Roster of Jackson County Confederate Soldiers:

Company F of the 17th Virginia Cavalry was formed by the counties of Wood, Jackson, Wirt and Roane located in Virginia in 1862. These counties now lie in the "occupied" state of West Virginia. Company F was known by the name "The Night Hawk Rangers". The 17th Virginia Cavalry was formed after the War for Southern Independence had begun. The men that made up this company were from all walks of life. There were farmers, physicians, lawyers, merchants and teachers. A few of the men were well educated.

Company F was organized on September 23, 1862. They originally served as Company N of the 14th Virginia Cavalry. The company was then assigned to the 17th Virginia Cavalry upon the regiment's organization. Captain James S.A. Crawford would be in command of Company F.

Captain Crawford was a 23-year-old attorney. He was born in Virginia and was educated in Missouri. In the fall of 1861, Crawford enlisted with the Greenbrier Cavalry. When he was appointed the Captain of Company F, he began recruiting men and boys from the western part of Virginia.

In 1862, a small scouting party from Company F was sent out on one of these recruiting expeditions. While out, the men broke Yankee lines and visited their homes before going back. While home, the men were presented a flag by some of the women in town. The women, whose names were Miss Fannie Hopkins, Miss Margret Coffey, Mrs. Sallie Stephenson Jackson, and Miss Mary Cook, presented the men with a handmade silk and homespun flag. The inscriptions on the flag were, "Liberty or Death" on one side and, "The Night Hawk Rangers" on the other side. It was very unusual for a company to have a flag, and thus it became very important to the men of Company F. The flag was carried into every conflict on a mahogany staff with a spearlike piece on the top.

Excerpts from Father Came West, Farlington History by Oello Ingraham Martin, niece of Mary Jane Ingraham Sheppard:

In the fall of 1875, we moved back to the farm. Aunt Jane Sheppard, Father's sister was living in Godfrey at the time and persuaded Mother to let her take me home with her. She would pay me 50 cents a week and send me to school.

She had a small girl of 6 named Tessa and she wanted me to look after her. So I went and for the next three years spent a large part of my time with the Sheppard family. I spent one school year and three summers from early spring until late fall with them.

One of her sons was Jacob Ingraham Sheppard, named for my grandfather. He was later known as Jake Sheppard, a lawyer for Fort Scott, Kansas.

When the Sheppard family first came to Kansas, their daughter Laverna was seventeen. She had come to teach our school on the home farm, but she was very much in love with a young man in Virginia and was engaged to marry him. He was a smart fine young man.

The only thing Aunt Jane had against him was that he was an illegitimate child. So she made fun of him and wanted the daughter to forget him. He wrote that he was coming west and wanted to stop in Kansas and visit Laverna. She wrote him not to come. That she did not care to see him.

He went to California and in time became one of the richest men there. But Laverna was broken-hearted over the affair. When Aunt Jane saw how hard it was for Laverna, she begged her to write to him and have him come and see her. But Laverna would not do it. After three years she met a man whom she decided to marry and got her trousseau ready. A month before the wedding date she was stricken with pneumonia and died. Aunt Jane was so remorseful over this, she kept Laverna's wedding clothes for thirty years. When Aunt was 85 years old and the last time she visited me she said, "I've always had that to regret". She felt that her interfering in Laverna's real love affair somehow caused the tragic result. The name on the tombstone is spelled Lovernia Sheppard.

At Father's death, Aunt Jane said to Mother, "It is too bad, Phebe, that your children are girls. If they were boys, they would get out and make you a living". Mother said later she worried more and lost more sleep over her two boys than all five girls. Yet they all grew up to be good citizens.....

Coal was discovered in large quantities a few miles east of Godfrey. A man with a team could find plenty of work to do there, digging and hauling the coal to the flat cars on the railroad. My Uncle Sam Sheppard had a coal office and bought coal from the wagons but the men shoveled it into the cars by hand. The price of coal was five to six cents a bushel. My uncle got into trouble with an agent and bought several cars of coal. It ended in a lawsuit with a big loss of money by my uncle. He with Jake and Jim Sheppard then bought a farm a few miles west of town and moved the family there. I went with them. There were six of us with the two boys and Tessa. I took Tessa to school and looked after her generally.

