

## *Descendants of Thomas Hoskinson, Sr.*

### *Generation No. 1*

1. THOMAS<sup>1</sup> HOSKINSON, SR.<sup>1</sup> was born 1679 in Rock Creek, Prince Georges Co., MD<sup>1</sup>, and died Unknown. He married JANE MOORE<sup>1</sup> Bef. 1718 in Prince George Co., MD, daughter of JAMES MOORE and MARY. She was born Bet. 1670 - 1690 in Rock Creek, MD<sup>1</sup>, and died Unknown.

THOMAS HOSKINSON SR. Price George County, Maryland

Ca 1679 - Ca 1743/44

In the year 1700, by his own admission, Thomas Hoskinson Senior came into "His Lordships Country Maryland". It is not known where he came from as this was never revealed in any of the records that the writer could locate about him. If he came into Maryland from another Country, it surely must have been from the British Islands. It is also possible that he could have come into Maryland from another province in the Americas. But, because he stated that after arriving in Maryland he worked a four year indenture for a Gentleman at the head of Biords (Birds) Creek in St. Marys County, I believe that Thomas Sr. must have come directly from the Old Country at that time. This would have been on one of the creaky old sailing ships of the times that made regular voyages to the new world and required several miserable weeks for the trip. As was the custom in those days, some one no doubt had paid Thomas's passage. After arriving here he was then obligated to work out a four year indenture to pay for his voyage. After completing his obligation to the "Gentleman" he then moved to Prince George County, Maryland and remained there the rest of his life. Circumstantial evidence indicates that he married Jane Moore, a daughter of James Moore Senior and Mary Moore about 1708/9 in or near Rock Creek Parrish, Prince George County, Maryland. Thomas HOSKINSON Senior was a planter and was mentioned several times in various County Court, land documents, tax lists and other records.

The first mention of Thomas HOSKINSON Senior in the Maryland records was found on the 1719 tax listing for Rock Creek Hundred, Prince Georges County. He was listed next to James Moore, his father-in-law. At that time there were only four known Hoskinson's in Prince George County that the writer could locate. These were; Thomas Senior, James, Mary and Elenore. The latter two girls were noted as being "couzins" of James Moore Senior, otherwise nothing more was learned about them. There were also a few "Hoskins" in Prince Georges County and others in Charles, St. Marys and the surrounding Counties, but as previously mentioned they were of different family groups and did not seem to be related to, or associated with the Hoskinsons.

On May 9, 1720 Thomas Hoskinson Senior, received a Warrant for 100 acres of land called "Hoskinsons Folly", from James Beal, near Bladensburg in Prince George County. The boundaries of this land began at a Bounded White Oak standing on the East side of the North Branch of the Eastern Branch of the Potomack River and near the beginning tree of "Addition to Jacksons Necessity". Liber I.L. #A Page 162 Survey Folio #1110.

On 14 September 1722 Thomas Hoskinson received a land deed for "Hoskinsons Folly" from Charles the 2nd absolute Lord proprietary of the Province of Maryland and Avalon, Lord Barron of Baltimore and James Beall. LIBR PL #3 Pages 141-143 Prince Georges County, Maryland. Also Land Office Patent P.L. #5 Pages 141-143.

In his early married years Thomas seemed to have lived the life of a typical Planter (Farmer) of the times. He had a servant lad by the name of Fergus Ferrold who was also inclined to run away from time to time. In 1721 Thomas had to apprehend and bring him back into the August court. He confessed there to having absented himself from his Masters service for twenty two days. Fergus was then adjudged to serve an additional ten days for every day he was absent, and another three months for the six hundred pounds of tobacco that Thomas expended in regaining him. LIBRA BOOK "K" Folio 378.

In the November Court 1722 in Prince Georges County, Thomas Hoskinson again swears runaway time against Fergus Ferrold. Fergus had unlawfully absented himself out of his Masters service for 30 days. Libr "K"

In March 1723 Fergus was again in Court, this time complaining tha this late Master John Bradford was unjustly detaining him as his indenture time had expired. However, Thomas Hoskinson had proven in the last Court that Fergus had ran away for 30 days and John Bradford now claims that Fergus 71 had also ran away from his service 90 days and that Bradford had expended 200 pounds of tobacco in apprehending him. Fergus was adjudged by the Court to serve his Master John Bradford two days for each of the 90 days of run-away time and three months more for the charges of 400 pounds of tobacco expended to apprehend him. It was also adjudged by the Court to aquit Fergus of the thirty days runaway time proven by Thomas Hoskinson because he had been corporally punished for the same.

On 27 March 1723, John Bradford submitted an indenture for the purchase of 196 acres of land, a part of "Widows Mite" lying between Branches of Goose Creek and Rock Creek. This was from Thomas Fletchall of Prince Georges County, Maryland and witnessed by John Frazer and Thomas Hoskinson. Deeds Liber "M" page 410.

In 1723 Thomas Hoskinson witnessed two other deeds by William and Ann Renshaw (a bricklayer) for the remainder of "Widows Mite", deeded to Thomas Fletchall. This was in the Freshes of the Potomack River between Goose Creek and Rock Creek. Liber "M" folio 407 and 453.

During the coming years Thomas Hoskinson Sr. was involved in several Court Cases. Most of these were for debts as Thomas did not seem capable of managing his business affairs without over extension which lead to serious debt problems. It is believed that Thomas was involved in a lifestyle and business dealings that he could not sustain. In 1726 Thomas was sued for debt and brought into court by Tobias Bowles. Later in the same year Thomas countermanded a suit by Patrick Hepburn, Fraser and Justice. Liber #5, Page 95.

In March of 1727 Edward Sprigg sued Thomas Hoskinson for non-payment of debt for sundry goods, wares and merchandise that Thomas had purchased from him. This dated back to the fifth of March 1725 and amounted to fourteen pounds, three shillings and seven pence.

