Notes for John E. Davidson:

John and Hopsy lived in several places in southwestern Virginia. The first was Mattox Place, which was located 1/2 mile southeast of Austinville. They then moved to the Quarter Place (in 1852) - it was owned by Col. John Jackson. Next, they lived at Loafer's Rest, near the Austinville Lead Mines. This was at the end of the Civil War (1861-1865) - it was later owned by Gordon Gray. After this, they moved a mile north of Austinville to a place later owned by the Cornett family. In 1867, they moved to Sulphur Springs\*, where they operated a hotel in conjunction with the health resort. Much later, they purchased land across New River and built a new house - it was later owned by Harold Porter - this is where John died and is buried.

\*Sulphur Springs disappeared when the Appalachian Electric Power Company constructed the hydro-electric plants at Buck and Byllesby (just south of Ivanhoe). Impounded lakes now cover much of the land.

The Civil War Muster Rolls is part of a historic effort to compile and link all available records of soldiers mustered by individual states during the Civil War. This database is a listing of over 5.3 million men who served in the war. Taken from records housed in the National Archives, each record provides the soldier's name, company, and unit. Also provided is the individual's rank when inducted and rank when discharged. For researchers of ancestors who may have served in the American Civil War this can be an informative database.

Virginia lets Joseph Walk (his brother) of Rowan Co., NC have his undivided interest in 1/8 of some land in Rowan Co. for \$150, witnessed by George Sutlive and George Fry and proved by the latter in Aug. 1820. (This is part of the 477 1/4 a. which Peter Frye let Martin Walk ( Sr.) have on 29 Oct. 1789 (See book 11, page 826). and he died owning and went to his 8 children (Hannah, who married Philipp Mock Sr., Joseph, Elizabeth, who married Harmon Butner, Martin, Abraham, Mary, who married a Clodfelter, George and Rebecca, who married Phillip Mock Jr. all of whom became tenants in common with their mother owning her life interest.

Martin is still on the 1840 census in Grayson Co., VA, aged 60-70, as is his wife (60-70). They have two boys, 5 -10, and 2 girls living with them (1 is under 5, 1 is 20-30).

Martin died in the latter part of 1843. He left no personal property, except a small quantity, which was under execution at the time of his death. That had been sold to satisfy the said execution except for the small portion thereof, which was reserved and appropriated to the widow Elizabeth. At the time of his death, Martin was indebted to Hugh Gwyn of Surry Co., NC for the sum of \$36.60 and a further sum of \$5.00. He was also indebted to the merchants J. & J. P. Waugh for the sum of \$7.57 and to C. & C. Nucholls for the sum of \$7.14 of Carroll Co., VA. (By this time, Carroll Co. had became part of Grayson Co.)

On 4 May 1844, Hugh Gwyn and the merchants J. & J. P. Waugh and Clark and Creed Nuckolls brought suit against Martin's widow and his heirs for the bill due them.

On 28 December 1844, the land was auctioned off at the front door of the Carroll Co. courthouse. Being the highest bid and best offer, Hugh Gwyn bought the land, described as a tract or parcel of land, lying and being in the County of Carroll and State of Virginia, on the waters of Crooked Creek, and by estimation being 100 acres more or less.

It was ordered that the dower of Elizabeth Walk, in the land of her late husband, Martin Walk, be returned 1/3 part of the land, south part on Paul's Creek, survey in the County of Carroll, she was to stay there as long as she lived, and at her death, that portion of land was to go to Hugh Gwyn and his heirs.

MARTIN WALK II was born on 2 April 1737 in Orange Co., VA and was baptized in St. Mark's Parish, he married on 22 Nov. 1767 in Friedberg, Rowan Co., North Carolina, he died 17 or 18 Oct. 1791 in Friedberg, Rowan Co., North Carolina and was buried in the Moravian Cemetery in Friedberg, location 15-65 on Oct. 19, 1791.

