Dear Sir:

In re W. A. Cook:

Your letter of some days ago came during my absence from the office. Mr. Cook died at the Soldiers' Home Saturday morning, December 26th; he had both asthma and tuberculosis. The nurse said he could hardly talk so as to be understood from the time he entered the Home. He was buried at the Soldiers Home Cemetery; funeral was in charge of the Bate Chapter of the United Daughters, and Dr. O. B. Johnson, Methodist Minister preached the funeral; the ladies carried flowers. Markers are placed at the graves, they have the date of birth, date of death, name of soldier, Reg., and Company designated.

The Superintendent told me that Mr. Cook was one of the best, and most genteel old man, at the Home.

If there is anything further you desire to learn about his death, let me know.

When Wilhelm Bramerloh was a young man in Germany he was in the German Army, because of military conscription. He was in the army of occupation in Alsace-Lorraine, a region in northeastern France on the French- German border. The two areas, Alsace- Lorraine, have long been a prize in wars between France and Germany.

According to my father, Frederick Wilhelm Bramerloh, his father never finished getting his naturalization papers processed, and therefore was never a citizen of the U.S.

At home they spoke of a brother to Wilhelm, whose name was Dick. He came to the U.S. also and used Wilhelm's papers to visit Germany and then return to the U.S.

There were other Bramerloh's in the Dittmer/Oermann, Missouri area. These "other" Bramerloh's were not closely related to Wilhelm and Dick. We never visited in each others homes (they were forty-second cousins). As I recall their names were Ida, Bertha, Bill, Herman, and two other brothers.

On the deed to the Bramerloh farm, the property was acquired from Thomas Fisher by warranty deed dated May 1, 1877.

According to a book I have (Ellis Island) Grandpa probably came in through a state run facility called Castle Garden opened in 1855. Ellis Island was built about 1892. At home our parents spoke of Grandpa Bramerloh coming to the U.S. by way of New York City, N.Y. I have a picture of a man and a lady identified as Bramerloh first cousins who remained in New York City, N.Y.

Wilhelm Bramerloh's wife's maiden name was Stulken. She told me the German pronunciation was Sturick. Grandma Stulken's maiden name was Heimsuldt. All of Grandma's brothers and sisters were born in the U.S. but the parents were born in Germany. My father told me that all the Germans in the Oermann, Dittmer, Cedar Hill area spoke low-German as opposed to high-German. The difference being the area of Germany people were born.

I believe Wilhelm Bramerloh came from a farming area in Germany, because of the farm practices my father described him as using. Millersville was supposedly the name of his birthplace; but my eldest son and his wife say that cannot be. Millersville is a French name.

Wilhelm Bramerloh and Annie Stulken Bramerloh were both bilingual. My dad was also; but then practically all of the people in the Oermann-Dittmer-Cedar Hill, Missouri area who were my dad's and grandparent's age spoke both German and English fluently.

Some of the fruit trees (apple, peach, and cherry) were still producing when I was a small child, and these trees had been planted by Wilhelm. He and Grandma Bramerloh raised sheep. Grandma corded the wool and Grandpa knitted his own socks. According to my mother

Margaret Statir Bramerloh, Wilhelm washed his own wool socks in cold water.

The above information was supplied in a letter to my mother-in-law, Elvira Crull Noonan, from her cousin Shirley. I have the original letter.

same information of Volkert Dirckse, Kirck Holgerson, Guillame Vigne, etc. that I have so I will not forward this to you.

The only case where I have questions pertains to the parents of Rachel Fulkerson. I am fully aware that there have been discussions over the years about whether her mother was Nancy Martin or Patience Poteet.

Nancy Martin is recorded in the bible of Rachel Fulkerson and Joseph Gray as being her mother. This bible is currently in the possession of Ron Walker (great-grandson of Brice Weaks). I have attached a copy of the information recorded in this bible. The naming of two their two children (Martin and Nancy), by Rachel and Joseph would also seem to point to Nancy Martin as being her mother. I have some additional information on this subject that will be mailed to you.

Dear Tom

Here is a proposed transcription of the Joseph Gray/Rachel Fulkerson Bible. Before I took pictures of it, Ron has photographed it using a digital camera and e-mailed them to me. I think there were thirty or more and it has been a real problem for my old computer and software to handle them. He took each name individually which was very Good but and I was unable to tell the order in which they went. But his digital pictures were much better than my photographs. He said the digital pictures even made clear some things which were very faint. So this transcription relied very heavily on the digital pictures.

