"No children.

"Samuel is #6 in the 1926 Gen. He is listed as the fourth child in the Gens. of both 1926 and 1964, born in 1655, but his date, based on the Branford Town Records, has been corrected to 1654, which places him ahead of Benoni.

"Nothing is known of Samuel's early life except that he served in King Philip's War of 1675-76, when the colonists broke the power of the Indian tribes. For this service, he was eligible for a grant of bounty land at Voluntown, CT, which was voted to the veterans by the Colony in 1701, but he had died before the grant was made.

"Samuel's wife is shown in the Gens. of 1926 and 1964 as Rebecca Rose, dau. of John Rose, but she was in fact the daughter of Joseph and Phoebe (Ives) Potter, bor in Branford 6 Jun 1663 [sic]. ... The date of the marriage of Samuel and Rebecca appears in the Gens as 1675, but as Rebecca

was only 12 at the time, it must have occurred several years later, probably in 1680 or early 1681. They could have been married only a few months when Samuel died.

"Samuel and Rebecca had no children. He died 16 Nov 1681, his estate being valued at 117 pounds. In 1682 Rebecca married a second husband, one Charles Tyler, and Edward Frisbie in his will left five shillings to his 'daughter-in-law Rebekah Tyler, relict of my son Samuel'.

"Up to the early 1950s a 'Samuel Frisbie House' stood on East Main St. in Branford, but this house was built in 1792, probably by Samuel Frisbie #526, who was the fifth generation from Edward and a descendant of his son Benoni. Some years later the house was dismantled and trucked away piecemeal to Litchfield CT where it was re-erected."

Josiah is entered as #9 in the 1926 Gen. He is said by the 1926 Gen. to have been a justice of the peace and a member of the General Court, but the source of the statement is not given, and it has been impossible to verify it. He appears in the Town records in 1687, when he was given a grant of land.

Under his father's will Josiah shared with his younger brother Caleb lands to the value of 84 pounds, the items being: "The home lot that was our father's proper lot, with the housing on it, and the meadow adjoining to it", valued at 20 pounds. This was one of the houses on the Green, and was probably the property originally granted to Edward by the Town, the other two lots having been acquired by purchase in the 1660s. Also included in the inheritance was "all of the land and meadow at Mosquito Cove, except two acres of Benoni's, and about five acres in the Beaver Swamp, and four score acres of the third division land in the woods". He shared his father's moveables with the five younger children.

Josiah never married. He died in Branford on 3 Mar 1711/12 according to the Gens., but on 13 Mar according to other sources.

Edward Frisbie of ..., p. 24: #11 - (2)I-1

1926 Gen: "John Frisbie was evidently one of the substantial, useful and honored citizens of his generation. Jan 31, 1676, he bought lands with house and barns at Indian Neck for the sum of 80 pounds. His name appears frequently in the records, as a surveyor appointed to divide land, lay out highways, etc. He and his father were signers of the 'New Plantation and Church Covenant of Brainford', Jan 20, 1667. According to the Rev. Timothy P. Gillett, in a semi-centennial discourse delivered in Branford Jul 7, 1858, on the reorganization of the Branford church Mar 7, 1687/88, John Frisbie was chosen one of the 'seven pillars' of his church. He was a representative to the General Court in 1690 and 1692. At his death he left an estate valued at 305 pounds 10 shillings."

A note regarding the "Seven Pillars" is in order. The statement is probably a misunderstanding of the old records. The Seven Pillars referred to the New Haven church, and the term was used only in the first few years of its existence.

Early Connecticut Marriages, v2, p99, has the date of John's marriage as 12/20/1674, but the Branford Town Records show it as 12/2/1674, which may be taken as correct. ...

The Hoadley Gen. makes several references to John, along with mention of William Hoadley, who was the William Hoadley whom John's widow married after his death. On 14 May 1678/79 at a Town Meeting, Mr. Rosewell, William Hoadley, and John Frisbie were appointed to run a line between Branford and Wallingford. On 20 Jan 1678 Mr. John Frisbie and three others were appointed to lay out lands. On 13 Feb 1679 W. Hoadley, John Frisbie, and Peter Tyler were appointed turnpike commissioners. At a Town meeting of 26 Jun 1683 Wm. Hoadley was appointed to "keep the ordinary" at Branford, that is, to operate the local tavern.

As "John Frizby" he signed the Town charter of 1685, and in the same year he was "deputed" by the Town as a member of the committee to meet with New Haven to adjudicate the question of the New Haven-Branford boundary, a matter which had been plaguing the two communities for years.

