He arrived in New York on 2 Feb. 1866. Having desire to go west, he started for Dubuque, Iowa, in 1867. Here, he was a pack peddler for nine years.

On Sept. 18, 1876 he married Mary Appel (1853 - 1929) of Galena, Ill. They came to Shelby Co., and purchased a farm southeast of Westphalia.

Their children: Rose, (1877 - 1932), m. Quirin Loehr; Josephine, (1878 - 1969), m. Jacob Loehr; John, (1881 - 1962), m. Elizabeth Jacoby; Mary, (1884 - 1981), m. Michael Sr., farmed and raised livestock and died Mar. 12, 1908. He and Mary are buried in Westphalia.

Obituary copied from the Earling Observer, Earling, Iowa, March 19, 1908: "Michael Petsche

Michael Petsche was born in Austria, Sep. 20, 1842. He crossed the ocean in 1866 and arrived in New York Feb. 2nd of that year, and from there went to Chicago where he stayed for one year. Having the desire to see more of the Great West, he started for Dubuque in 1876.

Here he met a few more of his former associates and they started in the peddling business, this occupation kept up by him for nine years. During this period he came in contact with a great many people and learned their different ways and habits. Owing to this, he was a great judge of men and consequently could get along well with other people. Having accumulated some means, Mr. Petsche came to Shelby County on March 2, 1876, and bought a farm where he has since resided.

On Sep. 26 the same year he was married to Mary Apple and of this union nine children, three sons and six

daughters, were born and are all living: Mrs. Q. E. Loehr, Mrs. Lake Loehr, John P., Mrs. George Sternberg, Mrs. Casper Langenfeld, Michael, Celia, Verona and Willie.

As a farmer and stock raiser he was a hard worker and was very successful. He erected one of the finest homes in Shelby County and owned a large tract of land. A kind and loving husband and father, he raised his family so that all can look upon them as a model.

Accompanied by his son-in-law, Q. E. Loehr, he left for Chicago Oct. 12, 1907, with a few cars of stock. While there, he consulted a physician as he was hard of hearing, but otherwise enjoyed good health for the first three weeks, he later got an attack of pneumonia. Hearing this, his loving wife hurried to his bedside and stayed there with him. Mr. Petsche was confined to the hospital for two weeks, the rest of the time, he was at the home of his sister-in-law, Mrs. Lizzie Petsche. Dr. Holmes was his physician, and he was also under the care of a trained nurse all the time. Whatever medical aid or skill could do was tried, but all in vain. He gave up his soul to God March 12th, just five months after he left home. Little did he dream then that he should never be able to return.

During his illness he was visited by his children, who were glad to see their dear father again and hoped that he might come home to be in their midst. His remains were brought home immediately, and reposed at his home till Monday, March 16th, when after a Requiem Mass he was buried in the Westphalia cemetery. The pallbearers were all of his former associates. They were George and John Rosemann, George Muschitz, John Kotschever of Carroll, John Gorsche, and Joseph Weihs.

Outsiders that attended the funeral were Valentine Apple of Iona, Minn., John Schugel of Beldon, Neb., John Kotschever of Carroll, and Lizzie Petsche of Chicago.

The Observer extends heartfelt sympathy to his widow and family in the hour of their great bereavement."

"Mike Petsche came from Austria to Illinois. He was single and made money working on a farm to bring Mary to America. They were married and came to Shelby county, IA. They bought a farm near Harlan. Mike built a huge home with a steeple and circular staircase. It looked like a castle. It was built like German homes and the yard had grapevines and a big birch tree. Mike went to Chicago and became ill with pneumonia. He died in Chicago. Mary stayed on the farm. She couldn't handle money well, and after making poor investments, ended up losing everything. Mary came to live with my family. I thought it was the greatest thing to have grandma live with my family. My house was on a hilltop, (there were several hills on the road we lived on). When Mary died we were driving to the funeral, and the hearse door came open on the hill! (They didn't lose it though)."