Unfortunately, I have done this sort of thing several times before,

including a Civil War Diary of one of my Holder ancestors. It is virtually impossible to copy what is hand written into a typed form because the hand and pen are not bound by any rules while the typewriter and word processor must go in a straight line. I have tried to be as accurate as possible, even to individual periods and commas but have taken a few small liberties in the interest of clarity.

I have previously also transcribed a Holder Bible which listed some people several times and gave them different dates of birth each time. At least one name was spelled three different ways. There were also some dates and facts which did not agree with other good sources. After dithering about the problem for awhile, I decided that I was obligated to type the bible record exactly as written (as near as I could tell) and but felt I could properly mention the differences or other problems in footnotes.

You will notice some things in parentheses. Try as I might, with digital and regular photos and a very strong loupe and bright light, I could not make some things out or was not perfectly certain. A few things I changed back and forth several times because I felt differently on the several times I proofed the transcription. I did not, as much as I would have liked, flip a coin. But for one or two things, I might just as well have.

I would like the transcription to be as accurate as possible. You and Ron may be able to compare the transcription with the original and make some corrections. I have a very thick skin. And, even after proofing this several times, I don't doubt that there may be typos left somewhere, but wanted to get this to you in plenty of time for your use.

I don't know what I can do at my end to put this e-mail into a particular word processing program for you. With my computer, I can save an incoming e-mail to my desk top or a file and then open it with the word processing program I want to use. Hopefully you can do the same thing.

I hope you have a great Fourth and enjoy your get togethers. I wish I could be there also.

to be laid off of the south east corner of the track that I now live on to make the amount of four hundred and fifty seven acres also two negro girls, Hamely and Ruth and their children. 5th I give and bequeath to my son Frederick Powell Gray, my negro man named Jordon in place of his proportion of my land. I also give him two negro boys Burrelo and Benjamin. 6th I give and bequeath to my daughter Mary Virginia Traylor four hundred and fifty seven acres of land whereon she now lives including the land between Big and Little Elk Creeks also I give her two negro girls Charlott and Leethy and their children. The balance that she may get from my estate after my death and the death of my wife. It is my will that she have it in her own right independent of her husband, or any person else and at her death to go to her children if she has any ---- if she has no children to be equally divided between her two brothers and sisters.

7th I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Rachel Gray the track of land that I now live on and all the negros that I now have or may have at my death. Reynoldsborg, at one time the county seat, has long since passed out of existence as a town, and nothing remains but the old court house, which is occupied by Thomas Wylie as a residence. All the houses were destroyed or fell into decay and dilapidation after the county seat was removed, and the land on which the town once stood is now a fertile farm, yielding large crops of corn and peanuts each year. Among the citizens of Reynoldsborg were John and Robert Thompson, William Tooker, the Wylies, D. P. and Royal Hudson, Elisha Turner, Peter Black, Henry Pugh, Stephen Harris and Benjamin Hudson. The Wylies were the merchants of the town, and were probably the first of the county.

All of Humphreys County was granted by the State of North Carolina at the time this was a portion of that State, to survivors of the Continental war, and was afterward farmed out in smaller tracts to the settlers as they arrived from the older States. Among the military land grants issued were the following: Jesse Rodgers, John Thompson, Kemps Crawley, Cass, Madlock and Louis Bairfield came from North Carolina, and settled in the vicinity of what afterward was the site of Reynoldsborg. During the period between the years 1810 and 1820 land was granted to citizens of Humphreys County by the State of Tennessee as follows: Robert Thompson, 320 acres.

The old fashioned corn-mill constructed of two stones and a hollow log was used at first, but soon gave way to the water-power mill. The water was conveyed from the creek to the mill through a race, and the old fashioned water-wheel was used. The building was a small, square, low log house, with a pole roof and no floor. From ten to twelve bushels of grist was an average day's grinding, and a toll of one-eighth was charged. Other mills of that day were James Lattimer's, on White Oak Creek, John Brown's on Lewis' Branch, Robert Thompson's on Big Richland Creek, and John McFall's on Harman's Branch. The chairmen of the county court since the year 1842, that being as far back as the records go, have been as follows: John Thompson, 1814-25.

This would be their home for the next few years, and the surrounding land would remain in the family for many years later. James and Mary had one more son, James, in September 1771.

