The Herdrich farm, 160 acres, was purchased from Newton Allen for \$4000.00 on October 14, 1899. It is located in the Township of Loyal, about 5 miles south of Loyal, Wisconsin on County Trunk K. Charles had the southern half while Oscar had the northern half. Charles and Oscar Herdrich (brothers) married Paetow sisters- Mathilda and Mary. Money was loaned to Charles and Mathilda Herdrich by Jonathan D. Steuerwald (stepson of Ernestine Eisentraut Steuerwald).

The original 160 acres was purchased by Frederick and Augusta and sold to Charles and Oscar Dec. 4, 1900. Frederick and Augusta Herdrich purchased 160 acres from Isaac Newton Allen on October 14, 1899 with a mortgage of \$4000.00 at 6% interest to be paid annually.

On December 4, 1900, Charles, Mathilda and Oscar Herdrich assumed and agreed to pay the \$4000 from Frederick and Augusta Herdrich of the Town of York.

The house was destroyed by fire February 5, 1979.

Charles F. Herdrich, a resident of the Village of Loyal for seven years and the Town of Loyal since 1900 passed away at his home Monday, April 20, 1931 at 9:00 a.m. He was born in Columbus, Nebraska on March 5, 1871 and when six years of age moved with his parents to Sheboygan, Wisconsin. On October 12, 1893 he was united in marriage to Matilda Paetow at Milwaukee, Wisconsin where they resided until 1900 when they located on a farm in the town of Loyal. In 1924 they moved to this village where death came after an illness of about a week although the deceased was paralyzed for the past seven years.

He is survived by his devoted wife, one son and three daughters; Everett of Loyal, Wisconsin; Mrs. Erma Uhrig of Calvary, Wisconsin; Mrs. Gladys Rowley, Loyal; Miss Florence of Chicago, Illinois. One child in infancy preceded the father in death and also two sisters. Three brothers survive: Otto of New Jersey, Ed of Washington, and Oscar of Loyal, Wisconsin and six grandchildren.

He was a member of the Methodist Episcopal Church, Modern Woodmen Lodge, and at one time served as Chairman of the Town of Loyal. Funeral services were held Thursday, April 23, at 1:30 p.m. at the home and 2:00 p.m. at the M. E. Church, Reverend V. C. Kegley officiating. Interment took place at the Union Cemetery, Loyal.

Mrs. Charles Herdrich, died Wednesday at 5:00 a.m., September 17, 1941 of a heart ailment and complications at the age of 73. Mrs. Herdrich, nee Matilda Paetow was born August 30, 1868 in Michigan. While an infant she moved to Sheboygan County where she spent her childhood and girlhood life. she was married to Charles Herdrich in Milwaukee, October 12, 1893 where they made their home for seven years. Here they rejoiced over and mourned for their first baby girl, Norma Irene, who died in infancy.

In 1900 she came to Clark County with her husband and they purchased the farm where their son Everett resides. In 1924 they retired to the Village of Loyal where Mr. Herdrich preceded her in death April 20, 1931.

and car repair. He liked dogs and always had at least two. He wore the striped bibbed overalls and an unshaven face that became so popular in the 1960s. You might say he was a little before his time. He was always happy to see us and laughed and joked a lot. He was a great help to grandma and grandpa and did a lot for them. You probably have the information about his time in the army in WW1. He was the oldest of the four children-5 yrs older than Art, 13 older than Anita and 14 older than Eva. When grandpa got his first car, 1916 I think, Tony was the one to drive it. Grandpa never did drive a car. He was a horse person. Tony has flat feet so didn't become a foot soldier. He was an orderly in a hospital in France."

Fredrich C. Herdrich and his brother Anton decided to leave Germany in 1867 to escape being drafted into the military. They were the sons of Johnnes and Kathrina Herdrich; Fredrich was born in Jena, Saxony, Germany on 6 Jun 1844. They sailed from Bremen, Germany, to New York; a 30 day ocean voyage. The brothers moved to Wisconsin where Fredrich married Augusta Eisentraut also from Germany. The couple had six children, three born in Nebraska and three born in Wisconsin.

Around 1903 Fredrich and Augusta moved from Wisconsin to the Tipso area north of Almira, Washington (the location is 3/4 miles north of Bagdad junction). They purchased some wheat land and lived in a one-story, five-room, lap-sided house that stood on the land. After Fredrich's death in 1907, Augusta took up a land claim near Denton, Montana, until she died in 1926. Both are buried at Lafollette Cemetery, north of Almira.

Gottlieb Eisentraut was born in Saxony, Germany, on January 18, 1823. Here he courted and wed Augusta R. Freidel. After the birth of three children (Ernstina, Augusta and Charles) they migrated to America. This was about the year 1849, and they settled on a farm near Fillmore, Wisconsin. The original homestead is now owned by Hugo Hauch. Here four more children were born to them (Mary, Moritz, Oscar and Gustav).

