Her record of death can be found on page 4 of 1869 Deaths in the Parish of Strathmartine, County of Angus, Scotland; The record states the following:

Janet Steel (widow of John Steel, road laborer) on July 28, 1869 at 1hr. and 15 mins. PM died at Baldovan Village, Strathmartine. Her age is recorded as 75; She was the daughter of Alexander Robertson, Lint Miller, (deceased) and Elizabeth Robertson, ms. Robertson; cause of death was old standing heart disease as cert. by James Christie, M.B.; Informant for this record was Alexander Haggart, son-in-law, present. The death was registered on July 28th, 1869 at Strathmartine, by John Simpson, Registrar.

In the Parish of Strathmartine, County of Angus Scotland the record of marriage can be found on page 1.
On July 24th, 1863 After the bans according to the forms of the Established Church of Scotland; Margaret
Steel who was 41 yrs old and residing at Stillarys, Strathmartine married Alexander Haggart who was
a 60 yr. old widow; agricultural laborer. Margaret was a linen weaver, spinster. Margaret's parents are
recorded as John Steel, road laborer (deceased) and Jessie Steel, ms Robertson. Witness' to this marriage
were John McGregor and Donald Ritchie, Registered by John Simpson, Registrar

Note that Margaret's mother in this record is recorded as "Jessie" where all other records found have her
recorded as Janet Robertson.

Jean Steele married to John Steele; farm laborer; died on August thirteenth 1861;

at the age of 37. She was the daughter of Andrew Wardrop and Jean Wardrop ms. Gilchrist both deceased.

Cause of death looks to be that she died during labor of pregnancy after eighteen hours. John Steele husband present and reported death.

It is worth mentioning that John Steele's wife has been referred to as Jeannie, Jean and Jane Wardrop. Her mother's name is Jean, her record of death provided by her husband, is Jean. Their marriage record is Jane Wardrop; yet no marriage record for Jean Wardrop and John Steele/Steel can be found. Therefore I have chosen to use the name Jean Wardrop in my research instead of Jane Wardrop. Also worth mentioning that no birth or death record has been found for a Jane Steele/Steel ms. Wardrop.

One more point. On her son Andrew's record of death, his mother is listed as Jeannie Steel ms. Paterson. There is no record of marriage between John Steel/Steele and a Paterson. Recently found is a record that lends proof of Jane Wardrop being previously married to a Paterson prior to her marriage to John Steele. Elizabeth Steel's marriage record to John McDermid, has her mother listed as Jane Steel, previously Paterson, ms. Wardrop (deceased). I searched for the marriage record of Jane Wardrop to a Paterson and found it. I have order the record of marriage and will scan it as soon as it is rec'd.

Her mother was Jean Steel; maiden name Wardrope; formerly [unreadable; Paterson?]. Parents marriage written as September 7, 1849 at Neicton [Neilston?] Mearns. They had one boy and one girl living; one girl deceased. According to the 1851 census they had a daughter named Mary.

3. ANDREW CRAWFORD³ STEEL (*JOHN² STEELE, JOHN¹*)^{18,19,20,21,22} was born Abt. 1849 in Parish of Cathcart, Village of Nertherlee, County of Lanark, Scotland, and died May 19, 1910 in Eastern Distric Hospital, Glasgow, Scotland²³. He married AGNES HODGE^{24,25,26} November 24, 1874 in Parish of Hamilton, County of Lanark, Scotland, daughter of JAMES HODGE and CHRISTINA WILSON. She was born Abt. 1846 in Hamilton, Lanark, Scotland, and died March 11, 1913 in Eastern District Hospital, Glasgow, Scotland²⁷.

Notes for ANDREW CRAWFORD STEEL:

Andrew was most likely named after his Grandfather, Andrew Wardrop. Andrew's father's last name is documented as Steele, while all documents found on Andrew are Steel. My Grandmother, who was the Granddaughter of Andrew Steel had spelt her name as Steele on her marriage license. See notes on Christina Wilson Steel b. 03/16/1908. Her sisters also used the spelling of Steele. It has been suggested that when people left and returned to the Church the spelling changed slightly, such as adding or dropping the "e" off Steel. Other

explanations are that singular type of spelling for a name was not a priority. It wasn't until bureaucracy came into play that a singular type of spelling for a family name is found more frequent.

We would like to thank our researcher in Scotland for all the wonderful documentation he has provided on this individual and other Steel family members.