One of the many events leading toward American independence took place at this time and appears to be associated with James' decision to move to the Holston River area. Many North Carolina residents had engaged in a popular uprising against excessive taxes, known as the "Regulator Insurrection." It coincided with other events of the time, including the Stamp Act rebellion and the Boston Tea Party. When this movement was finally put down by the British in 1771, hundreds of North Carolina colonists moved north into the region that is now southwest Virginia and southeast Tennessee. On arrival these settlers negotiated a ten-year lease with the Cherokees for the land they occupied, and in 1772 drew up a compact of government called the "Watauga Association," mutually binding themselves to observe their own set of laws. A general committee of 13 was elected to fulfill legislative duties, and among themselves chose five members to perform executive and judicial functions. While they did not make a statement as dramatic or well-known as the Declaration of Independence, they had certainly ceased to recognize British authority.

A local historical account tells this a little differently, but perhaps just from a different perspective:

"In 1770, Peter Livingston became the first settler in the Hiltons area when he established a farm on the North Fork of the Holston River at the mouth of Livingston Creek, about nine miles northeast of present-day Hiltons. With the arrival two years later of Abraham and James Fulkerson, who settled nearby at Dowell Gap, the first permanent settlement was begun."

In 1773 James and Mary moved an hour's ride away and built their final house near present day Burson's Corner in Wahington County. They had seven more children between 1775 and 1791: John, Isaac, Frederick, Mary, Catherine, Thomas and Abram. Isaac moved west to Kentucky and then to Missouri with Daniel Boone in 1814. He built his home there with the aid of Boone Hays,

Daniel's grandson [b. 1783]. Abram married Margaret Laughlin Vance, daughter of Samuel Vance.

Among his sons were Colonel Samuel Vance Fulkerson and Colonel Abram Fulkerson. Several of their children, including Abram, later lived in their own houses on the extended family farm.

In 1774 the court ordered a Benjamin Logan to cut a road from James Fulkerson's place to the wagon road at George Black's. Black's fort was about twelve miles to the northeast in a settlement called Wolf Hills (so named by Daniel Boone when he was bothered by wolves living in a nearby cave). That settlement is now the city of Abingdon.

Three years later, the court ordered a study of a road from George Black's and past James Fulkerson's land to the forks in the path leading to Kentucky and the mouth of Reedy Creek . Late in 1777 the court authorized James to build the road. This road extended about twenty five miles southwest of his place to the community of Long Island [just east of where Highway 181 crosses the Holston River in modern-day Kingport, Tennessee. This "Reedy Creek Road" was the forerunner of part of modern-day US 11.]

ISAAC FULKERSON was the seventh son of Capt. James FULKERSON, born August 9, 1776. Capt. James married Mary VAN HOOK in 1764 and settled his family in Washington County, Virginia. He commanded a company in CAMPBELL'S Regiment during the American Revolution, and took part in the Battle of King's Mountain in which the British were defeated on October 7, 1780. When Isaac was fourteen, his 23-year-old brother Jacob was killed by Indians while he was out searching for wild horses.

Isaac married Rebecca NEIL, of Lee County, Virginia, in 1799. They lived in Kentucky for a time, then moved west with Daniel BOONE in 1814. They settled in Darst Bottom, St. Charles Co., Missouri.

(It must be pointed out that Daniel BOONE was 80 years old in 1814. He had followed his son, Daniel Morgan BOONE to Missouri in 1799, when it was under Spanish rule. After the Louisiana Purchase he lost his Spanish land titles and returned to Kentucky. BOONE died in St. Charles County, Missouri in September of 1820, aged 86.)

Another quote from the Missouri Historical Review:

"Boone HAYS (grandson of Daniel BOONE) helped construct the Fulkerson stone house still standing. It was built with small windows near the ceilings and massive doors to guard against the Indians. The cellar was very deep, had two floors and was built to store provisions against a siege. Here during the fall months huge barrels of buttermilk were stored for drinking and making biscuits during the winter; and the temperature was such that it kept perfectly. Wine, malt, spirits, sauerkraut, jerked deer, buffalo tongue, bear bacon, and a thousand other things were stored there also."

