

Ancestors of Dudley Oliver TYLER

1. Dudley Oliver TYLER^{1,2,3,4,5,6}, born 4 December 1882 in Plainfield, Will, IL^{7,8}; died 9 May 1934 in Lafayette, Tippecanoe, IN^{9,10,11}. He was the son of **2. Lansing Howard TYLER** and **3. Alice Lillian RAY**. He married **(1) Clara R. ZINSER**^{12,13,14,15,16} 9 March 1905 in Carpenter Twp., Jasper, IN^{17,18}. She was born 8 February 1882 in El Paso, Woodford, IL^{19,20,21,22}, and died 17 April 1936 in Carpenter Twp., Jasper, IN^{23,24,25}. She was the daughter of Joel Ferner ZINSER and Martha TOBIAS.

Notes for Dudley Oliver TYLER:

The birth certificate for Dudley states he was the second child born to Alice and Lansing Tyler. The place of birth is listed as Plainfield, IL, and the date of birth is given as December 4, 1882. The certificate, No. 3862, does not have a name written on the line where a child's name should have been entered. The certificate was not signed and returned by the doctor until January 1, 1883.

Dudley, with his parents, moved from Plainfield, Illinois to a farm southwest of Remington in the Spring of 1890.

Dudley, aged 17, was counted twice in the 1900 Federal Census. He was enumerated in his parent's household in Gilboa Twp., Benton County, as well as in the household of Henry A. Milner, in Carpenter Twp., Jasper Co. In both enumerations, his occupation is listed as farm labor.

Heading: "Death Claims Dudley Tyler After A Short Illness; Pneumonia"

Another of our good and substantial citizens passes to the great beyond, about noon on Wednesday, when the life span of Dudly (sic) O. Tyler was closed.

Mr. Tyler had been in his usual health up to four days ago, when he was taken suddenly ill and pneumonia developed. The disease rapidly grew in intensity, and on Tuesday night he was taken to the Home Hospital at Lafayette where he passed away as above stated.

The deceased was one of our most energetic and substantial farmers, revered and respected by all. He had lived in this vicinity since 1890 and on the farm he at present occupied for the past twenty years. His age was 51 past. At the present time he was a member of the township advisory board.

Besides the sorrowing wife he leaves three sons, Hartley, Donald and Ralph the latter two at home and the former living near by. His aged mother, Mrs Alice Tyler of Remington, and two brothers, Simeon of this place and Roy (sic) at Ft. Collins, Colo., and one sister, Mrs. Tom Blake of Rensselaer, besides many friends and near relatives.

The funeral service will be held this Friday afternoon at two o'clock at the M. E. Church.

Dudley O. Tyler was born Dec. 4, 1882 in Plainfield, Ill., the son of L. H. and Alice Tyler, and died May 9, 1934, aged 51 years, 5 months and 4 days.

He was baptized and taken into the Presbyterian church, Jan. 4, 1899. After his marriage to Miss Clara Zinser, on March 9, 1905, he attended the Methodist church with her and there his three sons were baptized and received into the church. H(e) has lived in this community since he was a child of 7 years and received his education in the District School and the Gilboa High School.

An honorable and upright citizen, standing for all that was right and good. As a neighbor and friend he few equals. He was never too tired to help his neighbors who were in need of help. His devotion to his wife and children was a thing of beauty. For them he lived and died.

Surviving him is his wife Clara, his sons Hartley, Donald and Ralph, and two grandchildren. His mother Mrs. Alice Tyler, two brothers, Simeon of Remington, Ray of Fort Collins, Colorado, and a sister, Mrs. Cora Blake, of Rensselaer.

The Jasper County Health Department records incorrectly lists the birthplace of Clara's father, Joel Zinser, as Illinois. The record also incorrectly lists the birthplace of Clara's mother, Martha Tobias Zinser, as Ohio.

Heading: "REMINGTON WOMAN CALLED BY DEATH"

Remington, April 17. - (Special) - Mrs. Clara Tyler, 54, a resident of this vicinity for forty years, died at her home three miles southwest of here this morning at 10:30 o'clock. She had suffered a stroke of apoplexy a month ago and today suffered a second stroke, resulting in her death.

Mrs. Tyler was born February 8, 1882, in El Paso, Ill., the daughter of Joseph (sic) and Martha Zinser, and married Dudley Tyler on March 9, 1905. Following her graduation from the Remington High School, she held a teaching position near here for one year. She was a member of the local Methodist church.

Surviving are three sons, Hartley, Donald and Ralph, all of Remington; a sister, Mrs John Davitt, of El Paso, Ill., and two grandchildren.

The body was removed to the Howard funeral home. Funeral services will be held from the Remington Methodist church, with burial in Remington cemetery.

(2) Obituary for Clara (Zinser) Tyler:

Heading: "Mrs. Clara Tyler Dies Friday"

Mrs. Clara Tyler widow of Dudley Tyler, passed away Friday, April 17, at the family home west of Remington, following an illness of a few weeks. Funeral services were held Sunday afternoon at the Remington M. E. Church, with interment in Remington cemetery.

