Notes for GEORGE JOHN DAME:

According to the book by Charlotte Traylor George John Dame was of English descent. His ancestors fled into Germany from England when religious persecution was rampant. He fought in Revolutionary War of 1776 under the name John Dame. He was a private in Captain Hill's Co., 7th Virginia Regiment commanded by Alexander McClenanhan. John's name is included on the muster roll of 20 May 1777, he was discharged on 2 February 1778.

DAME - Virginia, Tennessee and Kentucky Families

In the year 1769, Augusta County, Virginia was divided, all territory south of the Marys River and to the west as far as Virginia extended, was included in the new county of Botetourt. The county seat of the new county was Fincastle. At this time, the settlers of this portion were Scotch Irish, Dutch, German and Swiss with a few English coming from the east and south of the Blue Ridge Mountains.

The first permanent settlement by white people in this section of country which became Augusta County and later Botetourt was made by natives of Germany in 1726 on the Shenandoah River, a few miles below the present village of Fort Republic. Also, a smaller settlement of German settlers for Lancaster County, Pennsylvania made their home in this section.

Between 1769 and the beginning of the American Revolution found great progress in the settlement and development of southwestern Virginia. The opening guns of the Revolution found this section in possession of people that might properly be termed the bravest, heartiest of the races, most fearless and determined patriots and advocates of liberty to be found in America.

The first settlers were people seeking refuge from political and religious persecution. Educated to unusual degree at the time, these people were lovers of religious and political liberty, ready at all times to stake their lives and fortunes to attain these objects.

The little town of Fincastle lies in a large valley, surrounded in the distance by huge, rolling mountains, blanketed with a canopy of forest trees. During the early days of the Revolution, George Dame, pioneer, who is said by his descendants to have come from Germany to America, served his new county in the field of battle. Revolutionary records is not available although there is recorded one John Dame from Virginia, who served as a private in Captain Hill's Company, 7th Virginia Regiment, commanded by Colonel Alexander McClenachan. His name is

first borne on the company muster roll dates May 20, 1777, and he was discharged February 2, 1778. The county in which he resided is not shown, although it is known that Colonel Alexander McClenachan was a native of Botetourt County which places John Dame in the same general locality. The collection of Revolutionary War records in the United State War Department in Washington is far from complete, and it is possible that George Dame fought also in those same ranks. The John Dame on record may have been a brother, or there could even been a mistake in the given name in the records.

It has not been possible to trace the exact home of this early family, known to have lived in or about Fincastle, in as much as early land surveys of Botetourt County were burned during the Civil War.

George Dame was doubtless of English descent, his family having fled into Germany from English religious persecution and thence sailed to the new world where religious freedom was assured. Nothing is known of his wife although the name of Margaret Dame appears in the 1810 Census Records of Botetourt County, Virginia, age 45 or over and head of household. It is entirely possible that she was then the widow of George Dame. Jacob Dame's name also appears in this same record.

George Dame was by trade a brick and stone mason, an ardent Whig in his political views and was a very earnest and consistent Christian man whose membership was probably in the Methodist Church. He was the father of John, born in 1785, and George Jacob, born 1786. These are the only known children, although there is a records of David Dame having married Margaret Cressir, daughter of Matthias Cressir in Botetourt County, Virginia in the year of 1802. This David Dame was probably another brother, inasmuch as the name David has followed through both families of John and George Jacob. Both of these brothers learned the tanners trade in Fincastle.

Shortly before the War of 1812, John had married Elizabeth Oyler of Franklin County, Virginia, and George Jacob had married Elizabeth Kittinger. The latter couple had four children, Thomas b. 1809; George b. 1811; John, b. 1812; and Katie, b. 1813, all in Virginia. It is said that these brothers heard the tales sent back by a friend about the paradise that was called Kentucky territory. George Jacob, in his eagerness to find this paradise, left a large Virginia farm, never returning to claim it. So the little group of the two Dame brothers and their families, probably accompanied by their close Virginia friends, the Moores and Johnsons who settled near the Kentucky family later, set out from their Botetourt County, Virginia home, through the wilderness, crossing the rugged mountains, doubtless through the Cumberland Gap, in quest of a new home in the West where land was plentiful, forests abounded with wild game and furnished logs for the early pioneer homes.

