Source: "The Hull Family in America." Compiled by Col. Weygant. The Hull Family Association. (Note: did not find this will in Manwaring, Vol. 1 but there was a record of an inventory of a Mrs. Hull, p. 132 of Fairfield, valued at £ 29-00-08 taken January 3, 1659 by John Burr and Alexander Knowles. A. Knowles was also a witness to the will of George Hull. However, Col. Weygant states that the Widow Sarah Hull survived her husband "but a few days" and that the inventories were filed together August 25, 1659. Weygant gives no date for the writing of George Hull's will. The Inventory describes the inventory as "of the estate of George Hull, late deceased of Fairfield" . . . Therefore, the question of the Jan. 3, 1659 inventory record for a Mrs. Hull in Fairfield must be further researched. Col. Weygant states that the widow Sarah Hull left a will dated August 12, 1659, naming Philip Pinkney overseer of her estate at Fairfield) This information is also stated in Jacobus' 'Families of Old Fairfield'.

Will of George Hull of Windsor, CT. who died in 1659.

I, George Hull, being feeble in body, yet of good and perfect mind, do now ordain this my last will and testament as followeth:

Imprimus: I give and bequeath unto my loving wife the third part of my estate, yf shee relinquish the twenty pounds which I promised her yf I died before her.

Item: I give and bequeath unto my son Josias Hull another third part of my estate.

Item: I give and bequeath unto my son Cornelius Hull, one little feather bed now in Boston

Item: I give and bequeath also unto Cornelius Hull forty shillings to be paid out of the third of my estate.

Item: I give unto my cousin Jane Pinkney twenty shillings.

Item: I doe by these presents ordain, constitute and make my son Josias Hull and Sarah, my loving wife, the executors of this my last will and testament.

Signed by George Hull.

Witnesses: Alexander Knowles and Philip Pinckney

Item: The rest of my estate, my debts and funeral expenses being payd, I give unto my four daughters, equally to be divided, that is to Mary, Martha, Elizabeth, Naomy.

Signed by George Hull

Witnesses: Alexander Knowles and Philip Pinckney

The inventory valued the estate at: £ 58-14-04 and was taken November 2, 1659 by William Hill, Alexander Knowles and Anthony Wilson. It was attested to by Cornelius Hull before Nathan Gold.

Pg. 11, Weygant quotes Hurd's history of Fairfield CT:

"George Hull was the personal friend and political adherent of Governor Roger Ludlow. He came from England in the same ship [Ludlow and his brother are assumed to have arrived in 1630 aboard the *Mary* and John per NEHGR 147:148 Vol. 147: 'The *Mary* and John, Developing Objective Criteria for a Synthetic Passenger List' by Robert Charles Anderson. Anderson determines that Ludlow et al. were indeed passengers on the ship at 1630], with him and his brother John and Humphrey Pinney, who afterwards married his daughter, Marie (Mary) at Dorchester, moved with him to Windsor, Connecticut, and jointly with him obtained from the general court of 1638, a monopoly of the beaver trade on the Connecticut river. When Ludlow moved to Fairfield, George Hull soon followed him and was selected by the general court as his assistant; and in 1651, 1653 and 1654 he was appointed by the governor as associate magistrate for the towns by the seaside . . . He was public spirited, active and intelligent, and as a legislator and magistrate was instrumental in establishing two of the enlightened commonwealths of New England: Massachusetts and Connecticut. Cotton Mather distinguishes him with a place

in his great book, and places his brother Joseph in his First Classis or List of First Good Men. Mr. Trumbull, the historian of Connecticut, groups him with those whose names are worthy of perpetuation, and Mr. Stiles in his history of Windsor tells us that he was a citizen of worth and distinction."

Hull, who had been licensed as curate there on April 16, 1633; the 1634 entry in the Consignation Book is identical.)

Hull acknowledged his sin and was again received. "Our sister Hull renewed her covenant, renouncing her joining at Yarmouth and confessed her evil in so doing, with sorrow." Before the end of the year Rev. Hull moved his family to York, ME.)

