

# *Descendants of William Faris*

## *Generation No. 1*

1. WILLIAM<sup>1</sup> FARIS was born August 12, 1812 in Ohio, and died February 09, 1880 in Arena, Iowa County, Wisconsin. He married LOUISA REED Abt. 1832 in Ohio. She was born December 24, 1816 in Ohio, and died July 23, 1880 in Correctionville, Woodbury County, Iowa.

### Notes for WILLIAM FARIS:

William Faris married Louisa Reed about 1832 in Ohio. They're first two boys, Pierson and George were born while living there. By 1840, the family was living in McHenry County, Illinois. While living in Illinois they had three daughters, Lydia, Louisa, and Acena. By 1949 the family had moved to Arena, Iowa County, Wisconsin. Here they had six more children, John, Mary, David and William (twins), Frances, and Paul. The family had always been farmers. According to the 1870 Federal Census, no one in the family could read or write, most had not gone to school. By 1880 William and Louisa had divorced, but they lived on farms next to each other. Pierson was living with his wife and seven children. Louisa was living next to them with her son David. And next to her was John with his wife, three children, and father William.

Through all of the census' the last name was spelled "Ferris". By 1880 it was written "Farris" in Wisconsin. Paul's last name didn't change to "Faris" until the 1900 census in Iowa. Some of the other family members spell their name "Farris".

From the "Dodgeville Chronicle - Friday, February, 13, 1880 - Arena News"

Our community was startled and thrown into considerable excitement early this morning over the announcement that Mr. William Ferris, Sr., better known as "Old Man Ferris", was missing, and shortly after that he been found lying in his back yard, dead. Upon learning the sad news, we, in company with several of our citizens, repaired to the house of the deceased, where we found him, lying upon his face in a small pen some six rods from the house, and from appearances, he had been attending some calves, in doing which he had to get down on his hands and knees to pass through a very low door - not over two and a half feet high - in coming out of which he must have fallen forward upon his face, and apparently died instantly, without a struggle.

In the absence of Justice Meigs, Justice King was notified, who summoned the following jury: Fr. Wm. T. Pinkerton, Wm. C. Meffert, F.G. Villemonte, Timothy Murphy, Geo. W. Standart and Wm. H. Jones, and held an inquest on the body, from which we glean the following facts:

That Mrs Ferris, wife of the deceased, left the house about 9 A.M. yesterday morning on a visit to her oldest son, Mr. Pierce Ferris, living about half a mile distant, and that a friend, Mrs. John Jerdan, called at the house about one hour after, both leaving him in in apparently good health and spirits. That Mrs. F. returned about 4 P.M. and not finding him at home, she concluded he had gone to the marsh a mile or two distant, to cut some wood but upon his not returning she became uneasy and went out to the barn, where she found the stock had not been fed or attended to during her absence. She then went into the house and waited for him to make his appearance, until near daylight this morning when she returned and informed her son of the circumstances, who immediately summoned his brother John, and instituted search, finding him about 7:30 this morning, as above stated.

After examining several witnesses the jury rendered the following verdict:  
"That the deceased, Wm. Ferris, aged about 68 years, came to his death instantly, in a calf pen, on his premises, about one-fourth of a mile north of the village of Arena, between the hours of 10 A.M. Feb. 9, and 7 A.M. Feb. 10, from paralysis of the heart".

Deceased was born in Ohio, and came to Wisconsin 31 years ago, settling near Arena, and was consequently one of our oldest citizens. He leaves a family of nine children - five boys and four girls - all grown to man and womanhood, several of them being respected citizens of this county. He was a member of the Advent Church, and an honest, upright, citizen, respected by all. The funeral will take place at 7 A.M. tomorrow, from the Advent Church.

### PIERSON FARRIS OBITUARY

Pierson Farris of the town of Arena died at his home Sept 4 at the age of 80 years, 4 months and 2 days. The cause of his death was a sudden attack of heart failure. He was born in Ohio on May 2, 1833. On June 17, 1860, he married Miss Lydia Durbin, who survives him after 53 years of married life. The family from this union consisted of seven children, two of whom have proceeded him in death. There are left to mourn the loss of a kind husband and an affectionate father, his wife, and children, William and John W. Farris and Mrs C. Nelson of Arena, Marion of Cassell and David N. of Spring Green. While the loss id felt by all the relatives and family, the bereavement is more closely related to his wife, who has traveled over half a century of life with him. The services were held from the home on Sept. 6 at 1 o'clock. Rev. B.N. Meigs officiated. A large body of friends of the deceased were in attendance and accompanied the remains to the cemetery where interment was made.