My uncle liked whiskey and drank it "for the stomach's sake". One Sunday when we had come from attending church in the large school house and had reached home, I heard my uncle say to Aunt, "I thought the son-of-a-b was going to ask me to pray!" I was terribly shocked, for I had never heard my uncle pray, anyway. Whiskey made him talkative and my aunt hated the drinking very much. When some Women's Christian Temperance Union people came to Godfrey and organized a Good Templar Lodge, my Aunt was very happy. The whole family joined the lodge and took the pledge.

In Aunt Jane's and Uncle Sam's home I met a different atmosphere than we had at home with my parents. There was always friction. They could not agree about their sons and each had a favorite. My uncle liked whiskey too

well and a few drinks made him act very different from his normal self. He would argue about anything. Once he disagreed with the minister of the church. The minister said: "When ever the church can send preachers to teach and preach to the whole world then the end will come". Uncle Sam said: "the Scripture says the gospel has been preached all over the world".

The minister said: "That is not in the Bible". Uncle Sam insisted it was in the New Testament. After the minister had gone Uncle called me and said, "I will give you twenty five cents if you can find that scripture for me!" I agreed to try and began to read the New Testament. I read every day for awhile until I came to the 23rd Chapter of Colossians and found where Paul said, "the hope of the gospel which ye heard which was preached in all creation under heaven....". Uncle was pleased and I got my twenty five cents.....

The Sheppards and My Grandmother

Aunt Jane Sheppard and Uncle Sam Sheppard still lived in Bourbon County. Grandmother Ingraham, father's mother, lived with them after Grandfather died in 1885. Aunt Jane and Uncle Sam always quarreled a lot but they seemed to get worse about it with Grandmother there. Uncle Sam thought things were so disagreeable in their home that he threatened to leave home and never come back. He had a brother in law in Idaho and Uncle Sam finally left and went out there.

Jake Sheppard, my cousin, was studying law in Fort Scott and making his own way. He was married and his son Jim was about Lena's age. Aunt Jane, Jim and Tessie were all that were left at home except Grandmother Ingraham.

Uncle Sam found in Idaho that there was a lot of land there for homesteading and he filed on a claim. He got on a train and came back and surprised Aunt Jane and they made up again. He gave a glorious account of what a fine country was Idaho. They sold the farm in Bourbon County, loaded up their household goods and stock in train cars and started for Idaho.

They could not take Grandmother as she was 80 years old. She had ten living children but none of them offered her a home, so Aunt Jane took her to the home of my sister Rose in Fort Scott until some arrangement could be made for the care of her. Sister Rose had but three rooms and four small children.

Grandmother did not try to make herself especially agreeable. One day when Rose was mending her husband's trousers, Grandmother said, "What are you working at?" Rose said she was mending the seat of her husband's pants. He was a harness maker and worked sitting at a bench. Grandmother said "I'd be ashamed of that. My husband never sat around enough to wear out the seat of the pants."

But they were very much crowded and Grandmother made much more work for Rose who was looking for another baby. A daughter of Grandmother's lived in a small town about six miles south of Fort Scott. When Sam and Rose suggested that Grandmother go to live with this daughter, she would not go. They were willing to take her but Grandmother smoked a lot of tobacco and the smoke made Rose deathly sick, so Sam decided to do something about it. One day he said, "Grandmother, don't you want to take a ride?" She said "Yes." She got into the buggy and Sam took her to her daughter's in Godfrey. There he left her. The old lady cried about it and Aunt Jane said it was a mean trick on Sam's part, but I did not think it any worse than Aunt Jane did when she left her own mother with Rose.

When the SHEPPARDS got to Cheyenne, Wyoming, Uncle Sam got sick with a cold that developed into pneumonia and he died there. They had to bury him there and leave him. It was a sad mother, son and daughter that went on to Idaho.

