Gordon Family

Alexander C. Gordon and his half-brother, Irwin (spelling should be Irvin - SSS) Rogers, were seized by Creek Indians near their uncle's store at Franklin. Their mother, Mrs. Rogers, came with James Hughs, her brother, in 1817 to what was later Franklin, Henry County. v Town of Franklin.

He (A.C. Gordon) was engaged in the mercantile business at Franklin, Aberdeen and Abbeville after he had some service in two wars. He owned a large acreage north and west of Abbeville. He married Eveline T. Hudspeth, daughter of Richard Hudspeth born 1776 in Va., and wife, Mary Abernathy Sims born 1781 in N.C. She (Eveline) was born November 25, 1813, died August 1, 1881.

Page 258:

From Department of the Army, Office of the Adjutant General, Washington, D.C. August 24, 1953 (apparently Mrs. Scott wrote for and received this info.)

A careful search of the records show that one Alexander C. Gordon was mustered into service May 17, 1836 at Abbeville as captain of a company designated as Captain Gordon's Co., Blair's Battalion Alabama Militia, and was mustered out and honorably discharged as a Captain, July 25, 1836.

More About ALEXANDER CURRY GORDON:

Burial: 1887, Abbeville City Cemetary

Captured by Creek Indians: 1821, while fishing on Phillips Mill Creek, along with 5 yr. old half brother, Irwin Rogers. Taken to Florida, traded to other Indians

Committees/Boards: 1859, one of the petitioners to first incorporate the town of Abbeville

Elected 1: Bet. 1836 - 1837, legislator for Henry County, House of Representatives

Elected 2: 1872, delegate of the Baltimore Democratic Convention

Elected 3: Mar 23, 1873, First set of officers for newly incorporated city of Abbeville (est. in 1820's). A.C.

Gordon was elected as councilman with 3 other councilmen, and with Mayor J.A. Corbitt

Elected 4: Mar 23, 1873, to Abbeville City Council

Elected 5: Apr 10, 1873, 2nd election held due to irregularities in first election in previous month. The same officers were elected, except Z.W.Laney was named in place of J.M. Marshall

Elected 6: 1875, member of the Alabama Constitutional Convention

Elected 7: Bet. 1878 - 1879, to Alabama Senate from Henry county

Employed: Unknown, by Anthony McCulloch to assist with Indian trade at Franklin, due to his learning the Indian tongue quite well

Home 1: built a fine home 4 miles north of Abbeville and named it Aberdeen. The nearby crossroads became known as Aberdeen.

Home 2: 1864, end of Civil War, he lost Aberdeen due to his generosity in financing the Confederates

Investment 1: Bef. 1861, stockholder in Abbeville newspaper: The Abbeville Times, that supported seceding from the Union

Investment 2: 1858, authorized by Gov. A.B. Moore, along with 8 others, to sell stock for the purpose of founding "The Eastern Bank of Alabama"

Military service 1: May 17, 1836, at Abbeville mustered into Ala. Militia, as Captain of Gordon Co., Blair's Battalion. He fought in the Creek Indian conflicts.⁶

Military service 2: he organized a company to rid the area of a band of Confederate deserters led by Joseph Sanders

Military service 3: He was with AL. Militia when they prevented Irwinton (now Eufaula) from being burned by Indians.

Military service 4: He was with Wellborn when the famous round-up of Indians was made at Hobdy's Bridge.

Military service 5: Jul 25, 1836, Mustered out and honorably discharged as a Captain

Military service 6: Nov 09, 1841, commissioned Brig. General of the Ala. militia by Governor Arthur P. Bagby

Military service 7: 1861, Civil War: he formed the first Confederate Army unit in Henry County, called the "Henry Grays"

Military service 8: May 14, 1861, certificate of election Captain of Henry Grays, part of the 6th Alabama Regiment, Volunteers, CSA

Military service 9: 1862, Civil War: he returned to Henry Co. and served in the confederate Home Guard unit

called the Henry Mounted Rebels

Military service 10: Jan 06, 1893, Muster Roll for the Henry Mounted Rebels, age 51 years. This was a Home Guard outfit.

Notes for EVELINE THOMAS HUDSPETH:

According to Anna Ford's extensive Hudspeth Research some years back (before computers), Ayres Hudspeth, b. 1758 in Surry County, NC d. January 1, 1844 in Winston County, MS, m. to Mary Street b. 1770 in NC.

Ayres was the son of George Hudspeth b. 1736 in Goochland County, VA, d. aft. 1804 and Judy Ran m. 1756 in Granville Co NC.

George was the son of Ralph Hudspeth and 2nd wife Catherine. She was b. 1715, m. 1735 in Goochland County, Va and d. after 1782 in Surry County, NC.

Ralph Hudspeth was the son of Ralph Hudpeth, b. before 1664 in England and died abt. 1719 in Henrico County, Virginia. He married Margaret Eyers (Ayers) abt. 1688 in Henrico County, VA, daughter of Joseph Eyers and Margaret Humphreys.

It is believed that Ralph, Cuthbert and John Hudspeth were three brothers who left Corbridge, Northumberland Co., Eng. for not paying their share of taxes on a bridge. They probably changed their name to from Hedgepeth to Hudspeth after coming to America.

6th Alabama Infantry Regiment

The 6th Alabama Infantry Regiment was organized at Montgomery, on 6 May 1861, with 12 companies and about 1400 men recruited from Autauga, Henry, Jackson, Lowndes, Macon, Montgomery, Russell, and Wilson counties. It was first ordered to Corinth, and from there it went to Virginia. Reaching Manassas Junction, it was brigaded under Gen'l Richard Ewell. It was on the field but was not actively engaged in 1st Manassas, and it

passed the fall and winter in that vicinity. Gen'l Robert Rodes succeeded Ewell in command of the brigade. in the spring, it moved to Yorktown with the army and was there reorganized and reenlisted for the war. It was on the field at Williamsburg but not under fire. At Seven Pines, the regiment took a prominent part, losing 102 k and 282 w out of 632 engaged (59%; the brigade lost 1296 out of about 2500). It again took a conspicuous part at Mechanicsville, 1st Cold Harbor, and Malvern Hill, with casualties. It was in the advance movement across the Potomac and lost slightly at Boonsboro. At Sharpsburg, it lost 52k and 104 w. The regiment was present but did not take part at Fredericksburg. With its brigade companions (3rd, 5th, 12th, and 26th regiments, Col. O'Neal commanding), the regiment fought at Chancellorsville, again with casualties (156). It participated in the Pennsylvania campaign with the brigade under Gen'l Battle, but with severe losses (382 engaged; casualties of more than 50%). Having wintered near Orange Courthouse, the regiment was at The Wilderness, where it lost considerably; and it was badly cut up at Spotsylvania. It took part in the Valley campaign of Gen'l Jubal Early and suffered casualties at Winchester. At Cedar Creek, many of the regiment were captured. Moving back to Petersburg, it was placed in Fort Mahone and was almost continuously under fire until it surrendered at Appomattox with 4 officers and 80 men, commanded by Lt. Col. Culver. Of 2109 names on its rolls, nearly 400 were killed in battle, 243 died of disease in service, and another 675 were discharged or transferred.
