He apparently passed out as he re-entered the house through the patio door, and died there, half inside the entrance. Diane and son Nathan found him when they awoke and came downstairs that morning.

Notes for Claude Braxton Freeman:

Claude was enlisted in the USMC in 1921, and served in Central America and the Caribbean. He served for one enlistment before leaving the Marines. In civilian life he worked as a mechanic, electrician, bricklayer, and various other jobs.

Claude often disappeared for periods of months after marrying Lillian. According to son Ralph this was because he was away working at the Rock Island Arsenal. Later Claude worked as a civilian armorer at Fort Belvoir, VA. He was given an award for developing a practice round for the M-16 rifle. He also received an award for developing a faster method of changing the oil in 90mm artillery piece. His method took ninety minutes whereas the old method took four hours. The newspaper article in the official army newspaper used to hang over his work table in his work shop. He worked at Fort Meyer and Fort Belvoir.

Claude also worked as a gunsmith, having a repair shop in the basement of his self-built home in Springfield, VA, and later in his and Lillian's home in Zephyr Hills, Fl. He would repair and modify weapons for the law enforcement, military, and civilian gun owners in the area. On several occasions he built sporting rifles from scratch for customers. His grandsons Donald and Dale used to sit in his shop and watch him make springs, screws, gun barrels, and carve the wooden stocks for the rifles. He had lathes and drill presses for forming all the gun parts he needed. He even did the engraving work on the gun receivers and stocks. He usually had a dog with him, and the dog would lay in the shop waiting for attention from Claude. Claude loved dogs, and they all seemed to love him. He rarely was without a dog during his life.

Ralph says that his father played either the banjo or the guitar on a country western or bluegrass radio show in North Carolina as a teen. As a boy, Ralph remembers Claude coming home and turning on the radio, listening to his favorite shows all evening, and finishing the night listening to country music until the small hours of the morning.

When Jerrell and Margaret were divorced, Claude and Lillian did all they could to help Margaret, baby sitting the children and having them down to Florida for visits when they moved from Virginia to Florida. Grandsons Donald and Dale spent a lot of hours with Claude, and they spent the summer with Claude and Lillian in 1968 in Florida.

Notes for Lillian Virginia Carter:

Lillian had problems with her legs, and for much of her middle and later life was greatly restricted in her ability to walk. She also had a very inactive thyroid gland which made it difficult for her to lose weight. Unfortunately for Lillian, the thyroid gland problem was only diagnosed by a nuclear medicine scan late in her life, and she finally lost weight just before she was diagnosed with pancreatic cancer. She did well on chemotherapy, not losing her hair or being very ill, but the chemotherapy was too late to stop the cancer which finally killed her.

After Claude's death she moved back to Alexandria, VA. She chose to live in apartments near Peggy (Margaret Freeman) Knight so she could help by baby sitting her grandchildren and help prepare dinner each night while Margaret and her second husband both worked. Later, when she got too ill, Margaret took care of her, taking her to all her medical appointments and helping her buy her medicines. When Lillian died in her hospital bed, Margaret and her daughter-in-law Hazel Freeman were present.

Unbeknownst to her grandchildren, her son Jerrell (their father) also came to visit her late in the evenings (per Ralph Freeman). On the day of her death, her grandsons Donald and Dale were called from work at the U. S. Postal Service, and her granddaughters were called from home, but they all arrived after Lillian had died.

Lillian used to visit her son Ralph in North Carolina and her brother Emmett in Orange whenever she could get someone to drive her. Her grandson Donald used to drive her for her visits on weekends and they became close during the last years of her life.

Donald once asked his grandmother why she never learned to drive. She, and Claude confirmed it, said that

Claude once put her behind the wheel of his car when they were living in Springfield in the 1950's. Lillian said she was doing fine, and they were driving down Old Keene Mill Road (in those days it was a rural road, not the six lane boulevard it is today) when she suddenly and for no apparent reason made a sharp left turn into the woods. That was the end of her driving lessons. Claude never again took a chance on teaching her.

John Benjamin Carter worked as a glazier for Dyer Bros. Paint Co. in Washington D.C. His grandson Ralph Harrison Freeman remembers going to the store as a boy and watching him cut and shape glass for windows. Brenda Carter's notes say he worked there from 1928 to 1929, but Ralph Freeman remembers that he worked there until he retired. Brenda Carter's notes also show that he worked as for Barnum's Circus where he held an apparatus in his mouth to support the high wire ladies. He also threw knives. There is an anecdote that he used Nannie Mae, his daughter, as a "target" for his knife act, but one time missed his throw and cut her toe. After this he gave up the act. Of course, the target was supposed to be her outline.

Margaret T. Freeman/Knight remembers her mother-in-law Lillian Freeman (Lillian V. Carter) saying that John Benjamin had been a "barker" for the carnival. Ralph H. Freeman, Lillian's son, supports this memory.

Son Bill (William) told his family that once his mother emptied some old jars of apple sauce into the yard, and the summer heat fermented it. The chickens in the yard ate the fermented apple sauce and became drunk, falling over in a deep sleep. Janie thought they had all died, and chose several to pluck and prepare for dinner. After the chickens were plucked some of them revived. For a while there were a number of bald chickens running around the yard.

Per Doris Freeman/Chandler, whenever the old sixties song "Polk Salad Annie" was played Lillian would talk about how her mother Janie used to wander the woods near home picking the "polk" for polk salad.

Jane died October 11, 1919 of the Spanish Flu. She is buried in Beth El Cemetery with her mother and father Nancy J. Brissey and Samuel Posey, brothers, sisters, and children. The location of her grave is C88.

William worked for Virginia Electric Power Company (Vepco). While working in Charlottesville he met and married Bertha Lee Craddock. His work took him to live in Orange, Virginia. Later he moved back to Alexandria, VA. He enlisted in the U.S.Navy and served in the Pacific during WWII. He worked at the Heating Shop as Supervisor at Ft. Myer, Virginia until he retired in 1967.

While working for Virginia Electric Power Company, he put together and installed the then new

refrigerators in the 1930's for customers and also was a lineman.

After moving back to Alexandria he worked there about a year before having a job description assigned by the government. It was Fixed Industrial Equipment Supervisor. He worked on water coolers and had a second job at the Ice House.

He was instrumental in changing all the coal fired boilers over to oil or gas at Ft. Myer.