John and his wife found the Sequatchie Valley in Tennessee to their liking and stopped off there for their future home. During the War of 1812, John entered the service of his country and fought in the Southland under Andrew Jackson. On the close of hostilities, he walked from Mobile, Alabama to his home. Later he removed with his family to Kentucky but, not liking that state as well as Tennessee, he returned to the Sequatchie Valley where his descendants live today.

George Jacob, known later through his life as Jacob Dame, although buried by the name George J. Dame, and his little family pressed further into the West, after leaving his brother in Tennessee and contined until they reached Northwest Kentucky, settling in what later became Muhlenberg County, Kentucky. Shortly after settling in their newly adopted home, Elizabeth (Kittinger) Dame passed away, leaving her husband and four small children. Elizabeth's grave is said to be in what is McLean County now as Muhlenberg County was later divided and part of it became McLean. Several of the older memebers of the Kentucky family remember having seen her grave, but younger ones have failed to find it, and it is feared that the marker may have been removed from the spot.

On March 27, 1817, George Jacob married Sarah Musgrave (or Musgrove), W. Henderson performing the marriage rites as recorded by the Kentucky Historical Society. Early U.S. Census reports show that Sarah Musgrove was born in North Carolina.

Following are accounts of the two brothers, John and Elizabeth (Oyler) Dame of Tennessee and Jacob and Elizabeth (Kittinger) 1, and Sarah (Musgrove) 2 Dame of Kentucky and their descendants. (as listed in database for each family).

Notes for JOHN DAME:

He learned the Tanner trade in Virginia. Moved to Tennessee in 1807 locating in the Sequatchie Valley. The Indians were living in the lower part of the Sequatchie valley when they first moved to the state and the region was wild and unimproved. He belonged to the Methodist Episcopal Church and worked as a tanner. He served in the War of 1812. On the close of hostilities he walked from Mobile, Alabama to his home. Later he moved his family to Kentucky but didn't like the state and moved back to Tennessee. He was a Whig and a Union sympathizer. He passed away on the family farm.

7th Cavalry Regiment [also called 1st Partisan Rangers] was organized during the early summer of 1862 and in July had 35 officers and 817 men present for duty. It served in the Department of Mississippi and East Louisiana

and later was assigned to Chalmer's, R. McCulloch's, and Starke's Brigade. The unit took an active part in the operations in North Mississippi, Kentucky, and West Tennessee. It contained 310 men in October, 1863 and reported 13 casualties at Collierville and 1 at Oxford. The regiment ended the war in Mississippi and was included in the surrender on May 4, 1865. The field officers were Colonels William C. Falkner and Samuel M. Hyams, Jr., Lieutenant Colonels L.B. Hovis and James M. Park, and Majors W.L. Davis and William N. Stansell.

Description: Four minor battles occurred in 1863 at Collierville, Tennessee, during a three-month period. The November 3 fight was intended to be a Confederate cavalry raid to break up the Memphis & Charleston Railroad behind Maj. Gen. William T. Sherman's XV Army Corps, then in the process of marching to the relief of Chattanooga. But, when Brig. Gen. James R. Chalmers, leading a cavalry division riding up from Mississippi, learned that only two Union regiments defended Collierville, he decided to attack. Union Col. Edward Hatch possessed more men than Chalmers supposed, stationed at Collierville and at Germantown, five miles to the west. Scouts warned Hatch of Chalmers's approach from the south, so he ordered Collierville's defenders to be prepared and rode from Germantown with cavalry reinforcements. Chalmers, as he had done only three weeks earlier, attacked from the south. Col. Hatch arrived with help. Surprised by the unexpected appearance of the enemy on his flanks, Chalmers concluded that he was outnumbered, called off the battle, and, to ward off Union pursuit, withdrew back to Mississippi. The Memphis & Charleston Railroad remained open to Tusculum, Alabama, for Union troop movements.

