

Descendants of Hugh Brown

Generation No. 1

1. Hugh¹ Brown was born 1716 in Melford, Argyllshire, Scotland, and died Oct 18, 1794 in Robeson County, North Carolina. He married **(1) Mary Buie** in Cumberland County, North Carolina. She was born Abt. 1725 in Jura, Scotland, and died Abt. 1825 in Robeson County, North Carolina.

Notes for Hugh Brown:

Residence

Hugh Brown was born in Scotland in 1716 and died 18 October 1794 in Robeson County, North Carolina. Hugh Brown left from Clachan Seil, Scotland sometime between 1739-1745 with his brother Duncan Brown to come to Cumberland County, North Carolina as disclosed in a letter written dated 16th of August 1820 from his nephew, Neill Brown of Melford, Scotland (See Hugh Brown Documents below). It is believed that Hugh Brown first married in Scotland and had two children, Daniel and Peter Brown. Apparently his first wife died, and he then came to North Carolina. Here he married Mary Buie and reared the rest of his family. Mary Buie was born about 1725 in Jura, Scotland, and died about 1825 in Robeson County North Carolina.

A list of land transactions trace Hugh Brown's migration from Scotland to his final home on Richland Swamp near Philadelphus, North Carolina in Robeson County Colonial records indicate Hugh Brown purchased 100 acres of land in Cumberland County (then a part of Bladen County) the 12th day of March 1745/6. According to Cumberland and Robeson County records (see table below) he may have lived in as many as five different locations during his life time.

Hugh Brown had ten children according to his family Bible. As mentioned above Daniel and Peter Brown were from his first marriage and the remaining eight children were from his marriage with Mary Buie. Daniel and Peter Brown were probably born in Scotland and came to North Carolina as small children with their father and Uncle Duncan Brown.

Neill, John and Catherine Brown were born in Cumberland County, North Carolina on Silver Run Creek. William, Mary, Hugh Brown, Jr. , and Ann Brown were probably born on Trantham's Creek in Cumberland County, North Carolina. Duncan Brown was probably born on Richland Swamp near Philadelphus, North Carolina.

At the on set of the Revolutionary War, Hugh Brown was 60 years old and living in Robeson County Two of his sons, William Brown and Hugh Brown, Jr. served as colonels during the Revolutionary War, and another son, Neill Brown was "a friend to his country" during the war.

Will

Hugh Brown died on 18th of October 1794 the age of 78. According to his will he left 950 acres of land to his wife and children as follows:

Mary Buie died about 1825 at age 100 years, and is buried beside her husband in the Brown Cemetery near Philadelphus, North Carolina in Robeson County

I Hugh Brown of North Carolina Robeson County through the abundant mercy and goodness of God, tho, weak in body, yet of a sound and perfect understanding and memory do make this my Last Will & Testament as follows

Item- I give and bequeath to my dearly beloved wife the plantation I now live on and Negro Clo and the child that is now at her breast, the black horse, the bay mare and colt, and gray filley and the most part of the stock as long as she lives with Duncan my son and at her death the whole to be and remain my son Duncan's and all land joining the plantation in all four hundred acres.

Item- I give and bequeath to my son Hugh a Negro boy named Lingo and two hundred acres of land above my son William's where he now lives.

Item- I give and bequeath to my son William a Negro boy named Simon and fifty acres of land joining John.

Item- I give to my son Neill Negro Sall and two hundred acres of land on Gilles Branch where Alexander Campbell now lives.

Item- I give and bequeath to my son John one hundred acres of land on Rockfish Creek near John Stewart and Jonstones.

Item- I give to my daughter Anna a Negro girl named Chaine.

Item- I give and bequeath to my daughter Mary one cow and calf in witness whereof have hereunto set my hand and seal September 28, 1789. (signed) Hugh Brown Witnesses: John Fort and Neill Brown

WILL & TESTAMENT OF DANIEL BROWN - 1811 - Robeson County, North Carolina

State of South Carolina, Williamsburgh District.

