John was the son of Duncan Mackillop and Margaret Beaton of Mabou Ridge. He graduated from MacLean Institute in Massachusetts and was a male professional nurse. John was handsome, very popular and loved company. He became known as Dr. Mackillop and was employed by the city of Halifax as superintendent of the Smallpox Hospital in the days when the disease was prevalent and until WWI, after which the building was turned into a hospital for the Army.

After the death of his wife in 1919 John left his two youngest children with his sister-in-law, Mary Jessie MacDougal, and retired to British Columbia where he taught Indian children. He also worked in some capacity for the Canadian Pacific Railway Company.

He suffered a stroke in 1936 and spent the remaining years of his life with an order of Monks in Victoria, British Columbia. He died in 1939 from hypertension and a cerebral aneurysm at St Joseph's Hospital.

She took a job with a magazine crew travelling on the road all the way to California, and celebrated her 17th birthday on the road. Mary stayed in Los Angeles for 12 years making one trip back to Detroit to visit sister Florence. At that time she also saw Bertha & Duncan, brothers Bill and Angus, also Nellie. Jack and Catherine had gone back to Judique.

She returned to Los Angeles where she tried out for an acting job. She got a part in the film "China Seas" starring Clark Gable, and was also a stand-in for actress Louise Reinier in "The Good Earth".

While in Los Angeles she met her first husband, who was an alcoholic. In 1938 when WWII broke out her husband enlisted in the Navy and she travelled back and forth with him. She went to be with him in Guam in 1950 where she worked at the Navy Exchange. Her husband died when his auto hit an embankment and caught fire.

She met Jack Baltzelle in Guam and married him in 1952. He was in Civil Service and retired in 1979.

The had a wonderful life and settled in Port Charlotte, Florida.

Jack died 18 August 1990. He had a son, Michael, by a previous marriage. Before he died he left instructions that he be cremated and his ashes flown out to Guam and scattered at sea. Jack had been Chief Petty Officer in the Navy during the war.

Sometime during 1999 Mary Jessie was entered into a nursing home in California.

Shortly after the Halifax explosion of 6 Dec 1917, he met Bertha Parnham formerly of Butterwick, England. They were married after a two-year courtship and settled in Detroit, Michigan, where Duncan worked at the auto factory until the depression hit in the 1930's. He held different jobs during this period, at one time working as a milkman and delivering ice. He worked for a bakery for some time and also worked on the WPA. The family made moves from Detroit, to Hazel Park, to Royal Oak, then to Berkley.

In 1940 Duncan was working for John Mannsville Insulation Company and was offered a job as foreman which he declined because he was afraid that he didn't have enough mathematical skills. He also worked for Russell Hurd Landscapers and many of his jobs took him to Port Huron. In 1947 the family moved to Port Huron, Mich, where Duncan got a job at Dunn Paper Mill. He was severely injured when one of the forklift operators accidentally dropped a 500-pound bale of paper pulp on his head, splitting it open from one side of the forehead to the other. He also suffered a ruptured disc in another accident. He was in surgery for five hours and a steel pin was inserted into the spine. He spent six months in a body cast. Only a couple thousand dollars was collected as compensation for this injury. Following the surgery on his back Duncan was reduced to wearing a corset and sleeping with a board under his mattress. After recovering he went to work again at Ullenbrooks on Lapeer, the best nursery in Port Huron. He loved working there.

In later years Duncan and Bertha lived in a mobile home on property belonging to youngest son, Fred. Duncan died at age 85 on 5 January 1979. He had lost most of his vision and hearing, and was suffering from memory loss.

The funeral services were at St Patrick Church in Croswell. The setting was beautiful with two Xmas trees standing one on either side of the altar and the church was full. It was a bitterly cold day with the temperature hovering below zero. Ice and snow covered the ground and the wind was unbearable. It was so cold that the priest hurried the grave side services.

Notes for CHRISTINE ANNE MCKILLOP:

Chris worked in photo mat studios when she was very young, and became quite interested in photography. She left home in 1939 and got a job in Bay City, MI, as a photographer. She lived with a girlhood friend, Irene Burtwell.

In 1943 she joined the WAAC and took basic training in Des Moines, IA. She served overseas in Munich, Germany, as a photographer. One assignment was to photograph war criminals after they were executed.

While in Europe she took in many of the famous sites. She was active in bowling and skiing. Stateside she was stationed at Rapid City, SD, and in Biloxi, Mississippi.

She worked for the telephone company in Detroit when she got her discharge from the service.

She and "Jim" Burger, a pilot in the AF, were married in 1949. He was stationed at an air base in Topeka, Kansas, at the time.

Notes for JAMES E. BURGER:

Jim joined the AF in the early 1940's during WWII. He flew many missions. He was stationed for a number of years in Germany and also in Japan. He received the AF Commendation Medal for meritorious service as flight check aircraft commander at Tinker AFB, Oklahoma.