Clara Zinser, daughter of Joel and Martha Zinser was born at El Paso, Ill., Feb. 8, 1882. With her parents she moved to the farm southwest of Remington in the spring of 1896. She was united with the church at El Paso, when just a young girl, bringing her letter to the Remington Methodist Church in 1898. She graduated with the class of 1901 from the Remington High School, and taught school the following year.

On March 9, 1905 she was united in marriage with Dudley Tyler. To this union were born three sons, Hartley, Donald and Ralph. Her husband preceded her in death, May 9, 1934.

For the past few years she has been in frail health, always courageous, she maintained her standards of home-making until about a month ago, since which time, she has patiently endured suffering and discomfort. Her sister, Mrs. J. W. Davitt has been with her during her last illness, ministering to her, out of the fullness of love, until she peacefully fell asleep in Jesus on April 17, 1936.

She is survived by her three sons, two grandchildren and one sister, Mrs. Davitt of El Paso, Ill. Also two nephews, one of whom, Richard Hannah, made his home with her, and Robert Zinser of Indianapolis. A brother Harvey Zinser, and sister Margurite Hannah preceded her in death. She endeared herself to many friends with the sweetness and beauty of her character.

Conflicting Death Records: Jasper County Health Department Death Records show that Clara's date of death was the 18th of April, in contrast with different newspaper obituaries which indicate the date of death was the 17th. The Health Dept. record lists her age as 54 years, 2 months, and 9 days. By using this age and calculating from her birth date, April 17th seems to be the more probable date of death, and matches the newspapers articles as well.

In the 1880 census, Lansing is listed in the household of his older brother Albert, occupation farmer.

In the Spring of 1890, Lansing moved his family from Plainfield, Illinois to a farm in Gilboa Township, Benton County, Indiana, a few miles southwest of the town of Remington.

Obituary of Lansing H. Tyler:

Heading: DEATH OF L. H. TYLER

Death relieved the suffering of one of our most respected citizens, Monday afternoon at one o'clock when the spirit of Mr. L. H. Tyler passed into the great beyond.

Mr. Tyler had been in poor health for a long time but was able to be up and about some, up to the 21st of June, on which date he was out riding with his daughter. On the 22nd he was stricken with paralysis, since which time he had been growing steadily weaker until he passed quietly away on the day and hour mentioned. He was in his 70th year, and leaves to mourn, a widow, three sons, Simeon, Dudley, and Ray Tyler, and one daughter, Mrs. Cora Blake, besides several grandchildren.

Mr. Tyler had been a resident of this vicinity for many years, and was one of the universally liked and respected men of the community. He will be sadly missed.

The funeral was held Wednesday forenoon, at the home, and burial made in Remington Cemetery.

Lansing Howard Tyler was born in Plainfield, Will Co., Ill., January 24, 1851. On October 20, 1880, he was united in marriage to Alice Lillian Ray, to which union seven children were born. Of these three died in infancy. Those still living, who with their mother, remain to mourn the loss of their father, are Mrs. Cora Blake, Mr. Simeon and Mr. Dudley Tyler, all of Remington, and Mr. Ray Tyler, of Brighton, Colo. With these are eleven grandchildren.

Mr. Tyler died at his home on July 4th, 1921, aged 70 years, 5 months and 10 days.

With his wife he moved from a not far distant farm to his present home about four years ago, having lived in the vicinity of Remington since 1889. His long residence in this community had given him a wide circle of friendships.

Notes for Alice Lillian RAY:

Alice, or "Allie" as her friends called her, studied at the North Western College of the Evangelical Church. She attended the Winter Term of 1879, and possibly additional terms as well. This college was founded in 1861 by the Evangelical Association, a predecessor denomination of the United Methodist Church. The College was first located in Plainfield, IL, and was originally known as Plainfield College. In 1870, the institution was moved to Naperville, DuPage Co., IL. The college name was changed to North Western College in 1864, and again changed to North Central College in 1926.

In the fall of 1941, Alice went to the home of her son, Simeon, where she was cared for until March 15, 1944 when she was taken to the Jasper County Hospital. There she passed away, quietly and peacefully Sunday morning, March 19th. Funeral services were held in the Presbyterian Church, March 21, 1944, with Rev. Dixon Poe in charge.

Notes for Simeon Bush TYLER:

Simeon left New York state as a young man, heading west to Illinois. He was one of the earliest settlers of Will County, Illinois, arriving in the Plainfield area in the mid 1830's. It is reported that Simeon landed from a boat in Chicago, and his first impressions of the place were not favorable. The Chicago area at that time was considered by many to be too swampy for farming purposes, so he made his way south to Plainfield where he acquired 160 acres, to which he added later. Simeon had acreage in both Wheatland and Plainfield Townships of Will County. In 1878, the land was valued at approximately \$75 per acre. He owned 184 acres of farmland at the time of his death in May 1888. Besides being a farmer, Simeon had learned the carpenter's trade at an early age, an occupation he followed until his 50th year. He is credited with the erection of many of the first buildings in Plainfield. He built a sawmill on the DuPage River at Plainfield. In it he sawed the lumber used for building the first frame house in Chicago. Active in religious work, he was a leading Baptist of his locality and assisted in building two churches in Plainfield. He was a staunch Abolitionist and Republican, believing it to be the party of advance and progress. He had a station of the underground railroad on his place.

