"In the name of God Amen, I ROBERT BRACEWELL beinge very weake & sicke of Body but of perfectt memorie, doe make this my last Will & Testament, Revockeinge all former Wills whatsoever., Imprimis I bequeath my Soule into the hands of my Redeemer, who gave it to mee, And my body unto the ground from whence it came to be decently buried, And for those Temporall goods God hath given mee I dispose of them in manner as followeth, I give unto my daughter JANE STOCKES her children, three coves, To REBECCA WEST my daughter one Cowe & Calfe And one Cowe & Calfe to the next child she shall have, And the rest of all my Estate unto my two sonnns ROBERT and RICHARD whome I make my full & sole executors of this my ill, and the Mill I desire shalbe finisht, with what speed may bee And to be lett out, only reservinge corne for themselves, and the p.(ro)duse of the Mill to be equally divided betweene them both, And reserved to build a new mill hereafter And when built to be left wholly to my sonne RICHARD Likewise I give Seaven hundred Acres of land where I now live and sixe hundred Acres att the Western Branch of Nancemond County To be equally divided betweene my two sonnes ROBERT and RICHARD Likewise it is my desire that noe part or parcell of the estate shalbe disposed of, nor none of the land, untill they both are of full Age, nor no wayes divided But if it shall please God that either of them shall depart this life before he comes of Age, That then the Survivor shall enjoye the whole Likewise I give unto my Servant ELIZABETH HALL when she shalbe free one heifer of two yeares of Age And likewise it is my desire That my loveinge friends Mr RICHARD IZARD and GEORGE GWILLIM to be Guardians unto my CHildren in the time of their Minoritie, And to see this my Will performed Likewise I give unto them the said RICHARD IZARD & GEORGE GWILLIM, ffortie shillings to each of them, to buy them each one ringe, Likewise I give unto my Daughter ANN BAGNALL one Cowe & Calfe And one Cowe & calfe to her first Child, And if it please God she have any, And likewise it is my desire that my two sonnes, ROBERT & RICHARD shalbe putt to schoole untill they cann both write & read And this beinge my Will I testifie it with my hand this 15th of February 1667

Robert was an Oxford scholar. Received BA in 1631. He was baptised at St. Andrews, Holborn, England. He was in Isle of Wight Co, VA by 1651 and was elected to the House of Burges in 1653. Will proven on 1 May 1668. Sold 100 acres of land in 1673 in Isle of Wight Co, VA. Sold 400 acres of land given to him by his father in 1660 in Isle of Wight Co, VA in 1673. Sold 300 acres for 15,000 lbs of "tob and cask" in Isle of Wight Co., VA in 1674. Nothing is known of the family prior to this date except that they and others of this name in England were said to have fled from Scotland during a rebellion against tyrannical rule. At the age of fifteen, young Robert Bracewell was sent to Oxford University to be educated for the ministry. Records of colonial Virginia show that Robert Bracewell, son of Richard Bracewell of London, Gentleman, entered Hart Hall, Oxford University, February 22, 1627, at the age of fifteen and graduated with an A. B. degree on November 3, 1631. This information has been certified of recent years by an Oxford Registrar. (Henning 1,378) (The Braswell Family, by Elizabeth B. Pearsall). A period of almost twenty years elapses before Robert Bracewell is heard from again. During the latter part of this period, England and Scotland were passing through a very difficult time under Charles I, who was determined as his father, James I, had been to force the Anglican form of worship on the Puritans of England and the Presbyterians of Scotland. The circumstances which resulted in Robert Bracewell's coming to Virginia are not known, but when he appeared in Isle of Wight County, Virginia, some time prior to 1649, he was an Episcopal clergyman. The first time his name is found in the records of colonial Virginia was

