Marriage Notes for JOHN RAVIE and ELIZABETH ROBERTSON:

John Ravie and Helen Robertson are the earliest members of the Ravie family I have documented. John and Helen seemed to have been married in Northern Ireland in the early 1800's. Elizabeth was born in 1798 in Newtownards, Co Down. Her parents were John Robertson and Elizabeth Robertson ms.

When their son John Ravey was born the names were John Ravey and Helen Robinson.

When James was born the names were John Reevy and Helen Robertson, they stayed in Stevenston, Ayrshire in 1834.

In the marriage certificate of James they stayed at Kilwinning in 1855. This is near Ardrossan.

The only John Ravie and Robertson I could find in the SRO were John Ravy and Helen Robertson, they had a daughter Elizabeth who died in 1865 aged 30 years, the registration was at Ayr. In the 1851 census for Ayr Helen Revie age 53 (widowed) and James Revie aged 16 are staying with the Lauries at the back off number 47 the HIGH Street. Helen was born in Co Down and James in Ardrossan. I think this is the correct family.

I think his parents are wrong, his grandson gave David Ravie and Mary Ann McDowall as David's parents. Rebecca's grand parents were David Lawrie and Marry Ann McDowall. In the 1861 census his birth place is given as Ireland.

Marriage Notes for JAMES RAVIE and MARY RENNIE:

This side of the family came from Ayrshire in the mid to late 1800's estimated between 1864-1866 , from evidence according to the census return.

From the IGI ( International Geneology Index ) 1984 , James Revy and Mary Rennie were married on the 1st of June 1855 in Coylton Ayrshire. On the 5th of September of this year a son was born , no record of his name is shown the assumption is that he died not long after his birth, the same happened again on the 13th of September 1860 ( The spelling is Ravy for this one).

From the marriage certificate they were married by Alex Duncan, Minister of the Church of Scotland Coylton.

Village of Hillhead on both sides of the Ayr and Cumnock Road from Mr McLeonan' s house at the West end to John Duncan's at the East end thereoff both included.

James Ravey (Ravie) stayed in the village off Joppa and was an agricultural labourer, they were a young couple at this time with William aged 4 and James 2. On his place of Birth James had Stewarton and Mary, Ballantrae, in latter census 's they give Ardrossan for James's place of birth and Daily for Mary's .

Discovery by Dr James Young that the cannel coals in the Boghead area could be processed to produce parafin oil caused a demand for miners both there and in Barbuchlaw to migrate to the area. James's son William is recorded as being a coal miner at the age of 14.

In 1862 the OIL industry was introduced to Uphall ( West Lothian, Scotland ), by Robert Bell a Lanarkshire iron and coalmaster, while in the search for coal found substantial deposits of oil shale. First works were set up in the same year at Stewart field east of the village of Broxburn, by 1870 there were eleven oil works in Up hall Parish and by 1876 only the Uphall OIL Company at Uphall Station remained i n operation. Broxburn Oil Company

took over the moribund small concerns around Broxburn in 1877 , and within a few years became one of the leaders in the industry. Young's Paraffin Light and Mineral Oil Company of Addiewell and Bathgate took over the Uphall Oil Company.

As with the Electronic boom in the latter half of the twentieth century the Oil boom in the 1860's onward acted as a magnet . In 1871 only 20% of oil workers enumerated in Uphall and Ecclesmachan had been born in West Lothian.

In the middle of the 19th century, the town of Bathgate was only beginning to expand outwards from the centre area of Main Street and High Street , leaving the old crowded village behind.

Rows of miner's cottages or one storey tenements constituted the majority of dwelling houses.

---

In the 1871 census the family stayed in Bathgate on the Whitburn road, 60 Durham town. Ravey was the spelling used for the surname. Another James Ravey stayed at 67 Durhamtown, in the Bathgate mortality records he is recorded as James McRavey.

In 1881 he had moved from Durhantoun to West Calder , where he worked as a labourer in the oil works.