The Salem Diary, October 1791 lists the memoirs of Martin Walk. They were translated by the Moravian Archives as follows:

The married Brother Martin Walk, who fell asleep in Friedberg on 18 October was born of Lutheran parents in Culpeper County, Virginia on 2 April 1737. He lost his mother early on and when his father remarried some time later, he often endured harsh treatment from his stepmother. In his 13th year he moved to North Carolina with his parents and some other families who now belong to the Gemeine here. They settled about 16 miles away, at Abbots Creek.

He left his parents home in his 22nd year and went to Brother Peter Frey, from whence he often went to work in Bethania and Bethabara. In this way he obtained his first inclination toward the Moravian Church. Indeed, the Holy Spirit was working within him to portray to his heart Jesus, the Redeemer of our Sins. And this impression remained with him even up to his blessed end.

In the year 1761, he went back to Virginia, stayed there a while and then went to Pennsylvania, where he settled in Heidelberg and regularly attended the meeting there with blessing for his heart.

When three years had run their course, he returned to Wachovia, and in 1767 in Bethania married the present widow Elisabeth Fiscus. They soon afterward moved to Friedberg, where he established himself about 2 miles from the schoolhouse. His marriage was blessed with 12 children, of whom 3 sons and one daughter preceded him into eternity; 5 sons and 3 daughters, however, are still living, and they belong to the local Gemeine.

He was received into the Gemeine in the year 1770. Then in 1772 he obtained the benefit of participation with the Gemeine in Holy Communion for the first time. This mercy remained important and meaningful to him ever after.

One event during his life caused his family much grief and so beset him in mind and body that he always retained some effects of it. In February of 1781, during the recent war, our blessed brother along with some others, was forcibly taken out of the area by a party of soldiers and held prisoner in Halifax, Virginia. Through God's help he was set free again, so that on 2 April of the same year, to his family's great joy, he returned home. Nevertheless, he had had much to suffer during the journey. Whenever he thought of this event later on, his heart filled with gratitude to the dear Saviour, both for this preservation and even in particular for the grace whereby he was brought to his Gemeine and granted salvation. Indeed he made this point clear in a special way during the last speaking prior to Holy Communion.

In general we can say of our blessed Brother that his whole disposition tended toward the Gemeine. Its weal and woe lay so close to his heart that he could not rest content if he noticed anything therein that was inconsistent with the mind of Jesus Christ. As for his own heart, he acknowledged that he was a sinner, with naught to show himself except Jesus' mercy and compassion. And he stated as much several times even on his sickbed. In this same disposition he also served the Gemeine here in material matters as well as he could and was a faithful, diligent member of the local Committee for many years, being generally loved for his trustworthy nature. The great concern in his heart, moreover, was his family's salvation, whereby all his children might thrive for the dear Saviour's sake.

A virulent fever laid him low about a month ago. In the beginning no one really thought it would bring him to his end. But several days before his death, when asked whether he thought the dear Saviour would use this occasion to take him to himself, he answered with a joyful Yes. He later indicated the same at some other times, adding that naught else remained for him. And in every way he let the Geschwister (brethren) who visited him know of his love.

He set his material affairs in order on the 15th and from then on simply waited the hour of his release. He was especially weak on the 16th, when Br. Schneider in the near presence of the dear Saviour, blessed him for his journey home. Then on the morning of the 18th, amid the singing of some hymn stanzas, the blessed moment ensued, and his

soul crossed over into Jesus' arms and bosom. His age had reached 54 years, 6 months and 16 days. (Translated by Frances Cumnock, May 1993).

"The Compilation of the original list of Protestant immigrants to South Carolina, 1763-1773" lists Anna Catharina Walk, 21, arrived at Charles Town, SC in 1764, along with a Martin Walk, 7 year old, and John Conrad Walk, 15., we don't know yet if they are any relatives of our Walks.

According to the Moravian Records, in January 1768, 'our' Martin Walk was part of the Bethabara settlement, when he, Martin Walk, sent a note by a boy to Brother Lorenz informing him that Andreas Betz has secretly engaged himself to a daughter of Brunner, near Salisbury. On Nov. 22, 1767, Brother Loesch married the younger Martin Walk and Liesel Fiscus in Bethania.