In the 1851 Census rec'd today (06/18/04) from Scotland; Andrew is found with his parents in the village of Netherlee:

My Granddaughter's middle name is Steel to continue the family association. She was the first female child born after the death of my Grandmother. She therefore was given the maiden name of my Grandmother, Christina Wilson Steel[e].

According to the 1891 Census, Parish of Barony, County of Lanark:

Andrew was 41; Agnes was 43 ; John was 16 ; Jeanie was 11; Lizzie was also 11; James was 9 ; Agnes was 5 ; and Margaret was 3 . Occupation given for Jeanie, Lizzie and James was Scholar. Their address at the time was 38 Little Milton, in Dennistoun, Glasgow District, County Lanark, Scotland. Andrew's birthplace is given as Renfrewshire, Cathcart; Agnes' is given as Lanarkshire, Hamilton; and all the children have Lanarkshire, then John - Bothwell; Jeanie and Lizzie - Rutherglen; James - Bothwell; Agnes - Barony; and Margaret - Old Monkland. Andrew's occupation was given was Ploughman.

According to the 1901 Census, Burgh of Glasgow, County of Lanark, Andrew age 52 and Agnes age 55 children living at home were Agnes H. age 15 and Margaret age 13. They were living at 102 Garngadhill, Dennistoun, County Lanark, Scotland. It looks as if Andrew's occupation is given as Carter, while Agnes H. was a Book Folder, and Margaret was a Scholar. There was also one boarder in the household by the name of John McDerimid age 20. This boarder would have actually been the nephew of Agnes and Andrew Steel. Also, living next door was William McDonald.

Parish of Glasgow, Application for Relief 1910--Provided by Researcher John McCreddie, Glasgow, Scotland.

Andrew Crawford Steel filed an application for relief right before his death in 1910. This application is six pages long and filled with information. Too much information to put into this format. It lists all of his children and where they were living at the time this application was filed. It gives his parents names, wife and her parents and years married. Lists accidents and types of injuries or disabilities he has incurred. Also mentions his sister Elizabeth and James McDerimid. Confirms much of the information already found. These pages will not be scanned as other documents. If anyone would like copies, contact me.

Register of Death: 1910 District of Garngadhill, County Lanark, page 98; line 293:

Andrew Crawford Steel, carter, married to Agnes Hodge, died May 19, 1910, age 61, 55 Garngad Ave., Glasgow, John Steel listed as father and Jeanie Steel, ms. Paterson; Cause of Death-capillary bronchitis, cardiac failure. Informant- Lizzie Steel, daughter, present. Lizzie gave the information on the maiden surname of Jeanie Steel as Paterson. [A recent find of documents state that Jane Wardrop was married to James Paterson prior to her marriage to John Steel.]

The only picture our family has of my great great grandfather's, Andrew C. Steel, headstone taken in Glasgow Scotland was given to me by a cousin who is now deceased.

The following words are engraved:

ANDREW C. STEEL Beloved Husband of AGNES HODGE WHO DIED 19TH MAY 1910, AGED 61 YEARS. SLEEP ON BELOVED SLEEP AND TAKE THY REST. LAY DOWN THY HEAD UPON THY SAVIOR'S BREAST. WE LOVED THEE WELL BUT JESUS LOVES THEE BEST GOOD NIGHT

We have located the cemetery where both Agnes and Andrew Steel are buried. John McCreddie in Scotland has gone to the cemetery and photographed the stones. Unfortunately, the stone for Agnes Hodge Steel and Andrew Crawford Steel is no longer there. The only stones still standing and legible are the McDerimid stones.

A researcher in Scotland did send me this obituary found in the local Glasgow paper.

Evening Citizen Thursday 19 May 1910.

"STEEL - At 55 Garngad Ave. on 19th. inst. Andrew C. Steel after a lingering illness - Funeral Saturday 3pm. Friends please accept of this (the only) intimation."

Listed in the family bible records of Margaret Drysdale Steel Sterret and passed on to me by her son, James Sterrett in May 1990.

Regarding the picture of Agnes Hodge listed on my home page...This email was received as an answer to an inquire I had made regarding the studio:

Hi Debra,

I did not have the information in my data but I went to our city library and found it in a book of photographers. Benjamin Wohlgermuth had a business 1877 - 1888.

The business then became Wohlgermuth & Co 1888-1896.

