

## *Descendants of James Graham (12/13/2003)*

### *Generation No. 1*

**1. James<sup>2</sup> Graham** (James<sup>1</sup>) was born 1753 in Virginia, and died June 14, 1830 in Grahamsville, Scioto Township, Jackson, Ohio. He married **Mary Buffington<sup>1</sup>**, daughter of John Buffington and Sarah Evans. She was born March 19, 1761 in Chester, Pennsylvania, and died May 02, 1838 in Grahamsville, Scioto Township, Jackson, Ohio.

Tombstone reads "A Soldier of the Revolution"

"A Peaceful Foray Into The Stronghold Of The Grahams", Jackson Standard-Journal, Wednesday, October 15, 1919.

Oct 2--The fame of the fighting Grahams of Scotland has gone round the world.

There is a Graham's town in Cape Colony and a Grahamsville in Jackson County. Dr. Sylvester Graham gave a name to a flour and J A Graham to a mineral.

The Grahams of Jackson county are all descended from James Graham and he must have had good blood, for it still flows in a host of people.

J H McCoy a great grandson of the pioneer offered to drive me to the old homestead today and I accepted gladly, for I wanted to pay my first visit to Grahamsville.

It was two o'clock before we started, for I wanted to attend the Sadie Faught hearing, and this prevented me from making all the investigations that should be made around the Graham homestead.

In passing along the Mabre pike, we saw Del D Colby helping William Mercer make molasses, and I was sorely tempted to stop right there the rest of the day.

When we came to the Sycamore farm, McCoy pointed out the new fram cow shed, and said that lumber was used in the dancing platform at the last Stret Fair.

Dickens wrote about echoing footsteps in the Tale of Two Cities and I wish I could write of the echoing sounds from the boards of this cow shed, the sounds of the tripping feet of gallant lads and gay lasses.

Then we came to a road which brought back to McCoy's memory the fate of Jos Lyons who was injured while making the new road and never recovered.

He told me next how John Stiffler and Alex Jones have become the owners of the old William Dawson homestead.

He related stories of the old pioneers living all along the road, and of the engineers who built a table in a Chestnut tree on the hill now owned by Harvey Sheward to make observations of the surrounding country.

We stopped for a drink out of William Howard's spring, whose fresh water once fed a fish pond, and suggested to me that many farmers should make fish ponds today.

Then we came to the home of A Q Parks in the borders of the land of the Grahams for Mrs. Parks is a Graham, and I say his huge pile of pumpkins the largest seen during the drive.

The Ford made short work of the climb up on Riegel ridge, and then carried us down into the valley of Pigeon Roost Creek, the third creek of that name in this county.

McCoy told me how the neighbors used to visit the Roost to fill bags with Pigeons knocked down with clubs, how all the trees were bent and broken by the millions of Pigeons that came to the roost, and how the ground was covered for years with their dung, until the creek ran black for miles.

The Pigeons selected a roosting place on the upper stretches of the thread like branches of the Run, where they were protected by the hills and forest from the bitter south west winds.

He then related the history of the Wyants and the Buslers, until we climbed out of the valley and found ourselves at his farm home, once the homestead of John Graham son of the pioneer.

His son William Hays McCoy who was in the Service and his young wife occupy the farm, but he was away painting for a neighbor, and she was down in the field blading Sugar cane.

McCoy took me first to his granery to show his hundred bushels of Buckwheat threshed September 30 from a little over four acres. In the same building is a lot of tobacco already hung up to dry.

Crossing the road we went into the cellar where I saw the fast quantity of canned fruit and vegetables stored up for winter by young Mrs. McCoy. Near by is the old well dug one hundred years ago.

Next he took me through the fields up to the Grahamsville graveyard, and we passed his son James Sanford McCoy harrowing the Buckweat land for wheat.

There is work enough in the graveyard for half a day's copying and I had to pass many monuments with a glance.

One of the first names that attracted my attention was that of Terracy, a young girl who died at fifteen years and I wonder if she ever knew that her real name was Theresa.

I saw the tombstone of Susan wife of James Kinkaid who died October 8, 1867, aged fifty five years, five months and two days. The name Kinkaid has disappeared from the county.

I stood at the grave of James Graham the pioneer who died June 14, 1830, aged seventy seven years and six months, and thought of the life which he led in the wilds of this county.

