

Descendants of Adam Crump

Generation No. 1

1. ADAM² CRUMP (*JAMES*¹) was born Abt. 1699 in co. Meath, Ireland, and died Abt. 1750 in Lancaster Co., Virginia. He married (1) ANNA BARBARA MCCARTY 1734, daughter of DANIEL MCCARTY and ELIZABETH POPE. She was born 30 Nov 1700 in Richmond County, VA (Source: <http://hometown.aol.com/wgreen19/index.html>), and died 12 Dec 1737 in Stafford County, VA (Source: Bill Hailey's book, "Arkansas Hills to the Texas Plains" - June 1993. Also (GHS King, Reg. of St. Paul's Parish 1715-1798).). He married (2) HANNAH BUSHROD 06 Aug 1742 in Lancaster Co., Virginia (Source: Bill Hailey's book, "Arkansas Hills to the Texas Plains" - June 1993. And, "The Marriage License Bonds of Lancaster Co, VA from 1701 - 1848", by: Stratton Nottingham, Clearfield Pub Co., Inc. & Genealogical Pub. Co, Balt, 1992), daughter of JOHN BUSHROD and HANNAH KEENE. She was born Abt. 1718 in Westmorland County, Virginia (Source: Neli O'Hara, Vallejo, CA), and died 22 Feb 1774 in Lancaster Co., Virginia.

Notes for ADAM CRUMP:

On 24 March, 1729, Adam Crump witnessed the will of William Lenthall, Dublin, Esq., in Dublin, Ireland. The will was also witnessed by Nicholas Ricard and Samuel Graham, both of Dublin. Nicholas was a Witness to the Memorial after Lenthall died in Oct 1732, but Adam was not - he was already in America!

It is probable, but unconfirmed, that Adam's father, James, was a son of either Richard or Adam Crump whom both had their property forfeited in the Williamite Confiscations of 1702-03, and that Adam, being one of the younger sons of James, saw that there was no future for him in Ireland. Perhaps he viewed the new world of America as an opportunity for him. It is also assumed that his brother, Patrick, was the Patrick Crump who was Commander of the ship "Tryal" that sailed from Philadelphia in Nov. 1738 as per Ben Franklin's Pennsylvania Gazette: "Ship TRYAL, Patrick Crump, Commander-Will sail for Ireland; for passage agree with Messers Thomas Robinson and John Erwin, at Mr. Lambert Emerson's, looking for glass-maker, in Front St., Phila. (Nov.)". [Note: No other Patrick Crump is found in the Colonies or in Ireland during this period]. Adam could have arrived on one of Patrick's voyages, or by way of the Caribbean, where a number of other Crumps had been in residence since the late 1600's. Another brother, Nicholas, was a priest in the Caribbean, on Montsuratt. [Note: No other Nicholas Crump is found in Ireland, America or the Caribbean during the period]. No record has been found of Adam's entry to this country, but, as we will see later, his will was filed in Dublin in 1750, marking him as the Adam, son of James, of Dublin. Adam's brother John is assumed to be the John Crump mentioned in the will of Dr. George Crump, who died on Antigua in the West Indies in 1756, who instructed his executors and administrators to purchase provisions from John Crump, Merchant in Dublin. John, the eldest, would have inherited his father's land and business, and appears to have continued to live and do business in Dublin.

On 23 Feb., 1732, Adam Crump witnessed the will of William Martin of Charles County, MD (Baldwin, Maryland Calender of Wills, Vol. 6, pp 220). The will of a William Martin of Cecil County, MD, dated 7 Nov., 1733 has bequeths to two cousins, John and Francis Crumpos, son and daughter of Betholome Crumpos (Baldwin, MD. Wills, Vol. 7, pp 13, Cecil Co.). It is unknown at this date whether the two William Martins are the same, or even related. The name "Crumpos" does not exist in this country except for this reference, and it is believed that the name is probably Crump, but no other information is known of Betholome or his family. Cecil County was originally Talbot county and the home of the William Crump who had married Frances Mountney, where he and Frances had migrated from Lancaster County, VA, in the mid 1660's. Frances Mountney's mother, Hannah Boyle (Pendley) Hill Spillman Mountney had patented land with Edwin Conway, I, in Lancaster on the Corotoman River in the 1650's, but no relationship is yet proved between this William and Adam.

In 1734, Adam married Anna Barbara McCarty Fitzhugh, the dau. of Daniel McCarty, Speaker of the House of Burgesses, and Elizabeth Pope McCarty of Westmorland County, VA. [Daniel McCarty's son, also Daniel, was a close personal friend to George Washington, and they visited overnight with each other. Daniel was one of the few private citizens invited to George's funeral service]. Anna McCarty had first married Major John Fitzhugh in 1715, son of Col. William and Sarah Tucker Fitzhugh of Westmorland County, VA, in or before 1719. Anna and John had five daughters and three sons born between about 1719 and 1733. Adam and Anna's children were Thomas born Feb. 17, 1734/5 and John born Sept. 28, 1736. It is not known at this point whether Adam and Anna were also raising her children by John, but likely they were all living in the house that had been John Fitzhugh's.

