Notes for CAPTAIN JOHN ROGERS:

John started the Roger surname connected with the Cherokee, which includes Chief William Charles Rogers, Diana Rogers Houston (Sam Houston's wife) and Will Rogers (there is question whether there is a blood connection to Will Rogers). He was a Scottish trader. He was reported to be a Tory Captain during the Revolutionary War and fought with John Stuart in the Carolinas. He lived about 12 miles south of Calhoun TN, near the Hiwassee and TN Rivers. He plyed boats on both rivers. In 1817 he left his home near Lookout Mt. and traveled by keel boat with 31 other people. They settled at Big Mulberry Bend, about 20 miles south of present day Ft. Smith, AR.

Some speculate that John was the son of Ben Rogers who was the brother of William. Beginning in Wythe County, Virginia, William went to Penn. and Ben to TN.

In "History of the Cherokee Indians", by Emmet Starr, on page 305, John Rogers is listed as a spouse to Elizabeth Emory, 1'1, 1'2, 2'3.

Jennie Due was John's stepdaughter from Elizabeth Emory.

Notes for JENNIE DUE:

From "The Texas Cherokee", Dianna Everett, Univ of OK Press, p 146; "interesting to note... Talihina's mother (John Roger's wife) was named Jennie Due; coincidentally one of Duwali's three wives was named Jennie (the other two were Utsuta and Utiyu). It is possible the Duwali married Jennie Due after the death of John Rogers thereby becoming Talihina's "father".

Jennie was John Roger's step-daughter.

Notes for DIANA ROGERS:

Diana Rogers Gentry was the widow of David Gentry, a half breed blacksmith who came to AR as early as 1817 and died in a skirmish with the Osage. Diana lived with Sam at Wilson Creek, Indian Territory where Sam had a crude store. It is thought that she was about 10 years younger than Sam. After her death she was buried near Cantonment Gibson. Later moved to the National Cemetery at Fort Gibson on the west side of the Officer's Circle, grave " 2467. Tombstone reads "Talahina, wife of Sam Houston".

Notes for JOHN ROGERS, JR.:

Through the the influence of John Rogers, a mission school was established at Hiwassee in 1799 by Reverend Gideon Blackburn, a Presbyterian. He had the military rank of Captain. He was the Captain of the Cherokee troops of Andrew Jackson in the Battle of Horseshoe Bend, during the Creek War. John moved to Dardanelle Rock in 1815. He moved to "Grand Saline" in 1824. He was one of the signers of the treaty of May 6, 1828. He was president of the committee (of the Cherokee Nation, West) in 1833. He became chief of the Cherokee Nation West, in 1839, after his uncle, OO-LOO-TES KEE, also known as, John Jolly. He died while an "Old Settler" delegate at Washington, June 12, 1846, at the home of Eugenia Townsley. He is buried in the Congressional Cemetery in Washington D. C. at site #89, range 40. There is no headstone. He was there to present claims for the possession or reimbursement for the salt works.

Captain John Rogers and Colonel A. P. Chouteau had established the salt works on the east side of the Grand River, near present day Salina, in Mayes County, OK.

16. JUDGE THOMAS LEWIS⁴ ROGERS II (*THOMAS LEWIS³, JOHN², JOHN¹*) was born August 11, 1837 in Cherokee Nation, Indian Territory, and died January 01, 1909 in Pawhuska, Oklahoma. He married (1) ELLEN COODY Bef. 1861, daughter of ARCHIBALD COODY and ELIZABETH BROWN. She was born Abt. 1842. He married (2) NANCY CHAMBERS MARTIN 1869, daughter of JOSEPH MARTIN and JULIA LOMBARD. She was born October 30, 1849 in Cabin Creek, Delaware Dist., CNW, and died January 27, 1933.

Notes for JUDGE THOMAS LEWIS ROGERS II:

Thomas' father was mixed blood Cherokee and from Georgia. His mother was mixed blood Osage. He was first cousin to W. C. Rogers who was principle chief of the Cherokees at the time of Thomas' death (1909) and Lewis Rogers, Sr. of Avant. On his mother's side he was first cousins to Albert and Joseph Lombard and A. L. Martin, (maybe J.L. Martin)

He joined the confederate army in 1861 at Denmark, Cherokee Nation and served as 1st Lieutenant in Butler's company under General Stone Waite. After the war he lived in the Cherokee Nation until he moved to the Osage nation and lived out his life here. He took a prominent part in the organization of the Osage government and was it's first Chief Justice. Hes served as President of the Osage National Council and served as an Osage delegate in Washington several times.

He was a member of the Masonic fraternity, a Knight Templar, a Shriner and Scottish Rite Mason. He was also a member of the Eastern Star and the B.P.O.E.

"He was a man of great culture and refinement, although raised under adverse circumstances."

All the information recorded on Thomas L. Rogers was found in the Osage Journal, January 7, 1909, page 1. Osage Al. No. 1807

Listed in the 1887 census in Thomas' household were, Rodman, Antoine - Neph - 15 (in his obituary he is listed as Antwine) and Payne, Lulu - Niece - 13 (in his obituary she is listed as Lulu Collins, also a John Collins is listed, possibly her husband. Also listed is a "near and faithful relative, N. A. Thompson")

Information shows that Thomas' mother was Ellen Lombard.

It is the census from Strike Axe Township. Number 8 is Rogers, Nancy listed as Head, F, Ind, 61, Wd. Number 9, Rogers, T. L., Son, M, Ind, 24, S. In the notes below there is a reference to Thomas L. "Cap" Rogers; (it says b 8-25-1930) clearly this is not correct, it may mean his death. In "History of the Cherokee Indians" page 650 it states his birth as Sept. 2, 1885, in Pawhuska, OK. The notes continue: "m1) Dovie Glendenning (Little Cap and Little Nancy) m2) Bessie Ivers -0- Dovie SOLD kids to Uncle Cap and they called Aunt Bessie "mama" because she raised them. SLBD" Bessie Barrett and Bessie Ivers are probably the same person. I did not reference the copy of my micro fish, it does not seem to be a direct copy of census since later dates are noted.