In 1686 the Town appointed "Jno frisbie" to the committee to negotiate with ... [Indians about land and a road].

John and his wife Ruth signed the Church Covenant drawn up in 1688. He was named executor of his father's will, written in 1689, and upon Edward's death the following year he was appointed one of the guardians of his youngest brother Ebenezer #20. In 1690 and again in 1692 "Mr. John Frizby" served as deputy to represent Branford in the Connecticut Assembly at Hartford. The "Mister" indicates that he had risen to a position of importance and esteem, for it was then an honorary title granted only to the chief men of the community. ... [His second son Edward must have been a particular favorite of his grandfather, for he was the only grandchild to be mentioned in the elder Edward's will. He received "a heifer two years old" as his portion. John died in 1694, a wealthy man for his day, his estate being valued at 305 pounds 10 shillings, equivalent by today's values to probably \$30,000. ...

"Benoni is listed as #5 in the 1926 Genealogy, and his children are listed as nos. 23 and 24. In both genealogies he is shown as the third child, b. 1654, but his birth date, corrected from the Branford Town Records, is properly 1656, which makes him the fourth child in the family.

"We know nothing of Benoni's history except that he married Hannah Rose, dau. of John Rose Sr.

...

"Benoni inherited a considerable portion of his father's lands. Enumerated in Edward's will the items were: two acres of pasture in the Mill Quarter, the cow meadow at Indian Neck, two acres of Beaver Swamp, two acres of meadow at Scotch Cap, four acres at Hopyard Plain, two acres of upland at Knocker's Hollow, and nine acres of cow pasture land north of Thomas Wheadon's swamp.

"Benoni also received the middle one of the three houses owned by Edward and facing on Branford Green, with two acres of land. On this lot there was a well of exceptionally fine water, and in his will Edward expressly reserves 'the use of the well which is in Benoni his lot for those that shall live on either of my home lots, so long as any of the Frisbys or any of their heirs shall live thereon.

"The well appears as 'Benoni's Well' on the plat of the village of 1699, and, interestingly enough, the offices of the Branford Water Co. now stand on the property. In recent years the belief has arisen that the well with a timber well-head now standing on the Hearthstone property was 'Benoni's Well', but this is not the case; Benoni apparently never lived at Hearthstone."

Notes for HANNAH ROSE:

Edward Frisbie of ..., p. 29: "Benoni died in 1700, but the date of his wife's death is not known. Inasmuch as they had only two children, in an era when large families were usual, it is likely that Hannah died not too long after the birth of her second child. She is mentioned in her father's will of 1683. Jacobus, quoting Branford Church Records for 1688 has: 'Ye same time adjoined Hannah Frisby', and he identifies this Hannah as the wife of Benoni."

Edward Frisbie of ..., p. 29: #15 - (2)V-1

Abigail ... bears #7 in the 1926 Gen. and her children are numbered 25-27. The children are not numbered in the 1964 Gen. Her birth and marriage dates are taken from the Bullard Gen.

Very little is known about the history of Abigail, but much can be surmised by reading between the lines of the known history of the family. It is probable that her mother died not too long after 1675 (when she is last mentioned in the Branford Town Records) and that Abigail, as the oldest daughter, took over the management of the house and the six younger children.

She moved with her father and the children into the new house, Hearthstone, when it was built in 1685, and her father evidently looked upon her a confirmed old maid, for in his will dated Oct 1689 (she was then 32) he specifically "reserved a liberty" for Abigail and the youngest dau. Silence "to live in my new dwelling house if they see cause, so long as they shall remain unmarried." Abigail did marry, but it was after her father's death in May 1690.

Under her father's will, Abigail received lands described in the Petition for Distribution of the estate as "our father's dwelling house and home lot of two acres and meadow adjoining to it", which was one of the three houses facing on Branford Green, with the meadow running down to the river at the rear, valued at 40 pounds. She also received "about an acre" at Indian Neck", valued at 2 pounds, and shared with the five youngest children in the distribution of the "moveables", that is, the household furnishings and farm equipment.

Notes for WILLIAM HOADLEY:

Edward Frisbie of ..., p. 29:

Abigail's husband William Hoadley was the son of Captain William Hoadley of Branford, and he operated a sawmill on Stony River. ... A few years later (ca. 1703), William married Elizabeth Frost or possibly Elizabeth Frost Reynolds of New Haven. By this marriage there was a son William Hoadley who married Sarah Frisbie #125; they [antecedent not clear] were the parents of David Hoadley, the architect of many charming Conn. churches of the 1830s, and of the Hoadley brothers who were famous as makers of wooden-works clocks.