I looked at once for the inscription in memory of his wife for I have learned a secret about the pioneers, which the wife's tombstone always tells.

She died (her name was Mary Buffington) May 2, 1838 having outlived her husband by eight years. She was only seventy seven it is true, but her outliving her husband indicates to me that he always shouldered many of her burdens, as he should have done.

After all is said, one of the principal reasons why the exodus from the farm has continued so long is because so many husbands lay too many burdens on the women.

McCoy then took me down the little Run to show where James Graham build his first cabin near a spring which is yet very much alive, but not flowing freely because it happens to be in a barn yard.

The log cabin of James Graham stood a short distance north of it and many lived in it after Graham died, and it is now a barn up on the ridge near where the old school house stood, moved there by J M Pierce.

The Grahams like the Williamses have allowed the old ancestral home to be torn down and moved away (Mrs Margaret Howell told me the other day that Albert Roach is tearing down the old house in which I was born.)

America will never be quite what it should be until pride of ancestry will cause us to preserve the old homesteads. Americans move too often.

It is true that rolling stones gather no moss, but it may be noted also that rolling stones gradually become reduced

to small pebbles, and many American families peter out in the third or fourth generation.

When I used the phrase peter out I had no intention of punning, but there is a certain aptness about it in the figure where stone or petros and pebbles are compared.

We stopped for a few minutes at the home of J M Pierce where we saw Mrs Pierce and her young daughter preparing roasting ears for supper and Mrs Effie Wastier a neighbor was with her.

We had passed a dead horse in the barn yard and Mrs Pierce said the its name was Barney. The incident emphasized the fact that farmers suffer many losses which are never considered by those who harp about farmer's profits.

We returned home along Spohn or Harrel ridge road, and from the high point by the Daniel Harrell home I enjoyed the wonderful vision of the southern Ohio hills.

While I looked far away to the west, I could see the hills on the other side of the Scioto River, and suddenly in the blue haze there appeared two higher points farther away.

The higher points had doubtless been visible all the time, but my eyes had not focused on them. It is always thus. We miss seeing so many things because our eyes are not open.

We passed in front of the new home of Louis Harrell, and saw J F Messing and William Erlenwein scraping the site for a new barn, and Mrs Messing were smiling on their work.

The road descends rapidly from the Messing farm through the old Crabtree homestead, and passes near the old homestead of Gilbert Weed whose son Oren Weed of Missouri is now visiting this county.

We stopped at Freedom church to take a look at the U S Benchmark in the stone under the church. It bears the figures 739 feet a correction of the original figures which were 794.

Then we drove rapidly home for the day was dying, but the colors of the Autumn foliage seemed purer more refined than in the glare of the midday sun.

Morning Glories smile all day long now, there is some Purple Ageratum left, Bottle Gentian is in its glory, the Blue Asters and the New England Aster in places, and Canada Golden Rod nods along the fences and the Runs.

We saw many apples along the road, great quantities of nuts, Walnuts, Hazels, Chestnuts, Hickories, and there were Persimmons here and there with red berries or drupes on Dogweed, Winterberries and other shrubs.

We stopped at the McCoy home to get his two old Bibles from which I will give many data about the Grahams, which after I have verified some dates and names in county records I will print later.

Following are gleanings from an old Bible:

-----The Buffington Record-----

John Buffington, son of William and Alice Buffington, was born the 28th day of October 1731, and the fifth day of the week, and was married to Sarah Evans the 6th day of August 1753, and the second day of the week.

She was born the 29th day of February, 1737, and sixth day of the week, and they had the following children, namely:

Joseph, born August 6th, 1754,  
Thomas, born July 28th, 1756,  
John, born December 19th, 1757,  
Mary, born March 19, 1761, and 5th day of the week,  
Phebe, born April 22nd, 1764, and first day of the week,  
Alice, born December 12th, 1770, and 4th day of the week,  
Seth Buffington, born April 4th, 1777, and sixth day of the week.

Mary married to James Graham.

Ruth, a grand daughter by Mary, was born May 21st, 1777.

Phebe married to James Sheward.

Alice married to Micael Timen.

John Buffington died April the 7th, 1804, aged 72 years and six months.

