Biographical Record of Jasper County, McGregor. Written about 1900.

Among the prominent and representative farmers of Jasper County is Benjamin Franklin Hatcher, who was born in Overton County, middle Tennessee, on April 7, 1847, and he was the son of Jabez and Paulina J. (Webb) Hatcher, the former of whom was born in Tennessee and reared and educated there. He became a teacher and also engaged in farming, coming to Jasper County, Missouri in 1857. He located on a property, which is still known as the old Hatcher farm, near Webb City, and was one of the old settlers of the county, where he became prominent. At one time he was associate judge of the county and was well and widely known. His death occurred during the war in 1864. The mother of our subject was a sister of John C. Webb, the founder of Webb City, and she is still living, at the age of seventy-six years.

The family of which Benjamin Franklin Hatcher was a member consisted of nine [was correctly 11] children

in which he was the third. When ten years of age he came to Jasper Co. with his parents, in 1857, and he was reared on the old Hatcher homestead and attended the district schools of Joplin township. He remained with his mother, after the death of his father, until his marriage, in 1870, when he purchased a part of the old farm which is not a mining camp, and which he still owns. First he resided in Webb City, and engaged in mining, but about 1888 he bought the farm of one hundred and forty acres upon which he now resides. At that time the place was not attractive as it is now, as there were no improvements, but in 1891 Mr. Hatcher was able to move upon the part which is occupied by his residence. This is beautifully located on a hill and every part of the one hundred and forty acres is in view. Mr. Hatcher has here a model farm, a delightful country residence, with barns and outbuildings of modern style and conducts his operations in farming and cattle raising with success. Mr. Hatcher also owns other property, one farm of one hundred and sixty-five acres in Newton Co., which is well improved and which he rents, and one of one hundred and sixty-five acres in McDonald Co., Missouri on Indian creek which is also rented. He also owns thirty acres of the old home place which is mining land, upon which there are five mining plants, and he gets royalties.

The marriage of Mr. Hatcher was in 1870, to Dora Daugherty, who was born in east Tennessee and was a daughter of W. A. and Nancy (Riggs) Daugherty, who came to Jasper Co. from TN in 1866. Seven sons and four daughters were born to Mr. and Mrs. Hatcher and these are: William, who married Effie Hurley, daughter of Foss Hurley; Frank who married Myrtle Ball, a dau. of James Ball of Webb City, now deceased; Walter James, at home; Pearl, attending Webb City college; Benjamin; Daugherty; Grover C.; Eulalia; Ruth; Era P.; and Ada H. who died at the age of twelve months. All were born on the old homestead in Jasper Co.

Mr. Hatcher was but sixteen years old at the outbreak of the war of 1861 and served for one year in the Confederate army in Company A, Shelby's Regt. He has been a life-long democrat and prominent in the councils of his party, through this section. Socially he is connected with the Masonic order and the I.O.O.F. at Centerville and is a leading member of the Methodist church in Webb City where he is highly valued for his liberality and his Christian character.

Know men by these presents that I Harris Hatcher of the County of Overton and the State of Tennessee, being far advanced in life though being of sound mind and retaining memory and being seised and possessed of some worthy property and money and having a desire to dispose of it in a certain way, do make and declare this to be my last will and testament in the words following to wit: First it is my will and desire that all my just debts be paid together with my burial expense out of my money I may have at the time of my death. Secondly, I do give and bequeath unto my wife Coatney Ann Hatcher and Joseph D. H. Hatcher my youngest son four hundred acres of land known by the name of the Home tract on which the mountain house now stands where I now live to hold jointly and be under the control and management of my wife Coatney Ann Hatcher, I do will and bequeath unto my wife Coatney Ann Hatcher two negro boys, to witt: Jeff March and Sarah to have and to hold her the said Coatney Ann Hatcher and hold and dispose of said slaves as she in her judgment may see proper, and use the value for herself and son, Joseph D. H. Hatcher, in any way she may think proper, the said negro girl Sarah, my wife is to hold during her natural life and on the event of her decease to go to said J.D. H. Hatcher. I do will and bequeath unto Joseph D. H. Hatcher, my son the following named slaves, to witt: Smith, Andrew, Albert, Perry, Ben, Haile, Mariah, Julia, and Chaney. I do will and bequeath unto my son Joseph D. H. Hatcher, two thousand dollars in Gold, I also give and bequeath unto my son Joseph D. H. Hatcher all the land hold upon Eagle Creek, I do will and bequeath to my wife Coatney Ann Hatcher and my son Joseph D. H. Hatcher all the notes and accounts which I may have at the time of my death to have and to use for the education of my son Joseph D. H. Hatcher and for other family purposes. I do will and bequeath to my two daughters, to witt: Feriba Butts and Permelia Brock and their heirs four hundred acres of land except a small piece of said tract, which I have