Adam did not mention her children in his own will.

In a deposition taken in 1736 in Fairfax County, VA. "...the dancing master would be Adam Crump. He claimed on land on the great Henting Creek but claimed land 8 or 9 miles from Alexandria at the head of Piney Run."

On 10 May, 1735, the will of James Crump, father of Adam, was filed in Dublin Ireland. A transcript of the will is in the Notes for James. James' will was probated 16 May, 1737. Since wills were filed only after death, it is more likely that he had died by 1735.

Also in 1735, Adam Crump of St. Pauls's Parish, Stafford County, purchased one thousand acres on Dogue Run in Truro Parish in Prince William County, Virginia, from John Warner, a surveyor. Prince William County had been created from Stafford County in 1730, effective in 1731. Warner had worked for Daniel McCarty. It was the same land which was granted unto the said John Warner, surveyor, by deed on March 9, 1730 from the Proprietors of the Northern Neck of Virginia (DB "B" pp 483, June 26, 1735, Stafford Co. VA.). This land became part of Fairfax County when it was formed in 1742. Today the land is just north of Fort Belvoir, near Franconia, just south of Downtown Washington, D.C. Adam had permission to cut timber from an adjacent property known as "World's End" in order to build a house.

By 1737, Adam had purchased 195 acres of land in Charles County, Maryland, across the Potomac from Stafford County, from Richard Brett.

July 3, 1738 - Succession of John Briscoe in Charles Co. MD, "Payments to: Dr. Brown, Robert Gill, Adam Crump..." (Maryland Probate Records), so Adam was at least involved in this land, although there is no evidence that he actually lived there.

Anna Barbara McCarty Fitzhugh died December 12, 1737, and Adam married second Hannah Bushrod, widow of Joseph Heale (son of George Heale and his wife Ellen). Heale had been elected Vestryman in Christ Church, Lancaster Co., VA in 1739 and died August 6, 1741. Adam and Hannah were married August 6, 1742, in Lancaster County, and Adam had apparently relocated to Lancaster County by that date. All of the persons named as executors and witnesses of his will were in Lancaster County.

In 1743 the Proprietors of Northern Neck granted Adam 385 additional acres of "wasteland" or uncultivated land lying in Fairfax County just to the west of, and adjacent to, the land already owned by him (Fairfax County, VA. DB "F" pp 97, March 13, 1743).

It is worth noting that the southern tip of Adam's 1,385 acres was less than two and a half miles north of land owned by McCarty, just over three miles north of the Fitzhugh property, and less than four miles north of the Bushrod property! All these families obviously knew each other, and it was through these associations that Adam must have first known Hannah Bushrod Heale.

In 1750 Adam's will was filed in Dublin. It is not known why it was filed there. It is recorded in the "Index to The Act or Grant Books, And to Original Wills, of The Diocese of Dublin to the Year 1800", p. 204. Of course this is only an Index, but a significant find. The Index read: "Crump, Adam, Virginia, America, Merchant, 1750". In Ireland wills were normally filed after the death of the testator, indicating that Adam had died by 1750, and no other Adam Crump is known in America in that time.

Adam's will was dated September 6, 1748 and proved in Lancaster County, Virginia on March 16, 1753 (see Lancaster County, VA Will Books 13, page 239 and will book 15, page 126). It can only be presumed that this was the same will filed in Dublin. There was no mention in his will of any property he owned or for which he had any interest in Ireland. Neither did it mention any land owned by him in Lancaster County (as that was still owned by his wife Hannah). However, as indicated in the previous paragraph, he probably died in 1750. Thomas and John Crump did not live to adulthood. Hannah decided to remain in Lancaster County, Virginia, after Adam died (in the Journal of James Gordon, he mentions Hannah Crump visiting him on August 3, 1761, at his home at Corotoman, Lancaster Co., Virginia). Following is a complete transcript of Adam's will (With paragraphs used for easier reading only; originally only one paragraph):

"I, Adam Crump, of the county of Lancaster being of sound mind & memory thanks be to God do make this my last will & testament in manner following Viz. I just committ my soul to God my Creator and my body to the Earth its original being fully assured that the sacrifice of Christ is a worthy expiation for all the sins of the faithful

and therefore hope my soul and body will have a joyful meeting at the resurrection of the just by the merits, mediation and intercession of our complete redeemer the Lord Jesus Christ Amen.