Jonathan ... was numbered 8 in the 1926 Gen., and his children were entered as nos. 28-32. Again, very little is known of the early life of Jonathan. As this is much less than the other children received, and he is not mentioned elsewhere in the will, it is probable that he had been granted his portion earlier, perhaps when he married.

The 1926 Gen. says that Jonathan was licensed by the New Haven Co. Court in JUn 1693 to keep a tavern in the center of Branford village, but the source of the statement is not given, and I [NGF] have not been able to verify it from available authorities. The tavern was perhaps one of the three houses facing on the Green, and it may in fact have constituted Jonathan's wedding portion, for only two of the houses are mentioned in the distribution of Edward's estate. Jonathan's wife Mary is said to have continued the management of the tavern after her husband's death ...

Her second husband was one Robert Darby; an entry in the Public Records of Connecticut for May 1697 (misquoted in the 1926 Gen.) reads: "This Court grants full power to Marie Frisbie alias Marie Darbie late wife of Jonathan Frisbie of Branford deceased, to confirme an exchange of six or seven acres of land made between the Reverent [sic] Samuel Russell and sd. Jonathan Frisbie and interchange [here a word is crossed out in the original] possessed by them in the life time of the said Jonathan." The "Reverent" Mr. Russell was Samuel Russell, pastor of the Branford church. Robert Darby was master of a vessel which was wrecked at Southend on Long Island, across the Sound from Branford, and he probably died in the disaster, for in 1699 Mary married a third husband, Nathaniel Fitch [given Finch on same page, above, by whom she had three children], and moved away to Norwalk CT.

The New Church Covenant of Branford, written in 1688, bears the signature of a Hannah Frisbie who may have been Hannah #19, although Jacobus identifies her as Hannah, the wife of Benoni #13.

Edward's will, dated in Oct 1689, provided that Hannah was to share in the distribution of the moveables, but he left her no specific properties. As she was married about 1688, it is probable that she was in the process of receiving her wedding portion, for Edward reserved to "my daughter Hannah her portion intire." ...

Early in the 1960s I [HGF] corresponded with Donald Lines Jacobus, the Connecticut historian who knew more about the early families than any man then living, and was himself a distant descendant of Edward Frisbie. Jacobus told me that he had found an entry in the Connecticut records indicating that Hannah and Nathaniel were called before the local court to answer a charge of "fornication before marriage" and were fined for it, but he did not give me the date of the incident, and I have not found any reference to it in my own researches. He said, however, that at that time such a peccadillo was not considered anything more serious than a minor misdemeanor; it ranked with a parking fine in our own day.

Nathaniel built a fine new home for his bride; known as the "Nathaniel Harrison House", it stood on West Main St. in Branford until it was torn down about 1951.

Ebenezer was 18 at the time of his father's death, and was left under the guardianship of his oldest brother John #11 and the Rev. Samuel Russell. Oddly, no provision was made for the guardianship of Silence, nor does her signature appear on the Petition for Distribution of her father's estate.

The twins share of their father's lands included "about 8 acres in the pasture, upland and swamp land at Little Plain, 2 1/2 acres in the woods, and Ebenezer's share of the Beaver Swamp, a total of 83 pounds 10 shillings. In addition, they shared with the four next older children in the division of the moveables.

... The name of the second child is shown as Mary in the earlier Gens., but her name was in fact Mercy. The name of the fourth child is shown as Mercy, whereas she was properly Mary. These corrections [are discussed in their own listings in the book].

[The following reports the inferential nature of data for Silence.]

Silence married Joshua Austin, son of John Austin of New Haven. The date of her marriage is not known, but it was after 1690, inasmuch as she is mentioned as Silence Frisbie in the Branford church records for that year. She and her husband lived in East Haven, the village lying between Branford and New Haven, and though the earlier Gens. list no children for her, it is probable that she had two: John Austin, b. ca. 1713, and a daughter b. Feb 1714 who lived only a few months. The existence of these children is based on the following evidence: The East Haven registers mention a John Austin, birth date not given, who died 2/22/1760. They also mention a Joshua Austin, b. 9-17-1733 and identify him as the son of Joshua Austin and Mehitabel Warner Hitchcock, but as Joshua Sr. was aged 60 in 1733, Joshua Jr. was more probably his grandson, son of John Austin. If John Austin had a child born in 1733 he must have been born in 1713 or before, and hence was a son of Joshua Sr. and Silence Frisbie. The East Haven records mention the birth of Silence Austin in 1714 and assign her to the second wife of Joshua Austin. However, due to her name she was probably the daughter of Silence #21, and Silence must have died soon after her birth.