At the time that Thomas was convicted of the Edward Sprigg debt, his Lawyer submitted a petition to get Thomas excused from prison but this was rejected, as follows; "In March Court 1727, It was Ordered by the Court here that Thomas Hoskinson's petition setting forth his unhappy circumstances and praying he may be discharged from imprisonment at suit of his creditor, be rejected". County Court Liber "N" Page 240. Prince Geo. Co., Md. County Court.

On 24 June 1730 Thomas was again summoned into Court by Edward Sprigg under a "Fiat Execution Sur Scire Facias" for the failure to pay the debt of 5 March, 1725, which was the reason for his being imprisoned in March 1727. Apparently Thomas had been released from prison on a type of debtors parole prior to his being again summoned to court. Thomas did not answer this summons and failed to appear. As a result the Court awarded the debt of 14 pounds, 3 shillings and 7 pence to Edward Sprigg, plus an additional three hundred and sixty eight pounds of tobacco in damages. This was no doubt a form of bankruptcy for the times and as a result Thomas may have already lost his land "Hoskinson's Folly" to his creditors.

Later in the November Court of 1730, Thomas submitted another petition to the judges and Justice of Prince George County as follows;

THOMAS HOSKINSON November Court 1730 Prince George's County, Md. Liber "P", Fol. 595 (Film CR34,711-1) Thomas Hoskinson professes to the Court here the following petition Viz; Maryland An. 1730. To the Worshipful Judges and Justices of Prince George's County now sitting. The humble petition of Thomas Hoskinson humbly sheweth your Worships that your poor petitioner came into his Lordships Country Maryland in the year 1700 and your petitioner served four years to a worthy Gentleman at the head of Biords Creek in Saint Mary's County and your petitioner hath been a hard labourer in Prince George's County twenty six years, not deserting from any person or persons but enduring much hardship. Your Petitioner hope's that your worships that knows your Petitioner will consider that your Petitioner cannot labour as formerly though willing and more to labour for your petitioner, but his children Chiefest of them very small. I hope your worships will consider your petitioner and dismiss me from paying levy which he's so long labored amongst you and your petitioner shall heartily and humbly be thankful to your worships for so doing. Upon reading which petition and consideration thereof had it, it is ordered here that the Petitioner be allowed in the next County Levy ninety pounds of tobacco and that he be levy free for succeeding years.

By all appearances, Thomas was destitute by this time, especially after having spent time in prison. Even though Thomas had probably lost "Hoskinsons Folly" to his creditors, he may have been allowed to continue to live on and work the land, paying rent to its new owner. James Hoskinson was no doubt there during these difficult times and probably helped work and manage the plantation while Thomas was in prison.

An item in the Provincial and General Court Judgements book, Liber E.I. #8, Prince George's County, Pages 440,441 and 442, seems to back up the loss of "Hoskinsons Folly" by Thomas. On 9 June 1740 a Samuel Hyde, late of London, Merchant, relinquished "Hoskinsons Folly" 100 acres, along with other tracts of land to George Plater Esquire and the Estate of the late Honorable Charles Calvert Esquire, to which he owed considerable debt.

The next appearance of Thomas Hoskinson Senior was on the tax listing of

1733. James Hoskinson was listed as a tithable as follows; "At Thomas Hoskinsons, James Hoskinson (1)". As Thomas had been excused from paying taxes and the way the entry was worded, the taxable was for James, believed to be his son. Thomas and James were listed next to George Moore. George Moore was son of James Moore Senior and brother in law to Thomas. Black Book #2, page 122. See James Hoskinson section for original tax list.

Nothing more was found in the Prince George County Records for Thomas Hoskinson after the 1733 tax listing until the March Court of 1740. By that time Thomas had managed to become involved in enough other business dealings that he again found himself in Court for non-payment of debts.

In March 1740 Court, Henry and Edward Trafford sued Thomas Hoskinson. Case Agreed, second writ. Agreed. Liber X, Fol.635.

In November 1739 James Hoskinson was ordered into Court on Duces Tecum

Issuer, brought by Henry and Edward Trafford. James was ordered to Produce a document or some instrument of writing. I believe this had some connection with the 1740 case of Traffords Vs Thomas Hoskinson. Liber X, Fol.549.

Also in the November 1739 Proprietary Court, an Eleanor Hoskins was brought up on a Bastardy charge. I do not know if Eleanor is connected to the Hoskinsons in any way, but there is a possibility that she may have been the one who was "Couzin" to James Moore Senior, as was noted in the 1717 deed of gift to Elinore and Mary Hoskinson. Her court appearance is as follows:

HOSKINS Bastardy Conviction by Confession: Prince Geo. County. Memorandum yt. at a County Court of Ye Right Honorable Charles absolute Lord and Proprietary of Ye Province of Maryland held at Upper Marlborough Town in County afsd, 4th Tuesday in March the Twenty Third Year of said Sprs Dominion and by oath of fifteen jurors, namely Robert Bradley was presented Eleanor Hoskins for having a Bastard Child and now at this day to wit. The 4th Tuesday in November in Twenty Fifth Year of his Sprs Ye Lord Proprietary Dominion Ye Eleanor Hoskins by Thomas Clark her attorney Comes and says she cannot gainsay but Ye she is of Ye premises above to her inform afsd. Imposes and therefore submits herself Ye grace of Ye Court here where upon premises being seen by Ye Court here fully understood it is considered by Ye same Court Ye Eleanor Hoskins be fined or suffer Corporal Punishment according to Act of General Assembly in such cases late made and provided and hereupon Ye Eleanor Hoskins by her Attorney afsd pays to Alex Contee, Clerk of court here 30 shillings current money for Ye fine afsd. John Hillery of Prince Geo. Co. Planter in his proper person in Court becomes security for Ye said Eleanor Hoskins Fees assured as by occasion of Premis Ye Eleanor Hoskins is dismissed.

