Aside from training for Mt. Everest, teaching geography and owning a can-do spirit - what else do you need for starting a major outdoor apparel and equipment firm ? For a starter, head for Mount Rainier.

The mountain climber sprinted down the trail through the snowfields of Rainier. He was wearing only a T-shirt, shorts, and hiking boots. His breath was coming fast and heavy, but his strength was not gone. His strides stretched even longer as Paradise Lodge peeked over the hill. When people saw the mountain climber racing down the hill they began to cheer. Some looked at their watches and then stared at each other in surprise.

The climber's name was Richard McGowan. He had just run all the way to the summit of Mt. Rainier and back in six hours and 40 minutes. That included a 20-minute breakfast stop at the 10,000 foot level. Not only had he chopped more than two hours off the previous record, but this was the second of three ascents in two days to the summit of Mt. Rainier. That was in 1959, and the record still would not be broken 14 years later.

To this experienced climber, who had been part of the first International Expedition to attempt to conquer Mount Everest, climbing Mount Rainier was sort of a routine workout. As owner of the Guide Service on Rainier for ten years, he would make no less than 83 trips to the summit. Richard McGowan was always looking for new conquests. Several of those forbidding, rugged peaks in the North Cascades were first scaled by this hardy mountain climber.

His stamina, and endurance proved to be amazing. When he was training for another expedition, this time to K-1 in 1960, Richard would leave school in Seattle at 3 p.m., drive to North Bend, run to the top of Mount Si and back, and be home in Edmonds by 7 p.m.

No doubt, it was a strong blend of this spirit, stamina, and endurance that helped Richard create Mountain Products Corporation, now one of the major suppliers of backpacking and climbing gear in America.

More than 130 persons are employed at its south Wenatchee Avenue location. The firm also maintains a warehouse in Pennsylvania. In addition, 35 salesmen are spread out across the nation, selling to 1500 dealers of the Mountain Products clothing and equipment.

In the early 1960's, McGowan was a junior high geography teacher in Seattle, but his first love was still mountain climbing. He began to realize there were few places in America where a mountain climber could buy adequate climbing equipment and clothing. In 1963, he opened his own mountaineering store in Seattle, importing European equipment. This went over so well that he opened another store in Portland. Business was booming. It was easy to get the climbing equipment or hardware from Europe, but with the enormous business growth, he was finding it hard to keep mountain clothing and sleeping bags in stock from American suppliers. So McGowan started making his own.

In 1964, he started a small factory, employing several seamstresses near University Village in Seattle. But with his business continuing to flourish, and competition for seamstresses in Seattle very keen, he decided that business prospects might be better in Wenatchee, Washington. Mountain Products Corporation first called Wenatchee home in May of 1967. Then it had only ten seamstresses. Only six years later 130 people are employed by Mountain Products Corporation. And it is still growing. Today, if one were to walk into the busy production center of Mountain Products on South Wenatchee Avenue, he would see a vast, colorful array of down-filled clothing, sleeping bags, tents, and nylon shell clothing. In addition, Mountain Products is the exclusive distributor of Kastinger climbing and hiking boots from Austria, and a French line of butane stoves, heaters, and lanterns called Jet Gaz. The Company also makes ski apparel in Hong Kong and packs, rucksacks and tents in Japan.

McGowan supervises the operations of Mountain Products from his comfortable home in Wenatchee. He has given up teaching and his retail stores, but he has not given up mountain climbing. When he was training for the American Expedition to Alaska's Mount Logan in 1971 he jogged up a Wenatchee mountain and down again every day carrying a fifty pound pack. He is involved in the designing of all Mountain Products Corporation's

clothing and equipment-with his deep reservoir of know-how and the feeling for what every outdoorsman wants and needs.

"To say that I was born traveling might be a slight exaggeration, but to say I have since crossed the globe is nothing but the truth. Travel and adventure are deeply rooted in me. All my life, I have explored the off-the-beaten path. And it all began with a powerful, beautiful mountain.

Seventeen years ago, my parents climbed Kilimanjaro in East Africa. The name means 'Mountain of the Snows'. It is the most majestic and spectacular volcano on the African continent, a massive table-like summit covered in a cap of eternal tropical ice, presiding over miles of golden East African plains.

I picture my mother at the summit, over 19,000' high, looking out over miles of sunlit clouds. She felt nauseated and wondered why this was the first altitude sickness she had ever experienced. In consulting the trip doctor, she realized that she must be pregnant.

So the seeds of my life were sown into exotic ground, binding me to a majestic mountain in East Africa. I celebrate that bond daily in using the name my parents gave me: Kili, short for Kilimanjaro, the great Mountain of the Snows.

Since then, I have been fortunate to have journeyed to all seven continents, including Antarctica, and I have traveled in about 45 countries. Some of my earliest memories are of playing in the Okavango Delta with my father while a guide watched for crocodiles and trekking to the base of Mount Everest in the Himalayas when I was three. For me, childhood memories are exotic: playing with seals and talking to tortoises in the Galapagos, imitating penguins in Antarctica, riding camels in Rajasthan or seeking tigers on the backs of elephants in India and Nepal. I have seen many of the world's most beautiful places: the Taj Mahal, Macchu Picchu in Peru, the Royal Palace in Bangkok. Perhaps one of my most memorable trips was to the North Pole on a Russian nuclear-powered ice-breaker.

Also, as my parents are both hikers and mountain climbers, I have trekked and climbed in many of the world's most famous and beautiful mountain ranges. I have also climbed on Mount Moses in the Sinai, Mount Ararat in Turkey, Mont. Blanc in Europe, Mount Fuji in Japan, and Mount Cameroun in West Africa. One of my favorites was Mount Stanley in the fabled Ruwenzori or 'Mountains of the Moon'. They are a giant sponge straddling the equator in Uganda. The whole trip was nothing but bogs, bogs and more mud. When I was ten, I traveled to Kilimanjaro with a small group. Although we were turned back from the summit by bad weather, I was able to see my awesome namesake.

It is impossible to separate these travel experiences from the development of my character. They have been

such an integral and formative part of my life, shaping my outlook and forming my attitudes. I have traveled in luxury, as well as slept with rats on a wooden floor, or used some of the most repulsive toilets imaginable. Through this exposure to both the primitive and the sophisticated, I came to appreciate both. Adventure and travel have given me a great passion for life. I know that the world is a thousand times greater than each person can experience, that there is more to life than what we experience here. I have learned to respect each culture I run into for the richness and beauty it offers.

My exposure to different people and cultures has fostered an open-mindedness and flexibility in me. I learned to be sensitive to what is around me - the people, creatures and environment. Any artistic spirit I have has been greatly inspired by the natural and human beauty I have seen. I have a deep respect for this world and everything in it. I appreciate the diversity of culture and people. I have a strong wish to preserve the spectacular wilderness of this planet. Everywhere, I have seen things that inspire and fascinate me - forests and deserts, mountains and oceans: people, culture, religion, philosophy, traditions, dress and language. Most importantly, I have come to love the human spirit.

As I prepare to leave MA at the end of this year, I realize there are many people to thank: First, and most importantly, to my parents - my mother, the most wonderful dreamer I know, and my father, the craziest adventurer I know - thank you for showing me the world. I love you both.

To Marie, Forest, Joemy, Janne, Serena and Erin - Thanks for your deep friendship. You are all such strong women. Thank you for celebrating life with me. To Jeff - Thank you for helping me realize the richness of my own world and for sharing yours. For the entire MA community - teachers, fellow students, and the Class of 1997 - I am thankful for being part of such a dynamic community."