One of Gottlieb's hobbies was planting fruit trees, especially apple and cherry. He built, alone and by hand, without the use of any mortar, just by perfect fitting and splitting, a windowless, stone-vaulted cellar that is still in existence today.

According to Aunt Bert (Bertha Startz) who stayed with Gottlieb and Augusta for some time, plowing was done by oxen and every time the dinner bell rang, the oxen would stop short and refuse to move another foot.

It is also of interest to know that Gottlieb returned to Germany for a visit and, while there, talked so much about how wonderful it was in the United States that he landed in jail.

His wife, Augusta, however, was very lonely here in the new country, away from all her relatives, and this feeling was further aggravated by the fact that she was an invalid in a wheelchair for many years. One evening when the doctor told Gottlieb Augusta would not live through the night, his compassion for her miseries and not wanting to live without her led him to seek comfort by swinging out from the branch of an old white ash tree and then dropping into a deep spot of the North Branch of the Milwaukee River. The white ash tree still stands-- one half mile south of Fillmore. Now that's quite a love story. (Augusta, however, did not die that night. She lived another five months.)

A tombstone marks the spot in the cemetery at Fillmore, Wisconsin, where both Gottlieb and his wife are buried.

John M. Brandl, dealer in flour, feed, seeds and fruits at Sheboygan, belongs to one of the pioneer families of this county. His parents, John and Waldeburga Brandl, were natives of Bavaria, Germany,

both born near Straubing, the former June 21, 1821, and the latter March 27, 1827. The father came to America in 1852, and the mother in 1854, being among the early settlers of Sheboygan, where their marriage was celebrated January 2, 1856. When they arrived here wages were very low, and money decidedly scarce. Mr. Brandl chopped cord-wood for T.M. Blackstock, at two shillings a cord, receiving in payment trade at a store. All the money that was in the house during one winter was a one-cent piece. Leaving his family in Sheboygan, Mr. Brandl went to work in the mines on Lake Superior, because he could get better wages there and be paid in cash. He was compelled to walk all the way to the mines, as he had no money with which to pay his passage. Although he was always an industrious and hard-working man, he never accumulated much property. He was a Democrat in politics, and was a member of the Catholic Church, as is also his wife, who survives, making her home in the Evergreen City. On the 9th of October, 1884, he passed away, leaving a family of seven children. In order of birth they are as follows: George, who runs a clothing establishment in the Chair City; Mary, who married Joseph Riesterer, of the same place; John, who comes next; Louis, who was lost in Chicago; Frank, who has charge of the paint shops of the Phoenix Chair Company; Joseph, who is a painter in the above-named shops; and Henry, who is a tailor in Sheboygan.

Diamond Bluff-This short history was submitted by Lorilee Scharfenberg. Thanks Lorilee!

Diamond Bluff became an official town Nov. 26, 1856. It is situated on the Mississippi River 43 miles below St. Paul. First named Monte Diamond by a Frenchman in 1800 and referred to as "Old White Man's Prairie" by the Indians. The first white birth was Mary Day, daughter of John and Sarah (Vance) Day in 1850. First death noted was Daniel Crappers in 1854. Early settlers included Enoch Quimby, August R. Mero, John R. Niles, John T. Payne, George Harpster, A.B. Willson, C.F. Hoyt, Samuel Hunter, Daniel Comstock, George Rogers, C.B. Messer and George B. Hope. The first store was opened by Daniel Stone and the next year E.B. Coulter opened for business. The first hotel was started by C.H. Grant and D.R. Clark who's money ran out and they sold to McCue & Cleary. The first school house opened in 1858 and in 1860 Chas. Fisher opened the first blacksmith shop. C.H. Grant and Z. Cross were the first carpenters in the village.

The township of Diamond Bluff originally included what is now Trenton Township. The first election was held at D. Comstock's on April 7, 1857 and the following town officers were elected: James Akers, chairman; Wilson Thing and A.B. Willson, supervisors; Edmond Thing, clerk (he later resigned and C.F. Hoyt took his place); James Akers, George Harpster and R. Caniff, assessors; A.B. Willson, Wilson Thing, C.F. Hoyt and R. Caniff, justices; E. H. Busted, superintendent of schools; A. Blaisdell, treasurer.

The town derived its name from many diamond-shaped stones found in the huge bluff which rose to great height immediately back of the town. The bluff was a guide for pilots on the river. A mile and a half out of Diamond Bluff there lay a cluster of Indian mounds (75-100), an archeologists dream. They covered 304 acres and were unexcavated for many years. The first church was a Methodist Episcopal Church established in 1855. The village does not have its own post office currently. The railroad runs between the main part of the town and the towering bluff. The current Diamond Bluff cemetery is well looked after and much information about the history and former residents can be obtained at the University of Wisconsin-River Falls archives by searching the microfilmed River Falls newspaper from the lat 1800s which carried a specific column on Diamond Bluff news. Ellsworth County Courthouse, only a few miles away, has many vital records. There are several Plat maps of Diamond Bluff which can be ordered through the St. Croix Historical Society at a minimum cost.