In March Court of 1740, Dr. Andrew and Mary Scott, executors of the estate of John Abington, merchant, late deceased, of Prince George County, sued Thomas Hoskinson for non-payment of debt. This was in regards to a promissary note dated 20 November 1738, for thirteen hundred and fifty eight pounds of tobacco to Abbingtion. Thomas won this case under "Non Prosequitur" because the Executors did not produce the documents to

prove their case and apparently had not conformed to the Court procedures as they should have. The Court awarded Thomas one hundred fifty three pounds of tobacco in costs and charges against Andrew and Mary Scott

Executors. Liber Z, #13 Fol. 28.

In the August 1741 Court, John Abingtons Executors again sued Thomas for non-payment of the same debt which amounted to thirteen hundred and fifty eight pounds of tobacco in cask and convenient in Prince George County. This time they produced the necessary documents to prove their case and Thomas was ordered to pay. A George Murdock became "Pledge and Manucaptor" for Thomas and was liable for payment if Thomas could not. The Court also assessed Thomas another two hundred sixty three pounds of tobacco for the Executors charges and costs. Liber. Z, #13 Folio 416-417.

In the April 1742 Court, George Atwood sued Thomas Hoskinson, a planter, for debt. This was an extensive case that dated back to 1736 and 1738. At that time Thomas had been dealing with John Hoopes a Merchant in Lurgen, Ireland to whom he had given bills of exchange, as Merchants did in those days, this was for the benefit of George Atwood. These bills were refused and were not accepted, something on the order of todays bad checks. Thomas promised to make them good but refused to do so and was brought into Court by Atwood. Thomas was ordered to pay to Atwood thirty pounds sterling and three hundred sixty eight pounds of tobacco in costs and damages.

Liber "Z" Folio 576,577,578.

This Court Case could be a clue as to where Thomas Hoskinson came from before arriving in Maryland in 1700, if in fact he had come from the British Islands at that time. Hoopes aparently came to Maryland after Thomas had his dealings with him in Ireland. This is by reason that on 22 February 1743 a Last Will and Testament was filed for Hoopes in Prince George County. A Cornelius Elting was his Executor.

In July 1742 Thomas appeared on the Estate debt list of a John Ellbrough deceased, along with James Moore Sr., George Moore and others. Estate Inventories Film #WK208. Inv. #1, DD#1, 1741. LDS Film 0014285. Prince Geo Co., Maryland. Also on the 1742 debt list of Dr. Joseph Coleman Deceased, appeared George Moore, Thomas Hoskinson, James Moore Sr. John Moore Jr. and others. Inventory #1 DD#1, 1741 Page 216. Film WK208. LDS014285.

The last mention of Thomas Hoskinson Senior. was on a June 1743 Court Petition for permission to apply to the next General Assembly for relief from his miserable prison confinement. It is not clear as to when Thomas was again put in Prison, but probably resulted from one or more of the several bad business dealings that he had had with his creditors. A verbatim copy of this petition is as follows:

THOMAS HOSKINSON JUNE 1743 COURT Liber AA #14, Page 671:  
Thomas Hoskinson proffers to the Court here the following petition Viz: To the Worshipful Justices of Prince George County Court now in counsel sitting the humble petition of Thomas Hoskinson Senior and humbly sheweth that whereas your petitioner at this time a languishing prisoner in this County Goal in the custody of John Hepburn Esq. for debts which your poor petitioner is in no capacity by any ways to pay and your poor petitioner

having a wife and family who must inevitably be obliged to be troublesome to your Worships for a maintenance. Except your poor petitioner were at liberty to gain support for them and upon whom they absolutely depend for maintenance. And your petitioner having been an inhabitant of this County upwards of forty years and behaving himself with probity and honesty to all men, being now misfortune and weekness of old age brought to this calamity, most humbly beseecheth your Worships of your great goodness and lenicy to such unfortunate persons to take his case into your consideration and grant him your certificate of permission to apply to the next General Assembly for relief from this miserable confinement and your Petitioner as is duty bound shall ever pray. Upon reading which petition and consideration thereof had, it is ordered by the Court here that the Clerk of said Court make certificate of the Petitioners notice. Film CR34.714XP Pr.Geo.Co.,Md.

I believe that Thomas Hoskinson died soon after this petition was submitted, probably still in debtors prison. The Court records were searched further in an attempt to locate an application to the General Assembly, or for some other evidence of relief to Thomas's problem, but none was found. It is also believed that Thomas Senior may have been married at least two times, because in his petition of 1730 for County assistance he mentioned that he had young children. Again in 1743 when he petitioned the Court for permission to apply to the Maryland General Assembly for release from debtors prison he indicated he had a wife and family to support.

By 1740 there was a Thomas Hoskinson Junior nearby who also began to appear in the records and who was no doubt the son of Thomas Senior. Thomas Junior is believed to be the one who married Ann in 1740 and whose children were later listed in the Prince George Parrish Church records. Thomas Junior was also listed in Court records when he sued to collect a debt from Thomas Butler whom he had built a tobacco barn for in 1742/43. Thomas Hoskinson Senior and Thomas Junior were designated as such in their 1742/43 court transcripts.

JAMES HOSKINSON Prince George County, Maryland Ca.1710-1796

The second in the genealogical family tree of Azariah Hoskins is James Hoskinson, born about 1708/10, to Thomas and Jane Moore Hoskinson in Prince George County, Maryland. In his lifetime James was always noted as being a planter and later in his life a carpenter. Records indicate that he died in Monongalia County about May of 1796. Other than her name being Elizabeth it is not known who James married. It is also not known if Elizabeth was James first wife or his second, but he is believed to have first married in about 1738-39. My research never turned up anything adverse in the lives of James and Elizabeth, they were honest and dependable in their business dealings, paid their debts and raised their family to be good honest citizens. I also believe that the males were schooled enough to at least read and write as they were all able to sign their names to any documents that were necessary. James family is believed to have been somewhat religious as they read both the bible and the book of Wesley and most of their sons carried biblical first names.