"I give to my sons by my first wife John & Thomas Crump all my lands and the appurtenances situate in the county of Fairfax to be equally divided between them and the heirs of their body respectively lawfully to be begotten and if both of my said sons die without heirs of their of one of their bodys, then I give all of the said land and appurtances to my two sons by my last wife, John Bushrod Crump and James Crump, to them and their heirs of their body lawfully to be begotten equally to be divided between them.

"I give to my son John Bushrod Crump my tract of land in Maryland and the yearly rent thereof to him and the heirs of his body and for the want of such issue to my son James and the heirs of his Body.

"Item I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Hannah Crump during her natural life the uninterrupted use and profit of all my Negroes that I am now possessed of and their increase and also all of my stock of cattle and other creatures of all kinds and all my household goods of all sorts whatsoever during her life. After her decease I give all the said Negroes, stock, household goods to my three children by my said wife Hanna [i.e.,] John Bushrod, Hannah Bushrod and James, & their heirs to be equally divided among them when they attain to the age of eighteen years. But if my said three children shall die before that age then my will is that my children by my first wife shall have the said Negroes and other estate to them & their heirs.

"Item It is my will that my executors shall put out at interest four hundred pounds current money now in the hands of Maj. John Champ and as the interest comes in to put it out at interest also and at the end of ten years to pay to my two sons John & Thomas two hundred pounds to each of my said sons by my first wife out of the sd. Money, and the rest to continue at interest till my son John Bushrod shall attain to the age of twenty one years and then all this money to be equally divided among my three children by my last wife.

"Item I appoint my executors herein after named to be the tutors to my two sons by my first wife and if my present wife shall die in the minority of my children by her then it is my will that my said executors shall be tutors to my children by my last wife also.

"Item It is my will that my son John Crump after he is sufficiently educated to be bound by his tutors to a physician surgeon or to an apothecary till he is twenty years of age and my son Thomas to a Lawyer or to a Clerk of a court for the term of seven years. Item it is my will that if any money falls to me by the death of any friend it shall be equally divided among my five children & their heirs.

"Item I give all the rest of my personal estate of whatever kind [what]soever not before herein mentioned to my beloved wife Hannah Crump.

"Item I do appoint my good friends Peter Conway, James Gordon, William Jordon [sic], and Harry Turner, Gent. Executors of this my last will & Testament. In Witness whereof I have here unto set my hand & seal."

(1748Signed sealed & delivered after interlining the words (of the body) and three small omissions [sic].

In presence [sic] of Edwin Conway, John Heath, John Jordon [sic]

At a court held for Lancaster County on the 16th of March, 1753, this will was proved in open court by the oath of John Gordon, one of the witnesses, thereto & be ordered to be recorded. Test. Thomas Edwards, Jun. C.C.

Lancaster County Wills, etc. No. 15, 1750-58

Adam Crump's appraisement, 16 day of March 1753. "We the subscribers having met being first sworn to appraise the estate of Mr. Adam Crump deceased as followed: Total 429lb, 10s, 11. (Signed) William Montague, George Payne, George Smither"

"True and perfect inventory of all the estate of Adam Crump decd. as yet come to my hands except a few trifles. (Signed) Hannah Crump"

The language of the will instructing that the executors act as tutors "to my two sons by my first wife" certainly implies that they were still living at the time of the writing of his will in 1748 while they were about 15 and 13 years old.

Edwin Conway who witnessed Adam's will was Edwin "III". The first Edwin was in Virginia by 1640 and was originally from Worcestershire, England, and probably born about 1610. As "'Edwyn Connaway, of Northampton, Clark" he was granted land in Oct. 1644 (1,250 acres of land in the county of Lancaster on the South east side of Corotoman River, 1,000 acres part thereof having been formerly granted by patents dated 6 Dec., 1652). Edwin died in Lancaster Co., VA in 1675. Edwin III was born 1681-82 and died Oct 3, 1763. He was a leading man in Lancaster county for many years. He was a vestryman for many years of Christ Church and St. Mary's White Chapel, in Lancaster. He married Ann Ball in 1704. Ann was the half sister of Mary Ball, mother of George Washington. Edwin III married 2nd Ann Hack, dau of Dr. George and Anna Herman Hack. "Col." Conway's children included Anne, who married Robert Edmonds; Peter, who died in 1763 (another executor of Adam's will and husband of Elizabeth Spann; George who married Ann Heath; and Millicent, who married James Gordon (another executor of Adam's will).

James and John Gordon were from Newry, co. Down, Ireland, being the two eldest of four sons of another James Gordon of Sheepbridge, co. Down. John was the eldest of the two and was married to Millicent Conway, daughter of Edwin Conway, III. William (F) Gordon was son of John Gordon. The the ancestors of these Gordons are said to have come from Scotland to Ireland during the Ulster Plantation. W & M Quarterly indicates the earlier James Gordon was condemned to death and his estates forfeited in Wigtonshire "as a Presbyterian" in 1689.

