She was born Abt. 1811 in TN, and died Abt. 1854 in Barry Co MO. He married **(2) Martha Ann Simpson** 13 Sep 1854 in WashburnPrairie(Barry) MO, daughter of William Simpson and Matilda Rowland. She was born 11 Feb 1827 in TN or Ohio, and died 16 Feb 1887 in Wagoner(CherNation)IndTerr.

Clark Sinclair, Houston TX, is the source for the parents, brothers & sisters of William Brummett. Clark is a descendant of William's nephew Harrison Brummett who settled in northeast TX during the 1830's

William Brummett was born about 1811 & was the son of Renna & Mary (Estes) Brummett who left Franklin Co Virginia & settled in Tennessee where William was born. By 1830, they had settled in Jefferson & Pulaski Counties of southern Arkansas.

William married first wife Nancy Ray about 1836 & settled in Randolph County of northern Arkansas. During the 1840's, William took his family to southwestern Missouri, settling in Sugar Creek Township of the Washburn Prairie, Barry County.

William's older brother Langston Brummett had moved on to northeast Texas during this time, settling in Lamar County near the Red River with his son Harrison Brummett. Just across the Red River to the north was Indian Territory. Harrison Brummett, born 1814, had received an original land patent from the Republic of Texas for his services during the Texas war of independence from Mexico.

William's nephew Harrison & other members of this family later settled just to the south in Fannin County & eventually Farmersville, Collin county, Texas.

At the beginning of the Civil War, Captain Harrison Brummett command Co 1, 15th Brigade of the Texas Militia at Farmersville.

William had several children from his marriage to Nancy Ray. They were Elizabeth, Mary Jane, Narcissa, Martha, William, Johnson & John Brummett. Nancy died while still residing in Barry County. In 1854 William married Martha Ann Simpson, the widow of John Gaylor, who brought his family to Barry County a few months earlier. Martha's brother-in-law, Rev Joel Mitchell performed the ceremony. Joel F. Mitchell was a baptist minister, slave owner and Confederate sympathizer who was bushwhacked by Federals during the Civil War.

This Brummett/Gaylor family moved on the northeast Texas about 1858 & settled near William's relatives. While in Fannin County, William Brummett & Martha had several children of their own, including Jefferson Brummett, born 1858 & Robert Clinton Brummett, born 1860.

(Don's Note: The census taker made several mistakes, in names, dates & places of birth. He also grouped all of the Gaylor & Brummett children together using Brummett as the surname for all of them. The youngest (on this census) was Jefferson Brummett, born 1858, age 2, the child of William & Martha Brummett & half-brother of the children listed above. Robert "Bob" Brummett, and probably other children were born to William & Martha Simpson Gaylor Brummett after 1860. After William Brummett died in Farmersville, TX about 1865, Martha, her third husband William C. McCord, and her Gaylor/Brummett children moved briefly back to Barry Co MO and then on to Indian Territory about 1870. No federal census records exist for Indian Territory during 1860's through 1890's, and these other children can't be identified by name.)

Several years later, toward the end of the Civil War, they moved to nearby Farmersville in Collin County, TX, where William's nephew Harrison Brummett had already moved shortly before the Civil War. It is believed that William Brummett died during or soon after the end of the war.

Notes for Martha Ann Simpson:

Martha married her 3d husband William C. McCord in Farmersville, Collin County TX. This was in 1867 and soon after that, they all moved back to Barry County, MO for a couple of years. While in Barry County, Martha's daughter, Sarah Matilda married Ivera Wright in 1868. That same year, Martha's step-son John Brummett married her niece, Amanda Mitchell, daughter of Roseanna(Simpson) Mitchell. Baptist minister Williamson Seamster, the founder of the Rock Springs Baptist Church, performed the ceremonies. It is believed the family belonged to this Rock Springs Baptist Church during this period of their return to Missouri. They remained there about two years and then backtracked into Indian Territory probably using the same Texas & Osage trails. They all settled near Fort Gibson about 1869. Martha's step-son John Brummett remained in Missouri & it is believed that wife Amanda died young, about 1880, leaving John with 2 young sons. According to Mitchell family tradition, these 2 sons were left in the care of brother-in-law James Mitchell, who also resided near Seligman, Barry County, MO. John moved on to Arkansas where he married another woman, but also moved to Cherokee Nation about 1888 & resided near his relatives.

