George Earl Hickman known as Uncle Earl by his nieces and served in the fight against the Mexican General Villa, the First Second World Wars. At the time of Pearl Harbor, he was First Company M21st Infantry, Hawaiian Division. At this time he Verdun medal, Purple Heart, Silver Star, Mexican, and First 1 medals among others.

In a letter to his sister, Rosa (Hickman) Ballengee dated 8 Nov Uncle Earl wrote:

Dear Sister,

I received your letter today and the candy you sent me also.

Was glad to hear from you and don't see why your letter was you. I got your candy all right and it was good.

You said you saw in the paper where there had been a battle I must tell you so you will not be uneasy about me. I have join and like it all right.

I was in that battle you read about and came out without a scratch. Perhaps the papers made it worse than it really was, but it was. There were not many U. S. soldiers killed, but lots of Mexican. The battle started Nov 2 at 1:37 P. M. and lasted three days. There was a continuous roar of cannon and small guns all the scared so bad I didn't know what to do for a little while, but I used to it. I saw hundreds of men and horses killed and some to me, but I guess I was lucky and was never touched.

I am in Company H, 18th Infantry. Perhaps you saw in the paper shrapnel burst in the H Company's trench and killed some U. I was in that trench and the man on my right side got killed and by my feet.

I was out on the battlefield today and saw about 500 Mexican piled up in piles of 20 or 30 ready to burn tonight. They never dead. They just pile them up and burn them.

There were no U. S. soldiers burned. They were fast sent away buried here.

The trouble is all over now and the Mexican army has moved that did not get killed.

You can do as you please about telling them at home about the army. I don't want to tell them.

I am driving an automobile that hauls supplies, but I had to go trenches just the same.

I like the army fine and I sure saw a sight that would be impossible

worth seeing.

Don't be uneasy about me. If anything happens to me you will know once. I wear an aluminum tag around my neck with my name and address on it so if anything happens, they will know and who to notify.

There will be no more trouble here so don't be uneasy about it. Gen. Villa got nearly all his men killed so he has gone back to Mexico City.

Well I will close for this time. Write me all the news and I will write just as soon as I hear from you.

As per previous announcement a monument was erected to the memory of Henry Young, on Powells Mountain, on Tuesday, August 26, 1897.

Powells Mountain is situated northeast of Summersville in Nicholas County. The distance from the northern to the western base is eight or nine miles, which the Western and Gauley Bridge Turnpike runs, there being no other road over the mountain.

Here on top of this beautiful elevation, at the western end, near the summit, about five miles from the northern base, and just as you start to descend to the western end of the mountain, about 15 miles from Summersville on the road, and about five miles from the Braxton County line on the north-west, Henry Young, a confederate, was shot by the Federal soldiers on September 8, 1861 and was buried a few days later by the citizens a short distance from where he was killed.

His grave designated as the "lone grave" on the top of this high, desolate mountain, remained for nearly 36 years, unmarked except by a few roots and surrounded by growing timber until a few weeks ago when his friends learned that a monument be erected to perpetuate his memory and to show as a proper degree of respect in which

his memory was cherished by his numerous relatives and friends. The suggestion was followed up by prompt action, and there now stands, as of Thursday was dedicated to his memory, a beautiful marble shaft, (made by T.H. Hawkins of Sutton) inscribed on one side "Henry Young born _____, 20, 1827, was killed by Federal soldiers, September 8, 1861". On another side was found a very appropriate verse as follows:

Remember friends as you pass by
That all mankind are born to die;
Then let your cares in Christ be cast,
That you may dwell with him at last.

On another side is this inscription: Lucinda, wife of Henry Young born _____, 26, 1829, died _____. By and by the remains of this aged and devoted wife will be deposited by the mouldering dust of her husband.

Ann Slaven is buried at the Liberty Cemetery near Galt, California but as far as I know Stuart is not. Ann died in 1872. I can easily get the exact date if you need it. Their oldest daughter Mary C. Slaven married Thomas

Lincoln Briggs and had one child named Annie E. E. Briggs. Mary C. Briggs died when Annie was just a toddler near Benicia, CA. In the meantime, Joshua A. Briggs (Thomas Lincoln Briggs' brother) married Sarah E. Slaven. So the Briggs brothers married Slaven sisters. A couple of years later Joshua died leaving his wife, and 2 very young daughters named Mary J. Briggs and Frances E. A. Briggs. Next Thomas Lincoln Briggs married his brothers widow Sarah E. Slaven Briggs.