Having served with distinction in the French ports of LeHavre and Rouen, the 1061st was sent from the European theater of war to the Phillipine Islands in July 1944 with company headquarters in Manila. They again served their country in the Asian- Pacific Theater by repairing the ports of Cavite, Corregidor, and Manila. The Watchword of the 1061st was "The 1061st never comes up short in simple terms this meant to us, if we need something we find it and confiscate it if they won't give it to us we take it, if we can't find it we make it our slogan 'the DIFFICULT WE DO IMMEDIATELY, THE IMPOSSIBLE TAKES A LITTLE longer. This enabled us to deliver the Port of LeHavre ready to receive shipping within seven days after our own sparse and uncomfortable living quarters was secured.

A LETTER TO MY FAMILY

My Military History

January 11, 2002

My Dearest Ones;

This narrative is my attempt to recount and record all that I remember of the time-frame Nov. 17, 1943 through to April 19, 1946. The 1943 date is the day on which I was inducted into the United States Army in Water Valley, Mississippi and the 1946 date marks the time I was honorably discharged at Camp Shelby, Mississippi. I will also add to this historical account the anecdotal information that I picked up from my buddies during the time we were on active duty and at reunions across the years. (Anecdotal is only a fancy word for scuttlebutt.)

My outfit, The 1061st Engineer Port Construction and Repair Group, was activated on December 15 1943 at Camp Gordon Johnston, Fl. I was one of its 1st members and likely the youngest. My 18th birthday on Oct. 20, 1943 made me draft eligible so being sworn into the U. S. Army by November 17 was a swift transition from civilian to soldier. Another source besides my memory that I have drawn upon is a Unit History document, some 200 mimeographed pages written by various members of the 1061st who lived it'S rich and various experiences and who were charged by our commanding officer to "keep a record of everything".

The job of the 1061st was to follow close behind the evacuation of the enemy from a given port and to make thing ready for the port to receive shipments of crucial war materials, men, and machines. You can well imagine that the disposition of enemy troops forced to evacuate a port that they had used against us did not cause them to leave the place in apple pie order for us, HIS enemy. That's just a long way around to say that EVERY place that we were called upon to rebuild was a hellish mess. We were even greeted at times with a generous sprinkling of mines and booby traps.

The 1061st was one of several E.P.C.& R. Groups that were created at the suggestion of President Franklin D. Roosevelt himself. The story goes like this. Sometime around mid-year of 1943, the President was at his retreat at now famous Warm Springs, Ga. The war was being heavily waged on several fronts and the news on too many days was bad for our allies and us. President Roosevelt called in for a conference several C.C.C. commanders from neighboring Southern states. The President's challenge went something like this. "Wouldn't it be good for

the prosecution of the war if we created from the U. S. ARMY several engineering outfits whose sole job would be to clean up the ports as soon as they are evacuated by the enemy, repair the damage he has caused in leaving and then turn that port into a tool to use against him. The Navy has its C.B's so why shouldn't the Army have its Special Forces of engineers." Thus the idea for the 1061st Engineer P.C. & R. Group was born. I'm told that the President's original idea was for ten such units to be created, five for the European Theater of war and five for the Asiatic-Pacific Theater. My personal knowledge is of only two other. They were the 1058th, (served in The Philippines) and the 1062nd (served in Europe.)

Camp Gordon Johnston Florida was the base chosen for these units to receive both basic and technical training because it was the army's only amphibious training center. Camp G.J. had the ocean, the swamps, the river, the weather and the terrain to recreate just about any hostile environment in which amphibious troops might be called upon to occupy. Throw in millions of mosquitoes, uncounted numbers of snakes and sand sand sand everywhere (even in your bed and your shoes and your mouth.) and you pretty much have it. They were training us for the hardships of war after all so camp G.J. was just the place.