Nothing more is known about Martha's 3d husband William McCord, but Martha resided for several years with her daughter, Sarah Matilda. Sarah had married blacksmith, Frederick M. Uhls and they resided under permit near Ft Gibson in the Illinois District but later moved to Muskogee. Sarah & brother "Tom" Gaylor applied jointly for Cherokee Citizenship in 1878, but were rejected. Martha's son "Jack" Gaylor and family left the area during the 1870's and eventually settled in Wyoming. Her son "Tom" & his Cherokee wife Nancy Alberty settled northeast of Wagoner in the Cherokee Nation and was a rancher on the Gaylor Bend of the Grand River for many years. Martha's son Bob Brummett & wife Lummie also resided in this area, however eventually settled near Hulbert.

It is believed that Martha moved to the Gaylor Bend area and died at her son Tom Gaylor's home place in 1887. She was buried in the Gaylor Bend Cemetery. Her son "Tom" Gaylor and other family members were later

buried near her. This family cemetery was among the several small cemeteries which were later relocated to the Pioneer Memorial Cemetery near Wagoner during the establishment of Fort Gibson Reservoir.

Notes for John Brummett:

John Brummett was born 1850 in Sugar Creek Township of the Washburn Prairie, Barry County, Missouri. He was the son of William & Nancy (Ray) Brummett who left Randolph County, Arkansas during the 1840's & settled in Barry County. John's mother Nancy died about 1854 & his father married widow Martha (Simpson) Gaylor that

same year. Young John made the journey to northeast Texas about 1858 with his father & step-mother along with all the Brummett/Gaylor children.

John's father died in Collin County, Texas during the Civil War & his step-mother Martha married William C. McCord in 1867. John's Brummett siblings, all older than him, remained in Texas when he went back to Barry Co

MO in 1867 with his step-mother & family. In 1868, he married his step-mother's niece, Amanda Mitchell, the daughter of Rev Joel & Roseanna (Simpson) Mitchell. When his step-mother, step-siblings & younger half-brother

Bob Brummett all headed back south in 1869 to Fort Gibson of the Cherokee Nation, John remained in Barry County.

It is believed that his wife Amanda died about 1880 & John went to Arkansas. According to Mitchell family tradition, 2 sons of John & Amanda Brummett, named James & Bill, were raised by Amanda's brother James Monroe Mitchell, who also resided near Seligman in Sugar Creek Township of Barry Co MO. James Mitchell also raised the 4 sons of his sister Martha Jane who married Richard "Dick" Pallett. Martha & Dick Pallett had also died during the 1880's leaving sons John, Bill, Frank & Burt.

John Brummett married Mary Smith about 1881 somewhere in Arkansas where their first child Mable Bertha was born in 1884. About 1888 John moved his family to the Cherokee Nation, close to where his half-brother Robert Brummett & step-brother John Gaylor resided at Gaylor bend on the Grand River. John later moved a couple of miles west, just across the line to nearby Wagoner in the Creek Nation. Their 3 other children Lawrence B, Florence & Leo were born in this area. John died in 1905 & was buried in Elmwood Cemetery in Wagoner, Oklahoma. Mary died in 1932 and was buried beside him. Their children later changed the family name to BRUMNET.

Notes for Robert Clinton "Bob" Brummett:

Robert Clinton "Bob" Brummett was born about 1860 near Ladonia, Fannin County, Texas. His parents, William & Martha Simpson Gaylor Brummett settled in nearby Farmersville, Collin County, soon after the end of the Civil War. His father died about that time & in 1867, still a young child, he moved to Barry County, Missouri with his mother & her new husband William McCord. Those who also made the trip were his half-brother John Brummett as well as half-siblings Jack, Tom & Sarah Matilda Gaylor.

In 1869, they all journeyed back south to Fort Gibson of the Cherokee Nation. His half-brother John Brummett, however, remained in Missouri for a few years before joining the family. Bob married Lummie in the Cherokee Nation & settled near Wagoner, not far from where his half-brother "Tom" Gaylor settled on Gaylor Bend of the Grand River. Bob's half-sister Sarah Matilda Gaylor married blacksmith Frederick M. Uhls and resided near Muskogee.

Bob's other half-brother, Jack Gaylor, had settled in Wyoming during the 1870's. Bob & Tom Gaylor are believed to have visited their brother Jack on his homestead in Sinks Canyon near Lander, Wyoming during the 1880's.

Sometime after 1900, Bob took his family to nearby Hulbert where wife Lummie died in 1914. Lummie was brought back to the Gaylor Bend area to be buried in the family cemetery. Bob's brother Tom Gaylor and mother Martha were also buried there. This cemetery was later relocated to the Pioneer Memorial Cemetery near Wagoner, during the construction of the Grand Lake.

About 1916, Bob married the widow Daisy Gilstrap. Bob died in 1943 & was buried in the Hulbert Cemetery.
