2. ANNA CHRISTINA<sup>2</sup> SETZLER (*JOHN ADAM<sup>1</sup>*) was born 06 May 1751. She married (1) ? SCHWARTZ. He was born Abt. 17. She married (2) ADAM FREDERICK EPTING Abt. 1772, son of JOHN EPTING and CHRISTINA OSIANDER. He was born Abt. 17 in Dutch Fork Area, South Carolina, and died 1780 in South Carolina, Revolutionary War.

Notes for ANNA CHRISTINA SETZLER:

Anna Christina had two 100 acre surveys in 1771, one on Cannon's Creek and one on the waters of Wateree Creek. Both were in the estate of her oldest son by Adam Frederick Epting, John Adam Epting (Newberry Court of Common Pleas B-12, 1812).

A 50 acre survey of 1770 to Adam Frederick Epting on Cannons Cr., with an adjacent tract, came down to Jacob Epting (Newberry Court of Common Pleas A-67, 1822).

Anna received the second of her own land grants in her maiden (Setzler) name in 1773. (See note below)

According to Dr. Carl W. Nichols, German-born children who came with their parents to America later received free land as "bounty" grant, and that the females always received their land in their maiden names, even if they had already married by the time the grant was issued. (ibid)

Per the Federal Census of 1790, none of the sons were reflected as being in her household. Henry Swatts (sic) was shown head of household with four males and one female. This could have been Henry, Anna Christina and her Epting children. Source, as above.

{Cibby's note: the 1790 Census most likely enumerated Henry with the four Epting children, John Adam, Jacob, John and Catherine. April, 2008}

From "The Dutch Fork, an Atlas" by Carl Nichols:

"Setzler, Anna Christina 100A, 16 Apr 1771m 119:403. Br. of Cannons Creek. Maps-Pp. 16, 18, & 37. Later owned by Adam Epting who d. intestate. Land partitioned, 1812, between widow of Adam Epting who had m. Martin Koon and dau., Elizabeth Mary Epting (Nby Ct of Common Pleas B-12.)"

In the census quoted, there was an adjoining landowner named Frederick Adam Apling, next to the 780 acre tract grant in Lexington County that Jacob Epting obtained in 1791. (ibid)

Notes for ADAM FREDERICK EPTING:

His land grants include 100 acres on 2 May 1770, and 50 acres on 5 Jun 1770 on Cannon's Creek.

He served in the Patriot Militia as a Private in Col. Benjamin Roebuck's Regiment, under Capt. John Adam Summer. (DFG site, Epting Family page)

He is said to have been killed in battle during the Rev. War in the year 1780 (C. S. Peterson, "Known Military Dead During the American Rev. War 1775-1783"). He had served in 1779 as footman under Capt. John Adam Summer and Col. Roebuck (Accounts Audited 2233, Stub Indents 1787).

A report dealing with the ancestry of Leland Epting of Spartanburg, SC, is found in V. L. Fulmer's "Shealy Family," Pp. 14-15. Mr. Epting's Great Grandparents were described as Adam Frederick Epting and Anna Christina Setzler. The children of this couple were listed as John Epting, Jacob Epting, Adam Epting, and it was stated that they had a half-brother, Henry Black.

Henry Black's family are found in various records as Schwartz or Black.

In 1794, Henry Black bought from Adam Epting and wife, Eve, the 100 acre survey of 1770 to Adam Frederick Epting on Cannons Cr. (Newberry Deeds Q-2, p. 159). In 1835, the heirs of Henry Schwartz, Sr., sold this tract to Nicholas Summer (Newberry Deeds S-111). Heirs of Henry Schwartz, Sr., at that time were: Henry Schwartz, George Reichert and wife Mary, Schwartz, David Kunkel and wife Christina, Rosanna Schwartz, Magdelina Schwartz, and Juliana Schwartz. Dower was signed by Susan M. Schwartz.

