APPRENTICESHIP AGREEMENT

17 April 1894

David Henry Davies and J. J. Cordes & Co Ltd.

MEMORANDUM of AGREEMENT

made the 22nd day of May 1896 between David Henry Davies son of Joseph Hale Davies of Newport in the County of Monmouth, Mason, of the one part And J. J. Cordes & Co Ltd of Newport aforesaid Nail Makers, herinafter called the company of the other part, Whereby the said David Henry Davies of his own free will and with the consent of his said father doth agree to serve the Company from the 17th day of April 1894 to the 17 th day of April 1900 at the following rates of wages, vide licet - six shillings per week of fifty four working hours for the first year, seven shillings per week of fifty four working hours for the second year, eight shillings per week of fifty four working hours for the third year, nine shillings per week of fifty four working hours for the fourth year, thirteen shillings per week of fifty four working hours for the fifth year and fifteen shillings per week of fifty four working hours for the sixth year. AND the said Joseph Hale Davies hereby agrees that the said David Henry Davies his son shall faithfully serve the company and they the said company hereby agree to employ the said David Henry Davies in 'Mason's Work' and to pay him wages at the rates aforesaid so long as he shall continue in their service within the specified period. AND the company shall have the power to discharge the said David Henry Davies for wilfully absenting himself from his employment or for any other gross misbehaviour or neglect.

In Memoriam Mrs Davies

On Sunday morning, January 11th, there passed away from our midst a sister whose record has been one of untiring devotion to the cause of her Master, Christ. Harriet Davies started life on this side February 7th, 1847. Quite early she commenced work at Pontnewydd, within Pontypool Circuit. In Sunday School, in Band of Hope, and in the many forms of service connected with churches, Mrs Davies has been one of the most dependable souls. For about 14 years the family was located in one of the villages of the then Swindon Circuit, and there, as at the first home, and later in Newport, she was diligent in doing what she could. But her special record has been in connection with the Lyne Road Mission of Newport Circuit. As seller of tea, lecture and concert tickets, her work has had no end. As the manager of teas and efforts to keep the cause going, she has sacrificed much time and strength, and fought on

despite discouragements many. She was well known by those disposed to help, and sometimes, perhaps often, succeeded in securing help where others would have failed. The metal of which she was made shown in this. When, on account of bad weather, her husband, who earnestly shared her work, would have dissuaded her from going to the service, she would reply: "It is the Lord's work; we shall take no harm." In later months of her life, however her strength evidenced signs of decline, and ultimately bronchitis and heart trouble sent her to bed, from which she never rose again to take part in any work either of church or of domestic kind. She suffered much, but with resignation, save that at times she prayed that if it were the Lord's will she would like to depart. For her the call to go higher was a great release and a triumph, though for the husband, five daughters, and two sons, her going was a sad loss. Yet are they and we sure she is in the Light; and so, with that picture in the mind, we would move on until we join the shining hosts. To a sorrowful yet assured company the writer spoke in a memorial service held on Sunday evening, January 18th. To her family and fellow-workers may her memory be a continuous inspiration and call.
