

# *Descendants of John Lewis*

## *Generation No. 1*

**1. John<sup>1</sup> Lewis** was born Abt. 1835 in Pontardulais, Glamorganshire, Wales. He married **Jane Hughes** in Wales. She was born Abt. 1843 in Llangyfelach, Glamorganshire, Wales.

Notes for John Lewis:

Wales has census records online for 1861, 1871, 1881, 1891 and 1901. I found John and Jane listed in each census.

1861: In Langyfelach (I think) John is 25 years old and working as a puddler. Jane is 18-years-old and housewife. There are no children.

( NOTE: Puddler: A worker who turns pig iron into wrought iron by puddling. Puddling: an Industrial Revolution means of making iron and steel. Int he original puddling technique, molten iron in a reverberatory furnace was stirred with rods, which were consumed in the process. Later, it was also used to produce a good-quality steel with the correct amount of carbon; this was a highly skilled art, but both high-carbon and low-carbon steels were successfully produced on a small scale, particularly for swords and other weapons)

1871: Living in Civil Parish of Langyfelach {Jane's birthplace} and hamlet of Clase, John is 36 years old and working as a "Black Richler". Jane is 28-years-old and "house keeper". Children are William (age 9) and David (age 3) and DANIEL (age 2). William is not seen on any other UK census record :>( although he does show up in the US later!

1881: They have moved to Llannon District, Civil Parish of Llanedy, Hamlet of Iscoed, and Rural Sanitary District of Llanelly on Hendy Road (Betty and I were there!!). John is now 46 and working as a "Tinplate Worker - Pickler". Jane, age 37, continues to be a housewife ...and mother...to: David (13), Daniel (11), Samuel (9), John Lewis (8), and Phillip (5).

1891: Living in the same area only on Forest Road we find John (56) still working as a "Pickler", Jane (47) housewife, Samuel (19) working as a furnace man in the Tin works (my dad /Harry Heckman/ worked as a furnace man in the Tin Mill of Weirton Steel!!), Johnny (17) working as a Tailor, Phillip (15) working as ...I swear it says...Rubber in Tinplate Works, and Emily Jane (8).

1901: we find John (66) working as a general labourer on the farm with Jane (57) and Emily Jane (18). On this census form it lists the Ecclesiastical Parish as Llanedy St. Edith ... and I found the church on [www.dyfedfhs.org.uk](http://www.dyfedfhs.org.uk). I am so sorry Betty and I didn't know this when we were over there!!

The wonderful lady we met in Llanelly, Wales... Tina Jon... is researching for further information on John and Jane Lewis.

**2. Daniel<sup>2</sup> Lewis** (John<sup>1</sup>) was born 28 Jan 1870 in Kidwelly, Carmarthenshire, Wales, and died 23 Jun 1926 in Follansbee, WV. He married **Mary John** 03 May 1890 in Llanelly, Wales<sup>1</sup>, daughter of Benjamin John and Mary Davies. She was born 1870 in Llanelli, Carmarthenshire, Wales, and died 1911 in Follansbee, WV.

Notes for Daniel Lewis:

Daniel died in 1926 from Tuberculosis. Trudy said she remembers "Grandpap" and she really liked him. He always dressed so dapper ... maybe that's where Uncle Bill Lewis got it! ;>)

I have to share this story and I'll put it here because it involves Daniel (sort of). One year on Father's Day, Tom and the kids and I had gone to Follansbee. Grandpap (George, Sr) Heckman was at mom and dad's, too.

Mom had been showing me pictures of Daniel and in one of the pictures, he was leaning against something and had his hat cocked to one side. Tom and I went out on the porch to sit with Grandpap...who, by the way, was very hard of hearing.

I stood in front of him, leaned down in front of his face and asked, "Was Grandma's dad a character?" He said, "No, when they came to this country, they were Methodist." Tom had to go in the house because he was laughing so hard. Pap went on to tell me that they then became Presbyterian, etc.

I love that story!!! haha

More About Daniel Lewis:

Cause of Death: Tuberculosis

Emigration: Jun 1898, Came through Elliis Island on the ship the Majestic. Ship manifest states that was going to "Wheeling, Ohio" to meet his "brother-in-law ...Mr & Mrs ? Jones. Have not yet determined who this was.