The first recorded mention of James Hoskinson was on 28 March 1717 in a deed of gift for a horse, given to him by his Godfather, James Moore Senior of Prince George County, Maryland who was also his Grandfather.

This deed was written as follows:

James Moore Senior  
To  
James Hoskinson

28 March 1717.

To all to whom these shall come KNOW YEE that I James Moore of Prince George County out of the love and affections I have to my God Son James Hoskinson, do give unto him and his heirs one bay mare with a starr in her forehead, branded on the farr buttock with a blotch brand resembling AN and on the rear buttock with T-L. Which said mare with all her increase I do hereby for me my heirs give and confirm to the said James Hoskinson and his heirs against the claims or demand of all persons what so ever: Witness my hand and seal this twenty eighth day of March anno 1717.

On 4 May 1717, soon after James Hoskinsons received the horse, James Moore Senior also gave his "couzins" Elinore and Mary Hoskinson a cow. At this point I have never able to determine who Elinore and Mary were in the Hoskinson-Moore relationship. The deed of gift is as follows:

JAMES MOORE SR. to Elinor and Mary Hoskinson. DEED 4 May 1717

To all to whom these shall come Know Yee that I James Moore in behalf of my son George Moore of Prince George's County out of the love and affections I have unto my Couzons Elinor and Mary Hoskinson, I do give unto them and their heirs; one yellow cow, being marked on the right ear with over half of the ear cut off and the tip of the under half of the ear cut off, and under or cut out. The left ear being the upper half of the ear cut of and a bitt of the top of the under half cut off. Which said cow with all her increase I do give and confirm to them the said Elinor and Mary Hoskinson and their heirs against the claims or demand of all persons what so ever. Wittness my hand and seal this 4th day of May Anno 1717.

The next mention of James was on the 1733 Rock Creek Hundred tax listing for Prince George County. On this he was shown as being "at Thomas Hoskinson's" place. George Moore and Thomas Dryden were also listed as being at the next two plantations. George Moore was a son and Thomas Dryden was a son-in-law of James Moore Senior.

In 1735, James Senior and Mary Moore gave their grandson James Hoskinson 50 acres of land called "The Gift" lying on the North West Branch of the Eastern Branch of the Potomack River. This was part of a 150 acre tract called "Barbadoes". In the deed it was specified that the land was given to James Hoskinson, subject to the use of his mother Jane Hoskinson until her death. A verbatim copy of the deed of gift is as follows:

JAMES HOSKINSON Deed of Gift Land Records 1735.

At the request of JAMES HOSKINSON the followiang deed of gift was

May twenty fourth day Anno Dom Seventeen Hundred Thirtyfive.

TO ALL CHRISTIAN PEOPLE to whom these presents shall come, I

Senior afsd of Prince Georg County in the province of Maryland Planter for  
and in consideration of the love and good will and affection which I have  
and do bear towards my loving Gran Son James Hoskinson of this afsd

and province has also for and in consideration of the sum of ten pounds  
sterling money to me well and truly paid by my said gran son James  
Hoskinson and for which sum I do for myself my heirs exects and assignes  
discharge him the afsd James Hoskinson and for certain other valuable  
considerations hereunto us waving, have given granted and by these  
presents  
do freely, clearly and absolutely give and grant to the said James Hoskinson  
his heirs, exects or assigns, all that Parcel of land called the GIFT" lying on  
the North West Branch of the Eastern Branch of the Potomack River  
containing fifty acres being part of a tract of land called Barbadoes  
containing one hundred fifty acres; beginning at the first boulder of the afsd  
tract of land called Barbadoes and running South fifty perches, East  
Eighteen degrees South one hundred and eighty two perches, North by East  
thirty nine perches then with a strate line to the first tree. Containing fifty  
acres, together with all its woods, underwoods, houses fences, gardens and  
all other improvements as all and singular the rent, profits, ways and  
passages, water courses, appurtenances whatsoever to the same belonging  
and appertaining. To HAVE AND TO HOLD the said parcel or tract of  
land afsd fifty acres and all the singular premisis and every part and parcel  
thereof with the appurtenances unto the said James Hoskinson his heirs  
(exect adid) and assigns from hence forth as his and their proper estate ever  
after, after the death of his mother Jane Hoskinson absolutely without any  
manner of condition as I the said James Moore have absolutely and of my  
own accord set and put in further testimony IN WITNESS whereof I have  
hereunto set my hand and seal the ninth day of May in the year of our Lord  
God One Thousand Seven Hundred Thirty and Five.

At the same time that James Senior and Mary Moore gave James  
Hoskinson the 50 acres of land on the North West Branch of the Eastern  
Branch of the Potomac River, they also gave George Moore the remaining  
100 acres of ("Barbadoes") then called "Sligo's Loss". James Moore Senior  
was into old age by this time and was probably in poor health, no doubt  
deeding some of his land and personal property to his children as a result.

At this time James also gave land to Peter and Benjamin Moore, two of his other sons. He also gave his household goods and furnishings to Benjamin along with the land. He and Mary were probably living with Benjamin at the time. James Moore led a very active life in Prince George County in his years there. He was mentioned often in the records, owned considerable land and was well respected in the area. In 1708 he indicated that he was 62 years of age when he gave a deposition in a Land Commission hearing in Chancery Court. This was to prove the boundary of a tract of land called Proff's Lott that lay adjacent to a tract called Moores Plains, which James Sr. had owned at one time. This would have made James about 89 years of age in 1735, a very respectable age at any time. James Moore is believed to have come to America in 1660 from England.