(This is incorrect. Samuel died at Weiser, ID and is buried in Weiser Cemetery. ID Historical Society gave me the obituary and his burial is in the Weiser Cemetery register. BS)

Excerpts from Father Came West, Farlington History by Jacob's cousin, Oello Ingraham Martin:

I went to Godfrey the fall of 1875 and went to school that winter there, Aunt Jane kept a transient or short-order eating house and served a meal to travelers for twenty-five cents. She would serve bread, butter, ham and eggs, potatoes, dried apple pie, coffee, cream and sugar, for the price of twenty five cents.

Uncle Sam Sheppard shipped coal to a man named Keene in Fort Scott. My cousins, Jake and Jim, were seventeen and fourteen years old. They hauled coal for Uncle Sam.

Aunt Jane begged Jake to go to school but he decided he wanted to see the world. One night he and a neighbor boy, Ivan Grant, ran away from home. Jake left a note pinned to his pillow. He said he was leaving and would write.

In a week they got a letter from him that Ivan had come home but he was going on West, but would wait for a letter at Nevada, Missouri.

Instead of sending the letter, Uncle Sam took Tessa and went to Nevada to the post office and waited for Jake to come for his letter. When he saw Jake coming down the street, he sent Tessa out to meet him. He was the most surprised boy in the world, but he came home with them.

He was not through "seeing the world", though. He would leave with some boy of his own age and steal rides on the freight trains and sometimes travel as a hobo.

On one occasion he was in Girard with a boy companion and they decided to hop a train and go home to Godfrey from Girard. They waited until the train started and made a jump into an open boxcar. Jake made it all right but his companion slipped and fell under the train. Both of his legs were crushed by the wheels and he died soon after.

When Jake saw what happened he got off of the train immediately. He walked seven and a half miles to our home and I never saw a boy so broken up. He never tried to ride free again. He went to his home the next day, started to school and it was not long before he got a certificate to

teach.

OBITUARY, Topeka Journal, Oct. 19, 1921: J.I. SHEPPARD DIES, Prominent Kansas Attorney Dies at Fort Scott. Was Lawyer for Alexander Howat, Mine Leader.

Fort Scott, Kan., Oct. 19.--Jacob Isaac Sheppard, prominent as a lawyer here for many years, died at this home here early today. Mr. Sheppard was 59 years old. He leaves a widow, a son, J.G. Sheppard, who is a practicing attorney here, and two daughters, Miss Mary Sheppard and a Mrs. McKay of Wichita, Kan. Mr. Sheppard...was educated here, and after working for a time as a section hand studied law in a Fort Scott law office and was admitted to the bar. For many years he was attorney for the United Mine Workers of America in district 14. At the time of his death he was attorney for Alexander Howat, Kansas mine leader. His last appearance in court was in behalf of Howat.

"Jake" Sheppard was one of the most prominent members of the State Bar association and a unique and interesting character. He was a fighting lawyer of the old school and his activity in mine union and the Appeal to Reason cases gave him statewide prominence. He established an extensive practice in southwestern Kansas and was for many years retained as counsel for Socialist organizations and for the Mine Union workers in district 14. When the industrial court law was enacted Sheppard was sent to Topeka with Frank Walsh to help defeat the bill. He urged the legislature to remove the penalty provision from the bill when he saw that passage of a law could not be prevented. He appeared before the joint session of the house and senate during the special session of 1920 when the bill was under consideration.

In the cases against Alexander Howat the Fort Scott lawyer was retained as chief counsel for the mine union chief. His last big legal fight was for Howat when he was tried last summer in the Cherokee county district court. Sheppard had been active in directing the affairs of the Socialists in Kansas. He was for many years their chief counsel and adviser. When the indictments were returned against the Appeal to Reason and its publishers...Sheppard made the spectacular defense for the indicted men. He was believed to have prepared and edited many of the scathing denunciations of government officials which led to returning of the indictments. In spite of his bitter fights Sheppard was an unusually popular lawyer and had hundreds of friends among lawyers and political leaders. He was known personally by almost every man active in public affairs in the state during the last quarter of a century.

From the Topeka Capital, Oct. 22, 1921:

ATTEND SHEPPARD FUNERAL. Howat and Dorchy Barred From Speech-Making or Interviews.