Notes for JOSIAS* HULL:

Per Trumbull's History of Connecticut, Vol. 1, p. 261 the General Court in Oct. of 1665 determined that Hammonascet should be a town. In that Oct. of 1665, 12 planters from Windsor, Hartford and Guilford "fixed" their residences there. The name originally designated was Kennelworth as shown on the Colony records. The name Killingworth was an error in recording, but ultimately that is the name that prevailed. In March of 1663 the general court appointed 3 men to view the lands at "Hommonascitt" and determine if habitable. The committee of three men did determine that the land would be a suitable plantation which they reported to the court in June 1663. Killingworth is now (2001) the town of Clinton. The original settlers numbered 21. The Act of the General Court required 30 families to settle there before the town could incorporate/be granted a patent. This was achieved in 1685. There are two deeds: Jan. 13, 1663 and Nov. 26, 1669 for the purchase from Uncas, Sachem of the Mohegans.

The last will and testament of Warren Hull of Lancaster, County of Erie and State of New York.

I Warren Hull of Lancaster [?] considering the uncertainty of this life do make and publish this my last will and testament as follows:

First. It is my will and desire that my personal property (excepting household furniture) be sold and the avails thereof be applied to the payment of my debts.

Second. It is my further will and desire that my real estate be sold as soon after my decease as it will bring the sum of forty dollars per acre or more and if it will not sell for that sum before the expiration of two years after my decease then my executors are authorized and empowered to sell the same either at publick or private sale at their discretion for the greatest sum that it will bring, on such terms as they shall deem most advisable for the best interests of the estate.

Third. From the avails of my personal and real estate, I give and bequeath to my son James Hull in addition to what I have already given him the sum of fifty dollars.

Fourth. To my son Edmund Hull in like manner, I give and bequeath the sum of three hundred dollars.

Fifth. To my son Justus Hull in like manner I and [sic] bequeath the sum of five hundred dollars.

Sixth. To Adaline Conly and John Conly the children of my deceased daughter Vilera {it looks more like this than the other daughters} I give and bequeath the sum of two hundred dollars each, to be paid to them when they shall arrive at the age of majority but in case of the decease of either of them before that time, then the legacy of said deceased shall be divided equally among my daughters then living - the foregoing legacies are to be in full without any further additions in any case of contingency whatever.

Seventh. To my daughter Polly Lewis I give and bequeath the sum of six hundred dollars.

Eighth. To my daughter Rebecca Tyler I give and bequeath the sum of three hundred and fifty dollars.

Ninth. To my daughter Anna Godfrey I give and bequeath the sum of seven hundred dollars to be paid her in land if it be her desire taken from the south lot and from the south side of the creek.

Tenth. To my daughter Maria Walling I give and bequeath the sum of five hundred dollars.

Eleventh. To my daughter Sophia How [sic] I give and bequeath the sum of seven hundred and fifty dollars.

Twelfth. To my daughter Miranda Conly I give and bequeath the sum of seven hundred and fifty dollars, but in case of her decease without issue then one half of her said legacy shall be refunded and revert to the other legates excepting the five first named.

Thirteenth. To my daughter Aurilla Wheelock I give and bequeath the sum of seven hundred and fifty dollars; but in case of her decease without issue, then one half of her said legacy shall be refunded and revert to the other legatees, excepting the five first named.

Fourteenth. It is my further will and desire, that the above legacies be paid to and received by said legatees in the full satisfaction for all claims and demands against my estate, on previous advances by me to said legatees; excepting my notes of hand bearing even date with this instrument, and all sums of money on other property paid to either of them, hereafter and previous to my decease, are to be deducted from their respective legacies.

Fifteenth. Should my real and personal estate amount to more than the several legacies named in this instrument, then, said surplus, after paying all necessary expences, [sic] shall be divided equally among the legatees, excepting the five first named.

Sixteenth. Of my household furniture, I will and bequeath to my daughter Miranda, one feather bed, one half of the remainder to my daughter Anna, and the other half equally to my other daughters.

Seventeenth. In the sale of my real estate, it is my will and desire that 31 feet square of ground be reserved including the grave yard now on the premises, with the privilege of my surviving relations going to and returning from the same, and my executors are desired to cause a suitable stone wall to enclose the same, the expences of which they are authorised to pay from my estate.

Eighteenth. I do hereby appoint Edmund Hull and Eber T. Howe, my executors and they are hereby authorised and empowered to carry into full and complete effect, this my last will and testament, according to the intent meaning and tenor thereof. And if they or either of them shall neglect or refuse to perform the duties required of them without charge or compensation for the time spent therein, then the legatees on a majority of them shall make choice of some suitable person or persons to act in their steads and when so chosen, they shall have all the powers necessary to perform the duties required of them by this instrument. And I hereby revoke all former wills by me made. In testimony whereof, I have hereunto set my hand and seal at Lancaster aforesaid this twenty first day of March in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirty six.