James Moore Senior purchased the tract of land called "Barbadoes" in 1713 which contained 150 acres. When I plotted out the survey runs and coordinates for both Hoskinsons Folly and James Hoskinsons part of Barbadoes, I found that Barbadoes lay adjacent to and nearly abutted Hoskinsons Folly on the South. Later in 1748-49 James Hoskinson applied for a resurvey of his land (50 Acres Barbadoes) to include a narrow strip of vacant and unclaimed land along his north line. After the resurvey was made James Hoskinsons land then abutted Hoskinsons Folly, both on the South and on the West.

In November 1739 James Hoskinson was summoned into Court on Duces Tecum Issuer, brought by Henry and Edward Trafford. James was ordered to produce a document or some instrument of writing. As already mentioned in the Thomas Hoskinson section, I believe this had some connection with the 1740 case of Traffords Vs Thomas Hoskinson. This was awarded against James. Liber X, Fol.549.

Later in 1747, James applied to the Provincial Land Commission for the resurvey of his property, which was to include a narrow strip of vacant and unclaimed land that lay between his and that of Hoskinsons Folly. This is found in "Petition to Resurvey Liber BY & GS #3, Folio # 54. After several delays, this resurvey was finally completed in 1749 and an additional 90 acres was added to the original 50 acres that James received from his Grandfather. This was by land Certificate #140. Liber BY & GS #1, Folio #635.

As mentioned earlier, when I plotted out the survey runs and co-ordinates,, it was found that James Hoskinsons land "the gift" (Barbadoes) abutted Hoskinsons Folly on both its south and west sides. Also, I believe that the North West Branch of the Eastern Branch of the Potomack River flowed between Hoskinsons Folly and James Hoskinsons land. The remaining 100 acres, the part of Barbadoes that George Moore received, also abutted that of James Hoskinsons on the South.

In 1755 James Hoskinson was noted as having packed, prized and shipped tobacco for the estate of Charles Higgenbotham in Fredrick County Maryland. In 1756 it was noted that James Hoskinson received payment for this service.

In 1763 the Prince George County Estate records indicated that James Hoskinson owed the estate of John Smith Prather a sum of money as follows: PRINCE GEO. CO. MD.COURT RECORDS Film LDS #0014282 No#1 1763 Page 18, 80 and 81. Estate Accounts Due of Wm Deakins and Elizabeth his wife, Executors of John Smith Prather for cash received and due to the Deceased Estate. Jan. 28, 1765 by Zach. Harris, /6/.

Samuel Sumsar 16, James Hoskinson 19. and others.

On 6 April 1765, James and Elizabeth Hoskinson mortgaged their land to Thomas Cramphin a Bladenburg Lawyer for the amount of Thirty Two pounds, Seven shillings and 7 Pence silver currency. Elizabeth released her dower in the land at the time. Repayment with interest was due on the first of August 1767. Later, on 18 February 1767 James and Elizabeth repaid this mortgage in the amount of Thirty Six Pounds, 10 Shillings and 5 Pence. I believe that this mortgage was probably taken out to pay the debt, at least in part, to the John Smith Prather estate. After James and Elizabeth paid off this mortgage they again received clear title to their land.

By 1769 some of those whom I consider to have been James Hoskinson's children and those who moved with him to Berkeley County, Va., began to appear in the Prince George County, Maryland records. The first was Azariah Thomas Hoskinson who appeared on a certificate of Astray in 1769, involving five stray horses. Then came Jephtha in 1771 on a Bill of Sale and later in 1775 Isaiah Hoskins appeared on an Estate Listing of people who owed debts to the Estate of Michael Binci. James, Azariah and Jephtha were also listed in this same ledger. Estate Inventories Bk #1, page 315.

On 23 December 1772 James and Elizabeth sold One Hundred Twenty Seven and one half acres of their land, Giliard (Barbadoes), with a half acre reserved as a burying place. This was sold to Samuel Shekill of Ann Arundell County, Maryland, with Elizabeth releasing her right of Dower in the land at the time. They received One Hundred Fifty Eight Pounds Fifteen Shillings Sterling in hand for the property. As James reserved 1/2 acre for a burying ground in this sale of Giliard (or Giliad), it might be assumed that both Thomas Senior and Jane Moore Hoskinson are both buried there. This sale left 12 1/2 acres remaining as unsold of their original 140 acres which may have contained the house where they had been living. James and Elizabeth were no doubt contemplating on leaving the area, but may have continued to live there for awhile longer after the sale of their other land. This sale was also in close proximity to that of Azariah Thomas Hoskinson, who had already sold his land, Hoskins Lott, on 14 September 1772. Azariah's land lay on a branch of the Sligo a short distance north from where James Hoskinson's land was located. This might seem to indicate that both Azariah and James had planned to leave the area together, as nothing more was found in the Prince George County records pertaining to them after that, with the exception of a few unpaid debts to some deceased persons Estates. Prince George County, Maryland Deeds Liber BB #3, Folio #144-145-146. Hall of Records, Annapolis, Md.

The next notice of Azariah and James was when they turned up in Berkeley County, VA. in 1777/78. By this time Basil and Jeremiah Hoskinson had already preceded them there, these two were first listed in Berkeley County, Virginia Court records on 17 March 1774. Later Jephtha, Isaiah, Ezekiel, Mathew and Nancy Geyer (w/o Fredrick) also turned up in the same area near Bath, Va. (now Berkeley Springs, WV.). Isaiah, Basil and Ezekiel served in the Virginia Revolutionary War Militia while living in, Berkeley County.