Columbus, Kan., Oct. 21.--Under guard of an officer, Alexander Howat and August Dorchy, deposed and imprisoned officials of the Kansas miners' union, were taken to Fort Scott this afternoon to attend the funeral of J.I. Sheppard, their chief counsel in their trial here. Judge Frank W. Boss granted permission for the prisoners to be taken with the condition imposed that they were to make no speeches or give any newspaper interviews. Justice Judson S. West, of the supreme court, and C. B. Griffith, assistant attorney general, left yesterday for Fort Scott to attend the funeral of J.I. Sheppard. Both are former residents of Fort Scott. W.E. Freeman, of Fort Scott, president of the state federation of labor, also returned to his home to attend the funeral.

From the Fort Scott Daily Tribune-Monitor, October 19, 1921: J.I. SHEPPARD PASSES AWAY. Widely Known Lawyer and Public Man Dead at 59, After Few Weeks Illness of Heart and Kidney Trouble. ---Powerful Character.

This city and this entire section of Kansas were severely shocked this morning to hear of the death of J.I. Sheppard, for years one of the most prominent and most active citizens of this part of the state.

Mr. Sheppard passed away at 2:55 o'clock this morning at his home 824 South Crawford Street as the result of heart trouble, complicated with Bright's disease, with which he has been confined to his home for the past two months. Mr. Sheppard would have been 60 years of age, had he lived until December 17, next. He had been in failing health for fully a year, but his condition did not become really serious until he was stricken two months ago. Since then his condition has grown steadily worse, and a week ago hope of his recovery was abandoned by his physicians.

Mr. Sheppard had been very active for years, not only in the affairs of Ft. Scott and of Bourbon County, but in affairs of statewide and even nationwide importance.

He was a man to whom the word "impossible" was empty of meaning. When he set about to accomplish a thing, he exerted an energy and driving power that were well-nigh irresistible. His ability to surmount obstacles by many of his accomplishments, but by none better, one of his friends said this morning, than his building of Convention Hall here in 1895. In that year Ft. Scott secured three political conventions, the Free Silver Republicans, the Populists and the Democrats. They were all to meet here at the same time but there was no hall having suitable space for such conventions. Mr. Sheppard went out and, practically by his own unaided efforts, raised the money with which to build the hall. Then he saw to it that the work on the building was pushed, so that

it was in readiness for the big meetings. The three parties met here together in 1895, united on a ticket, and carried the state.

Another of his notable accomplishments for Ft. Scott was the securing of the routing of the Jefferson Highway at New Orleans about six years ago. Mr. Sheppard was a member of a delegation of leading citizens who went to New Orleans to make an effort to have the Jefferson Highway routed through Ft. Scott. At New Orleans Mr. Sheppard led the fight for the local route, that the highway was routed through here, in spite of strong efforts made to locate the Kansas section of the route through Iola and other cities farther west. Also, Mr. Sheppard defeated a Missouri faction which was fighting for a route through western Missouri and the rejection of propositions for a Kansas route.

It was through Mr. Sheppard's unaided efforts that the People's College was located here, and to him alone goes the credit for supplanting the old street car system with the present bus line, which is still operating and giving good service.

Mr. Sheppard was an American in the truest sense of the word. He was always intensely loyal to his country, and this loyalty was demonstrated during the recent war. Fearful of the defection of the laboring elements of England, France and Italy during the dark days of the war, Mr. Sheppard went to Washington and personally suggested to President Wilson a commission of American labor leaders be sent to Europe to combat Bolshevik tendencies and to urge loyalty among labor. The President accepted Mr. Sheppard's proposition. The commission consisting of three men was sent. Its leader was Charles Edward Russell (illegible) wide reputation. (illeg.) Mr. Sheppard then editor of the Appeal to Reason, was another member of the commission. As the best illustration of another side of Mr. Sheppard's character, his paying of (illeg.) totaling \$15,000 which he did not legally owe, stands preeminent. When the First National Bank failed, it held paper with Mr. Sheppard's signature, totaling \$18,000. Mr. Sheppard was unaware of the existence of some of these notes. They were placed in the bank by a friend who had taken the liberty of signing Mr. Sheppard's name. But Mr. Sheppard met the matter squarely. He mortgaged his home for \$3000 and bought the securities from the receiver. Besides the \$18,000 in notes he owed about \$20,000 to other creditors. Undismayed by the size of the debt, he (illeg.) to pay it off, and not only succeeded, but later announced that he would pay the remaining \$5000 on the notes that had been held by the First National Bank, although legally they became cancelled when he bought them. And he did just what he said he would - he paid face value of the notes.