Abram moved in 1835, to Grainger County, Tennessee, where he continued the pursuit of farming. He was a justice of the peace for a number of years, and was a man of high esteem among the people of his county.

in 1657 as being the eight-year-old "servant" and possibly a stepson of Jan de Perie - in that same year, Dirck Volckertszen stabbed de Perie in an argument about a dice game. Also, by coincidence (?) many of Jan and Aeltje's descendants - under the new "English" surname of BLAW, BLAUW or BLAU - moved to the Somerville-Raritan area of Somerset County, New Jersey. One descendant, a Margaret FISHER, married John FULKERSON in 1821.

Volkert and Dinah moved their family to Somerset County, New Jersey, where his father and two uncles were operating a mill. Volkert's father Dirck Volkertse died in 1754, aged 87. It appears

that Volkert stayed in New Jersey long enough to see his father's estate settled - he didn't get much out of it, as he already owed his father money, but the will did name Volkert's ten children for

posterity. Volkert then determined to move his family south to less crowded regions in the Carolinas. However, Volkert died near the Virginia-North Carolina border, sometime around 1755. Dinah continued the journey with her family and arrived in Rowan County, North Carolina. There they reestablished their roots, many of them obtaining large properties.

I leave the use of all my estate, real and personal to my wife Dinah, which is not already given to my sons by deed of sale, also, 150, and she is to have an equal proportion with my daughters in all my estate, to be at her disposal, 'but among my children'. And she shall pay to my daughters, Greta, Dinah, Elizabeth, and Analche, when they are married, or of age, equal to what my daughter Mary Probasco hath received. After my wife's deceased my house and lands and meadows and rights are to be sold at vendue among my children. If my wife should die before my youngest daughter is capable of earning her own living, 'something is to be allowed for her bringing up'. If either of my sons, John, Henry, Frederick, should die without issue, the rest shall inherit his share. As I have given to my son Frederick by deed, land in the Jerseys I leave him, 5, 'and when he shall come of age to work upon his land in ye Jerseys, my son Henry is to allow him a years board if he is single.' John Collier's signature is on a petition presented in open court by the Rev. John Dibdall and signed by abt seventy others. See Surry Co Bk 1, pg 4, Nov 7, 1652. For his signature to carry legal weight, John would have had to be at least 21 yrs of age. If this is John, husband of Mary Sowerby, and not an earlier

generation, then he was much older than she, and a contemporary of her father's. There is the possibility that this John Collier was a SR and the one who married Mary in 1668 was a JR. There is no concrete evidence that Thomas Collier was John's father, however he did name his eldest son Thomas, which is in keeping with the family's tradition of naming the first son after the father's father. Research into this will continue, but at the moment I am inclined to believe that there was only one John Collier, and he was the son of Thomas, and was almost 20 yrs older than his wife.

In 1668, Edward Collier (Collie) of Charles City, VA names John as Attorney in Account for a bill of sale to

Richard Rogers of 200 acres on Chippoakes Creek and refers to him as his "loving cousin" (at this time, cousin could also mean "nephew"), see Surry Co Bk. 1, pg 143.

An inventory of John's estate was filed on 27 May, 1676, recorded in Deed Bk 1661-1674, pg 151.

Another inventory was filed as follows:

COLLIER, John: Est. - adm. by John King. 15 Nbr, 1677 . "There appeared in Court Mary Rawlin, ye relict of above, and certified to the inventory as being correct." Bk. 2, p. 15.

Mary Collier granted administration of the estate on 24 Apr, 1678 - Bk 2, pg. 169.

Still another inventory was recorded in Bk 2, pg 211 by John Rawlings in 1679 in which the estate was

divided among John's orphans named as Thomas, John, Joseph and Mary.

Notes for Mary Sowerby:

Mary was most likely the daughter of Thomas Sowerby and his wife, Anna Lee. This is suggested by the fact that the Sowerbys witnessed the marriage contract on 24 Sept 1677 between Mary and her second husband, John Rawlings, son of John and Eleanor Rawlings of Surry Co, and by a deed of gift of one yearling from Thomas Sowerby to Mary's son, John Collier Jr. Another son, Thomas Collier, petitioned the court and was granted the right to live with Thomas Sowerby in 1683. Deed Bks 1671-1674, pg 172 and Bk. 2, pg 15.

Mary and John Rawlings had two children, John Rawlings, Jr and Elizabeth, who are named in Anna Lee

Sowerby Jordan's will in 1697. They also had a son, Gregory Rawlings. John Rawlings grandparents were Gregory Rawlings I and Jane LEE, so it would appear that Mary Sowerby and John Rawlings were probably cousins.

