Here is the Will of Ann Garratt found by researcher Tony Poole in the Bristol Records Office in January of 2008:

Will of Ann Garratt (Burgess) in 1804

In the Name of God Amen

I, Ann Garrett, of the Parish of Bedminster in the County of Somerset, Widow, being in a bad state of health but of sound mind Make this to be my last Will and Testament in the following manner, first, I Will and Direct that all My Debts with my Funeral Expenses be first paid by my Executrix hereinafter Named, out of such Money, Bill, or Bonds that shall be left to me at my Decease and After That is paid, I Will and Direct that all Money, Bill, and Bonds that shall be due to Me at My Decease Shall be Divided and shared among My Dear Children in the following manner, that is to say one part to my Daughters Mary Ann, Sarah, Ann, and Elizabeth Burgess, and to my Sons Moses Rogers and Robert Burgess one part each, that is to say, to share and share alike. I Give and Bequeath to my Daughters Ann and Elizabeth Burgess all my household goods and furniture with all my wearing apparell of every kind Whatsoever each to Share and Share Alike as to Lot or to what my Executrix Mite Order or Appoint. I likewise give to my son Henry the Rev. John Bunyon's Works and to his Daughter, Ann Garrett, the Silver Cream Jug and Silver Sugar Tongs, and to Robert Burgess the Rev. John Wesley's bible in three parts, and to Elizabeth Burgess the Rev. John Wesley's New Testament and my Mourning Ring, and to Ann the small Bible in two parts, and likewise my watch, and to Moses Rogers the Rev. James Harvey's works and the gold sleeve buttons, and I do hearby Nominate, Constitute, and Appoint my daughter Mary Ann Sole Executrix of this my Last Will and Testament, and I hearby do declare this to be my Last Will and Testament, and I hearby put my hand and seal this third day of May eighteen hundred and four.

At the Request of the said Ann Garrett, widow, and in the presence of each other, We subscribed our names as witnesses hereto, and it was decided by said Ann Garrett to be her Last Will and Testament.

AnnBurgess' daughter, Ann, and son, John, are not mentioned in the will, so perhaps they died young.

She was born Dec 1781 in St. Peter's Parish, Hereford, Herefordshire, England.

Notes for MOSES ROGERS GARRATT ~:

After we found that William Henry Garratt's first appointment was in Hereford, Herefordshire, evidence that Moses Rogers Garratt was the father of William Henry Garratt was located by genealogist Henry Garratt (no proved relation) from parish records that he owns or has access to. This information was confirmed by the microfiche version of the IGI at the Rochester FHC, which lists the baptism of a William Henry Garratt in March of 1808 to Moses Rogers Garratt and his wife Suzannah. Two younger sons were also found in this manner. This was the first William Henry Garratt that I have found, in England, born in this year.

Genealogist Eleanor Harris then found the following:

The 1851 Census of Herefordshire has been indexed. There was only one Garratt family in the City of Hereford.

As you may know, I am the owner of a private index to the Diocese of Hereford & Deanery of Hereford Probate Records 1700-1858. I have searched my Index for the period 1700-1858 & there was only one item for a Garratt of the City of Hereford. I have looked at this Will for you & the details are as follows:

As you may know, the Herefordshire Family History Society has been indexing the Burial Registers 1813-1839. The project is almost finished. The Hereford Record Office holds copies of each completed Index. However, only four of the six parishes of the City of Hereford have been completed. I searched the four available Indexes - in the hope of finding some Garratt entries. Unfortunately, there were none.

The two parishes which have not been indexed for the period 1813-1839 are Hereford St John the Baptist & Hereford St Martin. On a later occasion, perhaps you would like me to search the Burial Registers for any Garratt burials.

The last search which I did was of the 1826 Poll Book for the City of Hereford.

On 23 May 1808, Moses Garratt of Hereford, yeoman was admitted as a Freeman of the City of Hereford - by marriage to Susan Gough, the eldest daughter of William Gough.

MOSES GARRATT

I have now done the search for the baptism of this chap, having decided to cover the period 1783 to 1788 inclusive, allowing for a little error in his birthdate, and for a possible late baptism.

