They came to Westphalia, Iowa in 1880, and moved to Panama in 1901. Mr and Mrs Schwery died within two days of each other and had a double funeral.

Cause of death of Margaret Jemming:

Margaret was taking care of her husband Godfrey, who was dying of "consumption". They lived on a farm, so she had taken responsibility for all the chores. She was checking on a newborn calf, and the cow mauled her. She crawled back to the house and died. Beatrice Leuschen remembered her as being such a strong woman. Her death came as a great shock. Godfrey died two days later, and they were given a double funeral.

About his usual daily tasks the day before his illness, death came as a great shock to his family, relatives and friends.

Melchior Schwery son of the late Godfrey and Margaret Schwery, was born Jan. 6, 1881, at Westphalia, IA. On Sept. 12, 1905, he was united in marriage to Theresa Klein. To this union twelve children were born, all of whom are living. Obituary: Melvin Schwery 77. Sept 2, 1924 - June 14, 2002. Panama - Melvin Schwery, son of Melchoir and Theresa (Klein) Schwery, was born Sept. 2, 1924, at Panama. He was baptized, received his first Holy Communion, was confirmed and attended school at St. Mary's in Panama. He grew to adulthood on the family farm.

Oct. 1, 1947, he married Verelda Schmitz at St. Boniface Church in Westphalia. Eight children were born to this union. After their marriage, they farmed the family farm at Panama. In August, 2000, they moved off the farm and into Harlan. Melvin started farming the family farm at the age of 17, when his father died. THEODORE SCHWERY.

Among the enterprising and progressive citizens of Shelby County there are none who stand higher in the esteem of their fellow men than Theodore Schwery, the owner of a fine farm of three hundred and fifty-nine acres in Washington Township. Having lived in this county for the past quarter of a century he has seen it grow from a wide expanse of thinly settled territory to its present prosperous condition and in this transformation he has borne no inconsiderable part.

Theodore Schwery, the son of Godfred and Margaret (Jemming) Schwery, was born October 16, 1870, in LaSalle county, Illinois. His father was born in Switzerland, educated in Germany and then began a sea-faring life with his father who had a small freighter on the Mediterranean Sea and carried goods between the various ports bordering the sea. When still a voting man Godfred came to this country, located in Louisiana and found employment as a fiat-boatman on the Mississippi river. A few years later he located in LaSalle County, Illinois, where he worked for some years as a farm hand and then bought a small farm. He continued to reside in Illinois until 1880 when he came to Shelby county and purchased a farm in West-phalia township. He and his wife died only two days apart, he passing away on February 12, 1914, and his wife two days before. They were the parents of five children: Theodore, whose history is here recorded; John, who married Mary Schmitz; Susan, the wife of Joseph Leuschen; Melcher, who married Matilda Schomer (deceased), and then Theresa Klein; and Godfred, who married Dessie Miller.

Theodore attended the schools of LaSalle county, Illinois, for three years and then was in school for five or six years after his parents moved to Shelby County. After leaving school he remained upon the home farm until his marriage in 1893 and then rented a farm from his father for a few years. Eventually he was able to buy a farm of one hundred and sixty acres in Westphalia Township on which he lived for Seventeen years. He then bought his present farm of three hundred and fifty-nine acres, on which he is making some very extensive improvements. He is now erecting a beautiful home and another large and commodious barn and intends to make his farm as near up-to-date as he can. He has always been an exponent of the most advanced methods of agriculture and is justly regarded as one of the best farm-ers in the county.

Mr. Schwery was married April 26, 1893, to Mary Foxhoven, the daughter of John and Katherine (Karll) Foxhoven. To this union there have been born nine children: Katherine, Bertha, Anthony, Isadore, Louis, Lawrence, Agnes, John and William. The latter two are deceased while the rest of the children are still living with their parents.

The Foxhoven family came from Germany, John Foxhoven Coming here with his parents when he was thirteen years of age; his wife, Katherine Karll, being ten years of age when her parents landed in this country. Both

families settled in Johnberg, Wisconsin, and in that place John Foxhoven and his future wife attended school together. On reaching maturity they married and he began to work in the pineries of Wisconsin. In 1874 he came with his family to Shelby County, bought a farm in Lincoln Township, lived upon it twenty-eight years and then retired early in 1902 to spend the remainder of his days enjoying the fruits of his industry. To John Foxhoven and wife were born thirteen children: Bartholomew, who married Philomena Xiemeier; Anna, the wife of John Pimple; Peter, who married Eva Schmitz; Joseph. Deceased: William who married Anna Engle; Anthony, who married Emma Mevers; Mary, the wife of Mr. Schwery; Louis, who died in infancy; Bertha who died at the age of twenty-two; Christina, the wife of Stephen Lefebvre; John who married Anna Kuhl; Katherine, the wife of Ralph Kirkpatrick; and Michael, who married Mary Jacoby.

