Jacksons unit stationed in Bay Point until Nov. 15, 1862 when they were transferred to Camp Heyward in Hardeeville, SC they remained there until march 15, 1863. He re- enlisted in July 15, 1862. Andrew hurt his leg during war and walked with limp afterwards.

Jackson & Caroline made their home in the Cummings Area through the 1880's then moved to H & B Junction 4 or 5 miles out of Lodge, SC. Both are buried at Carters Ford Baptist Church in Lodge.

His parents apparently migrated to Germany, because it was from Germany that he and his wife and children came to America. They came with other emigrants from the Lower Palatinate on the Rhine River to Germany. Isaac and his family probably arrived on the Oliver which docked in Charleston, SC on July 20, 1735. The SC Gazette of July 26, 1735 says of the arrival of the ship Oliver:

On Sunday last arrived here Capt. Robert Robinson mentioned in our last, with about 200 Palatines, most of them being poor, they are obliged to sell themselves and their children for their passages (which is six Pistoles in Gold per head) within a fortnight from the time of arrival according to the agreement the made with the Captain, or else to pay one Pistole per head more to be carried to Philadelphia.

It is certain that Isaac indentured himself for on Feb. 22, 1738/39 he petitioned for 350 acres of land stating that he was now out of servitude and listing a family consisting of himself, his wife, one son 15 yr. old (Charles), daughter 16 (Anna), daughter 13 (Sarah) one son 12 (Peter) and a son 2 (Jacob). His grant of 350 acres on Limestone Creek and town lot No. 282 on Fenwick Street was surveyed on JUL 25, 1739. He received the Royal Grant on March 1, 1744.

Isaac took an interest in the affairs of the community and the local Church. Reverend John Ulrich Giessendanner mentions his name on several occasions in the church record and recorded his death as follows.

1752 - On Monday Aug. 17 was buried the Body of Isaac Hottow, a Settler in this township for Several years past, who died suddenly on Sat. Aug. 15th in the Evening in the Path, as he was going home and was found and taken up dead between his house and the Town of Orangeburgh, no Mark, of any Fall or Violence done him could be seen on his Body. He left a wife and 7

children, 4 of which are married. He was aged 57 years and buried at his own plantation.

His widow, Mary Catharina remarried in 1753.

A fortunate circumstance is the Rev. John Giessendanner who was a Luthran minister IN 1738 and who was ordained in the Church of England in 1749 kept a record of baptisms, marriages, and death of his congregation, without this careful records the beginnings of the Hutto clan would be virtually unknown.

And because Sherman burned Orangeburgs courthouse, only a few of the present Hutto lines have been

carried back to the children and grandchildren of Isaac & maria Catherina. He spelled the name Hutto as Huttow/Otto/&Hottow.

To Thomas, Matthew and James before mention estate to be equally divided between them except that half the wheat after James has his is to be divided between Thomas and Mathew and 2 cows called Nanny and Cherry and one cow calf and half an ox which I give to son James and other half of said ox to Thomas, residue of goods and chattels to equally divided between sons Thomas and Matthew sons Thomas and James executors. Witnesses: Joseph Tanner, John X. Cocke. Elizabeth was the daughter of Captain Matthew Gough of Henrico Co. a Burgess for the session March 2 1942-43.

Census of 1624-25 - there were 680 free people and 467 white servants and 23 Negroes. Of the freemen 25 left descendants in well known families which can be traced to the present day. Eight of the servants were ancestors of Virginia families of the same standing. Among the freemen referred to one of these

was Christopher Branch, 1620. The Father and grandfather of Christopher are styled gentlemen, but his great grandfather was a prosperous merchant of Abington.

Christopher sailed on the ship "London Marchment" with his wife Mary Addie and 9 month old Som Thomas. Christopher and Mary married at St. Peters in London, England. Christopher and his wife Mary settled in College Land Virginia and they were listed on the town roll in 1623. He also lived on the James River at Arrowhattocks and Kingsland in Henrico County, Virginia. Grants of land received from the Crown, are shown on Captain John Smiths original map of Virginia. Christopher became a Justice and member of House of Burgess. His third Great Grandfather was Sir John Branch, Lord Mayor of Abington.

Due to his father Lionel having been disinherited from the family fortune and because of his unthriftiness, the financial circumstances of this 18 year old son Christopher, were not very favorable. This is what may have been what led Christopher and his bride to seek a better life in the New World. Christopher and Mary came to Henrico County near, Jamestown Virginia in March of 1619/20. They came on ship which was dispatched by the Virginia Company(also know as the London company).They sailed from Tilburyhope in England with 200 passengers. The settlement in and around Jamestown was the first permanent English settlement in America. When Christopher and Mary arrived the population was about one thousand. The first colonists arrived in 1607. In the Early days Christopher was of of the four married men since women were scarce in the community. In the census muster of 1624-25 Christopher and Mary and nine month old son Thomas were living in College Land Virginia.It was a large tract of land in Henrico County which was to be used as a place where the Indians would learn the Christian

religion. In the words of the colonists the land was set aside "to erect and build a college in Virginia for the training and bringing up infidel's children to the true knowledge of God and understanding of righteousness". This plan was abandoned in 1622 after the massacre of 350 colonists by the Indians, led by the Chief Opechancanough. Mary died about 1630 and there is no record of Christopher ever remarrying. In October 1634, Christopher patented 100 acres at Arrowhattocks in Henrico County, which includes part of what is now Chesterfield County. Arrowhattocks was on the north side of the James River. It is shown on the Map of Captain John Smith, who was the leader of the Virginia settlement. The eventual and permanent home of Christopher was Kingsland

his plantation immediately opposite of Arrowhattocks, on the south side of the James River, in what is now Chesterfield county. At Kingsland he patented another 100 acres in Sept. 1636. Christopher was a successful tobacco farmer. He also acquired a large plantation in the extreme northeast part of Chesterfield, bounded on the north by the James River and the south by Proctors Creek. Kingsland Creed runs through he property and takes its name from Christopher's plantation. He was a slave owner. The first slaves arrived in Jamestown in 1619 about the time he arrived from England. He represented Henrico County in the Virginia House of Burgess in 1629 which was the first democratic legislative body in America. In 1656 he was appointed a justice was literate for he wrote the will of John Ely. That will left a bequest To Master Christopher Branch, Sr. for writing my will, 100 good hogshead of tobacco. At the time of Christophers death, in either Dec. 1681 or Jan. two of which were well-worn Bibles. Thomas Jefferson third president of The United State and the author of the Declaration of Independence was the gr-gr-grandson of Christopher and Mary Branch.