Know all men by these presents that I, Daniel Brown of the State and District aforesaid now in perfect health enjoying the proper exercise of all my intellectual powers unimpaired do at the request of Katherine Brown my wife, give up and renounce all liens or claims whatsoever to all and every part of the property held and possessed by her previous to our marriage consisting of four Negroes, London, Amey, Davie and Nancy who was born last summer, one horse and some other stock, one bed and furniture to be held and disposed of forever at her pleasure. In witness I do hereunto set my hand and seal this the twenty fourth day of April and in the year of our Lord eighteen hundred and eleven. (Signed) Daniel Brown Witnesses: Neill Brown & D. Buie.

North Carolina Archives - Robeson County Wills 1783-1935 - C.R. 083.801.2

Daniel Brown, son of Hugh Brown, was born 20 March 1740 in Scotland. Daniel was Hugh Brown's first child, and believed to be from his first marriage. It is thought that Daniel's mother died some time after 1745 either in Scotland or soon after arriving in Cumberland County, North Carolina. Little is known about Daniel. He is mentioned in his uncle Duncan Brown's will in 1761, but beyond that point family historians have been unable to determine more about him. (See also, Peter Brown, brother of Daniel Brown)

Generation No. 2

2. Neill² Brown (Hugh¹) was born Feb 15, 1747/48 in Cumberland County, North Carolina, and died Dec 11, 1835 in Philadelphus, Robeson County, North Carolina. He married **Nancy Ann Smith**, daughter of Malcom Smith and Sarah Patterson. She was born Jul 17, 1752 in Cumberland County, North Carolina, and died Sep 07, 1838 in Philadelphus, Robeson County, North Carolina.

Notes for Neill Brown:

Early land grants give some clue to Neill Brown's migration from Cumberland County to Robeson County (a part of Bladen County prior to 1787).

Date Bought/Sold Acres Location

2 February 1779 Bought 200 Bladen (later Robeson) "a cypress pond"

7 November 1779 Bought 100 Bladen (later Robeson) Bear Swamp

25 April 1785 Sold 100 Cumberland County Cabin Creek on lower side of Rockfish Creek

Neill Brown sold 100 acres (above) on Cabin Creek to Malcolm Smith, his father-in-law, and the deed indicates that Neill was from Bladen (Robeson) County. It is therefore believed that Neill and Ann Brown moved to the Richland Swamp area near Philadelphus, North Carolina sometime between 1779-1785.

Neill Brown was a tailor in addition to being a plantation owner. He was also a justice of the peace for some 25 years. He was an early family historian as his journal reflects. He was a "Whig" in politics and helped his country (United States of America) during the Revolutionary War.

General Assembly of North Carolina

Neill Brown was one of the two first representatives from Robeson County to the North Carolina General Assembly from 1787-1790. During this period of service to his county, state and country, he was a delegate to the convention at Hillsborough, North Carolina to ratify the United States Constitution. Following are excerpts from the Journal of the Convention of North Carolina 1788 and 1789 from North Carolina State Records Volume 22:

Hillsborough Convention - "At a convention begun and held at Hillsborough on the twenty-fifth day of July [1788]...The returning officers of the several counties certified that the following persons were duly elected as members of this Convention viz: For Robeson, John Willis, John Cade, Elias Barns, Neill Brown, and John Regan. " The convention was convened to consider the Constitution of the United States and failed to ratify it. The vote was 84 for and 184 against ratification. The Robeson County delegates voted as follows: Neill Brown, Elias Barns, John Cade, and John Willis, for ratification, and John Regan, against ratification (page 25).

All of the delegates except John Regan were returned to the next convention which ratified the Constitution of the United States. North Carolina did not ratify the Constitution until it was amended to include a "Bill of Rights".

Journal of the Convention of North Carolina 1788 - "Monday, August 4, 1788 - Met according to adjournment. Mr. William Barry Grove, according to order, presented the following protest subscribed by the persons whose name are there unto annexed, to wit: Dissentient: Because the establishment of a seat of government in a place unconnected with commerce, and where there is at present no town, will be attended with a heavy expense to the people, and the town when established, never can rise above the degree of a village: The experience of Virginia and Maryland have given a striking proof of this in the towns of Williamsburg and Annapolis. Because the establishment of the seat of government at Fayetteville would have a great and instantaneous effect upon the decayed commerce of this country, by holding out immediate advantage to those who are employed in the culture of tobacco and other valuable articles of export, the principal part of which is now exported from Virginia and South Carolina. Because it should be the policy of this State to encourage a great commercial town at the head of the best navigation in the State; a situation which seems intended by nature to command the produce of the interior settlements...(pages 34-35)." [Note: 119 persons, all members of the Convention, signed the protest, among them Neill Brown, Elias Barns, John Cade, and John Willis, members from Robeson County This was evidently a protest against the selection of the present site of Raleigh, N C, as the "place for holding the future meeting of the General Assembly, and the place of residence of the chief officers of the State."]