In 1769, on March 10, the Wachovia Diary notes that Martin Walk's two week old son received the name Johannes.

In 1770, on Nov. 18, at a meeting of the Society, Martin Walk was unanimously elected Stewart, to succeed Adam Spach.

On 1771, on Dec. 19, in South Fork or Friedberg, Peter Pfaff was elected Stewart in place of Martin Walk.

Bethabara Diary, 1772, January 20: Brother Ernst from Bethania informed us that last evening the elder Fiscus who has lived behind Bethania, passed away, trusting in Jesus.

1772, Salem Congregation, August 31, Brother and sister Graff returned from Friedberg where they held communion for 17 members, in the felt presence of the Saviour. Martin Walk partook for the first time, In the afternoon they attended the Aeltesten Conferenz in Salem.

Friedberg Diary 1772, April 5, L. J. Bachhof, the reader and school teacher wrote that for two weeks he was not able to be out on account of a bad cold, but today he and his wife visited at Peter Frey's and Martin Walk's. At both places large and small were coughing and sniffing. This has been a very unhealthy spring, and it's hard to find a house in which there are not one, two or three in bed with a cold on the chest and fever. On June 6, Martin Walk brought him 20 lbs. of flour, all that he can give now. Flour is very scarce and many have not even corn meal. John Mueller brought us a piece of venison, which was very welcome, as we have had no fresh meat for a long time.

1773, Friedberg Diary, Dec. 25: We had a really blessed Christmas Day. Little Joseph Walk was baptized.

Friedberg diary, 1774, Nov. 6: Matthew Weesner was elected Stewart by the Society in place of Martin Walk.

Friedberg Diary 1775 - March 29, we visited Martin Walk. He told me that there is a group of people who are opposed to the Brethren and that they are planning to send a petition to the Governor through Justice Spurgeon, saying that the Herrenhueter (another name for the Moravians) are claiming land to which they have no deed.

On Dec. 8, his wife visited Liesel Walk. There she heard that the day before yesterday in the twilight, there was a curious phenomenon in the sky, a flame of fire, from which great balls of fire fell at various places. One of these fireballs fell in Peter Frey's yard near his pump, just as one of his children was drawing water, the child fainted from fear, and was nearly beside herself afterwards.

Book III: Friedberg Diary 1776, 'We visited Adam Spach and Georg Hartmann to learn what was done at the last muster. Practically all except Friedrich Mueller and Adam Hartmann had signed the declaration that they accepted congress as their ruler and would obey its orders. Spach, George Hartmann and Walk had not attended. A committee is to be selected from those who signed.

1778 Rowan Co. Tax list: In Cpt. Eakle's district: Martin Wolk, L260.

5 Aug. 1778 - Neglected or refused to take to oath of allegiance on the day advertised but now admitted to take the oath and have certificate paid for so certifying: Martin Walk, John Blanketpickler, Valentin Frey and many others.

1778, Salem, July 31, Brother Martin Walk came from Friedberg to consult Brother Graff about the State Oath. He was advised that those who signed the petition should send two of their number to the court at Salisbury to ask that nothing be done until the results of the petition was known, that this was what we planned to do at the Surry court.

8 Feb. 1780 4:232, George Hartman, Adam Spaugh, Peter Fultz, Martin Walk, Frederick Miller, Moravians, to be exempted from 12 fold tax and be assessed 3 fold only, being assessed by mistake.

12 Feb. 1780 4:238, Henry Michael took Martin Wollox' place as overseer from Reedy Creek to Surry County line on Moravian Rd. (Wollox = Walk).