JOHN A. SCHWERY.

Agriculture has always been an honorable occupation, and at the present time the agricultural output of the United States is more than equivalent to the total output of all the factories of the country put together. There is one feature in the life of the farmer which distinguishes it from any other occupation, and that is his ability to exist independently of every other occupation. The merchant, the banker and the manufacturer all depend absolutely upon the farmer's crops. A famine throughout this country would bankrupt the strongest merchant, wreck the largest bank and close the most extensive factory. Business men can see their business collapse within a week, but nothing short of an earthquake can ruin the farmer. A panic may sweep the manufacturer out of business over night, but the farmer can survive when every other industry falls. Therefore, the farmer is the backbone of the nation, and he who makes two blades of grass grow where one formerly grew is performing the most useful mission of man. Shelby county farmers are as good tillers of the soil as can be found anywhere in the world, and their history is largely the history of the material advancement of the county. Among Shelby County's many excellent farmers John A. Schwery is deserving of recognition as one of the progressive agriculturists of Westphalia Township.

John A. Schwery, the son of Godfred and Margaret (Jemming) Schwery, was born in LaSalle County, Illinois, September 10, 1873. His father was a native of Switzerland and his mother of Luxembourg, Germany, and they came to the United States several years before their marriage. Godfred Schwery was educated in Switzerland and after leaving school worked on a farm until he came to this country, at the age of twenty-three. He located in Illinois, and worked as a farm hand for ten years, during which time he married and began to farm for himself. In 1880 he sold the farm which he had previously bought in LaSalle county, Illinois, and brought his family to

Shelby county. Iowa, where he purchased a farm of one hundred and sixty acres. He farmed this for four or five years and then sold it and bought the farm on which his son, John A., is now living. He remained on this farm until 1901, when he bought a farm near Panama, this county, on which he lived until his death, which occurred February 12, 1914, his wife having died two days previously. Godfred Schwery and wife were the par-ents of five children: Theodore, who married Mary Foxhoven: John A., with whom this narrative deals; Susan, the wife of Joseph Leuschen: Mel-chier, who first married Matilda Schomer, and after her death, Theresa Klein, and Fred, who married Bessie Miller.

John A. Schwery finished the course in the public schools at Westphalia, then entered St. Mary's College at St. Mary's, Kansas where he re-mained in attendance for two years. He then returned home and assisted his father on the farm until he was twenty-one years old, when he rented a farm from his father in Washington township on which he lived for three years, after which he rented the farm which he bought in 1907. This farm comprised one hundred and sixty acres and to this he added thirty-five more acres in 1913 giving him a total acreage of one hundred and ninety-five acres. Besides his general farming, Mr. Schwery is engaged in the breeding of high grade stock and the feeding of them for the market. His farming operations have been so uniformly successful as to entitle him to rank among the best farmers of his community.

Mr. Schwery was married November 20, 1898, to Mary Schmitz, the daughter of Adam Schmitz and wife. The history of Adam Schmitz, which appears elsewhere in this volume, gives the family history of Mrs. Schwery To this union have been born eight children, seven of whom are single and still living with their parents: Margaret, Joseph, Leo, Arthur, Henry, Urban, deceased; Lydia and Bernetta.

The democratic party has always appealed to Mr. Schwery and to it he gives his hearty support at all times. He has served as township assessor.

"Mike Petsche came from Austria to Illinois. He was single and made money working on a farm to bring Mary to America. They were married and came to Shelby county, IA. They bought a farm near Harlan. Mike built a huge home with a steeple and circular staircase. It looked like a castle. It was built like German homes and the yard had grapevines and a big birch tree. Mike went to Chicago and became ill with pneumonia. He died in Chicago. Mary stayed on the farm. She couldn't handle money well, and after making poor investments, ended up losing everything. Mary came to live with my family. I thought it was the greatest thing to have grandma live with my family. My house was on a hilltop, (there were several hills on the road we lived on). When Mary died we were driving to the funeral, and the hearse door came open on the hill! (They didn't lose it though)."