After twenty some years Jim retired from the AF with the rank of Major. His love of flying led him to work for the FAA as a test pilot. He was responsible for testing instrument-landing systems.

Jim was a Shriner and on 19 January 1985 he was installed as Imperial Potentate at Crescent Temple Mosque, Trenton, New Jersey.

On 2 November 1988 Jim, his co-pilot, and electronics technician, were all killed while on a routine flight to check the instrument-landing system of the Jet Commander 21. Because of icing on the wings and a problem with the de-icer, the plane crashed over the mountains in western Pennsylvania, seven miles northeast of Latrobe Airport. Notes for FLORENCE MCKILLOP:

Florence was born in Detroit, Michigan, the third oldest of eight children. She attended St Mary Magdalen Catholic School, Hazel Park, MI, for the second, third and fourth grades. Because of early illness and hospitalization Florence and her younger sister, Mary, were in the same grade at school. They attended Benjamin Franklin grade school in Royal Oak and from there to Royal Oak Junior High School, then on to Royal Oak High School.

Florence worked after school in the office of Lamina Tool & Die Company doing time cards, payrolls and general office work. After the 10th grade she quit school and worked full-time. She went to night school taking up more stenographic courses, shorthand and bookkeeping.

At age 20 she joined the Womens Army Auxiliary Corps. (WAAC). Her basic training was in Des Moines, IA. It consisted of three months of classes concerning the operations of the government, and finding out what job a person was best suited for. The trainees got up before the break of day, fell in line to be accounted for, then marched to the mess hall for breakfast. They participated in parades on the base, learned to take orders, kept their areas clean and stood footlocker inspection at any given time. The beds had to be made so tight that a coin could be bounced off them. Any rule infraction would land you on latrine duty (cleaning toilets), or KP (kitchen police), which at times involved cleaning the bird droppings off the stair railings outside the mess hall.

After basic training Florence and three others travelled by train to Washington, D. C. for 30-day temporary duty. They had quarters at Bolling Air Force Base crossed the Potomac each morning to get to the Munitions Building where their duty was to type names and addresses on envelopes and a preprinted letter of condolence. The letter bearing General Hap Arnold's signature was forwarded in observance of Memorial Day to the parents of all the servicemen who had been killed in the war.

The next assignment was at Headquarters 2d Air Force, in Colorado Springs, Colorado (later to become Headquarters 15th Air Force). She worked in the Finance Office preparing enlisted men's payrolls.

An interesting note....the WAAC barracks in Colorado Springs are still standing. They are part of what is now called the Olympic Village where athletes train for the Olympics. They are probably used for storage. . . . and no doubt do not still have the two pot-bellied stoves in each one.

After the war she returned to Denver and worked for a short period running a billing machine at The Mine & Smelter Supply Company. She also worked at the Federal Reserve Bank of Denver in the accounting department. She received her high school diploma by taking the GED test (General Education Development).

In San Antonio she worked in civil service at 4th Army Headquarters in the Quadrangle, Fort Sam Houston, and was assigned to the Adjutant General Section. She received a diploma from Draughn's Business College in San Antonio taking up bookkeeping and attending classes after work. Through her boss she met Henry Goodloe Jenkins and they were married in 1949. It was an extremely stormy marriage although it lasted (in appearance only) for 18 years ending in 1969. They had one child, Susan, and Florence was determined to stick it out long enough for Susan to be a "grown-up". In her spare time she taught herself to paint in oils, and became very interested in bowling. In October of 1966 she started working at Kelly Air Force Base assigned to Special Weapons Directorate. There she met Bud Tolle and they were married in October of 1971. He was the "love of her life". They shared the same interests, one of them was bowling and they joined three leagues a week, and bowled in many tournaments. At one time she was named one of the "top 20" women bowlers in San Antonio. After retiring from civil service in 1984 at age 60 she pursued her love of painting, and never gave up the sport of bowling. She and Bud also became avid golfers after the age of 60!!

Their dog "Queenie", a Brittney spaniel, was very special. She was with them on every trip in their motor home. She was a well-travelled dog, had seen the wonders of the Grand Canyon and Niagara Falls, and had sniffed the ground of almost every state. She was their companion for 13 years.

In February of 2002 after having an MRA/MRI she was told she had an aneurysm in the center of her brain (8mm) and was advised not to have surgery but to live her life in full. On 15 May 2002 Florence underwent bilateral hip replacement surgery at St. Luke's Baptist Hospital. Released from Warm Springs (rehab center) on 30 May she was walking using a "walker", and after two months was able to walk without support and looking forward to bowling again. She was back on the lanes again in August 2002 bowling on two leagues.