enclosed adjoining the Hoover tract and lying Northwest of the same to be divided equally between them. I do will and bequeath to my wife Coatney Ann Hatcher and Joseph D. Hatcher all my household and kitchen furniture jointly to be equally divided between them and also all my farming utensils, consisting of various articles and also two weapons and all the horses, mules and cattle and sheep and hogs jointly and son Joseph, I do will and bequeath unto my wife our five carriages and harnesses. I do will and bequeath unto my daughter Arm Taylor, wife of Joseph Taylor, one negro woman named Winnefort. I do hereby revoke and make void all former wills made by me at any time. I do make and decree this to be my last will and testament in testimony whereof I have it is my will that if my son Joseph D. H. Hatcher should die, my son Washington is not to inherit any part of his property hereto set my hand and seal, this 21st day of February 1863.

The Hatcher House

Few houses were as extraordinary as the Harris Hatcher house in the 7th district of Overton County. Mr. Hatcher came to the Upper Cumberland from Buckingham Virginia with James Henry Clark and Benjamin Flowers in 1804. All three men built log cabins at first, lived in them, and planned the homes in which they would eventually live. When they built their larger homes they did it slowly, carefully, and with serious commitment to grace, dignity, beauty and comfort. Their excellence was unbelievable. It was the way of the English and Scotch-Irish to build good homes and in them to live with dignity and grace. They believed in having the best they could afford.

Harris Hatcher built a highly individual house, which had its origin in a dog-trot log house. There was no other exactly like it in design, and there was no other man like Mr. Hatcher. He was a logger, timber man, fine horse owner, store owner, sawmill operator, and a large scale planter on the hundreds of acres of fertile crop lands that he owned. Mr. Hatcher depended upon his own ability and the use of some handbooks in his general directing of the construction of his home; he employed David Andrew Godsey and Dave Sells to build his large log house and there were also his choice to build his mansion. They indeed proved themselves to be skilled artisans and carpenters.

The elegant, starkly white Hatcher house was first a six-room, two-story structure, with twelve-foot ceilings, and three fireplaces. It stood on a solid rock foundation and over a basement. A few years later the same builders altered, added to and enlarged the house and a twelve-room mansion with six fireplaces emerged. Two closed stairways led to the second floor. Perhaps the most interesting of the twelve rooms was one of the two parlors, the oval one which was designed as a part of the original house. All the rooms were spacious, airy, ample, and gracefully proportioned.

Viewing the front exterior of this two-story grandiose mansion, one saw double bay windows on both the first and second floors at the center front, with piazzas on either side across the remaining front. Verandahs were at either side and four doors led to the interior.

The mansion was in a park-like setting amid tall trees and boxwoods. A style-block to make mounting and dismounting horses easier was near the front gate. The cluster of buildings at the rear were kept the same stark white as the house.

All the rooms were furnished with furniture made of cherry, maple, walnut and oak that came from the Hatcher forest. The wood was prepared at the sawmill in the Sugar Camp on the estate, which was operated by Buchanan Matheny and Douglas Matheny. Calvin Harrison and sons made much of the fine furniture in the workshop on the place. One of the apprenticed cabinet makers was young Frederick Sells, a relative of the Hatchers. Some fine mahogany pieces came from the Hatcher General Store and were purchased wholesale in Nashville or up East.