John Heath appears to be a son of Thomas Heath. Thomas was the son of another Thomas Heath from Northumberland County who died before 1690. The will of Thomas the son was dated June 6, 1727, and proved in July 1729. His wife Winifred and children William, John, Betty and Mary are named in it. On August 13, 1753, John Heath was sworn as lieutenant of the Troop and Foot. , by July 8, 1754 he was Capiain of Foot in Wicomico parish, and on Feb. 12, 1759, he was a vestryman in that parish. On Oct 14, 1776, John Heath, Gentleman, was appointed Capiain of the Minute Company whereof William Lee was formerly captain and at the time of his death in 1783, he was a Justice of the Peace. Captain Heath engaged in merchandizing in Northumberland County on an extensive scale. He married 1st, his cousin, Mary Waddy, and 2nd, Judith Unknown, and 3rd, Chloe Unknown. This John Heath may have been the same as the John Heath who was first president of Phi Beta Kappa Society founded at William and Mary in 1776. It is interesting to note that Hannah Crump, daughter of William Crump of Talbot Co., MD, and her then husband William Tarbotin conveyed the 50 a. tract "Crumpton" in MD to a James Heath of Cecil Co., MD on March 19, 1719. The full relationship between the Heaths and Crumps is not yet known.

James Gordon's son-in-law by his second wife, Mary Harrison, was the Rev. James Waddell, D.D., a blind minister at Christ Church in Lancaster, one of the Presbyterian churches they apparently all attended regularly. Joseph Heale had been Vestryman at this same church before he died, and it is assumed by acquaintance that Adam did as well.

The following is from one of the publications of John Fredrick Dorman: The death of Major Harry Turner (the third of Adam's Executors) late in 1751 left vacant the clerk-ship of King George County, as well as his seat in the House of Burgesses. Harry Turner was the clerk who filed the will of Augustine Washington, and shortly after 1750 Elizabeth Turner, widow of Harry, and daughter of Colonel Nicholas Smith of King George, married Bowler Cocke. Thomas Turner had been a Burgess from King George in 1723. An earlier Nicholas Smith was a Burgess from Isle of Wright in 1659.

Major John Champ was mentioned in Adam's will as to be in charge of the money left to his children. James Gordon mentions attending the wedding of John Champ in the early 1760's, so they were all neighbors and attended the same Presbyterian Churches. Research on John Champ indicates that he was a wealthy landowner and acted as a "Personal Banker" to many during his lifetime.

The executors of Adam Crump were on the Rent Rolls for Fairfax County for 1800 acres in 1761 and 1764; and for 1000 acres in 1772 and 1774.

Notes for HANNAH BUSHROD:

Hannah Bushrod Heale, was the widow of Joseph Heale of Lancaster County, Virginia. She was the daughter of John Bushrod and his wife Hannah Keene of "Bushfield", Westmorland County, Virginia.

Generation No. 2

2. JAMES³ CRUMP (ADAM², JAMES¹) was born 1745 in Lancaster Co., Virginia, and died Aft. 1805 in Montgomery County, North Carolina. He married ISABELLE MONROE 1776, daughter of THOMAS MONROE and CATHERINE HORE. She was born 12 Nov 1751 in Fairfax Co., Virginia, and died 1797 in Montgomery County, North Carolina.

Notes for JAMES CRUMP:

James was been said to have been born in Leesburg, Loudoun County, VA, by his granddaughter, Laura Patrick. But that could not be the case. Loudoun was not even created until 1758 (James had to have been born between 1742 and 1748), and Leesburg was created later that year from scratch. Clearly, Adam and Hannah Bushrod moved to Lancaster shortly after they were married in 1742. Based on those facts, I am showing all three of their children as being born in Lancaster County, VA.

James Crump was active in the state government and served as one of five representatives from Montgomery County to the State Convention which met in Hillsborough in July 1788 and voted overwhelmingly not to accept the United States Constitution. James was again a representative when North Carolina ratified the Constitution, becoming the twelfth state to join the Union.

James headed the North Carolina Militia until his death sometime after about 1805. His only son, John Bushrod Crump, II, named for his brother, John Bushrod Crump, succeeded him in this position. James' wife was Isabelle Monroe, is said to have been a cousin of President James Monroe.

3. HANNAH BUSHROD³ CRUMP (ADAM², JAMES¹) was born 1746 in Lancaster Co. Virginia. She married ROBERT MOSS 15 Sep 1766 in Fairfax Co., Virginia (Source: Bill Hailey's book, "Arkansas Hills to the Texas Plains" - June 1993, records Hannah Crump's marriage to Robert Moss as July 22, 1766, in Loudoun County, VA.), son of JOHN MOSS and FRANCES LOVELL.

