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Land Records

In 1860, Greenberg Lackey appears on Schedule No. 4 - Production of Agriculture of the U.S. Census of 1860 - with their residence listed as Grape Creek and Westbrook as their Post Office. He is shown as having 14 acres of improved land; 146 acres of unimproved land; cash value of land is \$200; 2 horses; 10 milch (milk?) cows; 2 working oxen; 40 other cattle; value of livestock is \$520.

In 1880, Green B. Lackey appears on the Blanco County tax assessment roll but no land was listed.

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Military Service

Nathaniel Greenberry joined the Texas Cavalry of the Confederate Army on Jan. 25, 1862. He was assigned to the 18th Regiment, Dismounted. On Jan. 11, 1863, he was captured by the Union Army at Fort Hindman, Arkansas and sent to Camp Douglas in Illinois. He was a POW until April 10, 1863, when he released and returned to his regiment.

On September 20, 1863, during the second day of fighting at the Battle of Chickamauga in Georgia, Nathaniel Greenberry was wounded in the leg. Chickamauga is a small town in northwest Georgia and was the site of the first major battle in Georgia.

Nathaniel Greenberry was a soldier in the 18th Texas Cavalry. This Regiment was commanded by Colonel Roger Q. Mills. During Chickamauga, the regiment joined with Major General Deshler's Brigade and Major General Patrick Cleburne's Division. Lieutenant General Daniel Hill was in charge of the Corps.

August 25, 1864 Transferred to Company H (Terry's Texas Rangers), 8th Texas Cavalry (Hood's Army) by special Field Order #88 due to wounds received - unfit for "infantry" service
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The following is a quote from Matt Spruill's book "Guide to the Battle of Chickamauga" regarding the battle

Major General Patrick Cleburne, "I now moved Deshler's Brigade by the right flank, with the intention of connecting it with Polk's left, so filling the gap left in my center by the withdrawal of Wood. This connection, however, I could not establish, as Polk's left had in its turn also been driven back. Finding it a useless sacrifice of life for Polk to retain his position, I ordered him to fall back with the rest of his line, and with his and Wood's brigades I took up a strong defensive position some three or four hundred yards in the rear of the point from which they had been repulsed. Deshler's Brigade had moved forward to the right of the enemy's advanced works, but could not go beyond the crest of a low ridge from which Lowery had been repulsed. I therefore ordered him (Major General Deshler) to cover himself behind the ridge and hold his position as long as possible. In effecting this last disposition of his command, General Deshler fell, a shell passing fairly through his chest."
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Since Deshler was in effect commanding the 18th Texas Cavalry, it is assumed the Nathaniel Greenberry was close to Deshler when he was killed. This is probably where he received his wound. There is no record of discharge because they weren't enlisted in the Union Army. However, since the war was a treasonous act, part of the surrender included a pardon for all surviving Confederate soldiers.

In June of 1919, pneumonia, small pox, tetanus, diphtheria, and typhoid fever were still major causes of death. Nezzie became quite ill with agonizing stomach pains and vomiting. She told her sister, Sarah, that she had heard something "pop" in her stomach. Finally, her condition was considered serious enough to justify the risk of surgery. When they operated, they found a ruptured appendix and massive gangrene. Nezzie died on the operating table.

Greenberg (Greenberry) Lackey moved with his family to the vicinity of Grape Creek about 1858 where he joined his elder sons, James and Martin V. Lackey. James and Martin had moved to Grape Creek in 1856 or 1857 - when it was still a part of Gillespie County.

Family history says that Greenberry, Sr. ran a freight hauling business between Johnson City and Austin.

Greenberry and Mary are buried in Sandy Cemetery. There is a marker for each. There is also a marker in the cemetery that reads Berry Lackey and wife. This was found to be the grave of Greenberry, Jr. and his wife, Addie. (see their family notes for more info). They were killed by Al Lackey in 1885. {Albert Fudge has pictures of the new headstone - TLL}

~ Tax Assessment Info ~

Greenberg (Greenberry) LACKEY is listed on the early tax rolls of Burnet County. No date given for tax rolls.

In 1869, G. Lackey appears for the first time on the Blanco County tax assessment roll. He did not own any land that year, but he had personal property which included 1 horse valued at \$25; 7 cattle valued at \$31; and miscellaneous property valued at \$5. His total property value was \$61 and he paid a poll tax of one dollar.

In 1870, G.B. Lackey (Lackey) appears on the Blanco County tax assessment roll. His property consisted of miscellaneous property valued at \$115. His total property value was \$115 and he paid a poll tax of one dollar.

In 1876 and 1877, the name of G.B. Lackey appears again on the Blanco County tax assessment roll.