The above data were written in a fine, large, round hand, after the fashion of the beautiful writing of the early days of the Nineteenth Century. The archaic form of noting the day of the week is interesting. There is one error in the data easily detected, the birthdate of Sarah Evans, given as Feb. 29, 1737. It was not a leap year, and February had only 28 days. This suggests that the data were copied into this Bible long after the event. They seem to have been written at the same time, and that after the death of John Buffington. The Bible was printed at Philadelphia in 1804, and doubtless, the data were written in soon after the Bible was bought.

On the other side of the leaf bearing the Buffington record, there appear in faint writing the following names and dates:

The above seem to have been written with a goose quill. The names of Adda and Elizabeth are almost obliterated.

After copying the above I turned back and at the end of the last page of the New Testament I found this writing:  
Susan Graham, born March, 1825.

At the bottom of the page is this legend:

This book was purchased ----- Mary Graham. She was the daughter of John Buffington, and the wife of James Graham. The date of the purchase was unfortunately omitted.

#### Family of Seth Graham

Turning over the leaves I found another record between the Old Testament and the Apocrypha with data about Seth Graham's family, as follows:

Seth Graham, son of James and Mary Graham, was born Feb. 14, 1783. Susannah Graham was born Jan. 28, 1788, and was married Oct. 10th, 1811.

James, son of Seth and Susannah Graham, was born June 4, 1812.

Mary Margaret was born June 20, 1814.

Peter N. Graham was born Nov. 2nd, 1815.

Mary Graham was born Feb. 6th, 1819.

This writing is almost identical with that of the name Mary Graham as the purchaser of the Bible and may have been that of the Mary who was the daughter of John Buffington and Sarah Evans.

It is possible that the daughter named Mary Margaret born in 1814, had died before the second Mary was born.

John<sup>3</sup> Graham** (James<sup>2</sup>, James<sup>1</sup>)<sup>8</sup> was born October 01, 1782 in Pennsylvania<sup>9</sup>, and died July 26, 1855 in Grahamsville, Scioto Township, Jackson, Ohio<sup>10</sup>. He married **Catharine Rickabaugh**<sup>11,12</sup> Bet. January 02 - February 02, 1810 in Scioto County, Ohio (see note relating to conflicting dates)<sup>13,14</sup>. She was born January 22, 1794 in Virginia or Pennsylvania<sup>15</sup>, and died September 20, 1873 in Grahamsville, Scioto Township, Jackson, Ohio<sup>16</sup>.

Grahamsville, by Ralph Fout

Grahamsville was located in Scioto Township and got its name from John Graham, who owned the land and laid it out into twenty-one lots. There never were more than five houses standing at a time. There were two stores. One owned by Jacob Pierce I. The other was first owned by Sampson Nye. It changed owners many times. At

these stores the neighbors gathered to do their shopping, to visit and exchange the news. The stores carried a general line of goods such as groceries, clothing, china and glassware. One of Mr. Pierce's descendants still owns the famous Jacob's Ladder pattern, which was bought at his store. In connection with his store, Mr. Pierce has charge of the Post Office: receiving and giving out the mail. The last Post Office was in charge of Eliza Riegel Pierce. The old slot for inserting letters is still in the door of the little building, which also served as a little grocery store. When R.F.D. #1 begun, the Post Office was abandoned.

The old blacksmith shop was ably run by Solomon Busier. He took pride in keeping the farmer's horses shod and attended to their other needs.

There were three Grahamsville schools in all, the last one abandoned in the early 1920's. From these places went forth the young men and women of those days, to take up the duties of our State and Nation.

The religious needs of those days were cared for at the old log Church at Pleasant Hill. The beautiful Church now standing was built to replace the old log one. In these Churches many souls were saved. The last annual homecomings or picnics to renew old acquaintances until they ceased to be held during World War II.

In the old abandoned Graham Cemetery, one may pause a moment and check the dates of births and deaths. It will surprise you to note that more than half of those interred there died before reaching their forties. Epidemics of these times swept them away in their teens and twenties. If they escaped the many childhood diseases. What a different story if only they could have had our wonder drugs of today.

Beyond the old cemetery about a quarter of a mile in the creek that flows through the Pierce farm, one may still see some of the old foundation timbers of the old water powered mill where corn meal was ground. Often there was not enough water to turn the wheel, but when there was, it was kept busy night and day. Stevie Dixon once said that it ground such a thin stream of meal that a hound dog could have eaten it as fast as the meal came out. Mr. Dixon often arose during the night when grinding was in season to refill the hopper.