1781, Salem, Feb. 8: Yesterday and today no meetings could be held because of disturbances. In the morning many officers and privates were in town, they were very boisterous at the still house, and in the tavern things went badly, with much cursing, abuse and harsh threats so that we feared for our lives and our property. On Feb. 9, from Friedberg we heard a most distressing report that several of the planters in that section, and among others Martin Walk, a communicant brother, had been arrested by men in English uniform on the charge that they were enemies of the country. In the afternoon we heard that the English army was in Bethania, we also received order to furnish meat, which was confirmed in the evening by an English dragoon who came here. On Feb. 10, Brothers Bibighaus and Holder returned from General Greene with his answer that he could not protect us as the English must already be in our towns. March 21, in Bethania rags are being gathered for the wounded, and since the hospitals have been separated they shall be sent to the Continental hospital, and Bethabara and Salem will join Bethania in what is sent. At the request of Major Armstrong a copy will be given to him of the open letter sent out from the English camp to all philanthropic men in this country. Against the wish of the Brethren in Friedberg, Brother Beck has tried to help Martin Walk and the younger Volz. In consideration of all the circumstances it does not seem wise to meddle in the matter of the first named, but in regard to the latter the Friedberg members may ask for release if that is possible. 1781, April 10, Martin Walk arrived. Michael Hauser Sr. accompanied him to Colonel Armstrong to secure his advice about Walk's escape from prison. (This Michael Hauser witnessed the will of Frederick Fiscus in 1782. )

The Friedberg diary also reported Martin Walk's peril: 1781, Feb. 8, From Friedberg came a distressing story, for Martin Walk was seized by men in English uniform who claimed that he was an enemy of the land and took him away prisoner.

On March 19, Rev. Valentine Beck visited the families where there is small pox, that is at the homes of Adam Hartmann, Friedrich Boeckel, John Mueller's widow, and Walk. On March 21, the child Sarah Walk was buried, she went home yesterday from smallpox. On April 9, Rev. Beck went to Salem, and he was asked by the Conferenz to advise Martin Walk to surrender himself to the authorities. He says, "This I did this evening through Peter Frey, who said that Walk was willing. He did it on the 11th, and all went well so that he can go on with his work in peace until November Court, to which he is bound over.

Peter Frey was Martin Walk's brother in law, he having married his sister Catherine on 23 May 1756.

On Dec. 27, 1781 it was noted that: Last evening the Brethren in Friedland were disturbed by robbers, overpowered them and took them to Bethania, where they were released with a warning. Today Peter Frey had a saddle and bridle stolen from his horse at our mill, he saw it at once and chased the thief, who ran through the town into the woods, but could not catch him.

May 30, 1783: The single women of Friedberg have asked for a post celebration of the single sisters Covenant Day. Recently on Sunday, during service, there was a gathering of young people at Peter Frey's and the same thing happened at Valentine Frey's. This must be looked into but if the result is as we wish then that past celebration may take place on the Monday after Whitsuntide.

During an Offering of Praise and Thanksgiving of the congregation in Wachovia for the protection of God during the North American disturbances from the year 1774 to the year 1783, it was noted that in the year 1782, on Feb. 9, several persons of Friedberg were arrested as enemies of the country, among them Martin Walk, who escaped after suffering much misery and returned to his home. Bethania was much distressed by the army under Lord Cornwallis, which made camp there on the 9th at noon. a sharp order was given that twenty horses must be furnished but in the end they lost twenty three, besides thirty head of cattle and all their fowls while their fences were completely ruined. But for the praise of God it should be noted that young and old were preserved from injury to body or soul.

Friedberg diary 1784, Written by Rev. Valentine Beck, it is noted on April 12, Easter Monday, that they celebrated the postponed congregation festival. Br. Benzien held the love feast for the children. The love feast for the Society members was held by Br. Praezel. The married man, Heinrich Rippel, three boys, Joseph Pfaff, Peter Schor, and Joseph Spach, and five girls, Eva Fischel, Rebecca Frey, Christina Boeckel, Christina Mueller and Johanna Walk joined the Society.

On January 8, 1786 (Friedberg Diary), the house fathers met to discuss the necessity for a larger meeting hall in view of the increasing size of the congregation. It was unanimously agreed to build now, and the majority favored a new church, to be connected by a passage way with the present house, the new building to be thirty by thirty five feet in size. That the matter should be under proper supervision, the Brn. Peter Frey, Martin Walk and Friedrich Boeckel were elected as the building committee.