Notes for Mary John:

Mary died of heart failure at the very young age of 41 in 1911. She is buried in Brooke Cemetery, Wellsburg, WV along side Daniel and their son George Lewis.

Unfortunately, we don't have stories about her. Uncle George Lewis was only 10 months old when she died. Alice Maud was already married so she helped raise George.

Notes for Sidney Lewis:

According to Trudy, Uncle Sid died of cancer. Apparently, when he was in the service he got kicked in the jaw while playing football. The kick caused him to get cancer in the jaw and a huge growth on the side of his face.

Sid never married.

4. **William<sup>2</sup> Lewis** (John<sup>1</sup>) was born Abt. 1862 in Morryston, Wales. He married **Emily ?** Abt. 1881 in Wales.

Notes for William Lewis:

1900 US Census shows William residing in Martins Ferry, Ohio. He was 37-years-old at that time. William immigrated to the US in 1895 (which means he was in the US before Daniel). William worked as a roller in the tin mill. In 1948, he was residing in New York.

Children of William Lewis and Emily ? are:

- + 15 i. Horace Edgar<sup>3</sup> Lewis, born 24 Jul 1882 in Pontardulais, Wales; died 05 Dec 1948 in Pittsburgh, PA.
- 16 ii. William Luther(aka W.Luther) Lewis, born Apr 1884 in Wales; died in New York City, NY.

Notes for William Luther(aka W.Luther) Lewis:

In the 1910 Census Wiliam is working as a bookkeeper in the Planing Mill. He was 25 years old and single at that time.

- 17 iii. T. Albert Lewis, born 1886 in Wales; died in Bethlehem, Northampton Co, PA.

Notes for T. Albert Lewis:

In the 1948 census, Albert was living in Bethlehem, PA

- 18 iv. Irene R Lewis, born 04 Dec 1888 in Wales; died May 1982 in Bethlehem, Northampton Co, PA. She married (1) H. R. Wilson; born 1889. She married (2) Carles R. Holton Bet. 1920 - 1930; born 1887 in Maryland.

Notes for Irene R Lewis:

Irene immigrated to the US in 1896 with her parents. Naturalization is dated 1902. Her last known residence was 18018 Bethlehem, Northampton, PA. Prior to that, she lived in New York. The 1930 census shows Irene married to her 2nd husband, Charles Holton, and lists her as the mother of Charls' daughters to his first wife, Grace. This census also shows that they have a maid and a butler living in the home.

Notes for H. R. Wilson:

Mr Holton was an accountant for Bethlehem Steel Co.

Notes for Carles R. Holton:

In the 1910 US census, Mr Holton is living in Steelton Boro, Dauphin, PA and he is 23 years old. In the 1920 cesus, it shows him living in Lehigh, PA and working as a purchasing agent for Bethlehem Steel. He was married to Grace? with whom he had 2 daughters...Frances and Ellinore. In the 1930 census, it shows him married to Irene Lewis who was 41 at the time of the census taking. The 2 daughters were living with them.

- 19 v. Arthur W Lewis, born 28 Dec 1892 in Wales; died Sep 1975 in Newport Beach, Organe Co, CA.
- 20 vi. Jessie May Lewis, born 24 Jul 1897 in Ohio; died 11 Feb 1985 in Delray Beach, FL. She married Robert Benjamin Chew; born 21 May 1897 in Pennsylvania; died 31 Jan 1984 in Delray Beach, FL.

Notes for Robert Benjamin Chew:

In the 1930 US Census, Robert and Jessie were residing in Lakewood, Ohio (Cuyahoga Co). Roberts parents were born in West Virginia. Robert was working as a Salesman in the wallpaper store.

- 21 vii. Lillian Olive Lewis, born Nov 1898 in Ohio; died 17 Jul 1973 in Delray Beach, FL. She married (1) Enos Charles Pierpont; born 26 Feb 1900 in Ridgeville, OH; died 31 Jan 1984 in Broward Co, FL. She married (2) ? Fowler.

5. **Samuel<sup>2</sup> Lewis** (John<sup>1</sup>) was born Abt. 1872 in Llansamlet (?), Glamorganshire, Wales, and died 04 Dec 1945 in Steubenville, OH. He married **Annie Samson** 11 Sep 1897 in Trinity Rectory, New Haven, PA, daughter of William Samson and Elizabeth. She was born 04 Jun 1874 in Swansea, Wales, and died 23 Feb 1959 in Steubenville, OH.

