All of his life Don has had a love for the outdoors. He can usually be found either fishing or hunting. His hobbies include collecting antique fishing lures, carving fishing lures, and having an apiary (beekeeping). He worked for over 30 years in various grocery stores in and around the Joplin, Missouri area as a retail butcher before retiring. He has an excellent work record and reputation.

Don started doing taxidermy shortly after he married, initially for his own enjoyment. After a short time, he started doing taxidermy work for numerous friends. His hobby eventually grew into a family business based out of his home. Don joined the National Taxidermy Association in its second year of existence. He and his wife, Lois, have attended numerous state, national, and world conventions and competitions across the country through the years. On the back of a photo of Mabel Caroline Alderman, she wrote that she and Don first went together when she was about 17 years old.

Mabel's mother, Caroline Barcus, kept a scrapbook with family history and biographical information. (In the scrapbook, Caroline spelled the family name as Barkes). Mabel continued to add family information to the handwritten scrapbook until her death in 1988. In the scrapbook, Mabel noted that "all of Grandmother Harris' ancestors were either driven out, or were slain, in the awful massacre of Christians in Ireland". According to an undated clipping from an unknown newspaper (probably the Joplin Globe published on Oct. 18, 1988), "Services for Mable C. Scott, 79, ... will be at 2 p.m. Wednesday at the Clark Funeral Chapel, Neosho. Roger Owens and John Anderson, ministers, will officiate. Burial will be in the Burkhart Cemetery, Racine. Pallbearers will be Greg Scott, Davis Scott, Randy Scott, Edward Scott, Doug Williams, and James Lankford."

Notes for Caroline Barcus:

On the online transcription of the book by William C. Cutler, "History of the State of Kansas", (written in 1880 and first published in 1883), under the section on Marshall county, part 10, Cutler tells us of the calamities which occurred there. One listed after John Harris arrived was the plagues of grasshoppers. In August, 1867, the grasshoppers arrived in great numbers and "destroyed every living thing". In August, 1868, they returned in millions but did comparatively little damage. In the summer of 1874 they appeared again and ate every green thing or leaf they could find. The county was self-supporting during the plague. The morning of May 30, 1879 started out to be a beautiful day. By that afternoon, the temperature had dropped about 30 degrees and a storm began moving in. In a short time, a cyclone (tornado) moved through Marshall county, causing death and destruction in some localities on a large scale. The cyclone struck in the spring of the year of the birth of Caroline Barcus.

In her scrapbook, Caroline Barcus wrote about being sent to live with her aunt Caroline Mills at age 2 when her mother, Rebecca Harris, died from pneumonia. Her younger brother, George, also died of pneumonia within days of Rebecca. George was only 2 months old. Caroline reported that "after Mother's death papa took Charles, Margaret and Caroline to Marshall Co. Kansas and scattered us out among his brother and two sisters where we lived till grown."

Caroline also wrote about being bitten by a rattlesnake at age 3: "My favorite play thing was a cat or a chicken. My main playmate was a black and white spotted cat. She was fond of hunting. She would go hunting most every evening. She had 4 little kittens in a barrel on the north porch so she would leave the kittens and go hunt and when they mewed it worried me so I thought I would not let her go so she got outside the picket fence and I kept reaching for her and finally I reached just once too many times. A big rattlesnake bit me on the little finger of the right hand. This hapened Oct. 9 1882." Caroline's scrapbook also contains pictures taken of her with her "tame" chickens and her pet squirrel "Dickie".

Due to poor health, Caroline Barcus Alderman did not attend school until age 8. She described all of her teachers in her scrapbook. Apparently she was able to attend school for only a few years before she had to quit school to stay at home and help her aunt.

On the marriage license of Gildia and Caroline, it says that they were married in Marshall county, Kansas at the residence of Martin Campbell, Minister.

Caroline Alderman's obituary reported she had been a patient more than a year at the Jasper County Tuberculosis Hospital in Webb City when she died. Funeral services "were held at the Frank-Sievers chapel. The Rev. E. T. Hardaway of Carthage was in charge. The Wristen sisters sang."

A member of the Family History Center of the Latter Day Saints Church in Joplin said "Brother Al" was an active member of the local chapter of the Klu Klux Klan. She said he had taken her and other church members to a cave just outside Joplin which was known to be used for meetings of the Klu Klux Klan.

The 1880 Federal census of Empire City, Cherokee County, Kansas shows "John C Scott, C J, and Geo W". Geo W's age is shown as 17/12 months. This matches George Warren Scott's date of birth on his tombstone. John's occupation is listed as a miner.

On the 1900 Federal census of Shoal Creek Township, Newton County, Missouri, John Carson Scott and Clarinda Jane were living with all seven children. The census indicates that three of the children were born in Arkansas between Feb. 1889 and Oct. 1894. Mabel Alderman's notes indicated that one of the children, Anthony Lee Scott, was born in Evansville, Washington County, Arkansas. A check of the Washington county tax records of 1890 show a "J. C. Scott" of the Vineyard township (of which Evansville is a part) as having

paid taxes that year. (The index shows the tax record to be on page 103.) All evidence indicates that "J. C. Scott" is John Carson Scott.

