## *Generation No. 1*

He married **(1) Josefa Dominguez Ferrer**<sup>5,6</sup> Abt. 1845. She was born in Cocentaina, Alicante, Espana<sup>7,8</sup>, and died Unknown. She was the daughter of Jose Dominguez and Rita Ferrer.

## *Generation No. 2*

**2. Blas Albors**<sup>9,10</sup>, born Abt. 1800 in Cocentaina, Alicante, Espana<sup>11,12</sup>; died Unknown. He married **3. Monin Ferri** in Espana<sup>13,14</sup>.

**3. Monin Ferri**<sup>15,16</sup>, born Abt. 1800 in Cocentaina, Alicante, Espana<sup>17,18</sup>; died Unknown.

Notes for Blas Albors:

Albors is of Catalan origin. The first house of the family was in Balaguer de Lerida. The surname Albors has its roots in the plural of the Catalan word "albor" which in Spanish means "albur". Albur is the common name of a river fish which comes from the Arabic word "buri", that comes from the Egyptian city Bure. In the Middle Ages a second name (surname) was established in order to distinguish between 2 persons with the same name. Albors surname was based in the type of work of the first bearer, which was the person who fished or sold "albures"

"By reason or by force..."

This is the motto of the Albors Family Blason of Arms, Certificate of Authenticity # 37229 by the International House of Heraldry. This certificate was provided by Juan Alberto (Bertio) Albors. The Albors Blason of Arms was registered in Catalunya, Spain in the early 17th century.

Arms: Or, a bent vert

Crest: None registered

Motto: By reason or by force

Supporters: Two lions rampant OR, armed and langued gules

OR is gold, which means purity, valour

Gules is red which means fire, fortitude

Brief description:

The Bend is a bearing of high honor representing the scarf or shield suspender of a knight commander, and of ten awarded for distinguished command in battle.

The Lion is the emblem of deathless courage, and is the lively image of a good soldier who must be valiant of courage, strong of body, politic in council, and a foe to fear.

The Shield itself is the safeguard of a warrior, and signifies a defender.