when he was a witness to an agreement between Ambrose Bennett and Thomas Webb for the use of a mill and adjacent land, April 29, 1650. (Deed book 1, p. 426). When Captain John Upton made his will in January 1651, he mentioned three hundred acres of land he had sold to Mr. Robert Bracewell. (Will and Adm r. Book A, pps.32-33). Robert Bracewell's plantation was located on the Blackwater River, some miles south of the James River and the colonial town of Jamestown, a few miles northwest of where the Town of Smithfield, Virginia, now stands. Robert Bracewell's pastorate, known as Lawne's Creek Parish, was in the vicinity of the present boundary line between Surry and Isle of Wight counties. The name of Lawne's Creek was changed in 1737 to Southwalk Parish. In 1653 the Reverend Robert Bracewell was elected to the House of Burgesses of Virginia. At this period in history, separation of church and state was the subject of much agitation in both Europe and America. According to the records of the 1653 Sessions of the House of Burgesses, "It is ordered that Mr. Robert Bracewell, clerk (cleric), be suspended since it is unpresidential and may produce bad consequences." (Henning 1, p. 378) If clergymen were not allowed to hold political office, it seems odd that he was elected in the beginning. Whether the Reverend Robert Bracewell was a wealthy man before coming to Virginia, or whether he accumulated his wealth after coming to this country has not been established, but at the time of his death in 1668 he was the possessor of considerable property. He was referred to in the William and Mary Quarterly, Volume 7, as a "notable minister." (The Braswell Family, by Elizabeth B. Pearsall). Robert Bracewell's will was made February 15, 1667 and is one of the earliest recorded wills in this country. It is to be found in Deed and Will Book 1, p. 9, of the Isle of Wight records of Virginia. In his will, Robert Bracewell directed that his two underage sons, Robert, Jr. and Richard, were to receive the bulk of his estate and were to share the 700 acre home plantation and 600 acres on the Nansemond River. They were to share also in his new mill when it was finished. He named his two friends and neighbors, Mr. George Gwillen (Welsh for Williams) and Mr. Richard Izard, to act as guardians for the children, each to receive forty shillings with which to buy himself a ring. He further directed that his two sons be put to school to learn to read and write. His three married daughters were to receive three cows each, and an indentured servant, Elizabeth Hall, was to receive a heifer when she became free. Seven of his friends were to receive one cow each and his son-in-law, William West, a cow and a yearling. Included in the inventory of his property were sixty-three head of livestock, a servant boy, a library worth 500 pounds of tobacco, a sloop, silverware and numerous articles of clothing and household furnishings. The total value of his estate was given as 35,000 pounds of tobacco. (Will and Deed Book 1, p.55). An accounting of his estate rendered on January 10, 1669-70, and signed by Richard and Rebecca Izard. (Will and Deed Book 1, p. 28)

Notes for JANE BRACEWELL:

She married (1) Robert Stokes Abt. 1667. He was born Abt. 1656, and died 1677 in Executed - Bacon's Rebellion. She married (2) Robert Eley II Abt. 1678, son of Robert Eley. He was born Bef. 1650 in Nansemond Co., VA, and died Abt. 1680. She married (3) John Roberts Abt. 1680. He died Bef. 04 Oct 1706.

Notes for Jane Bracewell:

According to Hildon B. BRASWELL, Jane was evidently very attractive, married well, and "became one of the largest owners of land and other real property." Jane's first marriage was to Robert Stokes in 1667. Robert, along with his brother-in-law William West, participated in Bacon's Rebellion and was hung by the Brits in 1677 for his involvement. Although they were married for only a short time before his death, they had three daughters: Mary, Ann and Rebecca Stokes. Jane next married Robert Eley, II in 1678 and they lived in Virginia. They too, were married a short time (less than three years) and only one child was born to this union, Robert Eley, III. Jane's last marriage was to John Roberts in 1680. To this marriage was born three children: John, Thomas and Jane Roberts.