An online search of the Bureau of Land Management-General Land Office Records website found a John C Scott, who was issued a land patent for a 320 acre tract of land in New Mexico. The issue date for the patent was March 27, 1916, through the Clayton land office. The BLM serial number is NMT 0015073.

mustered out of Co. G at Duvalls Bluff, Arkansas on April 17, 1865.

The 1860 Federal census indicated that Richard M. Watson had attended school within the year while working as a farmer. The 1860 Census of Newton County also listed a Marion Watson, 24 years of age, from Kentucky (page 6, record 189). This was probably Daniel M. Watson, Richard's brother. Richard's middle name may also be Marion, after Richard's father.

Goodspeed's History of Newton County, lists a "R. Watson", a soldier of the Grand Army of the Republic (G.A.R.), who was mustered in the "Gen. George F. Foster Post No. 137, G.A.R." after March 27, 1884. The post was organized at Neosho on March 11, 1884. A photo of Richard shows him wearing what is probably a G.A.R. membership badge, which looks very much like a Medal of Honor. According to the 1890 Special Federal Census of Union Veterans and Widows of Veterans of the Civil War, Book III, Richard suffered from chronic diarrhea and measles while serving in the Civil War. His Pensioner Certificate No. is 352496. Donald C. Scott, Richard Watson's, grandson, said he remembered Richard being called "Cap Watson" even though Donald did not know if Richard had ever become an officer in the Civil War.

Richard Watson's obituary reads "His parents moved to Missouri when he was seven years old and settled on a farm near where Richard died and where he has [sic] resided for 57 years. When the war began he volunteered with Sixth Kansas Cavalry and served with a record of being a brave soldier. He had been justice of the peace for fourteen years and held that office when he died. He was the father of seven children, five of whom survive him."

If the obituary is correct, Richard moved to Newton county about 1846. His biological father has not yet been located in Newton county records.

The original membership records of the Burkhart Church of Christ of Racine, Missouri include "R.M. Watson". The records also indicate that Richard Watson was a charter member and a deacon, joining the church on 13 Jan 1896.

Caroline noted that, even though James' siblings stayed in the Marshall county, Kansas area, James made several moves finally settling in Iowa. Iowa is reportedly where James died. She also noted that he had three wives (Rebecca was the first) and an "army of children, step children, and some that were no relation at all to us".

Caroline Barcus received a letter from her father, James Thomas Barcus just before she was married, stating the following;

"Kent, Iowa  
Dec. 20, 1896  
My Dear Carrie,

I just received yours of 15th just last nite. I was glad to hear from you again & I thought if I ever wrote to Carrie Barks again I had better write now so you will get it while you are still Carrie Barks. Well, Carrie, all I have to say is to be good to yourself & your husband when you get him. You must both be industrious & try and save your earnings. That has been my failing, I was too free to give when I was young and able to work, but now I can't work much. I am getting quite gray, have only six teeth to eat with & my victuals does me but little good. So I am verry thin and weak in flesh. You (?) (?) going to Joplin, Missouri area going to locate at that town you spoke of. Has your intended got a trade? But it is not a healthy place down there, the water is not verry good. But wherever you go I hope you may prosper in spite of hard times. I got a letter from home last nite with yours in it. They are well as (coman ?) can be(?). I think they will come after me next Thanks(giving) so to be home Christmas.

Well, I expect this will get to your post (?) office on the 22nd. I believe you told you would be married on the 23rd. I would like to be there on that occasion but I can't come but I wish you both well with much happiness and prosperity. You must write to me soon after you are married. You never mentioned any of Mills folks whether they were well or not. I can't write to all the folks. They will have to find out about me through the letters I write to you & Mary & Charley. It is a big task for me to write any more. My hand is not as steady as it used to be. I am in my 52nd year now. How is Bro. O. S. Leslie & Sister Lottie, Bro. Joel Barks & Sister Margaret, Bro. Ebenezer & Sister Caroline Mills & all the folks. Will close wishing you a happy marriage, long life & prosperity. I will write some to my girl Mary E. Elliott.

From your Father, J. F. Barks"

On the 1870 U.S. Census of Marshall county, Kansas, James and Charlotte were both living with their brother, Joel. Yet James had real estate valued at \$400 listed, along with personal

property of \$200.

Notes for Anthony Lee Davis Scott:

Military service records of the Civil War list the place of birth for Anthony L. D. Scott as Cass County, Indiana. Cass county was formed on December 18, 1828 and is 2 counties to the east from Newton county.

A marriage record was found for "David" Scott and Nancy "Dewwy" December 15, 1849 in Fulton County, Indiana. Anthony L. "Davis", his wife Nancy A. and 2 month old daughter "Allis" were found on the 1850 Federal census of Fulton County, Indiana. They are living next door to Warren W. and Mary Dewey and family. Fulton County, Indiana is immediately north of Cass County, Indiana. Several Scott families were found in both Cass and Fulton counties on the 1850 Indiana census.