Notes for ELMER ADOLPH TOLLE:

(Bio written by Bud {Elmer}Tolle on 2 September 2002)

In 1929 the family moved from Bebe to a house on W. Ashby in San Antonio. I was three years old and was standing behind the truck that was backing up to unload the furniture. The driver could not see me and I would have been crushed between the truck and the concrete porch had not Aunt Hilda snatched me away. So, I guess I owe the rest of the story to Aunt Hilda.

My Uncle Anton and Aunt Esther Deschner were in charge of a missionary school about three blocks from where we lived. My cousin Anton was about a year older than I and we played together. There was a slight problem in that I could speak no English and he could speak no German, but we managed.

I started school at Woodlawn Elementary still unable to speak much English. There was no bilingual education then so I had to learn fast.

About 1933 we moved to 819 Canton Street to a house that was moved to that location. I think Dad paid about \$1000 for the house which was paid out in small monthly payments over a number of years. The kids in the neighborhood were upset with us because the house had been moved onto a vacant lot that was used as a neighborhood playground. They got over it after a while as there were other vacant lots around that we used for pickup baseball and football games.

I attended Tynan Elementary School and then went to Emerson Junior School. There, in addition to the 3 R's, we were exposed to art class (I did terribly), wood working (I managed), mechanical drawing (enjoyed but I'm too messy), and metal working (I really enjoyed cutting, binding, welding and just making things). During the summers I mowed lawns (with a push reel mower) for 25 or 50 cents, had a newspaper route, sold magazines, cleaned windows in newly built houses (also for 25 or 50 cents), and in spare time played baseball. We used to play against the black kids at Phylis Wheatly high school where they had a regulation baseball diamond. The games were heated and resulted in some fights but we always made up and came back for some more baseball. Also worked weekends at Patterson's Red & White grocery store.

I started high school at San Antonio Vocational & Technical (Tech). I took Electric Shop and guess this was the beginning of my electronics "career". I was also in the ROTC. During this time I was also the janitor at Hackberry St. Methodist Church. That included every week cutting the grass (still push mower), sweeping and dusting the church and the education building. I think I was paid the grand sum of \$4 dollars per month for this. During the summer I worked at what is now Lackland AFB helping to build barracks.

During the 2nd year of high school things weren't going fast enough to suit me and I became bored and dropped out. I worked as an usher at the Majestic Theater, spent some time playing pool and then went to work for Gulf Oil Company at a station on Romana Plaza. Later I was night manager of a station at Broadway and Josephine. I learned of a program to train people in electronics. I was hired as a Mechanic Learner and went to school in San Antonio for about six months. Was then transferred to a Pre Radar School at University of Texas in Austin. Completed that course in three months and then the program was cancelled and I'm out of work.

Went to work for Consolidated Aircraft Company in Ft. Worth (building B-24 bombers). Worked in the Electrical Test Laboratory testing electrical components before they were installed in the aircraft. Wasn't getting anywhere and heard of a job at Montgomery Ward that sounded like fun so I quit Consolidated and went to Wards. Job was filling mail orders by skating around in the warehouse and gathering the items ordered. Fun job, didn't have to think much and a lot of girls working at the same job.

Tiring of that, I came back to San Antonio, went to Navy Recruiting Office, took a test for an electronics rate and joined the Navy. My friend, Harold Woodward, and I joined at the same time. On 20 January 1944 we left for boot camp at Great Lakes Naval Station. Left in shirtsleeves and that was the last time we were warm for months. It snowed and snowed and we had to keep the sidewalks cleared of it 24/7. I was sick when boot camp was over but I was going to leave even if I had to crawl. Went from there to a high school in Chicago that had been converted to living quarters and an electronics school. From there to Texas A & M for more electronics school and then to Ward Island near Corpus Christi where we started training on actual equipment used in the fleet. From there went to FAW8, a PBY squadron at Whidby Island, Washington, with detachments in Attu and Kiska. Our squadron flew submarine patrol off the coast of California during the "Peace Conference" held during May 1945. This "peace conference" was the beginning of the United Nations.

After VJ day I was transferred to NAS Norfolk and remained there until discharged. Never fired a shot in

anger. Just went where they told me and did what they said to do.

After a short "vacation" I went to work for Western Electric as a Telephone Central Office Equipment Installer. Worked in San Antonio, Austin, Houston, Uvalde and points in between. During one period, while out on strike, went to Trinity University and took tests for several days to qualify for my GED certificate and got my high school diploma. Married Doris Hefner during this period. In Oct 1948 went to work for the Signal Corps at Ft. Sam Houston repairing radio and electronic equipment. Transferred to Kelly Air Force Base in 1950 to work on airborne radar and bombing equipment. Donald was born in 1950. In 1951 moved to Albuquerque to go to work for the 837 Specialized Depot. Had no idea what we would be working on. Turned out to be nuclear weapons. Sandra was born in Albuquerque during this time. The organization was renamed 2837 SPDG (Specialized Depot Group) and relocated back to Kelly Air Force Base in 1952. The 2837 SPDG became the Directorate of Special Weapons and I worked there until retiring in 1981.

