the county Sherriff.)

Indeed, I had a wonderful time at my job! Wonderful kids and great parents and Oh! Such lovely co-teachers. I will not call teacher's names lest I leave out some good ones. I truly worked with some great ones.

No one could have worked with finer lunchroom people or custodians. My bus drivers were mostly good.

I hear from some very wonderful people now who have beautiful success stories to tell. All in all, I am grateful for the opportunity I had in the field of education.

As I peddled the knowledge, I did it very seriously. No teacher ever enjoyed it more!