In 1860, A.L.D. Scott is found on the Federal census of Belmont township of Iroquois County, Illinois, working as a farmer. He is living with his wife, Nancy, and their children Cynthia, John, Edward, William, Mary, and Mathilda. There is a "J. L. Scott" residing with them who is ten years younger than A.L.D. and is listed as a farmer. All of the children are listed as born in Indiana. Hattie, the next child, was born in early 1861, after the census.

His military service record tells us many things. Anthony enlisted as a Private in the Civil War on October 30, 1863, at Kent (sometimes referred to as Kentland), Indiana in Company A, 128th Indiana Infantry. His residence when he enlisted was Jefferson Township, Newton County, Indiana, Congressional District number 9. His age at enlistment was 33 years. On December 15, 1863, he was commissioned a Corporal and paid a bounty of \$60.00. On the

July and August roll card, he was listed as absent because he was at the hospital in Knoxville, Tennessee. On April 1, 1865, he was promoted from the rank of Corporal to Sergeant. For a short period beginning October 20, 1865, he was detailed as a Commissionary Sergeant in Morgantown, North Carolina. In November, 1865, he was commissioned as a Second Lieutenant. During the November, 1865 roll, he was absent on detached service. On January 1, 1866, the Lt. Governor of Indiana, Conrad Baker, commissioned A.L.D. Scott to the rank of 1st Lieutenant. He was mustered into that position on February 6, 1866 at the infantry headquarters in Salisbury, North Carolina. He was discharged April 10, 1866 at Raleigh, North Carolina at the close of the war.

The existence of lead and zinc, in what is now Cherokee County, is said to have been known to the Indians long before the advent of white settlers. In 1872, a positive discovery of the ore was made, in the southeastern part of the county, in what is now Garden Township, and, about the same time, indications of its presence were observed in the vicinity of Baxter Springs. Nothing, however, was done toward the development of these resources at this time. In the spring of 1877, two miners from Joplin, Mo., named John Shoe and John McAllen, started out from that place upon a prospecting expedition. Reaching Short Creek, they began making some examinations in the bed of that stream, from which they came to the conclusion that here was good prospect for lead ore. The place upon which decided for a prospecting site belonged to a man named Nichols, whom permission was obtained to sink a shaft. They began digging near Short Creek, and at a depth of about fifteen feet struck upon a rich vein of the mineral. Only a very brief time elapsed until the rumor of the discovery was heralded broadcast, creating the most intense excitement. Men crowded into the place from all quarters. The towns of Galena and Empire City were started, and in less than three months, each had a population of from two to three thousand people. The land in the vicinity rose rapidly in value, and that which before could be bought for \$3 an acre, now brought vast sums. In the late 1800's and early 1900's, business was booming in southeast Kansas. Growth was based on thriving industries, such as coal mining and the cement, glass, brick, and tile plants that popped up around the area. All of these industries used the available natural resources such as coal, zinc, clay, and limestone.

By 1875, A.L.D. and his family had moved to Oswego Township, Labette County, Kansas. His occupation on the census was listed as a farmer. He may have heard about the good farming land in Kansas. Then he must have decided to get into the mining business. In 1880, he was living at Empire City in Galena Township, Cherokee County, working as a miner at one of the numerous lead and zinc mines in the Galena, Kansas area. At that time, Empire City was a city of tents and temporary dwellings since the town was growing faster than buildings or housing could be constructed.

Anthony's oldest son, John Carson, was living with his wife, Clarinda Jane (Michael), and their first child, George Warren, in Empire City, Kansas in 1880. John was also working as a miner. Another son, William Samuel, had recently married and was also living in Cherokee County with his bride Anna Arry (Butcher).

In January of 1887, Anthony married Mrs. Margaret Seawell in Cherokee County. The 1900 Galena City Directory and Federal census showed 70 year old Anthony living west of the city of Galena with 73 year old Margaret. Two of Anthony's sons, Edward W. and William S., and their families lived nearby. Another son, James, and his family lived in the city of Galena. Anthony's oldest son, John Carson, had moved with his family to Newton County, Missouri.

By 1900, Anthony was living in Garden township, in the heart of lead and zinc country. His physical condition was deteriorating. Anthony entered the National Home for Disabled Volunteers (now Dwight D. Eisenhower Veterans Administration) in Leavenworth, Kansas on November 25, 1903. This was also perhaps because of the death of his wife Margaret.

(However, an obituary or death notice for Margaret has not been found.)

Under "Domestic History" on the veterans' home index (# 14271), Anthony's birthplace was noted as Indiana, his age 73, his height 5' 10", complexion "dk.", color of eyes hazel, color of hair "dk", religion "Prot.", occupation farmer, residence subsequent to discharge Galena, Kansas, and marital status WIDOWER. The name and address of nearest relative noted was William S. Scott (son), Galena, Kansas. His pension certificate was 391755.

