SOLOMON HABEEB BAYOUTH (Excerpts from a 1998 interview of Kaline (Kay) M. Bayouth by the Tulsa World Newspaper)

Solomon `Sol` H. Bayouth was about 14 when he came to America to seek his fortune and ultimately established a small empire of dry good stores throughout Northeast Oklahoma.

When Sol Bayouth arrived in America in 1903, he went directly to Wichita, Kan. where an uncle was in the wholesale dry goods business. The uncle `loaded a suitcase with merchandise and strapped it to my father's back and sent him out to sell,` said K.M. `Kay` Bayouth, Sr. -- the second generation to operate the Collinsville Bayouth store. The young salesman traveled south into Indian Territory, going from farmhouse to farmhouse on foot. He found such success within seven months that he was able to buy a hard-covered wagon and team of horses. He established a sales route between Wichita and Oklahoma City, replenishing his stock at both ends from wholesalers, Kay said. 1905 was the year Sol first began peddling in the Collinsville area, recalling in an old newspaper article that, `most of the people lived in log houses and had plenty of corn bread and molasses.` It would be slightly more than a decade before he opened a store in Collinsville.

His first store was in Aline near Enid in western Oklahoma. `That was in about 1911,` said Kay, adding, `I was born there in 1913.` Kay said his father not only came to America because it was a prosperous nation, but followed the best prosperity he could find after arriving. `He went to Aline because that was wheat country and wheat meant money.`

Later, hearing about even more prosperity in the northeast Oklahoma oil fields, Sol closed up shop and moved his family to Oilton, opening his second store in the midst of the 1915 oil boom. An oil well fire forced Sol from Oilton, said Kay. `The fire burned an entire block full of businesses to the ground. He had nothing left. He was totally wiped out without a penny to his name.`

Again following prosperity, Sol packed up his family and headed to Collinsville, where he heard the world's two largest smelters operated. `He didn't have a penny, but managed to open a little store and talked some dry good wholesalers into advancing him some merchandise based on his good reputation. They knew him as an honest businessman,` explained Kay. That was in 1916 and it wasn't long after he arrived that he arranged for a loan from H.E. Huland (president of the local bank).

Sol's wife Aliha, who bore him seven children, died a decade after he became a Collinsville merchant. They had married in 1910 in Wichita, Ks. His father was broken hearted, said Kay. `He packed us kids up and took us back to Lebanon. We stayed there 18 months and those of us old enough went to school. He did not go back to marry, but met Salwa Andeel there and married her. She was the greatest mother anyone could have. She raised us kids and gave us four more siblings,`

said Kay, who was nine years old when the trip to Lebanon was made. The youngest of the original seven children was just a baby then, Kay recalled. Kay's older sister, Louise, helped Sol raise the younger children until he remarried.

The Collinsville store remained open during the nearly two years of Sol's absence. He had turned operations over to his brother Sam. Some time after returning, Sol purchased the two-story Lee building next door to his then existing business Bayouth's has operated from that location at the corner of 11th and Main streets since.

The elder Bayouth set the pace for civic involvement for the rest of the family members who eventually operated stores in various other northeast Oklahoma cities. He served as president of the Collinsville Chamber of Commerce and the local Eagle Lodge and was treasurer of the Masonic lodge for more than three decades. He also was Noble Grand of the Odd Fellow Lodge four term. In addition to many other civic accomplishments, Sol was the promoter and financier of the Collinsville veterans building. During World War II, Sol was chairman of several war drives such as gathering scrap iron, U.S.O., Red Cross and War Bond sales. `He did it all. He was the biggest promoter of the country and the war effort and he made sure Collinsville was always the first to go over the top on any of the war effort drives,` recalls Kay.

Kay did not begin working for his father until after high school graduation. He was too busy with academics and athletics. `I lettered in football and basketball four years, baseball three years and track two years.` He especially loved football and basketball. `I started every game and never missed one.` His school football career spanned six years, not because he spent six years in high school, but because `I was good enough to play on the high school team when I was younger even though I really wasn't supposed to.` The smallest player on the team, Kay played guard much of the time and was the team's starting quarterback his final two years. He was not alone in his love of sports. `We all played sports,` he said of his brothers. That love of athletics by the entire Bayouth family remains evident today. Over the years, all Bayouth stores were the central gathering spots for high school coaches, players and any other sports enthusiasts.

His working days in the Collinsville Bayouth store began right after high school graduation in 1934. Kay didn't get to go to college. That was during the Depression and it was very difficult, he said, for Sol to keep the business going. `There were days he'd sit in the store all day long without a single customer coming in. No one had any money. He traded with farmers for chickens, pecans, milk and other food to keep us going.` Sol was never a quitter. He kept going after the Oilton fire and when sales were few and far between during the

Depression and throughout other rough times because, Kay said, `he loved the dry goods business. That was his life. It just kept him going.`

Kay worked in the store right up to the time he shipped out for Europe with the 45th Division, 160th Field Artillery of the Oklahoma National Guard. When Kay returned home to Collinsville, he assumed operation of the Collinsville store from Sol, who wanted to retire. `He retired, turned the business over to me, but he continued to hang around the store. It was just part of him.`

Sol continued to be a key figure in Collinsville and very healthy and strong, said Kay, until his death at 68 in a 1954 car accident in Tulsa.

