1. Hienrich "Henry" Ernst Lehmann¹, born Aug 09, 1843 in Alt Rudnitz, Brandenburg, East Germany; died May 07, 1938 in Juneau, Dodge County, Wisconsin. He was the son of **2. Johann "John" Michael Lehmann** and **3. Wilhemine Breaeamer Cleimmer Klammar**. He married **(1) Wilhelmine "Minnie" Augusta Voigt** Dec 03, 1863 in Hustisford, Dodge County, Wisconsin. She was born Dec 01, 1849 in Lebonnon, Wisconsin, and died Jul 25, 1928 in Hustisford, Dodge County, Wisconsin.

Notes for Hienrich "Henry" Ernst Lehmann:

Heinrich Lehman, of Hustisford, Wisc., was another farmer to come to Dakota in 1880. He was tired of digging stumps there and thought the open plains had greater future in store. He brought his wife and seven of his eleven children in 1883. They brought their possessions to Watertown, bought a plow and horses and left to find their new place. Travel was slow with the large family so they didn't get to the Claim the night they planned. They stopped in a clump of trees one half mile south of Groton, SD. As soon as they arrived at the settlement, some went right to plowing, while others started the shelter for the family. His son EMIL, was then eleven years old. After some years in the Dakota the parents and all but Emil and his brother John, went back to Wisc. The two boys batched for awhile and then John also left. Courage and perseverance were essential to pioneers, so Emil's sister came to keep house for him until he married. His grandson Henry Lehman and his wife Dorothy (Erdman) still live on the farm.

"One of Oldest Resides of Juneau had been ill"

Henry E, Lehman, Sr., aged 95 years, one of this city's oldest residents, passed away at the home of his daughter Mrs. Dina Schultz, this city at 10:45 o'clock Sunday night, following a serious operation. Mr. Lehman had been about the home as usual until taken ill a week ago.

Funeral services will be held Thursday afternoon at two o'clock from the home of Mrs. Schultz and at two-thirty o'clock from St. John's Lutheran church, Rev. M.J. Nommensen officiating Interment will be in the Juneau City cemetery.

The deceased was born Aug 9, 1843, in Germany and he came to America in 1855, with his parents, and settled at Hustisford. In 1868 he was united in marriage with Wilhelmina Voight, who preceded her husband in death in 1928, after they had observed their 60th wedding anniversary.

Mr. & Mrs. Lehmann resided near Hustisford, Wisc for a number of years, then moved to North Dakota for a period of ten years, and then returned to the town of Oak Grove, In recent years, Mr, Lehman had made his home in this city.

Surviving are six sons; of whome Ex-Sherriff Henry Lehman, Jr., is one; four daughter; thirty-two grandchildren; twenty great-grandchildren and two brothers.

Notes for Johann "John" Michael Lehmann:

Moved from Germany June 11, 1856

1st - seven children were born in Alt Rudnitz, Germany, the last two were born in Hustisford, Wisconsin

Homesteaded south east of Hustisford, in Dodge Co., Wisconsin - was in the family for over 100 years, in 1955 the last of it was sold out by the family

He became blind when he was old

His father came over to America also. He is buried in the Hustisford cemetery between Woodland & Hustisford, Wisconsin

Notes for Wilhelmine Lehmann:
Beaver Dam Argus April 16, 1870 issue:

Sad and fatal accident happened, Mr. Henry Yock, wife and brother, Mr Dahan and wife were out in a small boar, a short distance above the dam and becoming on account of the strong currant, they neared the old Saw Mill and one of them in trying to grasp one of the timbers, swamped the boar, throwing them into the water, and out of the five only two got ashore, Mr, Henry Yock and wife and the wife of Mr Dehne were drowned. Their bodies have not yet been recovered, Mr Yock was a young man highly respected, and one of the most expert men we have in handling a boat, and a great swimmer. The cause of his going down was endeavoring the save of his wife, but being so near the dam this strong currant carried him over and down the rapids.