As that is the name on the photograph, then it must have been taken between those dates. 1888-1896.

The clothes almost looked 1900.

That was my guess before found the details.

In the Ellis Island Research site, I found Agnes Steel arrived at Ellis Island on September 6,1910. (Note,her husband Andrew had died only five months previously.) She arrived with daughter Elizabeth, on ship Furnessia (manifest passenger list) which had departed from Glasgow, Scotland. Reason given: To be with sons, John and James Steel in Hocking Iowa. Agnes gave age as 55, married female. Ethnicity is given as Britain, Scot. Her usual place of residence ..Glasgow, Scotland. Her place of birth was Glasgow, Scotland.

Note: The Furnessia was built by the Shipbuilding Company, Varrow-in-Furness, England, 1880. It was 5,495 tons; 445 feet long; 44 feet wide. Compound Engine, single crew. Service speed 14 knots. 1359 passengers (242 first class, 136 second class, 981 third class). Built for Anchor Line, British flag, in 1880 and named Furnessia. Glasgow-New York service. Scrapped in England in 1911.

GRO Records: page 117 of the 1913 death records in the District of Dennistoun, in the Burge of Glasgow: Agnes Steel, widow of Andrew Crawford Steel, Carter (Cleansing Department); died March 11, 1913 at 10 h. 45 min A.M. at Eastern District Hospital, her residence was 34 James Nisbet Street; she was a 66 year old female; her parents were James Hodge, coal miner (deceased) and Christina Hodge m.s. Wilson (deceased); cause of death was Cardiac disease, chorea. Nephew Stephen H. Hodge was the informant.

Our concerns are the fact that Elizabeth is never found with our John and Jean Steel (Steele) and that the occupations given for her father, John Steel, do not match what is found for our John Steel."

To set the record straight once again...this is getting to be a common occurrence in dealing with that individual's research; First of all, this person is using the possessive form of we in stating "our John and Jean Steel". There is no "our" in her case, she bears no relationship to our family. Secondly, John Steel[e] listed above has had the following occupation listed in records we have found: Calico Painter and Calico printer.

Now, if you take the energy to make such statements, you may as well take the energy to do a little research on the occupations of Scotland listed on these records. The term Calico painter is also a term used for house painter. (Which in the 1851 census does state such.)

We have not found the birth record of Andrew Steel, but have plenty of documentation that he was the son of John Steel and Jane Wardrop. Is this same researcher not totally convinced [not that it her opinions matter] that he is indeed the son of John Steel and an ancestor of this family? Ridiculous isn't it. Yet remarks like those are common on that person's online tree of which our family is listed. A family she has absolutely no connection to other than it is the family of her husband's ex-wife! You be the judge. Please be careful when researching this family with other online trees.

Susan said "they were much nicer homes then the ones in Hocking Iowa". Susan said "they kept them up nicely, two bedrooms with a kitchen and living room. Was a perfect fit for John and his 14 year old son."

[Author's note: I was moved by an article sent to me by a former coal miner and friend of my great grandfather's family. I have a deep respect for those individuals who have the courage to travel under ground daily as their profession requires, in mining. It may not have been the most attractive profession, however it was one that required a great deal of courage and discipline. Read a part of this article referenced below.]

In an article published January 20,1974 Des Moines Sunday Register states the following:

"The hey day for Iowa coal mining has long been over. Coal was discovered in Iowa in 1835, but it wasn't until 1849 that the first mine opened. And surprisingly, Iowa--famous for its agricultural commodities-- is said once to have ranked first among states west of the Mississippi River in commercial coal production. That ranking lasted 26 years." 86 year old "Mike DellaBetta of Chariton states "I've still got my tools--drills and picks," he said with a smile." "now I think I may have to go back in the coal mine again." "Harold Carter, 55, supervisor of the Big Ben Coal Mine near Williamson makes the following statements.." "Being a miner is not an attractive profession among today's young people and the only school for miners is experience." DellaBetta and Harold Ashley, 62 of Des Moines, said, work at the mines tended to be seasonal--mostly coming during winter months when local demand for coal was greatest. Then there were the hardships of trying to form a mine workers' union, and effort that was led by the famous John L. Lewis, a native of the Iowa coal community of Lucas. But, despite hardships, todays miners and former miners share a special fondness for the profession."

