John M Smith died at his home in Lockville after many months of suffering. Deceased is survived by his wife and three small children, his mother, two brothers and three sisters - Lloyd B Smith of Binghamton, NY; Clarence Smith of Centremoreland, Mrs Abijah Baird of Suttee, Mrs. Allen Dailey of La Grange and Mrs. Grant Van Gordeen of Meshoppen. Deceased was a son of Mr and Mrs Hanford Smith of Suttee. He was born on August 31, 1867, and married to Abbie Coolbaugh on November 15, 1892. Although being a sufferer for five years he bore his affliction with Christian patience and fortitude. He was a favorite with all who knew him, kind-hearted and generous, and the high esteem in which he was held was shown by the kindness of his friends and neighbors in his last illness. The funeral was held at Lockville M.E. church on Tuesday at 11 a.m. by Rev. Mr. James. Interment was in Temple Cemetary. The choir rendered some selections and Rev. Mr. James took for his text "Be ye also ready, for in such an hour as ye think not the Son of Man cometh."

#### History of Luzerne County

John S. Marcy, retired farmer, and a justice of the peace at Duryea, was born in Marcy township, this county, November 1, 1821, and is a son of Ebenezer and Susannah (Adams) Marcy, natives of the same place, of New England origin. They were among the earliest settlers in Wyoming Valley, and reared a family of twelve children, of whom our subject is the eleventh in order of birth. He received his education in the common schools, and worked with his father on the old homestead farm until the year 1839, when he accepted a position as clerk in a store in Wilkes-Barre; but only stayed there one year, returning at the expiration of that time to his home, where he remained until 1860. He then went into the grocery business, but in September, 1861, sold out and joined, as a lieutenant, Company G, Fifty-second Pennsylvania volunteers. He was at the battle of Fair Oaks, and at the siege of Charleston. Returning home in October, 1864, he has since then lived peacefully on his farm, which has been in possession of the family since the year 1770. Mr. Marcy was united in marriage August 7, 1843, with Mary E., daughter of Lieutenant Peter and Eleanor (Jacobs) Coolbaugh, natives of Bradford county, Pa., and their union has been blessed with the following children: Sarah A., born March 4, 1844, died December 2, 1889; Martha Rose, born January 26, 1846, died April 30, 1872; Joseph W., born April 9, 1848; Edwin B., born January 4, 1850, died August 11, 1883; Charles S., born March 19, 1852, died August 10, 1855; Gertrude J., born June 9, 1854; Hannah F., born July 20, 1856, died December 13, 1879; Bertha E., born March 13, 1859. Our subject is a Democrat, and has served at various periods as constable of his township, assessor, supervisor, and school director, and at the present time holds the offices of auditor and justice of the peace, having held the latter office nine years.

I am sure we are the same family for she is my gg grandmother. She has some roots in Poughkepsie NY I was there to the Historical Library. I found that indeed there is a family of Indians by the name of Lawson. The people who registered the Indians wrote their names in English to the records. The Indian name is Lo Song. Whether this is the family Mary Polly Lawson came from is the question. Indians don't keep records. I do have news paper articles about her. She was a devoted Christian. You might try to contact the Library for more information. It has been years since I was there and they keep getting information from people who search for their family lines. If you do find out anything I would greatly appreciate any new news. Thank you and good luck.

I am sure we are talking about same individuals . I have news paper article that says she was 6 years old when the Declaration of Independence was signed. She is a hard lady to find before she married John B. Dymond. She is of Indian descent. I went to Poughkepsie NY and found that there were some Indians with the name of Lo Song And that was misspelled to Lawson. I even found a wedding in which that name was used . The Indians gave to the white man a dowry of lots of land in that area. You would have to call or visit the Poughkepsie Historical Library New York. Let me know how you make out.

Joseph DYMOND, farmer, P.O. Lockville, Wyoming County, was born in Exeter Township, August 24, 1830, where he was reared and educated. He is a son of Joseph and Mary (Booth) Dymond, the former of whom was born in this county in its early settlement. He was one of its first pioneers, and did much for the growth and development of civilization. He lived to a ripe old age, and reared an interesting family. His son, Joseph, began life in Exeter Township as a farmer, on a farm of ninety-three acres. Like his father, he was a hard working and industrious man, and possessed considerable influence in the township, where he was honored with several offices of trust. He was a consistent member of the Methodist Episcopal Church, and his life, through uneventful, was fraught with good to all. He lived to be sixty years of age, and reared a family, all of whom grew to maturity, and eight of whom are now living. Joseph is the fifth in the family. He was always confined himself to farming, and has passed all his life in this county . He lived at home until his marriage, May 19, 1861, with Miss Matilda, daughter of Morehouse and Hannah Smith. To this union were born nine children, six of whom are now living;

Wilbur , Hannah,Joseph, Zacariah, Harrison N., and Calvin. In 1861, Mr. Dymond removed to his present residence, a farm of 14 acres, which he has improved in every respect. He has erected a fine new house and commodious barn. Mr. Dymond is a practical farmer and a man of some influence in his neighborhood; he has been honored with several township offices.