In 1891 the family stayed at 64 Beechwood Row , these were oil company houses built of red brick to the South of the railwayline and east of the main road. Oil Company houses were (rows) were mainly of one or two rooms .

In Uphall station Young's company owned 118 of these houses. The family had two boarders in 1891 , David Frost a labourer born in Edinburgh Newington and James Morgan a labourer born Fifeshire Burntisland.

#### Uphall Station

In the vicinity of Uphall Station, Young's Mineral Oil Company own some 118 houses. Beechwood Cottages consist of thirty-four houses, each having room, kitchen, scullery and washhouse, coal-cellar, and dry-closet. There is a small garden in front of these cottages. Gravitation water is got from the washhouse. The refuse is removed weekly from ash-pits. The rent is 3s. 2d. weekly, inclusive of rates.

A bowling green and Institute are good features of the village. In the district of Uphall there are 502 houses, occupied by some 2638 persons.

At the Station Rows there are eighteen houses of two apartments, and two houses of three apartments. There is no scullery or washhouse for twelve of these houses, but coal-cellars, and also dry-closets of a kind, are provided. Refuse is removed weekly from ash-pits. Sewage is disposed of by open channel. The rent is 2s. 5d. and 2s. 11d. per week respectively, inclusive of local and county rates.

When Uncle Sam was married in 1914 he was recorded in the marriage cert. as a retired Engineman.

When we stayed in Broxburn 1954-1959 he stayed in Winchburgh. What he used to say when he was going home and we ( Owen and I ) were going to bed was:

Time for bed said sleepy head,

Time enough said Slow,

Put on the pan said greedy Nan ,

We'll have a feed afore we go.

He died on the 21 st April 1958 at 85 Main Street Winchburgh of a Coronary Thrombosis. Death certificate was signed by his stepson John Irvan.

Location: Railway Dugouts Burial Ground (Transport Farm) is located 2 kilometres south-east of Ieper town centre, on the Komenseweg, a road connecting Ieper to Komen (N336). From Ieper town centre the Komenseweg is located via the Rijselsestraat, through the Rijselpoort (Lille Gate) and crossing the Ieper ring road, towards Armentieres and Lille. The road name then changes to Rijselseweg. 1 kilometre along the Rijselseweg lies the left hand turning onto Komenseweg. The cemetery itself is located 1.2 kilometres along the Komenseweg on the right hand side of the road.

Historical Information: At 2 kilometres west of the village of Zillebeke the railway runs on an embankment, overlooking a small farmstead known to the British Army as Transport Farm. It is a place screened by slightly rising ground to the East, and burials on the site of the cemetery began in April, 1915. They were continued until the Armistice, especially in 1916 and 1917, when Advanced Dressing Stations were placed in the

Dugouts and the farm. They were made in small groups, without any definite arrangement; and in the summer of 1917 a considerable number were obliterated by shell fire before they could be marked. The names "Railway Dugouts" and "Transport Farm" were used indifferently, and both are included in the present name. At the time of the Armistice, 1,705 graves were known and marked. Other graves were then brought in from the battlefields and small cemeteries in the neighbourhoods, and 258 known graves, destroyed by artillery fire, were specially commemorated. The latter were mainly in the present Plots IV and VII. There are now nearly 2,500, 1914-18 war casualties commemorated in this site. Of these, over 400 are unidentified and 261 are represented by special memorials. Other special memorials record the names of 42 soldiers from Canada and 30 from the United Kingdom, buried in other cemeteries, whose graves were destroyed in later fighting. The cemetery covers an area of 16,374 square metres and is enclosed by a rubble wall, except where it borders the pond. VALLEY COTTAGES CEMETERY, ZILLEBEKE, was among a group of cottages on "Observatory Road", which runs Eastward from Zillebeke village. It contained the graves of 111 soldiers from the United Kingdom and Canada. It was in an exposed position during the greater part of the war, and of the graves in it are represented by special memorials in Railway Dugouts Burial Ground. TRANSPORT FARM ANNEXE was about 90 metres South-East of the Railway Dugouts Cemetery, on the road to Verbrandenmolen. The graves in it were removed to Perth Cemetery (China Wall), Zillebeke; but one officer, whose grave was not found, is specially commemorated here.