From "The Eptings, A Documented History, 1700 - ca. 1920", 2nd Edition, Jean Epting Blackmon:

"The Newberry Census for 1810 listed both Henry Swatts, Sen'r and Henry Swatts, Jr. Henry Swatts, Sen'r was over 45 years of age, had a boy and three girls in his home under the age of 10. He also had a girl 10 - 16 years of age and a woman 16 - 20 years of age. It is apparent that he was married to a 'second wife' at this time, or at least was not married to Anna Christina Setzler Epting, if indeed he ever had been. Henry Swatts, Jr. was 16 - 26 years old, proving that he was born between 1784-1794, making it possible for him to be Anna Christina's son. A female in his home was the same age as he, and there was

"On January 22, 1835, an interesting deed was transacted by the heirs of Henry Schwartz. It said, "we Henry Schwartz, G Rikert and wife Mary, Adam Schwartz, David Kunkle and wife Christiana, Rosanna Schwartz, Magdelina Schwartz, and Julia Schwartz, all of the state of S.C. and part of Newberry and part of Lexington District, in consideration of the sum of \$855.00 paid by Nicholas Summer of the state aforesaid, and Newberry District, have granted, bargained and sold...a tract of land w Henry Schwartz Senr. died possessed of containing by resurvey 88 acres, being part of a tract originally granted to Adam F Epting, binding on lands now held by [another] Adam Epting, the widow Fike, Jacob Setsler, Wm. Chapman, estate of John Chapman, Nicholas Summer, and the remainder tract held by the widow Schwartz situated in Newberry District on branches Cannons Creek, waters of Broad River."

Witnesses were William Chapman, Joseph P. Summer, and Geo. H. Chapman. [Susan M. Schwartz, wife of Adam Schwarz relinquished her dower right.]"

**4. JOHN ADAM<sup>3</sup> EPTING** (*ANNA CHRISTINA<sup>2</sup> SETZLER, JOHN ADAM<sup>1</sup>*) was born 1773, and died 1801 in Newberry District, SC married EVE CHRISTINA LEITNER, daughter of MICHAEL LEITNER and MARIA BEARD.

Notes for JOHN ADAM EPTING:

John Adam and wife Eve Christina Leitner Epting sold 100 acres to Henry Black in 1794.

"...A receipt prepared by the administrator of Adam Epting's estate is interesting because it contains Henry Black's (same person as Henry Schwartz) signature. The receipt is written on a piece of paper that begins with the date 1790. {The writer of the receipt apparently first wrote 1890 and corrected it to 1790.} Beside that date these words appear, "The Estate of Adam Epting - D Henry Black".

Then the following (with original spelling):

"To Sundry articles from one time to another to Teatious To mention the whole Comes to - - - £2..0..10

As also ten Bushles of Corn which was given to s'd Epting In a Settlement of Land - - -

State of S. Carolina}

Newberry District} Personally appeared Henry Black and Declared on his Oath being Duly Sworn as the Law Directs & saith oath that the above account as it is Stated for the Two pound and ten pence is Just & True besides the ten bushles of Corn that he never receiv'd any part nor parcel of the Same \_\_\_\_\_

Sworn to before me this 18th day of December 1802 Mich'l Dickert J.P.}

[Signed by] Henry Schwartz"

The mention of the "settlement of land" indicates that this was the same Henry Black to whom [John] Adam and Eve [Christina] Epting sold the 100 acres of land in 1794. It also proves that Henry Black was the same man as Henry Schwartz. It falls short however, of proving a relationship between the two men."

John Epting was killed in a duel at the old mustering grounds above Duncan's Creek, a place called "Goshin's Hill".

"The scene of the murder is indicated as the old mustering grounds above Duncan's Creek, called Goshin's Hill. Court records the same year indicate that Lyles was brought to trial for his crime and was executed. Little Eph, as he was called, fought with the rank of Major, in local skirmishes during the Revolution. Lyles' second wife, Elizabeth and several children survived. Whatever precipitated that crime, impassioned or premeditated, is lost to us. There are indications that Little Eph had a violent temper." (Little Eph referring to Ephraim Lyles, Jr.) -- unknown source

Lexington County 1840 Census lists Adam Schwartz as a male, at least 30 and under 40 years of age. Also listed are three males at least 5 and under 10, one female under 5, one female at least 15 and under 20, and one female at least 20 and under 30.

Lexington County 1850 Census: Adam Swarts, age 47, \$600, farmer, Susanna Swarts, age 39, George H. Swarts, 17, God W. Swarts, 15, Mary M. Swarts, 12, Hariet E. Swarts, 9, Preston S. Swarts, 5, and Jasper M. Swarts, 3.