Death notification published in the Daily News (Joliet, IL), Friday, 11 May 1888 states: "Simeon Tyler, one of Plainfield's oldest citizens, departed this life Wednesday, May 9, 1888, at 2 a.m., aged 73 [sic] years, after a short illness. Funeral Friday at the Baptist Church. Mr. Tyler was one of the earliest members of this church and has always been a close adherent to the Baptist faith. He will be very much missed from among us. He leaves his wife, four sons and one daughter, who have the sincere sympathy of the community in their loss, which all share."

Death notification published in the Joliet Republic and Sun (weekly pub), Friday, 18 May 1888 states: "Died, Wednesday, May 9, at his home in Plainfield, Mr. Simeon Tyler, aged 77 years. Deceased was one of Plainfield's most honored and respected citizens and leaves many friends to mourn his loss. Funeral occurred Friday at the Baptist church."

The 1888 Old Settlers' Association of Will County, Necrology report, compiled by George H. Woodruff and printed in the Joliet Daily Republic and Sun, September 7, 1888 states: "Another old resident of Plainfield, Simeon B. Tyler, died May 9, 1888. He was born in Bethel, Sullivan County, N. Y., Feb. 23, 1811. He came to this state in 1835. Two of his sons, Alfred

(TYLER) and Albert (TYLER), served in the late war, Co. D. 100th Illinois."

[Comment: Sources vary as to the date of Simeon's death. Brigham & Tyler's genealogy as well as Simeon's grave marker at Plainfield Cemetery say 8 May. Joliet newspapers as well as a sworn statement by son, Albert H. Tyler, petitioning the Court of Will County for Letters of Administration in the matter of Simeon's estate, indicate Simeon's death was on 9 May. -- D. Tyler]

The following is an obituary of J. D. George written by Pastor O. P. Graves, published in the Onarga Leader & Review in July 1912:

John Dalrymple George was born near Easton, Penn., Nov. 13, 1827. In March 1847 he came to Wabash County, Indiana; in 1850 to Chicago; in 1851 to Rushville; in 1855 to Will County; in 1865 to Iroquois County, and in 1885 to Onarga, Ill, where he resided until his death July 7th, having sojourned here 84 years, 7 months and 24 days.

On Nov. 20th, 1856 he was united in marriage to Miss Harriet M. Tyler of Plainfield, Ill. To this union were born four children, three daughters and one son, all of whom survive him. In 1890 this wife died, and in 1892 he was united in marriage to Mrs. Emeline Raymond, who also survives him.

Brother George was converted near Williamsport, Penn., when eighteen years of age, and united with the M. E. church two years later, having had his church home and affiliations in the following places: Williamsport, Penn., Wabash, Ind., Rushville, Littleton, Pennington Point, Stickles, Barber's Corner, Lockport, Crescent and Onarga, Illinois. He was a Sunday School superintendent for over thirty years, most of the time at Crescent. This is a remarkable record, 65 years a church member and 30 years a Sunday School superintendent.

Until his health failed Brother George was a regular attendant on all the means of grace, and in the class meeting his voice rang clarion clear and with no uncertain sound as to the merits of his Redeemer, and to the personal application of his own life. Brother George was a man of strong convictions, a firm will, and both consistent and conscientious in the performance of his religious duties. I wish it could be said of all the oncoming generations as well as of him, he maintained the family altar.

These words of history rather than eulogy speak for themselves. He has left a legacy of purity and character better than gold. May God's Grace be sufficient for you at this hour, as it was for him through the four score and four.

The 100th Regiment, Illinois Volunteer Infantry was organized at Joliet, Illinois, and Hubbard was mustered into service on 30 August, along with his younger brother Albert. According to the "Muster and Descriptive Roll of Company D", he is listed as 21 years old, and is described as 5 feet 7 inches tall, with dark hair, blue eyes, and light complexion. Both his town of birth and town of residence are listed as Wheatland, IL. His occupation is listed as Farmer.

On 3 December 1862, Hubbard was reported as sick in hospital at Nashville, TN, but in fact, he had died several days earlier on 22 November of typhoid fever.