The first mention of James Hoskinson in Berkeley County, Va. was on 18

August 1778 when he purchased 200 acres of land from Abraham Davenport by indenture of Lease and Release. The writer believes that the Davenports and Hoskinsons were well acquainted prior to the purchase, as both had been living in Prince George County, Maryland before moving to Berkeley Co. Va. This 200 acres was located on Dry Run, a draft of Warm Springs Run, of the Potomack River, and lay about two miles north of Bath, Va. It was part of a 400 acre land grant that Davenport had received in 1775 from the Governor of Virginia. As the 200 acres was purchased by indenture of Lease and Release, James may have been living there for awhile prior to his actual purchase. Berkeley County, Virginia Land Deed Book #5, Pages 66-67-68.

During his stay of about ten or eleven years in Berkeley County, Va. James was involved in several small court cases, most involving debts that were owed him. These cases seem to point to James as having been into some type of business, possibly with Isaiah as he to was in a number of similar law suits in this same time frame. In my opinion almost all of the Hoskinson people that were on record in Berkeley County in the 1770's and 1780's were the children of James. These were: Azariah, Jeptha, Jeremiah, Mathew, Isaiah, Basil, Ezdkiel and Nancy Geyer. Also, with the exception of Basil and Ezekiel all of these people later ended up in Monongalia County, Virginia, just ahead of James. Basil went to Brownsville, in Fayette County, Pa. and Ezekiel to Mississippi.

Between August 1782 and January 1783, James sold the remaining 12 1/2 acres of land that he still owned in Prince George County, Md., to John Schofield of Montgomery County, Maryland. This was done by power of attorney. Elizabeth did not sign a release of Dower, which might indicate that she had died prior to that time. This is recorded in the Prince George County,

Maryland Deed Book, 1783. Liber Folio 282-283.

Also, after James arrived in Berkeley County, Basil Hoskinson applied for a land grant of 216 acres that was surveyed in 1779. This land lay next to that of James Hoskinson on Warm Springs Run. The Grant is as follows:

Thence along the lines of the three hundred and seventy two acres, North 47 degrees East 340 poles to a pine on a naked hill, North 43 degrees West 16 poles to a black oak sapling in William and Henry Boyles line Christopher Ault corner, thence along his reversed South 69 degrees East 32 poles to a white oak and hickory, thence south 25 degrees West 38 poles to a white Oak and Chesnut oak on the North side of a hill. Aretti and Abraham Davenport Corner thence along Davenports and Hoskinsons line taken together, South 22 degrees West 300 poles to a black oak on George Brents line and along it reversed South 80 degrees West 48 poles to a white oak his corner and

In 1788 James sold his 200 acres of land on Dry Run, by mortgage, based on five annual payments for five years, to Patrick McKelvey. McKelvey finished paying off this mortgage in 1794 and James released the mortgage by power of attorney. This P/A was handled by his good friend and son-in-law, Fredrick Gyer. James was then living in Monongalia County, either with or close to the Gyer family. The Gyers were from Washington Co., Maryland but had lived in Berkeley Co., near James Hoskinson at the time he was there.

On 14, December 1795, James Hoskinson gave all of his household goods and livestock to his Granddaughter, Ann Elizabeth Gyer, by Deed of Gift, as follows:

Hath given and granted and by these presents doth freely give and grant unto the said Ann Elizabeth Gyer her heirs and assigns, after the decease of him the said James Hoskinson, one black cow and heifer, one black ditto and red ditto marked with two staple forks in each ear, one bed, bedsted and furniture and pewter dish and six plates to be for her the said Ann Elizabeth Gyer own proper use to her and her heirs, an inventory of which articles have delivered unto her before the sealing and signing of these presents signed with my own hand and bearing date 14 December 1795. TO HAVE AND TO HOLD the said four head of cattle together with their increases, one bed, bedstead and furniture, one pewter dish and six plates to her the said Ann Elizabeth Gyer and her heirs and assigns forever: IN WITNESS whereof the said James Hoskinson hath hereunto set his hand and affixed his seal the 14 day of December in the year of our Lord 1795.

Notes for JEREMIAH HOSKINSON:

Came to Monroe County, Ohio, about 1800 with Infant son Azariah and settled near what is now Duffy. He grew up in Monongalia County, VA. Children from first marriage all migrated to Vermilion Co., Illinois circa 1820-1823 without their father and shortened names to Hoskins. (from History of Monroe County, Ohio, that includes family histories).

Thomas of second marriage went to Texas, the others to Illinois.

According to Daryl Bruner [lyrad22@aol.com](mailto:lyrad22@aol.com)>, the children of Jeremiah and Mary Scott Hoskinson were raised by Achilles Morgan who was Mary's brother-in-law.

The following information was passed on by Daryl Bruner which information she received from another researcher:

"By 1813 Jeremiah and Mary had seven children, the youngest, Susannah was born 6 March 1813. History seems to indicate that Mary had probably died about this time or soon after. Later in February of 1814 the seven children of Jeremiah and Mary Scott Hoskinson were taken to Monongalia county, Virginia and bonded to their grandfather, Thomas Scott. until they became of age. In this bonding their names were shown as Hoskinson along with their ages. No reason was given for this action and no record has been found to indicate that these children ever again lived with their father.

Ordered that Erariah (Azariah) Hoskinson, aged 14 years, Elza Hoskinson, age 12 years, Levina Hoskinson, 10 year, Synthia (Cynthia) Hoskinson, 8 years, Jannie (Jane) Hoskinson 6 years, Mary Hoskinson, 4 years and Susannah Hoskinson, 1 year be bound to Thomas Scott the males until they arrive to the age of 21 years and the females until they arrive to the age of 18 years and that William Wilkey perfect the indenture.

Later, history and circumstantial evidence seems to indicate that Jeremiah married Frances Scott in 1813/14 in

what was then Monroe County, Ohio. Marriage records have never been found. Frances was the daughter of Stephen and Elizabeth Cook Mygatt Scott of Williamstown, Massachusetts. At this time Stephen and Elizabeth Scott operated an Inn or ordinary on the Ohio River near what is now the town of Duffy. Duffy is in the southeast of Monroe County. This is the same area where Jeremiah is thought to have operated a ferry boat across the Ohio River.