She was granted a Special Letter of Collectorship but within the week, Aurilla Wheelock, Maria Walling, Rebecca Tyler, their husbands and W. Conly, widower of Vilera, along with Anna Godfrey requested that the court revoke that action and reinstate Edmund Hull to administer the estate.

A full inventory of the estate was submitted by Christian Vinecke and Jeremiah Wiltse on December 24, 1838.

LT. PARDRIDGE, CHICAGO, LOSES LIFE IN CRASH Flying Cadet Wilson Succumbs to Injuries in Second Crash At Same Site

Flying Cadet Harold Wilson of the [?]th Squadron, First Pursuit Group, Selfridge Field, stationed at Chanute to assist in training the reserve officers this month, died at 10:30 p.m. Tuesday evening August 10th, at the Chanute Field hospital from injuries received in an airplane crash on Friday, August 6th at the same spot and a few minutes after Lieut. Partridge, reserve officer, met his death. Military services were conducted at the Hostess House at 11 a.m. Wednesday with Capt. C. P. Futch, post chaplain, officiating. The body was dispatched to his home at Shelbyville, Ill. immediately following the services at the post. It was accompanied by an escort. As was the case at the time of Lieut. Partridge's death, the post and city flags at Chanute Field and Rantoul were flown at half mast.

Two airplane crashes at [believe it gives a morning time] Friday, August 6th occurring within a few minutes of each other at the same spot at the southwestern city limits of Rantoul and a half mile west of Chanute Field resulted in the death of one flyer and the injury of two others.

The reserve officer who lost his life was:

First Lieut. Clinton E. Partridge, 32, of Chicago.

The injured flyers are:

First Lieut. John F. Wolf of Racine, Wisconsin, who was [?] injured.

Flying Cadet Harold Wilson of the First Pursuit Group, whose home is at Shelbyville, Ill. and whose recovery is doubtful.

Lieut. Partridge had been a yearly visitor at Chanute Field for two weeks reserve training. He reported August 1st, bringing with him his four year old son, Clinton Partridge, Jr. and a half brother, fourteen years of age. They stayed at the Martin Hotel upon reporting but later the Lieutenant established himself at the reserve quarters at Chanute Field while his son and half brother were being cared for by Capt. and Mrs. M.H. Welch when the accident occurred.

Lieut. Partridge had come up to do "wing overs" in keeping with that day's schedule of reserve training and had been executing the common maneuver over the fatal spot at the altitude of 1,500 feet when his plane suddenly overshot the "wing over" maneuver and came down with a terrific speed with power on in a half loop, and crashed into the ground.

Though many theories [may be?] applicable in explaining the crash, yet the reason will probably never be known since the plane was smashed beyond any stage that would permit an intelligent investigation into the cause.

Lieut. Wolf, with Flying Cadet Wilson in the front cockpit of a similar training plane, a Curtis JN- 4, popularly termed a "Jenny", were nearby when Partridge crashed and immediately descended to the spot and immediately began circling around to guide rescuers through the eight foot stand of corn in which Partridge's plane had become lost to observers on the ground.

Lieut. Arnold Rich and Sergt. Long [could be Lang] were among the first to reach Partridge, finding him dead in the cockpit of the smashed plane, the motor of which was buried halfway in the ground. They were working to extricate his body when they saw the plane overhead go into a side slip(?) and crash fifty yards away. They immediately ran to offer their aid and extricated the two flyers from the plane before ambulance men, under (continued on page five)

The casket containing the body of Lieut. Partridge was taken to Chanute Field at 5:15 p.m. Friday, from Leonard undertaking parlor, where it was taken after the crash.

Upon arrival at the Field, the casket was taken to the Hostess House where appropriate military ceremonies were held under the direction of Captain C.P. Fuch, post chaplain. The post band played "Nearer My God to

Thee" as the casket was borne to the altar of the Hostess House. There were present the officers of the post and reserve officers. Eight reserve officers served as honorary pall bearers. The usual military service was read.

At the conclusion of the services at the Hostess House, the band took its place before the hearse, and playing Chopin's Funeral March as the cortege moved away from the Hostess House and Chanute Field. The route from the Hostess House to the hearse was lined with officers at salute as Partridge was carried to the hearse.

Saturday morning the body was taken to Chicago with Second Lieutenant A. J. McKesson (?) of Chicago as escort.