According to the Veterans Benefits and Services National Gravesite Locator, Hubbard is buried in the Nashville National Cemetery, 1420 Gallatin Road, South, Madison, TN 37115-4619, PHONE: (615) 736-2839 or (615) 736-2846, FAX: (615) 736-2847. Notes for Albert Henry TYLER:

CIVIL WAR SERVICE - At age 18+, Albert enlisted in the Union Army at formation at Plainfield on 1 August 1862 to serve for 3 years. The 100th Regiment, Illinois Volunteer Infantry was organized at Joliet, Illinois, and Albert was mustered into service on 30 August along with his older brother Hubbard. According to the "Muster and Descriptive Roll of Company D", he is listed as 19 years old, and is described as 5 feet, 3 1/2 inches tall, with light hair, grey eyes, and light complexion. Both his town of birth and town of residence are listed as Wheatland, IL. His occupation is listed as Farmer.

The 100th Regiment broke camp on September 2, 1862 and marched to the train depot where a train of twenty cars was waiting to take the regiment to Springfield. The unit arrived the next morning. At Springfield, their destination was changed from St. Louis, Missouri to Louisville, Kentucky. They proceeded eastward by rail towards Indianapolis, Indiana via Lafayette, where the boys were given a warm reception by it's citizens armed with all kinds of eatables and drink. At almost every station, the train was similarly greeted with folks tossing fruit, flowers, etc. The regiment crossed the Ohio River at Jeffersonville, and marched through Louisville. Here the soldiers received arms, sixty rounds of ammunition, and accoutrements. Louisville at the time was fearful and under martial law, not knowing whether they would fall into the hands of Confederate Gen. Bragg or Union Gen. Buell. Both armies were racing across the state with Louisville as their goal. On the 22nd, Bragg was reported as close by, and the excitement was intense. The 100th was placed on duty at once. Fortunately, Buell's army arrived at the city first, albeit all rags and dirt.

The 100th Regiment was attached to the 1st Brigade, 2nd Division, Army of Kentucky, Dept. of the Ohio to October. It was then attached to the 15th Brigade, 6th Division, 2nd Army Corps, Army of the Ohio, to November 1862. Then it was attached to the 1st Brigade, 1st Division, Left Wing 14th Army Corps, Army of the Cumberland, to January 1863. After that, it was attached to the 1st Brigade, 1st Division, 21st Army Corps, Army of the Cumberland, to October, 1863, and then finally the 2nd Brigade, 2nd Division, 4th Army Corps, to June 1865.

During the time Albert Tyler was assigned to the 100th Regiment, it's service included: The pursuit of Gen. Bragg into Kentucky, October 1-18; Battle of Perryville, Kentucky, October 8 (Reserve); Nelson's Cross Roads, October 18; March to Nashville, Tennessee, October 18-November 26, and duty there until December 26th; Advance on Murfreesboro, December 26-30; Lavergne, December 26-27; Battle of Stone's River, Dec 30-31, 1862 and January 1-2, 1863; At Murfreesboro until June 1863; Middle Tennessee or Tullahoma Campaign, June 24-July 7; Occupation of Middle Tennessee until August 16; Passage of Cumberland Mountains and Tennessee River and Chickamauga (GA) Campaign, August 22-24; Near Lee and Gordon's Mills, September 17-18; Battle of Chickamauga, Georgia, September 19-20; Seige of Chattanooga, Tennessee, September 24-November 23;

Chattanooga-Ringgold Campaign, November 23-27; Battles of Orchard Knob, November 23-24; Mission Ridge, November 25; March to relief of Knoxville and operations in East Tennessee, December 28-February 1, 1864; At Athens, Tennessee, February to April, 1864.

On April 28, 1864 (February 6, 1864 according to pension document notes), Albert was transferred from the 100th Regiment to the 160th Company, 2nd Battalion of the Veterans Reserve Corps (VRC). The 100th Illinois went on to participate in many more battles in the campaigns of Tennessee and northern Georgia. The regiment returned to Nashville in the Spring of 1865, was mustered out on June 12, and finally discharged at Chicago on June 15. Of the original 39 commissioned officers and 868 enlisted men organized at Joliet, the regiment lost a total of 214 men during service. Seven officers and 73 enlisted men were killed and mortally wounded, and 134 enlisted men died by disease.

During his service, rolls show Albert present except as follows: Dec 31, 1862 - went to a convalescent camp at Nashville, TN. Dec 26, 1862 - reported in Nashville hospital on detail. Oct 31, 1864 - already on detail service with portable hospital transport since Sep 25, 1864. Same to June 30, 1865.

During his service, medical records show Albert was treated as follows: as A. Tylor (rank, company, and regiment not shown), also shown as A. Tylor, Pvt, Co. D, 100 Illinois, various dates from January 5-18, 1863, (no diagnosis). Examined: as A. B. Taylor, Pvt, Co B, (also shown as Albert Taylor, Co. D, and as A. Tylor) from January 21, to February 28, 1863, catarrh, (diagnosis also shown as influenza); as Albert Tyler, Pvt, Co. D, from February 28 to March 16, 1863 (pleurodemia); as Albert H. Taylor, from Nov 18, 1863 to February 6, 1864 (chronic diarrhea). Transferred to 2nd Battalion, IL, February 6, 1864; as A. H. Tyler, Pvt., 160 Co., Veterans Reserve Corps [VRC], from May 1, 1864 to June 27, 1865 (no diagnosis).