To end this short sketch of this little vanished hamlet, I mention a few of those who once lived there. They were the families of James Graham, Solomon Busler, Simeon Martin and William Lamb. Many other families lived there as the years came and went. There are descendants of these people still living in our County. They may be found scattered from the Atlantic to the Pacific. The name Grahamsville still lives on in their memories. You may find the name on old maps of Jackson County. Taxes are still figured on certain valuation per lot. Nearly everything is gone but some of the old chimney stones left standing. May the name Grahamsville continue to live on in the memories and hearts of the descendants of those sturdy pioneers who once enjoyed life in this little hamlet of a century ago.

#### Franklin Township Voters

Franklin Township had for its election officers: Judges, John Rook, John Farney and Abraham Baker; and clerks, Isaac Baker and William Stephenson. Teter Null was the first of the sixty-one electors to cast his vote. The others were: Jacob Wishon, Peter McCain, Basil Johnson, John Wallace, Lewis Howard, John Clemmons, Isaiah Sheward, Jesse Martin, Peter Seel, Samuel Stephenson, Isaac Kilcoderic, Hugh Malin, Nathan Kirby, JOHN GRAHAM, John Peters, William Lyons, Eli Dixon, Thomas Crabtree, JAMES GRAHAM, James Higginbotham, Jonathan R. Nelson, John Dixon, Abraham Dixon, Thomas Craig, Ralph Nelson, James Johnson, John Martin, John Duncan, Ross Nelson, Emanuel Traxler, Richard Johnson, William Martin, Hugh Gilliland, John Burnside, Alexander Wilson, Alexander Anderson, Nathan Dixon, John George, William Holland, Francis Holland, Nottingham Mercer, Samuel Craig, Levi Mercer, John Traxler, Benjamin Ellison, Samuel Traxler, Jonathan Traxler, Nathan Sheward, Thomas Scott, John Farney, John Rook, Abraham Baker, John Webb, James Martin, William Stephenson, Isaac Baker, JOSEPH GRAHAM, Isaac Hartley, James Pennelton, Henry Dixon. An election to choose justices was held the same day, but by a different set of officers. They were Teter Null, Samuel Traxler and Hugh Gilliland, judges, and John Martin and Francis Holland, clerks. Sixty votes were cast, of which John George had 32, Thomas Scott 29, Isaac Baker 28, Nottingham Mercer, 26; George and Scott were winners.

John Martin named above was the pioneer who came to the Licks in 1796, and has been spoken of already. Peter