Journal of the Convention of North Carolina 1789 - "At a Convention begun and held at Fayetteville on the third Monday of November, 1789 agreeable to the resolution of the late General Assembly bearing the date 7th of November 1788, the returning officers for the several counties and borough towns certified that the following persons were duly elected to represent the same in convention, to wit: ... for Robeson: Neill Brown, John Willis, Elias Barns, John Cade, Sion Alford." This convention ratified the Constitution of the United States, and thus North Carolina became the 12th State to enter the federal union under its present Constitution. All of the Robeson County delegates voted to ratify the Constitution. The final vote was 195 for and 77 against ratification.

Neill Brown was a devout Christian and was one of the charter members of Philadelphus Presbyterian Church. He was a ruling Elder in the Philadelphus Presbyterian Church for more than thirty five years. He was also active in the formation and support of the Philadelphus Academy.

Neill Brown, Esq.
Fayetteville Observer
12th December 1835

At his residence in Robeson County, on Friday evening the 11th instance, Neill Brown, Esq., in the 88th year of his age. He was one of those patriots who took a decided stand in favor of his country in our revolutionary struggle. He was elected a delegate to the Convention, which met in Hillsborough in July 1788, and for three successive years he represented the County of Robeson in the State Legislature. He was an active Justice of the Peace for more than 25 years and an Elder of the Presbyterian Church for more than 30 years. In all the various

relations sustained through a long life, as father, neighbor and master, but few were more esteemed. And what affords to his numerous friends and relations the greatest consolation, he died with a full assurance of a resurrection unto eternal life.

Neill Brown Will

In the Name of God, Amen. I Neill Brown of Robeson County being of sound mind and memory, blessed be God, do this the third day of July in the Year of our Lord One Thousand Eight Hundred and thirty four make and publish this my last will and Testament in manner following:

That is to say: To my son Hugh Brown, I give and bequeath three hundred and forty two acres of land, including all the improved lands on which I live. Also one hundred acres known by the name "Cow pens", and two hundred and fifty acres in three surveys, including old improvements on both sides of Bear Swamp; also one hundred acres tract called the Piney Bay land; also one bed and furniture; one half of my stock of sheep; also one third part of my stock of cattle, and one half of my stock of hogs; also one half of my plantation tools and half of my still.

To my son William H. Brown, I give and bequeath two hundred and fifty acres of land in three surveys on both sides of Bear Swamp, lying between Campbell's Mill and Peter Dial; also one bed and furniture, one half of my stock of sheep, one third part of my stock of cattle, and one half stock of hogs, and one half of my plantation tools and one half of my still.

I give and bequeath to my daughter Mary, two beds and furniture, one-third part of my stock of cattle.

To my son Archibald S. Brown, I give and bequeath ten dollars.

To my daughter Ann, I give and bequeath one dollar.

To my daughter Catherine, I give and bequeath one dollar.

To my daughter Elizabeth, I give and bequeath one dollar.

To my daughter Margaret, I give and bequeath one dollar.

And I hereby make and ordain my sons William H. Brown and Hugh Brown, executors of my last will and testament, with full discretionary powers.

In witness whereof, I the said Neill Brown, have to this my last will and testament set my hand and seal, the day and year above written.