#### MARY FARIS ASHMORE OBITUARY

"Mrs. Ashmore Died Monday...Has Attained the Age of Almost Seventy Five Years Before Overtaken by Death.

Mrs. Mary Ashmore, though she has put up a determined effort to get well for several weeks passed into the great beyond last Monday.

Mary Faris was born at Arena, Wisconsin, October 21, 1851, and died at her home in Correctionville, Iowa on March 8th, 1926 at the age of 74 years, 4 months and 17 days. She was united in marriage with W.J. Ashmore Oct. 3rd, 1869, and went with him to Kansas where they took up a homestead upon which they lived six years. In 1875 they moved to Shelby County, Iowa, where they remained three years and then to Ida County where they also spent three years, coming on to Woodbury County in 1881, where they lived on the Ashmore farm in Rock Creek township until Mr. Ashmore's death in 1914. Mrs. Ashmore then came to Correctionville which was her home until the time of her death, following an illness of about six weeks.

Mrs. Ashmore was the mother of nine children, and all of them survive her except one son, E.E. Ashmore, who died in 1920. They are Mrs. C.E. Fitch and Mrs. A.T. Bentley of Correctionville, Mrs. Albert Croxell of Lawton, A.J. Ashmore of Hot Springs, S.D., Mrs. H.E. Wright, Mrs. A.M. Mead and Mrs. B.F. Wright of Correctionville, and G.E. Ashmore of Bronson. There are 27 grandchildren and 8 great grandchildren surviving and also one Brother Wm. Faris of MT. Horeb Wisconsin, and a sister, Mrs. Ida Vance of Mound Valley, Kansas.

Mrs. Ashmore had a well grounded faith in the tenants of the Christian life, having united with the church of her choice as a young girl. She had been a member of the United Evangelical church for 32 years preceding her death. She was primarily a home maker, always devoted to the best interests of those around her and always thoughtful of others even in the midst of her suffering. She repeatedly expressed her willingness and readiness to meet her maker. When unable to drink she whispered her intention of being soon at the Crystal fountain, and passed away with the name of Jesus on her lips, and example to the world of how a Christian can die.

Funeral services were held at the M.E. church in Correctionville Wednesday afternoon in charge of Rev. Hulse and interment was made at the cemetery here.

Paul bought this land April 29, 1884 from the Iowa Railroad Company. (see map)

Sometime between 1905 and 1910, Paul had quit farming and moved to Pisgah, Iowa. He had bought a house and opened his own Blacksmith shop (he had been blacksmithing on the farm). Sarah had a telephone switchboard in the home and worked as an operator for the telephone company. In 1905, their telephone number was "R 5", the R was their ring code and the 5 was their number. Sarah's mother, Julia Law, had moved in with them (Julia had been living with Paul and Sarah's daughter, Evie). They also had hired a servant to live with them and help out with Sarah's mother, Julia, who was 87 years old in 1910.

By 1920, Paul (age 61) and Sarah (age 58) were working for themselves. Paul was a Blacksmith and Sarah was a nurse for a private family.

Paul & Sarah Faris are buried in Magnolia Cemetery: Section 5, row 1. Paul was the youngest of eleven children.

Pisgah Branch Established.

The Pisgah branch of the Latter Day Saints Church (reorganized) was formed December 6, 1902, with thirty five charter members. The organizers were Frederick A. Smith, minister in charge, H.N. Hansen and Charles Derry; Joseph Lane was elected presiding elder; Charles Vrenderburt, presiding priest; and H.H. Oviatt, presiding

deacon. The present officers are Joseph Lane, presiding elder; John P. Lane, presiding priest; John Shearer, presiding teacher; PAUL FARIS, PRESIDING DEACON; John Vredenburg, financial clerk, and Cora Hoyt, secretary. The present membership is one hundred and fifty two.

Early in the spring of 1901, a church building was commenced and was finished during that summer. Charles Derry of Woodbine preached the first sermon in the new church edifice, Sunday, October 20, 1901. The dedication took place September 21, 1902, Joseph Smith and Charles Derry having charge. The building, lot, and fixtures cost two thousand eight hundred dollars. A fine library has been added for the benefit of the young people of the community. George Eggers is superintendent of the Sunday School which has a membership of one hundred and fifty five. Prior to the building of the church, Sunday School was held in the Jones house, near Pisgah.