Seel was the first white man to settle permanently in what is now known as Jefferson Township, building his cabin in the woods near the site of the Diamond brickyard, below Oak Hill, in 1814. His nearest neighbor was Lewis Adkins, who owned what has been long known since his days as the Joseph Cackley farm. Seel was a native of Germany, but emigrated when a young lad. He died February 21, 1868, aged eighty-four years, leaving 140 descendants. Isaiah Seward was the founder of a large family, who still takes an active interest in township and county affairs. The Hollands, Nulls, Scotts, Craigs, Kirbys, Duncans and Georges have left the township and the county, but the Dixons, Nelsons, Howards, Johnsons, Trexlers, Mercers, GRAHAMS, Gillilands, Stephensons and others have many representatives in the county. J. H. Rook, descendant of John Rook, died in 1915, at the home of his son in Washington C. H. A number of these voters moved to Lick Township as soon as the sale of lots in 1817 enabled them to buy property near the Licks. This movement down the valley toward Jackson has continued until this day, and a large proportion of the inhabitants of the county seat, can claim descent from the sturdy Franklins of this fine old township. JAMES GRAHAM, named among these voters, became a leading citizen of Scioto Township after its organization in 1816. He was a Virginian by birth, and he married CATHERINE RICKABAUGH who was born in Pennsylvania. They were the parents of twelve children who grew to maturity, viz.: Phoebe, who was married to Abraham Dixon; Elizabeth, the wife of Eli Dixon; John; Felix, who married Lucinda Russell; Jehiel, who married Rebecca Graham; Catherine, the wife of John Haley; Lydia, the wife of Nathan Gilliland; Sarah, the wife of John Norris; Mahala, wife of Levi McCoy; James, who married Margaret Norris, and was long the largest man in the county, weighing 360 pounds; lastly, Mary, the wife of Franklin McCoy, and Hannah, who married Lewis Davis. These twelve clan were nearly as numerous as the McClures, Hertons, Stephensons, Browns and Arthurs. Thomas Craig was another soldier of the Revolution. He belonged in the Maryland line and served under Capt. Richard Davis, in the first regiment, commanded by Colonel Rollins. He enlisted in 1776, was taken prisoner at Fort Washington and was not discharged until 1784. His pension certificate was No. 10,780. A third Revolutionary soldier in Franklin was Jules Dawson of the Virginia line. He served three years and seven months in the Thirteenth Regiment. He was in battle against the Indians at Coshocton on the Muskingum at the mouth of White Woman's Creek, and also on Big Beaver. A number of his descendants still live in Franklin. He survived until after the Fourth of July, 1843, for he and Thomas Oliver, another veteran of the Revolution, were taken to Jackson that day, to a great celebration in their honor as the last survivors of the Revolution in the county. Oliver died February 23, 1844, and Dawson outlived him only a few months. Oliver was a native of Maryland, where he was born May 10, 1763. His father died when he was only fourteen years old, and he went to live with his uncle, David Leffland, in Loudon County, Virginia. When sixteen years old, in 1779, he enlisted in the Sixth Virginia Regiment, under Colonel Muhlenberg and served three years and seven months. He became a pensioner in 1834, getting \$80 a year. He had come to Ohio in 1816 and settled in Madison Township, but he moved later to the Mt. Zion neighborhood in Franklin, and was buried in Mt. Zion graveyard. Oliver was married three times, and was the father of a large family, whose members are now widely scattered. One son named Hiram was a soldier in the Civil War. A number of other veterans of the Revolution died in this county, among them James Hulse of the Virginia line, who served three years in the company of Abraham Shepard in the Twelfth Regiment and received a land warrant from Virginia. William Clarke of Jefferson, who served three years in the First Regiment of Virginia Artillery and fought at Hampton and in North Carolina, when Colonel Buford was defeated, was another.

(deceased); and Amos, a farmer of Western Kansas. Peter Dixon was a farmer and merchant by occupation, a Whig in his political views, and a member of the Newlight Church. He died in 1859, and his wife in 1856. Cyrus Dixon began working for himself

at the age of twenty years, receiving, for ten months, thirteen dollars per month, and for about six months, sixteen dollars per month for his services. On the 2d of August, 1861, he joined Company A, Thirty-third Ohio Volunteer Infantry, under Capt. Curry, of the U. S. A., and, after serving twenty-six months, received his discharge, November 2, 1863, on account of a wound which he received at Stone River. He was in the raid through Kentucky, at Perryville, Bridgeport, and many minor engagements. He received a wound in the right side and hip by a musket ball, from which he still suffers. On the 25th of December, 1863, he was married to Miss Margaret J. Coles, a daughter of John and Mary (Wareham) Coles, who were the parents of the following children: Mary, the deceased wife of Milton Smith; Jacob, a farmer of Cass County, Mo.; Samuel (deceased), whose family reside in Jackson County, Ohio; Elizabeth Ann, the deceased wife of Griffie Dixon; Margaret J., wife of our subject; Maria, wife of Frank Albert; John, a farmer of Barton County, Mo.; Matilda, wife of Jacob Weber, of Illinois; and George, residing on the old homestead in Jackson County, Ohio. Mr. and Mrs. Dixon are the parents of five children: Mary Alice, born June 9, 1865, and died January 5, 1866; Oscar, born September 6, 1869; Huldah May, born May 27, 1873; John B., born August 7, 1875; and Charley, born April 7, 1879. Mr. and Mrs. Dixon are members of the Free Will Baptist Church, and he is a member of the Union Labor party. He also belongs to the I. O. O. F., the Knights of Labor, the Farmers' alliance, and the G. A. R. He owns 240 acres of will-improved land, eighty of which he bought for four dollars per acre, eighty at eight dollars per acre, and eighty at twelve dollars. This is now worth thirty dollars per acre. He has about seven acres in orchard.