On June 26, 1786 "we were relieved of anxiety for our Brn. Martin Walk and George Fischer, who left for Pennsylvania directly after Easter. They returned safely, though the first named had a narrow escape in crossing James River, when one of his horses shied as he was driving on to the flat." In another account it says: June 26. The Brn. Walk and Fischer returned with their wagons from Pennsylvania. The former had a narrow escape in crossing James River on a flat when one of his horses became frightened and he was in danger of loosing his load and his life. They brought us a letter from Br. Johannes, written in Lititz, which said that they had reached there safely on May 20.

NC Deed Book 11:615) . (This is the land John Gerhard, his father-in-law left in his will to Myers and Walk.)

9 May 1789 5:229 - Martin Wallox adm. of Solomon Wallox shows settlement of L89.6.4. Christian Fry and wife sell to Frederick Beekle 80 a. 1 July 1788, proved by Martin Walk.

MARTIN WALK listed in 1790 NC Census - Salisbury District, Rowan Co., NC: 2 whites, 5 white males under 16, 7 white females

1791, Friedberg, Diary of Simon Peter and Martin Schneider for the year 1791, notes on July 3, that the house fathers elected a new Committee and two new stewards. Members of the Committee were the Brn. Martin Walk, Johann Hoehns, Johann Volz, and Lazerus Hege. The new stewards were the Brn. Philip Rothrock and Peter Sehner.

In 1791, on October 17, the Reverend "visited several sick members, and stayed with Br. Martin Walk until he passed into the arms of his redeemer during the singing of home-going hymns." On October 19, many came to the funeral of Br. Walk. His loss will be deeply felt by his family, our members, and many outsiders. On Nov. 13, Br. Johannes Zimmermann was elected a member of the Committee in place for Br. Martin Walk.

"In the name of God, Amen. I Martin Walck of Rowan County State of North Carolina Planter, being weak in Body, but sound Memory Thanks be to god for it to this day and in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and Ninety one, on the fifteenth day of October , I do make and Publish this my last will and testament in Manner following, that is to say, I recommend my soul to God that gave it, and my Body I recoment to the Earth from where it came to be Buryet in a Dissant and Christian Manner as and to be and as for my Worldy Estate which it has Pleased God to bless me with in this Life, I want all my just Debts paid and with what is Left I do want the same in the manner following : First I will that my Dear and beloved Wife Elisabeth is to have and to hold all that is on my Premises where on I now Life, as Long as She remains my Witow, and Set in Case She should see cause to Merrey again, I will that my Dear Wife Elisabeth Shall have the Thirt out of all my Estate both Freehold and Movables, and for her to have and to hold the Same as Long as She Shall life, and after her Decease it is my will that watt she holds of my Estate, at the time of Merrage, Shall be Preat, and after her Decease the Same Shall be Equily Devidet amongst all my children Sheer and Sheer alick. -- Also it is my Will that if my Dear Wife should merry again that She takes the thirt out of all my Estate both Freehold and Movable as above mentionet and the other two Parts I will that the Same Shall be Equily Devidet among all my children both Boys and Girls, Sheer and Sheer alick, and for the true Performance of this my Last Will and Testament I make and ordain my Dear Wife Elisabeth and my trusty Friend Philip Hoens as my Sole Executors for them to See this my Last will and Testament fullfilt acording to my true Intent and Meaning, in Wittness whereof I the said Martin Walck have to this my Last Will and Testament Set my own hand and Seal the Day and year above Written, Signet, Sealed and Delivered by the said ....

So glad you answered my email!!! I have been going through my Poole information and I am assuming you have the other children for Edward, William, and Isaac Poole. I do have that Isaac Poole married Sarah Harper. For the children of Martin and Elizabeth Porter Poole, the only thing that I have that is different is that POLLY POOLE born 1829, died 30 June 1889, married James Pearman.

I descend from William Poole born March 1846 and he died 30 May, 1930. He married Mary E. Alley sometime in 1866 in Wythe Co. VA. No record of this marriage has been found. Mary Alley was born 6 June, 1846 in Wythe Co and she died 2 March, 1899, in Wythe Co. Mary was the daughter of Crockett Alley and Jane Spencer Alley.