The list of churches is as follows. In one or two cases the original registers have been lost or destroyed, but I was able to cover some of these gaps by using the Bishops' Transcripts (contemporary copies sent by the vicar each year to the Bishop, on loose sheets of parchment, some of which of course have also got lost!).

Having no clues I just tackled them in alphabetical order – except for St Mary Redcliffe which someone else was hogging the whole morning.

The search took me 2 hours. By then I had searched 20 of them, and found only one baptism of a child named Garrett – a Hannah Garrett, daughter of Julius and Ann, baptised on 21 Apr 1783. I felt this could well have been a sister of your Moses, but the way things turned out I reckon she is probably a cousin.

However, finally I got hold of the St Mary Redcliffe register and it was with great relief that I finally hit some paydirt!

28 Aug 1788 Moses Rogers son of John & Ann Garrett baptised born 7 Nov 1785

We were a bit lucky here because Moses' baptism was delayed for almost three years after his birth – even my fairly wide search margin nearly missed him.

Having found Moses, I widened my search of the St Mary Redcliffe register to pick up any obvious siblings. The full list I found is as follows, which I hope is useful for your purposes:

#### MARRIAGE of JOHN & ANN

The Bristol, S. Gloucestershire & North Somerset Marriage Index (1754-1837) lists these two entries of men named Garratt/Garrett marrying an Ann. Here are the details of the register entries

St Stephen 26 Jul 1758 John Garratt and Ann James both of this parish were married by Licence  
St Mary Redcliffe 11 Oct 1772 John Garratt and Ann Burges both of this parish were married by Licence

It seemed possible at this stage that these were both of the same man, perhaps remarrying after being widowed. So I ordered the Licence documents which usually give such details (copies of these accompany this report). Normally there are two documents for each one, the Bond and the Allegation by the parties that they were legally able to marry.

The first of these, dated 25 July 1758, shows that John Garratt of St Stephen, Bristol, and William Hucklebridge of St John, put up a bond of one thousand pounds - a huge sum equivalent to perhaps half a million pounds today) to guarantee the wedding, to be forfeited if the wedding did not take place because of any irregularity. The parties were named John Garratt and Ann James (spinster) of St Stephen, Bristol. John's marital status was not given, and no Allegation survives.

The second was dated 25 Aug 1772, between John Garratt and William Pritchard of St Michael, Bristol, was also for £1000. It guaranteed the legality of the marriage between John Garratt and Ann Burges of the parish of St Mary Redcliffe, spinster. Again the groom's marital status is not stated. But in this case the Allegation has survived, and it states that John Garratt, Anchorsmith of St Mary Redcliffe is aged 21 years and upwards and is a Bachelor, and Ann Burgess is also twenty one or more, and a spinster.

This seems to clear up any doubts – the two Johns are different men, and it seems likely that Moses was the son of the younger one. It's unlikely that the John & Ann (James) would still be having children 30 years after the wedding!

#### WILL of ANN GARRATT

I looked for a Will of Moses' father, but could not find one in the indexes. However I did find one by his mother written in 1804 and proved in 1808 – see the copy coming along with the marriage documents. This shows that her husband had died before 1804, and names 6 of her children (Mary Ann, Sarah Ann, Elizabeth Burges, Moses Rogers, Robert Burges and Henry). Ann and John do not show up, so maybe these had died young. Robert I don't seem to have found in the baptism register but maybe I missed him. Anyway, I am sure you will find this useful.

#### OTHER RESOURCES

Now there are a number other Garrett wills in the Bristol Record Office indexes dating back to 1598, and also

several mentions of Garratts in the Poll Books (=electoral rolls), Burgess Rolls (awards of Freedom of the City) and apprentice registers. I have a feeling that most of these refer to this family. However I did nothing further at this point since I didn't want to run away with your budget without consulting you. But if you are interested I think there is a lot of useful information tucked away on this family.

In the 1881 Census, I found a Richard Garratt, 71 years old, living in Tupsley, Hereford, England with his wife, also 71, Jane Garratt, her child, Jane Birchley, a widow, 44 years old, and Jane's grandchildren, William, 20, a butcher; Annie, 18; Frank, 14; Earnest, 12; Jane, 10; Percy, 8; Septimas, 6; Millicent, 5; and a servant girl. Richard is a retired decorator, whatever that means. The grandchildren were all born in Kyre, Worcester, England, and Jane was also born in Worcester.