Stuart and Ann Slaven also had 2 sons named John W. Slaven and Alexander Gilmore Slaven. I don't know what happened to Alexander after 1861 or so. John W. Slaven married a Mary Munsen and they had a son named Gilmore Slaven. Mary Munsen Slaven died in the 1880's and John W. Slaven married someone named Georgia. He remained close to the Briggs girls/nieces and left them money when he died in California in 1906.

An 1869 deed page 452-53 states that Bazzel Young sold for the sum of four hundred dollars a piece of land of one hundred acres more or less which bordered Lucinda James Young's land. Brenda Hickman discovered this deed in an e-mail dated 31 May 2000.

This deed made the 4th day of June Eighteen hundred and sixty-nine between Bazzle Young of the County of Braxton and State of West Virginia and John Elliott of the County of Wirt and state

In the 1830 Census of Nicholas County there were six males in the household counting Bazel. Three of them were 0-5 years of age, one was 15-20 and then Bazel 30-40. There were 2 females listed including Agnes Nancy. The one female child was 5-10 and Agnes was 30-40.

In the 1840 Census of Braxton County there were six males listed in the household counting Bazel. Two of them were 10-15, two were 15-20, 20-30, and Bazel was 40-50. There were 4 females in the household including Agnes Nancy. One female was 0-5, one was 5-10, one was 15-20, and one was 50.

This is the information that I received from William R. Pierson of Arbor, Michigan in 1981:

Basil Young Family: The male 15-20 in 1830 Nicholas County Census was too old to be a son of Basil and Agnes who married in 1817. The male 15-20 in the 1840 Braxton Census is presumably the male 10-15 in the 1830 Census. One of the males 15-20 in 1840 can be present in 1830. Combining with the 1850 Braxton Census, I (William R. Pierson) make the family of Basil Young as follows: Boy born 1817-1820, girl born 1820-1825 either married or died between 1840-50, Andrew J. born 1827-28, boy born 1825-30 (presumably Henry), boy born 1825-30 (possibly one of the sons in 1840 who otherwise died before 1840), Charlotte born 1830-31, Loretta born 1835-36. Combining this with the Bail Family History the latter miss Margaret might be the unidentified girl born 1820-25. Between the two unidentified boys (in the census record), Jonathan was born in 1819 which leaves David born 1825-30.

From Susan Bail Adams 5 Jun 2001: Bazel married Agnes Pierson is my 3rd g-grandmother by her 1st marriage. Because my gg-grandfather was so young when his own father died, and was raised by Bazel, I think he was closer to the Young family. The family Bible reflects that with its lack of information on the Bail family. We have the Bible and don't know who does, but it was used as the basis for the booklet first written in 1941 called "BAIL 1791-1941: A century and a half of progress." The 1791 date being Agnes' birth year.

Just checked the 1860 census of Roane County which borders Wirt and was a B.S. Young listed and a Jonathan Young and a John Young. (Brenda 2001)

One source said she died in 1850. She is listed in the Braxton County Census. In 1860 both she and Bazel are not listed in Braxton County.

Brenda Hickman visited the Wirt County Courthouse in West Virginia on August 7, 1998 where she discovered of Bazel Young's parents on the marriage record for his second marriage Sarah Pickergill. Bazel was born in Kanawha County, VA/WV and his parents are given as Mathias and Nancy Young. Sarah's maiden name was Wick she was born in England.

Researching Mathias Young Records:

Mathias Young married Milly Holliday in 1795 from Kanawha County Marriage Records. Mathias Young married Maria Tate 26 Aug 1838 from Kanawha County Marriage Records. Mathias Young married Nancy Young Hickman 5 Dec 1806 in an undocumented record.

A Mathias Young from Kanawha County was in the War of 1812; he was called to serve from 1 May to 30 Sep 1791 and again from Mar 1 1793.

A biography about Peter Young states that Mathias Young married Sarah Hickman in Greenbrier County, now Fayette County and later moved to Kanawha County then back to Kanawha County where he married Maria Tate. The biography said he died at 57 yrs of age. 13 children by first marriage and the second one.

A report at FHL in Preble Co found by Brenda said that Mathias and Nancy Young had other children born in Wood County, now Wirt Co.

1810 Kanawha County Tax Records show Mathias in what is now Kanawha County. From the information given estimated birth date of 1768, estimated marriage date of 1788, and estimated death date of 1830. Sent for free information offered by Broderbund.

Brenda found in the land tax book of Kanawha County Conrad, Charles, Henry, and Mathias all listed in the 1810, 1811, 1812, and 1813 books; there was a Charles, Conrad, and Henry. In 1808 and 1809 none of them was in it. (may have been in Nicholas book then) In 1793 there was a Mathias Charles. In 1794 there was a Conrad, and in 1796 there was a Conrad and Henry. This was in Kanawha. In 1792 Tithables there was Conrad and Henry. In 1794 and 1795 there was Charles, Conrad, and Mathias. In 1810 Kanawha Census Heads of Household there was Henry with Nicholas Co. and Mathias with Nicholas Co. out from names and Charles with nothing out from 1

(this is same as 1810 Kanawha County County Tax Records above as contained the tax records for 1806 and 1809).