Anthony was discharged from the home November 26, 1904 with the cause of discharge listed as "O.R.". He was readmitted to the veterans' home November 1, 1906 residing there until his death from "diarrhoea chronic" on January 5, 1907. He was buried at the National Cemetery at Leavenworth, Kansas. Funeral services were conducted by the "Rev. James M. Payne, Chaplain". His obituary was in the Leavenworth Times, Thursday morning, January 10, 1907. It was also recorded that his son, John C. Scott, of RFD No. 1, Box 123, Joplin, Missouri was notified of his death.

A check of the deed records at Cherokee county, Kansas produced a warranty deed dated June 26, 1882 showing a purchase of lot #159 in the Land and Street addition to the city of Galena, Kansas for a cost of \$20. On July 13, 1883, "E. W. Scott" sold the land for \$25. On Feb. 22, 1899, he purchased lot #67 in Geltz's second addition of Galena for the sum of \$50. On May 16, 1898, Edward purchased lot #68 in Geltz's second addition of Galena for the sum of \$50. A check of the deed records at Cherokee county, Kansas produced a warranty deed

dated February 7, 1882 showing a purchase of 2 lots of land in the Land and Street addition to the city of Galena, Kansas for a cost of \$45.00. On January 5, 1883, "William and wife" sold the land for \$100.00. This increase in property value was directly related to the lead and zinc mining boom in the area.

An online search of the Bureau of Land Management-General Land Office Records website shows a William S Scott who was issued two 160 acre tracts of land in New Mexico. The issue date for both land patents was Feb. 11, 1914, through the Tucumcari land office. One is BLM serial number NMT 0013993, the other NMT 0009769.

According to his obituary, William had resided in Bard, New Mexico for about twenty years although he died in Drumright, Oklahoma. It was noted that he was on his way to Galena, Kansas from New Mexico to "spend the Christmas holidays with his daughter. He stopped at Drumright to visit friends and became ill a little more than a week ago." His daughter's name was given only as Mrs. John H. Petty. Funderal services were held at "10 o'clock Thursday morning".

Notes for ? Watson:

The identity of Richard Watson's father remains a mystery. There are some possibilities however.

The 1840 Federal census of Marion County, Kentucky, listed the household of a Richard Watson as follows: Free White Males, 2 under five years (it is possible this was Daniel and Richard); 1 thirty and under forty (Richard senior); Free White Females, 1 ten and under fifteen (unknown), 1 twenty and under thirty (possibly Elizabeth). One person was listed as employed in Manufactures and Trades. The ages of the children indicated this Richard Watson could be Richard M. Watson's father.

A Richard Watson was listed in the 1850 Louisville, Jefferson Co, Kentucky Federal census who was 34 years of age and born in Mass. His wife was listed as Mary Watson, 30 years of age, also born in Mass. and married within the year to Richard. There were no children listed. Could this be Richard Watson's father and his second wife? His occupation appears to be "none".

Also, as indicated by Richard M Watson's obituary, he and his parents had moved to Newton county sometime near 1846. If so, Richard Watson's father probably died and was buried in Newton county.

Further research is needed on each of the above notes.

Notes for Elisha Alderman:

Based on Elisha Alderman's age of 48 years on the 1850 Federal census, his date of birth was estimated to be about 1802. His place of birth appeared to be "Vt". However, International Genealogical Index (IGI) records list "Richfield, Otsego Co., New York" as his place of birth. In an effort to confirm Elisha Alderman's date and place of birth, on-line 1810 Vermont and New York Federal census records were searched. No Alderman families were found in Vermont in 1810. Several Alderman families including males under 10 years of age were found in New York. An E. Alderman family was the only Alderman household listed in Otsego County, New York. The E. Alderman family included 2 males under 10 years of age. It is possible that one of these males was Elisha.

An Ephraim Alderman was listed in the 1820 New York Federal census of Otsego County. Unfortunately, itemization of the household was not available on-line.

By 1830, the Elisha Alderman family was residing in Conneaut township, Erie County, Pennsylvania. On the 1830 Federal census, 6 persons were listed in the household as follows: Free White Males, 1 under five years, 1 five and under ten, 2 twenty and under thirty (Elisha and an unknown, maybe a brother); Free White Females, 1 twenty and under thirty (Didemia), 1 eighty and under ninety (probably a grandmother). A Michael Alderman family,

possibly Elisha's brother, was also residing in Erie County, Pennsylvania.

Both the Elisha and Michael Alderman families were still living in Conneaut township, Erie County, Pennsylvania in 1840 according to census records. On the 1840 Federal census, 9 persons are listed in the Elisha Alderman household as follows: Free White Males, 1 under five years, 1 five and under ten, 1 ten and under fifteen, 1 fifteen and under twenty, 1 twenty and under thirty, and 1 thirty and under forty (Elisha); Free White Females, 1 under five years, 1 thirty and under forty (Didemia), 1 sixty and under seventy (this was probably Elisha's mother, since Lucy Didemia's mother was residing elsewhere). Two persons were listed as employed in agriculture. Two were listed as scholars.

