

## *Descent s of Henry Hillock*

### *Generation No. 1*

1. **Henry<sup>1</sup> Hillock** died 1800 in Fayette Co, Kentucky<sup>1</sup>. He married **Sarah Hambleton**. She died Unknown.

Notes for Henry Hillock:

Fayette County Kentucky Records, Will Book A, Page 203

Will of Henry Hillock, gives all his bonds and notes and other accounts due him to James Hambleton Hillock, also all his other property, and desired that the money be put to interest and that his mother, Sarah Hambleton to have the said interest paid her yearly for keeping said boy until he reaches maturity; in case James Hambleton Hillock should die, then the said money and other property to be given to Sary Hambleton, his mother. He appoints Henry Marshall his executor desiring that he take the bonds and notes out of Mr. McCullough's hands which had been left in his care. June 11, 1800. Walter Karrick, Joshua Judd and Jonah Sketer witnesses. Probated July 1800, and re-recorded October Court 1804.

"The Hillocks were members of the MacDonald Clan when the clan joined Robert The Bruce to repel the English at the battle of Bannockburn, near Sterling Castle, on June 23-24, 1324. One small family group (said to be 16) of the MacDonalds bravely defended a small hill the English were trying to capture, and after the Scottish victory, King Robert honored them by giving them their own name, "Hillock". The name Bannerman was given at the same time to the family of a man who bravely defended the flag."

The Hillock coat of arms hereby illustrated is officially documented in "Burke's General Armory", Wilfred Hillock is now deceased. His work covers the Hillock family of Thomas & Ann who came from Derry(Londonderry)N.Ireland in 1856. This family lived in Ontario,Canada in the counties of Simcoe,Peel and York.

2. **James Hambleton<sup>2</sup> Hillix** (Henry<sup>1</sup> Hillock) was born Bet. 1790 - 1800 in Ireland or Kentucky, and died 03 Jan 1849 in Fayette Co, Kentucky<sup>2</sup>. He married **Ann B. Walker** 07 Dec 1815 in Clermont Co., OH, daughter of Dr. Walker. She was born 22 Nov 1798 in Bolton, England<sup>3</sup>, and died 10 Aug 1888 in Weston, Missouri<sup>4</sup>.

Notes for James Hambleton Hillix:

Family history as written by Dorothy Hillix Bywaters in 1966 indicates that James Hillix was born in Ireland. However, the 1900 Census of Platte Co. Missouri has a record of James Hillix's son, William Walker Hillix(I) that indicates his place of birth as Kentucky. It also indicates that his mother was born in England, which agrees with the family history. Ann Walker is said to have been born in Bolton, England in 1798.

Midway, Kentucky..there are several towns named Midway in Kentucky.

James Hillix was married in Lexington, KY according to Dorothy Hillix-Bywaters family history. However, there is a marriage record that appears to be his in Clermont Co, KY in Dec 1815.

It is believed that they lived near the town of Midway

The 1830 Census for Fayette Co., KY shows a James "Hillicks."

Served in Stuart W. Megowan's Regiment of KY Mounted Volunteer Militia in War of 1812. His name was spelled Hillock and Hillox on the muster rolls for this unit. It is clear that the family name was changed from Hillock to Hillix during James' life time.

All of his children except his oldest, John W., were still living with him according to the 1840 census.

Notes for Ann B. Walker:

There is an entry on page 769 of Paxton's Annals of Platte County Missouri listing Ann B. Hillix as a pensioner receiving \$8/Mo. This entry is from the section for January, 1883. This was a widow's pension for James Hillix's service in the war of 1812.

Was married in Dec., 1815 in Clermont Co., OH at 16 years of age to James Hillix.

Family tradition says that her middle initial B was for Bolton and that she was from Bolton, England.

Marriage Notes for James Hillix and Ann Walker:

Filed in Clermont Co., OH on January 15, 1816. They were married by Charles Kuery(J.P.)  
The entry in the marriage book reads as follows;

I the undersigned one of the Justices of the Peace in & for the County of Clermont Lewis Township Do hereby certify the solemnization of marriage and joined together in Holy matrimony James Hillix and Anna Walker. By virtue of public advertisement agreeably to "save this seventh day of December 1815.