To go with the fine handmade furniture were handcarved mirrors and picture frames, rare glass, choice china, and many elaborate oil lamps throughout the house. There were also practical oil lamps and plenty of candles that were molded by the family or the help.

The carpets were woven in the weaving room, which was on the second floor over the dining room. In this room were the spinning wheels, flax wheels, cards for making bats, shuttles, strands of wool, strands of cotton, and strands of flax. The room was also used for the storing of the wool sheared from the sheep and the feathers plucked from the geese.

One special room was reserved for the salesmen who made the rounds to the Hatcher General Store regularly; it was designated the "drummer room" and was occupied by "drummers" only.

Of particular interest was the kitchen, warmed by a capacious fireplace with a pleasing mantel. Here was a varied collection of early woodenware, wrought-iron pieces, bowls, pots, pans, kettles, molds, spoons, ladles, crocks, paddles, a crank coffee grinder, cedar churns, cedar buckets, and a large wood-burning range. There were also slat-back chairs, tables, benches, cupboards, and a safe, all made in the Hatcher workshop. One found an intimated glimpse in the Hatcher kitchen.

The Harris Hatcher estate was passed on to his son, Joseph Dillard Harris Hatcher. In 1907 the entire estate was purchased by Hardy Keisling and George Allen Knight; Mr. Keisling took the home and the cleared land and Mr. Knight the timbered land, the cemetery, and the store building.

Today this house is still playing its role as a fine, spacious, comfortable house. It has been exceedingly well maintained down through the years. It survives today because it is a great house by reason of the care and upkeep of the successive owners and occupants. It is now the residence of Charles Keisling, son of Roy Keisling and grandson of Hardy Keisling.

Harris Hatcher died during the Civil War, and was buried at the cemetery on the estate. He left 1,000 acres to his wife Courtney Ann Ryan Hatcher and his son Joseph D. Harris Hatcher; at Courtney Ann's death September 14, 1899, Joseph D. Harris inherited the entire estate. In 1908 Joseph D. Harris Hatcher sold his estate to Mr. and Mrs. Hardy Keisling and Mr. and Mrs. George Allen Knight.

This Indenture made this Tenth Day of November, One Thousand Eight Hundred and Twenty Eight, between George W. Sevier and Harris Hatcher both of Overton County and State of Tennessee. Witness, that for and in consideration of the sum of one hundred dollars to him, the said Sevier in hand paid by the said Hatcher the receipt where of is hereby acknowledged has given, granted, bargained and sold and hath by these presents, give, grant, bargain and sell unto the said Harris Hatcher a certain tract or parcel of land situated in Overton County. Beginning on a Forked Dogwood and Black-Gum, the Northwest corner of the tract whereon said Harris Hatcher now lives; then a North Thirty-five degrees East on hundred and sixty poles to two black oaks and a hickory; thence North ten degrees; West sixty-six poles to two white oaks and an ash near the Head of Key's Spring; thence north fifty-six degrees; West one hundred and seventy-four poles to a forked Willow- Oak in a flat; thence North Fifty-two poles to a white poplar in the Barber old fields; thence North, thirty-two degrees; East sixty-five poles to two white-oaks; thence north fourteen degrees; West forty-seven poles, Crossing a Spring Branch at it's sinking to three black-oaks and a hickory; thence South seventy-four degrees West, one hundred and five poles to two black oaks; thence South three degrees west five hundred and twelve poles to the beginning Containing Four hundred acres, with all and singular, the woods, waters and appurtenances thereunto belonging.

To have and to hold to the afore said tract of land and bargained, promises and every part and parcel thereof to the only proper use and benefit of him the said Hatcher, his heirs & C. & C. & C.