On June 29, 1865, Albert was honorably discharged from the VRC at Louisville, KY, by reason of medical disabilities. Dr. Joseph P. Barnum, Acting Assistant Surgeon-US Army, certified that Albert was incapable of performing duties of a soldier because of Phthisis Pulmonalis developed by exposure since entering the service. He rated Albert's degree of disability as one-half.

In October 1891, Albert applied to the government for an Invalid Pension on the basis of disease of the lungs, brain (due to sunstroke), and piles. In the pension claim, Albert states the following: "I have had a cough since the war ended and have spit blood. I had a sunstroke two years ago and have not been able to do a hard day's work since - I have piles." The surgeon's certificate dated December 2, 1891 states the following conditions: Pulse rate 84; respiration 20; temperature 98.5; height 5 feet 8 1/2 inches; weight 145 pounds; age 48 years. The Invalid Pension was approved in April 1893 at the rate of \$6 per month, retroactive back to 23 October 1891. Following Albert's death in February 1900, the Invalid Pension was suspended.

Wife Ann, at age 57, applied for a Widow's Pension in June 1900. It was approved in September 1900 at the rate of \$8 per month, retroactive back to 14 June. At the time of Ann's death in July of 1922, she was receiving the pension at the rate of \$30 per month.

An affidavit signed by David W. Jump, M.D., that was filed with the Widow's Pension application, states that Albert H. Tyler died on 8 February 1900. The doctor stated that he was not present at Albert's death, but saw his body the next day. The doctor stated that he was Albert H. Tyler's attending physician during Albert's last illness. Affidavit signed 24 April 1901.

OBITUARY - An article was published in the Joliet Daily News, Thursday, 8 Feb 1900 under the heading of: "SUDDENLY STRICKEN -- Capt. A. H. Tyler, of Plainfield, dies this afternoon -- Succumbs While On Collins Street - Taken Into Bray's Drug Store In Dying Condition - Was Brother of S. S. Tyler of This City and a Veteran of Civil War." The body of the article reads, "Capt. A. H. Tyler, a well known resident of Plainfield, was suddenly stricken with what appeared to be acute asthma, this afternoon while on Collins street and died at Bray's drug store at 1 o'clock. He had come to Joliet on business and was on his way down town when he suffered an attack of his old trouble and was unable to get his breath. He died soon after being assisted into the drug store. His brother, S. S. Tyler, living on Eastern avenue, was immediately notified and took charge of the remains, and arrangements were made to remove them to Plainfield this afternoon. Captain Tyler was born on a farm several miles northeast of Plainfield and has made his home on the old homestead since. Several weeks ago he had a sale of his personal property and also disposed of his farm to Asa Mather, expecting to move to town in the spring. He had been a sufferer from what was termed asthma and during the past few months has been in a serious condition. Mr. Tyler served in the civil war and was a member of the Plainfield post G. A. R. He leaves besides a wife, a daughter, Mrs Avery Lambert, of DuPage; a brother, Lansing, of Goodland, Ind.; another brother, Ralph W., of Galesburg, and S. S. Tyler, of Joliet, besides a sister, Mrs. Wesley Simmons, living in Nebraska." [Comment: Although the newspaper article assigns the rank of Captain to Albert, there is no evidence that he attained this rank. All pension records document his rank as Private - D. Tyler]

A short paragraph published in the Joliet Weekly News, Thursday, 15 February 1900 states, "The funeral of A. H. Tyler was held at the M. E. Church Sabbath afternoon."

OBITUARY - An article was published in the Joliet Evening Herald-News, Thursday, July 20, 1922, under the heading of: "MRS. ANN TYLER SUCCUMBS TO SHORT ILLNESS, Prominent Plainfield Resident Is Taken By Death Today." The body of the article reads, "Mrs. Ann Tyler, 79 years old, of Plainfield and a resident of Will County for 69 years, died at the home of her daughter, Mrs Avery Lambert, of Plainfield at noon today. Mrs. Tyler came from the east with her parents when a child, and has been a resident of Plainfield the greater part of her life. She suffered a paralytic stroke last Thursday, and her death today was the result of the stroke. She is survived by her daughter, Mrs. Lambert; one brother, George Dunlap of Wheaton; one sister, Mrs Libby Walker of Wellington, Ill.; and by one grandson, Burton Lambert of Plainfield. The funeral will be held from the home of Mrs. Lambert Saturday at 3 o'clock. Burial will be in the Plainfield Cemetery."

Notes for Simeon Stephen TYLER:

Simeon Stephen studied at the North Western College of the Evangelical Church. This college was founded in 1861 by the Evangelical Association, a predecessor denomination of the United Methodist Church. The College was first located in Plainfield, IL, and was originally known as Plainfield College. In 1870, the institution was moved to Naperville, DuPage Co., IL. The college name was changed to North Western College in 1864, and again changed to North Central College in 1926.