During this time I was divorced from Doris, married to Jo Ann Donnell, and Mark was born in 1959. Divorced from Jo Ann, and met the love of my life Florence McKillop Jenkins. We were married 9 October 1971 and, though it's hard for me to believe she has put up with me for all these years. We are still married.

Notes for MARY JEAN MCKILLOP:

Mary attended St. Mary Magdalen Catholic School for two years. When the family moved to Campbell Road in Royal Oak she attended Benjamin Franklin Grade School and then Royal Oak Junior High School.

In 1940 she was working after school hours at Bigley's Grocery and Market in Berkley. When she finished the 10th grade at Royal Oak High School she went to work full time and in 1946 she went to Denver where she and Florence roomed together. She got a job at J C Penny's and worked there for about a year. She returned to Detroit in 1947 and worked at Burroughs Adding Machine Company until they laid off many of their workers.

On a Sunday afternoon Mary was introduced to Bill by a girl friend that she had been visiting. Her friend was taking Mary back to the YWCA when they passed a bar that the friend had been to many times....square dancing being a big attraction.

Notes for WILLIAM LEWIS BRYANT:

Bill served in the United States Army during WWII and was a prisoner of war in a camp in Germany.

In 1961 the Bryant family moved to Sao Paulo, Brazil, where Bill started up a forging plant for Rockwell International. The family was there for a year, then moved to Pennsylvania to set up another forging operation for Rockwell International

In the early 1970's the family moved to Navasota, TX, where Bill undertook setting up the third plant for Interstate Drop Forge, Milwaukee, Wisconsin. He managed it until his retirement at the age of 62, and for some years afterward served as a consulting engineer.

On 2 July 2001 Bill was presented with a "Thank You America" certificate by the French government for the part he played in the liberation of France during WWII. The consul general, Pierre Lepetit made the presentation to the former 101st Infantry Regt, 26th Division staff sergeant, medic and POW.

Bill underwent major heart and back surgeries. By May 2002 he had developed leukemia and also required surgery on his carotid artery.

In the end he had lung and stomach cancer. He passed away in his home the afternoon of 25 February 2004, with his family at his side. One of his last efforts was to try and take Mary out to dinner on their 54th anniversary the week before his death. Bill was loved by all.

Bill had made all arrangements for his funeral ahead of time. The services were held at Lindley Holt Chapel in Navasota, TX,, with Rev. Ben Shawhan officiating. "Dear friends---

It has been quite a year, and we are hopeful that all is going to be well for 2000! Before I go on to all the happenings of the past year, I want to thank all of you for the numerous cards, letters, flowers, prayers, phone calls and messages of support we have received since my cancer diagnosis last year. I truly believe your prayers and good thoughts made a difference and they certainly helped me in my time of trial.

Since it has been so long since many of you have heard about anything other than my illness, a little history is in order. It has been a good year for Jeff and Eric---Jeff graduated from The College of William & Mary with a degree in Finance in May of 1998; Eric graduated from The University of Virginia with a degree in Systems Engineering in May of 1999. Both of them took jobs with Andersen Consulting in Washington, D. C. --- Jeff in June of '98, Eric in June of '99. They both are enjoying the work and the money!! Jeff is living in a condo in Arlington with two of his fraternity brothers who also took jobs with Andersen. He must be having a ball because he is never home, no matter what time I call!! He has just changed projects, this new one is with the IRS. He's not too happy about that, but with his positive attitude I'm sure he'll make the most of it. He has done a lot of travelling in the last year and really liked Atlanta. He hopes for a project there soon. He and two of his friends, Brian and Mark (special friends from high school who spent so much time at our home over the years that I refer to them as my other sons), surprised me at Easter by coming to Tulsa to spend four days with us. I had just finished my last chemo and was starting radiation in a week and was really down. Allen and I were deeply touched by their thoughtfulness and are so proud of them. They are such fine young men. Their visit meant more to me than they will ever know. I'm getting weepy just thinking about it!!

Eric had a very good year. He had his pick from nine job offers ---chose Andersen because they offered an obscene amount of money!! He has an apartment in Tysons Corner with a girl friend (not a girlfriend) that is working for Arthur Andersen. They are getting along very well ---she's still in her room when he leaves for work and is normally in for the night when he returns from work ---they just pass in the night so to speak. Eric (and Jeff) just love that Andersen pays their analysts overtime. They get in as many hours as possible. His current project is with the postal service working on a program whereby you could order stamps from the Internet. He's very excited about it. His girlfriend of three years, Laura, is in her first year of medical school at the University of Virginia. She did very well on her exams for the first semester. Eric goes to Charlottesville as often as he can to visit her and plans to spend New Years with her in Virginia Beach. He spent several weeks with us here in Tulsa after graduation. We really enjoyed having him.