`We've all been married to these stores,` he said of many Bayouths who have grown up in a Bayouth's Department Store. `It's been our entire lives. And, it's been wonderful. I've loved every minute. `Thanks to all the wonderful people who have worked for us and those who have been our customers and friends. We love you.`

"LOUISE BAYOUTH FARRIS: A LOVING TRIBUTE"

Louise H. (Bayouth) Farris, 75, of Tulsa, Oklahoma passed away suddenly on Monday, August 10, 1987. A Trisagion Prayer Service was held Wednesday evening, August 12, 1987. St. Antony's Orthodox Christian Church in Tulsa over-flowed as many friends and relatives came to show their love and respect during her funeral services at 10:00 a.m. on Thursday, August 13, 1987. The Rev. Fr. George Eber of Tulsa officiated and was assisted by Rev. Fr. Michael Keiser (formerly of Tulsa) who flew in from Florida after hearing of Louise's death. Interment was at Ridgelawn Cemetery in Collinsville, Oklahoma.

Mrs. Farris was born Louise Helen Bayouth on February 26, 1912 to Sol H. Bayouth and Aliha Bayouth in Amorita, Oklahoma. When Louise was 12 her mother, Aliha, died suddenly of a brain hemorrhage. Shortly after her mother's death, her father returned to Lebanon for two years with Louise and his other children. Louise, who was the eldest daughter, was like a mother to her six brothers and sisters as she helped care for them. While in Lebanon, she became fluent in the Arabic language and learned the Lebanese heritage which she carried with her throughout her life. Her father, Sol, met and married Salwa Andeel Bayouth before leaving Lebanon and returning to Oklahoma. As Salwa was not fluent with English upon coming to this country, Louise continued to help with the raising of both her original 6 siblings plus 4 additional brothers and sisters who were later born to Sol and Salwa. Salwa and Louise became not only mother and daughter, but were like sisters and best friends throughout the years until Salwa passed away in 1984. Her father, Sol H. Bayouth of Collinsville, Oklahoma, was a well-known merchant and benefactor to many Lebanese and Non-Lebanese throughout the Southwestern United States until his untimely death as the result of an automobile accident in 1954.

As a young woman, Louise attended school in Collinsville, Oklahoma and was a member of The Order of Rainbow for Girls.

She married her husband, William M. Farris, in 1945 at which time she owned and operated Tulsa Grocery in Downtown Tulsa. By the early 1950's, they owned Farris Grocery and Market which was a prominent business in suburban Tulsa at that time. In the early 1960's, they also operated Lou's Laundry and Drycleaning in Tulsa as well as Farris Department Store in Broken Arrow, Oklahoma. Farris Grocery was their last business until it was closed in 1964. In 1965, Louise went to work for Kinney's Shoe Store in Tulsa's Southland Shopping Center. She was awarded trophies as the top salesperson of all Kinney's Shoe Stores in 1974 and 1977.

Louise was a very active member of St. Antony's Orthodox Christian Church in Tulsa since it was founded. She served as treasurer of the Ladies Auxiliary for 25 years. As a memorial, the family asked that friends contribute to the Louise Farris Memorial at St. Antony's Church.

Louise was a very active member of the Salaam Club of Tulsa. The success of the club and preserving the Lebanese heritage and traditions through future generations was very important to her. On the day of her death she was actively selling ads for the Convention Book for Baalbek Festival '87 which is the Labor Day Weekend Convention that the Salaam Club hosts in Tulsa every three years. As a tribute to her hard work and as an expression of love, the Salaam Club dedicated the Convention Book In Loving Memory of Louise H. Farris.

In addition to her husband, Louise is survived by : two daughters, Wadiha "Dee" (Mrs. Emile) Farhood of Houston, Texas and Marcia (Mrs. Amos) Wooten of Broken Arrow, Oklahoma; two sons, Merhige W. "Bill" Farris (and wife Lisa) of Wichita, Kansas and Dr. Donald J. Farris of Tulsa; five grandchildren, Tracy and E.J. Farhood of Houston, Texas, Monica and Christian Habeeb Wooten of Broken Arrow, Oklahoma, Matthew Merhige Farris of Wichita, Kansas; five brothers, Kay M. Bayouth of Collinsville, Okla., A.B. "Bus" Bayouth of Skiatook, Okla., Eddie J. Bayouth of Sapulpa, Okla., Emile S. Bayouth of Cleveland, Okla. and Tex Bayouth of Hominy, Okla.; four sisters, Inez Jones, Juanita Jorishie, JoAnn Naifeh, all of Tulsa, Okla., and Delores Sallee of Collinsville, Okla. Louise was preceded in death in 1983 by a brother, William S. Bayouth.