Excerpt from an article published in the Genealogical and Biographical Record of Will County, Illinois (pub. Chicago, 1900) contains the following information about Simeon S. Tyler: "Simeon S. Tyler, who is engaged in the insurance and real-estate business in Joliet, was born in this county May 1, 1849. He is a member of a family whose genealogy is traced back to 1317 in England and Holland and whose members have been prominent in American history since early colonial days. ...(Simeon S. Tyler) was reared in Plainfield, where his father resided from 1832 until his death in February, 1889 [sic] (actually was May 1888). When he was a boy his older brothers

started to the front to aid in defending the Union. One of them, Hubbard A., who was then seventeen years old, died of typhoid fever at Nashville, Tenn., during his term of service. Unable on account of his youth to go with his brothers, (Simeon) was forced to content himself with the routine of study in the village school. Later he studied in the Northwestern College of the Evangelical Church, which was then in Plainfield, but is now in Naperville. His first venture in business was as a merchant in Evansville, Ind. After some time he came to Joliet. Later he made a trip to Kansas and selected land near Dodge City, on the old Santa Fe trail. Locating there he has for three and one-half years engaged in the clearing and cultivating of his land, after which he returned to Joliet. As an insurance agent he represents twelve of the old-line standard companies. Since he started in the insurance business nearly twenty-five years ago he has represented a number of these companies steadily, which speaks volumes for his ability and knowledge of the business. From early boyhood his sympathies have been with the Republican party, which he was reared to believe the party of advance and progress. ...Abolitionist and Republican, and his brothers were no less strong in their political sympathies. However, he has never cared for office and has never been active in politics. Fraternally he is connected with Mount Joliet Lodge No. 42, A. F. & A. M. In 1888 he erected on Eastern avenue the comfortable residence where he and his family have since made their home. He was married, November 18, 1874, to Miss Lovice B. Towne, a daughter of Caroline (Hammond) Towne, of Waupun, Wis. they have two children, Walter S. and Dorris, the former a student in the Illinois University. The family are connected with Central Presbyterian Church."

Simeon S. Tyler owned S. S. Tyler & Company, Insurance Agents, located at 227 Jefferson in Joliet in 1891 and 1892. This information is per the Joliet, Illinois City Directory. The directory lists George W. Fouser, Miss Mamie Murphy, and Miss Mary Polson as employees. The city directory lists S. S. Tyler's home address as 121 S. Eastern Ave., Joliet.

Obituary published in the Joliet Evening Herald, Tuesday, 26 Jul 1910, under the heading of "S. S. Tyler, Veteran Insurance Agent, Succumbs After a Long Period of Illness" is quoted as follows: "Simeon S. Tyler, for thirty-five years a prominent real estate and insurance agent, died at his home, 121 South Eastern avenue, last evening at 9 o'clock. Mr. Tyler has been sick since Christmas, and during that period was confined to his bed most of the time. The deceased was well known in Joliet. He was born in Will county, May 1, 1849, and spent his entire life in this vicinity. His parents were numbered among the first settlers of Will county, settling near Plainfield. -- Related to President -- The elder Tyler was a member of an old English family, who came to America in the early days. Their names are linked with many colonial events, and the early history of the country. John Tyler, president of the United States at the time the deceased was born, was a relative. Mr. Tyler lived with his parents at Plainfield until a young man. He finished a course at the Northwestern College of the Evangelical church, which was then located at Plainfield, but which later moved to Naperville. After completing his college course the young man went to Evansville, Ind., where he entered the mercantile business. He remained in the Indiana city for three years and returned and settled at Joliet. Some few years later he went to Kansas and took up a claim. For three years he lived there where he farmed. Mr. Tyler then moved back to Joliet, where he has since resided. -- Identified Fraternally -- In politics the deceased was a staunch Republican and took a prominent part in the party's work. He was a Mason and a

member of other fraternal orders. November 18, 1874, he was married to Miss Lovice Towne, of Waupun, Wis. Mrs. Tyler and a son and daughter are left. The son, Walter, resides at Bridgeport, Conn., and Doris lives with her parents. He leaves one sister, Mrs. E. Simmond [sic], of Fairbury, Neb., and two brothers, Ralph, of Galesburg, and Lawrence [sic], of Remington, Ind. The funeral will take place Thursday at 10 o'clock from the residence. Rev. D. C. Miller, of Chicago, will officiate. Burial will be at Oakwood cemetery."

[Comment: The statement made in the above Joliet Evening Herald article about Simeon being related to President John Tyler is highly doubtful. I personally believe this to be false. There does not seem to be a documented connection between President John Tyler's line and the descendants of Roger Tyler of Connecticut, at least within the United States. - D. Tyler]

Obituary:
Wesley William Simmons was born in Victor, New York Nov. 7 1851. He came to Plainfield, IL when a young man and was there united in marriage with Esther Ruth Tyler. To this union were born two children, Mabel Ruth and Grace Estella. In 1878 Mr. Simmons and family moved to Fairbury, Nebraska and have made their home there since that time. He united with the Baptist Church a number of years ago. Mr. Simmons passed away at the home of his daughter in Fairbury March 29, 1927 at the age of 75 years 4 months and 22 days. He leaves to mourn his death two daughters, Mrs. Mabel Stoneman and Grace Sperry of Simoam Springs, Ark., eleven grandchildren, and a host of friends.
Funeral services are being held this Thursday afternoon from the Baptist Church conducted by Pastor Rev. Wm. Park.