My [DWF] comments: It is not at all impossible for a man to have a child at age 60, provided that

the wife is of child-bearing age. And, Joshua may well have named his first daughter by a second wife after his recently deceased first wife. Hence, Silence Frisbie may have died earlier than 1714.

"These entries quite obviously all refer to the same man, and it is equally obvious that he came from Simsbury and died in service in December 1777. The date of death is substantiated by Know Military Dead in the Revolutionary War, p. 70, which lists Levi Frisby, corporal from Connecticut, who died 12/31/1777. There is nothing in the records to indicate that Levi #354 resided in Simsbury, but of the several men of this name at this period, Levi #354 is the most likely candidate for the service.

"The 1926 Genealogy assigns the service in 1775 (the second entry above) to Levi #349, but this Levi is know to have died in Orwell PA in 1841.

"The identification is complicated by the fact that the 1790 census of Wallingford credits a Levi Frisbie with a household of 1-1-1. This entry does not fit any known Levi Frisbie; it may be an error on the part of the enumerator, or it may relate to a hitherto unknown Levi."

"There is considerable variation between the dates given above and those shown in the two earlier Genealogies, and two additional children are included. The above dates are taken from what appear to be pages from a Family Bible, included by Luman's wife Anna when she made application for a widow's pension. The dates in some instances are not clear. For comments see the entries under the individual names.

"Eldad Parker, father of Luman's wife Anna Parker, served in the Revolutionary War and his service is noted in DAR Patriot Index, p. 515.

"Luman served in the Revolutionary War:

State Regiment, Col. Roger Enos; Capt. James Peck; on roll as 9-17-1777 (Connecticut Men in the Revolution, 615). The 1926 Genealogy notes this service as with Minute Men and Volunteers. Enlisted 8-15-1777 for the duration of the war; regiment of Artificers, Col. Jeduthan Baldwin, Capt. James Morton (Connecticut Men, 292). A similar entry appears in Massachusetts Men in the Revolution, p. 102, which gives the place of enlistment as North Chester, MA, and notes that the company was probably from CT. The 1926 Genealogy gives the dates of service as 1777-1783.

"These two entries appear to relate to two different men, but there is only one Luman in the Genealogy at this period. No explanation for the discrepancy is suggested.

"The 1926 Genealogy says that Luman moved to Harpersfield NY in 1785, but this is scarcely possible, inasmuch as he is found in the 1790 census for Hamden CT with a household of 2-3-3. This

indicates that there were more children than are listed in the record or, more likely, that another family was living with them. He apparently lived in Hamden through the 1790s, as the first five children were baptized all at once in Hamden in 1794, and the sixth child Luman was baptized there in 1796.

"The date of Luman's move to Harpersfield is not know, but it was probably soon after 1800. He does not appear in the 1800 census in either CT or NY, but there is a strong traition amongst the descendants of the child Theodore #814 that he was born in NY state in 1802.

"The 1926 Genealogy says that in 1818, after Luman's death, his wife Anna moved to Harpersfield OH with four of her children (who are not named), Theodore and another son (not named) having gone there two years before, and Joel and Levi remaining in NY state."

Enoch (Enos?) and Oscar were her brothers (Frank knew them well - Melba); she also had a sister Melissa, who Melba and Ruth both remember. Melissa had a daughter Goldie and a grandson Leonard Larmis.

Melba reports that Joseph says she died in childbirth, so there must have been another baby after William.

Louise Biddle Green said she is buried in Old Baptist Cemetery, Hannibal. Records for the cemetery in the Hannibal Library are incomplete, and the cemetery is in bad disrepair. I have not found her grave, or that of Mary Ann's daughter Susan Ellen, who is also buried there (obituary in Melba's papers) or that of Thomas Biddle.