Paul Faris Dead

Monday afternoon the town was shocked by the sudden death of Paul Faris. He dropped dead at his home just a few minutes after his return from the hall where he had cast his vote in the town election. He had not been well for some time, but had done some work at his blacksmith shop during the day. His death was caused by heart trouble.

Mr. Faris came to Harrison county in 1874, worked on different farms for a few years and then bought a farm in Allen township about five miles east of the town of Pisgah. There he remained until he moved into the town a few years ago.

He was married February 6, 1877, to Miss Sarah I. Law. To them three children were born, one son, Claude, a resident of Pisgah, two daughters, Mrs. John Lane and Mrs. George Holman, all survive with his wife to mourn his passing. He was not an old man, probably in the middle sixties. He was an honest, hardworking man, a good neighbor and friend, one whose word could be depended upon. The funeral will be held at the L.D.S. church in Pisgah this afternoon and the interment will be in Magnolia cemetery. Elder Joseph Lane will be in charge of the services.

After Paul's death in 1922, Sarah started to sell some of the land in Pisgah. On November 27, 1923 she sold part of lot 1, block 2 to A.D. Townsend. This is probably the land that Paul's blacksmith shop stood on. On Feb. 1, 1937 she sold the rest of their property, the other part of lot 1 and all of lot 2, block 2, to Jessie F. Alwell. Records show that in April, 1943, Sarah was living in Mount Ayr, Ringgold County, Iowa.

Sarah died in 1952. Her headstone has been missing as of November 13, 1999

#### OBITUARY-FARRIS-MARION FARRIS:

The second son of Pierson and Lydia Farris was born in Arena Prairie, Iowa Co., Wisconsin, August 2, 1863 and died at the home of his daughter, Mrs. Roy Reeve at Cassell on August 29, 1932 at the age of 69 years and 27 days. When Marion was a young man his folks moved to Badger Valley, Sauk Co., Wisconsin to the farm later known as the "Abraham Holzer Place". In October, 1886 he was united in marriage with Miss Carrie Sorg. To this union were born eight children, all of whom survive their father. They began housekeeping on the Sorg Farm just west of the Philip Sorg place.

Thirty six years ago they moved to the Abram Pierce Farm at Cassell which they purchased from Edward Talbot. It is this farm that the children remember as home. Four of them were born here and the others were very young when they came to Cassell. The first great sorrow came to this home on Jan., 1906, when death entered and carried away the wife and mother. With great devotion to duty Mr. Farris kept his family together, brought them up, paid his way, and asked no odds of anyone. He lived all his life within a few miles of the place of his birth, so his neighbors had an opportunity to know him well. They remember him as a good friend and neighbor.

In matters involving morals, Marion stood for what is right. He had clearly defined ideas of justice and honesty which he put into practice. He was a deeply religious man who tried to carry out the Savior. While Mr. Farris was a farmer most all his life, he found time to do other things as well. During the winter months, for years, he made axe handles. He became an expert in this work, marketing many hundred axe handles in the surrounding towns.

He dearly loved the outdoor sports of fishing, hunting, fife shooting, and baseball. He was a skilled violinist and was known all of his life for the accomplishment. In recent years. The revival of interest in what is known as "Old Time Fiddler" brought Marion into prominence. He took a large share of the honors on several contests among "old timers." He was then sought by managers of radio stations and his rendition of the "old time music" delighted thousands of listeners in our own town and neighboring states.

On Monday of last week, he indulged in his favorite pastime of fishing. Returning to the Reeve home in the afternoon, exhausted by the extreme heat, he suffered a heart attack, but appeared to recover from it in the evening. The relief was only temporary and he passed away during the night while peacefully sleeping.

He leaves to mourn his departure, four sons; Henry of Spring Green, Evan of Merrillan, Herbert of Roxbury, and Grant of Fifield; Four daughters, Bessie (Mrs. Reeve) of Cassell, Nettie (Mrs Lorenz Tarnutzer) of Paole, Pearl (Mrs. J. Accola) of Sumpter, and Esther (Mrs. John Rindle) of West Point; Two brothers; John of Spring Green, And David of Madison; one sister, Louie, (Mrs. Charles Nelson) of Highland; Eighteen grandchildren and many other relatives and friends. He has cone from our midst, leaving an enviable record of honesty, sobriety, neighborliness, clean living and Christian character. May his life be an inspiration to others to follow his example in living a good life. Sympathy is extended the bereaved.