My mother Cecilia

(Schugel) Sullivan was good friends with Estelle (Petsche) Boettger. The Schugels & Petsche's kept in close contact. My grandmother Veronica (Petsche) Schugel came to America in 1890 & stayed with her uncle Mike Petsche, till she married John Schugel in 1892. Mike Petsche came from Bistriz House # 2 Slovenia, Parish of Tschernmbl, Austria, then it became part of Yugoslavia & now its Bistrica # 2, Parish Crnomelj, Slovenia. Petsche also was Pece depending on which country had control. I have a copy of the 1870 census of Jo Daviess County, ILL. Mary Apple was living with her parents, so I don't think Mike brought her over to marry. My dad's ancestors lived in that area & I remembered the name from Mike's Obit & mother had mentioned a Valentine Apple.

Mike Petsche immigrated Jan. 25, 1866 on Ship Bark "Diana" from Bremen, Germany. Merchant age 23. N.Y. Passenger List 175,617. He arrived in N.Y. Feb. 2, 1866 and went to Chicago, IL. where he stayed for a year. Having a desire to see the great west, he started for Dubuque, IA. in 1867. He was in the Back Peddling Business in Wisconsin & Iowa for 9 years. March 1, 1876, he moved to Shelby County, Iowa and bought a farm. He was

a farmer and stock raiser. On Oct. 12, 1907, he took several train carloads of stock to Chicago, became ill and died. He died at the home of his sister in law, Mrs Joseph (Lizzie) Petsche at 5304 Bishop St. Chicago, IL.

Notes for JOHN PETSCH (b. 1 Oct., 1858 November 23, 1981, by Rose Vorwald:

John, the 1st 2 years in the U.S. walked peddling his wares, carrying a pack that sometimes weighed 200 pounds or more. Then he bought a horse and buggy. When he came to the U.S., he had 3 uncles living there already. His uncle Joseph Petsche had a saloon in Chicago, IL., His Uncle Pete had a store and saloon in Petersburg, IA. and his uncle Mike who peddled merchandise from door to door in Illinois and Wisconsin. Both John and his uncle Mike had in their pack of merchandise, a walking store, stocked with everything from overalls to cough syrup. Michael Petsche is the same one that later had a farm near Harlan, IA. and my grandmother Veronica Petsche lived with his family when she came to the United States.

Notes from Pat Sullivan Oct 99: In searching FHL microfilm # 1416521, LB 977, Page 55, 1865, Family book Nesselal Parish, I found the bans for marriage for Michael Petsche, 1842, Bistriz # 2--Parents Johann Petsche & Maria Rom. TO Katherine Mischle or Mischke or Mische, Warmberg # 9--Parents Johann Mischle & Maria Maierle. They had the 1st & 2nd announcements, but the 3rd was different than others and I couldn't read it. I suppose we'd have to check the marriage records in Nesselal Parish to see if he got married, got cold feet or maybe she died. He left for the U.S. in 1866, so its interesting.

"Mike Petsche came from Austria to Illinois. He was single and made money working on a farm to bring Mary to America. They were married and came to Shelby county, IA. They bought a farm near Harlen. Mike built a huge home with a steeple and circular staircase. It looked like a castle. It was built like German homes and the yard had grapevines and a big birch tree. Mike went to Chicago and became ill with pneumonia. He died in Chicago. Mary stayed on the farm. She couldn't handle money well, and after making poor investments, ended up losing everything. Mary came to live with my family. I thought it was the greatest thing to have grandma live with my family. My house was on a hilltop, (there were several hills on the road we lived on). When Mary died we were driving to the funeral, and the hearse door came open on the hill! (They didn't lose it though)."

"I went to school in Westphalia. I boarded away from home the second year, and I was very lonely, and it was very frightening. I graduated in 1934. All the girls wanted to buy class rings. The nuns thought it was a waste of money, because they cost \$16.00, and it was during the depression. The girls managed to buy them anyway. After graduation I stayed at home and worked with my mother. I married LeVern Schwery on 12 Oct. 1937."

"LeVern went to rural school until 8th grade, then he farmed with his father. After we were married we moved to a farm near Panama until 1945. Then we bought a farm near Vail, (where Mark and Betty Lou Schwery now live). It was 238 acres, and it cost \$32,000. Our first year we owned six beautiful hogs."

"During the great depression a dollar went a lot farther than today. A loaf of bread was \$.10. A box of Cornflakes was \$.19 to \$.39. Coffee was \$.25 a pound. Hogs went for \$.04 a pound. A dance was \$.25 for admission and \$.25 for your lunch when you got in. No alcohol was served at the dance. If any drinking was done it was in the parking lot."