DEATH OF OLD RESIDENTER.

With the death last week of Mr William Ravie, Pumpherston Road, Uphall Station , at the age of 84, Uphall Station has lost one of it's oldest inhabitants and a well known figure in the locality.

Mr Ravie was born in the parish of bathgate, (an error by whoever ?) and enlisted at Edinburgh on the 1st March 1877 at the age of 21, in the 92nd (Gordon) Highlanders. He spent a great part of his army career abroad, serving nine years in India. The campaigns in which he took part included East Indies / Afganistan : and Cape Colony, for which he was awarded the campaign medal with three clasps and a bronze star. He also took part in the famous march with Lord Roberts from Kabul to Kandahar. It is interesting to note that he served along with Sir Ian Hamilton at Kabul, and when Sir Ian Hamilton visited Redford Barracks on a recent occasion, Mr Ravie went in with the intention of interviewing him, but unfortunately missed him. A happy sequel to this was that through the good offices of Dr Maclardy, Pumpherston, who acquainted Sir Ian with the facts, Mr Ravie received a letter and signed photograph from Sir Ian Hamilton, and this he prized very much.

After his soldiering days Mr Ravie came to reside in Uphall Station. Where he was employed at Young's Oil Co's works until his retirement. Mrs Ravie, who predeceased her husband, was a native of Musselburgh and her brother was the well known professional golfer, Willie Park.

Kabul to Kandahar Star  
9th-31 August 1880.

This bronze star, made from the captured cannon taken in the battle of Kandahar , was awarded to all who had taken part in General Robert's famous march to relieve Kandahar. It is a five pointed star with a ball between the inner angles , except the top one. In the center is the monogram VR1 around which is a circular raised border. In raised lettering on this border are the words KABUL TO KANDAHAR with the date 1880 at the bottom. The reverse is plain with a hollow center .The star is surmounted by a crown to which is attached a ring, 7/10ths in diameter, which holds the typical India pattern rainbow red, white, yellow, white and blue ribbon. There is engraved naming on the reverse, capital letters for British troops and capitals or sloping script for Indian soldiers.

Later, at the head of his men, after strenuous fighting, he gained the final objective. He set a splendid example of pluck and enthusiasm to all ranks.

He had stered in command of a platoon, and, as the advance continued and the officers became casualties, he took command of their platoons also and succeeded in establishing them on the final objective. Later he and one other officer were all that remained after a few hours gas bombardment, and they formed the remaining men into one company. He remained in the gassed area for 35 hours.

He was a typical Scot with a fund of dry humour and shrewd comment that was a perpetual delight to his many acquaintances. He had all the independence of the Scot and suffered no injustices meekly. He feared no man whatever his position and would air his point of view with a frankness which won the respect of all. Especially will be missed among the members of Middleton Hall Bowling Club. Jimmy was a real bowler, a man who played the game for its own sake and for the unmitigated joy he got out of it. His enjoyment was infectious and most vocal. His sallies and comments delivered in senatorial tones as he praised a particularly fine effort or bemoaned the fates that frowned on one not so successful gave the green a colour and atmosphere that contributed to the enjoyment of his fellow members. He was a good player himself and won the championship of the club on at least one occasion, and his travels as a bowler had taken him all round the county where he was known and liked by a vast company of bowlers. This was reflected in the large congregation of mourners at the funeral last Sunday to Mid Calder churchyard where the Rev. T. E. McClements officiated. At the weekly hat-night of the Middleton club on Monday evening, Mr J. Napier made reference to the grievous loss sustained by the club in the passing of a highly respected and most popular member, and expressed the sympathy of the club for Mrs Ravie and family in their sad bereavement.