Notes for SUSAN GARRATT:

Strangely, there is a Susan Garratt or Hull of the right age living in Galveston Texas in the 1880 census. She is the mother-in-law of a sea captain and is from England. I don't know if this is our Susan, my four-times-great aunt, but how interesting if this was the reason for first E.D. and then George Henry to migrate there. It's always better to move where there are relatives.

#### *Generation No. 5*

5. WILLIAM HENRY<sup>5</sup> GARRATT ~ (*MOSES ROGERS<sup>4</sup>, JOHN<sup>3</sup>, JOHN<sup>2</sup>, HENRY<sup>1</sup>*) was born Bef. 18 Mar 1808 in All Saints Parish, Hereford, Herefordshire, England, and died Bef. 1881. He married JANE WATTS ~ 03 Jun 1828 in Bedminster, Bristol, Somerset, England, daughter of JOHN WATTS and SARAH DAVIS. She was born 02 Oct 1808 in Bristol, Somerset, England, and died 20 Aug 1882 in Annan, Dumfriesshire, Scotland.

Notes for WILLIAM HENRY GARRATT ~:

William Henry Garratt was first found in the 1861 Annan Scotland Census. We weren't sure he was of our family, but his was the only Garratt family in Annan. After we noticed that he had a son, Edward Garratt, who was of the proper age to be George Henry's uncle, E.D. (Ed) Garratt, we really got interested. WHG's occupation was listed as Ride Officer, Excise, which we later found out was an Excise (Tax) officer. WHG's age was 53 at the time of the 1861 Census and he and the family were living on Butts Street in Annan. In the 1851 Census he was listed as living alone in Annan (again on Butts Street) and Jane and the children were still in Northumberland (English friend Henry Garratt found them for me). In the 1871 Census, none of the family seems to be in Annan-- and this is after my going though it several times, but they may have been visiting family elsewhere. In 1881, Jane Garratt was listed as a Excise officer's widow, living with her daughter Caroline (Garratt) Baxter and Caroline's husband, William Baxter, and two children of C&W's. So WHG died between 1861 and 1881.

We then found a William Garratt who married a Jane Watts in Bristol (at Bedminster Cathedral) in 1828, and these are undoubtedly our great-grandparents, for WHG's first child was born in 1829 in Bristol. We have documented 10 children after that, one every two years, except for one gap, in 1831, where there is a missing child who might have died or been out of the house already by 1861. That would make 12 children, and George Henry would have made the 13th. I will try to find the birth of that missing 12th child. [The missing child, Jane, was found--she was born in 1831, most likely in Bristol. So we have them all.]

More recently we found, through genealogist Ian Waller, that William Henry Garratt had joined the Excise Service in Hereford, Herefordshire, which isn't too far away from Bristol. His initial appointment was on March 25, 1830. Finally we had a place to look for WHG's birth, and there he was, being christened on March 18, 1808, just the year I had calculated from his declared ages on various census. His father and mother were also found as were two younger brothers, Henry and John. Friend Henry Garratt, again, located this information for me, and I confirmed it in the IGI microfiche at the local FHC and through a Hereford genealogist. [Henry also found WHG's possible grandfather and mother and three uncles, although since Henry's father Moses Rogers Garratt was not born in Herefordshire, we have doubt of this last information.]

Finally, I got a copy of the All Saints Parish, Hereford, Herefordshire records from our local FHC, and on Aug 10, 2002, saw for myself the baptismal record for WHG on the proper date. I have those records reserved, and will search for WHG's siblings later. The church records, written by a church transcriber, have the name as "Garret," but that doesn't matter much, since no Garratt wrote them.

We have proof of 11, and know nothing else about her yet, but it is enough.