Justin had a wonderful time in eighth grade at Bixby Middle School --- made many good friends, enjoyed playing football and participating in track. Unfortunately, the school was not very challenging --- Justin was in the gifted program, taking honors classes, making all A's --- but his school books never left the entry hall!! So much for the Oklahoma Public School System. He is attending a very reputable private school, Holland Hall, and again has made a stellar adjustment. He loves his classes --- his schedule is very much like a college schedule --- the days are divided into segments and the classes are on a six-day cycle. The subjects are divided amongst the cycle and he has free segments each day to study. They have a great athletic program and participate in the southwest Preparatory School Conference with other private schools in Oklahoma City, Fort Worth, Dallas, Austin, San Antonio and Houston. He wears a button-down collared shirt, a tie, and dress slacks every day. It has taken a bit to get used to it, but he has made some very good friends there too and has done well with the academic challenges. We were very impressed with the teachers and the curriculum. Justin played football and is now playing basketball for the freshman team. We have enjoyed meeting the parents and participating in the cheering section!! They had a winning football season and Justin played almost all of every game. On a side note, Justin is 6'1" and doesn't appear to be through growing yet. Both his brothers are jealous!

Allen is enjoying his job at Willbros. He keeps up with many of his friends from the old Mobil organization and is very glad he's out of there!! This fall the leaves from our 'forest' kept him busier than he wanted, but the yard certainly looks great. He also did some deck staining on his vacation --- thought it would take two days, but it ended up taking the whole vacation! He hasn't been playing as much golf as he would like --- he's been so

sweet --- says he's not going back to it until I can play with him. Hopefully it will be this spring. He's looking forward to having Xmas and New Years' weeks off to enjoy doing nothing with me and the boys.

Now to me --- I had four months of chemotherapy starting last December 29th. My hair fell out the middle of January, which was probably one of the worst things that can ever happen to a woman. One day it was there, the next day it was falling out in clumps. It started coming back in late April-early May and is now about 3 inches long. One good thing --- I always had thin, fine, straight hair. My hair is now thick and very curly. I can't believe it! I always said God would give me good hair in the next life to make up for the awful hair I had in this one. Maybe he gave it to me now! When I finished the chemo, I had seven weeks of radiation treatments. I am still trying to heal from that. Things did not go as well as they could have. In May, I developed a complication called lymphedema and it took until mid September to get it under control. Unfortunately, there is really nothing that can be done for it, you just have to be very careful not to strain the arm or allow any infection to set in. I don't know what I would have done without Allen. He has been such a help to me this past year. We are closer than we have ever been. I love him so much. He went to every doctor appointment and chemotherapy session with me and was such a support. There have been no really bad, lasting side effects yet from all the chemo --- I have low blood counts and suffer from some memory problems, but am told that these are normal and will eventually go away. I am happy to report that the bone-scan, chest and lung X-rays I had taken on December 6 showed no signs of cancer. My tumor marker was also in the normal range. I have another test on my adrenal glands tomorrow and several heart tests scheduled the week after Xmas, but I expect them to be normal also. For now, it looks as if the cancer is gone. Keep me in your prayers. One year out and nine more to go.

Once again, I want to thank all of you. It meant so much to us that so many people took time to encourage us and show their concern. There has been a bright side to my cancer. I had never been a very spiritual person. Because of this ordeal, I found such peace in reading of God's healing plan and comfort from prayer --- things I had never known before. My appreciation for life, health, love, family and friends has been greatly enriched.

Susan found many more friends during her journey through breast cancer. This e-mail was sent to "contreasure" , Connie Pawling, with the subject "God bless you, sweetie...."

"Good morning, my dear friend....."

I am going to bed now, and will say prayers for you. I am remembering us, our first meeting--Stephen King & Her2neu--your sense of humor--St. Louis, the bus ride--you are so special, and a true, dear friend to me. I am so afraid for you, but trust that God will hold you as dear as I, and that all is going to be well. I look forward to making you laugh--and you, me! I have giggled all evening thinking of your dentist's receptionist arming herself to check the bathroom-----

Setting my alarm, and will be praying and thinking of you as you go off to surgery. You will not be alone--there are many of us with you-----Sending you hugs of friendship, sisterhood and just plain love.....

Here is my prayer.

Our father, who art in heaven,
hallowed be thy name,
thy kingdom come, thy will be done,
on earth as it is in heaven.
Give us this day, our daily bread, and
forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who
trespass against us.