"My first car rides were with LeVern when we were dating. We dated every Wed. night and Sat. for three years. We would sometimes go to the show. We never would date on a Sat. night, because you would be preparing for church the next day. Some days LeVern couldn't drive to my house because of the dirt roads, so he would ride a horse instead. Depending on the condition of the road, I could anticipate the mode of travel."

"My first dealings with electricity, were the "Home Delta Plant". It was like a generator made up of batteries, that had to be kept charged. When we moved to Vail, IA, the town had no electricity. We had all the appliances, but no electricity! LeVern worked to get it to town. It took about a year. I remember my folks bringing ice home for their wooden refrigerator."

*Additional Notes: Recorded by LeAnn Hugeback, Jun., 1998 as recollected by Cecelia Schwery.

"For entertainment, before we were married, we'd go to the dances two or three times a week. The 'Klubhaus' in Westphalia is where we went. We played cards and pool. It was a meeting place for us kids after school. School was right there in town. It cost \$.25 to get in and \$.25 for lunch. Didn't have to have a date to get in. No alcohol was served. Wedding dances were free. To get money, you could work as a hired girl. You got \$2.00 a week - working from morning to night. You could work in restaurants or housekeeping. I didn't work out very much, so I stayed home with my mother and helped her. We used to churn butter once a week. Mother made her own bread and cake and pies. We kids had to bring wood and cobs for the stove and furnace. The kids always knew what their chores were.

At haying time we had to help pull the rope on the rake. I never milked cows either. I had seven brothers. I had to gather eggs though. We had to take lunch out to the men in the field in the afternoon, otherwise it was too long a day. Oat slashing time, all the farmers would get together to do the fields. All the women were busy making lunch and dinner. Sometimes we had to wait until that morning to butcher the chickens 'cause they wouldn't keep.

We had an icebox. We'd buy a 25 lb. block of ice from time to time. Butter and milk would often sour. We'd have it down the well on a cistern to keep cold. At night you had to go out to the outhouse. You were never sure what you'd find. They used to have barn dances. People just played the instruments that they had. I guess they played good enough music for us to dance too. We had a favorite dog - 'Spot'. Black and white dog. Nice dog. During the holidays dad would cut a Christmas tree down - didn't always have a tree. We had a big table and each of us kids had a spot and that's were our present would be. At Easter time we used to dye eggs. We always had our baskets for eggs and candy. We never had Easter egg hunts. We always had new hats. I didn't like hats much, but we always had to have a new hat. On the 4th of July we'd get up in the morning and clean chickens. Dad would go to town and get ice and we'd have homemade ice cream. So we'd have fried chicken and we had some small fireworks. We could see Harlan fireworks from our upstairs window. We'd take a horse and buggy to school. In the winter time we'd take a sled. We left the wagon in a barn in town that someone let us use. It was 3 ½ miles from our farm to school. Sometimes we had to walk and we'd take a ride from anyone. My grandparents lived just up the road. They had lots of fruit trees and a beautiful birch tree. When Grandpa came over from Austria, he raised enough money to bring Grandma over. He built her a big enough house that she'd never want another. When grandpa Petsche died, grandma came to live with us. She'd always tell us stories while we washed dishes and we'd laugh and laugh. We sure enjoyed having her living with us. My mother's mother died when she was seven. Grandpa Jacoby kept all the children together after their mother's death. He had to teach them (the children) to cook and clean. On Sat., he'd make them children all shine their shoes and get prepared for church on Sun. He made sure all those kids got to church. Shivaree - They'd get together and the newly weds had to treat them to drinks and food - or maybe they'd bring it? I would last about two days. Wouldn't have a shivaree until a day or two after the wedding. Don't know how many kegs of beer they'd have. My dad said he had a real good one; lasted three days. Big wedding. My folks would talk German. They didn't speak a lot of German, 'cause they wanted us to learn English. I never learned German though I knew a few phrases."

They resided there until 1961 and then retired and moved into the town of Vail.

She was the matriarch of the Schwery family. Cecelia was a loving wife, mother, grandmother and great-grandmother who enjoyed her family very much.