Notes for Samuel Lewis:

Now this is when research gets frustrating! I decided to look for Daniel Lewis's brother Samuel. In the Wales census of 1891, he is listed as living at home (age 19) with John, Jane, Johnny (17), Philip (15), and Emily Jane

(8). I cannot find him in the Wales census for 1901.

However, on the Philadelphia Passenger Lists, 1883-1945 records, I found "a" Samuel (is he ours??) arriving in Philadelphia on Aug 26, 1895. It says that he is 24 years old (which would be our Samuel's age) and that his last residence was Pontardulais, Wales. (This makes sense as our Samuel)

Then... on the 1900 US Census records for Pennsylvania, there is a Samuel (born in Wales) with wife Annie (born in Wales), sons William (1) and Leonard (1 mn) and brother Philip living in Connellsville in Fayette County, PA. (This makes sense as our Samuel AND Philip!)

UPDATE: Surprise! On Jan. 17, 2006, I received an email from a lady named Betty Ann stating that she was Samuel Lewis's granddaughter. I almost fainted! I was so excited...I answered her immediately and flurry of emails have continued between us...including her daughter, Amy. It has been wonderful to find out about Samuel and his family...but I'm still baffled why we didn't know about them!

1910 Census ... I can't find him! He may have been living someplace whose records are not online!

1920 Census (now this gets interesting!) I found him with wife Annie and children William (20), Leonard (19) , Horace (16), Ernest (14), Ethel (9) and Edith (7) living in... NOW GET THIS... in Steubenville, OH. Why didn't we know this??? He's listed as a foreman in the Tin Mill!

1930 Census...he is still listed in Steubenville with Annie and their daughters. It states that he was a shipping clerk at a department store. WHY DIDN'T WE KNOW THIS?

#### SAMUEL LEWIS DIED AT HOME HERE TUESDAY

Samuel Lewis, 73, of 1216 Plum Street, a prominent resident of the city for the last 39 years, died at 2:50 p.m. Tuesday at his home where he has been seriously ill the last two weeks. He was formerly a foreman at the tin mill of the weirton Steel Company for years and in later years until his retirement in May 1945 had been employed at The Hub store.

He was born February 7, 1872 in Pontardulais, South Wales, a son of the late John and Jane Lewis, and had come to the United States 50 years ago and settled in Connellsville, PA.

He was married, September 11, 1897 at Connellsville, PA to Annie Samson [sic] of Swansea, Wales, and moved to Steubenville in 1906. Where he had since resided a highly respected citizen. He formerly attended the Baptist church.

Mr. Lewis was a man of pleasing personality and always interested in his home and work. He had a wide acquaintance throughtout the city and a host of friends will regret his death.

He was the last of a family of six children. Surviving are his wife, Mrs Annie Samson Lewis and these children: Charles H Lewis of Youngstown,PA, William J. Lewis, Leonard Lewis, Earnest Lewis, Mrs Estel Hawkins and Mrs Henry Kropp, all of Steubenville and 12 grandchildren. Friends may call at the McClave Funeral Home.

Lewis and Ernest Lewis, both of Steubenville; Leonard Lewis of Miama, FL, and Charles Lewis of Youngstown; 12 grandchildren, and 12 great-grandchildren. A sister and a brother preceded her in death. Friends may call at the McClave Funeral Home from 2 p.m. to 4 p.m. and 7 p.m. to 9 p.m. Saturday and from noon to 4 p.m. and 7 p.m. to 9 p.m. Sunday, Funeral services will be at 1 p.m. Monday in McClave Chapel. **7. Phillip<sup>2</sup> Lewis** (John<sup>1</sup>) was born Apr 1877 in Llanedy, Carmarthenshire, Wales. He married **Mary** 1903 in Wales. She was born Abt. 1875 in Wales.

Notes for Phillip Lewis:

I decided to try to find Daniel's brother Phillip who was born abt. 1875. In the 1891 census, Phillip was 15 years-old and living at home in Llanedy, Wales. I did not find a match in the 1901 census for Wales.

However, in the 1900 census, Philip is living with his brother Samuel and his family in Connellsville, county of Fayette, Pennsylvania.