Obituary from the Fairbury Journal, Thursday, March 31, 1927:
Death of W. W. Simmons

W. W. Simmons died at the home of his daughter, Mrs. Stoneman, in Fairbury, Nebr., on Mar. 29, 1927, at the age of 75 years, 4 months, and 22 days. Mr. Simmons had spent the winter with his grandson, Kenneth Stoneman, touring in the south and was apparently in his usual health until he was suddenly taken ill on Monday and died the next morning.

Wesley William Simmons was born at Victor, New York, Nov. 7, 1851. When a young man he came to Plainfield, Ill., and was there united in marriage to Esther Ruth Tyler. Two daughters, Mable Ruth and Grace Estella were born there.

The family moved near Fairbury in 1878 and lived on their farm southwest of the city until about 1902. Mr. Simmons continued to farm his land until the last few years, when they moved to Fairbury. Mrs. Simmons died six years ago. For many years Mr. Simmons had been a member of the Baptist Church.

He leaves his two daughters, Mrs. Stoneman of Fairbury and Mrs. Grace Sperry of Siloam Springs, Ark.; eleven grandchildren and three great-grandchildren. A grandchild, Mrs. Ira Henry and two children of Nevada, Nebr., came for the funeral which was held at the Baptist church, Thursday afternoon with Rev. Park officiating. Interment was in the Fairbury cemetery.

Note that Mabel was spelled differently in the two obituaries: Mabel & Mable.

The obituary states that "a grandchild, Mrs. Ira Henry and two children of Nevada, Nebr. came to the funeral." Maybe 'Henry' is misspelled and 'Handley' was meant. Mabel's eldest daughter, Isabell, was married to Ira Handley and had two children. But if 'Henry' was correct, then Grace's daughter Clara must have married

an Ira Henry.

From a note signed by Simeon S. Tyler, brother, among the Probate Court records of Simeon B. Tyler's estate, it was determined that Florian B. Tyler died in Dodge City, Kansas. Circumstances surrounding his death are unknown, however, Joliet newspaper death notices mention Florian having a serious illness. There is record of payment made to Dr. W. F. Mason* of Dodge City for his services, among Simeon B.'s records. Simeon S. traveled to Dodge City at the request of his father to attend to the body of brother Florian. A round trip ticket to Dodge City was purchased for \$59 on 8 Sept 1880, the date of Florian's death. On 10 September 1880, \$105 was paid for a casket and embalming the body.

Death notification published in the Joliet Daily Sun, Thursday, 9 Sep 1880 states:

"R. W. Tyler, of this city, son of S. B. Tyler, of Plainfield [sic], this county, received a telegram from Dodge City, Kansas, Wednesday afternoon, that his brother, Florian [sic] B. Tyler, was dead. Another telegram preceded this a few hours announcing the serious illness of Mr. Tyler, and Simeon Tyler started by the first train for Dodge City."

Death notification published in the Joliet Daily Sun, Saturday, 11 Sep 1880 states:

"The remains of the late F. B. Tyler, who died a few days ago at Dodge City, Kansas, will arrive in this city to-morrow morning [sic] and, will be taken at once to Plainfield. The funeral will be held at the Baptist Church in that place at 11 a.m."

Death notification published in the Joliet Republican (weekly pub), Saturday, 11 Sep 1880 states: "Mr. Simeon Tyler, with E. B. Shaw, in the insurance business in this city, received a telegram yesterday morning from Dodge City, Kan., announcing the serious illness of his brother, Florian B. Tyler, who is engaged in railroading at that point, and started at once for Dodge City. In the afternoon his brother, Mr. R. W. Tyler, received a telegram announcing the death of Florian. Their father, Mr. S. B. Tyler, resides at Plainfield, in this county. The body will be brought home for burial."

*Note: Dr. W. F. Mason and his family are enumerated in the 1880 Census for Dodge City, Ford County, Kansas. Dr. Mason is listed as age 35 and was born in Ohio. His wife Lina, age 29, daughter Hattie, age 6, and son Marvin, age 2, are all listed as having been born in Michigan.