We didn't know it then but the 1061st was to serve in France at the ocean port of LeHavre and the Seine River port of Rouen. After the Germans surrendered in May 1945 signaling the end of the war in Europe, we were sent to The Philippine Island of Luzon where we worked on the ports of Manila and Cavite and on the Peninsula of Bataan. We also had some work details to go over to Corrigedor by boat for the day but I never was assigned that detail. Corrigedor is an Island at the entrance to Manila Bay

On Christmas day 1945 our work party on Corregidor was startled to see a group of Japanese soldiers come walking toward them with their hands up in surrender. They had been hiding in a cave and didn't realize that Japan had surrendered some four months before until they read one of our newspapers left the day before. When asked by our sergeant in charge why they were in such good physical shape, the reply, "We have been stealing food from you each time you come to the island to work."

One matter-of-fact entry made in the unit history log reads "12 October, 1945- Clearance of Malinta tunnel on Corrigedor, removing dead bodies, bombs, shells, debris, etc.--12in. to 14in. projectiles removed from east entrance. This entry alone pretty clearly defines some of the work an E.P.C. & R. group had to do. The bodies were dead but not the bombs, shells, and projectiles. The work was sometimes grisly and dangerous!

Another entry very personal to me reads "4 September 45 T/5 John D. Dame, 34877110, was assigned and joined from the 21st Evacuation Hospital." I had undergone an emergency appendectomy about two weeks before and was simply being rejoined to my outfit.

The 115th Military Intelligence Group supports intelligence operations 24 hours a day, seven days a week in support of U.S. Pacific Command and its assigned forces. The 115th is the Army component of the Kunia Regional Security Operations (KRSOC) Center.

The Army Corps of Engineers began construction in 1942 of the Kunia facility for assembly of folding-wing aircraft. Completed in 1944, the Kunia facility was used for map production until after the end of World War II. The Navy later used the tunnel as an ammunition storage depot and later as the Pacific Fleet Operations Command Center before placing it in caretaker status in 1977.

The U.S. Army Intelligence and Security Command reactivated the facility in 1980. U.S. Army Field Station Kunia, a 436-soldier unit, became operational in October of 1980. Initially quartered on Fort Shafter, the unit grew rapidly, moving to Wheeler Air Force Base and then to its current location at A-Quad, Schofield Barracks in 1986. The 1st Operations Battalion with its three companies activated on 1 July 1983. "1st Ops" gained two additional companies and a Support Detachment on 1 July 1985. The Support Detachment became

Support Battalion U.S Army Field Station Kunia on 1 August 1986.

Field Station Kunia was redesignated as the 703d Military Intelligence Brigade on 1 January 1988 with Support and 1st Operations redesignated as the 731st and 732d Military Intelligence Battalions, respectively. 733d Military Intelligence Battalion activated on 15 October 1993.

Consolidation of worldwide intelligence resources led to organization of the jointly-staffed Kunia RSOC in March 1993. As part of the consolidation, the 703d relinquished cryptologic host responsibilities for the tunnel operations to the Naval Security Group Activity-Kunia. This transition was initiated in March 1995 and completed by October 1996. Soldiers assigned to the 731st Military Intelligence Battalion who provided security, logistics, electronic maintenance, computer operations, and communications support for the Kunia RSOC were reassigned to other Army units. The 731st Military Intelligence Battalion colors were cased on 10 May 1996. The 733rd Military Intelligence Battalion colors were cased on 21 May 1998.

The 703d Military Intelligence Brigade has a proud history of intelligence production success, winning the National Security Agency's prestigious Travis Trophy in 1992 as the outstanding military cryptologic unit of the year. The brigade's colors fly streamers of two Army Superior Unit Awards.

On 16 June 2000 the 703d Military Intelligence Brigade was deactivated and the 115th Military Intelligence Group was activated at Schofield Barracks, Hawaii, and assigned to the U.S. Army Intelligence and Security Command. The activation of the 115th marked the beginning of the new chapter in the life of the unit and the assignment of an important new mission.