1910 census I found a Phillip Lewis in Morgantown, WV with wife Mary and children Gladis, Glenn and Olwen. Phillip is working as a heater in the tin mill.

1920 census Phillip (age 45) and Mary (age 45) are living in Baltimore, Maryland with children Glyndon [16] (Glenn), Olwen [14], a name I cannot make out...it looks like Iris but it's a son [7], and Brinley [5].

Trudy verified these people as she remembers visiting her Uncle Phillip in Baltimore and remembers the children "Ollie" and Brinley.

I cannot find Phillip in the 1930 census, however, I found Glenn Lewis (25) on S. Ellwood Avenue, Baltimore, MD with his wife Eva (22) and his children Mary (3) and Phillip E.(1), as well as, his brother Brinley (16). There were several possibilities for a match to Mary Lewis in the 1930 census.

I checked the Social Security Death Index and found Phillip E. Lewis (Phillip's grandson) of Baltimore ... born September 25, 1928 and died March 5, 1995.

Notes for Mary:

Phillip was Mary's second husband ... first husband unknown.

**9. Alice Maud<sup>3</sup> Lewis** (Daniel<sup>2</sup>, John<sup>1</sup>) was born 11 Aug 1890 in Llanedy, Carmarthenshire, Wales, and died 08 Dec 1964 in Steubenville, Ohio. She married **George Samuel Heckman** 15 Jan 1909 in Follansbee, West Virginia, son of Noah Heckman and Carrie McCullough. He was born 09 Feb 1886 in Clarion, PA, and died 11 Aug 1977 in Weirton Medical Center, Weirton, WV.

Notes for Alice Maud Lewis:

Grandma (Alice Maud) was 8 years old when she arrived at Ellis Island ... oh how I wish I'd asked her questions. She kept her Welsh language skills and, according to my dad (Harry Heckman) whenever she and Uncle Bill (Lewis) wanted to talk about something and not let anyone else know what it was, they would speak Welsh. Oh how I wish I had asked questions and learned!!

Between Grandma and my dad, I was taught to count to ten in Welsh, to say Cup of tea and a bite of cheese ... I just can't spell it :->. They also taught me to say Llanfairpwllgwyngyllgogerychwyrndrobwll-llantysiliogogoch .. which is the name of a town in Wales that is about as big as its name! We went there so we could buy souvenirs with the name on it! haha It is now legally called Llanfair PG ... but not to the town's folk!

Notes for George Samuel Heckman:

Buried in St. John's Cemetery, Eldersville Rd, Follansbee, WV

1910 Census:

Living in the 2nd ward of Follansbee, Brooke Co, WV. He's 24-years-old and working as a Screw Big in the Tin Mill (Follansbee Steel). He and Alice Maud have a boarder...Georgia Whitaker, age 16 and born in Ohio. She is a laborer in a glass house.

In 1920 George and Alice are living in New Kensington, PA where he is listed as a laborer. Also in the home are Ellsworth (age 9), Harry (7), George (5) and Mary Alice (3). Also living with them is Alic's brother, George Alber Lewis (age 10).

In the 1930 US Census, they have returned to Follansbee, WV and George is working as a Tinner in the Steel Mill (Follansbee Steel). Also in the home are Ellsworth (19), Harry (17), George (15), Mary Alice (13), Alice's brother George (20) who is a salesman in a department store, Alice's nephews Lyman (22) and Kenneth Lewis (20). Lyman is working as a Chemist in the Steel Mill and Kenneth was working in the Tin Mill.

I, (Alice) Marlene Heckman Daniels have entered this information in the Family Tree. George and Alice Maud were my grandparents...Harry was my father.

Notes for Grover Ellsworth Heckman:

Ells is buried in Weirton at the cemetery at the top of Cove hill. He died from cancer of the jaw and mouth.

Ells quit school early and went to work in the mill in Follansbee to help the family live. They had a house full of people living there! He went on to make a very good living from the mill.

He first married Winifred Jenkins (Aunt Win) and they were married for 16 years before she died of cancer. My only memory of Aunt Win is going to the funeral home when she died...I wasn't very old. I just remember walking in the room and Uncle Ells saying, "There's my girl"... and I thought I was going to puff out of my dress coz I was so proud!! haha

About 1960, he married Alice McLain Durbin . She was a widow with 3 children...Carolyn, Jane and NED (Neal Edwin Durbin). Carolyn was grown when they married and Jane was probably in junior high or high school. NED was about 7-8. Aunt Alice was a great lady...and her kids were pretty great, too.