Notes for Mary Brown:

Mary (Polly) Brown, born 1 July 1777 and died 31 July 1865 was never married. It has been told by family members that she remembered the British soldiers coming in her father's home during the Revolutionary War searching for her father as he was a patriot. When Sherman's army came through North Carolina in 1863 during the War Between the States, some soldiers commenced searching through some trunks at her brother's home (William H Brown) and she told them to "get out!", she was not afraid of them as she had had a childhood experience with the British soldiers. Mary Brown was a "pious and esteemed lady" according to James McCallum, Clerk of the Session of Philadelphus Presbyterian Church in a letter to William H. Brown, regarding a bequest of \$300 left to the Church by her to maintain an "orthodox Presbyterian Minister." She is buried in the Brown Cemetery near Philadelphus, North Carolina.

Notes for John Brown:

Little is know about the first three children of John Brown and Ala Bennett. However, considerable work has been done to trace the descendants of John Byars Brown. From the book Kinsfolks by William Curry Harllee the following is written on page 1303 about this family. "John Byars Brown married Susanna Alford and migrated to the Hatchet Creek community known as Brownsville, Alabama then in Talladega County and now Clay County This settlement is about 10 miles from Good Water, Alabama. The church of this community is called Hatchet Creek Presbyterian Church and the names Brownsville and Hatchet Creek are used interchangeably to designate this community. John Byars Brown and wife Susanna Alford were buried at Hatchet Creek Presbyterian Church which he helped organize in 1835. He was a ruling elder in this church from organization until the time of his death. Many man have gone out from this church to make outstanding careers in business and professional world."

Notes for William Brown:

Revolutionary War

William Brown was a colonel in the North Carolina Militia during the Revolutionary War. He was attached to General Francis Marion's command and had under his command approximately 200 men. He was ordered to "proceed immediately against the insurgents of 'that' county on Little Pee Dee, on the Frontier of South Carolina." In a letter from General Francis Marion to Major General Gates 4 October 1780, General Marion stated that he had delivered nine prisoners to Colonel Brown taken at B. Mingo, and three of the 63 Regt. taken at the Great Savanna. He further stated that at this time, Colonel Brown had about 100 men and was within eight miles of him. The letter was written from Drowning Creek, South Carolina near Cheraw, South Carolina. Several of the descendants of William Brown have been members of the Daughters of the American Revolution based on his military service.

General Assembly of North Carolina

William Brown served as Senator from Robeson County to the North Carolina General Assembly for two years (1817 and 1818).

Residence

William Brown and Mary Campbell lived in Robeson County near Philadelphus, North Carolina on Richland Swamp after the War had ended. He was a ruling elder in the Philadelphus Presbyterian Church for 36 years. He was also President of the Robeson County Bible Society. William died the 8 March 1826 in his 70th year. He and his wife are buried in the Brown Cemetery near Philadelphus, North Carolina.

Notes for John Fort:

About 1798 or shortly thereafter, Mary Brown and John Fort moved to Wayne County, Georgia. In 1810 he was serving as a commissioner of Wayne County Academy and in 1825 was a member of the Georgia Senate. John Fort died on the night of 25 August 1840, and his wife on 3 September 1839.

DIED, on the 13th instance at his residence in Maury County, Tennessee, Colonel Hugh Brown, in the 90th year of his age.

Col. Brown was a native of North Carolina. He served in the Revolutionary War under General Marion, and he was, for many years, a member of the General Assembly of his Native State.

The confidence reposed in him by his fellow citizens, furnishes the evidence that he was early imbued with the love of liberty, and that spirit of independence which constituted a prominent feature of his character.

At a very early age, he made a profession of religion and united with the Presbyterian Church, in which he was a consistent and prominent member until his death. The precise time is not know to the writer, but it is supposed that he was a church member for nearly or quite seventy years, and a ruling elder during the greater part of the time.

He settled in Maury County a few hundred yards from the spot on which he died, in the year 1814, and he was the nucleus of the Bethesda Church which grew up in the neighborhood under the pastoral labors of a younger brother, the Reverend Duncan Brown DD., who still lives in the same County Having imbibed the spirit of liberty

in the Revolutionary War struggle, and cultivated his love of freedom in the legislative hall when our republic was rising up from the formation state, it is not surprising that Col. Brown should manifest a strong partiality and an unusual zeal for Presbyterianism. He knew what part Presbyterians enacted in that memorable contest for freedom, and how much the framers of our civil government were indebted to those principles which constitute the distinctive features of Presbyterianism for the free institutions handed down to us.