There were six children born to Jeremiah and Frances Scott Hoskinson. There is some conflict in the ages of Susannah (youngest of Mary Scott's children) and Melissa, the oldest of Frances Scott's children as later census records puts her birth date in the vicinity of 1812/13.

There is a good possibility that Jeremiah may have lived across the river in Tyler County, Virginia for a while from about 1815 to 1819. Records indicate that he was well acquainted with people there and he also conducted some business with them. His father-in-law Stephen Scott Sr. and brother-in-law Stephen Scott Jr. both owned land there and Melissa, (Frances Scott's oldest daughter) married Butler Delashman or Delashmutt in Tyler County, Virginia. Later some of these Hoskinson children and some of the Delashmans or Delashmutts moved to and lived in Iowa.

There were others of Jeremiah's relatives in Monroe County, Ohio. His brothers Azariah, Archibald, and Ezekiel Hoskinson as well as a sister Sarah Hoskinson Martin were there. Jeremiah's brother-in-law Stephen Scott Jr. was first married to Hannah Wilson, daughter of Humphrey Becket and Jane Hoskinson Wilson of Monongalia County, Virginia, sister to Jeremiah. Stephen Scott Jr. and Hannah Wilson lived in Tyler County, Virginia where she died early in their marriage. Two other sons of Stephen Scott Sr. are believed to have married daughters of Humphrey Becket and Jane Hoskinson Wilson. They were John Scott, who married Nancy Wilson and James Scott, who married Rachel Wilson.

on 22 November 1822 Stephen Scott Sr. died and Philander B. Stewart (a son-in-law of Stephen Sr.) was appointed administrator of his estate.

On the night of 1 May 1824, Philander Stewart died in a drowning accident on the Ohio River. His canoe overturned while he was returning from a party across the river. Isaac Baily (a son-in-law of Stephen Sr.) and Jeremiah Hoskinson were appointed administrators of Stewart's estate.

Sometime in May or early June of 1828, Jeremiah Hoskinson died in Ohio Township, Monroe County, Ohio. His brother, Azariah was appointed administrator of his goods and chattels on 19 June 1828.

On 24 Jun 1830 an extension of time to settle his estate was asked for from the court, which was granted. Again on 30 March 1831 another extension for settling the estate was requested by Azariah Hoskinson. Again it was granted. After this there was no mention of Jeremiah's estate settlement in the records.

Borff being offered as accepted as such security and Samuel McBride. Isaac Baily and John Neff was appointed appraisers to appraise the (real estate) personal estate.

Francis Hoskinson is believed to have died in Cass County, Illinois in 1837 and is supposed to have been buried in the Carr Cemetery.

Jeremiah's seven children by Mary Scott all migrated together to Edgar County, Illinois. ( a part of which later became Vermilion County). They arrived there in about 1823, after a two or three year stopover in the Helts Prairie area, of then Vigo County, Indiana. This area is now Helts Township, Vermilion county, Illinois.

(3)All of Jeremiah's children by Frances Scott migrated to Iowa in the 1850's, except Thomas Bowman Hoskinson, who went to Texas,, probably in the 1840's. (Thomas did not change his surname. )All of Jeremiah and Mary Scott Hoskinson's children shortened their name from Hoskinson to Hoskins about the time that they migrated to Illinois. No reason was given for this, but was probably for convenience in signing their name."

Azariah's sister, Sarah, was the wife of Abner Martin and the land was purchased in 1847 by Abner Martin, Isaac Rush and Christian Resecker, trustees of the United Brethren Church for the purpose of building a "meeting house" and therefore became the Mt. Olive United Methodist Church and Cemetery. Another story relates that he established this church in 1825 which could be possible, as many groups in that time period were meeting in members' homes.

From the book, "Family Research-Monroe Co., Ohio, Vol. II", page 49 lists Azariah Hoskinson, John Howell and others being sued by the state of Ohio in 1817. The article doesn't state what for.

You will come to a fork in the road on the way to Mt. Olive. go right and just up around the bend is the Sardis Cem. Can't miss it. Its weird that all this time I spent in Sardis Visiting my family I was 4 miles away from this. Az's grave stone is a small stone with AH on it, thats it, there is also a dedication monument. Dave

In April it participated both days in the battle of Shiloh, with heavy loss; and took part in the siege of Corinth until the evacuation when it moved westward, operating in Northern Mississippi and arriving at Memphis in July. It was ordered to Alton, Illinois in August, where it remained until July 1863, then moved to Helena, Arkansas. In January, 1864, the Regiment re-enlisted and went to Ohio on veteran furlough. In March it joined the Red River expedition and met with disaster. It took part in the capture of Mobile and then went to the Rio Grande where it served until mustered out March 8, 1866, the veterans having performed over four years of service.

Grandson Howard Carr recalled: "Sometimes when I would come home from WVU I would stop to see him and he would be to sick to shave...he would ask me to shave him then. There was one time when I had to take him to see Doc Frye...needed to open up his urinary tract to remove urine because of blockage, prostate etc. I stood behind his chair and tightly held both his arms while the Dr. worked on him from in front...very painful. He never said a word...just thanked me when it was over...a tough old guy. Country medicine practiced on poor patients with old men's problems. John loved his beer and would sit there in Joe Romeo's beer joint, below the cemetery near where we lived, most of the day at times and then try to get home. I supervised when I spotted him."

Raymond Lambert played in a band and was very good at violin. He had curly, dark hair, and bright, powder-blue eyes. He wasn't very tall, built somewhat like his son Arthur, but looked like his eldest son, Howard. He never lost his hair, but it did turn white.