Also one other tract of land, lying and being in the County aforesaid, beginning on a White Oak and Black Gum near the head of the big "falling spring"; thence North twenty-one degrees West ten poles to a small hickory above a bluff and the head of said spring; thence North fifteen degrees; East Sixty-four to a White Walnut; thence North Sixty-seven degrees, East nine poles to a White Walnut at a bluff, thence South two degrees East fifteen poles with said bluff to a White Hickory, thence South sixty degrees; East thirty-nine poles to a small ash on the bank of a creek called little Eagle Creek; thence a direct line to the beginning, containing Ten Acres; with all and singular, the woods, waters and appurtenances, thereunto belonging & C. & C. &C.

Next paragraph: "I started to Iowa on the 6th day of September 1849 got there the 6th day of October 1849." Vineyard was heading for Wapello Co. IA where his brother James Porter Brock and wife Permelia Hatcher lived. From the diary: "He was born in Fentress Co. TN in 1816, was married and had 5 children before he left Iowa for Oregon. His wife returned to her father's plantation in Tennessee. Vineyard sent for the three eldest children and his wife kept the two youngest. Giving affidavits for this claim were Russell W. Brock, Lewis McCallister, Miller Morgan and Thomas Ward." It was noted that Mary "Polly" Crawford also left TN on the 6th day of September 1849 and accompanied Vineyard's group to Iowa.

The diary indicates that Vineyard and Russell started for California on the 30th day of April 1850 and arrived in Oregon City, OR on August 30, 1850. The day-by-day account written by Russell begins on June 15, 1850 when they crossed the Platt River at Fort Laramie.

Having proven to the satisfaction of the Register and Receiver of the Land Office for the "Willamette District" in Oregon Territory the fact that such settlement was commenced on the fifteenth day of October in the Year of our Lord one thousand Eight hundred and fifty one, four years prior to the date hereof; and having pursuant to the requirements of the Acts aforesaid, established by live disinterested witnesses the fact of continual residence and cultivation, required by the 4th Section said Act: Now, therefore, BE IT KNOWN, That B Jennings Register, and James Guthrie Jr., Receiver of the Land Office aforesaid, do hereby certify to the Commissioner of the General Land Office the facts aforesaid, accompanied by the evidence thereof, in order that a patent may be issued to said claimant for the tract of land above described: PROVIDED the said Commissioner shall find no valid objection thereto. GIVEN UNDER OUR HANDS at the Land Office in Oregon City this 28 day of February 1851. This contract signed by Vineyard Brock comprises 11 pages (646-659). Ray Schuknecht noted that pg. 654 provides space for a wife's name and Vineyard wrote "Not a married man" in the space.

Vineyard Brock arrived in OR September 30, 1850 and applied for the 320 ac. land grant and took possession of his land October 15, 1851 as he had to be a resident of the County for 1 year to qualify for the land grant. Vineyard gave his brother James Porter Brock a power of attorney to sell his farm in Wapello IA. The sale was July 10, 1852 to Joseph Ralston.

Biographical sketch of John C. Webb by McGregor (from Cox films)

John C. Webb, the founder of Webb City, Missouri, and the owner of a large tract of rich mining land in that locality, died at his home in Webb City, after a lingering illness, on the 13th of April, 1883.

He was born in Overton County, TN, March 12, 1826. His father, Elijah C. Webb, was born in North Carolina and his grandfather, a native of the same state, was a revolutionary soldier. His mother was Martha (Johnson) Webb. John was the second of a large family of children and obtained his education in log school houses in TN. He grew up a farmer, first working with his father on the old homestead farm. In January, 1849, he married Ruth F. Davis in Overton Co. TN, and set up in farming on his own account. Thinking to better his fortunes, in 1856 he removed to Jasper County MO and soon entered from the government two hundred acres of land and procured by purchase one hundred and twenty acres more. He farmed part of this land, erecting a modest dwelling, living for years unconscious of the hidden wealth beneath this soil. Soon after the breaking out of the Civil War, he joined the State Guards, under the call of Governor Jackson, in which he served six months, then going south where he remained during the greater part of the war. Soon after the close of the war he returned to his farm in Jasper County, MO. One day in 1873 he found some lead ore that had evidently been turned up by the plow and on digging at that spot soon unearthed quite a quantity, at a depth of only a few feet from the surface. After this, he laid out the town of Webb City and leased land for mining, receiving a royalty on the lead and zinc mined. His land produced these ores in great abundance and Mr. Webb was soon receiving a large income from his mines.