Greenberry LACKEY appears in the 1877 Blanco County tax assessment roll. No land is listed.

In 1880, Green B. Lackey appears on the Blanco County tax assessment roll, but no land was listed in his name.

Greenberg (Greenberry) LACKEY is shown on the 1880 Census (could this be the Texas census?). His age in 1880 is listed as 93 years, indicating a birth year of 1787. He was born in Illinois and his parents, Henry LACKEY and Mary JENKINS, were born in New York. Greenberry's wife, Mary, is listed as being 93 years also. She states that she was also born in Illinois and that her parents were also born in NY.

"The Virginia house of delegates, in 1778, extended the civil jurisdiction of Virginia to the northwest, and appointed Capt. John Todd (1750-82), of Kentucky, governor of the entire territory north of the Ohio, organized as "the county of Illinois." This government was confined to the old French settlements and was entirely inefficient. In 1787, Virginia and the other states having relinquished their claims to the country west of the Alleghenies, the Northwest territory was organized by congress by the famous ordinance of 1787. Two years later St. Clair county was formed out of the southwest part of the Illinois country, while the eastern portion and the settlements around Vincennes, Indiana, were united into the county of Knox, and in 1795 the southern part of St. Clair county was organized into Randolph county, with Kaskaskia as the seat of administration. In 1800 the Illinois country was included in the territory of Indiana, and in 1809 the western part of Indiana from Vincennes north to Canada was organized as the territory of Illinois; it included, besides the present state, all of Wisconsin except the northern part of the Green Bay peninsula, a large part of Michigan and all of Minnesota east of the Mississippi. In 1812, by permission of congress, a representative assembly was chosen, a territorial constitution was adopted and the territorial delegate in congress was elected directly by the people.

"In 1818 Illinois became a state of the American union, the enabling act fixing the line 42° 30' as the northern boundary, instead of that provided by the ordinance of 1787, which passed through the south bend of Lake Michigan. The reason given for this change was that if the Mississippi and Ohio rivers were the only outlets of Illinois trade, the interests of the state would become identified with those of the southern states; but if an outlet by Lake Michigan were provided, closer relations would be established with the northern and middle states, and so "additional security for the perpetuity of the Union" would be afforded.

Two years later St. Clair county was formed out of the southwest part of the Illinois country, while the eastern portion and the settlements around Vincennes, Indiana, were united into the county of Knox, and in 1795 the southern part of St. Clair county was organized into Randolph county, with Kaskaskia as the seat of administration. In 1800 the Illinois country was included in the territory of Indiana, and in 1809 the western part of Indiana from Vincennes north to Canada was organized as the territory of Illinois; it included, besides the present state, all of Wisconsin except the northern part of the Green Bay peninsula, a large part of Michigan and all of Minnesota east of the Mississippi. In 1812, by permission of congress, a representative assembly was chosen, a territorial constitution was adopted and the territorial delegate in congress was elected directly by the people.

"In 1818 Illinois became a state of the American union, the enabling act fixing the line 42° 30' as the northern boundary, instead of that provided by the ordinance of 1787, which passed through the south bend of Lake Michigan. The reason given for this change was that if the Mississippi and Ohio rivers were the only outlets of Illinois trade, the interests of the state would become identified with those of the southern states; but if an outlet by Lake Michigan were provided, closer relations would be established with the northern and middle states, and so "additional security for the perpetuity of the Union" would be afforded.