George McMillen enlisted in the Union Army at Monticello, NY on September 18, 1861 to serve a term of three years. He was 15 years and 5 months old, although his military records give his age as eighteen. He was mustered in to Company K, 56th Infantry on 10 October 1861 as a Private. He was discharged on the 20th of February 1864 at Beaufort, SC at the rank of Corporal by reason of reenlistment as a veteran. He was promoted to Sergeant upon reenlistment on 22 February 1864. He was mustered out at the rank of Sergeant with the rest of his company on October 17, 1865 at Charleston, S.C., having served a total of 4 years. George served under Major General George B. McClellan in the Peninsula Campaign of 1862. He was in the following battles and engagements: Seige of Yorktown, VA (15 Apr - 4 May, 1862); Williamsburgh, VA (5 May 1862); Bolton Ridge; White Oak Swamp Bridge, VA (30 Jun 1862); Fair Oaks, VA (31 May - 1 Jun 1862); Malvern Hill, VA (1 Jul 1862); Honey Hill, SC (30 Nov 1864); and Levins. He was slightly wounded twice. George's discharge certificate describes him as having blue eyes, brown hair, a light complexion, and being 5 ft. 7 in. high. Another record describes him as having hazel eyes, black hair, and being 5 ft. 8 in. high. Both military documents state that George was born in Dutchess Co., NY, and his occupation was a farmer. SOURCE: New York State Archives, New York State Education Dept., Albany, NY, and notes of Ms. Lucy McMillen, daughter.

George died at National Soldier's Home in Milwaukee, WI on Tuesday, April 25, at 5 o'clock. Dropsy was the cause of death. He was buried in the cemetery at the home and word was not sent to the family until some of the members of G. W. Spencer Post No. 489, Grand Army of the Republic, of which he had long been a member, wrote of their coming visit. Their letter was returned with blue pencilled note "DEAD." A response to a telegram confirmed the death and the body was disinterred

on May 2, 1911, and prepared for burial in the family lot at Plainfield Cemetery, Plainfield, IL. Members of G. W. Spencer Post entered a protest against the actions of the officials of the Soldier's Home, who failed to advise members of the family of his impending death or of his burial. Protest was also made by the family with no result, this protest being directed to the Veterans Administration in Washington, DC.

The 1810 Federal Census for the Town of Bethel, Sullivan County, New York contains an entry for a Timothy Tyler. The enumeration lists the following: One male child under the age of 10, (b. 1801-1810); an unknown child? Two male children between 10 and 16 (b.1794-1800); possibly Jesse and Stephen? One male of 45 or older (b. before 1765); Timothy. 3 female

children under 10 (b. 1801-1810); possibly Hester, Sarah, and Asantha?, and one female between 26 and 44 (b. 1765-1784); wife Rachel? This census record would certainly appear to be "our" Timothy's family, although no conclusive proof can be made. Upon analysis, the age ranges all closely match with the information that we have on the birth dates of the family members found in other sources. If the census data is correct, however, one male child is missing from our presently known list of Timothy and Rachel's children. In 1810, a male under 10 years of age existed. If we look at the children's birth dates, it can be seen that a child was born about every 2 to 3 years. The widest gap is about 5 years between the births of Sarah and Asantha. One might speculate that there was a boy born between these two sisters. This is not an unreasonable possibility, and it would explain a male child under 10 years of age accounted for in the 1810 census.

Timothy Tyler served as a Private in Captain Mill's Company of Artificiers during the Revolutionary War, according to Volume I of "New York in the Revolution as Colony and State". See page 67. He also served in Captain DeWitt's Company of the Orange County (NY) Militia.

The exact date and place of Timothy's death, as well as the place of his burial is unknown. Brigham & Tyler, in their Tyler Genealogy, state that Timothy died in 1820, probably in Lebanon, Wayne County, Pennsylvania. Lebanon refers to a township in Wayne County. This seems to be a likely possibility because Timothy's son Stephen lived in Lebanon Township at that time. Another source says Timothy died in Jeffersonville, Sullivan County, NY, but I tend to think this is an error wherein the researcher confused the location for the death of Timothy Tyler, son of Paul Tyler with the death location of Timothy, son of Bezaleel. The two Timothys were related, the elder as uncle and the younger as nephew.

NOTE: The 1820 Federal Census for the Town of Bethel does not contain a listing for the family of Timothy and Rachel Tyler. There is an enumeration for a Timothy Tyler and family, but upon examining the ages of the family members, this is a younger family and they don't match up with Timothy, Rachel or their children. This family listing is most probably that of Timothy Tyler and wife Hannah Hallett, who lived at Jeffersonville, Sullivan County. This particular Timothy was the son of Paul Tyler and Hester Brink.

Page 162 of the Minisink Valley Reformed Dutch Church records shows that a RACHEL MIDDAG was baptized on 10 Feb 1773. The parents listed were Gideon Middag and Gerretje Kortregt. Witnesses listed were Cornelius Van Garden and Rachel Middag. I have not been able to confirm whether or not the Rachel who was baptized on this date is the very same Rachel that married Timothy Tyler, although other reseachers have stated that it is.

The 1810 Federal Census for the Town of Bethel, Sullivan County, New York contains an entry for a Timothy Tyler and family. The enumeration lists one female in the category between the ages of 26 and 44. This would place Rachel's birth year between 1765 and 1784. Most likely she was born shortly before the date of her baptism, 10 February 1773.