DIAMOND BLUFF CEMETERY

Diamond Bluff Cemetery is located in Section 19 of Diamond Bluff Township in Pierce County, WI and is one of the older cemeteries in the county. The land the cemetery is located on was once part of the MERO family cemetery. It was allowed to set idle, with no care for many years, and this neglect has taken its toll on this part of the cemetery. The cemetery was indexed in May, 1985 by Mikell Franzmeier and Reta Sanford.

Directions to the cemetery: take highway E south from Highway 10 to Diamond Bluff (about 6.8 miles). Turn right off E, cross the railroad tracks go .1 mile to stop sign (in Diamond Bluff). Turn left and go .6 mile to cemetery which is located on left-hand side of the road.

Samuel Blair was born in Ballyvallyough (near Raloo), County Antrim, N. Ireland in 1738. His nickname, "The Renegade", was given to him years after his death by Blair family historians. It was used as a means of distinguishing him from the many other Sam Blair's who were roaming the New World in the 1700's. The name was chosen because of his daring escape from the hangman's noose in Northern Ireland. Following is the poem, written by Sam while enroute to America, and the story behind his escape that was published in the November 1927 issue of the "Blair Magazine."

FAREWELL TO ERIN

by Samuel Blair, "A Hearts of Steel Man"

"While I live I'll never forget
The sorrow of that day
When, bound unto a foreign land,
Our good ship sailed away.

So I left my friends in Belfast town,
My love on Carrick shore;
And I gave to our dear Old Ireland
My blessings o'er and o'er.

Right well I knew when I set sail
What my hard fate would be;
When gazing on my native hills
They seemed to fly from me.

I watched them as they wore away,
Until my eyes grew sore;
Well knowing I was doomed to tread
On Shamrock soil no more.

They tell me I'm for Freedom's Land,
Where all my Masters be;
But were I in my winding sheet,
There's none to succor me.

For I must eat the stranger's bread
And bear the stranger's scorn,
That haunts me with a deal o'care
Sweet Isle, where I was born!

And were in now the tender heart
I once could call my own?
Who gave to me a long farewell
The day I left my home!

Not all the gold that I could earn
Beyond you Western Main,
The pleasures of my own dear girl
Could bring to me again!"

These lines were written by Samuel Blair, of Ballyvallyough, a leader in the Hearts O'Steel Rebellion in Ireland, 1770. He was captured and condemned to death, but escaped through the cleverness of his twin sister, Mary. The Heart O'Steel Rebellion, it may be said, was an uprising of the Irish tenantry to protest against the unjust taxation imposed upon them in the time of George III, and its spirit was largely the inspiration of the American Revolution, a few years later. These patriots were unsuccessful; many were put to death; and some--as shown herein--escaped to the New World. Many of them also served, Scotch-Irish Patriots, in the land of their adoption.

The story of the escape of Samuel Blair is one of the most charming of all those we have found. Samuel and Mary, as we have said were twins. Mary had just borne her first child when the news was brought to her of the capture and condemnation of her brother. She rose from her bed, dressed, and mounted her horse, riding for her farewell visit with the best-loved brother. She was permitted but a short stay with him, but when she left the prison she was weeping so heart-brokenly that it was with difficulty she could mount her horse and ride away.

The execution was set for some two or three days later. When the victim was led onto the scaffold, and before the noose could be adjusted, he stepped forward and threw open his coat, and, says the fascinating record, "there were fair white breasts dripping with suck," One soldier, whose quick perception must always thrill us, cried instantly aloud; "We've been fooled! We've been fooled! Its a woman!

The brief visit of farewell had, of course, been spent in the exchange of clothing, and Samuel had ridden away---with full speed, as we may imagine, when once out of sight of the prison---and taken passage in a vessel happily ready to sail to the New World. Mary, runs the tale, was taken before the King, and there she told her story. The monarch "bowed his head and the tears ran heavy over his cheeks as he bade her go her way, back to her babe. And, said he as he watched her going, "Would to god that some one loved me so!"

Samuel, of necessity, left without farewells---other than to Mary. No chance was there even for a farewell to the sweetheart who, we feel, should have joined him later. He arrived in Philadelphia; later settled in Central Pennsylvania on the shores of the Susquehanna. About 1796 he removed to Crawford County, Pennsylvania (in the north-western part of the state), where he died, it is said, in 1820. He married a young widow, Mrs. Ann Young, and left a number of children. His grave is in Mt. Blair cemetery, near Meadville, Pennsylvania. His nephew, Patrick Blair, who came over in 1835, is buried near him.