The most striking feature in the Christian character of our deceased friend, was a strong confidence in a superintending Providence and his ardent love for the doctrines of grace set forth in the Confession of Faith of the Presbyterian Church. His religion was not, however, a mere attachment to party; nor was it periodical. He loved the sanctuary and "delighted in the law of the Lord." Worship in his family and attendance on all the ordinances of God's house, was as but a part of his life---as the superintendence of his farm and the support of his family. But a few Sabbaths before his death, he occupied his place in the house of God. When taken with his last illness, he was strongly impressed with the belief that he would not recover, and, although his mind had been failing for several months previous, he now spoke of death and his future prospects with great clearness and consistency. When his Minister first entered his sick-room and inquired how he was, he replied, "I am very near my Father's house." He expressed much gratification that he had called, and said that he had been very anxious to see him that he might relate his experience, and as he was troubled with doubts. He then narrated with much animation several incidents in his early life, which led him to commit himself to God, and had convinced him of the efficiency of prayer. When asked why he doubted, "Oh," he said, "I have done so many things that I ought not to have done, and I have left undone so many things that I ought to have done." A deep conviction of his own unworthiness, and an unwavering confidence in the mercy of God in Christ characterized his conversation until he was unable to speak. He suffered much but he was perfectly resigned, and waited calmly for the announcement of the Bridegroom's coming, as one whose lamp was trimmed and whose vessel was furnished with oil. At midnight the voice was heard; but he was not startled, ---"Life's duty was done, as sinks the clay, light from its load the Spirit flies," and goes into the marriage supper of the Lamb; where, as we fondly trust, it is commingling with kindred spirits that have gone before, all dressed in the bright unspotted robes of the redeemed.

The above Obituary appeared in the Presbyterian Record, published at Nashville, Tennessee, May 31, 1851.

The following inscription is on the tombstone:

"Col. Hugh Brown died May 13th, 1851, in the 90th year of his age. Blessed are the dead which die in the Lord, from hence-forth; yea, saith the Spirit, that they may rest from their labors, and their works do follow them."

Dear Cousin William,

With pleasure the fore sent opportunity is embraced of dropping you a few lines. We have been long separated from each other and it may be we may never have personal intercourse again. We are many miles apart and family concerns require our notices.

Nothing of importance and interest have ever transpired in the connection, but I have made an effort to communicate and I have now the most sad obligation to write that has ever yet fallen to my lot, viz. The death of my dear and (I hope) Christian Mother who departed this life on Sunday night the 8th of last month (July). For the last few years of her life she was much afflicted. And at this news interesting circumstances in her last days, I cannot forbear mentioning at least some. Some time we before her departure, she required Father to collect all his children together, and to get Doctor Hardin (who is our minister), to preach the funeral, and accordingly, he did so, and a day much weeping it was.

One day some weeks before her death, she came out of her room and asked Father if he heard her last night. He answered, no. She said Death came to the door and she opened both her arms to receive him, and she could not but rejoice. The day before her departure, Father went into her room and asked her how she felt. She answered,

"My dear, I shall soon leave you, and be with my Sweet Jesus. I was with him a little while this morning, but could not stay. But shall soon be with my Sweet Jesus to return no more." Thus she left the world in this triumph of faith, retaining her senses to the last, giving testimony to the truth of the religion of Christ that the righteous have hope in their death.

Through the blessings of a kind Providence, we are all in common health. Uncle Duncan and family were all well a few days ago. Cousin William Brown from Talladega in Alabama came to see us last winter.

Our crops of corn for the present year will be very short in this neighborhood. We have had a severer drought than any I have seen since I have been in Tennessee, through some neighborhoods have been very seasonable, so that we calculate on plenty being made in the country. There was an abundant wheat crop with us the last year, which will make bread more plenty, and I am of the opinion, there will be a considerable made.

We are all married but brother William. He is yet single. Two weeks ago we heard from Giles County The McCallum's and connection were all well.

Dear Cousin, I would be glad on the reception of this you would write me as it has been a long time since we heard from Carolina. This letter is intended for you and the rest of our connection.

Dear and affectionate Cousin William,

Through the care of a kind Providence I am once more permitted to drop you a few lines, though with a hand trembling.