Notes for HANNAH BUSHROD CRUMP:

When Hannah married she was not of age and her mother had a marriage contract drawn up which specified that Robert Moss would not be able to sell any of the land belonging to his wife, nor her Negroes, during her lifetime, and at her death, if there were no children, all the land and the Negroes willed to her by her father, Adam, would revert to Hannah's brothers. Thus, the land would remain in the family.

JOHN BUSHROD³ CRUMP (ADAM², JAMES¹) was born Bef. 06 Sep 1748 in Lancaster Co., Virginia (Source: John Bushrod Crump full name was on a deed, Fairfax Co, VA Deeb Book L & M p. 293 - 296 as per Nancy Lewis 8/31/96.), and died 04 Jun 1837 in Montgomery County, North Carolina (Source: Nancy Lewis 8/31/96.). He married MARY STEPHENS. She was born Abt. 1755 (Source: *1810 US Census, Montgomery Co, NC.*), and died Abt. 1859 in Montgomery County, North Carolina.

Notes for JOHN BUSHROD CRUMP:

John Crump served as a private in the Continental Army from Virginia under General Green, and, along with his brother James, was in the Battle of Guilford Courthouse. John Crump was "Entry Taker" or Land Clerk for Montgomery, NC for many years.

When John sold his land in VA it was mentioned as a "medicinal doctor". In 1790, the Census reports both John and James lived near the "Narrows" on the east side of the Yadkin River. He owned 5 slaves according to that census.

John, along with his son James and James' wife Elizabeth are buried on the original land granted to them by the state of NC in what is now the Badin Lake area of the Uwharrie National Forest in North Carolina.

In the late 1760's and early 1770's, James and John Bushrod's names appeared in Court Records of Fairfax County. Suits were brought against them for minor debts. On one occasion James failed to appear. On another, Hannah, their mother, paid their debt. In one Grand Jury presentment, the case was dismissed.

James and John also inherited land from Adam's first wife, since neither of the sons of Adam and Anna Barbara McCarty lived to majority. John is thought to be the youngest of Adam's children, and had to have been born by the time Adam wrote his will in Sept, 1748. Some descendants believe that John was the oldest since he was named first at least twice in Adam Crump's will. Without further documentation I will leave it as is until new material is uncovered.

In "The Points of Our Compass: Surveying Our Ancestors" by Frances Osborne Gust and Katharine Shields Melvin, 1988, James Bushrod Crump's son is listed at "(Colonel) John Bushrod Crump II". The will of Col. John Crump is represented here as follows:

"Paper marked "A" appended to the Petition of a copy of the will of Col. John Crump deceased. [Note: The courthouse in Montgomery burned in 1835, so this is apparently a copy that was used in place of the original]

"In the name of God Amen. I John Crump of the County of Montgomery & State of North Carolina being of sound mind & memory on this 15th day of January 1835 make this my last will and Testament as follows-

" Item 1st. I lend unto my beloved wife Letitia Crump the following property until my son James, arrives of age (towit) the Plantation whereon I now reside and the Fish traps (the Narrows excepted) all the stock of horses, cattle, & hogs on the plantation, and all the present Crop of Corn and provisions on hand - also all the household and kitchen furniture and two or three loads of Corn from my Davidson place as my Executor may think my family will require. More than is on hand here - I also lend unto my wife Letitia Crump the following negro slaves, until my son James arrives of age (towit) Jerry - Alfred - Peter - Isaac - Lucy - Leanner & their Children, Bob & one child & Rode for the purpose of making a support for my family.

"Item 2nd. I wish my Executor to sell two of the horses heretofore loaned to my wife, Mark & Ball, & a young mare Blaze at my Davidson place to be put in their place -

"Item. My Wife is to keep all the tools of every description on this place with my wagon (one still & worm(?) excepted) which I wish to be sold-

"Item. I wish my Executor to sell all of my lands in Davidson County on a credit of one, two or three years and all the crop, stock & farming tools on my Davidson place to be sold (except the mare blaze) on such credit as my Executor may think proper -

"Item I wish my executor to sell two negroes Merry and Jude his wife - the balance of my negroes not loaned to my wife I wish taken to Lawrenceville and hired out annually until my son James comes of age but my executor is authorized to sell or dispose of them if he thinks it best -

"Item I wish my executor to rent out my fishery the narrows annually either in lots on the whole as he may think proper until my son James comes of age -

"Item. My will and desire is that when my son James comes of age that the negroes I and my wife and the balance of my negroes with all their increase be valued and lotted off and equally divided between my wife Letitia, my son James - Henneritta, Laura Ann my daughters and my son John and youngest son Thomas Steele Crump.