One might think that Sam's thirst for adventure had been quenched after the above experience but either out of natural taste for it or out of necessity his adventures continued in the New World. We believe he landed in Philadelphia in the years just prior to the start of the American Revolution. He was probably in the company of other banished rebels all with a deep grudge against the British. According to the Crawford County Veterans Office and a Revolutionary War marker on his grave he served as a Captain in Pennsylvania's 1st Regt., Continental Line from November 1775 to November 1776, but no confirming records have ever been located to substantiate this. Knowing his love of a good fight, however, it would be hard to believe he didn't take this fortuitous opportunity to do in a few British soldiers.

After his skirmishes with the British, Sam seems to have disappeared into the frontier of Pennsylvania for a few years. Records were few in the backwoods, but it is known that he settled somewhere on the banks of the Susquehanna River, which was at the edge of settled territory. The Scotch-Irish often led the way into the frontier as they were more accustomed to the hardships it brought. They were hearty souls on the order of Davy Crockett who could "leap the Ohio, ride upon a streak of lightning, and slip without a scratch down a honey locust; could whip his weight in wild cats- and if any gentleman pleases, for a ten dollar bill, he may throw in a panther--hug a bear too close for comfort, and eat any man opposed to Jackson!" As you can see they were also able to spin a good yarn. The Scotch-Irish women were just as hearty as described here by historian H. C. McCook:

Stalwart of frame no doubt they were, with muscles hardened under the strain of toil; hale and hearty, vigorous and strong, able to wield the axe against the trunk of a forest monarch or the head of an intruding savage; to aid their husbands and fathers to plow and plant, to reap and mow, to rake and bind and gather. They could wield the scutching knife or hackling comb upon flaxen stocks of fibers, as well as the rod of rebuke upon the back of a refractory child. They could work the treadle of a little spinning wheel, or swing the circumference of the great one. They could brew and bake, make and mend, sweep and scrub, rock the cradle and rule the household.

Sam married Mrs. Ann Young sometime before 1777 as that was the year their first child, Margaret, was born. Little is known about Ann Young, not even her maiden name, what is known is that she was a widow with a daughter by her first marriage and this daughter later married a gentleman by the name of Thomas Gilmore.

Sam and his nearly grown children moved on again in 1794, in search of yet another Frontier. They took title to land on French Creek in Northwestern Pennsylvania, later to become Woodcock township, Crawford County. This land had just recently been opened to settlers and Sam and his family were amongst the first of this daring breed of trail blazers to enter the land in that region. It is evident that other Scotch-Irish friends, family and neighbors came at nearly the same time or soon after. He carved out a home in this new wilderness and lived out the remainder of his days. He and Ann are buried in Mt. Blair cemetery near Woodcock, Pennsylvania. This was originally a family cemetery on Sam's farm which later became a public burial ground, even though most of those buried there are member's of Sam's family or close friends and neighbors. The cemetery sits aside a steep hill with Sam and Ann resting at its highest point.

Pictured on the left is the gravestone of Samuel Blair and on the right his wife, Ann's. Although difficult to read in this photograph, they are actually in remarkable condition today, especially Ann's. Part of the cemetery is pictured in the middle. Sam and Ann rest at the top of this hill with a remarkable view of the valley below. Both of these stones are large slabs that rest flat on the ground. Their stones read:

WOODCOCK TOWNSHIP.

Initial settlement was made by James Humes in 1791, upon land one mile west of Woodcock Borough. Three men settled in 1794: Henry Rust and John H. Bossard, of Westmoreland County, and James Long, of Lancaster County. Long died in 1830, in his ninety-third year. The McGill brothers, Patrick and Arthur, moved in during 1795. The latter took up eight hundred acres, but later, gave the south half to his brother. Samuel Blair, of Ireland, and George Long came from Susquehanna County to this township in 1797. At about the same time, William Wykoff, accompanied by his son John, came in from New Jersey, and located on Gravel Run, and John Greenlee, from Susquehanna, located on the farm upon which his son William is a resident. Nathaniel Clark, from Armstrong County, removed to this township about 1801. George Peiffer, a soldier of the Revolution, in 1802 came to the County, and to the township in 1809; and Thomas Rice, of Allegheny, settled on the farm now owned by S. T. Rice, in 1810. Wild beasts gave the settlers much trouble. Wolves were destructive to sheep, and were known to attack the cows. The mother called in her children before dark, and the settler returning from his work or from a raising saw the wolves skulking around him, and night was made hideous by their dismal howls. Bears were known to tear down the pens and carry off the pigs, and reports of panthers heard or seen made night-travel no pleasant undertaking.