Melba does not know birthplace. All she has is a small precious picture in Joseph's Bible. "... a nice looking young woman with dark hair and dark eyes. Her hair is long and drawn back in a bun at the back of the head. It is parted in the middle, looks quite thick and frames her face softly. She is wearing a blouse and skirt which shows up darkly on a black-and-white picture. The blouse has drop shoulders, and full sleeves which taper to the wrist. There is a small ruching around the neckline and cuffs. The blouse buttons down the front and at the throat there is a flat bow and on the bow is a small, round brooch. The skirt is full from the waist down and is made of a shiny material. It could be brocade or taffeta, or something similar. Grandmother appears to be somewhere between 25 and 35 years old, and is neither fat nor thin. Considering that she was in her prime child-bearing years, and was having babies as fast as the laws of nature would allow, I think she looks just great." Melba mentions that she knows of only three siblings of Mary Ann; Oscar and Enos Frisby, who Frank Biddle knew - both lived past 90, and Great Aunt Melissa (no surname given). As an older woman, Melissa stayed with Melba and Eula Frances while their mother was hospitalized in 1923. Melba mentions Goldie and her son Leonard Larmis. Melissa, Goldie, and Leonard apparently all had red hair. She mentions the Oscar Frisbie/Catherine Jane Biddle marriage and that Frank Biddle had very dim memories of his natural mother.

Melba: Frank says that Joseph always claimed to have walked all the way from Pennsylvania to Missouri. ... that Sarah Ann Turner was a widow when she married Joseph [unclear whether Turner was married or maiden name].

Melba on Joseph himself: "He is said to have walked from Pennsylvania to Missouri. However, there is little doubt that his ancestors were English. His surname is English, he looked English, and behaved like the English. He also gave all his children English first names. I have been told that in the prime of his life, Joseph was about medium height, had light brown hair, blue eyes, and fair skin. ... [My mother] has said that he was a very courteous, soft-spoken man, that he kept himself very clean, and he always went around the house fully dressed, including vest and coat. He didn't drink and was not profane. He was 80 years old when Mother first met him, and she has said his eyesight and hearing were good. Joseph made all the early entries in his Bible, and his handwriting is firm and strong, and it also had a certain elegance. Mother always felt that he was a very civilized man and had a refinement belied by the poverty in which he lived so much of his life. However, from the pictures of his family in Joseph's Bible, we must conclude that Joseph was not always poverty-stricken. Those pictures are of babies, children and adults who are neatly groomed and very nicely attired. So there must have been some good times in their lives. Joseph's spine was very bowed in his old age and he walked bent over and used a cane for support. He died of old age and heart failure and did not linger a long time. ...

[Around 1911 or 1912] my father received a rather pathetic letter from his stepmother. Joseph was now 80 years old and unable to work any longer. She was also too old to work, and they were now in desperate straits. He was the only one of the children unmarried [recently widowed by Cora] and without responsibilities. If he couldn't help a little she didn't know what they would do. Right here you can chalk up a credit for Father. He went down into the country, packed them up and moved them into his house in Hannibal. So, when Mother married Father, her home was shared by two very elderly strangers. ... If the four of them ever argued or "had words", it must have been trifling, because Mother could never remember any ugly episodes. During all my life, I never heard Mother say an unkind word about Grandpa Joe and Grandma Ginny. She used to tell us stories about 'old Joe', but it was always with great humor and kindness."

Frances purchased land prior to being married and later sold part of the land to John W. Frisbie. A reason for the selling of the land was probaly because they had moved to Montana for the land was sold by them from the state of Montana. The land was two different locations on the same road. The two pieces of land was about 1/4 acre each. The one part was for the house and the other was for the blacksmith shop. The school was located south of the blacksmith shop. The Methodist church was to the east of the blacksmith shop. This property was later sold on March 20th 1920 to a Oliver Harry Waldschlager and wife. One thing is noticiable on the selling of the land by John & Ida. There is a different date for them signing the land record. John dated the record on the 20th and Ida signed on the 22nd. John was living in the Pike county area and Ida was in the Marion county area. A story has come forth about John Frisbie. It goes like this. A black man had lost an object down a well. He came to John for help to retrieve the object from the well. John made something like a grappling hook and atached it to a rope. After the object was secured the black man made a comment that Mr. Frisbie could make anything. John quipped back with this comment there is one thing I can't make and that is a black baby.

In spite of all his faults, Uncle George had a certain charm and was always very kind to my sister and me. ... In spite of the abuse Uncle George's body endured for so many years, he lived to age 83, which is something of a small miracle." Melba reproduces the death notice from O'Donnell Funeral Home, indicating burial in Hope Cemetery. She has pictures of George in 1936, Aunt Lucy with Mary Catherine (along with another woman and her child), and a group picture of Chester, Mary Catherine, and Harold in childhood. I now have pictures of the gravestones for George and Lucy and for Chester and his wife.