I think we basically have the same information but it is nice to know there are other cousins out there researching the same lines. The Pooles are on my Father's side of the family and I have more dead ends on his side. Wythe Co was not very good about birth, death, and marriage records.

(X) Rider, Martin Moser, Philips Henrich Soeller, Friedrich Scholl, Jacob (X) Bayer, Michel Kur, Laurence (O) Dur, Sebastian Doerr, Bartell Eberle, Bastian Eberle, Johann Adam Moser, Jerg Schuhmacher, Jacob Kuhn, Leonhard (O) Hicker, Jacob Meckling, Theobald (D) Mechling, Hans Jerik (O) Seyler, Jacob Senck, Hans Riech (O) Botz, Andreas Strickel, Hans Jacob Schlauch, Johannes (O) Ruspag, Hans Jerg Mettler, Adam Sommer.

The two Stoevers are famous Lutheran ministers, Stoever, Sr., the father, labored in Virginia, Stoever Jr, the son in Pennsylvania. The younger Johann Caspar Stoever wrote the following in this Record Book of Baptisms and Marriages: "I was born December 21, 1707 in a place named Luedorff, in Solinger Amt, Duchy Berg in the Unter Pfaltz. His parents were Johann Caspar Stoever, a native of Frankenberg in Hesse and Gertraudt, born in Amt Solingen. When he was six years of age he learned to read German perfectly in four weeks under his father's direction. After his he also commenced to study Latin under his father. Subsequently he received private instructions in Latin and Greek from four pastors successive named, H. Nicolaus Muentz, H. Samuel Bratschisch, H. Valentine Kraft and H. Antonius Pfaffmann, and later in the languages names, as also in Hebrew and French, and likewise theology from H. Knabel and finally from H. Special Adolph Ruehfeld at Brumath, three hours (12 miles) from Strassburg. Journeyed from Europe to America in 1728, on the Rhine and on an ocean vessel, preaching on Sundays. Arrived in Pennsylvania Sept. 29, and continued to preach, ordained on April 8, 1733 by Christian Schultz, p. t. pastor in Philadelphia and was married at the same time to Maria Catarina. They became the parents eleven children. His wife was born May 14, 1715 at Lambesheim in Chur Pfaltz. Her sponsor was Catarina Ursula Schmidt, her parents were Christian Merckling and his wife Catarina, nee Brucher. Nov. 2, 1778. Whilst I am writing this cursum vitae, my age is by the grace and help of God 70 years, 10 months, 1 week and five days. "

(Jacob and Theobald Meckling were on the same ship as the Stoevers, and are probably brothers of Maria Catarina, wife of Mr. Stoever. He arrived on the 11th of September, however, not on the 29th as he said in his biography. The elder Stoever went to work in Spotsylvania, Virginia, and his son in Pennsylvania, even though some of the baptisms and marriages in his record book are from Virginia.

Hans Martin Valck (Walk) might have come to Spotsylvania and the Germanna settlement due to his acquaintance of Pastor Stoever. In early 1733, Pastor Stoever had agreed to come to serve the first Lutheran congregation in Virginia, who, for 16 years prayed and waited for a pastor. After arriving in Pennsylvania in 1728, the elder Stoever had left his son in eastern Pennsylvania and journeyed south to the Palatine settlement at New Bern, NC. There he remarried and had a second son. He was finally ordained in Trappe, Pennsylvania, before coming to Germanna. Stoever was sent to Germany to ask for funds, and he died on the return voyage from Germany aboard ship, and his will was probated in Philadelphia on 20 March, 1739.

There seemed to have been a special interest between the colonies at Christopher von Graffenried's settlement of New Bern and Germanna. Graffenried planned to develop the mineral deposits of North Carolina, and the miners of Germanna certainly could have help him in that aspect.

On 19 May 1735, Michael Clore, the 1717 colonist, sold 100 a. to Martin Wallick (Walk) and at the same time, he sold 100 a. to Michael O'Neal in Orange Co., Virginia. (His daughter Agnes Margarete had married Michael O'Neale.) Martin Walk had married his other daughter, Catherine. Michael Clarw made his will on 10 May 1762 in Culpeper Co., Virginia and mentioned the children of his deceased daughter Catharine, formerly the wife of Martin Walk. (See Clore Family).