Son Arthur tells that Raymond began working in the coal mines at age 11. He never finished school, but he took piano lessons and developed beautiful handwriting. He played fiddle at the Moose and other various lodges and bars. Son Arthur played the guitar and son Howard played the Piano. The three of them played together around the Preston Co., WV, area.

Alice Lambert, Raymond's daughter-in-law, recalls: Raymond played piano at a roadhouse that he would take Alice and Howard to. Raymond fed Alice her first taste of strawberries and cream--the strawberries were home grown and the cream was fresh from the cow. It was delicious. Raymond also took care of Alice and Howard's dog, Ginger, when they couldn't keep it. One of Raymond's favorite things to do was to tease Alice with his pet possum by letting it chase her until she jumped on the bed, but the possum would just jump on the bed, too. He took a group swimming at Mill Creek one day, and Alice remembers slipping on a flat stone and cracking her head and had to get stitches. One of the houses that Raymond lived in was so far back in the country you could only drive so far and then had to get out and walk a good ways to get to the house.

Raymond is buried with his second wife Elsie Dean in the Oak Grove Baptist Church Cemetery off of Route 119 five miles north of Grafton, WV.

Howard spent a lot of time on the farm with his paternal grandparents, Ruben and Lily Lambert. He recalled working on the farm--rising early and doing the milking, having a huge breakfast, then working in the fields and then having a huge lunch. He probably formed his love of cooking at this early age. His wife, Alice, recalls that Howard liked to cook -- made homemade bread, Thanksgiving turkey, cobblers, canned food.

Howard held many jobs, mostly in the electrician fields, was a welder, a grinder at Tyson Roller Bearing. He was artistic (family remembers a particular picture of a pheasant) and could play the piano.

Interesting that all of his and Alice's children and grandchildren were musically talented. (Alice was musical, too).

Howard and Alice, and Howard's sister, Joan and her husband, Ed, owned a restaurant called Hensel's for three years until Route 21 was re-routed.

Notes for DANIELLE LAMBERT:

After the Thanksgiving meal in 1998, Danielle and daughter Dian were talking about Danielle's childhood. These are some of the memories they talked about:

Danielle was known to friends and family as "Dani", and is still called that to this day.

Dani remembered getting their first television around 1954-1955. She was in the sixth grade and the kids were only allowed a limited amount of viewing time. Their mom told them the tubes would burn out. Westerns were the favored shows, and heroes were Hop-A-Long Cassidy and Annie Oakley.

Her favorite childhood toys were the Lincoln Log set and any kind of Tinker Toys. Every Christmas, she and her brothers and sisters got two to three toys each-but always a baby doll.

The family never owned a car. They walked everywhere. They also had a diet of beans, vegetables and bread. Not surprising, all the kids were slim and healthy!!

The family grew a garden each year, using very simple implements--a shovel, hoe and push plow. Dani's mother canned everything. Meat was a special treat, usually reserved only for Sundays. Mr. Haight, a Mannington area farmer brought butter and cheese twice a week.

Dani and sister Eileen were the closest in age and spent much time together. Dani remembers her mother making dresses with matching bloomers for her and Eileen from feed sacks. She said they were very pretty. Eileen and Dani played in the yard, and were not allowed to play outside the yard until they were in junior high school.

The big events to look forward to with much excitement were the circuses and carnivals that set up in the big field right across the narrow road from their house.

Sometimes the events set up a block away at the old pottery dump. Another much looked forward to event was the annual 4th of July Parade.

Dani recalled not being allowed to wear pants in school until the 9th or 10th grade, and then, absolutely no jeans or tennis shoes were allowed. Gym shoes had to be carried to school in a bag. She also remembers always seeming to be in a hurry, running to and from school, and in the winter having cold, chapped legs. The school board policy until she was in 7th grade was that if you lived within 1 and 1/2 miles of the school, you didn't ride the bus, and you went home for lunch. They lived over a mile from school!

Dani's first job at age 12 or 13 was ironing clothes for .50 a basket for her neighbor, Mrs. Margaret Ann Christner. At age 14, she was allowed to baby sit to make extra money.

All the family haircuts and permanents were done at home.

Dani never met her biological father, Raymond Lambert, but knew Gene Schrader, her step-father, from about age 3. She recalls when she was angry with him, she would call him "Old Gene Lambert".

The family used to get their ice from the Ice Man who would come once a week or so and bring a big block of ice. When she was four or five years old, Dani jumped off the porch one day and landed on the Ice Man's ice pick. There was a lot of crying and plenty to cry about. She said that Gene took care of her.

Dani remembered that older sister Joan was sent outside with pots and pans to bang to celebrate the end of WWII.

Well, Dean didn't, and so didn't receive his bonus. His mother, Alice, thought he did. After that summer, when he turned 18, he hitched rides to Florida with only \$5.00 in his pocket. He slept on beaches and stole oranges to survive. He finally called his mother and told her the truth, at which time she bought him a bus ticket home. Several years later, he returned to Florida with a friend and worked in a trailer park. His friend moved away and he lost his job and had to return to Ohio again. On July 1, 1981, Dean was swimming at an old rock quarry in Medina, Ohio, and dived in. He was injured and lived the rest of his life as a quadriplegic. During his treatment in Columbus, he and his nurse, Susan fell in love and married. They moved to Florida. Dean died under uncertain circumstances and we may never know the full story of his death. His mother said that the first four years of his life in Florida were probably his happiest.

Before his accident, Dean played in a number of bands, being extremely talented. One band he played in actually opened for the Bob Seger Band. He could play the trumpet, french horn, bass, keyboard, flute and sing. He was a licensed music agent and worked at Applecreek Development Center as a technician. His son, Aaron, is also very musically talented and won the Louis Armstrong Award his senior year. He plays the trumpet.