Places and dates of birth for Elisha's sons James and Abner indicate the family moved from Pennsylvania to Illinois between 1844 and 1848. On the 1850 Federal census of Knox County, Illinois, Elisha's given name was spelled as Elsha. He also was noted as the only person in the household over age 20 who could not read or write. Elisha, age 48; Didemia, age 41; John, age 19; Michael, age 14; Philistia, age 12; Hosea, age 10; James, age 6; and Abner, age 2 comprised the household in 1850.

Elisha Alderman was not listed in the 1860 Federal census of Knox County, Illinois. Elisha's wife and 2 sons were residing elsewhere implying that Elisha died between 1850 and 1860.

It was unusual for the first child to be named for anyone other than a parent, grandparent, or sibling of the father.

After his first wife, Mary Ann Haywood, died in Pennsylvania in 1868, he moved the family back to Illinois while Manley was still a young boy. Obediah was a member of the Odd Fellows Lodge but never affiliated with the local lodge. At the time of Obediah's death, a son, William, is said to have lived in Hudson, Kansas. Daughters Rozella Wade and Pearl Wilkinson lived in Galesburg and Cambridge, Illinois.

Obediah's family had a long history of military service. His grandfather, Lyman Jackson, and 7 of Lyman's brothers fought in the War of 1812. Obediah, along with 3 of his brothers, fought in the Civil War. One brother was killed at the Battle of Bull Run. Two nephews and 2 cousins fought in the Spanish War.

Obediah was drafted into Company H, 98th Pennsylvania Infantry during the Civil War. He was 36 years old at the time. According to papers from the War Department Adjutant General's office, dated April 22, 1865, his eyes were gray, hair brown, complexion fair and height 5'10". His occupation was listed as laborer. He was enlisted at Ridgeway, Pennsylvania on March 6, 1865. He was discharged on November 17, 1866.

After his discharge at Albion, Pennsylvania, Obediah resided there until 1869 when he moved to Middlesex, Pennsylvania. He lived there until Oct. 19, 1873 when he moved to Princeville, Illinois in Peroria county. In 1876 he moved to Galva, residing there until his death. His home was in the northwest part of the city. He died on a Wednesday morning after a short illness. His death was due in part to complications involving Bright's disease.

Obediah was active in the G.A.R. He was employed by the Galva News for 10 years as assistant press foreman. When issue #1 of the Galva News was published on October 18, 1879, Obediah operated the press. It was "a slow, laborous job. "

The following are the first names of the Gray heads of households: Joseph Sr, Dr. William, Joseph, Isaac, Richard, Mahlon, and Thomas. Since Samuel's date of birth was Nov. 15, 1810, Samuel would have been 19 years old at census time. This would place Samuel in the "15 and under 20" age group.

In the Dr. William Gray household resided one male in the "15 to 20" age group and one in the "50 and under 60" age group. There were three females; one in "10 and under 15", one in "15 and under 20", and one in "40 and under 50". The one male that was in the right age group could have been Samuel, living at home. Dr. William Gray would have been the right age to have been the brother of Joseph Gray, Sr.

Another possibility was the household of Joseph Gray, Jr. Listed is one male "under 5", one male "5 and under 10", and two males in the "15 and under 20" group. There is only one female listed, "40 and under 50". It appears as if Joseph Gray, Jr's wife had died (maybe

during childbirth), and his deceased wife's mother was living with them taking care of the children. But why were there two males in the 15 to 20 age group and no other older males? Maybe Samuel was a sibling of Joseph, Jr and was helping him on the farm. More research is needed in this timeframe.

Samuel Gray was first located as a head of a household on the 1840 Census of Independence township, Warren County, New Jersey. The census indicated the household comprised two boys "less than 5 years" old (George and Isaac), one male "between 30 and 40" (Samuel), one girl "under 5" years old (Mary), one girl "between 5 and 10" years old (Margarett), and one female "between 20 and 30" years of age (Phoebe).

In 1850, Samuel and Phoebe were still in Warren county, residing in Amwell, in the Independence township. The census listed George, Mary, Isaac, Mahlon, Elizabeth, Charles, and John as the children with them. Samuel's occupation is a laborer. In 1870, Phoebe is in Victoria township, Knox county, Illinois living as a widower. She has John, Hulda, and Isabella living with her.

Notes for John Harris:

On the online transcription of the book by William C. Cutler, "History of the State of Kansas", (written in 1880 and first published in 1883), under the section on Marshall county, part 10, Cutler wrote that "John Harris and family, now residing in Osage County, Kan., came in 1856." This is in contradiction with the date of birth of David Harris on the 1860 census of Barrett Mills, Vermillion Township, Marshall county, Kansas. It indicates that David was born about 1858 in Illinois. However, in Cutler's book, he wrote that the biographies and indeed, much of the information came from local county historians.