Lexington County 1860 Census: Adam Schwartz, age 56, birthplace Newberry County, farmer, real estate worth \$500. Also listed are Susanna, 49, born in Lexington County, Ellen, 19, Preston, 15, Jasper, 13, Cummings, 8 (female), and Jacob, age 6. The children were all born in Lexington County. Listed in a separate household are his son G. H. Schwartz, age 27, farmer, his wife Artemissia, 35, and Daniel Sutton, age 6. Census taken July 5, 1860.

Broad River Township, Lexington County, SC, 1880 Census lists Adam Schwartz, age 77, occupation: at home, with his son Jacob J. as head of household with his wife Frances and son Arthur, age 8 months. Jacob is listed as either sick or temporarily disabled. Census taken June 10, 1880.

The children are listed in the Bible of Hattie Beulah Swartz, daughter of John Jacob Schwartz.

"As I remember what was told to me was that Paul Swartz came to Wagener to work for W. A. Lybrand (daddy's granddaddy) stores. I was told that W. A. Lybrand owned nearly all of Wagener and all the land between Wagener and New Holland. His carried groceries, clothes, hardware, etc., and he had a livery stable. Mama said that Paul Swartz was a very handsome man. Edith told me that Paul Swartz had both Minerva and Joanna pregnant and that W. A. Lybrand told him that he had to marry the other. He chose Joanna. Edith called her Aunt Anna.

I was told that Paul Swartz was the father of both daddy and Aunt Bessie. Aunt Bessie was older than daddy. Minerva had a child out of wedlock, Aunt Lelia. I was told that her father was probably a traveling pot and pan salesman. Edith said that even though Paul was married to Joanna he still got Minerva pregnant with daddy.

Then Minerva married Furman Huckabee. I've always wondered why he married her with three illegitimate children. Maybe I married her for what he thought he would get when Minerva's father died. I was told that he left each of his children two hundred acres. Minerva's land was where Camp Rawl is today. She sold her land to the Rawl family and they gave part of it to the Baptist Church for then to build the Baptist Camp for youth. The picture of all of them was taken in front of the house that Minerva and Furman built on her land.

Then she and Furman had four more children...Uncle Fred, Uncle Robert, Aunt Minnie, and Uncle Danny. After Minerva died Furman married a much younger woman named Elizabeth. They had seven living children: Margarer, Betty, Barbara, Ottalee Johnny, and twins that they named William and Willie. Mama (sic) said that Furman and Lizbet as he called her had a stillborn child that they buried at the feet of Minerva in the New Holland Cemetery. Aunt Bessie and others were upset about it but I told them that Minerva would never of having a "little angel" buried at her feet.

When I was ten years old daddy and mama talked Furman and Elizabeth into letting Betty (age nine) come to live with us for a year. She was a grade below me. Mama made dresses for both of us and I know it was more clothes than Betty ever had. I and mama took Betty to see her parents several times during the year and when school was out they took her home. Her younger sister wanted her turn to come live with us but mama said that she had enough.

Edith's husband Joe Williamson had a sister named Lois. Lois married Bill Swartz. When I saw him he looked so much like Edith said he should for they were half brothers. Bill and Lois had a daughter, Elaine, that was interested in genealogy. She found out that there were Jews in her background and was very upset about it. Edith thought it was very funny that she was upset. Edith also said that Lois Swartz told her that we came from the trashy side of the family. This hurt Edith very much. I should have reminded her that Joanna wasn't a saint either.

I remember when I was a small child and we went to visit Furman or daddy's brothers or sister we passed through Pelion. There was a big two story house on the right going down that had a bunch of camelias in the front yard. Mama said that daddy's aunt lived there. I remember that once on an occasion we stopped and visited with the people there. I always thought it was where Aunt Annie and Uncle Paul lived.

Daddy was very ashamed of his birth circumstances and got angry if anyone brought it up. Once I said that my grandmother Minerva had daddy and got divorced and married Furman. I always knew that Furman was not his father. I did not know anything about illegitimacy at that age. I assumed that she had been married before. Daddy got so angry that he was fuming and I didn't know who had been talking to me. Mama said that she thought Betty had told me. I knew never to mention it again.

I used to ask mama what Minerva looked like as she died before I was born. Mama said to put a bonnet on Daddy and I would