We finally found the mother of George Henry Garratt, Mary Ann Garratt, (daughter of WHG and Jane Watts) in Manchester--in 1859, not 1857--having George Henry Garratt in the proper month, although it was on the 17th, not the 14th or the 16th as our family histories variously reported. We believe Mary Ann's statement because she signed the birth certificate, and being from a middle class family, and having been earlier listed as a scholar in the 1851 Census, she would have been able to read. A local Manchester researcher, Judith Moore, who found her, spent some time looking for any sign that Mary Ann had married in Manchester, or had worked as a dressmaker or any other documented occupation (there aren't many for women at the time), and there was no evidence of those options. She was either abandoned in her pregnancy, or the father died before they could get married, and then she traveled to Manchester to stay with someone until the baby was born. Since she did not list the father's name on the birth certificate, we can assume nothing but that she did not want the father's name publicized. We do assume that George Henry was taken back to Annan at some early point to be raised by his grandparents--because he said so. However, in the 1861 Census he is not listed at his grandparents house, and we have not been able to find him or his mother at one of her sister's houses either, so perhaps they were still in Manchester, although Judith Moore did not find them there. In 1871 none of the Garratt family is to found in the Annan Census--we don't know where they were--but GHG was probably with them. Mary Ann is not to be found in England in the 1881 census, so she must have married, died young, or immigrated. Subsequent DNA testing of Uncle Dick shows some closeness to two surnames: Spencer and Boyd. There were many young men named Spencer in Annon at the time of Mary Ann's pregnancy, but no Boyds. So we may be Spencer's after all. No way to tell.

The 1900 Census lists E.D.'s birthplace as Scotland, his birth month as June, and his age as 50. But stranger things than this have been explained away.

Family history says that "George Henry Garratt grew up in Annan, Scotland, but was born in Manchester on October 14, 1857. He was the youngest of 13 children." The burial certificate says he was born on October 12th, however, and the same person, Ava Garratt, wrote both the history and gave the information on the certificate. Birth records in Manchester, England say that the only George Henry Garratt born in this month around this time was born on October 17th, 1859--although this may be his baptismal date. His mother recorded October 17 as his birthday on November 10th 1859, and I will take her word for it. As for the year, Rosalia Balliman (G.H.'s wife) was born in 1857, and George Henry may not have wanted her to know he was younger by two years--a very gallant lie, I think, if true. George Henry's mother is Mary Ann Garratt, who is the daughter of a William Henry Garratt and Jane (Watts). William Henry was an Excise Officer whose job moved him all over England. He and Jane were married in Bristol, and they seemed to move every two years after that, having a child in each place. We have proof of 11 children, one named Mary Ann, who was born around 1839, and room for at least one more which I have not yet found.

Manchester Mary Ann was not married at the time of George's birth, and she did not declare a father on the birth registration. We surmise that she was sent away to Manchester to have the child. We do not yet know what happened to her after that, but George always said that he was born in Manchester, but raised in Annan as the youngest of 13 children, so after 1861 he must have been taken to Annan to live with his grandparents. In the 1861 Census of Annan, Scotland, there is a William Henry Garratt (53), his wife Jane (52), daughter Sophia (18), who is a dressmaker, daughter Caroline (16), son Edward (12), and daughter Matilda (10). These are the youngest of Jane's and William's children of which we have records. We believe that twelve year-old Edward is George's uncle E.D. Garratt, who moved to Galveston, three years earlier than G.H., in 1875. Mary Ann is not with the family in 1861, although she was in the family in the 1851 Census from Northumberland (when she was 12). In that 1861 Census there is a George H. living with a William Johnstone (30) and his wife Elizabeth (28) and two other young sons. One of the children has been born in England, but it was marked down as the one two years older than George. Family history says that a Captain Johnstone was an uncle, and it was this uncle that GH traveled with when he went to sea for his health and eyesight, and this may be the family, although Elizabeth is not one of WHG's daughters. Susanna is the daughter that would be this age. Could she have had a twin sister? By the time of the 1881 Census, Jane Garratt is living with her daughter Caroline, wife of a William Baxter, and older daughter Sarah is living with her husband William David Douglas (a sea captain). Where was George at this time? In America--he immigrated in 1878.