This however did not seem so strange to some of the "down-and-outers" who had been helped by Mr. Sheppard, for they learned that he was generous almost to a fault. They found that nobody who ever went to him for aid was refused and that he aided, on his own initiative, many who, through pride, would not have asked. Mr. Sheppard had a country-wide reputation as a lawyer, and especially as a criminal lawyer. For years he had been prominent as a member of the local bar. About 16 years ago, he was county attorney for 4 years, and another leading lawyer said this morning that he could have held the position indefinitely had we wanted it. But the holding of offices did not appeal greatly to Mr. Sheppard. It has been said that he could have been nominated for congress on the Democratic ticket at almost any time, had he been willing to run.

Mr. Sheppard was connected with many criminal cases of countrywide interest, notable among them being the Ard case, the Noah Strebill case and the cases of the Menace and the Appeal to Reason.

The present Industrial Court Law is the outgrowth of an idea that was originally with Mr. Sheppard. At the time of the coal miners strike, when people were suffering for lack of coal, he declared that the rights of the public were paramount to those of any class and said that the state would take action. He went to see Governor Allen about the matter and it was not too long after that before the state took charge of the coal mines. Then the Industrial Court law was drafted and passed. Speaking before the legislature later, Mr. Sheppard repeated his opinion that the rights of the public are paramount to those of any class but expressed his opposition to the penalty clause in the Industrial Court Law. He said that the Law was all right in other respects.

It was Mr. Sheppard who about a dozen years ago formed the trackmen's union composed of local section men. From a local movement he made it become countrywide with organizers in many states.

For many years before establishing the People's College, Mr. Sheppard carried on a correspondence school from his home here and served hundreds of students.

(regarding Fred Warren)...He had defended Warren through the federal court. Warren was charged with publishing improper (illeg.) in his paper. The jail sentence was affirmed and reaffirmed. The time was approaching when Warren must go to jail. Without his knowledge Mr. Sheppard undertook a plan of securing his pardon by President Taft without embarrassing Warren, in the light of his defiant attitude toward the judgment by asking for a pardon at all. Mr. Sheppard conceived the idea of running Warren as a martyr candidate for congress in the Third district on the socialist ticket. The socialists were strong in that district and there was a possibility of attracting a sufficient number of votes from Campbell to Carren to make possible the election of a Democrat. Mr. Sheppard sent for W.R. Smith, then editor of the Columbus Advocate, a Third district Republican paper, and proposed that he suggest to Congressman Campbell the political advisability of securing a pardon for Warren in order to prevent his capitalizing on his imprisonment in politics. Mr. Smith thought it a good idea and wrote

Congressman Campbell such a letter as Mr. Sheppard dictated. Within two or three weeks, and just before the time scheduled for Warren's surrender, the Associated Press carried a Washington dispatch announcing the pardoning of Warren, who truthfully declared he had not asked for a pardon and that it was a great surprise to him.

Jacob Ingraham Sheppard was born December 17, 1961 in Jackson County, West Virginia, and was therefore nearly 60 years of age. He came to Bourbon County 52 years ago with his parents in a covered wagon. He was then about 7 years of age. His parents settled about 7 miles south of Fort Scott in the Godfrey neighborhood. Mr. Sheppard was married in 1885 to Miss Ida Gifford of the Godfrey neighborhood. The marriage occurred at Walkertown.

It was in 1886, 35 years ago when Mr. Sheppard was 25 years of age that he moved to Ft. Scott to accept the position of principal of the Main street school. He held that position for about a year, then took up the study of law, and a short time later formed his first law partnership with C.B. Daughters. This partnership continued for about a year. Then he was in partnership for several months with H.A. Prichard. Then the well-remembered partnership of Biddle, Boyle & Sheppard was formed. This existed for about four years. When it was dissolved, Mr. Sheppard secured his own office and went into partnership with his son, J.G. Sheppard. In 1911 his daughter, Miss Kate Sheppard, became a partner. She left the firm in 1917 and since then Mr. Sheppard and his son have been the only partners.