Uncle Ells was an avid golfer and a well respected one, too.

**10. Luther<sup>3</sup> Lewis** (Daniel<sup>2</sup>, John<sup>1</sup>) was born 1892 in Llanedy, Carmarthenshire, Wales, and died 1943 in Fairmont, WV. He married **(1) Mabel** Abt. 1908. She was born 1887 in unknown, and died 1926 in Follansbee, WV. He married **(2) Mary Stocks** Abt. 1926. She was born 1892 in Follansbee, WV, and died 1956 in Follansbee, WV.

Notes for Luther Lewis:

Buried in Oak Grove Cemetery, Hooverson Heights, Follansbee, WV

Although the complete facts are not known, from all accounts it appears that Luther adopted Lyman and Ken from a children's home in Steubenville. I have heard conflicting reports on the story. One story is that Mable (their mother) had placed them in the home and then Luther got them out when he married Mary.

The other report is that Mabel nor Luther were their biological parents but that Luther adopted them. I do recall my dad (Harry Heckman) saying that Ken & Lyman always considered Mary to be their mother and that they adored Luther. [on 6/16/05 in a conversation with my mother, she insisted that Mabel was their birth mother but she did not know who their father was].

Trudy told me that Luther and Mary were living in Fairmont, WV when he died. They had been standing out on the balcony of their apartment looking across at a cemetery. Luther said, "There's a place I hope I don't go to any time soon." They then retired for the night and were laying in bed talking. He suddenly quit answering Mary and she realized something was wrong. He passed quickly...reportedly due to a blood clot breaking loose.

Trudy was pregnant for her son George when Uncle Luke died. He was really looking forward to her baby being born. His death caused Trudy to have some difficulties with her pregnancy...but, as we know, her curly haired wonderful son was born just fine! :->)

Information from Ruth Pierce:

WWI Draft Registration Cards 1917-1918

Luther is age 25, working as a mill worker in the tin mill at Follansbee Brothers Steel, Follansbee, WV, he has a wife and 2 children. This throws a wrench in the theories of who the parents are for Lyman and Ken!!

In the 1930 US Census, Luther is 38-years-old, working as a roller in the mill and he is now marries to Mary Stocks. H.E.Lewis, Former J&L Head, Dies

Pneumonia Fatal at 66 to Retired Steel Executive

H. Edgar Lewis, who came to America as the son of an immigrant Welsh tin mill roller and rose to president and board chairman of Jones & Laughlin, died of pneumonia at his home here early Sunday. He was 66.

Mr. Lewis, who lived at 210 Tennyson avenue, Oakland, was stricken with pneumonia last Tuesday, but he had been in ill health for more than two years. It was his health that prompted him to resign his posts as head of J. & L. in February 1947.

The rise of Horace Edgar Lewis as a key figure in industry is in the best American tradition. He was born in Pontardulais, Wales, and came to the United States in 1896.

Joined J. & L. in 1936

By 1916 he was executive vice president of Bethlehem Steel Company. He joined J. & L. in 1936, when he was elected chairman of the board.

In 1938, at the resignation of S. E. Hackett, he was elected president of J. & L., the fourth largest steel company in the nation.

He guided J. & L. during the war years. In 1942, when he was rumored as a Republican candidate for governor, he promptly scotched the talk by announcing that he felt he could be of more use to America's war effort at Jones & Laughlin.

### First Job in Duquesne Works

The Lewis family first settled in Harrisburg, then moved to Martins Ferry, O., where H. E. Lewis obtained a grade and high school education.

In 1899, when he was 17, he took a job as steelworker in the Duquesne works of Carnegie Steel.

In 1906 he left Carnegie, worked a short while for the Passaic Steel Company in New Jersey, then joined Bethlehem.

Ten years later he was its executive vice president. In 1930 he left Bethlehem to become chairman of the board of Jeffrey Manufacturing Company of Columbus, O.

### Interested in Sports, Philanthropy

In his personal and business life, Mr. Lewis shied away from publicity. His two main interests, however, were sports and an anonymous activity in philanthropy.