The changes which time brings are sometimes Joyous, and sometimes Grievous. At present it falls to my lot to communicate the sad intelligence of the Death of our many years stricken Father (Col. Hugh Brown) who departed this life on the 13th of last month (May) after patiently suffering a confinement of 17 days. His disease was what the doctors were pleased to call an inflammation of the stomach. He was given to hiccup pretty much during his sickness, loathing food, yet craving drink. During his illness, he was calm, patient, and submissive. And though for two days before his Death his speech failed, it did not appear to effect his patience in the least. We could see nothing distressing in his countenance, and thus quietly he left us, as we hope, to rest in the bosom of his Savior, free from the turmoil's of this sin-smitten world. He appeared to anticipate his death from the time he was taken ill by frequently expressing that he was near his journey's end, and that he could last but a little while in his 90th year.

During his sickness he was attended by all his children, except Brother Joseph who lives in Memphis, 200 miles from us, and Sister Elisa McCallum who lives in Pulaskie, Giles County, 40 miles. Uncle Duncan was also with us, all which appeared to minister to his comfort.

Dear Cousin the last letter from you was directed to Father which gave him and also others great satisfaction, especially to hear that you were all well. That you had gained you lawsuit and that the deed he had executed to you and others, for the benefit of Philadelphus Church was rightly arranged and satisfactory. His prayer was that the Church might grow and become a strong vine, producing the fruits of righteousness.

Dear Cousin you and I in some degree, have to occupy the Christian Station which our Fathers did. May the Lord grant us grace that we may glorify His name. The Church (by Divine Grace) committed to your nursing in concert with others is the Church in which our Fathers worshiped and in which you and I were given to the same service. Can we be too careful to hold forth the Truth as it is revealed to us in the Word of Life. These recollections and such are touching and should prompt us to know our duty and discharge the same.

Two weeks ago I read a letter from our Cousin Elias Fort in Georgia in which he stated that they are all well. He himself has had bad health for the last 12 months and that his hand trembles so much he can scarcely write intelligible (Which is truly my condition.) and that Uncle James is Dead. I have lately heard from Mississippi. Our friends were generally well as far as I could learn. I last week heard from Cousin Hugh Smith who lives in the West part of this State. They were all well except one son who has returned from California enjoying bad health. Two of his sons has been there for some time. There has been considerable immigration from this State to Texas, and yet many talk of going.

There is great scarcity of provisions among us at this time---corn, \$3 per barrel, which is 5 bushels higher than for many years; bacon, 10 cents per pound. So far in this year we have been blessed with favorable seasons and the present crop promises an abundant harvest is coming on with plenty to all appearances.

My Dear Cousin I must close by requesting a continuance of your communication with me. Give my respects to relations and friends.

Dear Mother,

Yours of 11th of April came to hand, by which we read the pleasing intelligence that you and other friends were well. I cannot write the same to you respecting my family. For three weeks past my wife has some affliction with the Rheumatism in both her knees; but has not been continued, and is getting rather better. About two weeks ago past, Elizabeth was attacked pretty severely and the chills and fever came with it. But through the kind Providence and the appreciation of medicine, the disease was properly checked in a few days, and she is now pursuing domestic employments, as usually. About a week past I was attacked with what maybe termed Influnca and have suffered considerably with cough, headache, inflammatory sore throat, and some fever, but neither of these symptoms are as distrpine now as they were except the cough.

I have made out to attend school through my sickness. Our little daughter is well and growing fast, and is termed by all who see her as almost an exception for forwardness in knowledge, and for beauty and activity. She is scarcely three months old and can stand with little assistance. You may think me vain in this representation, but it is true. Perhaps we are in danger of idolizing our tender offspring. We love her dearly 'tis true, but I hope our regard for her is lawful.

I preach at the same place where I formerly preached. Some of them are far from here; one 25, another 20, and one 15 miles from this place. I also preach in this awfully declined little town, as usually, but am often thinking that I ought to cease casting (as I think) pearls before swine. May the Lord awaken sinners to a right sense of their danger.

Catherine, Betsey, and myself for one, and little Catherine Ann, presume our best wishes for you all.