The name of James Hillix is hard to read. It looks like it has been over written. The 'x' is hard to distinguish from an 'n'.

Notes for Charles Hamilton Hillix:

According to family lore, he is said to have been killed at the Civil War Battle of Shiloh, TN, also known as Pittsburgh Landing. This was one of the bloodiest battles of the civil war with over 10,000 casualties being suffered on both sides. The Union General was Ulysses S. Grant and the Confederate generals were Johnson and Beauregard. Johnson was killed during the most intense part of the battle. The battle ended in a stailmate, but helped the South solidify its position on the western front. Some consider it to be a Union victory because Beauregrad didn't follow-up on the initial successes of the Confederate forces allowing the Union army to regroup and bring in

re-enforcements.

The information above was according to family lore. However, I have found he was killed in the siege of Vicksburg, Mississippi in June of 1863. He served in Landis' Battery of Missouri Light Artillery, Confederate States Army(CSA). He was mortally wounded by an artillery shell that exploded directly over the breastworks(redoubt) where he was sleeping.

He was called Ham Hillix and is mentioned in two books about the civil war, "As the Mockingbird Sang," and "Fishing on Deep River," both by Susan Staker Lehr, which are memoirs of the Civil War by two brothers, Samuel Baldwin Dunlap and Robert Caldwell Dunlap.

Enlisted at Van Buren, AR on 23 Mar 1862, period one(1) year. Landis' battery of Missouri Light Artillery.

Counted present in Muster Rolls of July, August, September, October, November and December, 1862.

Counted present in Muster Rolls of March, April, May, June, 1863. Counted present on card for March and April, 1863. Card for May and June, 1863 says "killed seige Vicksburg."

She married **John Argabright** 29 Jan 1834 in Fayette Co., KY. He was born 09 Aug 1809 in Ross Co, Ohio, and died 29 Apr 1882 in Nebraska.

JAMES W. ARGABRIGHT, farmer, P. O. Nemaha City, was born in 1840, in Fayette County, Ky. Accompanied

his father in his removal to Missouri, Kansas and Nebraska, in 1859. Has lived on his present farm since 1862, and married Miss M. F. Moore, who was born in Burlington, Iowa. They have six children--Mary P., John W., Cora, Anna E., J. Paul and Richard M., all born in Nemaha County, as well as Zua, who died aged seven, and Samuel M., who died in infancy. John Argabright was born in 1809, in Ohio. Appears he was born in Kentucky about 1820, married in Kentucky in 1841 to Ann Jane Thornton of Pennsylvania, was still in Kentucky in 1850 according to the census of 1850, moved around 1853 to Missouri and then by 1859 to Leavenworth, KS where here lived out the rest of his life. He was a carpenter and laborer. He had five(5) children. He lived until 1903. He was about 83 years old when he died. All five(5) children were at home in the 1860 census, James and Thaddeus were not listed in the 1870 census.

Cause of death heart failure.

"Fell over dead" at the corner of Quincy and Madison St., Leavenworth, KS.

Only kindred listed was James Hillix. He was single at the time, so his wife probably preceded him in death or divorced.

**6. Henry H.<sup>3</sup> Hillix** (James Hambleton<sup>2</sup>, Henry<sup>1</sup> Hillock)<sup>15</sup> was born 03 May 1825 in Fayette Co., KY<sup>16</sup>, and died 11 Feb 1900 in Leavenworth, KS<sup>17</sup>. He married **Mary Eliza Barbee** 18 Jan 1849 in Fayette Co., KY<sup>18</sup>, daughter of Jesse Barbee and Sutton. She was born 18 Jan 1834 in Fayette Co., KY, and died 23 May 1895 in Seneca, KS<sup>19</sup>.

Notes for Henry H. Hillix:

He was a veteran of the Mexican War(1846-1848). He served in the First Kentucky Mounted Volunteers.