He was an excellent soccer player as a boy and helped develop an interest in the game in the United States. For arranging matches between United States and foreign teams, he has been called the "father of soccer in America." Golf was another hobby.

Mr. Lewis was active also in Community Chest work, city planning committees and Pittsburgh's Civic Opera. He is survived by his wife, Mrs. Helen Sanders Lewis, formerly of St. Paul, Minn.; a daughter, Mrs. Emily Lewis Gillespie of Long Island, N. Y.; two sons, James Edgar Lewis of Los Angeles, and Edgar Sanders Lewis, San Francisco; three sisters, Mrs. Charles R. Holton of Bethlehem, Pa., Mrs. Robert Chew and Mrs. Olive L. Fowler, both of Lakewood, O.; three brothers, W. Luther Lewis, New York City, T. Albert Lewis of Bethlehem, and A. W. Lewis of Pasadena, Cal., and four grandchildren.

### Funeral to be Tuesday

Mr. Lewis' club memberships included the Pittsburgh Chamber of Commerce, the Duquesne Club, the Fox Chapel Country Club and the Pittsburgh Golf Club. He was a member of the Episcopal Church.

He was a director of the Jeffrey Manufacturing Company and British Jeffrey Diamond, Limited, and had been a director of the Kelsey-Hayes Wheel Company and the Ohio Malleable Iron Company. In addition, he was an honorary vice president of the American Iron and Steel Institute.

Funeral services will be held at 4 P.M. Tuesday at his home. He will be buried in St. Paul, Minn., the home of Mrs. Lewis.

Son of a steel worker Lewis came to the United States at the age of 14 and within three years was employed by the Carnegie Steel Company. He soon joined Charles Schwab's proteges in Bethlehem, Pennsylvania and wound up a \$400,000 a year vice president of the Bethlehem Steel Company. In the industry, it is commonly accepted that he quit this job in 1930 on a matter of policy, his stand being on the humane side. He then almost immediately became chairman of the Jeffrey Manufacturing Company of Columbus, Ohio and in 1936 was elected chairman of the board of directors of Jones and Laughlin and two years later was chosen as president. He served in these capacities until 1947 when he resigned because of his health, impaired by his duties guiding his enterprises through World War Two and the nation's recovery program. Such a talented man as this offered all his outstanding ability to soccer as well as his ever open purse, but like so many others, refused to become involved in the welter of petty politics and quit the effort. He withdrew entirely from the game a victim of the system that for many years prevented soccer from becoming a major sport in the United States. At one time there was nothing that Edgar Lewis would not do for soccer and under the banner of the Bethlehem Steel Company he recruited from Britain one of the great teams of American soccer history. He was the driving force behind the great Bethlehem Steel teams from 1915 through to 1930 and instrumental in the formation of the American Soccer League, becoming its first president. His teams won the U.S. Open Cup in 1915, 1916, 1918, 1919 and 1926. The American F.A. Cup in 1916, 1917, 1918, 1919 and 1924. Bethlehem Steel was also one of the most powerful teams in the American Soccer League winning the championship in the 1921-22 (as Philadelphia) and in the 1926-27 season and finishing second in 1922-23, 1923-24, 1924-25, 1927-28, and the Lewis Cup competition in 1928. He donated the Lewis Cup, which at first was awarded to the winners of the special ASL cup competition, but following the so called "soccer war" between the USFA and the American Soccer League in 1928, withdrew the cup from competition for a while. In later years it was awarded to the ASL league champions and in recent years has disappeared.

Disillusioned by the entire soccer situation he withdrew Bethlehem Steel from soccer competition entirely in the summer of 1930.

I'm not certain why these stories were included in the information given me ...perhaps because Helen worked in the Steubenville library... but I found them very interesting stories. I grew up in the Ohio Valley and never heard these stories. It's probably a good thing or I would have never crossed the Market Street Bridge (which passes over Route 7, the highway mentioned here) and gone into Steubenville!

Note No. 1: THE GHOST IN THE LIBRARY TOWER

(From a printed document obtained at the library.)

In the 1890s steel magnate Andrew Carnegie began giving away his fortune to build public libraries. He first endowed places that had influenced his early life; in Ohio that meant Sandusky, East Liverpool-and Steubenville, where the 15-year-old Carnegie had been a telegrapher.