"Item. It is my wish and desire that Thomas Steele Esq of the county of Richmond act as my Exeutor and I further request my said Executor to ast as Guardian for my children, and pay particular attention to the education of my children. I wish my sons to be kept as school until they graduate at the university. It is my wish that my Executor heretofore named lend out all the money I how have on hand and dispense of all the gold I have on hand -

"Signed sealed and delivered in the presence of J. B. Martin & Frances Lock - John Crump (Seal). Copy February 1851"

Thomas Steele Crump was a son of John Bushrod Crump, II, and brother to James M. Crump and Laura Crump Patrick. Fred, this is likely the T.S. Crump listed in DeSoto Parish LA in the 1860 census. That T.S. was enumerated as 24 years old, born in NC, a druggist, with (\$0 Real Estate), \$10,000 in Property , and in the HH of Mattie E. Russell, 20, "Matron", born Florida.

The reason I think so is that I found him in the "Records of Louisiana Confederate Soldiers" by Andrew B. Booth, Commissioner Louisiana Military Records, originally published 1920, and in the Louisiana State Library in Baton Rouge, Louisiana, and reprinted by "The Reprint Company" of Spartanburg, SC in 1984. That reference read as follows:

"Crump, Thomas S., Sergt. Capt. Co. D 2nd La. Infy. En. May 11th, 1861, New Orleans, La. Present on all rolls to April, 1862. Roll for May and June, 1862, Absent, sick, in Richmond. Rolls from July, 1862, to April, 1863, Present. Roll for May and June, 1863, Absent. Wounded at Winchester, Va. June 15th 1863. Promoted Capt. June ___, 1863. Roll for July and Aug., 1863, Died at Winchester, Va. June 27th, 1863. Roster dated Jan., 1865, Killed June 15th, 1863. Successor, Wm. Cunningham."

In an undated letter (but determined by me to have been written c. 1904) Laura Crump Patrick writes as follows:

Crump, born about 1812 [I'm showing 1811 as his sister Nancy Ann was born Oct. 6, 1812] according to the age he gave census takers (Sorce: 1850, 1860 and 1870 Censuses. He said he was 38, 48, and 58 respectively.) He moved to Yazoo County, Mississippi, by 1843 (Source: Tax list) and claimed farmland worth \$50,000 and personal property worth \$44,950 in 1860 (Source: 1860 Census), but down to \$25,000 and \$2,000 by 1870. Personal property in 1860 was most likely in value of slaves owned.

George filed notice February 10, 1860, hiring William Allen, a Stanly County magistrate and sister Nancy Crump Allen's husband, to help him collect his share of James Crump's estate; three days later William filed a bill of sale to George for an apparent family of nine slaves for \$5,115. (Source: Stanly County Deed Book 5, pages 259 and 260).

George does not have a wife or family in either of the three census periods 1850-1870, so it is assumed that he never married and did not have any heirs.

Stephen was a farmer and owned real estate valued at \$8700, the second highest in Stanly County. In 1857 when Stephen's property was divided among his 15 heirs, he owned 45 slaves. Stephen served in the 2nd Regiment of Montgomery County in the War of 1812.

From p. 16 of "Stanly County USA, A History of Stanly County, NC", 1990, is the following: "the Stephen Crump family owned about all the land in this area for miles around. He owned many slaves and farmed in a big way. He also operated the Crump Feed & Grain Mill as well as a general store. Note: (Stephen Crump's third wife was Ann Eliza Kendall, daughter of John Spilman Kendall). The Kendalls were another prominent family. Thornton and Reuben Kendall were prosperous land owners, who also had many slaves.

Stephen married Nancy Easley in or about 1809. Their chidren were born between then and 1926 or so. Nancy must have died about 1826 as their youngest son Woodson was born about then. Stephen then married Deliah Parham about 1826 or 1827. Deliah died by 1850 as Stephen and Eliza Ann Kendall had Lucy Ann Crump by about 1850/51. However, Deliah was his wife in the 1850 census.

Since his sister Nancy is known to have been born in July 1790, and his brother Roland to have been born in 1792, 1791 was chosen. He could have been a twin to either, but if not, then he would have been born about 1791. If he were born as late as 1793 then his son would have been born when he was 17. Not impossible, but unlikely. ELC 1/2000

1820 NC Census - Mack not found, but some census lost.

1830 NC Census - Davidson County, p. 227 000011-000201, so of 30 but not yet 40 - one son.

1840 NC Census - Davidson County, p. 240 Rebecca shown as widow, 00001-0000101, so Mack is deceased and still only one son.

"At the request of several of the descendants of my Grandfather and his brother-John Crump-I am induced to write this, for their benefit, as well as a desire on my my part. That my children may know something of their Ancestry, which now dates too far back for them to get their information, at the present time, from any one except myself.