Cutler also tells in his book of the calamities which occurred in Marshall County. One listed after John Harris arrived was the plagues of grasshoppers. In August, 1867, the grasshoppers arrived in great numbers and "destroyed every living thing". In August, 1868, they returned in millions but did comparatively little damage. In the summer of 1874 they appeared again and ate every green thing or leaf they could find. The county was self-supporting during the plague. The morning of May 30, 1879 started out to be a beautiful day. By that afternoon, the temperature had dropped about 30 degrees and a storm began moving in. In a short time, a cyclone (tornado) moved through Marshall county, causing death and destruction in some localities on a large scale.

A probate record was found in Cass County, Indiana for "William Scott's Estate", which is 23 pages long, on microfilm at the Indiana State library. It names his widow, Otilda, and children, Moses, Anthony D, Harriet L, Graham NF, and Edward W. It is being transcribed. In the probate document, William is referred to as Col. Scott. Due to his age, he may have

fought in the War of 1812. An online search of Ancestry.com revealed the following; SCOTT WILLIAM, (unit) LT. COL. SCOTT'S DETACHMENT, GEORGIA MIL.; (starting rank) LT; (ending rank) COLONEL; (roll-box) 184; (roll-exct) 602.

An obituary in the "Logansport Telegraph", dated July 19, 1845, reads as follows. "On the 16 inst., at his residence, in Washington township, Col. William Scott, The deceased was one of the early residents of this place-having immigrated in the year of 1828. In his long and varied intercourse, with his fellow-citizens, of this place and vicinity, he was always esteemed as a good neighbor, a worthy citizen and an honest man."

The following was found on the Darke County, Ohio web page; "Scott, Moses...1820...(page) 067...(township) Greenville" and "Scott, William...1820...(page) 068...(township) Greenville". Darke County, Ohio is located on the Ohio-Indiana line, halfway between the north and south parts of the state.

A search of an online marriage index of Darke County, Ohio, revealed the following; Scott, William...Crage, Jamima...15 Jan 1820...001...006...John Beres, JP  
The date of marriage is consistent with the time that Moses Scott, William's oldest son, was born.

William served as the Sheriff of Darke County, Ohio, after his father, Moses, had served as Sheriff. The records are unclear as to whether Moses served the first and second terms, with William serving the third or that Moses served the first and William served the second and third terms. Regardless, father and son served the first three terms in the position of Sheriff of Darke County, Ohio. His prior experience would explain why William was elected as the first Sheriff of Cass County, Indiana, in 1829 when the county was first formed.

Since her date of death is unknown and there is no documentation as to why some of the children went to stay with James, we can only speculate the reasons. Maybe since James was getting older, he may have asked for some help on his farm. There were 3 farmhands listed on the census (two of which were of the Alderman family); Henry and Theodore Alderman, and William Millen. Henry was Henry John Alderman, the second son of John Luther Alderman. Theodore was Theodore Arthur Alderman, the third son of John Luther Alderman.

"The borough of Albion occupies an elevated site at the junction of Jackson's Run with the East Branch, near the Elk Creek line, a mile east of Albion depot, and twenty-seven miles southwest of Erie by the E. & P. Railroad. The first settlers at Albion were Thomas Alexander, Patrick Kennedy, William Pain, Ichabod Baker and Lyman Jackson. Michael Jackson, son of Lyman, who built the first saw mill, did not become a permanent resident until 1815, although he spend a few months there five years earlier. William Sherman settled at Albion in 1827, coming from Herkimer County, N. Y. He died on the 1st of February, 1883, aged seventy-eight years. Thomas Thornton came from England at an early age, and settled in Albion about 1857. Amos King built the first grist mill and Lyman Jackson taught the first school. The town was long known as Jackson's Cross Roads, and the post office name has been successively Jacksonville, Juliet and Albion."

"The manufacturing establishments are Thornton's grist and woolen mills, Wells' oar factory, and Van Riper's horse rake and wooden ware factory. All of these use steam. The water-power, once quite good, has become unreliable since the clearing up of the country. The flouring mill was built in 1828, by Amos King, and is now owned by Joshua Thornton. The woolen mill was erected by W. H. Gray, in 1840, burned in 1876, and rebuilt in 1880 by Thomas Thornton. Its present owner is William Thornton. Michael Jackson built the rake factory in 1846. It has been completely overhauled and much extended by George VanRiper & Co. The oar factory was built by Henry Salisbury and Reuben McLallen in 1859. There were 4 individuals noted as engaged in agriculture.

Quoting the Abstracts of Rev. War Pension Files, "JACKSON, Lyman, Deidamia, W2806, MA and NY Line, sol (soldier) was b (born) in 1756 at Simsbury in Hartford Co CT and he lived in Berkshire Co MA at enl (enlistment) and later moved to Albany Co NY & also enl there, sol appl (applied) 6 Aug 1832 Erie Co PA & sol d (died) there 20 Mar 1835, sol and wid (widow) had m (married) 3 Jan 1782 at Pownal in Bennington Co VT where he then lived, wid appl 11 Aug 1837 Erie Co PA, sol & wid had 13 children of which 12 married & had children but the only children named were; David B. Jackson & Rosanna who was b about 1783 & she m John Rudd, Jr. when sol & wid were living in Otsego Co NY." Pension No. W2806. It was reported that Lyman's brother, Ebenezer, served as a substitute for him during the war.