The Steubenville Library was designed to be a \$50,000 building with a commanding peaked roof, massive twin chimneys and a 105-foot stone clock tower. Construction began in 1901 in Steubenville's South End; the mammoth building loomed over the modest homes surrounding it. Halfway through the project, money ran out and Carnegie was asked for a supplemental grant of \$12,500; he generously gave it. When the building was nearly finished, it became apparent that the money wouldn't stretch to buy the four-sided clock for the tower. A third appeal to Carnegie was met with silence. A Library Board member later reported that Carnegie had remarked, "Let them buy watches!"

The enormous building opened on March 12, 1902. The first librarian of the new Carnegie Library was Ellen Summers Wilson of Albany, New York. When she first took up her new post, her office stood behind the main library desk. However, when the trustees complained of having to climb the 31 steps up the spiral staircase to the Trustee Room in the clock tower, Miss Wilson's office was moved to the former Trustee Room. Two years later, she died of a heart attack, possibly brought on by the 62 steps required to get from her office to the circulation desk.

Immediately stories began to circulate about strange noises in the attic of the library, of creaking sounds and footsteps heard from the unoccupied attic. The ghost of Miss Wilson, of course, keeping an eye on things from her lofty domain.

Today the Ghost in the Library Attic is practically an institution in Steubenville; a staff sign on the attic door proclaims, "Home of the Library Ghost." Strangely creaking beams and odd breathing noises from the cooling ducts still haunt the library. Today the attic houses modern air conditioning equipment that mysteriously turned itself off for no apparent reason-until the controls were moved downstairs. Is it the ghost of Miss Wilson, annoyed at her banishment to the Tower? Or Andrew Carnegie, trying to pinch some pennies?

A wintry encounter with the Steubenville Ghost.

(This account obtained from the Internet.)

Our encounter with the Steubenville Ghost was very surprising because we didn't believe in such phenomena. If I had imbibed, or been by myself, I would probably have turned to some professional for help after the experience. I say we, because I was not the only participant.

The late Clarence R. Coulter, who's family still reside in Akron, Oh. and I owned Halbert and Coulter Construction Co., Inc. in Wheeling W.Va. Early morning of December 30, 1948 he drove his new Hudson as we went into a small factory at 1817 E. High Ave. in Youngstown, Oh. It was an unusual day for that time of year in northeast Ohio. It was an overcast day with temperatures in the forties. I give you this because records can verify the accuracy of my memory.

About 11:00 am. in the office of Storm Sash, Inc. a radio announced an extreme cold front was approaching carrying extremely hazardous icing conditions. It warned everyone to get off the roads and streets shortly.

We went to a little greasy spoon nearby and prepared to leave earlier than planned to try to beat the severe weather. We concluded our business and left about 2:00 pm. As we proceeded south on Market St. we came to the south edge of town and Schotts Restaurant on the east side of the street. It was a well-known establishment that was only closed and torn down a few years ago.

Neither of us was smart enough to be too afraid, and we were both great optimists. We couldn't resist a feast. We ate with no drinks. We had parked about 20 feet from the front door. As we stepped out of the door, we almost fell on the predicted glare ice, so we held onto the car fenders and anything else for support to keep from falling. We were agile and very active young men.

We saw no traffic moving. We entered his car and sat there debating if we should try to find some place to stay. Since New Years Eve was the following day, we preferred to be home in Wheeling for it. We decided since we were experienced drivers in inclement weather, and no traffic was moving, if we proceeded at 20 or 25 miles per hour and slid into something, we might bend a fender, but unlikely to be injured, so we decided to go home.

We proceeded south on Route 7 and already to the point where it turned east to East Liverpool, Ohio. There we encountered two emergency vehicles crawling along. There were no others moving until we next traveled through the small town of Steubenville and came to our place of encounter. The temperature had plummeted and was now biting cold.

About some twenty miles south of Steubenville on the old highway, we came to a place flat and even as a floor. At the north end of it the Ohio River turned east maybe a 1/4 to 1/2 mile, then south a ways, then turned back west to the highway. There had been a town there on that low plain but it was washed away in the Great Flood of 1936.