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SABINE PASS, TEXAS. The town of Sabine Pass is on State Highway 87 at Sabine Pass, thirty miles southeast of Beaumont in extreme southeastern Jefferson County. The townsite, first known as Sabine City, was perhaps laid out as early as 1836. The Sabine City Company, which organized the town, eventually included such notables as Sam Houston, Philip A. Sublett, George W. Hockley, John S. Roberts, Albert G. Kellogg, Niles F. Smith, and Sidney Sherman. The town was projected to be a major Gulf seaport. The first steam sawmill in Jefferson County was built there in 1846, and the Sabine City post office was established the next year. By the time of the Civil War the town had a newspaper (the Sabine Pass Times) and a connection on the Eastern Texas Railroad. Cattle and cotton were among the port's major shipments, and the post office had adopted the more commonly used name of Sabine Pass. On June 15, 1861, the town was incorporated. During the Civil War, forts Sabine and Griffin were constructed to fend off Union attacks at Sabine Pass. An outbreak of yellow fever in 1862 led most residents to evacuate but dissuaded Union troops, who had landed near the city and destroyed the sawmill, from permanently occupying the area. Another projected federal invasion was blunted in the battle of Sabine Pass in 1863. Sabine Pass had 460 inhabitants by 1880, making it the second largest town in Jefferson County. The construction of the Sabine and East Texas Railroad in 1881 replaced the older rail line, which had been abandoned during the Civil War, and seemed to bode a bright future for the city. Several factors, however, led to the decline of Sabine Pass in the years to come. A hurricane in 1886 killed eighty-six persons and destroyed the town, and storms in 1900 and 1915 further emphasized the locale's exposed position. Also significant was the refusal of the Kountze brothers, who owned most of the choice tracts in the area, to make a deal with prospective developer Arthur E. Stilwell. The subsequent growth of Port Arthur, as well as the construction of additional deepwater ports at Beaumont and Orange, attracted major investors to these rival cities. As a result of these difficulties, Sabine Pass never achieved the prominence its founders had anticipated. Its population was 363 in 1900. Though the Sun Oil Company built docks and a pumping plant there in the wake of the boom caused by the Spindletop oilfield, these operations were discontinued in 1927. Commercial fishing and marine repair remained the major local industries, and small quantities of oil were discovered at the Sabine Pass oilfield in 1958. Though Port Arthur annexed the community in 1978, the town of Sabine Pass retained a distinct identity during the 1980s. The population of Sabine Pass had grown to 1,500 by 1984, when thirty-nine rated businesses were reported there. By the early 1990s, however, the Texas Almanac no longer reported separate population figures for Sabine Pass.

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SABINE PASS, BATTLE OF. The battle of Sabine Pass, on September 8, 1863, turned back one of several Union attempts to invade and occupy part of Texas during the Civil War. The United States Navy blockaded the Texas coast beginning in the summer of 1861, while Confederates fortified the major ports. Union interest in Texas and other parts of the Confederacy west of the Mississippi River resulted primarily from the need for cotton by northern textile mills and concern about French intervention in the Mexican civil war. In September 1863 Gen. Nathaniel P. Banks sent by transport from New Orleans 4,000 soldiers under the command of Gen. William B. Franklin to gain a foothold at Sabine Pass, where the Sabine River flows into the Gulf of Mexico. A railroad ran from that area to Houston and opened the way into the interior of the state. The Western Gulf Blockading Squadron of the United States Navy sent four gunboats mounting eighteen guns to protect the landing. At Sabine Pass the Confederates recently had constructed Fort Griffin, an earthwork that mounted six cannon, two twenty-four pounders and four thirty-two pounders. The Davis Guards, Company F of the First Texas Heavy Artillery Regiment, led by Capt. Frederick Odum, had placed stakes along both channels through the pass to mark distances as they sharpened their accuracy in early September. The Union forces lost any chance of surprising the garrison when a blockader missed its arranged meeting with the ships from New Orleans on the evening of September 6. The navy commander, Lt. Frederick Crocker, then formed a plan for the gunboats to enter the pass and silence the fort so the troops could land. The Clifton shelled the fort from long range between 6:30 and 7:30 A.M. on the 8th, while the Confederates remained under cover because the ship remained out of reach for their cannon. Behind the fort Odum and other Confederate officers gathered reinforcements, although their limited numbers would make resistance difficult if the federal troops landed.

Finally at 3:40 P.M. the Union gunboats began their advance through the pass, firing on the fort as they steamed forward. Under the direction of Lt. Richard W. Dowling the Confederate cannoneers emerged to man their guns as the ships came within 1,200 yards. One cannon in the fort ran off its platform after an early shot. But the artillerymen fired the remaining five cannon with great accuracy. A shot from the third or fourth round hit the boiler of the Sachem, which exploded, killing and wounding many of the crew and leaving the gunboat without power in the channel near the Louisiana shore. The following ship, the Arizona, backed up because it could not pass the Sachem and withdrew from the action. The Clifton, which also carried several sharpshooters, pressed on up the channel near the Texas shore until a shot from the fort cut away its tiller rope as the range closed to a quarter of a mile. That left the gunboat without the ability to steer and caused it to run aground, where its crew continued to exchange fire with the Confederate gunners. Another well-aimed projectile into the boiler of the Clifton sent steam and smoke through the vessel and forced the sailors to abandon ship. The Granite City also turned back rather than face the accurate artillery of the fort, thus ending the federal assault. The Davis Guards had fired their cannon 107 times in thirty-five minutes of action, a rate of less than two minutes per shot, which ranked as far more rapid than the standard for heavy artillery. The Confederates captured 300 Union prisoners and two gunboats. Franklin and the army force turned back to New Orleans, although Union troops occupied the Texas coast from Brownsville to Matagorda Bay later that fall. The Davis Guards, who suffered no casualties during the battle, received the thanks of the Confederate Congress for their victory. Careful fortification, range marking, and artillery practice had produced a successful defense of Sabine Pass.