Susan suffered a heart attack and passed away at 3 o'clock on the morning of 19 October 2003. Having moved from Bixby, OK, to Savannah, GA, in June of 2003, she and Allen were in the process of building a new home, and they were looking forward to the weddings of Jeff and Eric to Courtney and Jennifer.

Funeral services were held in Murphy's Funeral Home Chapel, Falls Church, VA, on 23 October. Her son Jeff gave the following eulogy:

"First, I would like to thank all of you for coming to show your love and support for my Mom and our family. It is a testament to how much of an impact she could have on people, even if they knew her only briefly. I want to take a few minutes to honor Mom by talking about the ideals she cherished most in life and will continue to cherish for eternity: family, friendship, and laughter.

As I listened to relatives and friends share memories over the past few days, these things come to the surface virtually every time. I will always cherish these memories, and Mom will live forever with the sharing of these memories.

Yesterday my family shared stories about how much fun we have had over the years. Dinner at our house was extremely important, and many of our memories took place while eating dinner. Whether we were at the table, in front of the TV, or at a restaurant, we were together, and we were always laughing. More often than not, we were laughing at each other, trying to make each other snarf or make Mom flee the table for the bathroom. She loved to laugh, and taught us the invaluable lesson of laughing at yourself.

The other thing I want to share with you all is how happy Mom has been over the past few months. I already knew this, but it was reinforced last night talking to you all. Since my Mom was diagnosed with breast cancer almost 5 years ago, there was always a sense of fear for the worst that made it hard to be positive. Through an amazing group of "Breast Friends" she found on the internet, and through the love of her family and friends, Mom's perspective changed, and she lost that sense of fear. The last few months of Mom's life have been filled with happiness and excitement about the future. With a new city and her dream house to be, Eric and I engaged to women that she LOVED, and Justin at Georgia Tech, she was completely content. That's all I have ever wanted

for Mom, and it makes me happy to know she found that happiness, and she will remain happy forever. Mom died in her bed with the love of her life, and she didn't feel any pain, and she had a wonderful last day here. Now she is smiling down on us from heaven, forever laughing, and protecting us. For that, I am happy, because heaven is a better place with her there.

I have never met someone so dedicated to her family and friends as my Mom, and will spend the rest of my life trying to emulate her. As a tribute to my Mom, laugh and never take your family and friends for granted, because she never did."

The following messages were posted on the Cancer Board by Jeff, Eric, Justin and Allen.

First, I want to thank you all for your support and your love. Over the course of this day, I have thought about the many things I have shared with my Mom, our beloved Susan. Along with the same birthday, I think she gave me a lot of the same things you all have written so fondly about. Above all, Mom loved her family, her friends, and laughter. I truly believe she could be made to laugh at any given time, and that her laughter was contagious. One of the most valuable things Mom taught me is to be able to laugh at myself. I can't begin to count the times our family would sit at the dinner table just laughing with each other, "snarfing", and just enjoying each other. I will cherish every one of those memories, and she will always be by my side, laughing with me and making me smile.

As you all know, my Mom loved her family. While this can debatably be said of any mother, what was so special about Mom was the number of people in her "family." You all helped my Mom, and our family, through one of the toughest experiences she ever had to go through, and please believe me when I say she couldn't have done it without you. Mom had an enormous heart, and it was filled with love for Dad, my brothers and I, and you, her cherished friends, who were also a part of her family. Although Mom has taught me millions of lessons over the course of the last 27 years, she has constantly impressed on us the meaning and value of friendship. I am honored to call Susan "Mom", and want you all to know that she is looking down on us now, potentially with a handful of Chee-tohs, and definitely smiling because of her love for us all. Thank you for making her life happier, for that is all she ever did for us.

I too would like to first offer thanks for all the kind thoughts and words that you have shared. During the drive to Savannah today, I kept recalling the various times that I (we – seeing as many of them were referred to in your messages) have shared with my mom these last several months. The two overpowering emotions that I got out of all of these memories was the love that Susan felt for everyone in both her immediate family and her extended family (aka her "Breast Friends") and her happiness. I remember so many occasions where our family would be sitting around the table just talking... which eventually led to stories of the past (the "tree-frog" incident, the "two trees not in a straight line incident", mom's famous "nurturing"). Anyone who has ever been around my Mom knows that these conversations inevitably end with her laughing until she cries and spreading the laughter to everyone around. There was so much of that laughter and happiness these last months and those thoughts and memories are very comforting to me in this difficult time.

One other thing that Jeff touched on is the thanks that goes to each and every one of you for being part of her life. She thought of you often and spoke of you like family, often inserting you into Instant Messenger conversations, on the telephone, and in emails. You were all there for her in her time of need and I know that the bond she shared with you helped give her the strength to persevere. So, thank you all for being there not only for her, but for our whole family.