Although her death was a sudden loss to all who knew her, she had a very full life. She touched many. The lasting influence that Louise had on others is well summed up in the following inscription that has been placed at her grave site: "YOU ARE EVER A PART OF OUR LIVES; ALL THE GOOD YOU HAVE DONE WILL LIVE IN OUR HEARTS FOREVER".

BAYOUTH -- Kaline M. (Kay) Sr., 92, passed away peacefully Tuesday, April 25, 2006, at his home in Collinsville, OK. Kay was a life-long resident of Collinsville and 1 of 12 children born to Collinsville pioneer, Solomon H. Bayouth. After the passing of his mother Aliha, he was raised by Solomon's second wife, Salwa Andeel Bayouth. Kay was born August 16, 1913, in Aline, OK. Kay married Gloria Bayouth on June 7, 1948. They made their home in Collinsville where they owned and operated the family business, Bayouth's Department Store from 1946. Kay was an active and founding member of St. Antony's Orthodox Christian Church of Tulsa. Kay attended Collinsville High School where he earned letters in football, basketball and track. He joined the 45th Army division in February 1941, and served his country (along with 4 of his brothers) during World War II, until July 1945. He took part in three amphibious landings - in Sicily, Salerno and Anzio in Italy. Thirty years after receiving a biological sciences degree from The University of Tulsa, Jacob "Jake" Jorishie (BS '71) returned to campus - this time to earn a degree in music with an emphasis in jazz studies. But technically, this alumnus and sports enthusiast never left.

Whether he's acting as honorary marching band director, giving pep talks to the athletes or donning Blues Brothers gear to perform as an ad hoc TU cheerleader, Jorishie has remained one of TU's most loyal and visible fans. And in contrast to his persona as a Golden Hurricane fan, Jorishie is quiet and unassuming as a donor.

Because of Jorishie's outstanding contributions to the University and his willingness to go beyond the call of duty, he's been named this year's J. Paschal Twyman Award Recipient - an award given to TU friends and family who possess leadership and commitment.

Both an accomplished dentist and musician, Jorishie's hands bring precision to the 88 keys of a piano and to meeting the dental needs of his patients. His Preventive Family Dentistry office in Tulsa overflows with symbols of his third love - the University.

"I credit my experiences and preparation at the University as the foundation for all the success in my life," Jorishie said. "I've never forgotten the opportunities that instrumental music gave me and the doors my degree from TU opened."

Born in Tulsa, Jorishie got his first exposure to TU while marching with the Will Rogers High School band on Skelly Field. But it was his first TU game - the memorable 1964 defeat of the Pokes (see page 18 for a recap of this historic Homecoming game) - that hooked him. A promising young musician, he began studying saxophone and clarinet privately with TU music professor Dwight Dailey. When the time came to apply to college, Jorishie had only one school in mind.

While a TU student, he attended every football and basketball game. His classes and studies included as many music activities as possible - playing in the marching and concert bands, orchestra, jazz band, woodwind quartet and the annual TU talent reviews and operas.

After earning his degree from TU in 1971, Jorishie graduated from the Washington University School of Dental Medicine in St. Louis, Mo., in 1974. Upon the completion of his service as a U.S. Naval officer in 1977, he promptly returned to Tulsa. "I missed taking my dad fishing, and I missed going to TU football and basketball games. The choice was easy for me," Jorishie said.

Over the past 31 years, Jorishie has strived to give back to the University he feels gave him the foundation for his success in life. He's been a continuous member of the Golden Hurricane Club, serving on the board for 20 years and as its president in 1996-97. He's the founding member of the Tulsa Rebounders Basketball Club, has served on the Board of Visitors for the Henry Kendall College of Arts and Sciences since 2000 and was awarded the College's Distinguished Service Award in 2004.

"Throughout the years I have just tried to do my part to be a faithful steward of the University," Jorishie said. "This journey and experience has certainly been fulfilling and gratifying. As a bonus, I have enjoyed the work, the challenges and certainly had a whole lot of fun along the way. I have been able to touch and be touched by so many special people."

According to his friends, Jorishie is the kind of donor who spots needs and rushes to fill the gaps without being asked. In recognition of his noteworthy lifetime giving to TU, Jorishie is a member of TU's Circle Society, Patrons Level. During more than 30 years of University giving, Jorishie has contributed to programs and projects across campus, including the Golden Hurricane Club, the School of Music, Tulsa Undergraduate Research Challenge, the Alumni Association, the Reynolds Center, H. A. Chapman Stadium and the Dr. Jake Jorishie Annual Scholarships in Music. He made a gift to purchase eight brass marching sousaphones, contributed the seed gift to purchase new band uniforms and made a significant commitment to the Roxana Rozsa and Robert Eugene Lorton Performance Center.

"There truly is no greater gift in life than the gift of giving - seizing every moment and chance to make things better, and to change that one life at a time. I am blessed to be given the ability to take advantage of these special opportunities," Jorishie said. "I'm ultimately the real prize winner because these efforts have made my life whole, content and complete."

This December, Jorishie will once again walk to "Pomp and Circumstance" to receive yet another gift from the University - a well-deserved diploma in music that has been a long time in the making.