"Now at the age of 73 years I am the only descendant of my Grandparents, who know anything of their early history.

"My information came from a dear old aunt, Eva Forest (my father's sister), who loved to entertain the children with stories of her father's service in the Revolutionary War.

"My grandfather - Major James Crump - was born in Loudon Co'ty, Virginia.

"He was a lad in his teens at the opening of the Revolution and at an early period in the war, he served General Washington on his staff in the capacity of Page. Was afterwards promoted to regular service and ranked as Major at the close of the war in 1781, at which time he was with the American Troops in North Carolina, serving under General Green - and was present in the battle of Guilford.

Frances' surname has been a mystery for years. However, in collaboration with a descendant, Tiffany Edmonds, we have concluded that Frances was very likely a Bogguss. There are several reasons for this determination, although there is no documentation for it at this point. The reasons are as follows:

1. The Jones County, Texas, Census of 1900 places Frances L. "Unknown's" birth at May of 1867 in Louisiana. She is the wife of John Crump, originally of Grant Parish, Louisiana.
2. There are only five Frances' who are the right age in Grant Parish in 1880 (and that includes two years either side of 1867). Two are confirmed as married to someone else by Grant Parish records, and one shown as only 11 in 1880, and NOT included in the 1870 census with her parents; indicating that she was born shortly after the 1870 census.
3. Francis Reeks (13) is a possibility, but her parents are not found in Louisiana in 1870.
4. The fifth Frances, Frances Bogguss, 13, is found in Grant as daughter of T. Henry and Lavinia Bogguss. Frances' middle initial is "L".
5. In 1880, a (Dr.) Peter Bogguss is found, living just south of the Grant/Rapides Parish line on the east side of the Red River in the Rigolette Community (pronounced "ro-gully") Peter is 69, born in KY, but has a son Joel 35, born in Arkansas, and daughters Joanna 22, Amanda 13, Frances 11, and Mary W. 9, John Torry ("son"), and Leonidus Nugent ("step-son") 17, living with him. Leonidus is undoubtedly named for the famous Episcopal Fighting General in the Civil War, Gen. Leonidus Polk, who established Episcopal churches throughout the south, and was heavily involved in the Confederacy. Peter's relationship to T. Henry Bogguss in Grant is not established, but Peter's son Joel was born in Arkansas about 1845, and T. Henry Bogguss was born in Arkansas about 1840. This is NOT a common name. Peter was probably father of T. Henry Bogguss.
6. In 1870, Peter Bogguss is living next door to Columbus Nugent 17, and several of his brothers and sisters. No adult there. The siblings, in addition to Columbus include Amanda 13, Francis (f) 11, and Leon 7, all born in LA. Leon is likely Leonidus.
7. In 1900 Amanda E. and Francis J (f) Bogguss are living with Charles A. Nugent in Grant parish, LA.
8. In 1900, Lonnie Nugent is enumerated with John Crump in Jones Coutny, Texas.
9. A Lurena Bogguss is buried at the Friendship Cemetery in south Grant Parish, LA. This is the same cemetery in which Alexander E. Crump (brother to Benjamin and John Crump) and his family have been buried since Alexander died. Lurena's dates are Dec 28, 1839 to Apr 21, 1929, so not likely the mother of Frances L., but

clearly a relative. Likely Frances' middle name was either Lavinia (wife of T. Henry Boggus), or Lurena, relationship not definitely established.

Although marriage records survive in Grant Parish from about 1879, no record is found of the marriage of John Crump to any Frances. Perhaps they married elsewhere, or married without benefit of license.

During the Civil War he fought in the battles of Murfreesboro, Chickamauga, Jonesboro and Nashville. Benjamin returned to Russellville in Pope County, Arkansas, where he married Bettie Howell. They had two daughters, Minnie and Bettie. His first wife died in 1874. He traveled back to Stanly County, NC, to marry Eugenia Randle July 5, 1877 (Source: marriage certificate). They had four children: Bennie, Randal, Samuel and Loy. Source: Biographical & Historical Memoirs of Western Arkansas, 1891, with information that certainly came from Benjamin Allen himself.)

He enlisted in Co. B, 2nd Arkansas Rifles in 1861. The four battles he said he fought in were major battles in the North's drive South to capture and burn Atlanta then march on to the sea. Jonesboro was the final battle that lost Atlanta. Confederate forces tried to yet defeat the North's army by retaking Nashville and cutting off the Federals' supply line. But instead the Confederates suffered disastrous defeat. Allen was among Confederate troops who surrendered at Greensboro, NC, in 1865. He died March 12, 1901. (submitted by Jim Adams).