I echo my older brothers' sentiments of thanks – a thousand times over – towards you. While it is obvious in each of your lives to your friends just how special the bond you share with your "Breast Friends" is, I want you to understand how infectious your love is. My mother's spiritual and emotional health improved so vastly – again, a thousand times over – that I cannot begin to describe to you the thanks and warm feelings I hold in my heart for you all and your families. You are truly a family unto yourselves, because you share with each other an

understanding that those of us who are so helpless cannot ever match. What you all did for my mother I could never have achieved, and from the bottom of my heart and soul I thank you and love you for the joy you put in my mother's heart, life, and spirit.

We all have special memories of Susan. Her astute understanding of geometry (the way two trees can form something other than a straight line), her unique parenting methods (nurturing with a smile and an iron fist J), and her notorious encounters with tree frogs will all bring warm smiles to our faces whenever we hear her name. My own favorite stories will always be mine: different memories around the dinner table, with her manicures and nurturing; her "Chat Nights," which kept her running from the computer room to the bathroom laughing like the Mad Hatter, trying to make it before she peed her pants; the joy I saw in her smile these last few months as she lived her life the way she was always meant to.

But, as Jeff said, as much as I will bring memories of her throughout my life, the lessons she taught me will remain even closer to my heart. I have learned more about love and faith today than I believe I could have ever imagined possible – and I thank you all for this. Your overwhelming responses on the board have brought me smiles and tears of joy, and I see how much love there is to go around in this world where bad things happen to good people. I thank you again with all my soul for the love and faith you all have brought to Susan's spirit – I know that she is looking down on us with a smile.

Yesterday, after I had lost my wonderful wife of 22 years and one month, I began making the painful calls to family and friends. The first call to anyone not related to us by blood was to Connie. I asked her to spread the word through the Susan's family of "Breast Friends". Later in the day, I sat down at the computer and noticed that Susan had left this board up on the screen, obviously her last look at "the Board" before going to bed Saturday night. You were all in her heart and mind that last night.

Out of curiosity, I opened MK's post and began to read. I have been overwhelmed by the love from her family of breast friends. I saw names I had heard many many times and for whom at Susan's request had said many prayers. I monitored the board throughout the day and when the boys arrived they also read closely. Before going to bed for a bit, I asked the boys to prepare some thoughts to feed back to you. What you see above is an example of why Susan was so proud of these guys.

Over the last several months, Susan's spirit was elevated in anticipation of completing the house and of the coming holidays. She was excited to be in the house she loved with her loving sons and their beautiful fiancés. Saturday was a great day for us, though our last together in this life. We spent the day shopping for plumbing fixtures, ceiling fans and carpet. It was a sunny, 70 degree day and we had lunch outside. We genuinely enjoyed being together as we had begun to rediscover our relationship in recent months. There were only the two of us at home now. We made plans to go to Atlanta to see Justin at Ga. Tech and talked about the wedding plans for Jeff and Courtney and Eric and Jennifer.

That night, after our traditional Saturday steak, we watched movies on TV and I held her hand (in part to occasionally check her pulse as heart had been fluttering, but also because our sense of being in love seemed to have been rekindled). Our last day together was one of the best and happiest and I'll remember it always. I'll also remember always the outpouring from you on this board. As the boys have said above, you were a vital part of a stressed life since her diagnosis 5 years ago. We thank you for your sentiments and prayers at this moment, but more for what you added to Susan's short life. I will continue to pray for you all.

Notes for JUSTIN CHRISTOPHER JANACEK:

Justin wrote the following thesis while in his junior year at Holland Hall preparatory to submitting his bid for entrance to Rice University.

"The greatest challenges teenagers face are not related to academics. Taking standardized tests, applying to

colleges, and then trying to get the highest grades possible do not ultimately define an individual. Teenagers are forced to face challenges in their emotional, social, and spiritual lives that help define the individuals they become.

While many of the challenges I have dealt with are common to teenagers, some experiences I have faced, and the lessons I have learned, are very likely unique to myself. When I moved to Washington DC, I immersed myself in Tae Kwon Do classes. Not blessed with natural athletic ability, my private reason for wanting to take the classes was to attain the rank and bragging rights associated with being a black belt. My father was very excited about Tae Kwon Do because of the Tenets of Tae Kwon Do: "Honor, courtesy, integrity, perseverance, self-control, courage, community." As a white belt, (the lowest class in Tae Kwon Do), instructors constantly remind students of these values, hoping they become more than just words, but a way of life. At the time, I paid attention to my instructors because it helped me attain higher rank in my classes. Honor, integrity, perseverance, and community were words I had heard but never really thought about. The other tenets I knew as they applied to me. Self-control entailed behaving in class; courtesy involved being considerate and kind to people, courage was being brave in the face of fear or danger. It took time and experiences for me to fully understand these concepts and to realize my initial definitions only scratched the surface of their true meaning.