My thoughts (from Deeds):

Why would a man, at the time owning land meant everything, sell someone for one dollar unless it was connected through family in some way? Agnes Nancy Pierson had a brother Joseph and a brother David. Like I said, none of this really proves anything but it is interesting and maybe takes things a little farther. Love, Brenda

So from Brenda's findings we see that a Mathias is living in Nicholas with a wife named Milly in 1823 who sold land on Peters Creek. A Mathias Young also sold land for one dollar to David Pearson and to Joseph Pearson. The first wife of Bazel Young was Agnes Nancy Pierson who had brothers named David and Joseph. We see that Mathias was in Ohio in 1833 from a deed to David Pearson. And the land deed in Ohio in 1835 shows that Mathias was alive at that time about 60 years old.

This part is taken from Campbells History of Nicholas County in 188 Browns History of Nicholas County. The numbers at the start of each sentence/paragraph is the number of the "letter" in his writings.

"Campbell possessed an extraordinary memory for names and facts earliest inhabitants of Nicholas County, and some sixty years following as a travelling justice, he wrote down his reminiscences of the early settlement the way in which they lived. Campbells memoirs have always been held in esteem by historians, and where validation is possible he has seldom been in error in any of his remarks."

1. The first settlement on Peters Creek and at Kesslers Cross Lane Kanawha County was made by Henry Morris, Conrad Young and Edward McClung. They made the start in 1792. Morris built a cabin near where William B. Summers now resides and Young built near where Robert lives.

3.....The Indians were watching a path that led from Morris's cabin to Young's cabin and it is supposed that when night approached they intended to attack and destroy both families. Young was better prepared than Morris had two or three sons with guns ready for defense.

4.....Before midnight Mathias Young, who had traveled eight miles in the dark through the woods came to McClungs cabin and told of the massacre of Morris children.The next day all of the families left for the fort on Kanawha River at the mouth of Hughes Creek.

6.Edward McClung remained in the Kanawha Valley and sold his land to Edward Hughes and John Campbell. Morris and Young stayed in Kanawha the remainder of the year 1792, and in 1793 they returned with their families to homes on Peters Creek.

9.Henry Young made some improvements on Laurel Creek near B Church.

10. Thomas Smith married a daughter of Conrad Young.

12. Thomas Smith settled on the Hughes improvement, Edward Hughes settled on the John D. Grove improvement.....Henry Young settled at places named.

14.Thomas Smith, he having moved to Twenty-Mile.

24. There were some marriages between the family of Henry Morris and that of Conrad Young, but I can't remember all of them now.

25. Conrad Young, one of the pioneer settlers, had three wives and children. I have mentioned three, Mathias, Henry, and Thomas Smith. His son Charles was a good woodman, a daring adventurer, and one of

Conrad Young came to Peters Creek about 1791 and built his cabin above Morris on what was later known as the "Neil Place". He had three sons at the time of the settlement: Mathias, Charles, and Henry. Conrad was married three times and had several other children but no record was found in Nicholas County.

I looked in Braxton Deaths from 1853-1920 and found no deaths listed for Mathias Young as the father. I looked in 1860 Census of Braxton, Calhoun, Gilmer, Harrison, Lewis, Mason, Pendleton, Pocahontas, Randolph, Ritchie, Upshur, and Wirt Counties (which is all the 1860 Census Records the library has) and Bazell Young was not in any of those.

Conrad's father, Hans Mattheus Jung, immigrated to PA from Germany in the early 1700s. Conrad was married twice. His oldest son, by his first marriage to John Young, was the famous frontiersman of Kanawha Co.

Ray Cooley has a copy of a deed of land (Ref: Accomack Co., VA, D 1747, pages 72-73) in which William Hickman gives his son Richard Arthur) the 135 acres of land. The deed does not give the acreage nor describe the land. The date of the will of William Hickman, 1st (the elder) is not cited. However, both William Hickman, 1st. and 2nd. are listed on subsequent deeds from Richard Hickman to Simpson in 1785 and William Hickman in 1786 indicate that the acreage was 135 acres. This is the evidence relevant to linking William Hickman 1st (the elder) of Accomack who died in 1683 being the father of , William Hickman 2nd of Maryland who died in 1785 and Richard Hickman who died after 1785 and was Arthur Hickman's father.