Spending a great deal of time with other miners in mining camps, Grandfather picked up the habit of drinking. Well, one particular night, John Steel stayed up drinking most of the night. In the morning he told his daughter, Margaret, "I'm going to church this morning and getting right with God". Margaret exclaimed, "Oh you are not". Sure enough, John Steel headed off to church that morning and never touched another drink of alcohol.

Susan stated that Grandfather would not even touch soda if it came in a bottle.

So in 1906, he gathered his wife, Christina Steel, and their young daughter, Agnes Hodge McDonald, along with Christina's sister, Jeannie, and Thomas' nephews, James Stewart and George McDonald Stewart, and headed for the "new world." The ship was bound for Quebec (which is why they do not show up in the Ellis Island Immigration records) and arrived at the end of April, 1906.

My grandmother, Jeannie Steel(e), lived in Glasgow, worked on a dairy farm in Paisley. According to my grandfather George McDonald Stewart, she moved to Lennoxtown to work for McDONALD Family at their dairy as a milk maid. My grandfather's mother was the daughter of George and Jane McDonald. Jane was a McMillan who's parents were the former owners of the dairy. George McDonald Stewart and his brother Jim came to Canada, entering at Montreal in 1906. His aunt Jean Lieshman nee (McDonald) was living in Walkerville on Monmouth Rd. She had come out in the late 1890's and her husband Andy worked for Canadian Bridge where his father was a foreman. I would assume that after my grandfather became established he journeyed to Iowa to get Jeannie. They were married in a double ringed ceremony in 1908 with his brother Jim and Mary Campbell (King).

Notes for GEORGE MCDONALD STEWART:

George MacDonald Stewart was born November 5, 1884, 10:20 P.M. at the home of his parents who lived in the

apartment above Boccuck's Store on Main Street. He had one older brother, James, born December 31, 1882 at 4:00 A.M. His mother Janet Mc Donald died January 3, 1885 and his father, James, died the following year, January 11, 1886. The responsibility of raising the two orphans was left to the mother's parents who owned the Lennoxtown Dairy. They were George and Jean McMillan McDonald. The McDonalds had four children in addition to Janet. They were Jean, Angus (whose son was Captain Angus Jr. of the Royal British Navy), James (who died young), and Tom. As George and Jean McDonald had to run the dairy during the early years of George's life, his grandparents were forced to board him with John Miller at Hallersley's land, Campsie (the same people who boarded his father when he first came to Lennoxtown).

He attended public school up in the Cross Hill on the right side of the road just before the bend going to Jamie Wright's Well. His last few years of schooling were spent at the new school located opposite the old graveyard where his parents were buried.

His grandparents (McDonalds) were buried in the new graveyard located behind the Presbyterian Church.

George was a member of the Junior choir in this church and he related the time he broke a strike being conducted by the Senior Choir by walking in the church saying to the Senior Choir, standing outside, that he would sing himself if they refused to follow. As he walked down the aisle towards the choir loft, the Senior Choir followed. Instead of proceeding up to the loft, he turned at the row delegated to his family and sat down. The Senior Choir continued on to the choir loft.

I asked Grandpa if he knew the people who lived at the Lennox Castle, as they were originally of Stewart (Royal) descent. He said he knew them, they had their place in the front of their church as was the custom (according to class)

On Sundays, after church, the kids would often go to the Cross Hill. Before climbing up, they would gather a stone. When they reached the top, they would place it in a pile located there. These piles of stones may still be located there. On weekends, the town's children would come out to the dairy to ride the donkey. If the donkey became angry, he would dump the kids in a nettle patch next to the wooden print mill fence.

Early Sunday morning it was George's job to take the two wheel cart and horse to Lensie located south of Kirkintilloch where he would pick up the choir master who would arrive there by train, as he lived in Glasgow. He also made the same trip for the Thursday evening choir practice. As a boy, he often went to the little streams in the area where they caught small trout by hand. They would lift the rocks and logs under which the trout rested on sunny days and would grab them as they scooted away.

The living quarters were located at the west end of the dairy. Twenty-six cows were in the east end. This building is now the clubhouse for the Black Watch Soccer Team. There was a hole in the wall at the west end of the dairy where people would come to pick up milk and butter. There was an indentation in the wall, which was used for a bed by George. Behind the dairy was a small building which held six cows that Janet McDonald, George's grandmother, always milked. As a child, one of George's jobs was to milk the cows again after the first milking. Daily, George would deliver milk to the townspeople by carrying it in two pails hanging from a board on his shoulders. He had a dipper, which he used to measure the milk taken from the pails.