From Dick Garratt:

"Grandpa Garratt came to Galveston from England possibly sailing from London or maybe that is where Manchester comes into the mix. He had an uncle living in Galveston and he went to work for him. The Uncle's business was supplying ships in the harbor with fresh water. He had drays on which they would haul the water out to the ships. The Uncle was lost in the Galveston Storm of 1900. Your Mom (Margaret Garratt) has a book on that storm. Roy Garratt was 9 years old and he was lifted up by the storm and caught hold of the porch post and held on, flapping in the breeze, until he could be rescued. The family went upstairs and sat out the storm, and they would sit and watch the sea water come up the stairs one step at a time. They watched livestock swim or float by. When the water receded, Roy had to go out and get food at the store or at the shelter, wherever he could find some, and he told me about all the dead bodies laying around in streets and yards. It was the worst hurricane in the history of this country and still has not been topped. I have the Garratt coat of arms also, which I will tell you about in the next installment. I will say that either one of my grandpas or brothers or a family member was knighted and was the Lord Mayor of London, subsequently the coat of arms."

Great Grandpa G.H. Garratt is buried in the Rose City cemetery, Section I, Lot W-1/2 265, Grave 4, and GG Rosalia is at his side.

In the 1880 Census of Galveston, TX, George Henry is living with Sarah and Frank McArthur, who were born in England, and older brother Sam'l, who was born in Scotland. They may have grown up together in Scotland.

The coat of arms: Across the top---the name in a partial circle. Both sides---unidentified scroll work. Center top---full helmet resting on shoulders. Type but setting on the top of a shield with a red plume and three white bee hives--two at top and one centered on the bottom. The shield is white around the edges with a red center in the shape of the shield and the same three bee hives --two on top and one centered on bottom. A partial circle on the bottom with a unknown figure in the center.

The von Buren family (Rosalia's parents): When Switzerland kicked out the ruling family, the von Burens were the Duke and Duchess of ?. There was supposedly no Prince or Princess Regent so they would have been next in line for the throne. They shipped out and came to Galveston Texas, and during the offloading of their belongings the trunk with the family seal and such was lost overboard and to this day evidently lies on the bottom of Galveston harbor."

Rosalia told her daughter-in-law, Ava Garratt, that, from the cemetery on a hill, and wrapped in a feather quilt, she watched Federal ships shelling Galveston Harbor during the Civil War. She could have been no more than seven years old at the time.

Here is one entry from an autograph book of Rosalia Balimann's. Many of the entries are in (Swiss-) German. Rosalia had not yet married Grandpa.

Galveston, November 9th 1880

To Miss Rosa Baliman:

Here is one leaf reserved for me,  
From all thy sweet memorials free;  
And here my simple song might tell  
The feelings thou must guess so well.  
But could I thus, within thy mind,  
One little vacant corner find,  
Where no impression yet is seen,  
Where no memorial yet has been,  
O, it should be my sweetest care  
To write my name forever there!

We have a letter dated January 14, 1907, which tells Rosalia (Frau Garratt Balimann) that she is being sent a small inheritance of 80 Swiss Francs, and that her brothers got most of it, but this little part had been saved for her. Family history says that the family used these funds to go to Portland Oregon after another hurricane hit Galveston, and they had enough!

From Lee O'Connor, an attorney in California: (to disprove that Edward John Garratt was in our family)

Anyway, as I said, according to the 1930 Census Edward Douglas Garratt was an attorney Beverly Hills who was born in Texas and had a son named Edward D. Jr. So, I'm sure that this is your guy. Again, working from memory, I believe that I found a relatively recent death record for Edward D. Garratt Jr. These are the primary facts that convinced me that you got the wrong person when you indicated that his son was Edward John Garratt. While it's possible that Edward Douglas Garratt the lawyer could have given the same first name to two different sons (I know I've seen it a lot in my own family history), it usually only happens when the first child dies in infancy (or if the father is George Foreman). However, if Edward D. Jr. lived well into adulthood, which is what I believe happened, then I think it's exceptionally unlikely that his father had a second son named Edward John. BTW, I also believe I figured out from the son's death certificate information on the wife of Edward Douglas Garratt, the lawyer. The son's death certificate lists the mother maiden name (Nettelhorst). Putting that together with the wife first name and middle initial from the 1930 Census, you have Helen E. Nettelhorst. I then found a death certificate for a

Helen Emma Garratt with an alternative name of Helen Emma Nettelhorst, which provided both her date of birth and date of death. So, that should give you a substantial advancement on your family tree.