Notes for JAMES FRANKLIN CRUMP, SR.:

The 1860 U. S. Census of North Carolina shows a James Franklin Crump, age 17, living in Anson county, Wadesboro District, pp. 543, working as a farm laborer on the Benjamin Henry farm.

When the Civil War broke out, James F. Crump joined the 4th Regiment, Company A, North Carolina Calvary. He enlisted in Anson Co., N. C. at the age of 18 on May 10, 1862, and was mustered in as a corporal. He was reduced in rank about March/April 1864 for "Neglect of Duty" and was present and accounted for on Company Muster Rolls through August 1864.

Company A was enlisted at Wadesboro, Anson Co., N.C., beginning May 10, 1862 for a period of three years or the end of the war. The initial recruits from Anson County were moved to Camp Vance, near Kittrell's Springs, Granville Co., N.C., where it was mustered into the CSA service on July 16, 1862. Here it remained until assigned to the 59th Regiment, N. C. Troops (4th Regiment N.C. Calvary) and placed under the command of Col. Dennis D. Ferebee on August 10, 1862. The 4th was assigned to duty in the Dept. of North Carolina until the spring of 1863 in this capacity until late spring of 1863 when it was placed in the Army of Northern Virginia, serving in that command until the summer of 1864. The 4th was then returned to the Army of Northern Virginia, where it remained until the end of the war, in Gen. W.H.F. Lee's Division, Cavalry Corp, Army of Northern Virginia.

The 4th N.C. Cavalry participated in more than 50 various engagements during its tenure and was officially included among the CSA forces that surrendered at Appomattox Court House on April 9, 1865, but in fact, the 4th along with most of the Cavalry of the Army of Northern Virginia was able to escape through federal lines. It disbanded a few days later, however, when it became clear that they would not be able to reach Johnston's forces in North Carolina.

After the Civil War, the family lost their land in NC and had to free their slaves. The children began to move. Some went to Mississippi, and James Franklin Crump homesteaded 40 acres near Rison Arkansas, or at least between Rison and Niven, south of Pine Bluff. His Homestead application in 1878 stated that he had lived on the 40 acres for at least ten years and had cleared four acres. On two acres he built a house of wood and logs with a fireplace, and farmed two acres.

The 1870 U.S. Census for Arkansas, Jefferson Conty, Randall Area, Talledega Twp, pp. 488/489, shows two (2) James Crumps living there. It is believed that this is a misenumeration or example of census fraud, and that there was only one James Crump family. He is listed as a farmer, age 24, married to Sarah Crump, his first wife, and having two sons, Frank (age 2) and William (age 1). Frank died young while William went on to have ten children of his own. Sarah died in Oct 1870, and James married Priscilla Tisdale, a next door neighbor in Dec 1871.

The 1880 U.S. Census for Arkansas shows James Crump (age 35) married to Priscilla Crump, his second wife, (age 27) and two sons, James, Jr. (age 6) and Albert (age 1). (Note: George's middle name was "Elbert", but he was not born until 1882, so "Albert" could not have been an incorrect spelling for George Elbert - more on this at Sidney Johnston Crump), living in the Niven Township of Dorsey County (now Cleveland), Ark. pp.8. He is listed as a farmer.

James also worked for the railroad, the booming industry of the time, and some farming. At one time or another all four of his sons worked for the railroad. Sidney was still working as a Station Master when he died in 1912. Robert Edward went on to be a university professor, but George continued to work for the railroad as station master until his retirement. George never married. James Jr. later became a doctor.

It is very interesting that the Battle of Shiloh, in the Civil War, was fought at Crump's Creek in what is now known as Crump, Tennessee, on the Tennessee Alabama state line. During that battle General Albert Sidney Johnston was killed. Years later, James Franklin Crump, who served in the war from 1861 - 1865 named his second son (the first was James Jr.) "Sidney Johnston Crump". Records indicate that Crump's Creek is indeed a coincidence and that had nothing to do with our immediate family. Also, James Franklin served in the CSA only in North Carolina and Virginia, and was never at Shiloh.

James Franklin Crump's first wife's father, Phillip George Henry was at Shiloh and lost an eye there. He lived near James in Arkansas, and they undoubtedly talked about the war. It is presumed that James named a son after the General even though he did not serve under him. Sidney Johnston was born in Aug of 1878, so would have been one year old at the 1880 census, where he was listed as "Albert". It is presumed that his full name was Albert Sidney Johnston Crump, but the Albert was dropped somewhere along the way. This Sidney Johnston's son may have been Sidney Johnston Jr., but since his father died when he was only five years old, he never used the Jr. after his name, and was always known by the family and friends as S. J. Crump. On the other hand, if the first Sidney knew that his full name included Albert, then his son would never have been a "Jr".

Sidney Johnston Crump, Jr. of Shreveport, Louisiana, still carries this third generation name.