Years after joining Tae Kwon Do, when my family had to relocate, I began to understand the meaning of the words honor and courtesy. My family was forced to deal with several challenges in a relatively short time span. As my father looked for a new job and a new house, my mother was fighting diseases in her thyroid and parathyroid glands only to be diagnosed with cancer soon afterwards, while I was dealing with the typical growing pains of adolescence. During this trying time, my father's actions taught me about honor. He never complained about our situation, but instead kept his head high, found a new job and a new home, and cared for my mother. He had every excuse to resent the people who had dealt with him unfairly in conjunction with his previous job. He could have lashed out and become untrusting of other people, but he did not. My father wanted us to learn that even if someone treats you poorly, that is not justification for treating him or her, or anyone else in the same manner. He always did the right thing, even when it was painful for him and his family. My father's honor provided a source of strength for him to continue in his unwavering dedication to making the best life that he possibly could for all of us, regardless of self.

As my mother grew weaker, more and more responsibilities and duties around the house fell upon my father and me. As most teenagers are, I was reluctant to voluntarily take on any new and real 'responsibility.' It became quite necessary, however, for me to assume the duties of many of the household chores. After the ritual grumblings I uttered before setting to work, I usually continued in silence, allowing my mind to wander. I often resented being pulled away from activities that at the time may have seemed important, however in retrospect were far less valuable. When I worked with my father, I would notice that he never seemed to complain. He would explain to me that my mother could not do the task herself, but she gladly would if she could. The most valuable thing I could do was to help whenever and wherever possible, being courteous and respectful of both her and my family's needs. As I grew accustomed to the chores, my perspective changed; I realized how little time they actually took, and what a difference I could make through even a small action. I began to actively seek out those "little things" in and outside of my family life that could make a difference. I made a concerted effort to be more courteous to my family and friends, and it became far less difficult for me to tear myself away from self-serving tasks to help out someone in need.

My mother's struggle with breast cancer opened my eyes to the true meaning and value of community. Despite our best efforts, my family and I were not able to help her cope with the disease on all levels. While at the hospital for a round of radiation, my mother met another breast cancer patient, who directed her to an internet site. This chance meeting introduced my mother to something that radically changed her outlook - a support group of breast cancer patients from across the country that met daily on an on-line message board and chat room. My mother found in this community of friends something her own family could not offer her: understanding. These women shared experiences that were completely foreign to us, and helped her cope with her disease and the fears of living with the unknown. This support group enabled my mother to deal with her cancer, and taught me what being a part of a community truly entails.

My mother's battle with cancer also helped me understand courage. One day I stumbled upon an old training manual for Tae Kwon Do. Immediately, I thought of the tenets, and as I repeated them to myself with a nostalgic smile, I thought about courage. Courage was my mother waking up every morning to face a day of chemotherapy. Courage was the hope of a life after suffering, not knowing what to expect from one day to the next. My mother embodied courage each day of her life since the day she was diagnosed with cancer. Courage began to take on new meaning to me as I internalized its meaning and tried to apply it to myself, just like my family members had successfully done for themselves.

Another sport, football, helped me understand the merits of perseverance and integrity. During high school, I started to play and to love football. As a sophomore, I began seeing action on the varsity squad, and I reveled in playing on the team. I played and started for the entire season as an undersized and overwhelmed

sophomore. Conversely, as a junior, my destiny was not to start in any of the games, but to watch the majority of the season from the sidelines, cheering on a player who won the starting position over me. I talked to a coach about what I needed to do to get more playing time, and he spoke about perseverance, and the integrity that goes along with supporting the greater good of the team, even when it is painful to do. The coach said if I persisted in my efforts and worked as hard as I could, he believed I could be a leader on our football team next year. He told me that one thing that gave me an advantage over other players is that I had the mindset necessary to be successful. I followed his advice and worked hard through the off-season and finally began my senior season. I started every game of my senior year, and received one of three awards given to players by our coaching staff, the Most Improved Player award. When speaking about the award, my coach said that one thing that shaped my character was the perseverance I displayed by not giving up after I was benched my junior year.

The tenets I was taught during Tae Kwon Do have surfaced time and again during my life, and have helped shape my personality and the advice I give to others when they come to me with problems. I tell them that it is important to put everything they face into perspective, and understand that just because something unexpected occurs, it is not necessarily negative. There truly are unique and real problems that people face every day, and one aspect of what is so unique is how people address those problems and challenges. What I have to contribute to the Rice culture is my perspective on the problems I have faced and those I have watched others face. I can offer these things in the hope that I can help my new classmates deal with challenges that are a part of everyone's lives. "