He was the same quiet, unostentatious Christian gentleman he had ever been. He was quite liberal with his money in behalf of those in need and in aid of public enterprises, churches and colleges. In laying out Webb City he reserved a block of lots for public schools, which he donated to the school district. He also donated the lots and almost unaided built a commodious brick church, which he turned over to the Methodist Episcopal Church South, being a devoted member of that denomination. He contributed much to the growth and development of Webb City, building business blocks and many dwelling houses.

Mr. Webb's wife died some seven years before him. Their children now living are: E.T. Webb, a leading business man and banker of Webb City, and Mrs. Martha E. Hall, wife of W. E. Hall of Carthage. Another daughter Mrs. Mary S. Burgner has died since her father and a son John B. Webb died in 1874.

In ancient England, a gate was frequently build across the highway in forest districts to prevent the escape of deer. This gate was called a "hatch". The suffix "er" means at or near. Hence Hatcher was the name given to one who resided at or near the gate.

Notes for Lawrence* Conner:

He was wounded in the war. Also states that he served with Col. Campbell's regiment, under Capt. Jewett for 18 months and was in battles at Germantown and Monmouth, Gilford Court House; Camden (where he was wounded) and Stony Point.

The Battle of Germantown was October 4, 1777. Pvt. Conner was one of about 11, 000 American troops commanded under General Washington, that attacked the 9,000 british troops who were stationed at Germantown, PA commanded by General Sir William Howe. General Washington's strategy was to completely surround the town and attack from four sides at dawn, but the surprise raid failed as it was a complicated plan and the morning of October 4 brought dense fog to the area. British losses were set at about 535 and American losses were about twice that number. Even though the battle was lost to the Americans and General Washington, it was credited with influencing the French to aid Americans in the war. That winter (Dec. 19, 1777 to June 19, 1778) the continental army, led by General Washington, camped at Valley Forge on the west bank of the Schuylkill River, 22 miles northwest of Philadelphia. This area was occupied by the British, but the site was defensible as it was located on trade routes and near farms for supplies. The army suffered through a harsh winter

and starvation due to mismanagement in the commissary. Much-needed supplies began to arrive after the Franco-American Alliance in Spring of 1778. Many men were lost over that winter, but the army reorganized and was ready for battle by June. The encampment grounds are now the Valley Forge National Historical Park.

On June 28, 1778, Pvt. Conner was in the battle of Monmouth Court House, Monmouth NJ. The British, commanded by Sir Henry Clinton, left Philadelphia and marched through New Jersey, stopping for almost 2 days at Monmouth. Upon leaving, the British army left a small number of its forces at the Monmouth Court House. General George Washington ordered Charles Lee to attack the British rear as they were retreating into NJ. Lee attempted to surround the small force at the Monmouth Court House, but was surprised by the arrival of Lord Cornwallis' rear guard. Lee ordered a retreat. General Washington arrived and rallied his troops, stopped the British advances, and Cornwallis withdrew his troops that night. Camden Co. NJ is located across the Delaware River from Philadelphia and was often held by the British.

Stony Point, Rockland County, is located in southeastern New York on the west bank of the Hudson River. In July 1779, General Anthony Wayne's troops attacked and captured the British post.

The Shawnee Expedition (Dunmore's War)

As the new settlers grew in numbers and migrated ever westward, the Shawnee Indians began attacking these advancing settlers. Governor Dunmore of Virginia and the VA Assembly took action by creating a line of defense at the Ohio River. The Shawnee nation was headquartered in the Scioto River Valley (now Ohio). Per the book *Lawrence Conner of Dublin, Ireland, Virginia and Kentucky*, by Eva B. Conner and Luther C. Conner, Jr., Governor Dunmore sent a letter to Colonel Andrew Lewis of Botetourt Co. on July 12, 1774 in which he stated: "I am sorry to find there is so great a probability of your being engaged in a war with the Indians. Wait no longer for them to attack you, but raise all the men you think willing and able to go down immediately to the mouth of the Great Kanaway, and there build a fort, and, if you think you have forces enough that are willing to follow you, proceed directly to their towns and if possible destroy their towns and magazines; and distress them in every way that is possible; and if you can, keep a communication open between you [and] Wheeling Fort [Fort Fincastle] and Fort Dunmore [at Pittsburg]. I am well persuaded [you] will prevent them from crossing the Ohio any more . . ."