In 1783, Thomas petitioned the court to live in the household of Thomas Sowerby. He was a Justice of the County Court in 1714 and High Sheriff of Surry Co in 1720. Information from the book Southside Virginia Families by John Bennett Boddie 1956.

Christine, sometimes called Christina, was born about 1610-1613. This would have made her somewhere between ten and fourteen years old when she arrived in America. Little has been written about her, other than that she married Dirck in 1630 or 1631. Dirck and Christine lived in her parents' household until 1638. She was a sponsor in baptisms at the Dutch Reformed Church in 1643 and 1650. The rest of her story must be inferred from what we know about her husband and children. Her last child, Jennekin, was born in 1653. There was no further record of her after 1663, although she may have lived into the 1670's.

Notes for Guillame Vigne:

The Walloons were French-speaking Protestants from the southern Netherlands region that is

now Belgium and northern France. In the 1500's and 1600's it was subjected to protracted wars involving Holland, France and Spain. A 12-year truce beginning in 1609 provided some respite, but the truce was not renewed when it expired in 1621. Another unsettling factor in that region was the desire of the Catholic French monarchy to convert or kill the Protestant population living within and along its borders. Many non-Catholics fled after having their property confiscated.

Guillaume and Adrienne were born in Valenciennes about 1586-1590. They married sometime around 1610, and emigrated to Holland by 1623. In that year they were in the city of Leiden, which was a protective and tolerant haven from war and prejudice. After they began living among the Dutch, the Vigne name was changed to Vienje. Guillaume became known as Willem Vienje and Adrienne as Ariantje Vienje. [The "-je" ending in the Dutch version of their name was also pronounced as "-yeh."]

The Vignes were one of 30 Walloon families selected by the Dutch West India Company to establish a permanent settlement in New Netherlands [New York, New Jersey, Delaware and Connecticut]. The original Company plan was to send only five or six men to set up a fur trading post on Manhattan Island. The addition of the Walloon families may have been a late change to the plans. Perhaps the families volunteered when they heard of the colonization plans. After all, the Walloons were a displaced people who had become refugees in crowded little Holland. There was no land available to them - the Dutch had run out of land and had just started to reclaim land from the sea. It is possible that Adrienne and Guillaume may have had advance information about the New Netherlands region, according to the "New Netherlands Connections" published by Dorothy A. Koenig:

"Nancy Fulkerson Hill wrote to the Algemeen Rijksarchief in the Hague [to find] whatever documents exist in The Netherlands about the ship Tijger [Tiger] known to be in New Netherland waters in 1614 under the command of Adriaen Block...[they referred her] to notarial documents held by the Gemeentearchief in Amsterdam."

"Pim Nieuwenhuis investigated these notarial documents only to discover that they had already been translated into English and published in 1959 by the City of Amsterdam Press under the title, The Prehistory of the New Netherland Company: Amsterdam Notarial Records of the First Dutch Voyages to the Hudson by Simon Hart ..."

On page 22 Dr. Hart asks rhetorically, Who were the merchants in the [Van Tweenhuysen Company] which sent Adriaen Block on his voyages? Besides Arnout Vogels and Francoys Pelgrom, there were Leonard, Paulus and Steffan Pelgrom -- brothers of Francoys ... [The] four Pelgrom brothers were children of Gheeraert Pelgrom ...[whose] first wife Anthonia van Dijcke died...[and who]... remarried to Susanna Cuvelier. From this marriage Paulus and Steffan Pelgrom were born..."

If Adrienne Cuvelier was related to Susanna Cuvelier, she and Guillaume could have had first-hand information about the Hudson River area through her relatives.

The Vignes are believed to have sailed from Holland in April of 1624 on the "Nieuw Nederlandt" [or possibly on the "Eendracht," which means "Unity"]. Some of the other colonists, including Joris Janszen Rapaelje, were also from Valenciennes. The Vignes had three daughters, Christine, Maria and Rachel, when they sailed to America. Most of the 30 families must have had children, as the total number of new colonists was about 120. Upon reaching the Hudson River in mid-May, they found a French ship that was trying to claim the territory for the king of France. With the help of a smaller Dutch ship that arrived from the West Indies, they politely aimed their cannons and escorted the French ship out to sea. Cornelis May, captain of the "Nieuw Nederlandt," became the first Director of the New Netherlands colony.