The following account of an incident that Henry Hillix participated in is from a book on Kansas history by William G. Cutler;

#### The Baughn Tragedy

"On November 12, 1866, four men came to Seneca(KS) with a team and wagon, and with three loose horses; the latter, as it was afterward proved, stolen by them at Elwood, in Doniphan County. On the 19th, three pursuers arrived at Seneca, procured writs, and proceeding west, on information obtained, found the thieves encamped on the Vermillion River, about ten miles from town. Making no attack, the pursuers returned, obtained the Sheriff with a small force of citizens, and again started out to make the arrest, going out on the North road, the men they were seeking coming into Seneca on the same day by the South road, passing through and stopping a little east of the town. Here they divided; two of them, named Jackson and Strange; remaining where they were, and being arrested, while the other two, Baughn and Mooney, started out on foot, eastward. The Sheriff summoned a posse of men, who started in pursuit, and overtook the men they were after, on the Capioma road, at the crossing of the Muddy.

Three of the pursuers, Charles W. Ingram, **\*\*Henry H. Hillix\*\*** and Jesse S. Dennis, were in advance of the rest, and on seeing the men rode nearly up to them, Ingram remarking as they did so, "We have come for you." At this, one of the men, having a double barrelled shot-gun, discharged both barrels at Ingram, neither of which took effect. The other one had two revolvers, and shot at both **\*\*Hillix\*\*** and Dennis, one shot passing through **\*\*Hillix's\*\*** clothing, another striking him just below the shoulder blade, making a severe, but not dangerous wound. He returned the fire, but without effect.

Dennis received a bullet in the back, which passed diagonally through the body, through the lungs, and in close proximity to the heart. He was fatally wounded, living only a few moments. The one having the gun, after getting over into an adjoining corn field, again fired at Ingram, who jumped from his horse, thus avoiding the shot. Both men escaped.

A proclamation was at once issued by the prominent citizens of Nemaha County, offering a reward of \$1,000 for the delivery of the bodies of Baughn and Mooney, to the legal authorities of said county within ninety days, a description of both desperadoes being given.

On January 6, 1867, Melvin Baughn, the chief offender in the tragedy, was arrested in Leavenworth[KS], on a description or warrant sent from St. Joseph[MO] for a gang of burglars who had plundered a store in Wathena[KS], a few days before. Upon being recognized as the murderer of Dennis, he was brought from Leavenworth, delivered to the county authorities, and lodged in jail, a preliminary examination having been held and the prisoner bound over to await trial at the next term of the District Court. On January 10 an unsuccessful attempt was made to lynch Baughn, going no further than demands for the prisoner and threats, but being only satisfactorily settled by the crowd appointing a Deputy Sheriff to have special charge of the prisoner until his trial. On February 6, Baughn with another prisoner confined in the jail, succeeded in forcing open the doors and escaping, helping themselves to arms and ammunition in the passage of the jail.

Efforts were made at recapture; unsuccessful until June, 1868, and then only due to the fugitive's committal of lesser crimes than the one for which he was wanted in Nemaha County[KS]. On May 25 a house was robbed at Sedalia, Missouri; the next day a suspicious looking carpet bag was expressed by some one, to Joseph King, Otterville. Officers there were posted, but in endeavoring to make the arrest of King, wounded him severely, but nevertheless allowed him to escape for the time being, capturing him, disabled by his wound, two days after he was shot. On its being discovered that the prisoner was none other than the notorious Baughn, and after the necessary legal formalities, he was returned to Seneca on June 27, and recommitted to jail.

On August 2 his trial commenced, concluding on the 6th, the jury returning a verdict of murder in the second degree. On the 7th, Judge R. St. Clair Graham pronounced sentence, that on the 18th of September, 1868, the prisoner should be legally executed.

This sentence was duly carried into effect, at 3:00 P. M. of the day mentioned, the condemned man showing extraordinary nerve at the approach of death, and freely forgiving the community who had "tyrannized" over him, attributing their "ill-feelings to ignorance and bad whiskey." It is unnecessary to state that he announced his reconciliation to God.