...In 1918 Mr. Sheppard intimated that his long and successful career as a lawyer started with his studying law by correspondence. In one paragraph he said: I, like millions of others of the working class, had no opportunity as a youth for schooling. What learning I have was mainly obtained by my own efforts without the assistance of schools or colleges. I have practiced law for thirty years and have been usually successful. My worst enemies will concede that much. I never studied a day in a law office or law school until I opened an office of my own. I never saw a lawsuit tried until I tried one myself..

The deceased is survived by his wife, two daughters, Mrs. Kate Sheppard McKay of Wichita, Miss Mary Jane Sheppard, at home, and son James G. Sheppard of (?) 16 South Crawford and grandchildren Julie Ida and William Jacob, daughter and son of J.G. Sheppard, and one brother, James B. Sheppard, of Santa Rosa, Calif.

Mr. Sheppard's office has for more than 15 years been in the present location at 6 1/2 N. Main street. Before that, for a number of years, he had office rooms in the Lotterer building, on east side of Market Square.

It was announced today that the funeral will be held from the home at 824 South Crawford street at 2:30 o'clock Friday afternoon, Rev. Albert Watkins officiating. There will be no music or singing. A LARGE FUNERAL FOR J.G.SHEPPARD

THE BAR ASSOCIATION AND OTHER GROUPS ATTEND

The Quality of His Friendship is Eulogized by the Officiating Pastor.

A large concourse of old friends and neighbors gathered at the Presbyterian church yesterday

afternoon to pay their last tribute of love and esteem at the funeral of James G. Sheppard.

The C.C.C. Club members attended in a body, as did also the Bourbon County Bar Association, courthouse officials and employees, city officials and employees, members of the police department and P.E.O. Club.

In accordance with the wishes of the family, the services were carried out with dignity and simplicity.

The Rev. B.W. Young conducted the services. His remarks were appropriate and consoling, speaking of "Jim" Sheppard as a man who grasped and had a high conception of life and who possessed a splendid mind and soul to serve his home, community and friends with effectiveness. He was a former county attorney.

The minister read scriptures bearing upon life's uncertainty, the love and goodness of God and the future life. Emphasis was given to the thought that the supreme values of life are spiritual, and these include love, mercy, faith, friendship, sympathy, service, goodness and truth. He reminded those present that life here cannot be properly evaluated by material measurements and of the high importance of placing a spiritual interpretation upon all that is said and done, inasmuch as the final issues of life are spiritual.

Referring to the deceased, the pastor expressed his deep personal regard for the fine friendship, made deeper by recent opportunities for a better acquaintance for his true qualities of moral and spiritual earnestness and sincerity. He spoke of his recent regular attendance at the mens' Bible class. The minister mentioned his devotion to his family and in the closing prayer remembered the bereaved companion, son, daughter and mother. Several fitting poems were quoted in the brief eulogy, setting forth the beauty of faith, hope and love.

Mrs. John Hill sang "Shadows" in a beautiful and touching manner. Mrs. Dan Bates was the accompanist.

The unusually large array of flowers banked the entire rostrum of the church. The family block of 'mums and red rosebuds rested on the casket. Nearby was a large wreath from the Bourbon County Bar association and a beautiful triangle from the C.C.C. Club. Additional pieces were from friends and neighbors in Kansas City and Joplin, business friends and associates, and the Presbyterian men's class, P.E.O. and the Ladies' Society of the Methodist Church, Women's Auxiliary of the Presbyterian Church, Grace Class of the Trinity Baptist Church at Kansas City, and many personal remembrances.

Interment was made in the family lot in Evergreen Cemetery. The pallbearers were A.M. Keene, Harry Warren, Walter G. Davis, Frank Shoemaker, Charles Grant, Judge W.F. Jackson, Martin Miller and Frank O'Brien.