The first child of Martin and Catherine, Barbara, was born on 15 October 1735. So we can assume that Martin arrived in Germanna by 1734 and married Catherine Clore probably by January 1735.

Martin Walk was granted 400 a. jointly with Tobias Wilhoit, on 10 July 1736, he patented these 400 acres in the Great Fork of the Rappahannock River in the Parish of St. Marks and the County of Orange, Virginia.

Wilhide & Walk: This indenture made the twenty second Day of September 1748 between Tobias Wilhide of the Parish of St. Mark and the County of Orange of the one part and Martin Walk of the Parish and County aforesaid of the other part. Whereas the aforesaid Tobias Wilhide and Martin Walk did jointly take up and survey 400 a. of land in the Great Fork of Rappahannock River in Orange County and obtained a patent for the same bearing Date the 20th day of July 1736 as by the said patent will and may morefully and at large appear by virtue of which patent the said Tobias Wilhide and Martin Walk entered into the said land and tenements and were thereof jointly seized of the said tract of land as aforesaid & are willing and desirous to make partition thereof. .... They divided the land: from two white oaks standing on the South side of the German road by Col. William Beverley line running thence south have 86 degrees west until it intersects the south 24 degrees west line of the said patent and two red oaks ... Tobias Wilhoid signed and Martin Walk signed with his mark MW.

On the same day, Martin Walk and Catherine his wife in the Parish of St. Mark sold to Michael Yeager of the Parish and county aforesaid sold these 200 a. (near Teater Weaver's corner .... crossing some branches of Deep Run ... Col. Beverley's line ... south side of German Raod .... ) for the sum of 20 L. current Money of Virginia. Signed Martin Walk (MW) and Catherine Walk (+).

In June 1742, Martin Vallick sued Michael O'Neal for trespass. Michael Clore in his will directed that no portion of the heritage of his daughter Agness Margaret "shall come into the hands of Michael O'Neal." It appears, Michael O'Neal had some problems with his relatives. Walk and O'Neal divided the land on 22 September 1748. (?) On the same day, Martin Walk and his wife Catherine sold their two hundred acres to Michael Yaeger. (Orange Co. DB 11, pp 95-97: Indenture 21 Sept. 1748 between Martin Walk and Catherine, his wife, Parish of St. Mark's, Orange Co., and Michael Yeager of same... deeds of lease and release for 20 L. .. grants 200 a. in Great Fork of Rappahannock River, being part of a patent granted to Martin Walk and Tobias Wilhide for 400 a. 22 July 1736.. bounded ... Peater Weaver .. Deep Run... Col. William Beverley's line, .. south side German Road ...

Martin Vallick was naturalized with other Germans of the Hebron Church community on January 24, 1742/43 and is shown as the owner of 100 a. in the Culpeper Rental of 1764. Martin Walk was living in Rowan County, North Carolina, by 1782.

On October 15, 1745, German applicants came to the court of Williamsburg to take their oath of allegiance: Jacob Mansboil, Lawrence Grays, Thomas Weeland, Matthew Gesler, Conrad Broil, Christopher Uhl, and Martin Walk. all from the 'Dukedom of Wirtemberg' and now neighbors on Robinson River. (The Wilhoids, Tobias and John, from the Electorate of Mainz were naturalized the following days, as were Jacob Chrisman from Worms, now of Opequon, and William Rickley, from the Canton of Berne in 'Swisserland.' )

MARTIN WALK, the immigrant, was born ca. 1710 in Wuerttemberg, Germany, birth estimated from Moravian Records, he married ca. 1734/35 in St. Marks Parish, Orange Co. (now Culpeper ) VA.

He moved with his family (incl. 12 year old Martin, ca. 1749/50 to North Carolina. They settled on Abbott's Creek, 16 miles from Friedberg. The first land grant is in 1752, Anson Co., which became Rowan in 1753, and Davidson Co. in 1822.