As we entered this plain from the north, we saw a string of maybe six cars entering it and approaching us from the south end. After passing only 2 moving vehicles in about 3 hours, this struck us as very strange. Suddenly, the lead car moved over and back again on this very straight road. Those behind did the same in a serpentine line. We remarked that maybe an animal was down or something had fallen onto the road that they were trying to avoid hitting. When they came to us, they passed us making a sloshing, drumming sound as if they were in heavy water on the pavement. This eerie sound seemed weird to us since the road was smooth glare ice.

We proceeded and came to that place where the strange maneuvering had occurred, and a woman in a white gossamer gown with a veil over her head put up her hand to stop us.

We thought she was dressed in a wedding gown. There was a lot of crime activity in the Wheeling, Steubenville, Pittsburgh triangle we were in. We thought she might be there to stop us for robbery, as we looked prosperous. But no one would be out there with others lying in a ditch for that kind of activity in the bitter weather conditions we were in.

Clarence steered gently into the left lane. Man or beast could not have stood to move quickly on that uncleared, untreated glare ice. When she saw we were trying to pass her by, she floated smoothly and quickly over into the left lane. Fearing we might hit her, we steered back into our right lane as she quickly glided or floated back to it and stood in front of our approaching car. It was either hit her or stop. As we stopped before striking her, she moved back on the berm of the road and we came to a complete stop with her standing by the right hand door where I sat. We were confused and scared, but completely lucid and in control. I rolled the window down about 4 or 5 inches. She sounded like someone in a complete alcohol or drugged stupor as if her tongue was very thick. She leaned down and her face was maybe 18 inches from mine. She asked if we were going to Steubenville. She kept repeating it and I said "any fool could see that we just came from there". Clarence leaned forward to see her past me, and tried to get some sense out of her. I was sure I was going to see here in a police lineup for identification, so I stared intently at her face looking for any marks or features whereby I could positively identify her.

I suddenly realized she was featureless. There were dark spots where there should have been eyes, nostrils and mouth, but she was like smoke. In back of her to the west against the foot of the hill, a house had been recently built. As we were both staring into her face, someone turned on a light in the front of that house, and we saw it - through her.

We were suddenly very scared. He was a semi-pro fighter, and I was not a coward either. I was afraid she might enter the car. I'll never forget my exact words as I cranked the window closed, "let's get the hell out of here". We went spinning our tires out of there to a night club/bar down the road at maybe Tiltonsville or Yorkville. We slid into the lot, stopped by the front door, as there was only one customer there. We clung to the car to the steps, entered where I called the Ohio State Patrol and told them someone should investigate. If that was a human being we left there, it would be a terrible thing to have done. Hearing no news, I called the patrol office two days later. The dispatcher laughed me off the phone saying they received no such report. I replied they had, since I gave it. In 1961, I moved to Topeka, Kansas. During the course of business, I met an Air Force Staff Sergeant based here at Forbes Field. I don't remember his name. In a conversation I began to tell him about the forgoing experience. Before I mentioned the name of the town as I related the event, he pulled on his pipe and said "that was the Steubenville Ghost". Somewhat surprised, I asked how he knew about it. Since I hadn't yet mentioned that she wanted to go to Steubenville. He said, "matter of fact, I was reading about her just last week". She is one of the phenomena many people still discuss. I asked if he know anything about her. I don't believe I ever referred to her as the Steubenville Ghost before that time. He said the most general or plausible explanation was this. In downtown Steubenville on the west side of the main street sits an old small frame church. I believe it was a

Congregational or Episcopalian Church. He asked if I remembered that church. Of course I did. He said the prevailing wisdom was that she was a young lady near Rayland, Ohio, dressed up and in a buggy at that point on her way to that little mid-town church for her wedding. Maybe a riverboat whistle, something spooked her horse which bolted and threw her from the carriage where she struck her head on a rock and was killed. I told him I often thought of returning to see if I could meet her again. Maybe we should have given her a ride. He said I had better be glad we hadn't. He said he didn't know if it was true in this case, but that there were reports of similar incidences where the apparitions were given a ride and those who gave the ride disappeared to never be seen again.

This is all I know of this phenomenon. After all these years and the former roadway having been made into a divided 4 lane, maybe she doesn't appear now. But I would really like to know the whole story. Maybe what I've given here will fit into other known pieces.