JANE made a will 25 June 1711 which was proved 14 Aug 1713. In it she named six children. ROBERT ELEY received 100 acres which was part of a patent of 1450 acres granted to JOHN and JANE ROBERTS on 20 July 1680. This was land on the lower side of the branch called Long Branch on the south side of Beaver Dam Swamp. The following each received 100 acres on the west side of Beaver Dam Swamp: Grandson ROBERT SCOTT, daughter MARY PARKER (widow of WILLIAM PARKER), and granddaughter MARTHA SANDERS. THOMAS JONES (no relationship mentioned) was bequeathed 'the land he now lives on according to the boundaries that he bought of my brother, RICHARD BRASWELL.' Daughter REBECCAS BRINKLEY received 5 shillings, and daughter JANE SCOTT only 1 shilling. Sons JOHN and THOMAS ROBERTS were appointed executors. Jane's daughter, MARY, married WILLIAM PARKER of Nansemond County. He died before 26 Jun 1711 when JANE BRASWELL ROBERTS mentioned him in her will as the deceased husband of her daughter, MARY. MARY was in North Carolina by Dec. of 1738 when she deeded her inheritance to ROBERT ELEY. The record reads, 'MARY PARKER, Precinct of North Carolina, deeded ROBERT ELEY part of a patent to JANE STOKES, widow, Isle of Wight Co., land on Nansemond Indian Creek, 100 acres, July 20, 1680, part patented by JOHN ROBERTS and his wife granted by Sir HENRY CHICHELEY 1450 acres, and was given to MARY PARKER by JANE ROBERTS, deceased, Aug. 24, 1713, on the west side of Beaver Dam Swamp...down the line to Mr. EDMUND GODWIN's, etc...and boundary of former deed made to JOHN ROBERTS and his wife.' (Isle of Wight Deed Book 5, p. 310) MARY PARKER died in Edgecomb Co., NC; her will was probated in Aug of 1754. She left all to her grandson, EDMUND GODWIN. REBECCA, daughter of JANE BRASWELL, married an unknown man named BRINKLEY of Nansemond Co. It isn't clear which of JANE's three husbands was the father of MARY and REBECCA. An unknown daughter married an unknown SANDERS (the mother of the granddaughter she mentions in her will)."

Notes for Robert Stokes:

He was captured during Bacon's Rebellion by Governor BERKELEY and was hanged. His estate inventoried for sale in October 1677. BODDIE states that they were married for more than 10 years.

Richard and Sarah Valentine (?) Bracewell's issue is known primarily from their wills, signed respectively in Isle of Wight County on 28 Jul 1725 {Great Book, p.174} and 20 Mar 1734 {Wil l BK4, p. 64}:

Richard Bracewell, Jr., b.c. 1672, m. Elinor Unknown whom he abandoned in Chowan Precinct, NC, about 1715 and took up with Ann Carver (divo rce then unattainable); died in the midst of much litigation over his estate in Edgecombe County, N.C. between 1753 and 1758; Robert Bracewell b.c. 1674; m. Sarah Unknown and died testate in Bertie County, N.C., c.1736; William Bracewell b.c. 1676, m. Mary Unknown and died in Chowan Precinct, N.C. in 1720;Martha, b .c. 1678 and married a Mr. Murphy; Valentine, thought to have been named for hi s mother's family; Ann Bracewell, b.c. 1682; m. Matthew Strickland, Jr.;m. 2nd a Mr. Edwards by 1732. Jacob Bracewell, b.c. 1684 and married Rebecca Unknown; he died c.1719 and his widow remarried to William Wilson by 10 Nov 1724 in Bert ie County; Jane Bracewell, b.c. 1686 in Isle of Wight County, Va.;m, Samuel Wil liams, Jr.; John Bracewell, b.c. 1688. He remained behind and took care of his parents while the rest of his brothers migrated to North Carolina.

Note:

Richard's will was dated 28 Jan. 1724/25 and witnessed by Edward POWERS, Sr. and Edward POWERS, Jr. He gave 10 sheep to each of his sons and daughters: Richard, Robert, Valentine,Jacob, John, Mariah MURPHY, Ann STRICKLAND, and Jane WILLIAMS. His granddaughter, Susannah BRASWELL received a cow and the rest of the estate was left to wife, Sarah. His executor was his wife, Sarah.