Eight men were left at Manhattan to "take possession." A dozen families were deposited at the Delaware and Connecticut Rivers, and 18 families were taken up the Hudson to a site near present-day Albany. The first news back to Holland was that, "Everything was in good condition. The colony began to advance bravely, and to live in friendship with the natives." However, most of the families began their residence in the new land by digging seven feet into the ground to make wood-lined, bark covered shelters. They did not begin to build wooden homes until 1625. We don't know whether the Vignes spent their first year at the Albany, Connecticut River or Delaware River settlements.

In 1625, the Company sent over another ship with 103 head of cattle and off-loaded them on Manhattan Island. Along with the cattle came some home builders and more settlers, who were directed to establish six bouweries [farms] on Manhattan. Engineers began constructing Fort Amsterdam near the southern tip of the island, and laying out the streets for the town of New Amsterdam. The colonists who had been deposited at the Connecticut and Delaware Rivers were brought back to Manhattan Island. They were too few in number to be in such isolated locations. Over the next three years, all of the Albany settlers trickled back to Manhattan. In 1626 Peter Minuit [also a Walloon] arrived as the new Director. He brought more colonists and bought the rest of Manhattan Island from the Indians for 60 guilders' worth of minor trade items. By the end of 1628 there were roughly 275 people in and around New Amsterdam.

The Vignes established their Manhattan farm north of what is now Wall Street, along the East River. In 1624 or 1625, not long after their arrival, their son Jan was born. He was the first European male born in New Netherlands. [The first European girl born in New Netherlands was Sara Rapaelje, in June 1625.] Guillaume died about 1632. His two oldest daughters had already married by that time, Christine to Dirck Volckertzen, and Maria to Jan Roos. He left his wife with two minor children.

Notes for Maria Vigne:

Maria was born about 1613, probably in France but possibly in Holland. Maria married Jan Roos about 1631. They had one son, Gerrit Jansen Roos. Franklin Roosevelt descended from this son [his great-great granddaughter married Isaac Roosevelt in 1726]. Jan died about 1632.

In 1634 she married Abraham Ver Planck. Abraham may have just arrived that year [he was possibly a cousin of J.A. Planck, who witnessed the antenuptial agreement above]. Maria and Abraham lived at the Vigne household until Damen took over. They bought land across the Hudson at Paulus Hook [now Jersey City]. They had a farm and two cows, and leased four acres to two tobacco planters.

The 1643 Indian war forced Maria and Abraham to seek the safety of the fort at Manhattan. The family continued to own the land at Paulus Hook until 1699, but never went back there to live. They bought a lot from brother-in-law Van Tienhoven at Smits Vly in 1649, near Pearl Street and Maiden Lane, and built a house there. They no longer farmed, but leased their land holdings and entered into the fur trade. This business took Abraham up the Hudson and down to the Delaware River. In 1664, when the English fleet showed up on the Hudson River, Abraham was one of the signers of the petition requesting that Peter Stuyvesant surrender. A fight with the English would have destroyed New Amsterdam. The people were more interested in keeping their homes than keeping Stuyvesant as their leader. He fell onto financial hard times in the 1680's, although he still owned lots in New York City which his heirs sold in a 1699 indenture. Maria died in 1689, and Abraham in 1691. She had ten children, the first by Jan ROOS.

Notes for Rachel Vigne:

The youngest daughter, Rachel, was born in Leiden, Holland, and was baptized on March 16, 1623 at the Leiden Walloon Church. Translation from French: "Baptized 16 March 1623 [n.s.], Rachel daughter of Guillain Vigne'. Witnesses Henri Lambert, Pierre de Fuche, and Marguerite Vigne'."

In 1639 Rachel had the misfortune to marry Cornelis Van Tienhoven. Although he was a highly-placed Dutch West India Company official, he turned out to be a murdering, philandering scoundrel. Cornelis drowned or absconded in 1656, leaving Rachel a 33-year-old widow with three young children and pregnant with a fourth. He also left a great deal of property and three houses.

In 1657 Peter Stuyvesant initiated the Burgher system [long used in Holland] which established 2 privileged classes: the Small Burghers and Great Burghers. Small Burghers had the right to engage in business. Great Burghers could conduct business and were exempt from common arrest. Many citizens [including Abraham Ver Planck] paid the 20-guilder fee to become Small Burghers; Rachel was among the 20 who paid 50 guilders and passed Stuyvesant's scrutiny to become Great Burghers. Her privilege did not protect her against everything. She died in 1663 at the young age of 40. Rachel had two children who survived childhood.