Martin Walk and his wife Catherine sold 200 a. of land on 22 Sept. 1748, and as Martin Walk and Michael O'Neal had divided their 400 acres of land also on 22 September 1748, it would appear that Martin Walk was preparing to move to other parts.

Ms. Fries, a Moravian researcher, stated that the Ziegler's, Fisher's and Miller's were the families that moved with the Walk's to Abbott's Creek.

In 1749, the area where Martin Walk settled became Anson County. It had been Bladen County, North Carolina, and might still have been Bladen when he arrived. In 1753, it became Rowan County, and remained such until Davidson County, NC was created in 1822.

On 25 March 1752, Martin Wallock acquired from John, Lord Carteret, Earl Granville, 165 acres. The deed was made to 'Martin Wallock of Anson County' but was recorded after Rowan was taken from Anson in 1753. There was to be a yearly rent of 6 shillings, seven pence. The land began at a white oak and maple, north 13 degrees, 65 chains to a white oak, west 20 chains to a white oak on the river bank, down River to the beginning. Witnesses: John Haywood, W. Churton. (Rowan Co. NC Deed book 3:72). Sworn chain bearers: Daniel Garrit, Dollon Lane, James Carter, Deputy Surveyor (North Carolina Land Grant Office, Raleigh, Patent Book 11:20). This land is on the west side of the Yadkin at Horseshoe Neck.)

The original record in the North Carolina Archives, Raleigh, has Martin Walk's signature.

The land Martin Walk received, on the east side of the Yadkin River, was near Johannes Gearhart's land, on the same side and occupied what is known as 'Horse Shoe Neck'. After Catherine's death, Martin married Catherine Gerhard / Garret.

13 Jan. 1767 II:667 - Will of Peter Fry proved by Martin Walk. Exec. Barbra Fry. (A:53 says Frey).

20 July 1768 Bill of Sale 25 June 1768 Martin Warlocks and wife to Michael Myers for 158 a. 15 May 1768 (6:578), Martin Warlocks buys this back the same date (6:595). (Warlocks = Walk).

15 Nov. 1769 Jacob Myers granted license to keep tavern in Moravian Town Bethabara.

15 Feb. 1770 James Glenn, Joseph Harrison, James Buck, Samuel and David Stewart, Georg Lash, Martin Houser, of the Yadkin, Henry Spoonhour and Michael Houser of Bethany, Jacob Stoner, Jacob Blecken and John Ranke of Bethabara, and George and Charles Holder of Salem to lay off a road from the Shallow ford of the Yadkin to cross the North Fork of Muddy Creek a little above the mouth of Steward's Creek to the town of Salem.

9 Nov. 1775 - Martin Walk was appointed the overseer on the Moravian Road from the Moravian Line to Reedy Creek.

On 1778 Rowan Co., Tax list: In Cpt. Mooris' district, was taxed for L745.

20 March 1782 A deed was signed by Martin Wallox and his wife Catherine of Roan (sic) County. They sold to Daniel Mauk of Shenandoah County Virginia 100 a. in Culpeper County, VA. (Keith, Arthur Leslie: The German Colony of 1717, I:26, 189-199.) This land was most likely the land that Michael Clore sold Martin Walk in 1735.

7 Feb. 1784 William Frank appointed overseer of the Virginia Road the Painted Springs to Abbots Creek, Michael Myers from Virginia Road from Abots Creek to the fork of Guildford Rd. Henry Frey on the Bauld Mountain Rd. from Flat Swamp to the Virginia Road.

8 Nov. 1785, 4:519 Administration of estate of Solomon Wollox dec'd granted Martin Wallox and Peter Fry who qualified and gave L300 bond with Peter Seaner and Daniel Hull, sec. He purchased 98 a. of the Martin Walk place. Martin Wallox and Joseph Wallox were witnesses. Grant was issued 4 Nov. 1784 to Soloman Wallox.

Martin Walk died before 8 February 1785, when his will was proved by the oath of Will Adams in the Court of Pleas and Quarter Sessions, Rowan Co., NC.