"I went to school in Westphalia. I boarded away from home the second year, and I was very lonely, and it was very frightening. I graduated in 1934. All the girls wanted to buy class rings. The nuns thought it was a waste of money, because they cost \$16.00, and it was during the depression. The girls managed to buy them anyway. After graduation I stayed at home and worked with my mother. I married LeVern Schwery on 12 Oct. 1937." "LeVern went to rural school until 8th grade, then he farmed with his father. After we were married we moved to a farm near Panama until 1945. Then we bought a farm near Vail, (where Mark and Betty Lou Schwery now live). It was 238 acres, and it cost \$32,000. Our first year we owned six beautiful hogs."

"During the great depression a dollar went a lot farther than today. A loaf of bread was \$ .10. A box of Cornflakes was \$ .19 to \$ .39. Coffee was \$ .25 a pound. Hogs went for \$ .04 a pound. A dance was \$ .25 for admission and \$ .25 for your lunch when you got in. No alcohol was served at the dance. If any drinking was done it was in the parking lot."

"My first car rides were with LeVern when we were dating. We dated every Wed. night and Sat. for three years. We would sometimes go to the show. We never would date on a Sat. night, because you would be preparing for church the next day. Some days LeVern couldn't drive to my house because of the dirt roads, so he would ride a horse instead. Depending on the condition of the road, I could anticipate the mode of travel."

"My first dealings with electricity, were the "Home Delta Plant". It was like a generator made up of batteries, that had to be kept charged. When we moved to Vail, IA, the town had no electricity. We had all the appliances, but no electricity! LeVern worked to get it to town. It took about a year. I remember my folks bringing ice home for their wooden refrigerator."

"For entertainment, before we were married, we'd go to the dances two or three times a week. The 'Klubhaus' in Westphalia is where we went. We played cards and pool. It was a meeting place for us kids after school. School was right there in town. It cost \$ .25 to get in and \$ .25 for lunch. Didn't have to have a date to get in. No alcohol was served. Wedding dances were free. To get money, you could work as a hired girl. You got \$2.00 a week - working from morning to night. You could work in restaurants or housekeeping. I didn't work out very much, so I stayed home with my mother and helped her. We used to churn butter once a week. Mother made her own bread and cake and pies. We kids had to bring wood and cobs for the stove and furnace. The kids always knew what their chores were.

At haying time we had to help pull the rope on the rake. I never milked cows either. I had seven brothers. I had to gather eggs though. We had to take lunch out to the men in the field in the afternoon, otherwise it was too long a day. Oat slashing time, all the farmers would get together to do the fields. All the women were busy making lunch and dinner. Sometimes we had to wait until that morning to butcher the chickens 'cause they wouldn't keep. We had an icebox. We'd buy a 25 lb. block of ice from time to time. Butter and milk would often sour. We'd have it down the well on a cistern to keep cold. At night you had to go out to the outhouse. You were never sure what you'd find. They used to have barn dances. People just played the instruments that they had. I guess they played good enough music for us to dance too. We had a favorite dog - 'Spot'. Black and white dog. Nice dog. During the holidays dad would cut a Christmas tree down - didn't always have a tree. We had a big table and each of us kids had a spot and that's were our present would be. At Easter time we used to dye eggs. We always had our baskets for eggs and candy. We never had Easter egg hunts. We always had new hats. I didn't like hats much, but we always had to have a new hat. On the 4th of July we'd get up in the morning and clean chickens. Dad would go to town and get ice and we'd have homemade ice cream. So we'd have fried chicken and we had some small fireworks. We could see Harlan fireworks from our upstairs window. We'd take a horse and buggy to school. In the winter time we'd take a sled. We left the wagon in a barn in town that someone let us use. It was 3 ½ miles from our farm to school. Sometimes we had to walk and we'd take a ride from anyone. My grandparents lived just up the road. They had lots of fruit trees and a beautiful birch tree. When Grandpa came over from Austria, he raised enough money to bring Grandma over. He built her a big enough house that she'd never want another. When grandpa Petsche died, grandma came to live with us. She'd always tell us stories while we washed dishes and we'd laugh and laugh. We sure enjoyed having her living with us. My mother's mother died when she was seven. Grandpa Jacoby kept all the children together after their mother's death. He had to teach them (the children) to cook and clean. On Sat., he'd make them children all shine their shoes and get prepared for church on Sun. He made sure all those kids got to church. Shivaree - They'd get together and the newly weds had to treat them to drinks and food - or maybe they'd bring it? I would last about two days. Wouldn't have a shivaree until a day or two after the wedding. Don't know how many kegs of beer they'd have. My dad said he had a real good one; lasted three days. Big wedding. My folks would talk German. They didn't speak a lot of German, 'cause they wanted us to learn English. I never learned German though I knew a few phrases."

They resided there until 1961 and then retired and moved into the town of Vail.