However, according to two different applications for the Daughters of the American Revolution, (Application for Membership to the National Society of the DAR, submitted by Gertrude G Metcalf. National # 191109. Approved 12 June 1923) and (Application for Membership to the National Society of the DAR, submitted by Helen S Jackson Dunn, M. D. National # 8721. Approved 26 April 1895), Lyman Jackson was born in New Camden, Kings District, Albany County, Province of New York.

The following was taken from an Application for Membership to the Daughters of the American Revolution submitted by Mrs. Helen S. Jackson Dunn. No application date was given but the DAR application was examined and approved on 26 April 1895.

Written by Helen S Jackson Dunn:

"My great grandfather, Lyman Jackson was born in New Camden, Kings District, Albany County, Province of New York. He was a Sergeant in Captain (Lothrop) Allens Company, Colonel Harpers Regiment, New York Continental Militia. He was afterwards transferred to Colonel (Zephaniah) Platts Regiment. He was with Col. Tham Allen, also with General Starke at Bennington. Later in life, he resided in Cooperstown, New York. Subsequently, he emigrated with his family, all but my grandfather (Ebenezer Jackson) to Pennsylvania. Lyman died at Albany, Erie County, Pennsylvania. He with seven sons, including Ebenezer served in the War of 1812."

Part of the transcript written by Mrs. Helen Jackson Dunn states "Lyman Jackson enlisted in the Levies in Capt. Lothrop Allen's company, Col. John Harper's regiment, and subsequently served under Col. Zephaniah Platt. He was at Ticonderoga and with Starke at Bennington."

According to the "Revolutionary Patriots in Erie County Pennsylvania", Lyman's military service was as follows:

"Sgt. Enl. at Pvt., Alford Berkshire Co., MA, Jan or Feb 1776 under Capt William Bacon, Col Porter's MA Regt. until Jul 1776. Enl. Nov 1776 in Capt. Alexander Baldwin's Company. N.Y. Rangers until May 1777. While a resident of New Caanan, Albany Co, NY Vol. enl. un Jul 1777 and served for 2 mo. Enl. Sep 1777 and was at surrender of Burgoyne. Enl. Aug 1778, twice for one mo. each. Served Sep 1779 for three months, as St. under Capt. King's NY Compay in 1778, Col. Platt's NY Regt. Enl. Spring 1780 and served for 7 months as Sgt."

The DAR Patriot Index, Centennial Edition, lists a "Jackson, Lyman: b 2-29-1756 CT d 3-20-1835 PA m Deidama Dunham Sgt MA NY PNSR WPNS".

Abner Jackson was a retired Methodist minister who originally lived in western Pennsylvania. He and his family were the Jacksons of "Jackson Settlement" (aka "Jacksonville", "Jacksons' Crossroads") in what is now Albion, Erie Co., Pennsylvania. Abner's father, Lyman Jackson, was noted to be an early pioneer of Erie county, Pennsylvania.

The Jackson family was cited as early as 1840 by Mormon Elder Benjamin Winchester, as a primary source of information on Solomon Spalding and his writing efforts while living in New Salem, Ashtabula Co., Ohio. Abner penned a statement December 20, 1880 which was published by the Washington, Pennsylvania "Daily Evening Reporter" in response to the newspaper's question of who wrote the "Book of Mormon". Abner's contention was that the "Book of Mormon" had its origins from the writings of Solomon Spaulding rather than those of Joseph Smith, Jr.

Moses Scott

Moses Scott (deceased) was a native of Washington county, Penn., born in Union township, October 12, 1809. He was of Irish descent, his father, Thomas Scott, having emigrated from Ireland to America in 1796, being then a young man of some twenty-two summers. After landing, Thomas Scott proceeded to this county, making a settlement on Mingo creek in Union township, where he cleared the land and followed farming and milling until 1850, in which year he moved into Monongahela City, and there ended his useful life, dying February 19, 1856. In politics he was a Whig, in religion a member of the Mingo Creek Presbyterian Church. In 1802 he had married Margaret Turner, a resident of the county, and the children born to them were Rebecca (Mrs. Franklin Goldthrop), William, Joseph, Alexander, Moses, Mary, John, James, Matilda (Mrs. James Rogers), Elizabeth and Jane. The mother was called to her long home December 24, 1849. Moses Scott, of whom this memoir is written, received a rudimentary education in the schools of the neighborhood, afterward attending Marshall's academy and a school in Monongahela City. He learned the milling business which he followed in his native township until 1850, when he came to Monongahela City. Here, in 1856, he opened a general grocery store, which he conducted several years, and then, selling out the business, moved to Beaver, same State, where he remained some three years, at the end of which time he returned to Monongahela City, and there passed the rest of his life, dying March 5, 1891. Moses Scott was married in 1855 to Miss Rowanna A. McFarland, of Franklin county, Penn. In his political affiliations he was for some time a Republican, but in the later years of his life he voted the Independent ticket. For five years he served as alderman of his adopted city. In early life he identified himself with the Presbyterian Church, but afterward enlisted under the banner of the Baptist faith. His widow is still a resident of Monongahela. James Scott, M.D., brother of Moses, was born in Union township, April 15, 1815. In the subscription schools and at Marshall's academy he received a liberal education