Jackson, Keystone and Buckeye Furnaces (1853)

There were three furnaces in the county when the railroad came, Jackson, Keystone and Buckeye, but these had been built mostly with foreign capital, were located on the outer borders of the county, and had not affected its life or business to any great extent at that time. Jackson Furnace, the first built, in 1836, was near the southern county line and its owners had no other interest in the county. J. J. G. Smith was manager, and Jacob Hurdand and J. H. Ricker were two associates who assisted in operating it. The steam engine for this furnace was the first erected in the county. Keystone, the second furnace, was erected on Little Raccoon by Scioto and Lawrence County capital. It was very near the east county line and its business followed its iron, which was boated down the stream when the waters were high. John McConnell & Co. were the builders, but int 1853 they were succeeded by Green Benner & Co. Buckeye was built in 1851 a few miles higher up the stream from Keystone, and its owners were very anxious for the building of the railroad...

Keystone Furnace

Keystone was the only furnace established in this township. It was built in 1848, by John McConnell & Company. H. S. Brady was the principal owner when its career ended. It stood on the east side of Little Raccoon and much of its iron was taken down that stream during the rainy seasons when the waters were high. Several of its men were drowned in going over mill dams which obstructed the current except during high water. Samuel Benner, the first postmaster at Keystone, was appointed in 1855. Wendall Churchill, who raised a company for the Twenty-seventh Ohio Volunteer Infantry while an officer at Keystone, became a brigadier-general. Samuel Thomas, who went out under Churchill, became a colonel and settled at New York after the war, where he was rated at his death as a millionaire.

Bloomfield Township sent out 232 soldiers to the Civil war. It is claimed that no murder was committed within its borders. While its land is not exceptinally fertile many of its farmers have become wealthy and the majority have been noted for their great personal independence. The present officers are trustees, T. J. Williams, W. W.

Included is response to questions of who wife is and children's names and birth dates. Claim rejected because disability was no worse.

6. Application for Pension filed on July 8, 1890, under act of June 27, 1890.

7. Declaration for Increase of an Invalid Pension filed April 30, 1891 from Lincoln Twp, Harrison Co, MO. He claims he had suffered loss of hearing in both ears during the bombardment of New Madrid, MO on May 9, 1862 (he's unsure about date). It was the firing of gun boats and 64 pound artillery that caused the concussions. His prior disability, loss of right eye, was caused in about 1883 when he was pounding a hoop onto a barrel.

8. Claim for increase in pension (due to deafness in both ears) filed July 5, 1894.

9. Declaration for Increase of Pension, filed June 30, 1900 from Eldorado Springs, Cedar, MO. Claim rejected.

10. Declaration for Increase or Additional Invalid Pension filed November 0, 1902 from Eldorado Springs. Claiming deafness and rheumatism. He was ordered to appear for a medical exam to Nevada, Vernon, MO; he asked to be re-assigned to someplace closer (like Eldorado Springs); failed to appear at Nevada. The postmaster of Eldorado wrote a letter on Silas' behalf asking that he be reassigned to a closer location, as he was old and it was hard to travel.

11. Declaration for the Increase of an Invalid Pension filed 24 March 1904 from Eldorado Springs. Claiming deafness, rheumatism and partial paralysis of legs. Ask that he be assigned to Eldorado Springs for examination. Claim rejected.

12. Increase in Invalid Pension approved, to \$10/mo, from October 3, 1906. Loss of sight in right eye, rheumatism, and senile disability.

13. Application for pension under Act of Feb 6, 1907 filed on Feb 23, 1907. Pension set at \$12.

14. Declaration for Pension, filed 27 March 1911, claiming he reached 70 years of age. Rejected because there was no proof of his age. Julia was informed of this on Aug 12, 1912 (after Silas' death). Filed 10 June 1912 from Eldorado Springs, MO, age stated as 64 years old. Also includes an affidavit from Rebecca Claar and G. W. Claar (in Jackson Co, Ohio), attesting they were at the marriage, too. Julia filed an affidavit saying she was born on July 10, 1846, according to her family bible. A certified copy of a marriage record was made June 13, 1912, and submitted to the pension office. Pension approved at \$19.

Letter from an attorney asking that Julia's pension be increased because she was 70 years old sent Sept 14, 1916. Pension Bureau asked for proof, the family bible. Bible mailed to them and returned to Julia. Also includes a letter from Josephine Kincaid, her sister, attesting to her birth date, but this wasn't accepted. Josephine seems to be Mrs. J. Sullivan.

Pension increased to \$20, effective September 8, 1916.