In the center of the dairy property was the print mill. It was enclosed by a wooden fence. The cow dung produced by the dairy cattle was used to set the dye in the calico patterns made there.

Grandfather George McDonald had the job of hitching his horses to the railway cars and pulling them in and out of the Print Field Property. Every Saturday, he and his three friends would take the horses and buggy up the Hawkeed Road around through Torrance and back home. On the way they would stop at friends and various pubs for socializing. The horse was also used for delivering milk and would automatically stop at the proper place, just as he did when on his milk run during the week. George McDonald recalled, one day when the old boys returned home, young George was asked to put the horse and buggy away by one of his uncles. Since young George had to deliver his milk in the town, he asked his grandfather to put the horses away. Old George, still feeling good, was found the next morning, under the bull, in a stall, with a bottle of spirits in hand. Apparently, he kept an extra bottle in the bull feed bag, a place where his wife Jean would not venture. That morning George was whipped by the uncle for not putting the horse away as he was told. The next evening when his uncle punched the time clock at the print mill gate he was greeted by Grandpa and young George. The old man raised his cane and proceeded to beat him over the head while repeating the words, "You who would harm an orphan boy".

George served his apprenticeship (carpenter) working for contractor John Mc Lucky in Lennoxtown. They made caskets, cabinets, and wagon wheels in addition to general home contracting. George worked here from the ages of 12 to 13, at which time he boarded on the Campsie Row and the Crox Road. There were two Muire Coal Mines at Lennoxtown, one located at the present area of the Aluminum Works and the other in the Campsie Fells. When George MacDonald Stewart worked for Mc Lucky, they had a contract to repair the carts used for transporting the ore in these mines. George recalls them taking the lime from the Campsie Fells and working it. Tells how they would place a layer of brush, a layer of limestone, a layer of brush, a layer of limestone and so on until they had about eight layers. This would all be placed in a deep hole with vents in the sides of the hole to let the smoke out. Then it was set on fire and the lime was drawn for use by the plasterers.

The last year of his apprenticeship, he worked for Jack Mc Millan, a relative of his mother. He boarded at Jack's sister's home on Brewery Lane, Dunbarton. Jack Mc Millan was a boss in the shipyard in Dunbarton. At this time he worked as a cabinet maker on Sir Thomas Lipton's famous yacht, Shamrock, which lost the Americans in the America's Cup.

When George completed his apprenticeship, he took two years of night school and trained to build buildings up to four floors. He took pride that he could figure a job such as a school or a church and order all the materials correctly.

In 1906 George MacDonald Stewart came to Canada with his older brother Jim, his uncle Tom MacDonald, wife Christine "Teenie" nee Steele and their daughter Agnes Hodge MacDonald(1902) who later Married Clare Goodrich. Agnes had her 4th birthday on the boat also accompanying them was Jean "Jeannie" Steele Christine's sister, who George would later marry on Sept 29,1909.

He went into the construction business , working on buildings like the new post office on Ouelette Ave and a number of schools and churches. He built his house at 1133 Monmouth and helped build his brother Jim's house across the street at 1148 Monmouth. George finished off his attic, making it into an apartment. It could then be used by his relatives as they came to Canada. He built a number of cottages at Linden Beach and homes in the Walkerville and Windsor areas.

After working as a contractor, putting in the railway underpass at Droillard and Wyandotte, and the tunnel from the river to plant 6 at Ford Motor Co., he was offered a permanent job by Ford's chief engineer as supervisor over the mill rights. This was in approximately 1929, since the depression was on he took it. While at this job he claimed to have memorized the piping layouts in all the Ford buildings and any deviations from the normal he had in his little black note book. He was able to determine if changes were possible right from his desk.

George played for the Walkerville soccer team. They competed in a league with teams in Detroit. The teams they played against were, Sons of England, Thistles, Packers, Sons of Scotland, and the Old Scots. They won the Michigan Cup in 1909. Members of the team he could remember when he was 89 years old were Andy Leishman, Tom Crosby, Tom Telford (right wing), and Vic Bowman. George played center half.

He recalled the last year he played, the Walkerville team signed an agreement to split the gate at Packard Park in a five game play down. They played before massive crowds and were paid only four dollars, so he quit playing. He said "Work comes first, play second". He said he gave the cup to one of his daughters, Betty or Jessie. He received a gold medal of which the girls made into a broach.