Richard identified himself as the son of Robert BRASWELL, "Clerk," in a deed of 9 Oct. 1674. He and wife, Sarah, sold toThomas GREEN 300 of the 400 acres he received by deed of gift from his father on 16 Jan.1660. On 9 Aug. 1681, Richard and Sarah sold 2 acres to WilliamWEST. They were in Nansemond Co. to acknowledge the deed which was witnessed by Arthur JONES, John PITT, and Thomas PITT.

On 8/26/1745 Joseph and William Braswell, acting as Executors, presented their father's will in Isle of Wight County Court. Joseph and Sarah began their southerly migration sometime after their marriage. As both Joseph and Sarah's families had considerable holdings and both were recipients of considerable inheritances, some time would have been required to divest themselves of their holdings.

In 1746 Joseph and Sarah sold lands in Isle of Wight Co VA which they owned jointly with brother Wm and his wife Sarah. In 1749 Sarah and her sister, Faithe, sold land in Isle of Wight Co VA to their brother, Samuel.

Joseph and Sarah probably were in Orangeburg Dist SC by 1750. Joseph is reported to be found in the 1778 Orangeburg Dist. SC Tax Roll. And, he is believed to have died sometime thereafter in Orangeburg Dist. SC.

WILLIAM (BRACEWELL) BRASWELL, Jr. 1707-1785

Since his father, William BRACEWELL, died about 1720 it is apparently this William Braswell, Jr. who proved Susannah Burgess Bracewell will 1732. He would be about 25. If his father had lived he would have been executor of the estate along with Richard. No mention is made of Richard in 1732. However land title was maintained in the William Braswell estate as late as 1764. (ref. Isle of Wight County Deed Book 11, p. 268)

William BRACEWELL, Jr. was born about 1707 in the Isle of Wight County, Virginia. His parents, WILLIAM and MARY BRACEWELL, moved to Chowan County of North Carolina when William was a young child. On the 28 May 1728, the former MARY BRACEWELL and her second husband, Moses Quinn, quit-claimed to William BRACEWELL, Jr. the estate left by his father WILLIAM BRACEWELL. This would indicate that William Jr. had come of age at this date (Bertie Deed Book C, pg. 119). Almost immediately William Jr. began to dispose of the land he had inherited. On 31 July 1728, he sold 100 acres to Robert BRACEWELL, and on the same day sold 250 acres to John Wood (Deed Book C, pg. 3). In August of the same year he sold 240 acres to his step-father Moses Quinn (Deed Book C, pg. 79).

Then on August 31, 1728, William Jr. and wife Margaret BRASWELL (he had by now changed the spelling from BRACEWELL to BRASWELL), he being the son and heir to WILLIAM BRACEWELL deceased of Bertie County, sold 250 acres to Thomas Daughtery, in accordance with his father's bond (Deed Book C, page 5). In February of 1729, William BRASWELL, planter of Bertie County, sold 603 acres "All the tract where my father last lived", north of Meherrin River to John Baude (Boddie- Deed Book D, pp. 9-10).

It is apparent by this time that William Jr. was planning to move. On 25 May 1734, he was living in Edgecombe Precinct when he sold the last of his Bertie County land "To the Reverend John Boyd, Gentlemen, minister of the gospel in Bertie County 300 acres where the said Boyd doth now live and dwell." (Deed Book D, pgs 150, 313).

Notes for BENJAMIN BRIDGERS JR.:
From John Lucas:

April 20, 1776, Benjamin Bridgers enlisted as a Private in the Militia Company of Captain Jacob Turner of Franklin County, North Carolina, which was Colonel Jethro Sumner's Third North Carolina Infantry Regiment, North Carolina Continental Line. He was discharged 20 October 1778. He fought at the Battles of Brandywine and Germantown. He served for two and a half years. He was paid L2.11.2 1/4, for 27 days service by Col. Nicholas Long for an expedition to Norflok, Wilmington, and Moore's Creek.

In 1782 Benjamin Bridgers, Jr. appeared in the Nash County Tax List and showed he owned 550 acres. He lived near the Swift Creek area of Nash County.

By 1804 Benjamin Bridgers, Jr. was living in Franklin County, North Carolina.

His will was probated 22 April 1822 in Franklin County, North Carolina.