Also, I don't think that Roy Edward Garratt, who died in Orange County, is the son of Edward D. Garratt Jr. I found Roy Edward's birth and death certificates and they both indicated that he was born in Kern County. I'm not sure how well you know California, but while Kern County is the county immediately north of L.A. County (although that doesn't mean too much because both counties are geographically large), it's millions of miles away culturally. Kern County is primarily an agricultural region (largest city Bakersfield). I think it's unlikely that the son of an attorney from Beverly Hills would move to Kern County and raise a family there. A search of the California Births database for a father named Garratt and a mother named Self (Roy Edward's mother's maiden name according to the death certificate) revealed about 3-4 other hits, all in the range to be siblings. Also, I believe that Edward D. Jr. died in L.A. County. Finally, I located through the Social Security Database a Roy E. Garratt who died in Kern County and was about the right age to be Roy Edward's father

He never made any money on those houses, he said, but he always seemed rich to me. His and grandma's houses were always beautiful, and their cars were newish. I was convinced he was a rich man.

Doug was born in a little house on 52nd between Stanton and Siskiyou, in a home his Grandpa Berglund built. He was in the U.S. Navy for eight years, from '37-'45. He had just been discharged when World War II began, and reinlisted immediately. He served on eight aircraft carriers, and a "few" destroyers. He also spent 12 years in the U.S. Coast Guard, and 25 years in the Post Office. He retired in 1973 or 1974.

He belonged to the Presbyterian Church until he became an adult. He became a lifelong agnostic who was intensely interested in religion, often perplexing his friends and relations by quoting John Barthes and Tehard de Jardin.

From an early age he drew beautifully, and became a painter, starting in the Navy by painting designs on Navy planes and drawing illustrations for ship's newspapers. After the war, he took his wife Margaret and moved to New York City where he went to school at the Art Student's League and also took music training.

When the family (which now included a baby daughter) returned to Portland, his father Roy gave him an acre of land on Mt. Scott in a southeast suburb. Roy and other family members helped him build a small house, which got added onto in subsequent years. A daylight basement was added first, and then dormer windows and porches were added to expand the floor space. Margaret calls the house "the house that was never finished", but it was occasionally lovely and a warm and friendly place to live nonetheless.

Douglas worked for several years for his father as a carpenter. In 1952 he started working for the U.S. Post Office, painting on the weekends.

Two more children were born, Steven and Lorraine, but many more came in the form of foster children. Margaret tried to adopt one of these, Rose Marie, but was prevented from doing so by Catholic Charities. We consider her our sister even so.

In 1972 he retired from the Post Office.

From Steven:

"In 1976, he presented, to the Port Angeles, Washington Coast Guard base a 10 ft. long mural, depicting the entire base, 11 planes and ships, even showing the city of Port Angeles, with the majestic Olympic National Forest mountain range as the background. The research and painting took him one and half years to complete. The painting may be viewed by the public during normal business hours.

The most wonderful thing Douglas gave his children was a sense of excitement about music. He loved music--but only one particular kind--big band jazz, and "modern" vocal harmonies like The Four Freshman, the Hi Los, the Modernaires, and the King Sisters produced. He and his sister Edith sang for years in various groups, one in

particular was called The Belaires. Ben Gilaspie generally was their piano player, Liz Colson, Jack Nagle, and Ted and Jo Starr were also in the group at various times. If there is heaven he is singing yet, and trying to get the heavenly choir to sing at least four parts--and MODERN harmony, please.

For what it's worth Jack's DNA does not appear to be at all related to the DNA of two other lines of living Strzyzowskis (Tadeusz, now living in Florida, on the one hand, and Marcin, now living in Poland, on the other). On a test of 25 markers that would surely pick up even a remote relationship, there was a mismatch between Jack and the other two at 16 of them (while the others were a two-step match with one another). Jack's DNA appears to be in a DNA haplogroup found frequently in Germany (a different haplogroup from the other Strzyzowskis, above), according to a European DNA database generally used for forensic purposes (at [http://ystr.charite.de/index\\_gr.html](http://ystr.charite.de/index_gr.html)). In particular, he is in group I (i.e., the letter between H and J). The I, I1, and I1a lineages are nearly completely restricted to northwestern Europe. These would most likely have been common

within Viking populations. One lineage of this group extends down into central Europe [quoted from the Family Tree DNA web site].