He built his house at 1133 Monmouth and his older brother Jim's house across the street at 1335 Monmouth.

For relaxation he spent most of his time at the lawn bowling club at the Bridge Works. He was proud of his lifetime membership given to him for the maintenance and construction contributions he had made to the club.

He was also often seen at the Walkerville high school yard teaching the boys how to kick a soccer ball.

He was a member of the Mason's.

He is remembered for singing his Scottish songs and being there to help his children with their carpentry projects.

Another reseacher is using information on a death certificate to incorrectly validate James' middle name as Hart instead of Hodge. Any researcher who obtains death certificates understands that some of the information may be inaccurate. Unfortunately it is a common occurrence with that particular researcher to take one piece of information as if it is the only valid document. Instead of looking at information as a whole, which is so readily available to all of us. I tend to use the information that was provided by person themself, if available. For instance, on the above applications and certificates for naturalization, James himself gave the information. He should have known his given middle name. Whereas information provided on a death certificate is given by a widow or widower in most cases. Added to the documents that James himself provided information, is that of his daughter's Social Security Application; which states her father's name as James Hodge Steele.

[Author's note: When displaying information on a death certificate, it is not necessary to display on the internet, the full cause of death. For example; one could have stopped with "aneurism of the arch of the aorta" and left out The later part being of no historic value or research value. That information may tend to anger a family of descendants whom have provided you with mounds of information in the past. Unless that was your motivation to do. Not to mention it is in very poor taste. Humiliation of offspring seeing private information plastered on the internet could have been prevented had someone used common sense.]

According to the above document, Hulda was born Abt. 1888. James gave his wife's name as Hulda, which coincides with family records. On the death certificate of James Steele, her name was written as Hilda. In both cases we are not certain if the names were written by the recorder of those documents or the individuals themselves. Which leaves room for error. If those documents were written by recorders, they could have merely written how they heard the word. It's hard to believe that James would record his wife's name incorrectly, or that she would record her own name incorrectly.

Typically certificates of death and information given by the informer, are not written by the informer. More often the questions are asked and written by another party. In contrast; the application for Naturalization are typically filled out by the party requesting the application.

In the 1895 Census of Scott Iowa we have found Hilda Bell, four years old.

According to the step grand daughter of Hilda, Hilda remarried to a man by the name of Joseph Liddicoat. Hilda died in McGrew Nebraska in May of 1967; Joseph died later in Iowa. It was after Hilda's death that Edna and husband John moved from Nebraska to Texas.

Thanks to the very kind people of Scottsbluff Nebraska, we were sent the obituary for Hilda. That obituary has been scanned and is listed under her name on our Homepage.

Your mother was born on December 5th, 1866 and Aunt Agnes was born October 4th, 1864. So your mother's age would have been 64 last December. I have sent two pictures to Agnes and I am sending two to yourself. One is you were a baby and the other is also taken as a baby but it's the fourth generation of you Steel family. I know you would like that picture as it is yourself (your Father) your grandpa (Andrew Steel) and your great grandfather Steel. I know you loved your grandpa Steel, Margaret and that should be a very interesting photo to you. I told my mother we would send it to you. We will look at my father's stuff and find you a little keepsake of ??.

I have been looking all the shops to see those dolls with the ? (pud) body. There aren't many here now of the kind but I saw them in a big place in the town, called the Argyle Arcade. Your Father would remember it. There are a lot of swell shops in it. Donald got Susan's letter today and he will write to her himself. Agnes sent Jackie's letter photo to mother. You know Margaret, my mother has always loved Agnes since she brought her up like her own since she was five months old till she was 17 years. She was a good mother to us both and I'm sure Agnes realises that now. I have still got the four boys and hope that is them all now. The baby is 3 years in May and they are all wild as I don't know what. You say we got the big men you and I. John is nearly 6 feet and I am pretty big myself 5ft.6 inches. I always thought you would be tall yourself. I will close now and will write you very soon. Aunt Agnes isn't fit to write to anyone as she is an invalid now. She shakes all over all the time with nerves. I gave Annie your address and she promised to write. I will get a doll just as soon as I can but you know the heads are china and how would you get it without being broken? I got all birth dates in the family bible. Your mother was married June 1898. Write soon love to all. From your loving cousin Lottie.