He studied medicine, and at Ohio Medical College took his degree, after which he commenced practice at Lebanon, Warren Co. Ohio. He was a very prominent and influential man, and for some time represented his State in the Legislature on the Republican ticket. He married Hannah Fowler, of Cincinnati, and by her had one child that died young. In church connection the Doctor is a Presbyterian."

It is not the Moses Scott of my lineage but may possibly be related.

Moses Scott was found on the census of Washington County, Pennsylvania, in 1800 along with a number of other Scott families. He was found in Bucks county in 1810. The Scott families in Washington county, Pennsylvania came there from Lancaster county, Pennsylvania. Books of Lancaster County state that the Scotts there were all descendants of Joseph Scott from northern Ireland. Joseph was the son of William Scott, who fled Scotland in the late 1600's due to his dislike of "popery". He was a supporter of the Covenanter Church and their religious beliefs.

Moses Scott served as the Sheriff of Darke County, Ohio, for at least the first term. The records are unclear as to whether Moses served the first and second terms, with his son, William, serving the third term or that Moses served the first and William served the second and third terms. Regardless, father and son served the first three terms in the position of Sheriff of Darke County, Ohio. Sometime afterwards, Moses and his remaining family moved from that location to Fort Wayne in Allen county, Indiana, and settled there for the rest of his days.

The references above are from the book of Jackson (page 7-8), which is on file in the State Historical Library in the Historical Building, Des Moines, Iowa, and family records."

The website of the Descendants of William Wilcoxson refers to an "Application for Membership to the National Society of the Daughters of the American Revolution, submitted by Helen S Jackson Dunn", probably submitted in early 1895. Helen wrote the following:

"During the French and Indian War, my gg-grandfather, Michael Jackson was an Adjutant under General Lyman who was stationed at Fort Edward in 1756. During this year, Michael's oldest son was born and named "Lyman", after his commanding officer. The name Lyman has since remained a family name. An orderly book which he subsequently used as his family record is still in the possession of one of his descendants. During the Revolution, he (Michael) served at Lexington and Concord, and was wounded at Bunker Hill and at Montrossors Island."

"The following was taken from the 'Decendants of William Wilcoxson of Derbyshire, England and Stratford, Connecticut', by Thomas Wilcox. Information furnished by Jane Trotman.

Samuel is mentioned by Winthrop as being 18 years old in 1658. This would place his birth year at 1640. It is likely he lived briefly with his mother and father-in-law at Killinworth. It is known that he lived in Windsor for a time for he married there to Hannah Rice, daughter of Richard Rice of Concord, Massachuset. Samuel then joined the group of pioneers who founded the town of Simsbury. There he and his descendants continued to live for some 200 years. He was known in his time as Sergeant Samuel Wilcoxson from his rank in the local trainband company. He represented Simsbury in the Hartford Assembly for several terms.

Samuel died intestate, 12 March 1712. In this connection a document published in Manwaring's Digest of Connecticut, Probate Records, Volume 2, is of interest both for its genealogical information and as a study of how estates were distributed among natural heirs at that early period of American history. It reads:

'An Agreement between the heirs of Samuel Wilcoxson of Simsbury...To all christian people to whom these parents shall come, greeting: Know ye that we, each of us, Samuel Willcoxson, William Willcoxson, Joseph Willcoxson and Margaret Willcoxson, children of our honoured father, Samuel Willcoxson of the town of Simsbury, late deceased intestate, do by these presents mutually appoint and ordain Thomas Holcomb, Samuel Case, John Pettebone, and Joseph Case to make distribution of our honoured father's estate and appoint to each of us our respective portions of said estate in lands and where it shall be, all to be judged and finally issued according to the rules of equity and conscience, to which judgement, issue and determination we bind ourselves, our heirs, executors, and administrators in a bond of 100 pounds to agree and abide standby and sit down satisfied with the judgement of the above said distributors. To the true performance of the above written premises we set our names and affix our seals this 31st day of March 1712'.

This document was signed by Samuel, William, Joseph, and Margaret Willcoxson (note they spelled with two l's with the "son"). The witnesses to the document were Joseph Pettebone, Samuel Tuller and Joseph Strickland. There is a subsequent notation to the effect that the home place of Samuel Sr, was set aside to the use and proprietorship of Margaret Willcoxson, the daughter."