Thus ended the Dennis murder case, with the first and last judicial execution the county has seen."

Following is part of his obituary;

Another of the very first settlers of the county has passed on to the bourn from whence no traveler returns. Henry H. Hillix died at the Soldier's Home in Leavenworth, KS on Sunday, February 11, 1900 at the advanced age of 74 years. The remains were shipped to Seneca at the request of the Masonic Lodge of this city, of which he had been a member for almost forty years. The funeral services were conducted by the Rev. E. Combie Smith and were held at the M.E. Church and the remains were interred with Masonic rights in the Seneca cemetery alongside his wife (Mary E. Barbee). Henry Hamilton Hillix was born near Lexington, Kentucky, on May 5, 1825 and grew to manhood among the historic scenes of the bluegrass regions of Kentucky.

Death Announcement - Seneca Tribune, 15 Feb 1900

H. H. Hillix, a pioneer of Nemaha county died from a complication of diseases and old age at the Old Soldier's Home at Leavenworth, Sunday, February 11. The body was brought to this, his former home, Wednesday noon. The funeral will be today at two o'clock, p.m. in the M. E. church and will be in charge of the Master Masons of this city. The interment will be at the Seneca cemetery. Grace Hillix of Centralia, daughter of the deceased, and Wm. Hillix, of Colorado an adopted son, will be here to attend the funeral. Henry H. Hillix was an upright and honest citizen whose death is deplored.

It is located on Kentucky State Hiway 62 South of Interstate 64. Per family history done by Dorothy Hillix, W. W. Hillix moved to Platte Co., Mo. in 1853. It is believed they later moved to Buchanan CO., Mo. He was married in St. Joseph to Ellen Rebeca Whittington on 10 Jan 1856. Their first child, William Walker II, was born in Buchanan, Co. on 15 Nov 1857. It appears that they moved, at least temporarily, to Kansas around 1859. He appears in the census index for 1859 in Leavenworth, KS. His sons, Allen A. and Charles H. are indicated to have been born in Kansas in 1861 and 1863 per the census of 1900 of Platte Co., Mo. This would make sense because of the border skirmishes between Missouri and Kansas based factions during the Civil War. There were many raids on Platte Co. during the war by bushwackers and many family's left the area until the war was over to avoid attack and possible death. Platte Co. was perceived to be a base for southern sympathizers, even supporters of Quantrel's raid on Lawrence, Kansas. Kansas was a free state. Although Missouri did not secede from the Union during the Civil War,

slavery had been legal there before the war and the emancipation proclamation.

Hillix Family Picture - Circa 1900 - Charles H. Hillix and Clara May Nelson Hillix had a child, Katherine Rebecca Hillix (Kilbourne) who was born on January 28, 1900 and she is not in the picture. Gus Hillix(2nd) said that W.W. HILLIX and the Barbees were co-owners of a gold mine in Colorado, the Bonnie Lew Mining Co., in Cripple Creek, CO. It was 30 acres(small claims). An attorney named Frost was given money to pay the taxes on the mine, but never did. This put a lean on the title of the mine. Later the Barbee's willed part of the mine to the School of the Ozarks. A syndicate lead by a Col. French tried to get a clear title to the mine because gold prices had risen considerably. The School of the Ozarks and Gus Hillix sold it(not sure if it was to French or someone else).

Short biography below of William C. Polk is from a booklet that was published by the newspapers in Weston and Platte City, MO in conjunction with the national corn husking contest held in Platte County on November 15, 1929.

William C. Polk was born in 1860 near Flintlock Church, the first little log church in Platte County, MO. His parents were Willis and Parthenia Francis Dye Polk, who lived on a farm near the historic post of

the Unity Baptist Church.

Mr. Polk was educated in the public schools of the county and at Gaylord College in Platte City, after which he took a commercial course in St. Joseph, MO.