Matthew Arbuckle was an Indian scout who lived on the James River, near the mouth of the Cowpasture River, who was enlisted in Co. Lewis' army as a captain, serving as the guide and scout in the Shawnee campaign.

Governor Dunmore, marched the right wing of the army (over 1000 men), while Col. Lewis marched the left wing from Botetourt Co. The Botetourt army joined units from other counties at Camp Union. The entire left wing then marched 160 miles to the junction of the Great Kanawha and the Ohio Rivers, arriving October 6, 1774. (The troops named this area Point Pleasant) Dunmore's troops were positioned a short distance up the Ohio River, while Lewis' troops remained at the junction of the two rivers. Shawnee Chief Cornstalk attacked Lewis's 1000 plus men on the morning of October 20, 1774.

According to the book: *Lawrence Conner of Dublin, Ireland, Virginia and Kentucky*, by Eva B. Conner and Luther C. Conner, Jr., Col. Lewis ordered two detachments (150 men/detachment) to be formed with men from Augusta Co. and men from Botetourt and Fincastle Counties. The Virginia troops soon determined that they were far outnumbered and retreated. At this time Col. Lewis sent reinforcements, some lead by Capt. Arbuckle. The Shawnee were driven back to the river, and after a day of battle, the Indians retreated and crossed the Ohio River at dark. Fatalities suffered by the Virginians were thirty privates and eleven officers.

This battlefield is now a state park known as the Point Pleasant Battle Monument State Park situated in West Virginia. According to a brochure published by the Division of Tourism and Parks, West Virginia: The Battle of Point Pleasant has become officially known as the first battle of the revolution.

Cumberland Co. KY was formed at 1798 from Green Co. All the area was once a part of Kentucky Co. VA, which was divided into 3 counties: Fayette, Jefferson, and Lincoln. Lincoln Co. was split and part became Green Co. in 1792.

The first white settlers arrived in what is present day Washington County in the 1760's. Daniel Boone explored this area during his expeditions to Kentucky. His dogs were attacked by wolves near present day Abingdon., as a result he called the Abingdon area, Wolf Hills. Washington County was formed from Fincastle County in 1777, the county seat, Abingdon was formed in 1778. The original Washington County, VA in addition to containing some of the other present day surrounding counties also contained what is today, Sullivan County, TN.

PETER GILSTRAP - 1795 Will Craven County, North Carolina

In the name of God, Amen, the 10th day of November 1795, I, Peter Gilstrap of the county and state aforesaid. Planter, being in perfect mind and memory, thanks be given to God therefore calling to mind the mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die, do make and ordain this my last will and testament, that is to say: Principally and first of all I give and recommend my soul into the hands of God that gave it, and for my body I recommend to the earth to be buried in a Christian like and decent manner at the discretion of my Executrix and Executor, nothing doubting but at the general resurrection I shall receive the same again by the mighty power of God, and as touching such worldly estate wherewith in this life, I give and dispose of the same in the following manner and form:

Imprimis, it is my will and I do order that in the first place all my just debts and funeral charges be paid and satisfied.

Item, that in this manner I lend to my well beloved wife, Mary Gilstrap, the plantation whereon I now live, the same containing 76 acres, that is if she shall choose to sell it and to go into the back country and carry the children with her, her deed shall be good, otherwise if she continues here at her death the said land shall be sold and the money equally divided betwixt these four children: Polly Gilstrap, Bright Gilstrap, Welthy Gilstrap, and Winifred Gilstrap.