In 1880 Mr. Polk went to the Panhandle in Texas, working in a commercial store. He liked Texas and took advantage of the opportunities open to an eager young man, establishing an investment fund which later he used for the purchase of stock in the Bank of Weston (GH note - his brother-in-law, Allen A. Hillix was the president and Charles Hamilton Hillix, another brother-in-law was VP and Treasurer).

Back in Missouri during eleven (11) years of his stay in Texas, lived a petite little miss with black hair and dark sparkling eyes. The information on his age in the obit conflicts with the census information from 1870 and 1880, which both indicate he was born in 1869 or 1870.

\*note - I had written a note on the print-out from Mt. Muncie Cemetery, where he is buried, that his father was James Hillix and his mother Eliz. Gardner, both born in KY. I think I copied this from the death certificate or similar information from Davis funeral chapel in Leavenworth, KS.

I have a copy of the marriage registration for this marriage from Buchanan Co., MO.

His official death certificate says his mother was Elizabeth Gardner, which corresponds with the census records of 1870 and 1880.

The obituary for James M. Hillix from the Leavenworth Times says he was survived by two(2) sons, George and James F., both of Leavenworth.

An e-mail from Wilbur D. Russel of Leavenworth, KS claimed that the parents of George W. Hillix were James and Hannah Hillix. This is not correct. (I have a copy of the marriage license for James M. Hillix and Hannah Bowman, 13 SEP 1886).

Both of the above conflicts with what I got from Bill Hillix saying George W. Hillix's father was Henry H. Hillix.

The following description of Mt. Muncie cemetery is from William G. Cutler's History of the State of Kansas written in 1882.

Mount Muncie Cemetery, the principal and most beautiful of Leavenworth's burial grounds consists of 173 acres, purchased of Dr. Mills, three and a half miles from the court-house, on Delaware road. Twelve thousand dollars was the amount of the purchase money, and the sum of \$38,000 has been expended in the adornment of the naturally beautiful spot chosen by the original board of directors: Thomas Carney, William Fairchild, W. C. Lobenstein, Charles N. Palmer, James B. Laing, W. H. Ralston, John Wilson, A. Stettauer, L. T. Smith, A. A. Higginbotham, John Kerr, Isaac Young, Henry Foote, C. R. Moorehead, C. B. Brace, F. E. Arnold, S. S. Ludium, H. D. Rush, J. W. Morris, T. P. Fenlon, J. G. Reaser, D. P. Mitchell, J. D. Liggett, W. E. Chamberlain, B. L. Baldrige, David J. Brewer, H. R. Hammond, J. L. Wever, Geo. S. Woodward, James Hall, A. M. Sawyer, W. G. Mathais and H. M. Moore. The association was organized under the general incorporation law of Kansas, and the second section of the charter provided: "The entire funds arising from the sale of burial lots, and proceeds of any investment of said funds shall be, that they are specifically dedicated to the purchase and improvement of the grounds for the cemetery and keeping them durably and permanently enclosed and in perpetual repair throughout all future time. \* \* \* and no part of such funds shall, as dividend, profit, or in any manner whatever inure to the corporators." That Leavenworth has a cemetery of which every citizen may be justly proud, her people are mainly indebted to the unselfish and self-sacrificing labors of James B. Laing, John Wilson, J. L. Wever, and D. J. Brewer, who through sunshine and storm always stood forward as the steadfast, fearless friends of the association. All honor to them. The scale of prices of lots range from twenty-five to three-hundred dollars, according to size and locality. The grounds are interspersed with hill and valley, and have been laid out on the rural or Cincinnati plan--the size of a lot depending on the "lay" of the ground. Since the grounds were opened, nearly eighteen years since, nearly 4,000 persons have been buried in Mount Muncie. The first President was James B. Laing; John Wilson, vice president; David J. Brewer, the first and present secretary. Present officers: George A. Eddy, president; Lewis Mayo, vice president; J. L. Wever, treasurer and superintendent; D. J. Brewer secretary; David Bovard, sexton; James B. Laing, E. P. Willson, C. B. Brace, H. W. Gillett, John Wilson, George A. Eddy, Lewis Mayo, J. L. Wever, D. J. Brewer directors.
